INDIANA STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

Indiana State Teachers College was created on December 20, 1865, when an Act of the General Assembly provided for the founding of a teacher training institution. The state-supported institution has grown to an evaluation in excess of ten million dollars in physical plant alone, and the enrollment has increased from the original 23 students to an average of more than 3000 different students served in a calendar year.

The chief function of Indiana State Teachers College is to prepare teachers and other employees for the public schools. To this end four major curricula are outlined: one for elementary teachers, one for high school teachers, one for administrators and other school employees, and one for nurses.

In addition, pre-professional courses are given in dentistry, engineering, law, and medicine. Several short term curricula are offered in the commerce department to train secretaries, stenographers, and bookkeepers. Other four-year courses offered to meet the needs of students not preparing for the teaching profession are in art, nursing, secretarial science, accounting-business administration, merchandising-business administration, journalism, medical technology, professional music, radio, social welfare, and theatre.

The college occupies a campus of approximately seventeen acres in the heart of Terre Haute, a ten acre plot of ground at Allendale where the college lodge is located, and thirty-seven acre physical education field on East Wabash, where a proposed field house and athletic plant is to be erected.

There are thirteen buildings on the compact campus, including the Fine Arts and Commerce Building, the Student Union Building, the Administration and Health Center Building, and the Language-Mathematics Building, that cost approximately \$6,500,000. The old Main Building and Stalker Hall were razed two years ago to make way for the new campus improvement program.

During the last two years, there have been additions of 91 modern rooms to Parsons Hall, dormitory for men, and 76 rooms to Women's Residence Hall; completion of a new Power and Storage Plant a short distance off the campus; and the construction of a new \$850,000 Education and Social Studies Building.

At the present, plans are being made for a \$2,000,000 campus expansion and improvement program within the next two years. It includes additions to the present library and Vocational Arts Building, the construction of new Home Economics Building, and landscaping the campus quadrangle.

Indiana State football, basketball, golf, baseball, tennis, track, and swimming teams participate in varsity intercollegiate competition.

Indiana State and five other Hoosier colleges organized the Indiana Collegiate Conference in 1950, but with the acceptance of DePauw University of Greencastle in 1953, the circuit starts operating as seven-team unit this year. Current members of the three-year-old loop include Butler, Ball State, St. Joseph's, Evansville, DePauw, Valparaiso, and Indiana State. Full schedules in all sports are slated for the conference members throughout the 1954-55 season.

COACHING STAFF SKETCHES

MARK E. DEAN -- Head Football Coach (Northern Illinois '38)

Coach Mark Dean is starting his fourth year as head football coach of the Indiana State eleven this fall. A '38 graduate of Northern Illinois State Teachers College at DeKalb, Ill., Dean has 16 years of successful coaching experience. He spent three years at Wisconsin State Teachers College, Superior, Wis., before taking the helm at Indiana State in 1951.

The young coach began his gridiron coaching career as a physical education instructor and coach in the West Des Moines, Iowa, school system. Moving to Roodhouse, Ill., high school in 1942, he won eight consecutive games and a championship in a single year's stay. The next season at Jacksonville, Ill., Dean molded another championship squad as his team won six and lost two.

Dean, a U.S. Navy veteran, spent the next two years in the service and immediately after being discharged, he took the head coaching post at Austin Junior College in Austin, Minn. His teams at Austin compiled a phenomenal record of 13 victories, two defeats, and one tie for two seasons and walked off with a championship.

In 1948, Dean was appointed head of the football coaching staff at Superior State. In three seasons at the Wisconsin college, his aggregations won 11, lost 13, and tied two games.

Dean, who was named "Coach of the Year" by the Indiana Collegiate Conference in 1952, has led the Sycamores to a record of nine victories, four defeats, and three ties over the past two seasons.

Dean's all-time record is 75 victories, 36 losses, and seven ties. His football teams have grabbed four championships, the last being at Austin Junior College in 1947.

COACHING STAFF SKETCHES (CONT.)

DR. WALTER E. MARKS -- Backfield Coach (Chicago '27)

Although Dr. Walter E. Marks resigned the head coaching job at Indiana State just five years ago, he will be back on the scene for the fourth year as backfield coach under Dean. He retired after a 22-year reign as the head Sycamore football coach and concentrates on the teaching of physical education and coaching the Indiana State baseball squad. He is the chairman of the Men's Physical Education Department.

