## SYCAMORES QUALIFY FOR MISSOURI VALLEY RACE

While Indiana State plays only four football games against Missouri Valley Conference schools this fall, the Sycamores will qualify for the 1977 conference championship by virtue of a fifth "designated" MVC contest.

Not one to put things off, the Sycamores' designated tilt will be their Sept. 10 opener against Southland Conference powerhouse McNeese State. Other designated games around the MVC are Southern Illinois at Arkansas State (Sept. 24) and Tulsa at Cincinnati (Oct. 22).

Other Valley schools—Drake, New Mexico State, West Texas State and Wichita State—have five foes within the loop to automatically qualify for the crown race.

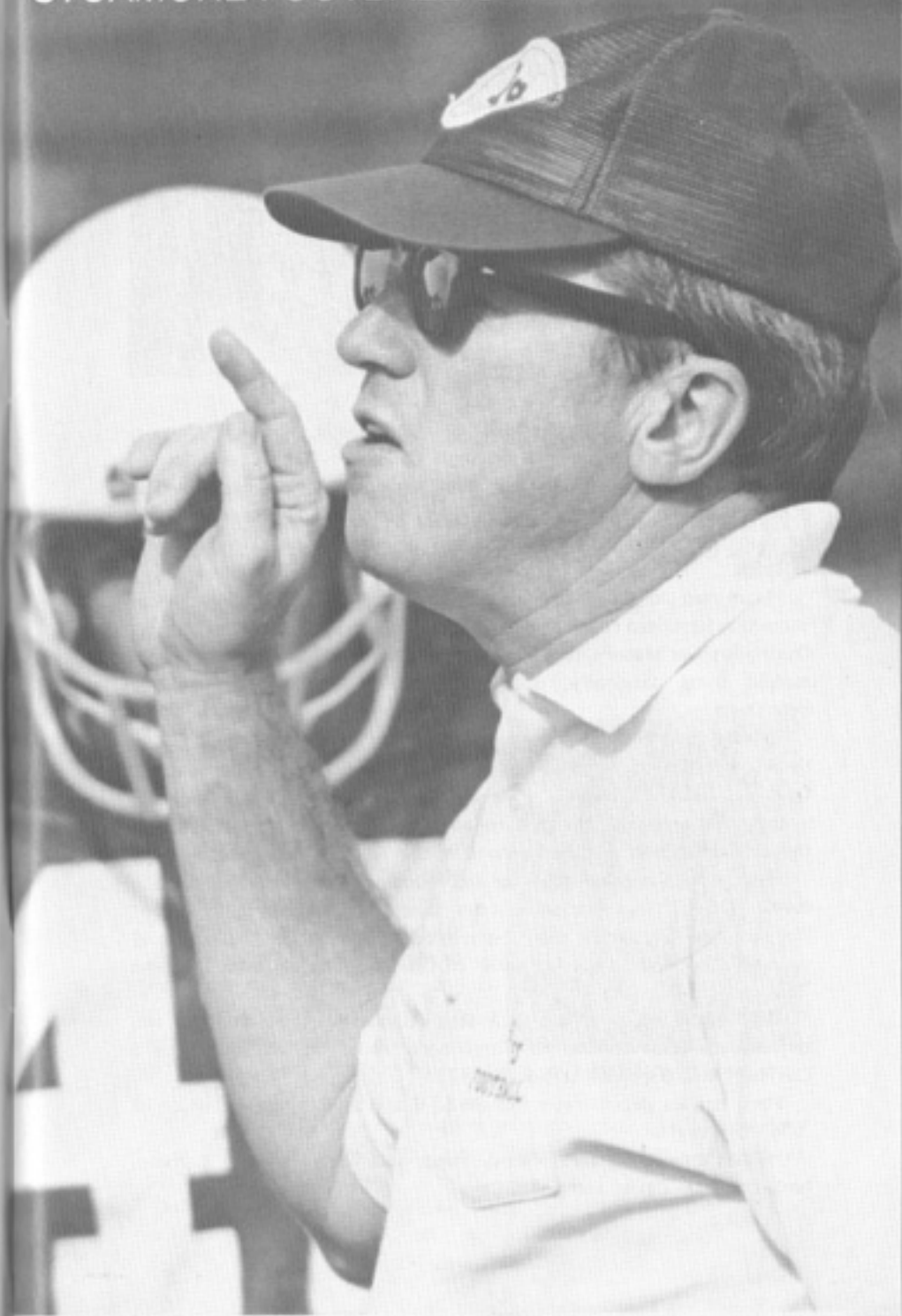

**TOM HARP  
HEAD FOOTBALL COACH**

For the 20th season, Tom Harp will serve as a head football coach. During that career, Harp has served at both the high school and college levels and will begin his fifth season at Indiana State University.

