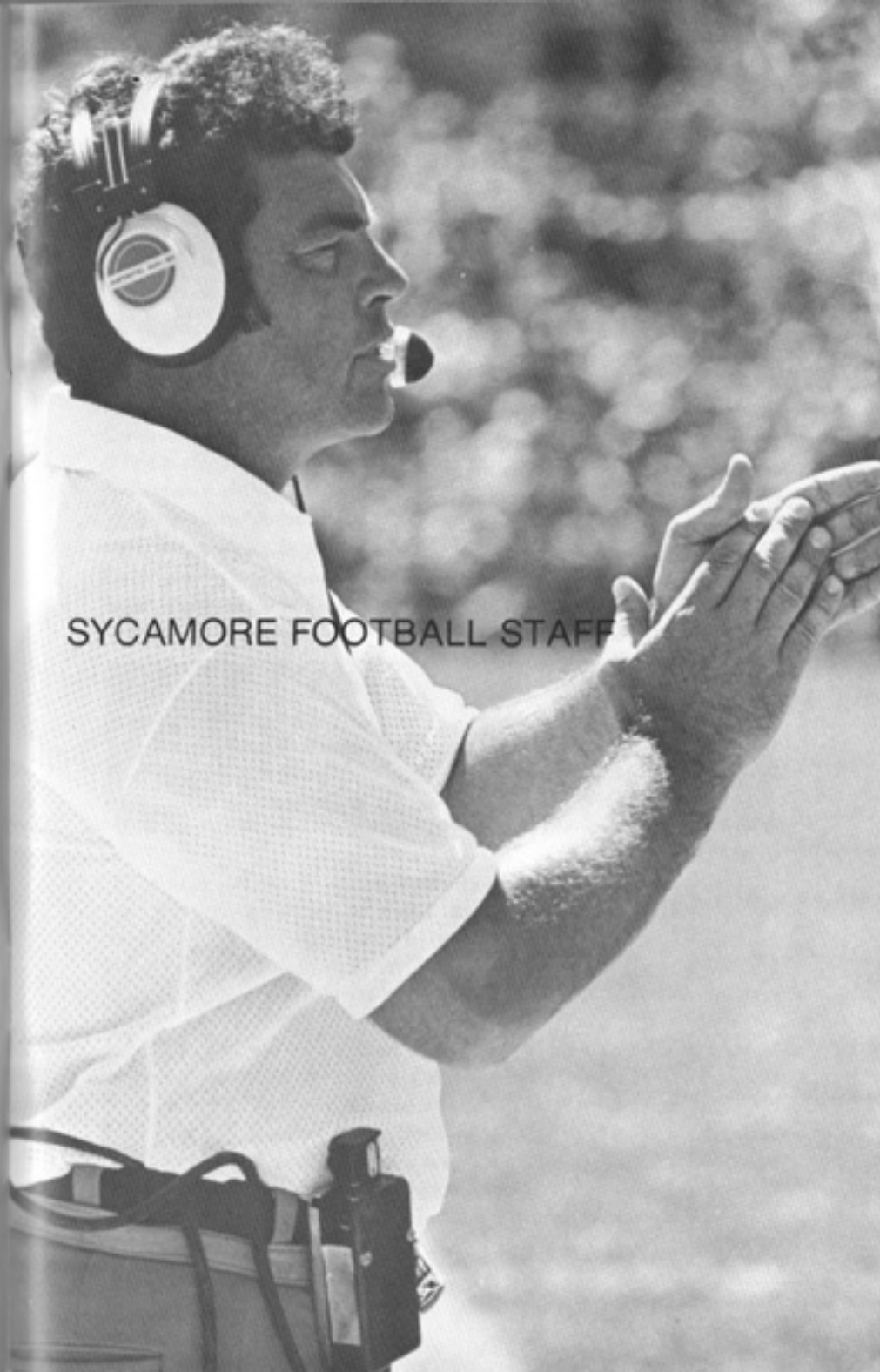

SYCAMORE FOOTBALL STAFF

**DICK JAMIESON
HEAD FOOTBALL COACH**

Dick Jamieson, a mighty "Brave" guy with a twist of "Tiger" thrown in for good measure, is in his first season as head football coach at Indiana State University.

