INDIANA STATE COLLEGE

Indiana State College located in Terre Haute, Indiana, is one of four state-supported colleges and universities in the state of Indiana. The others are Ball State Teachers College, Indiana University, and Purdue University. Indiana State was created on December 20, 1865, when an act of the General Assembly provided for the founding of a teacher training institution. The doors were first opened to twenty-three students on January 6, 1870. In the 91-year period of its existence, the College has become firmly established and recognized as one of the nation's finest teacher education colleges. The expansion of the nature of the college education offerings was recognized with the name change on July 7, 1961, to Indiana State.

The physical plant has grown to an evaluation exceeding 21 million dollars, and the enrollment increased from the original 23 students to an enrollment of over 4800 on campus students and an additional 1,500 to 2,000 students enrolled in extension and correspondence study. Termed one of the "fastest-growing colleges in the Midwest", enrollment increased 140 per cent over seven-year period, 1953-60.

Primary emphasis in the College's instructional program is to prepare students for professional careers as teachers, school administrators, and other public school positions. To this end, courses of study are offered for elementary teachers, secondary teachers, school administrators, and other special school employees, and nurses.

While primary emphasis is on preparation of students for the teaching profession, Indiana State does offer strong and highly-rated programs of study preparing students for other professional careers. The regular four-year liberal arts degree program is offered. Also offered are four-year degree programs in art, secretarial science, accounting-business administration, merchandising-business administration, general business administration, public accounting, medical technology, professional music, radio-television, pre-school work, or theatre. Four-year pre-professional degree courses are offered in pre-law and pre-medicine, and two-year (non-degree) courses are offered in pre-dentistry and pre-engineering. A two-year (non-degree) short course in business is offered to prepare students for positions in either accounting or secretarial work.

Indiana State occupies an expanding campus area of more than 45 acres in the heart of the city of Terre Haute which is located in southwestern Indiana along the famous "Banks of the Wabash". The College's Allendale Lodge is maintained in the city's southern suburban Allendale District. The Physical Education Field, one-half sodded and the other half taken over by six lighted grass tennis courts is just one block west of the campus quadrangle. More physical education areas are now being completed. The construction of a new Men's Physical Education Building started in late summer of 1960 and will be dedicated in early 1962. Home football and baseball games are now played in Terre Haute's Memorial Stadium.

An Athletic Field in the locale of the new Men's P.E. Building is contemplated. This field would have facilities for football, track, and baseball events. Terre Haute is also the home of two other outstanding colleges, Rose Polytechnic Institute (an engineering college for men) and St. Mary-of-the-Woods College (a Catholic girls' college).

Nineteen campus buildings are located on the compact downtown Indiana State campus area. A new Home Economics Building and a new addition to the Industrial Education Building housing printing and auto mechanics shops were opened in 1956. The entire three-story Industrial Education Building was completely remodeled and newly-equipped and opened in the fall of 1957. The College Library was remodeled and a new six-story air-conditioned addition was completed to the building in 1957. The 25-classroom Education-Social Studies Building was first opened in January, 1954. Five years ago, 91 rooms were added to Parsons Hall for men, and four years ago, a 76-room addition was completed to the Women's Residence Hall. The twin Administration-Health Center and Language-Mathematics Building were completed at a cost of almost two million dollars in 1950.

A new six-story women's residence hall and an addition to the Student Union Building were both completed in 1959. A new six-story women's hall and a new nine-story men's hall are now under construction and will be ready in Sept., 1962. Two more such halls will probably be put under construction in the 1961-62 year. A new Bookstore Building will be ready in November, 1961, and the old Science Building will be remodeled as the new Business Department home during the 1961-62 year. A new \$2,500,000 Science Building was dedicated in April, 1961.

Indiana State football, basketball, baseball, golf, tennis, track, cross country, wrestling, and swimming teams participate and maintain schedules in intercollegiate competition. Freshmen are not eligible to compete on varsity teams, but frosh schedules are maintained in most all sports. Wrestling and gymnastic coaches were added to the coaching staff in 1959.

Indiana State and five other Indiana colleges and universities officially organized the Indiana Collegiate Conference in 1950. DePauw University was accepted as a seventh loop member in 1953, and the ICC has been operating as a seven-team conference since 1954. Full schedules in all sports were slated for all conference members for the first time in the 1959-60 year.

INDIANA STATE 1961 FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

Indiana State's 1961 Sycamores are somewhat of a question mark, but over-all coach Bill Jones' team is expected to be improved over last year when it ended the season with a 3-4 record.

After dropping the first four games by close scores in 1960, the Statesmen jelled to win the last three straight and hopes are high that the team can continue the winning streak.

The 1961 squad will be minus 13 members of last season's team. Nine were lost through graduation and six of the 13 were regulars. Respite this loss, Jones will have 17 returning lettermen.

Returning will be last year's first two quarterbacks, Bobby Clements and Gil Fujawa. Clements did most of the signal calling last year and was rated among the top quarterbacks in the ICC.

Also returning will be regular halfbacks Lloyd Robbs and Bob Cohoon. The only loss in the backfield was fullback Bill Gaskey. Steve Brandenburg, who was injured most of last season, will be back at the spot along with a transfer from the University of Illinois, John Bush.

Jones expects to have more depth in the line than he has had in the past, but the problem positions are expected to be the ends. Both regulars, Wally Webb and Rich McNair, graduated and inexperienced men will have to fill the vacancies.