The 49-year-old Barnesville, Ohio native came to Indiana State after serving as assistant coach at Navy under Rick Forzano in 1972. He was also an assistant to Army's Red Blaik from 1956 to 1960.

Harp's coaching experience began at Carrollton (Ohio) High School where he started in 1951. After three seasons, he moved to a similar post at prestigious Massillon (Ohio) High School. In two seasons there he won the Ohio prep championship in 1954 and was state runner-up in 1955.

He moved to the collegiate coaching ranks the following season, becoming backfield coach and chief scout for Earl (Red) Blaik at Army. During his five seasons at West Point, Army's 1958 club was unbeaten, ranked third nationally, and produced Heisman Trophy winner Pete Dawkins.

Tapped as Cornell mentor in 1961, Harp's Big Red teams produced three Ivy League rushing leaders in five years. Appointed head coach at Duke in 1966, he led the Blue Devils to a 5-5 season and a 41-25 victory over arch-rival North Carolina in his first year. His last squad at the Durham school finished second in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Harp, who played football for Sid Gillman at Miami of Ohio for one season (1945), was graduated cum laude from Muskingum (Ohio) College in 1951. While there he played for coach Ed Sherman and quarterbacked the school to a pair of Ohio Conference titles ('49 and '50).

He "redshirted" a year of coaching between his stints at Duke and the Naval Academy and sold insurance and reported sports for a Durham, N.C. television station in 1971.

Harp has an overall record of 96-83-6 and a winning percentage of .536 in 19 years.

He has three daughters, Marcey, Peggy and Molly. His wife, Barbara, has a daughter Betsy, and a son, Cam.

**BOB PYCHINKA  
DEFENSE COACH**

Bob Pychinka begins his eighth year on the Sycamore football staff and his second season as defensive coordinator.

Pychinka, who basically works with linebackers and defensive ends, was one of the best athletes to attend Indiana State University.

The '68 graduate won three letters in football, starring at linebacker, and twice was an Indiana

Collegiate Conference all-star. He also was an outstanding wrestler, winning three ICC mat titles.

"Chico"—defensive line coach for four years—was frosh mentor in '70 and '71. Prior to that he served as assistant football and wrestling coach at Calumet High School, and in 1969 his freshman team there was 5-2-1.

The 32-year-old Allentown, Pa. native is married to the former Jane Ann Stultz.

**BILL DOLE  
OFFENSIVE LINE COACH**

Bill Dole is in his fifth season as offensive line coach at ISU.

He came here in 1973 from North Carolina, where he had been a grad assistant for two years and in '72 served as an assistant coach.

A '64 graduate of Davidson, where he was a star offensive and defensive tackle, Dole received a military commission and spent six years as an Army captain before being released from active duty in July, 1970.

Dole, 35, who holds a M.S. degree in communications, is a product of a coaching family. His late father, Bill Sr., was head grid coach at East Carolina and Davidson.

Dole is married to the former Kathy Cole.



**BOB TURNER  
DEFENSIVE BACK COACH**

Bob Turner, who starred in Indiana State's defensive backfield for three seasons, is in his third year as a Sycamore coach—and second working with the defensive secondary.

A '72 graduate who worked with offensive backs here for a season ('75), Turner tied a Sycamore record by intercepting nine passes during



his sophomore year, and picked off a total of 16 aerials for 219 yards in three campaigns. He also returned 22 punts for 250 yards and a TD during his career.

Before joining Coach Harp's staff at his alma mater, Turner was assistant football and basketball coach at Kokomo Haworth for three years ('73-75).

The 28-year-old East Chicago Washington product is married to the former Sheryl Oliver.

**CAROL PURICHIA  
OFFENSIVE BACK COACH**

Carol Purichia is in his second go-around as a member of the ISU football coaching staff.

Purichia, here the first time for four seasons ('69-72), spent three campaigns at Western Illinois before returning to ISU. This will be his second season under Tom Harp, after four under the Sycamores' previous mentor Jerry Huntsman.

The 38-year-old Indianapolis native came to I-State initially from



Chatard High in Indy, where he had been football and wrestling coach for five years. There his teams won two city titles and three conference crowns.

"Rico" earned his degrees from Indiana Central ('61) and Butler ('66), quarterbacked the Greyhounds for four years.