A former star quarterback at Bradley University and for the past six seasons offensive coordinator at the University of Missouri, Jamieson has experienced plenty at those two institutions—and in between—but not as a college head coach.

As a 19-year-old sophomore at his hometown university (in Peoria, Ill.) Jamieson led the nation's small colleges in total offense and directed Bradley to a 7-2-1 record in 1956. Although he left BU to sign a pro baseball contract (as a catcher) the following spring and didn't gain his bachelor's degree until 1961, the strong-armed signal caller's grid playing career wasn't at an end.

After two seasons behind the plate in the Pittsburgh Pirate organization, Jamieson traded his "tools of ignorance" for a spot on the Baltimore Colt roster and sideline. There, in 1959, he studiously served as backup quarterback to NFL Hall of Famer Johnny Unitas. ("It was easy playing behind him. Johnny was playing so well, I had very little to do," Jamieson recalls.)

Not being one to sit back and watch, Jamieson left the security of the Colts to join the New York Titans of the fledgling American Football League. There, in 1960 and '61, he piloted the Titan offense until suffering a serious back injury. ("We used to run to the bank to cash our checks," says a smiling Jamieson about the now super-solvent Jets.)

So, Jamieson—articulate enough to hold down the job of sports director at Peoria TV station WMBD in 1961—turned to coaching, becoming backfield tutor at Bradley from 1962-64. The lure of playing brought him back to the AFL in 1965 where he served as a player-coach with the Houston Oilers. Again a backup signal caller—this time to ever-youthful (or ever-aged) George Blanda—his coaching responsibility was as receiver mentor.

Jamieson returned to coaching for good the following year when he moved back to Peoria as head coach at his prep alma mater, Central High. In six seasons there his club posted an impressive 40-19-1 mark, including a conference title and "Coach of the Year" honors in 1970.

A success at the prep level, Jamieson joined the Missouri staff in 1972. There, under Al Onofrio, he was in charge of both quarterbacks and receivers—as well as coordinating the Tiger offense. To Mizzou he brought variety and a touch of innovation to an attack which once featured the fullback up the middle on third down and a (railroad) yard to go.

Also an ace recruiter, some of Jamieson's prize players were MU quarterbacks Steve Pisarkiewicz, a '77 first round pick of the St. Louis Cardinals, and Pete Woods, a '78 third round selection of the Kansas City Chiefs, plus wide receivers Henry Marshall, now of the Chiefs, and Joe Stewart of the Oakland Raiders.

ISU's 14th football coach, who gained a master's degree in school administration at Bradley in 1966, is married to the former Rosalie Cottingham of Ottawa, Ill. The Jamiesons have two sons, Jeff, 20, a junior at Missouri, and Tim, 19, a sophomore at the University of New Orleans, and a daughter, Judi, 14, a sophomore at Terre Haute South.

**DENNIS RAETZ
DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR**

Coordinating Indiana State's defensive efforts this season is first-year Sycamore aide Dennis Raetz.

Raetz (pronounced RATES), who also is in charge of linebackers and defensive ends, was graduated from Nebraska in 1968 and three years later gained a master's degree from Central Missouri State.

He joins Coach Jamieson's staff after spending last season at Missouri where he served as MU's junior varsity grid coach. Previous to that he was head football coach for four years at Harmon High School in Kansas City, Kansas.

The 32-year-old North Platte, Neb., native is married. He and his wife, Betty, have one daughter, Jaime (3%), and an infant son, Mark, who was born July 10.

**STEVE BRICKEY
RECEIVER COACH**

Youngest member of the new Indiana State football coaching staff is 24-year-old Steve Brickey.

Brickey, a '77 graduate of Missouri, came to ISU after serving as a graduate assistant coach at Mizzou last season. Under Coach Dick Jamieson here his responsibility will be to work with wide receivers and tight ends.

As an Affton High senior in 1971, Brickey was a first-team All-Metro selection at quarterback by the St. Louis **POST-DISPATCH**. Unfortunately, a pair of knee injuries ended his playing career at MU.

Active in sports of all sorts, Brickey is one of two bachelors on the staff.



