**Credentials:** Space for the working press, radio, TV and scouts will be allocated by the Sports Information Office. All requests for working credentials should be directed to this office in writing at least one week in advance of the game. The Indiana State press box is located on the south side of Memorial Stadium with elevator service from the ground to the press level. All media representatives and scouts should enter through the south gate directly behind the elevator.

**Policies:** Working press will be admitted to the press deck where approximately 25 seats are available. Credentials will be issued according to the following criteria: a) local newspapers, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area, and student newspapers from ISU and opponent's school; b) other daily newspapers with preferences to those which regularly cover ISU; c) radio and television personnel not actually broadcasting but considered reporting; d) scouts.

**Radio-TV:** The press deck has been designated for use by radio and television broadcasting crews, home and visiting coaches, and stadium operations. Each booth is fully enclosed and sound-proof.

**Photographers:** Only accredited photographers will be issued credentials.

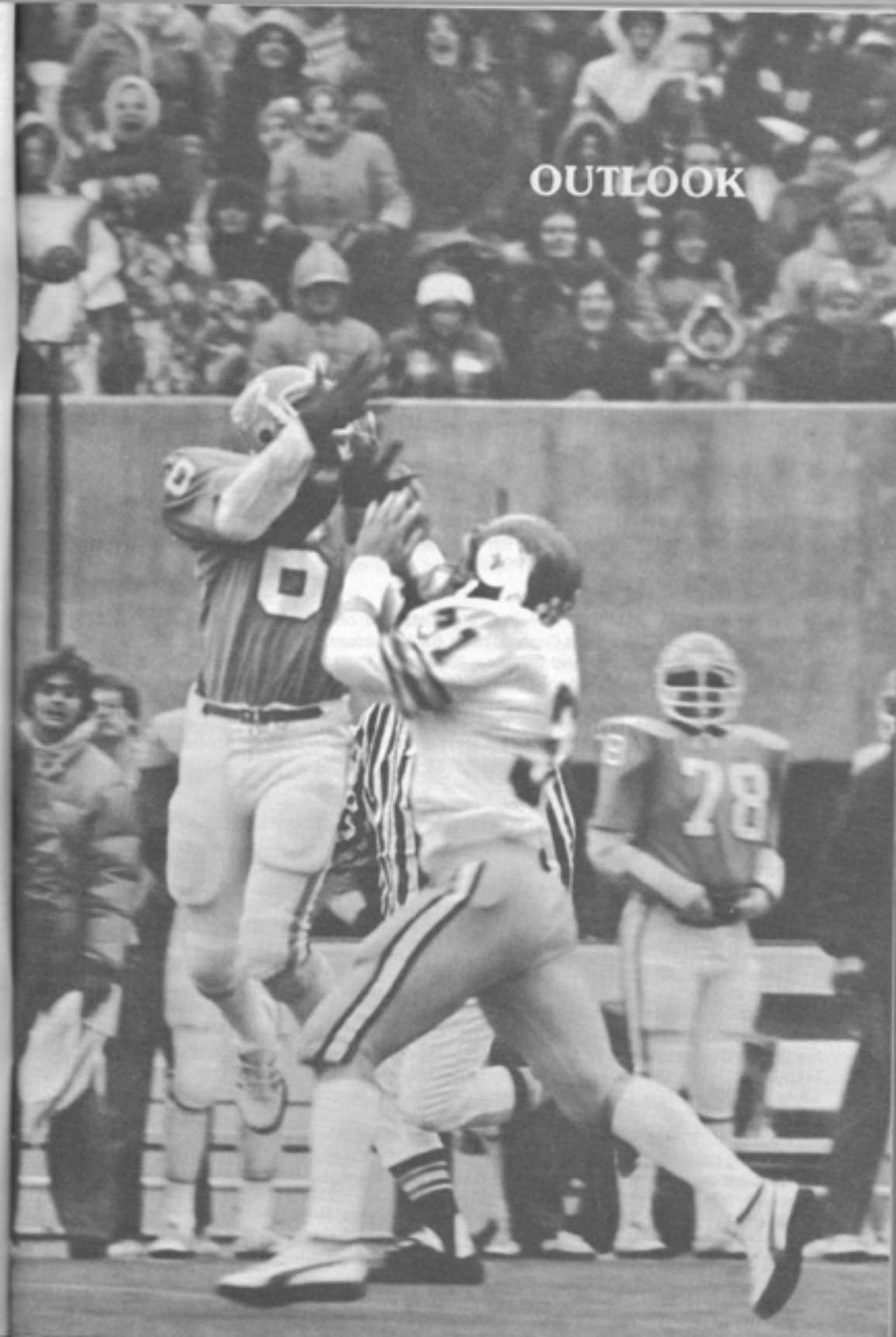
**Services:** Play-by-play, halftime and complete statistics will be provided. When possible post-game comments from the coaches and players will be made available. Refreshments are available on the press deck.