Purichia and his wife, Donna, have two daughters, Angela, 8, and Toni, 1.

**MIKE WESTHOFF  
DEFENSIVE LINE COACH**



Mike Westhoff is in his initial season as defensive coach at ISU.

The 29-year-old Westhoff, who was offensive line coach at Dayton last year, was an assistant coach at Indiana in '75, after serving as a grad assistant for a season.

The Bethel Park, Pa., native was a three-year prep starter at that

community's high school and, after a year at Wyoming (1965) transferred to Wichita State, where he was a three-season starter for the Shockers.

A '70 grad of the MVC school, Westhoff was a two-way gridder at WSU (defensive end and center), and as a senior was both captain and most valuable offensive player.

Before moving to the college ranks, Westhoff gained coaching experience at four high schools: Wichita Collegiate, Midland (Pa.), Peters (Pa.) Township and Canon-McMillan (Pa.). He also gained some hours on a post-graduate degree at Penn State and Pittsburgh before completing his master's degree at Indiana.

Westhoff is married to the former Marilyn Meredith.

**GRID GRAD ASSISTANTS**

Coach Tom Harp and his staff will have additional coaching aid in 1977 because of the efforts of these graduate assistants:

—Tim Campana of Kent, Ohio, a '76 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan;

**MEL BLICKENSTAFF  
SUPERVISOR OF TRAINERS  
ATHLETIC TRAINER**

It was in 1962 that Mel Blickenstaff joined the Indiana State staff as an athletic trainer, and what a plus he has been to the University!

"Blick," one of only eight trainers selected for the 1976 U.S. Olympic team medical squad, also served with U.S. Pan American team at Mexico City in 1975.

Before joining ISU 15 years ago, he gained various experience: nine years as a coach in northern Indiana, three years as a physical reconditioning instructor in the Air Force during World War II, and 11 years as athletic trainer at Columbus (Ind.) High School.

Blickenstaff earned his B.S. degree at Manchester ('38), gained his master's from Indiana ('47) and has specialized instructions in P.E. and athletic training (IU '51). He and his wife, Mary, have three grown sons.

**RAY BAGGETT  
ATHLETIC TRAINER**

Ray Baggett is in his eleventh year as trainer at Indiana State and has some 20 years of experience behind him. He works with Mel Blickenstaff in the Athletic Training curriculum, serves as trainer for football and assists with training in all other sports.

He came to ISU in 1967 after serving as trainer at the U.S. Military

Academy at West Point, N.Y., for three years. Before that, he was a trainer at Indiana University for seven years.

Baggett gained a bachelor of science degree from Troy (Ala.) State University in 1957, a master of science degree from Indiana in 1958 and a Director of Health degree, with specialization in health education from IU in 1966.

**HAROLD GARVIN  
EQUIPMENT MANAGER**

Harold Garvin, who joined the athletic department staff as equipment manager in October, 1973, is in his 12th year as an ISU employee.

Before moving to athletics, Garvin was assistant supervisor in maintenance at Tiley Memorial Union Building.

A Terre Haute native, Garvin is a graduate of Garfield High School and spent three years (1943-46) in the U.S. Army.

He and his wife, Virginia, have five children.