**BILL BRYANT
DEFENSIVE LINE COACH**

Bill Bryant, an import to the midwest from the west coast, is the Sycamore defensive line coach whose main responsibility involves ISU's interior linemen.

Bryant, who played both ways (linebacker and offensive guard) and was graduated from California-Davis in 1970, gained two years of



coaching experience there, plus another two at Cal-Berkeley. Last season he was junior varsity head coach and assistant defensive line coach at the University of Oregon.

Nicknamed "Bear" but no relation to the long-time Alabama coach, the 31-year-old U.S. Army veteran is married. He and his wife, Jo Ann, have an infant daughter, Christy.

**PETE HOENER
OFFENSIVE LINE COACH**

Pete Hoener, like five others, is in his first year as an assistant football coach at Indiana State.

Hoener (pronounced HAY-nur), who coaches the Sycamore offensive linemen, joined the ISU staff after spending 1977 at another ISU, Illinois State. Before that he was a graduate assistant for two years ('75 and '76) at Missouri.



A native of Peoria, Ill., Hoener was a three-year starter at tight end for Bradley University. A '73 Brave grad, his first two years of coaching were at Peoria Spaulding and Belvidere, respectively.

Also a five-year veteran of semi-pro hockey, the 26-year-old newcomer to Terre Haute is married (Marianne).



**DAVE MCGINNIS
DEFENSIVE BACK COACH**

Dave McGinnis, a 1973 graduate of Texas Christian University, is Indiana State's new coach of the defensive secondary.

McGinnis, a three-year letterman at defensive halfback for the Horned Frogs ('70-72), spent one season as a grad assistant at his alma mater and another as a "GA" at Missouri. After a year as junior varsity

mentor at Mizzou in '76, he served as the Tigers' secondary coach last fall.

The Snyder, Texas, native, who also gave the pros a try-signing with the Houston Oilers after his TCU career, is a 27-year-old bachelor.

**BOB TURNER
OFFENSIVE BACK COACH**

Bob Turner, who starred in Indiana State's defensive secondary for three seasons, is in his fourth year as a Sycamore coach—and second working with the offensive backfield.

Turner, a '72 grad, tied a former ISU record by intercepting nine passes during his sophomore year, and picked off a total of 16 aeriels for 219 yards in three campaigns ('69-71). He also returned 22 punts for 250 yards and a TD during his career.

Before joining the Sycamore staff at his alma mater, Turner was assistant football and basketball coach at Kokomo Haworth for three years ('73-75).

The 29-year-old East Chicago Washington product is married to the former Sheryl Oliver.

Graduate Assistant football coaches aiding Coach Dick Jamieson and his staff in 1978-79 are a pair of Indiana imports, **Dennis Davis** from West Virginia Wesleyan College and **Gene Jones** from Rocky Mountain College in Montana. **Davis'** main assignment will be aiding defensive line coach **Bill Bryant**. **Jones** will assist defensive coordinator **Dennis Raetz** by working with Sycamore linebackers and defensive ends. A third grad assistant had yet to be named at this publication's press deadline.

Indiana State's football equipment staff is headed by sixth-year athletic department veteran **Harold Garvin**. A Terre Haute native in his 13th year of ISU employment, **Garvin** is married and has two grown children, both ISU graduates. He came to ISU in 1967 after serving as trainer at the U. S. Military Academy at West Point, N.Y., for three years. Before that, he was a trainer at Indiana University for seven years.

Baggett—who took sabbatical leave last spring to do further post-graduate work at the University of Alabama—gained a bachelor of science degree from Troy (Ala.) State in 1957, and a master's degree from Indiana the following year. He also earned a Director of Health degree with specialization in health education from IU in '66.

**'78 OUTLOOK &
PLAYER PROFILES**



INDIANA STATE FOOTBALL '78 OUTLOOK

The 1978 edition of the Indiana State University football Sycamores is indescribable. At least that's the pre-season situation facing first-year grid coach Dick Jamieson, who moved to Terre Haute last December from the University of Missouri.

Jamieson—a youthful looking gent with an even more youthful staff (six assistants averaging 28 years old)—is a spirited competitor who has been somewhat reluctant to pinpoint his comments on ISU's chances in the '78 Missouri Valley Conference race.