**Telecopier:** Four telephones and one telecopier are available for media use on a first-come, first-serve basis. If you plan to use your own phone and telecopier please inform the Sports Information Office in advance.

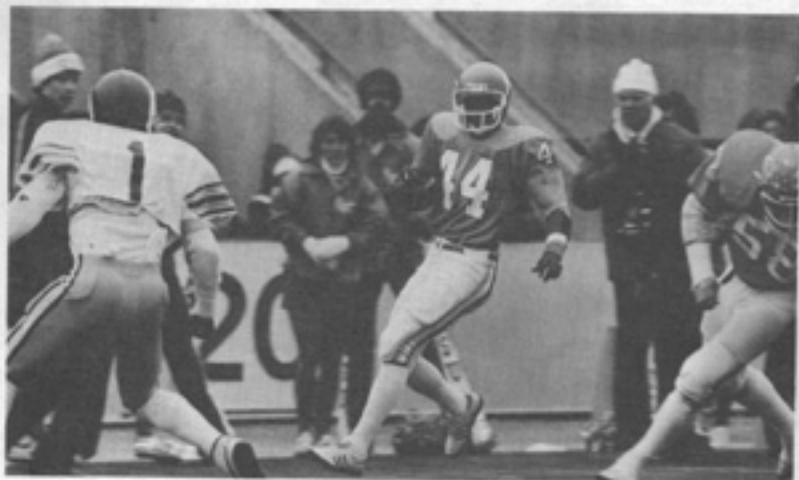

# OUTLOOK



## 1980 OUTLOOK



*First team all-conference wide receiver Kirk Wilson enroute to a big gain against Northeast Louisiana as the Sycamores defeated the Indians 38-21 to cap their first winning season in seven years.*

The return of 44 lettermen, including eight starters on offense and nine regulars on defense, has Indiana State Head Coach Dennis Raetz encouraged as he begins his first year at the helm of the Sycamore grid fortunes. Enroute to their first winning season in seven years, the Sycamores set school records for most points scored (276, 25.1 per game average) and total offense (4,155 yards). Quarterback Reggie Allen, the Missouri Valley Conference Offensive Player-of-the-Year keyed the offensive attack, while safety John Allman, the first player in Indiana State history to earn back-to-back all-conference honors, was the bulwark of the defense. The following is a synopsis of the 1980 Sycamore team.

### OFFENSE

Keying the potent Sycamore offense is quarterback Reggie Allen. Named to both the A.P. and U.P.I. all-conference squads, the junior established school records for most pass attempts (196), passes completed (87), passing yardage (1,468), and total offense (1,895). Allen, who topped the conference in passing and total offense while finishing fourth in scoring, tallied nine touchdowns rushing and added seven more by passing. Junior Scott Bartel, a part-time starter as a freshman, and Cary Macy, a sophomore who enjoyed an outstanding spring, provide good depth.