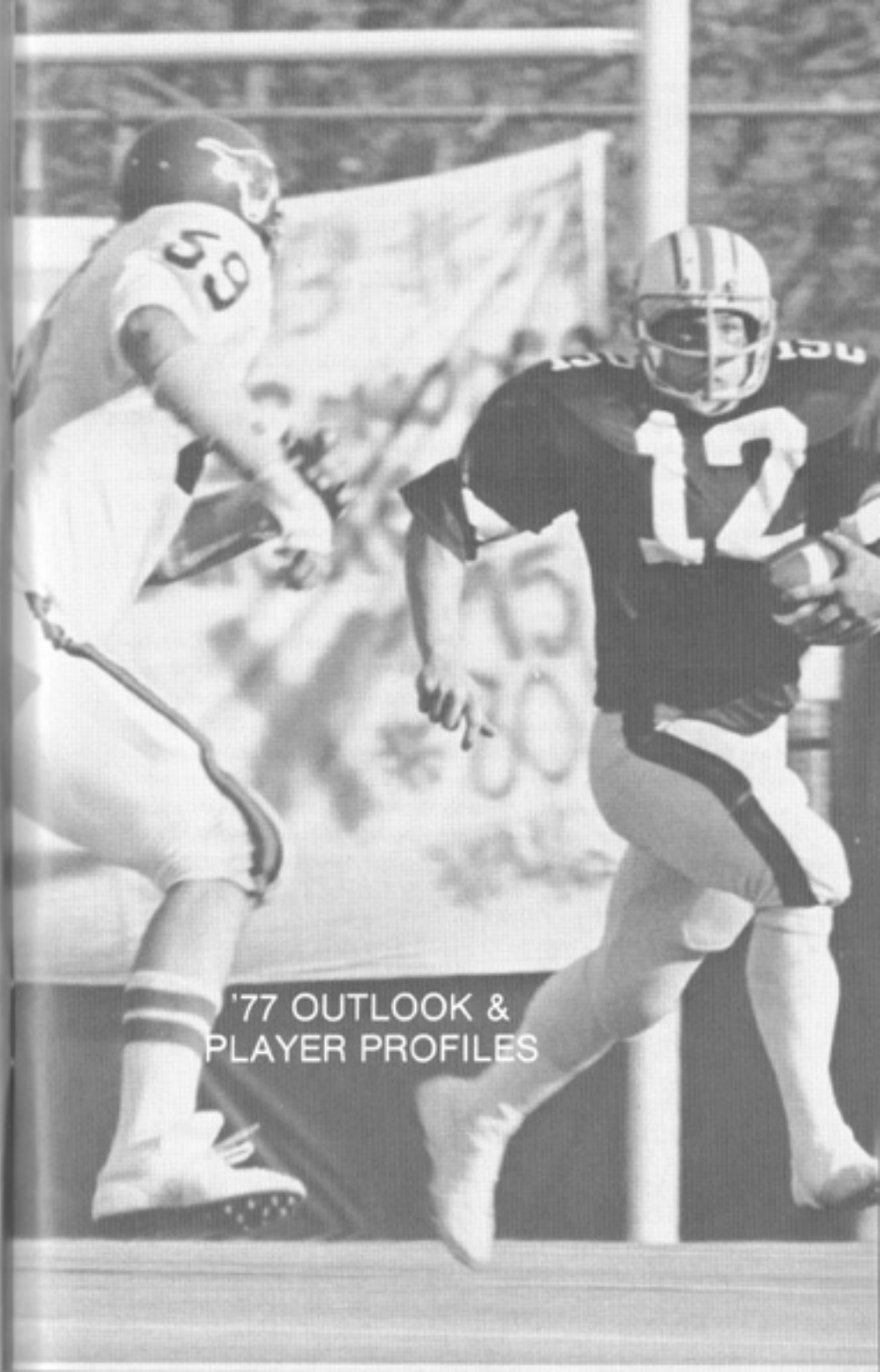
Hetherington, director of the student health center—as well as a staff physician there since 1975, also joined ISU's football medical staff in 1975.

### HOW WE BECAME THE SYCAMORES...

The name "Sycamores" was adopted by a student body general election in 1921. A contest was started that year for a school name to be selected on Blue and White Day, a forerunner to Homecoming. The names were to be submitted to a committee of four, with that group's top three choices being placed before the student body in a campus-wide election. The name Sycamores was among the three submitted. Although it was roundly booed when placed on the ballot the students, in an apparent joke, gave the name a one-sided victory in the election. The winner of the contest received \$3 as first prize for his entry. The name was first used January 3, 1922, in the Normal Advance, predecessor of The Statesman, present campus newspaper.

## INDIANA STATE FOOTBALL '77 OUTLOOK

If it's a challenge that will bring out the best in this fall's Indiana State University football team, coach Tom Harp's gridders might go undefeated in all 10 starts in 1977.

Starting their second campaign as a major college grid entry, the Sycamores also are eligible for their first Missouri Valley Conference football title. (And although ISU won't meet defending champ Tulsa or New Mexico State, Harp's fifth squad will play a "wild card" MVC game against McNeese State—current powerhouse of the Southland Conference.)

Indiana State, returning 25 lettermen from last year's injury-plagued 3-7 squad, again tackles the most ambitious football schedule attempted by the school.

In addition to Independence Bowl victor McNeese State, I-State meets MVC foes Drake, Southern Illinois, West Texas State and Wichita State, Mid-American titlist Ball State, improving Division I entries Louisville, Western Carolina and Illinois State, and 1976 NCAA Division II runnerup, Akron.

Several questions loom on the Sycamore horizon, not the least of which is the status of '75 Little All-America halfback Vincent Allen (Richmond), who missed last season because of mid-summer knee surgery. Allen, whose ball carrying abilities are reflected in ISU's record book (where he holds seven individual bests), spent last spring in intensive training readying himself for the fall.

