INDIANA STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

Information About the College

Indiana State Teachers College in Terre Haute, Indiana, is one of four state-supported colleges and universities in the State of Indiana, the others being Ball State Teachers College, Indiana University, and Purdue University. Indiana State was created on December 20, 1865, when an Act of the General Assembly provided for the founding of a teacher training institution. The doors of the college were first opened to students on January 6, 1870. In its ensuing 85-year history, the College has established itself as one of the finest teacher training colleges in the nation. The physical plant has grown to an evaluation exceeding eleven million dollars, and the enrollment has increased from the original 23 students to an average yearly student enrollment of over 3000 different students.

The chief function of the College is to prepare students for positions as teachers, administrators, and other employees in the public schools. To this end, four major courses of study in this field are offered: one for elementary teachers, one for secondary school teachers, one for administrators and other special school employees, and one for nurses.

While the major emphasis is on public school teaching and administration, Indiana State does, however, offer a wide variety of courses of study in other-than-teaching fields to meet the needs of the students. Those not preparing for the teaching profession may pursue regular four-year courses of study in art, secretarial science, accounting-business administration, merchandising-business administration, general business administration, journalism, medical technology, professional music, radio, social welfare, or theatre. The regular four-year liberal arts degree may be earned at the college. Four-year pre-professional courses are offered in pre-law and pre-medicine, and nursing is offered in cooperation with the local hospital schools of nursing. In addition, two-year pre-professional courses are offered in pre-dental and pre-engineering and a two-year (non-degree) short course in business is offered to prepare students in either accounting or secretarial skills.

Indiana State occupies a quadrangular-shaped campus of some 17 or more acres in the heart of the City of Terre Haute in southwestern Indiana. The College's Allendale Lodge is maintained in the city's southern suburban area. The new Physical Education Field, one-half sodded and the other half taken over by six tennis courts, is just one block west of the campus and was opened in June, 1956.

Thirteen buildings are situated on the compact campus area. All the buildings are relatively new and modern structures. The new Home Economics Building was completed this past summer and was opened for the first time this fall of 1956. An addition to the Industrial Education Building was also completed this summer. This addition houses the college's printing and auto mechanics shops. Plans to remodel the entire Industrial Education Building are currently being studied. A \$600,000 addition to the College Library is expected to be completed during the 1956-57 college year. The 25-classroom Education-Social Studies Building was first opened in January, 1954. Three years ago, 91 rooms were added to Parsons Hall for men and in 1955 a 76-room addition was completed to the Women's Residence Hall. The

twin Administration-Health Center Building and Language-Mathematics Building were completed at a cost of almost two million dollars and opened in 1950.

Indiana State football, basketball, golf, baseball, tennis, track, and swimming teams participate and maintain schedules in intercollegiate competition. Freshmen are not eligible for varsity competition. Fresh schedules will be maintained against other college fresh teams.

Indiana State and five other Indiana colleges and universities officially organized the Indiana Collegiate Conference in 1950. DePauw University was accepted as a seventh loop member in 1953, and the ICC has been operating as a seven-team conference since 1954. Full schedules in all sports are slated for conference members throughout the 1956-57 college year. Current members of the five-year old conference include: Ball State, Butler, DePauw, Evansville, Indiana State, St. Joseph's, and Valparaiso.

SKETCHES OF OUR GRIDIRON MENTORS . . .

DR. MARK A. DEAN -- Head Football Coach (Northern Illinois '38)

Coach Dean starts his fifth year as head coach of the Indiana State gridsters this season. Dean has spent 17 years of his teaching career in coaching athletic teams. He spent three years at Wisconsin State Teachers College (Superior, Wis.), before taking over the reins at Indiana State Teachers College in 1951.

He began his coaching career at West Des Moines, Iowa, where he was physical education instructor and coach. From there, he went to Roodhouse, Ill., in 1942, where he won eight straight games and a championship in a one-year stay. He then was in the Navy for the next two years, and when he returned, he took the head coaching post at Austin Junior College in Austin, Minn. There he won 13 games, lost two, and tied one. He was there for two years, and won a championship.

In 1948, Dean was appointed head coach at Superior State. In three seasons at the Wisconsin college, the squads garnered 11 wins, lost 13 and tied two games.

Dean, who was named "Coach of the Year" by the Indiana Collegiate Conference in 1952, has led the Sycamores to an overall record of 13 wins, 14 losses, and four ties in the four years that he has led the squads.

His overall coaching record is 75 victories, 36 losses, and seven ties. He was given a year's leave of absence last season to attend Humbolt State Teachers College in Arcata, California. There, he taught theory courses in physical education, and helped to develop a program for obtaining the M.A. degree in physical education. He also supervised student teaching.

COACHING STAFF SKETCHES (Cont.)

