INDIANA STATE COACHING STAFF

BILL JONES, Head Football Coach (Ohio Wesleyan, '39)

Indiana State's head football coach Bill Jones is one of the most original thinkers in college football today, and since coming to State in 1957, he has used this originality along with a sound knowledge of football fundamentals to begin a program which promises to take the Sycamores to heights which they have never before reached.

Bill has twice been named Indiana Collegiate Conference Coach-of-the-Year, the first time in 1959 and again last year.

The 1962 season was undoubtedly the most satisfying for Jones since he came to State. His Sycamores--minus some 46 players from the 1961 varsity and freshman teams--was a solid pick to wind up in the cellar in the ICC. However, to the surprise of everyone--including the players and Jones--it finished in a tie for second in the league with Valparaiso and was in competition for the championship right up to the final weekend of the season.

The originality of Jones, who introduced the Lonesome End at State a year before Red Blaik did at Army, again showed through when he developed an unbalanced line wing-T set-up which proved to be devastating. The new in appearances, the system was as old as football in that it relied on plain, old-fashion blocking in accepted conventional patterns to make it work.

It was only fitting that Jones should start to get some satisfaction from his work at State, for he has faced a monumental task in raising the Sycamores football fortunes from the greatest depths of their history.

It's been an uphill fight, but Jones has been winning it. His first two seasons here (1957 and 1958) found him compiling a cumulative 3-12 record. Then, with the players getting adjusted to his system, a 5-3 season resulted in 1959. In 1960, the Sycamores captured the last three tilts of the season after losing the first four by close scores.

Jones hit a temporary snag in 1961 when a combination of things--including an abnormal number of injuries resulted in a disappointing 2-6 record. But last year's success indicates that Bill is again back on schedule in his efforts to bring State football to the top in the intercollegiate sports scene.

Jones came to Indiana State in 1957 after an amazing record at Sullivan, Ind. High School. From 1952 through 1956, his Sullivan elevens lost only four games and had two 20-game winning streaks. He was at Sullivan High School for 13 years and also served as athletic director. He coached the Sullivan basketball team for the 1956-57 season. His father was a coal miner, but Jones had his first jobs in automobile manufacturing plants.

Coach Jones hopes to instill in young men the correct attitude toward athletics. He wants to satisfy the natural desire to participate, develop sportsmanlike attitudes, and create a striving for victory; however, always working harder to improve skills and accept criticism. With such noteworthy aims, Jones-coached young men are certain to be better players and better citizens.

CHESTER E. SANDERS, Head Backfield and Defensive (Indiana U., '48)

In his third year on the ISC coaching staff, Chester E. Sanders was assistant football and golf coach and head wrestling coach at Wabash (Ind.) College from 1955-59. He is recognized as one of the finest defensive coaches in the Midwest. A graduate of Brazil, Ind., High School, he earned the B.S. and M.S. degrees at Indiana University and he was named on the 1945 Big Ten Team.

Sanders coached at high schools in Hobart, Ind., 1948-50, East Gary, Ind., 1950-53, and Clinton, Ind., 1953-55, before going to Wabash College in 1955.

JOHN L. LONGFELLOW, Athletic Director (Manchester, '28)

Regarded as one of Indiana's finest basketball coaches, John L. Longfellow joined the ISC staff as head basketball coach and athletic director in 1948. In six seasons, 1948-54, he piloted ISC basketball teams to 12 assorted championships, the top title being the National Association of Intercollegiate

Athletics crown in 1950. Named Indiana's 1950 college Coach of the Year, he coached the U.S. Olympic basketball team that won the Pan American Games basketball title in Buenos Aires, Argentina, in 1951. Seven of his ISC players were on that U.S. Olympic team. A heart attack in 1955 forced him to quit coaching basketball, but he continues as the athletic director.

As head coach at Elkhart, Ind. High School, Longfellow's teams over a 19-year period won 24 championships and 113 of 165 N.I.H.S.C. games. He served as president of the N.A.I.A. and has been a member of the N.A.I.A. executive board for a number of years.

In 1958, he was sent by the U.S. State Department as an American specialist to the Republic of Haiti to supervise a program of athletics from the university level on down through the secondary and elementary schools. He also spent some time assisting Haitian coaches in preparing Haitian athletes for competition in the Olympics and Pan American games.

PAUL E. SELGE, Head Line Coach (Indiana State, '43)

A veteran and versatile member of the Indiana State coaching staff since 1946, except for a two-year period 1951-52 when he was recalled for a tour of duty with the U.S. Navy, Paul E. Selge has been Head Line Coach every season since he joined the staff. In 1955, he was the acting Head Football Coach.