Hopeful and frank about Allen's chances for a successful return to the ISU lineup, Harp isn't optimistic (although he'll soon find out), but admits, "In my 26 years of coaching, I've never had another player as good as Vincent."

"Last year, in looking at films and checking times when we needed a first down, I figure Vincent could have made the difference in three or four victories."

"Even minus VA," continued Harp, "we had a fine spring. Enthusiasm was high. It's a pleasure having a group of people who want to work and who are willing to do what they have to do in order to be the best they can."

"We have some veterans," Harp said, "but we also have a lot of young people playing vital roles for us. We know they haven't reached their peak from a mechanical standpoint but we do know they are hustlers and they're fun to coach."

Harp, who added that he and his staff can tolerate errors when they are made by players giving 100 per cent, said his club will battle and

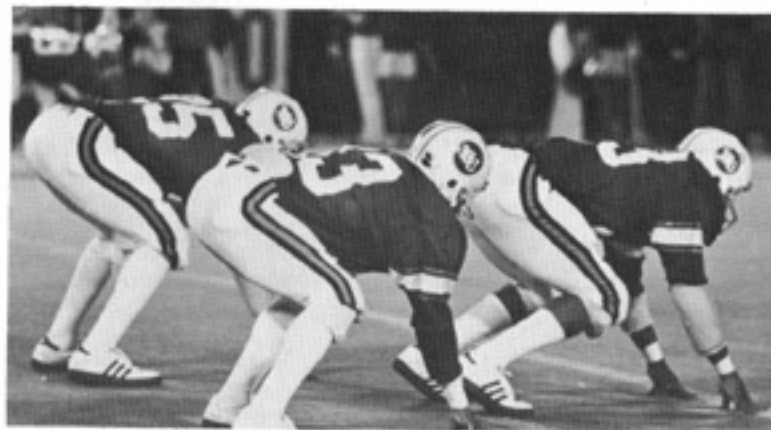
give it all they have. ("While we're probably a little too young to expect anything fantastic because we don't have many upperclassmen—no one will run us out of any stadium.")

While senior guard Tony Suriano (Medinah, Ill.) is the only returning starter upfront, a handful of backs saw enough duty to letter last year: quarterback Pete McCoy (St. Louis, Mo.), fullback Harry Turner (Cincinnati, Ohio) and halfbacks Mark Hardy (South Bend Adams), Tom Johnson (Markham, Ill.) and Kevin Weatherby (Indianapolis Washington.)

Other bright spots for the Sycamore offense include aerial targets Mike Brantley (Monongahela, Pa.), the team's leading receiver last season and his alternate, explosive Royce Allen (Indianapolis Manual), who caught ISU's only three TD passes in '76. Another senior receiver-blocker is tight end Jim Jelenick (Chicago, Ill.).

Defensively, the lineup is a bit more predictable with the return of nine regulars: Bruce Montagner (Mertztown, Pa.), fifth nationally last year in kickoff returns (25.7), Greg Washington (Oviedo, Fla.), Roger Tuttle (Scottsburg) and Ken Cantrell (Elkhart Central) in the secondary; linebacker Marty Murray (Warren, Ohio), and lineman Jeff Larimore (Hobart), Dave Lowe (Terre Haute South) and soph Gerry Gluscic (McKeesport, Pa.). Mark Kupets (Republic, Pa.)—probably the top pro prospect on the squad—has switched from linebacker to defensive end after leading the squad in tackles as a junior with 158.

The kicking game looks solid as a pair of juniors—placekicker Dave Vandercook (Ellettsville Edgewood), the team's leading scorer, and punter Bill Edwards (Terre Haute South), who averaged 40.1 yards per boot in '76—anticipate good seasons.



Again in 1977, the Sycamores will employ the "wishbone" offense.