"Since we haven't been through the Valley schedule yet, it's really tough to say how we'll be," admits the 1961 graduate of MVC sister institution Bradley University, "but I wouldn't have taken this job if I didn't think we could do well at this level. That's our goal here—not shoot for the Big Eight title. It's to compete in and to win in the Missouri Valley."

But is Indiana State going to throw the ball or run it? And how solid or porous will the Sycamore defense be?

"Offensively, I'd prefer to put the ball in the air more than they have in the past, but in order to do that effectively you must have personnel who can both throw and catch the ball. Whether we will pass consistently, well, the months of August and September will help determine that strategy. I suppose what I'm saying, then, is time will tell," Jamieson said.

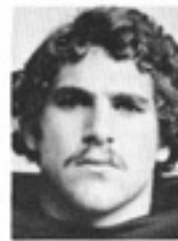

He was an all-league wide receiver and an all-metro and all-state defensive back...quarterback **Scott Bartel**, 6-0, 185, of East Peoria (Ill.) Metamora earned all-state honors from the late Chicago Daily-News.

ISU now has Byrd (not Bird) playing football. He's 5-11, 180, defensive back **Lester Byrd** from Lincoln in East St. Louis, Ill., where he was an all-conference back last year...**Dan Crafton**, 6-4, 235, an AP all-state first teamer from Indianapolis Ben Davis, played for Bob Wilbur there. See page 55 of this book for Wilbur's lone ISU record...**Larry Cross**, 5-9, 180, was all-conference and all-metro running back at Apex, N.C., for former ISU All-America guard Bob Poss.

Defensive lineman **Mark Delamater**, 6-2, 215, of Carmel High in suburban Indianapolis, was all-conference and all-state...running back **Ed Foggs**, 6-1, 185, was a standout gridder at Anderson High, also participating in basketball, track and wrestling there...6-0, 185, linebacker **Carl Fowler**—an all-league selection—is one of two recruits from Evanston, Ill...from McKeesport (Pa.) Area High comes 6-1, 205, defensive end **Gary Gilmore**. He was all-district defense and all-conference fullback last year.

Scott Higgins, 6-3, 240, is an offensive tackle from Bethel Park High in suburban Pittsburgh, Pa. So was just-graduate ISU star discus thrower Ken Currie...from Peoria, Ill., Central comes **Kyle Hood**, 6-4, 200, last year an all-conference selection.

A first team AP all-stater is running back **Gene Howard**, 5-9, 185, from Indianapolis Ben Davis...at 6-3, 260, is offensive tackle **Leroy Irvin** of Lockport (Ill.) Central, an all-area choice.

Steve Lakey, 6-3, 240-pound tackle from Ellisville, Mo., and Lafayette High, was all-conference in football, but also competed in basketball, wrestling and track...6-2, 185, **William Logan** was an all-conference player at Evanston (Ill.) Township where he played both defensive end and tight end...Indianapolis Tech's best defensive lineman was 6-3, 210, **Jeff Lorick**, an all-city and all-state choice.

Hubert Moore, 6-3, 205, was an all-Interscholastic League tight end at Kansas City (Mo.) Central High...from the New Orleans area comes **Alvin Reynolds**, 6-1, 190, an all-city and all-district selection from West Jefferson High and Marrero, La...**Eric Robinson**, 5-8, 180, was an all-conference and all-county running back at J.F. Kennedy High in Silver Spring, Md...speedster **Eddie Ruffin**, 5-7, 160, was a basketball and track standout, as well as an all-conference wide receiver at Peoria (Ill.) Central.

If the name of 6-3, 210, quarterback **Mike Shannon** sounds familiar it's because there are a pair in one family. This Mike was CBC's strong-armed QB in St. Louis. His dad is the former Cardinal star and current Redbird baseball broadcaster...one of five Smiths on the ISU roster (none related) is **Keman Smith**, 6-1,

185, running back, who was an all-district pick. The Edgard, La., product led his West St. John team to the Louisiana state finals...another frosh named Smith is 6-1, 210, **Marvin Smith**, a two-time letterman at defensive end for Indianapolis Tech.