An Indiana State graduate, Selge, a native of South Bend, Ind., is a Woodrow Wilson High School (South Bend) graduate. He did not play high school football, but ranks as one of all-time outstanding Indiana State football players. He was a varsity center under Sycamore Coach Walter E. Marks for three seasons and was named at the center position on the 1941 and 1942 Indiana All-State Collegiate teams. He earned the M.S. degree at Indiana State.

He serves as the college's Head Swimming Coach and has also been Head Track Coach.

ROBERT L. HOLLAR, Head Freshman Coach (Manchester, '41)

Robert L. Hollar assists coaching the varsity linemen until the middle of September and then he devotes his efforts to freshmen football players. He

is head coach of the freshman basketball team also.

A member of the ISC staff since 1950, Hollar is the former Dean of the ISC Laboratory School and coached varsity linemen during the 1951, 1952, and 1955 seasons. He was named as a full-time member of the college coaching staff in 1955.

Before joining the ISC staff in 1950, Hollar was coach at Van Buren (Ind.) and New Paris (Ind.) high schools and Hanover College.

THE 1963 OUTLOOK

The Indiana State football picture this year could best be compared to a best-selling book--with no first or last chapter. At most positions the Sycamores have the potential to be a serious contender for the Indiana Collegiate Conference championship, but their hopes for improving on last year's 5-3 record are dimmed considerably by the lack of any ends who measure up to ICC requirements.

Ends are by no means Coach Bill Jones only problem, but they are by all means his most serious. Only junior Joe Mervar from Indianapolis returns at the flanker spots, and that means that replacements must be found from other areas.

At the end of the first week of preseason practice the other end running with the first unit was senior Ernie Lewis from Feriday, La., who lettered at tackle last year. Lewis is a good blocker but is limited as a pass receiver and as a defensive player.

Others who were receiving consideration at the spots were sophomores Byron Elmendorf from Evansville, Gary Richard from Hart, Mich., Jim Lowe from Crown Point, and John Connelly from Lafayette and junior college transfers Willie Smith from Paterson, N.J., and Bob Lui from Baltimore, Md. At this writing, Elmendorf and Smith seemed to be the best prospects.

The next sore spot in terms of personnel problems is at guard where senior Rolland Beckham of Indianapolis, the Sycamores' MVP in '62 and a co-captain this trip, is the only lettering returnee. His likely starting mate is hard-nosed sophomore Edgar Freese, also from Indianapolis, while two other sophomores, Danny McGrath from Cleveland, Ohio, and Jack Coats from Terre Haute, will provide the bulk of the support.

The tackle situation is in fairly good shape although the reserve strength is not as good this time as it was a year ago. The starters will again be All-

ICC senior Wally Geib from Hobart, the other co-captain, and junior Art Fallon, from Quincy, Mass., who blossomed fantastically a year ago although he didn't play any high school ball.

Backing them up will be junior Bill Beeslin from Gary who lettered two years ago at center but missed last year due to grades, and sophomore Jim Session from Terre Haute, who has been a pleasant surprise in practice.

Center is again well-protected with three lettermen, including junior starter John Allen from Terre Haute returning. The other monogram winners are seniors Charley Hettenback from Evansville and Terry Stepp from Marshall, Ill. Beeslin can also help out here if needed.

The backfield is well-stocked with at least two lettermen at each positions. Quarterback will again alternate in the hands of junior Clarence Reedy from Terre Haute and Pat Jones from Clinton. Behind them are sophomores Gary Page from Angola, Scott Riley from Evansville and Don Turich from Whiting.

The starting wingback post will probably again be filled by senior Moyese Williams from Elkhart. But he won't be able to loaf because letterman Jack Brake, a senior from West Lafayette, and Don Pope, a junior from Plainfield, can also fill the post quite adequately.

The starting assignment at halfback again promises to be a dogfight between junior Pat Tuttle from Casey, Ill., last year's leading ground gainer, and senior Jon Pope, Don's older brother. Sophomore Jim Bracey from Flint, Mich., is the back-up man.

The fullback post will be contested between senior John Bush, from Marshall, Ill., who alternated in the starting position here in 1962, and senior Walt Heilig from Peterson, N.J., who gained his letter as halfback a year ago.

Bush will again handle the punting chores which he performed quite ably last season with a 37.2 average. Jones is the placement kicker; he kicked eight of 11 PATs last year.

From the overall viewpoint, the Sycamores should be stronger on offense because they've had a year of experience with Coach Jones' offense. The defense, however, must be considered weaker because there are no ends around to match the graduated Joe Beach, an All-ICC performer, and Bill Jones, Jr.

In summarizing, it seems safe to say that State will field a team which is better than last year's team which finished in a second-place tie with Valparaiso in the ICC. But the question is, "Have they improved enough to keep up with the rest of the league?"

Only time will tell.