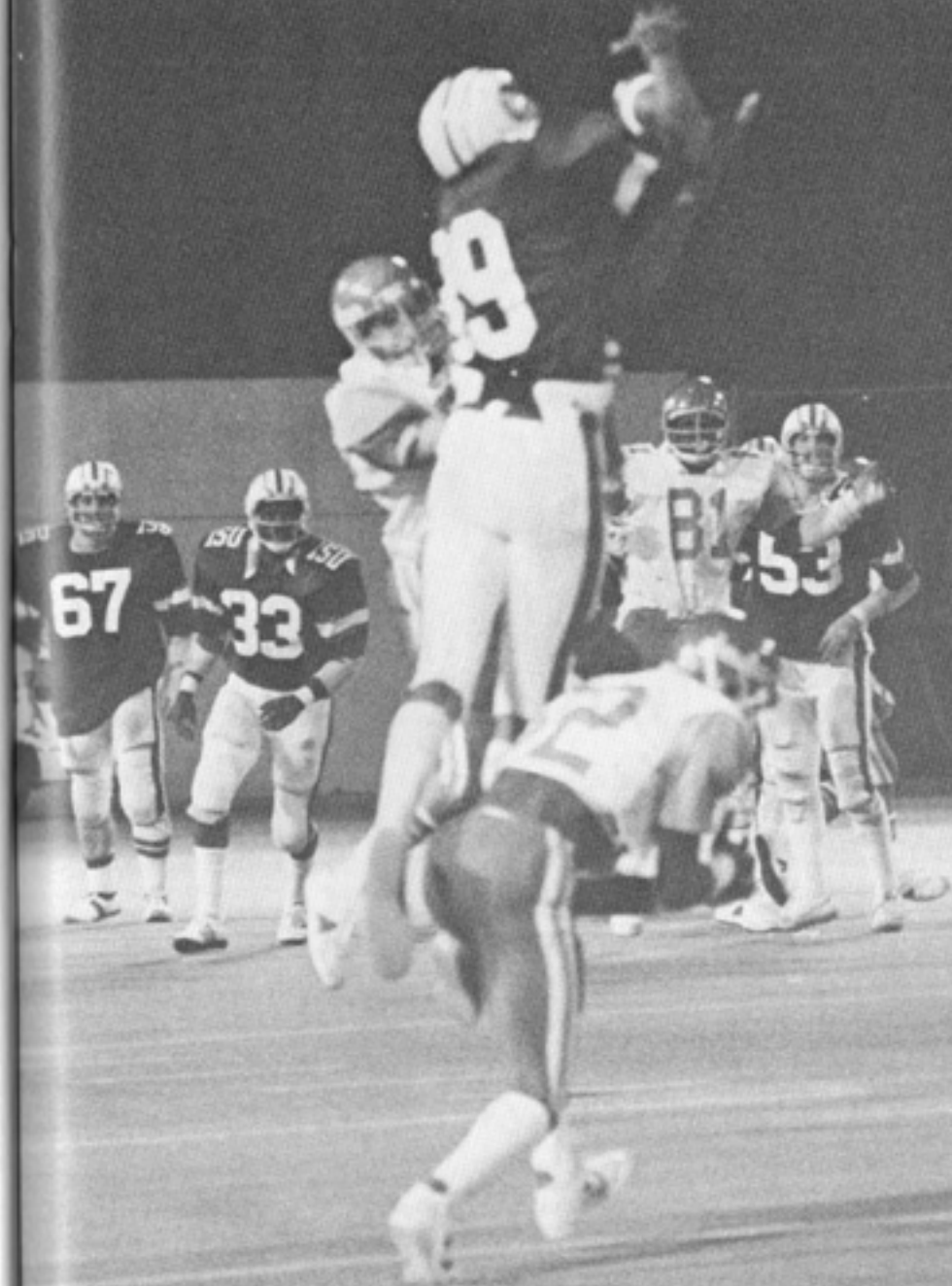

**INDIANA STATE GAME-BY-GAME AWARDS**

The Indiana State University football coaching staff presents a number of awards following each game, the purpose of the honors being to reward outstanding effort and to provide incentive for future effort.

After grading the game films, the coaches present awards to the **Offensive Back of the Week, Offensive Lineman of the Week, Defensive Back of the Week, Defensive Lineman of the Week and Linebacker of the Week.** These awards are determined by the film grades and reward the players in those categories who have the best efficiency percentages.

**Hatchet Awards** are presented weekly to back and lineman players, who in the opinion of the coaching staff, inflicted the most damage on the opponent. Winners may have had key fumble recoveries or interceptions, a long run at a crucial time, etc.

Individual awards are also presented weekly for big plays, such as a scoring run or pass, a key block on a scoring play, a tackle behind the line of scrimmage, etc. Winners of these awards receive decorations for their helmets that they wear the remainder of the season.

