INDIANA STATE COLLEGE

Located in the heart of the city of Terre Haute, Indiana, near the famous "Banks of the Wabash," Indiana State College is a public, state-supported multi-purpose college offering undergraduate and graduate study in teacher education and school administration, arts and sciences, and professional-vocational areas. Created by an Act of the Indiana General Assembly on December 20, 1865, the College opened its doors to 23 students on January 6, 1870.

The College was known as Indiana State Normal School from 1870 to 1927, and as Indiana State Teachers College from 1929 to 1961. Each name change was in recognition of greater educational offerings. The change of the name to Indiana State College came officially on July 7, 1961.

Called one of the "fastest growing colleges in the Midwest," the College has an ever-increasing number of students, faculty, buildings, and course offerings. Enrollment in 1953 was 1867 students. Last Fall, enrollment had increased to 5316. In the Fall of 1962, about 6300 students were expected. This Fall's enrollment is almost $3\frac{1}{2}$ times that of nine years ago. The School of Education was established two years ago, and a Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences was named for the first time this year. Primarily a teacher education college for many years, the College now offers opportunities for a student to earn degrees in Liberal Arts or Professional Vocational areas or in any phase of teacher education. The College also offers the Master of Arts and Master of Science degrees, and the Doctor of Education degree is offered in cooperation with Indiana University.

Building construction has been going on at a rapid pace over the last 12 years. Nineteen modern buildings are located on the downtown, ever-expanding campus area. A six-story women's residence hall and a nine-story men's residence hall were opened for the first time this Fall of 1962. The women's unit is the second of a three-unit development with the third unit scheduled for opening in the Fall of 1963. The men's nine-story hall is the first of four units in a men's housing development. The second nine-story men's hall is now under construction and is expected to be ready for use in the Fall of 1963.

The Business Building was officially opened this Fall of 1962. The building had housed the Science Department for many years and was completely remodeled and rehabilitated over the past two years so as to provide a home for the growing Department of Business. A new Bookstore Building was officially opened for the first time in the Spring of 1962, and a \$2,500,000 Science Building was dedicated in 1961.

The outstanding Indiana State College Arena was completed and put into use in February, 1962, with official dedication of the building scheduled tentatively in December, 1962. This structure has a huge gymnasium area which can be used as three gyms, or can be converted into one large gym floor for basketball games and other events. The gym is serviced by 30-row, mechanized bleachers which provide seating for over 5000 persons. The bleachers can be folded up to take up only five or six feet of floor space, and when extended

stretch out about 60 feet. The building also houses a gymnastics room, wrestling room, several dressing rooms, a trainer's room, an Olympic type pool with 1-meter and 3-meter diving boards, a suite of faculty offices, and three classrooms. The lower level of the building, directly under the tym floor, is a dirt-covered area providing facilities for indoor track practice, baseball batting and pitching cages, and a golf practice cage. Bar bells and other body conditioning equipment are also located on this lower level.

Indiana State has varsity football; basketball, baseball, golf, tennis, track, cross country, wrestling, swimming, and gymnastic teams and maintain schedules each year in intercollegiate competition. Freshmen are not eligible to compete on any varsity teams, but frosh team schedules are maintained in most sports. Wrestling was added to the college's program two years ago, and gymnastics was added this year.

Indiana State and five other Indiana colleges and universities officially organized the Indiana Collegeiate Conference in 1950. DePauw University was accepted as a seventh loop member in 1953, and the ICC has been operating as a seven-team conference since 1954. Full schedules in all sports for all ICC member schools were first slated in the 1959-60 year.

INDIANA STATE COACHING STAFF

BILL JONES, Head Football Coach (Ohio Wesleyan, '39)

In his sixth season as Indiana State's head football coach, Coach Bill Jones will again be counted on to field a smooth functioning, fundamentally sound, and spirited Sycamore eleven. In a tremendous rebuilding job after his first two seasons and a 3-12 record, Jones piloted the Sycamores to a 5-3 record in 1959 and a 3-4 season in 1960 before injuries and illness brought a slip to 2-6 last year. Fellow ICC coaches recognized his outstanding accomplishments and named him the 1960 ICC Football Coach of the Year.

One of Indiana's all-great football players, Jones was named to the Indiana All-Star High School Football team in his senior year on the Clinton, Ind., High School eleven. At Ohio Wesleyan, he was named the Most Valuable Player in his senior year. He played the fullback position in high school and college. After earning his AB from Wesleyan in 1939, Jones later received the master's degree at Indiana State.

Jones came to Indiana State in 1957 after an amazing record at Sullivan, Ind. High School. From 1952 through 1956, his Sullivan elevens lost only four games and had two 20-game winning streaks. He was at Sullivan High School for 13 years and also served as athletic director. He coached the Sullivan basketball team for the 1956-57 season. His father was a coal miner, but Jones had his first jobs in automobile manufacturing plants.

Coach Jones hopes to instill in young men the correct attitude toward athletics. He wants to satisfy the natural desire to participate, develop sportsmanlike attitudes, and create a striving for victory; however, always working harder to improve skills and accept criticism. With such noteworthy aims, Jones-coached young men are certain to be better players and better citizens.

INDIANA STATE COACHING STAFF (continued)

Although Jones favors the Split-T offense, he does employ Straight T, Single-Wing, and Lonesome End formations in his offensive attack.

PAUL E. SELGE, Head Line Coach (Indiana State, '43)

A veteran and versatile member of the Indiana State coaching staff since 1946, except for a two-year period 1951-52 when he was recalled for a tour of duty with the U.S. Navy, Paul E. Selge has been Head Line Coach every season since he joined the staff. In 1955, he was the acting Head Football Coach.