An all-parish performer from Plaquemine, La., is 5-9, 180, running back **John Spradley**...from Midlothian, Ill., and Bremen High comes 6-3, 195, quarterback **Marty Strutz**, an all-conference football and baseball player last year...**Jackie Thomas**, a 5-10, 160, wide receiver from Indianapolis, is one of three football freshmen from Tech High...6-3, 240, offensive tackle **Vince Vrtis** of Rogers High and Michigan City, Ind., was an all-state and all-conference pick...**Kirk Wilson** 6-0, 170 wide receiver, was all-district and all-city at New Orleans (La.) Fortier—and also was clocked at 21 seconds flat in the 220 last spring.

A LOOK AT INDIANA STATE

Indiana State University is one of four state-assisted institutions in the Hoosier state and has been in existence since 1865. Originally a "teacher's college," the University has grown to serve the diverse needs of modern students seeking preparation to join a variety of occupational endeavors.

More than 11,000 students are currently enrolled on the Terre Haute campus. Six major academic units serve the institution—College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business, School of Nursing, School of Education, School of Health, Physical Education and Recreation and School of Technology.

The student body is representative of the nation as all 50 states, plus 45 foreign countries are enrolled at Indiana State. Both undergraduate and advanced degrees are offered in a variety of interests and professions.

In addition to providing a climate for higher learning, Indiana State has a multitude of extra-curricular activities for student participation.

Students also have access to modern housing facilities on campus and near academic buildings.



ISU HISTORY

Indiana State University—formed Dec. 20, 1865—now is in its 113th year of operation. The University opened its doors to 21 students (13 women and eight men) on Jan. 6, 1870.

The announced purpose of forming the University at that time was an institution that would “be to teachers what law school is to lawyers and medical school is to doctors.”

The school was known as Indiana State Normal School from 1870 until 1927, when the name was changed to Indiana State Teachers College. In 1961, the name again changed, this time to Indiana State College. The latest, and probably the final, name change came in the spring of 1965 when the Indiana Legislature renamed the school Indiana State University.