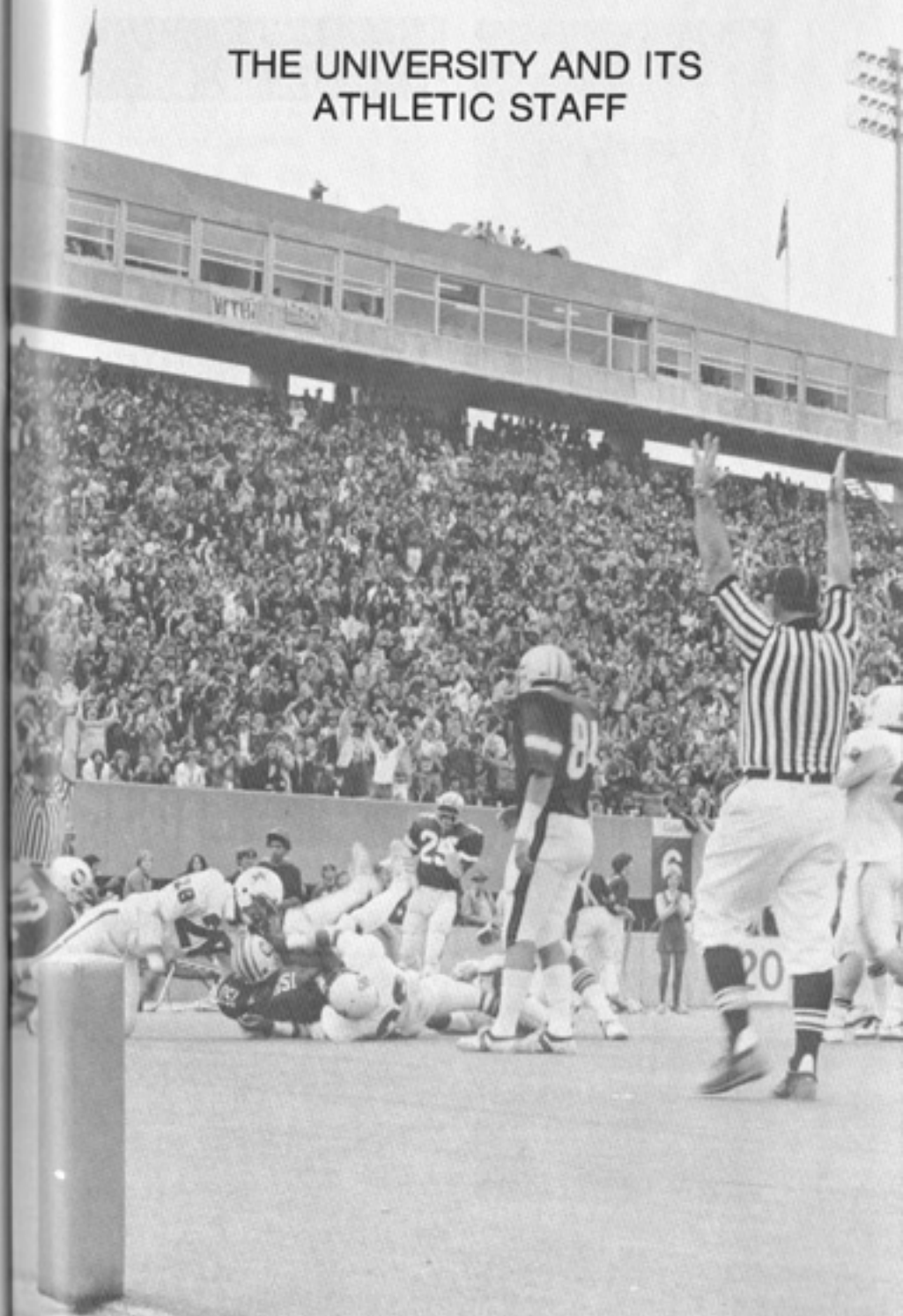

Bob King

**BOB KING  
DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS  
BASKETBALL COACH**

Bob King is in his fourth year as director of athletics and third as basketball coach at Indiana State.

Last year as cage mentor he led the Sycamores to their winningest season ever (25-3) and to the NIT tournament. King's two-year mark at ISU is 38-15.

King, whose 12-year college coaching record is 213-104 (.671), came to Indiana State after 12

years at New Mexico, the last two as associate athletic director.

His primary notoriety at UNM, though, came between 1962-72 when he served as Lobo basketball coach. In a decade there he was 175-89 (.663), and four of his clubs went on to post-season activity—three NITs and one NCAA playoff. (His '64 team was runnerup to Bradley in the NIT, and he also shared one WAC title.)

In addition to coaching All-America Larry Bird at ISU, King has produced several fine cagers at New Mexico who went on to professional careers: Mel Daniels (Indiana Pacers), Willie Long (Denver Nuggets), Ira Harge (ABA veteran), Ron Nelson (The Floridians), Ron Sanford (Dallas Chaps) and Greg Howard (Phoenix Suns).