PAUL E. SELGE -- Line Coach (Indiana State '43)

Paul Selge, after being acting head coach last season, returns this season to the staff as line coach. Selge has spent three years in the Navy during the World War II, and returned in 1951 for a two-year stint.

Selge played three years of varsity ball at Indiana State under Coach Wally Marks, and was one of the all-time Sycamore greats to carry the Blue and White colors on the gridiron. In 1943, he was named as center on the All-State eleven.

He first started his coaching duties at Indiana State in 1947, and has been line coach except for last season, when he acted as head football coach during Dean's absence. He also coaches the Sycamore swimming and track teams in the winter and spring respectively.

Selge is a native of South Bend, and graduated from Washington-Clay High School. He received his B.S. and M.S. degrees at Indiana State.

DUANE E. KLUEH -- Assistant Coach in Football (Indiana State '49)

Klueh came to Indiana State last season to be head coach in basketball and assist with the coaching of ends in football. He will do the same thing this season, and coach tennis once again, too. He was an All-American basketball player at Indiana State in 1948 and graduated the next year. A former Fowler High School coach, 1951-55, Klueh was appointed head coach in the spring of '55 to succeed John L. Longfellow as head basketball coach.

ROBERT L. HOLLAR -- Freshman Coach (Manchester '41)

Robert L. Hollar will assist Mark Dean in varsity football until Sept. 20, when he will assume his job as head freshman coach and lead the frosh in all freshman sports. Hollar, however, is no newcomer to the varsity coaching staff, as he coached line play for Mark Dean in 1951 and 1952, and last season for Paul Selge. He has been a member of the Indiana State Faculty since 1950 and has been Dean of the Indiana State Teachers College Laboratory School. He has helped coach all sports in the Lab School, and was named to the college coaching staff as freshman coach in the spring of 1955.

A '43 Manchester grad, Hollar served as coach in several Indiana high schools before coming to the campus in 1950. He was coach at Van Duren, Hanover College, and New Paris.

EDWARD G. ZEMBAL -- Backfield Coach (Purdue '55)

Serving as backfield coach for the second straight season will be Edward Zembal, a 1955 grad of Purdue University, where he earned four major letters as a halfback on the ~~Rollermaker~~ eleven in 1951-52-53 and 54. A native of Chicago, Ill., where he attended Weber High School, Zembal was chosen for two consecutive years, 1949 and 1950, on the All Chicago area football and basketball teams. He saw the most action during his sophomore and senior years and played in the 1955 Blue-Gray Charity Bowl game in Montgomery, Ala.

Besides serving as backfield coach, Zembal will assist in football, and spring sports, besides teaching his regular schedule of physical education classes and completing his Masters degree.

A BRIEF OUTLOOK AT THE 1956 EDITION OF THE SYCAMORES

A returning head coach, an experienced coaching staff, and 12 major letterwinners are the ingredients that will spell the destiny of the 1956 edition of the Indiana State Fighting Sycamore football team. It's a wait and see proposition for Mark Dean, who returns after a year's leave of absence, as head mentor. Dean has been head coach for four previous seasons, 1951 through 1954. Paul Selge was acting head last season in Dean's absence.

Graduation and other reasons took nine lettermen from last year's squad, that won two and lost seven. Among the seniors graduated from that eleven was Wayne Gruber, who won two major letters here and helped to set ten new ICC team records with his work at quarterback. His most sparkling performance came against Evansville when he completed 18 of 39 passes good for 338 yards.

Other graduated seniors were: Dave Brines, who won three letters as a reserve quarterback, Marvin Houghland, halfback and winner of three letters. Also, Dick Comer, tackle, and winner of three letters; and Don Patz, who won four major letters at tackle. Chuck Patton, tackle, also was graduated.

Bill Griffith and Bob Wilbur are among the returnees this season. Griffith, stellar end, was the lone Sycamore selected for the All-ICC squad last season. He was among the top ten in pass receiving, and was the main pass receiver in the record-breaking Evansville game. Wilbur has been the leading Sycamore pointmaker the past two seasons, and garnered 51 markers last year. Bob is a back.

Other major letterwinners are: Chuck Cashaw, fullback; Don Ellar, end; Harry Hausenflock, center; Vern Ketner, center; Dave Topping, halfback; and John Barrett, halfback. Also George Deal, center; Dick Hemingway, fullback; Bill Lumsdon, tackle; and Jim Waugh, fullback.

Griffith, Wilbur, Ketner, and Cashaw are seniors out of this group of lettermen. There are three other seniors on the squad. Since frosh are ineligible this year for ICC play, these men plus the numeral letterwinners, prospective new team members along with transfer athletes will form the 1956 edition of the SYCAMORES.

As Coach Dean says, "We'll just have to wait and see--Meanwhile hoping for the best."