Teaming with Allen to make the Sycamores' passing game work are three outstanding receivers in Kirk Wilson, Eddie Ruffin, and Hubert Moore. Both Wilson and Ruffin were named all-conference last season after catching 25 passes apiece and ranking fifth and sixth, respectively, in the league in receiving. Moore, who is also an excellent blocker from his tight end position, had 13 catches before missing the final two games of the year due to injury. Junior John Spradley is coming off a good spring and will back up Wilson and Ruffin, while sophomore Max Dillon, who filled in for Moore last season, will share the duties at tight end.

Four of 1979's top five rushers return indicating the Sycamores could very well counter their strong passing game with a potent running attack. Senior Donnie Warner led ISU from his tailback position with 648 yards (5.6 per carry average), while Zack Washington, a three-year letterman, gained 550 yards from his fullback spot on a team-leading 135 carries. A pair of speedy sophomores will provide depth at tailback in the person of Eric Robinson and Larry Cross. Sophomore James Banks, who had an excellent spring, and junior Ed Foggs, combine with Washington to make fullback a strong position.

Three starters return in the offensive line. Guards Mark Gradkowski and Ray Ferrari, along with John Wayhart, a part-time starter at guard who will move to tackle this year, will be joined by sophomore Sean Whiten at center and senior Terry Dzimiera at tackle. Sophomore Manual Studway will backup at both guard and tackle spots.

#### DEFENSE

Walter Seaphus, John Gaunt, and Fred Bell, all starters last year, return along the interior front, and the year's experience will make this an improved group. Richard Anderson, a converted offensive tackle, has been switched to nose guard, and his impressive showing in the spring has projected him as a possible starter at this new position. Providing depth will be seniors Mark Frastak and Dale Harvel, and sophomore Perry Willet who made great progress in the spring.

All-American Gerry Gluscic must be replaced at one end spot, and that void is expected to be filled by impressive sophomore Kevin Lynch. Senior Dwight Tripp returns to his starting spot at the other end position with Quinton Mikell, a converted linebacker, providing depth.

At linebacker the Sycamores can look to four players who all possess the talent to start. Last year's regulars Craig Shaffer and Dan Maher return along with junior Billy Logan and sophomore Denorvell Collier. Shaffer was an all-conference choice two seasons ago, and was an honorable mention selection last year despite seeing limited action due to injuries.

Two-year all-conference safety John Allman returns to anchor a strong secondary that sees three of four starters back. Allman, who has led the team in tackles for two straight years, will be joined in the defensive backfield by last season's regulars Kirk French and Wayne Hamilton. Senior Joe Angyus moves in as the fourth starter at the cornerback spot. Providing depth will be junior Lester Byrd, a converted running back, and sophomore Robert Tyree.

#### KICKING GAME

Senior placekicker Joe Stellern returns to defend his conference kick-scoring title. The soccer-style kicker was successful on 28 of 34 extra point attempts and ten of 16 field goal tries for a total of 58 points. Sophomore Mike Johannes is back to handle the punting chores once again. A replacement will have to be found for the graduated Carl Spruill, the snapper in kicking situations for the past three seasons.

## DENNIS RAETZ

### INDIANA STATE HEAD FOOTBALL COACH



Intense. Dedicated. Tireless worker. Demanding, but fair. These are just a few of the adjectives used to describe new Indiana State Head Football Coach Dennis Raetz (pronounced RATES). Raetz was elevated to the head coaching position on February 25, 1980, replacing Dick Jamieson who resigned to accept a position with the St. Louis Cardinals of the National Football League.

The 34-year-old Raetz had served two seasons under Jamieson as the Sycamores' defensive coordinator, in addition to his duties of coaching the defensive ends and linebackers. Under his tutelage end Gerry Gluscic earned all-America honors in addition to being named the Missouri Valley Conference's Defensive Player-of-the-Year in 1979.

Raetz graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1968 with a bachelor's degree in education, and received his master's degree in physical education three years later from Central Missouri State.

From 1968-72 he served as an assistant football coach at North Kansas City (Missouri) High School. In 1973 he was appointed head coach at J.C. Harmon High School in neighboring Kansas City, Kansas.