Previous to his stint at UNM, King was head assistant cage coach at Iowa for three years ('59-62), where he helped coach Don Nelson, current coach of the Milwaukee Bucks.

The 54-year-old Gravity, Iowa, native, who never has had a losing season in 26 years of collegiate and high school coaching, was graduated from Iowa in 1947 and 10 years later earned a master's degree in psychology from Drake University.

An officer in the U.S. Air Force from 1943-46, King started his coaching career at prep level, spending 14 years at schools in Britt and Algona, Iowa, and Rockford, Ill. His record in three sports over that period was 363-124 (.745).

One of 55 applicants for the top Sycamore athletic post, King was the unanimous choice of ISU's 10-person search committee, a group that looked "from coast to coast for an experienced, enthusiastic and highly-respected athletic administrator."

King and his wife, Sharel, have six children: Chris, 29; Gary, 25; Larry, 24; Dianne, 7; Brad, 5, and Randy, 3.

**JERRY HUNTSMAN  
ASSISTANT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR**



Jerry Huntsman, who left the football coaching profession a winner (7-3) in 1972, is assistant athletic director, and served as acting director of athletics prior to the arrival of Bob King.

Huntsman, whose seven-year record here was 43-24-1 (.639), is in his fifth campaign as an athletic administrator. Prior to coming to ISU as backfield coach in 1965, Jerry guided Earlham College to 29 victories in 32 games through four seasons. (His 1962 club was undefeated.) His prep coaching experience was gained at Waveland, Covington, Crawfordsville and Huntington and his final coaching mark was 105-39-4 (.723).

A native of Richmond, Ind., and a 1952 graduate of Wabash College, Huntsman earned a master's degree from Purdue in 1958. As a quarterback at Wabash he was named an all-state small college gridder in 1951.

Jerry and his wife, Coralee, have three sons—Brent, 20, Jerry, 18, and Scott, 15.

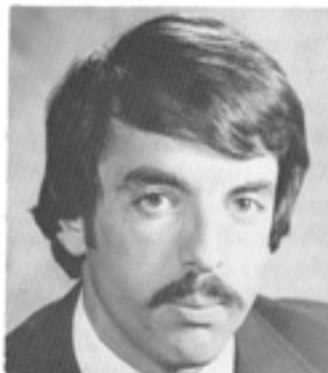
**JOE MacISAAC

**DR. JACK JESSELL**  
**NCAA FACULTY ATHLETIC REPRESENTATIVE**

Dr. John C. Jessell is in his fifth year as ISU's faculty athletic representative to the NCAA. A professor of education and director of the division of guidance and counseling in the graduate education department, Dr. Jessell joined ISU's staff in 1964.

A former college baseball player at New Haven (Conn.) State (now Southern Connecticut), he gained a master's in education at Ohio U., and doctoral degree at Wisconsin.



**DR. RICHARD G. LANDINI**  
**PRESIDENT, INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY**

Dr. Richard G. Landini, now in his third year as President of Indiana State University, was a most important factor in the Sycamores' admission into the Missouri Valley Conference on March 9, 1976.

But that figures. He's a doer—not a passive spectator. (In fact, Landini is a former New York Yankee farmhand, having hurled for the Yanks' Class D club in the Coastal Plains League in the 1940s.)

Educationally, the 48-year-old Landini earned his bachelor of arts (1954) and a master of arts (1956) degrees as an English major at the University of Miami in Florida. In 1959 he gained a doctor of philosophy from the University of Florida.

Following those three years at Florida, Landini served on the Arizona State University staff for 11 years ('59-70)—the last two years as

assistant to the president of ASU. He then moved to the University of Montana in 1970 as academic vice-president and professor of English. After five years there he succeeded Dr. Alan C. Rankin here and became ISU's eighth president.

Landini, who resides on the ISU campus with his wife, Phyllis, is the proud father of four sons and one daughter: Richard, 22; Gregory, 21, Matthew, 19; Cynthia, 17, and Vincent, 12.

**ISU HISTORY**

Indiana State University—formed Dec. 20, 1865—now is in its 108th year of operation. The University opened its doors to 21 students (13 women and eight men) on Jan. 6, 1870.

The announced purpose of forming the University at that time was an institution that would "be to teachers what law school is to lawyers and medical school is to doctors."

The school was known as Indiana State Normal School from 1870 until 1927, when the name was changed to Indiana State Teachers College. In 1961, the name again changed, this time to Indiana State College. The latest, and probably the final, name change came in the spring of 1965 when the Indiana Legislature renamed the school Indiana State University.