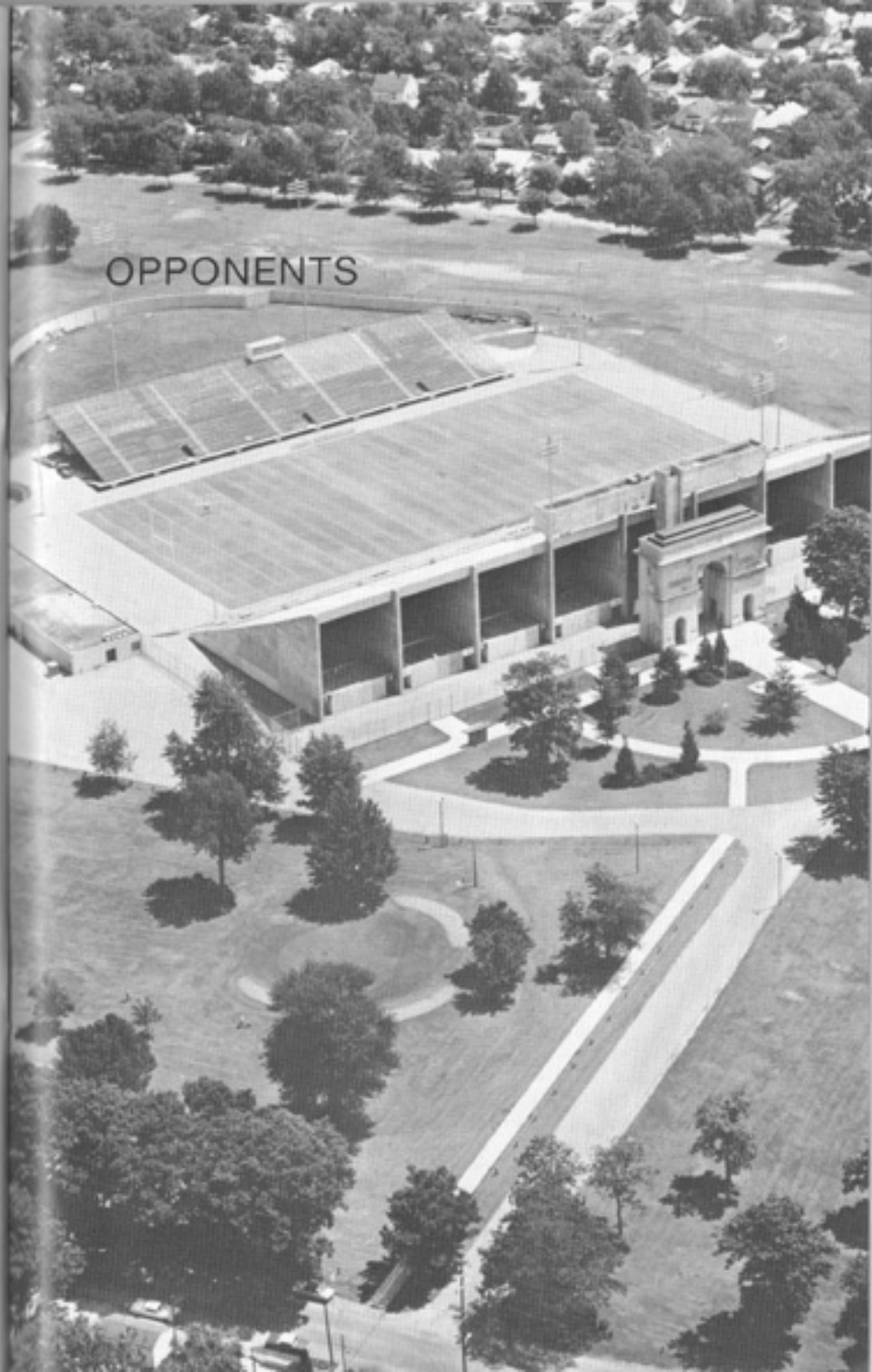

DR. RICHARD G. LANDINI
PRESIDENT, INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY

Dr. Richard G. Landini, now in his fourth year as President of Indiana State University, was a most important factor in the Sycamores' admission into the Missouri Valley Conference on March 9, 1976. But that figures, since he's a doer—not a passive spectator.

The 49-year-old Landini earned his bachelor of arts (1954) and a master of arts (1956) degrees as an English major at the University of Miami in Florida. In 1959 he gained a doctor of philosophy from the University of Florida.

Following those three years at Florida, Landini served on the Arizona State University staff for 11 years ('59-70)—the last two years as

assistant to the president of ASU. He then moved to the University of Montana in 1970 as academic vice-president and professor of English. After five years there he succeeded Dr. Alan C. Rankin here and became ISU's eighth president.

Landini, who resides on the ISU campus with his wife, Phyllis, is the proud father of four sons and one daughter: Richard 23; Gregory, 22; Matthew, 20; Cynthia, 18, and Vincent, 13.

DR. JACK JESSELL
NCAA FACULTY ATHLETIC REPRESENTATIVE

Dr. John C. Jessell is in his sixth year as ISU's faculty athletic representative to the NCAA. A professor of education and director the division of guidance and counseling in the graduate education department, Dr. Jessell joined ISU's staff in 1964.

A former college baseball player at New Haven (Conn.) State (now Southern Connecticut), he gained a master's in education at Ohio U., and doctoral degree at Wisconsin.

BOB KING
DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS
BASKETBALL COACH

Bob King is in his fifth year as director of athletics and fourth as basketball coach at Indiana State.

Last year as cage mentor he led the Sycamores to a 23-9 season record and to their second straight appearance in the NIT. King's three-year mark at ISU is 61-24.

King, whose 13-year college coaching record is 236-113 (.676), came to Indiana State after 12

years at New Mexico, the last two as associate athletic director.

His primary notoriety at UNM, though, came between 1962-72 when he served as Lobo basketball coach. In a decade there he was 175-89 (.663), and four of his clubs went on to post-season activity—three NITs and one NCAA playoff. (His '64 team was runnerup to Bradley in the NIT, and he also shared one WAC title.)

In addition to coaching All-America Larry Bird at ISU, King has produced several fine cagers at New Mexico who went on to professional careers: Mel Daniels (Indiana Pacers), Willie Long (Denver Nuggets), Ira Harge (ABA veteran), Ron Nelson (The Floridians), Ron Sanford (Dallas Chaps) and Greg Howard (Phoenix Suns).