If the team jells properly, the Sycamores could be a strong contender for the Indiana Collegiate Conference title.

INDIANA STATE COACHING STAFF

BILL JONES, Head Football Coach (Ohio Wesleyan, '39)

In his fifth season as Indiana State's head football coach, Coach Bill Jones will again be counted on to field a smooth functioning, fundamentally sound, and spirited Sycamore eleven. In a tremendous rebuilding job after his first two seasons and a 3-12 record, Jones piloted the Sycamores to a 3-4 season last year and a 3-3 mark in Indiana Collegiate Conference play. Fellow ICC coaches recognized this outstanding accomplishment and named him the 1960 ICC Football Coach of the Year.

One of Indiana's all great football players, Jones was named to the Indiana All-Star High School Football team in his senior year on the Clinton, Ind., High School eleven. At Ohio Wesleyan, he was named the Most Valuable Player in his senior year. He played the fullback position in high school and college. A graduate of Ohio Wesleyan, Jones later earned the master's degree at Indiana State.

Jones came to Indiana State in 1957 after an amazing record at Sullivan, Ind. High School. From 1952 through 1956, his Sullivan elevens lost only four games and had two 20-game winning streaks. He was at Sullivan High School for 13 years and also served as Athletic Director. He coached the Sullivan basketball team for the 1956-57 season. His father was a coal miner, but Jones had his first jobs in automobile manufacturing plants.

Coach Jones hopes to instill in young men the correct attitude toward athletics. He wants to satisfy the natural desire to participate, develop sportsmanlike attitudes, and create a striving for victory; however, always working harder to improve skills and accept criticism. With such noteworthy aims, Jones-coached young men are certain to be better players and better citizens.

INDIANA STATE COACHING STAFF (Continued)

Although Jones favors the Split-T offense, he does employ Straight T, Single-Wing, and Lonesome End formations in his offensive attack.

PAUL E. SELGE, Head Line Coach (Indiana State, '43)

A veteran and versatile member of the Indiana State Coaching staff since 1946, except for a two-year period 1951-52 when he was recalled for a tour of duty with the U.S. Navy, Paul E. Selge has been Head Line Coach every season since he joined the staff. In 1955, he was the Acting Head Football Coach.

An Indiana State graduate, Selge, a native of South Bend, Ind., is a Woodrow Wilson High School (South Bend) graduate. He did not play high school football, but ranks as one of all-time outstanding Indiana State football players. He was a varsity center under Coach Walter E. Marks for three seasons and was named at the center position on the 1941 and 1942 Indiana All-State Collegiate teams. He earned the M.S. degree at Indiana State.

He serves as the college's Head Swimming Coach and has also been Head Track Coach.

ROBERT MEYNE, Assistant and Backfield Coach (Hanover, '48)

A former athletic director and head football and track coach at Earlham College (Indiana), Robert Meyne is in his fifth season on the Sycamore coaching staff where he assists with football and is head track coach. A native of Chicago, Ill., he is a Hanover (Indiana) College graduate and earned the master's degree at Indiana University where he has completed course work for the doctor's degree in physical education.

ROBERT L. HOLLAR, Head Freshman Coach (Manchester, '41)

Robert L. Hollar assists coaching the varsity linemen until the middle of September and then he devotes his efforts to freshmen

football players. He is head coach of freshman teams in all sports.

A member of the ISC staff since 1950, Hollar is the former Dean of the ISC Laboratory School and coached varsity linemen during the 1951, 1952, and 1955 seasons. He was named as a full-time member of the college coaching staff in 1955.

Before joining the ISC staff in 1950, Hollar was coach at Van Buren (Ind.) and New Paris (Ind.) high schools and Hanover College. CHESTER E. SANDERS, Assistant Varsity and Freshman Coach (Indiana U., '48)

In his third year on the ISC coaching staff, Chester E. Sanders was assistant football and golf coach and head wrestling coach at Wabash (Ind.) College from 1955-59. He assists with varsity squad coaching until freshmen start practice. A graduate of Brazil, Ind., High School, he earned the B.S. and M.S. degrees at Indiana University and he was named on the 1945 Big Ten Team.

Sanders coached at high schools in Hobart, Ind., 1948-50, East Gary, Ind., 1950-53, and Clinton, Ind., 1953-55, before going to Wabash College in 1955.

JOHN L. LONGFELLOW, Athletic Director (Manchester, '28)

Regarded as one of Indiana's finest basketball coaches, John L. Longfellow joined the ISC staff as head basketball coach and athletic director in 1948. In six seasons, 1948-54, he piloted ISC basketball teams to 12 assorted championships, the top title being the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics crown in 1950. Named Indiana's 1950 College Coach of the Year, he co-coached the U.S. Olympic basketball team that won the Pan American Games basketball title in Buenos Aires, Argentina, in 1951. Seven of his ISC players were on that U.S. Olympic team.

A heart attack in 1955 forced him to quit coaching basketball, but he continues as athletic director.

As head coach at Elkhart, Ind. High School, Longfellow's teams over a 19-year period won 24 championships and 113 of 165 N.I.H.S.C. He has served as president of the N.A.I.A. and has been a member of the N.A.I.A. executive board for a number of years.

In 1958, he was sent by the U.S. State Department as an American specialist to the Republic of Haiti to supervise a program of athletics from the university level on down through the secondary and elementary schools. He also spent some time assisting Haitian coaches in preparing Haitian athletes for competition in the Olympics and Pan American games.