In 1977 he was hired as an assistant coach at the University of Missouri by then-Tiger Head Coach Al Onofrio. Raetz' duties included coaching the defensive ends as well as serving as junior varsity head coach. It was at this time Raetz' association with Jamieson began as the former Sycamore head coach was also a member of that Missouri staff. When Jamieson was named head coach at ISU he brought Raetz with him to coach the defense.

A native of North Platte, Nebraska, Raetz and his wife Betty have two children: a daughter Jamie (5½), and a son Mark (2).





### STEVE BRICKEY

Beginning his third season on the staff is 26-year-old Steve Brickey. Brickey's responsibilities will include working with the quarterbacks and receivers, as well as serving as an administrative aide to Head Coach Dennis Raetz.

Brickey came to Indiana State in 1978 along with former Head Coach Dick Jamieson. A 1977 graduate of the University of Missouri, he served one year as a graduate assistant with the Tigers. A knee injury forced Brickey to end his playing career and begin his coaching career.

A native of St. Louis, Brickey graduated from Affton High School in 1971, where he was an outstanding quarterback, being named to the first team All-Metro Conference by the *St. Louis Dispatch*.

Brickey enjoys participating in all sports.

### PETE HOENER

Assuming the duties of offensive coordinator, in addition to working with the offensive line is 26-year-old Pete Hoener (pronounced HAY-nur). Hoener begins his third season on the Sycamore staff.

Hoener came to ISU from Illinois State where he had served on the Redbirds staff during the 1977 season. Prior to that he had spent two years (1975-76) as a graduate assistant at the University of Missouri.

A native of Peoria, Illinois, Hoener was a three-year starter at tight end for Bradley University from 1970-72. After graduating in 1973, Hoener coached one year at Peoria Spalding High School and one season at Belvidere (Illinois) High School.

A five-year veteran of semi-pro hockey, Hoener and his wife Marianne have two children; Jennifer (2) and Kathleen (3 months).



### DAVID MCGINNIS

Rejoining the Sycamore staff is David McGinnis. The 29-year-old McGinnis, who spent last year in private business, will coach the defensive secondary.

A 1973 graduate of Texas Christian University where he was a three-year letterman, McGinnis also coached the defensive backfield in his previous stint with the Sycamores.

A native of Snyder, Texas, McGinnis signed a professional contract with the Houston Oilers following graduation from TCU. He spent one season with the Oilers before deciding to enter the coaching profession.



He returned to his alma mater in 1974 to serve as a graduate assistant before moving to the University of Missouri the following season to serve in a similar capacity on the Tiger staff. In 1976 he was the head junior varsity coach while in 1977 he served as the Tiger's defensive secondary coach.

### MAX PAYNE

Beginning his first year on the Sycamore staff is 39-year-old Max Payne, who will be responsible for coaching the defensive interior line.

A native of Jasper, Missouri, Payne has served as head coach of Wyandotte High School in Kansas City, Kansas, for the past five seasons. During that time his teams won three league championships.

A 1962 graduate of William Jewell College where he lettered as a running back, Payne has also been an assistant coach for seven years (1968-74) at North Kansas City (Missouri) High School, and six years (1962-67) as head coach at Bethel (Missouri) High School.

Payne, who earned a master's degree in education from Central Missouri State in 1974, is married, and he and his wife have two children; Doug (18) and Andrea (14).



### BOB TURNER

Bob Turner, who starred in Indiana State's defensive backfield from 1969-71, is in his sixth year on the Sycamore staff. Turner will be responsible for working with the offensive backs.

A 1972 graduate of ISU, the 31-year-old Turner tied an Indiana State record when he intercepted nine passes as a sophomore in 1969. Over his three-year career Turner intercepted a total of 16 passes. He also served as a punt returner, running back 22 punts for a total of 250 yards and one touchdown.

Prior to joining the Sycamore staff in 1975, Turner served as assistant football and basketball coach for three years (1973-75) at Kokomo Haworth High School.

A native of East Chicago, who attended Washington High School, Turner is married to the former Sheryl Oliver.