Previous to his stint at UNM, King was head assistant cage coach at Iowa for three years ('59-62), where he helped coach Don Nelson, current coach of the Milwaukee Bucks.

The 55-year-old Gravity, Iowa, native, who never has had a losing season in 27 years of collegiate and high school coaching, was graduated from Iowa in 1947 and 10 years later earned a master's degree in psychology from Drake University.

An officer in the U.S. Air Force from 1943-46, King started his coaching career at prep level, spending 14 years at schools in Britt and Algona, Iowa, and Rockford, Ill. His record in three sports over that period was 363-124 (.745).

One of 55 applicants for the top Sycamore athletic post, King was the unanimous choice of ISU's 10-person search committee, a group that looked "from coast to coast for an experienced, enthusiastic and highly-respected athletic administrator."

King and his wife, Sharel, have six children: Chris, 30; Gary, 26; Larry, 25; Dianne, 8; Brad, 6, and Randy, 4.

JERRY HUNTSMAN
ASSISTANT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Jerry Huntsman, who left the football coaching profession a winner (7-3) in 1972, is assistant athletic director, and served as acting director of athletics prior to the arrival of Bob King.

Huntsman, whose seven-year record here was 43-24-1 (.639), is in his sixth campaign as an athletic administrator. Prior to coming to ISU as backfield coach in 1965, Jerry guided Earlham College to 29 victories in 32 games through four seasons. (His 1962 club was undefeated.) His prep coaching experience was gained at Waveland, Covington, Crawfordsville and Huntington and his final coaching mark was 105-39-4 (.723).

A native of Richmond, Ind., and a 1952 graduate of Wabash College, Huntsman earned a master's degree from Purdue in 1958. As a quarterback at Wabash he was named an all-state small college griddier in 1951.

Jerry and his wife, Coralee, have three sons—Brent, 21, Jerry, 19, and Scott, 16.

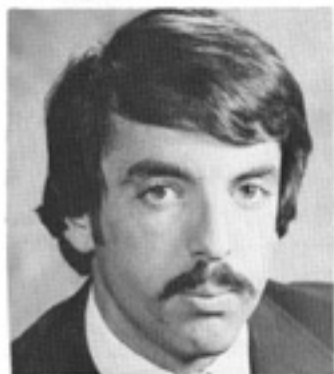
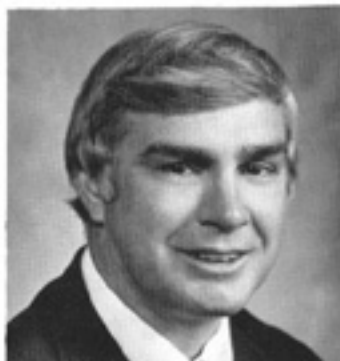
JOE MacISAAC

ALL-AMERICA ALLEN

In short, Vincent Allen is Indiana State University's first major college football All-America.

Allen, who earned honorable mention from both the Associated Press and THE SPORTING NEWS—as well as all-Missouri Valley selection last December, earned much more than grid accolades in 1977.

Last season the 5-8, 175-pound senior from Richmond, Ind., gained 1,026 yards in 231 carries, caught 20 passes, and scored eight touchdowns for 48 points. And those performances were in a comeback year!

VA, who missed the entire 1976 campaign because of a knee injury and subsequent corrective surgery, is one of only four NCAA football players to gain 1,000 yards or more in each of four seasons. (The others are Tony Dor-SETT, Howard Stevens and Rich Kowalski.)

As a freshman he gained 1,066 yards. In his sophomore year he upped his production to a school-record 1,221 yards. A year later (1975) he gained 1,022 before being injured in ISU's ninth game of the season at Tulsa. In all, Allen holds nine ISU records (see pages 52-55).

Married a year ago to the former Joyce McGee, Allen—who averaged 111.1 yards per game in 39 ISU contests (and 5.2 yards per carry)—currently is residing with his wife in Winnipeg, Manitoba, where he is the property of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League.

In short, an All-America has gone international!
