INDIANA STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

Indiana State Teachers College in Terre Haute, Indiana, was created on December 20, 1865, when an Act of the Indiana General Assembly provided for the founding of a teacher training institution. It first opened its doors to students on January 6, 1870. In its 85-year history, the College has gained a world-wide reputation as one of the finest teacher training institutions. The physical plant has grown to an evaluation exceeding ten million dollars and the enrollment has increased from the original 23 students to an average yearly student body of over 3000 different students.

The chief function of the College is to prepare students for positions as teachers and other employees in the public schools. To this end, four major courses are outlined: one for elementary teachers, one for highschool teachers, one for school administrators and other school employees, and one for nurses.

In other-than-teaching fields, Indiana State offers a wide variety of study courses to meet the needs of many students. Those not preparing to enter the teaching profession may pursue regular four-year courses in art, secretarial science, accounting-business administration, merchandising-business administration, journalism, medical technology, professional music, radio, social welfare, and theatre. Four-year pre-professional courses are offered in pre-law and pre-medicine, and two-year pre-professional courses are offered in pre-dental and pre-engineering. Nursing is offered in cooperation with Terre Haute's St. Anthony and Union Hospitals' Schools of Nursing. In addition, the college offers a short two-year course in business in either accounting or secretarial studies. A student may earn the liberal arts degree at Indiana State.

Indiana State occupies a campus of approximately 17 acres in the heart of the City of Terre Haute in southwestern Indiana. A College Lodge is maintained in the southern suburban area of the city also.

Twelve buildings are situated on the compact campus area. All are relatively new structures. In 1950 the twin Language-Mathematics Building and the Administration-Health Center Building were completed. The 25-classroom Education-Social Studies Building was opened in January, 1954. Three years ago, 91 rooms were added to Parsons Hall, men's dormitory, and this past spring (1955) a 76-room wing addition was completed to the Women's Residence Hall.

At present plans have already been approved for the construction of a new Home Economics Building and the expansion and remodeling of the College Library. An addition to and remodeling of the Industrial Education Building is also proposed for the 1955-56 school year.

Indiana State football, basketball, golf, baseball, tennis, track, and swimming teams participate in varsity intercollegiate competition. Freshmen will not be eligible for varsity competition with the start of the 1956-57 school year. They will then participate against other college freshman teams.

Indiana State and five other Indiana colleges organized the Indiana Collegiate Conference in 1950, but with the acceptance of DePauw University of Greencastle in 1953, the ICC started operating as a seven-team loop in 1954. Current members of the four-year old loop are Butler, Ball State, St. Joseph's, Evansville, DePauw, Valparaiso, and Indiana State. Full schedules in all sports are slated for conference members throughout the 1955-56 season.

PAUL E. SELGE -- Acting Head Football Coach (Indiana State '43)

Stepping into the head coaching post for the 1955 season will be Indiana State's Line Coach Paul E. Selge who has tutored the Sycamore linemen for six seasons, 1947 through 1950 and 1953 and 1954. He takes over from Mark E. Dean who was granted a one-year leave of absence.

A native of South Bend, Indiana, Selge was a member of Indiana State's varsity football team for three seasons, 1941-42-43 and was named as the center on the All-State (Indiana) team in 1943. He played under Head Coach Dr. Walter E. Marks and in 1947 and 1948 was Marks' line coach. During the 1949 and 1950 seasons, he coached the linemen for Head Coach George Ashworth, but was recalled to service with the U.S. Navy in 1951. He returned to the campus for the 1953 season and the past two seasons has coached the linemen for Head Coach Mark E. Dean.

Selge spent three years with the U.S. Navy during World War II. He earned both his B.S. and M.S. degrees at Indiana State and graduated from Washington-Clay High School in South Bend, Indiana.

ROBERT HOLLAR -- Line Coach (Manchester '41)

Newly-appointed frosh coach Robert L. Hollar will direct the Sycamore line play this season. Hollar is no newcimer to the line coaching position since he coached the Sycamore line play for the 1951 and 1952 seasons for Mark E. Dean. He has been a member of the Indiana State faculty since 1950 and has been Dean of the Indiana State Teachers College Laboratory School. He has helped coach all sports in the Laboratory School. This past spring he was named to the college coaching staff as freshman coach.

A '41 Manchester graduate, Hollar served as a coach in several Indiana High Schools before coming to the campus in 1950. He was coach at Van Buren, 1941-42; Henover College, instructor and coach, 1947; and New Paris, coach, 1948-50.

EDWARD G. ZEMBAL -- Backfield Coach (Purdue '55)

New backfield coach will be Edward G. Zembal, a 1955 graduate of Purdue University, who earned four major letters as a halfback on the Boilermaker elevens in 1951-52-53-54. 1955 FOOTBALL OUTLOOK AT INDIANA STATE

A new head football coach, a practically all-new coaching staff, and a young, spirited squad are the ingredients that will go to make up Indiana State's 1955 football destiny. In all, it's a wait-see proposition for Line Coach Paul E. Selge who steps in as acting head coach for the season. Selge has been the Sycamore line coach for six seasons and takes over the head job from Mark P. Dean who is on a one-year leave of absence from the campus.

Graduation took a heavy bite into the Indiana State squad and nine of last year's 25 lettermen are missing. Of those nine, eight were regular starters and saw heavy action. Among the veterans lost were Guard Bob Masulovich, East Chicago, who was named for three consecutive seasons on the first ICC, 1952-53-54; End and Fullback Jack Griffith, Terre Haute, who was named to the ICC first team the last two seasons; Center Bill Sakalares, Chicago Heights, Ill., who was a varsity squad member for four seasons; triple-threat Halfback-Quarterback Jim Cox, Winchester, who held down a starting post for four straight years; Halfback Glenn Tyler, Terre Haute, the leading scorer in 1953; Tony Milazzo, Hammond center and tackle, a starter the past two years; End Walt Minton, Shelbyville; Harold Huff, Sullivan tackle, a regular last season; and Jack Moon, reserve center from Bedford.

Of the returning lettermen Selge will have ten linemen and six backfield men to form the nucleus of the 1955 squad. Returning lettermen will include guards and tackles Art Rose, Knightstown junior; Edgar Poole, Brownsburg sophomore; Dick Comer, Lafayette senior; Don Patz, Crown Point senior; and Charles Patton, Chicago senior; lettermen ends include Don Ellar, Elkhart sophomore; Nealon Gaskey, West Chicago sophomore; Ray Sandlin, Terre Haute senior; and Bill Griffith, Terre Haute junior; and Center Harry Hausenfleck, Hammond sophomore.