Marks, currently a Big Ten basketball and football official, was one of Amos Alonzo Stagg's greatest athletes at Chicago University. During his sophomore year, the Chicago Maroons walked off with their last Big Ten gridiron championship. "Wally" also starred on the baseball diamond and the hardwood at Chicago.

He came to Indiana State immediately following his graduation in 1928 and compiled impressive records in coaching every sport on the Sycamore campus.

PAUL E. SELGE -- Line Coach (Indiana State '43)

Paul E. Selge after a second tour of duty in the U.S. Navy, returned to the college ranks last season as line coach. Selge also spent three years in the Navy during World War II. He first started coaching duties at Indiana State in 1947. The Sycamore line tutor returned to the armed forces in 1951.

Selge played three years of varsity ball at Indiana State under Coach Wally Marks where he was one of the all-time greats to carry the Blue and White colors on the gridiron. In 1943, he was named as center on the All-State team.

He will continue to act as head line coach, a post he held during his stay at Indiana State.

1954 INDIANA STATE OUTLOOK

Head Football Coach Mark E. Dean, starting his fourth year at Indiana State, has brought the Sycamore footballers from the doldrums to a contender in the Indiana Collegiate conference during the past two seasons. State's record for this period is nine victories, four losses, and three ties.

Hoping to improve on last year's record of five victories and three defeats, the 1954 edition of Fighting Sycamores has 17 lettermen on its roster. Out of 23 lettermen on last season's aggregation, four were graduated, two were called for duty in different branches of our armed forces, one did not return to school this fall and the remaining 16 are in Sycamore uniforms.

The seventeenth letter winner is Guard Herschel Killion, a Terre Haute sophomore, who lettered two years ago and has just returned from a tour of duty in the U.S. Marines.

Included in the other 16 veterans are 11 line and five backfield letter winners.

The linemen are Guard Art Rose, Knightstown sophomore; Center Bill Sakalares, Terre Haute senior; Don Patz, a junior guard from Crown Point; Tackle Chuck Patton, a Chicago, Ill. junior; John Moon, a senior center from Bedford; Tackle Tony Milazzo, Hammond junior; Guard Bob Masulovich, East Chicago senior; End Jack Griffith, Terre Haute senior; Doyle Schmidt, a sophomore end from Princeton; End Dick Comer, Lafayette junior; and Ray Sandlin, a sophomore end from Terre Haute,

In the backfield, Halfback Glenn Tyler, Terre Haute senior; Jim Cox, a senior halfback from Winchester; Quarterback Dave Brines, Vincennes junior; Walt LeBeague, a sophomore fullback from Lafayette; and Halfback Merv Hougland, Kentland junior, will be returning.

1954 INDIANA STATE OUTLOOK (CONT.)

Tackle Dave Schaeffer, the team's most valuable player, Center John Arzumanian, End Pete Kokinda and Fullback Arvin Workman were the only starters lost by graduation. First string End Jerry Long, who led the conference in pass receiving last year, and substitute Fullback Bill Takacs were lost via the military draft. Second string Guard Don Burton did not return to school.

Among the top performers returning are Griffith, who won all-conference honors last year at tackle, but will be an end this season; Cox, the regular quarterback for three years, who will run from a half-back spot this year; Brines, who spearheaded the team in passing and total offense with 460 and 653 yards, respectively; Tyler, who led the squad in rushing with 423 yards and in scoring with 48 points; and Masulovich, who has been selected as an all-conference guard for the past two seasons.

About one-half of the 50 Sycamore candidates, one of the largest turn-outs in history at Indiana State, are freshman, but Coach Dean will, for the most part, place his attack on the shoulders of the lettermen and seven or eight other tried hands from last season's team. This year's team is expected to have the greatest depth of any Sycamore eleven since Dean began his coaching duties in 1951.

Working with Dean this season will again be Dr. Walter E. Marks, serving his fourth year as backfield coach, and Paul E. Selge, line coach who returned to the college ranks after a tour of duty with the U.S. Navy last year.

Dean uses a diversified offensive attack, but favors the T and split-T formations. He also utilizes a single-wing attack. As in the past he will conform his attack to suit his material.