An Indiana State graduate, Selge, a native of South Bend, Ind., is a Woodrow Wilson High School (South Bend) graduate. He did not play high school football, but ranks as one of all-time outstanding Indiana State football players. He was a varsity center under Coach Walter E. Marks for three seasons and was named at the center position on the 1941 and 1942 Indiana All-State Collegiate teams. He earned the M.S. degree at Indiana State.

He serves as the college's Head Swimming Coach and has also been Head Track Coach.

ROBERT L. HOLLAR, Head Freshman Coach (Manchester, '41)

Robert L. Hollar assists coaching the varsity linemen until the middle of September and then he devotes his efforts to freshman football players. He is head coach of freshman teams in all sports.

A member of the ISC staff since 1950, Hollar is the former Dean of the ISC Laboratory School and coached varsity linemen during the 1951, 1952, and 1955 seasons. He was named as a full-time member of the college coaching staff in 1955.

Before joining the ISC staff in 1950, Hollar was coach at Van Buren (Ind.) and New Paris (Ind.) high schools and Hanover College.

CHESTER E. SANDERS, Assistant Varsity and Freshman Coach (Indiana U., '48)

In his third year on the ISC coaching staff, Chester E. Sanders was assistant football and golf coach and head wrestling coach at Wabash (Ind.) College from 1955-59. He assists with varsity squad coaching until freshmen start practice. A graduate of Brazil, Ind., High School, he earned the B.S. and M.S. degrees at Indiana University and he was named on the 1945 Big Ten Team.

Sanders coached at high schools in Hobart, Ind., 1948-50, East Gary, Ind., 1950-53, and Clinton, Ind., 1953-55, before going to Wabash College in 1955.

JOHN L. LONGFELLOW, Athletic Director (Manchester, '28)

Regarded as one of Indiana's finest basketball coaches, John L. Longfellow joined the ISC staff as head basketball coach and athletic director in 1948. In six seasons, 1948-54, he piloted ISC basketball teams to 12 assorted championships, the top title being the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics crown in 1950. Named Indiana's 1950 college Coach of the Year, he co-coached the U.S. Olympic basketball team that won the Pan American Games basketball title in Buenos Aires, Argentina, in 1951. Seven of his ISC players were on that U.S. Olympic team. A heart attack in 1955 forced him to quit coaching basketball, but he continues as the athletic director.

As head coach at Elkhart, Ind. High School, Longfellow's teams over a 19-year period won 24 championships and 113 of 165 N.I.H.S.C. He has served as president of the N.A.I.A. and has been a member of the N.A.I.A. executive board for a number of years.

In 1958, he was sent by the U.S. State Department as an American specialist to the Republic of Haiti to supervise a program of athletics from the university level on down through the secondary and elementary schools. He also spent some time assisting Haitian coaches in preparing Haitian athletes for competition in the Olympics and Pan American games.

1962 PROSPECTUS

The 1962 Indiana State football team is best described as a question mark. Due to an abnormally high number of losses through graduations, scholastic shortcomings, and other reasons, Coach Bill Jones will be going with untested personnel at several key positions.

In all, 46 boys who were members of last year's varsity and freshman team were not on hand when pre-season practice began Sept. 1. This left Jones with just 14 lettermen to start with as a nucleus.

The picture is not quite as dark ("Darn near," says Jones) as the small number of letterwinners would suggest. When an outstanding transfer student and four well-regarded junior college grads are added, the total goes up to 19 experienced hands which is not too bad a starting nucleus.

While the number of high-grade freshmen moving up to the varsity this year is small primarily because of disastrous academic achievements of many freshman prospects, there are several promising prospects. The experienced hands and sophomore prospects should give Jones two reasonably solid teams.

Behind these 22 players though, the talent drops off quickly. If the Sycamores should be hit by a series of injuries and illnesses such as occurred in 1961, the outlook could get bleak in a hurry.

The biggest holes Coach Jones is seeking to fill right now are at quarterback, center, and tackle. The first two quarterbacks, the first three centers, and four of the first five tackles from 1961 squad are gone.

Trying to replace quarterbacks Gil Fujawa and Bobby Clements are Pat Jones, a Clinton junior with limited playing time last season and sophomore Clarence Reedy, Terre Haute. The center position was the sole property of Charlie Hettenbach, Evansville junior, when practice opened.

The tackle spots will be filled from three junior college transfers, Don Pugh, Brawley Gilmore and Vernoon Lewis, and a returning senior letterman Dan Ross, Indianapolis.

The strongest positions when practice started were guard and end. The guard situation is in the hands of veterans Ed McCauley, a Butler University transfer; Wally Geib, Hobart junior; Garry Knorr, Rensselaer junior; Brent Anderson, Terre Haute senior; and Rolland Beckham, Indianapolis junior. Also lending depth here is sophomore John Allen, Terre Haute.

The ends will be manned by Bill Jones, Clinton senior, Carl Zarndt, Griffith senior; and sophomore Joe Mervar, Indianapolis. Figuring in the picture at both guard and end when practice began was Joe Beech, Francesville senior.

A two-year letterwinner, Beach is generally regarded as the best player on the squad. He would be a virtual cinch for All-Indiana Collegiate Conference team at guard where he has played the past two seasons, but Jones feels his services may be more useful at an end spot this year.

How does Indiana State in 1962 compare with the Indiana State team of 1961? It's hard to say. Certainly, Jones and his staff have high hopes of improving on last year's disappointing 2-6 record.

However, they also realize that every team on the 1962 schedule has improved over the year. The big question is have the Sycamores improved more than the rest. On the face probably not, but only time and a few games will tell.