### PAT HENDERSON

Pat Henderson, the newest member of the Sycamore coaching staff, will coach the linebackers this season.

The 28-year-old Henderson coached the past two seasons at the University of Nebraska-Omaha where he directed the defensive secondary. Previously he coached three years at Coffeyville (Kansas) Junior College, including the 1975 season when they won the national junior college title.

A 1975 graduate of Kansas University, Pat and his wife, Mary, have three children: Brian, 6; Kelli, 3, and Jeffrey, 5 months.



### RAY BAGGETT

Ray Baggett is in his 14th year as a trainer at Indiana State, while having more than 22 years of athletic training experience behind him.

Baggett came to ISU in 1967 after serving as trainer at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, New York, for three years. Prior to that he had served as trainer at Indiana University for seven years.

A 1957 graduate of Troy (Alabama) State, he earned a master's degree from Indiana in 1958. He also earned a Director of Health degree with specialization in health education from IU in 1966.

**ALLEN, REGGIE** — Quarterback, 6-0, 180, Junior, Monessen, Pa. — the Missouri Valley Conference Offensive Player-of-the-Year last season...set ISU records last fall for pass attempts (196), completions (87), passing yardage (1,468), and total offense (1,895), while helping the team set school marks for points and total offense... also an outstanding runner with breakaway potential (had a 67-yard touchdown run at New Mexico State), who ranked third on the team in rushing, led the team with nine touchdowns rushing, and accounted for 16 of the total of 36 touchdowns scored by rushing or passing...a tough player physically who has often played hurt during his two-year career...formerly an excellent all-around high school athlete who was second-team all-Pennsylvania quarterback for Coach Joe Gladys at Monessen High School, born 10-8-58...major is business.

**ALLMAN, JOHN** — Safety, 6-1, 188, Senior, St. Louis, Mo. — probably the outstanding free safety in the Missouri Valley Conference with two consecutive all-conference awards...has been the Sycamores' leading tackler from the time he became a defensive player as a sophomore...credited with 245 tackles the past two seasons...had 128 tackles last year and led the team in interceptions with four, recovered one fumble, broke up seven passes, and tackled six ball-carriers behind the line of scrimmage...missed spring practice with a broken toe...earned all-America recognition from *The Sporting News* as a sophomore...was an offensive back as a freshman and has been used to return punts...also serves as a holder for ISU kickers...played for Coach Tom Moran at Cleveland High School...born 5-7-59...major is health.



**ANDERSON, RICHARD** — Nose Guard, 6-2, 228, Sophomore, Peoria, Ill. — enters fall practice as No. 1 nose guard...talented sophomore who lettered as a reserve offensive tackle last fall...saw action in every game last year as member of the specialty teams...possesses excellent quickness...earned all-state honors twice as a linebacker in high school...played for Coach Hal Montville at Manual High School...born 11-15-59...major is automotive technology.

**ANGYUS, JOE — Defensive Back, 5-11, 173, Senior, Hammond, Ind.** — three-year letterman...saw most of his action last fall on specialty teams, but still played enough to record 21 tackles, including two for losses...former North-South All-Star quarterback who was converted to defensive back as a freshman and who started by the end of the season...missed most of his sophomore year due to injury...played for Coach Jerry Vlasic at Bishop Noll... born 4-15-59...major is environmental safety and management.



**BANKS, JAMES — Running Back, 6-3, 195, Sophomore, Cincinnati, Oh.** — outstanding sophomore who could be a major factor in the Sycamore running attack this year after lettering as a reserve last fall...led all rushers in the spring game with 116 yards on 20 carries...all-around athlete who is also an outstanding baseball prospect...played for Coach Pat O'Brien at Western Hills High School, a school that also produced Pete Rose, Don Zimmer, and Jack Reynolds...born 4-20-61...major is undecided.

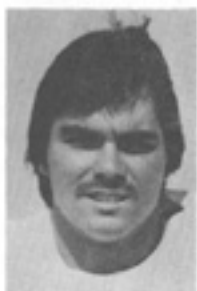

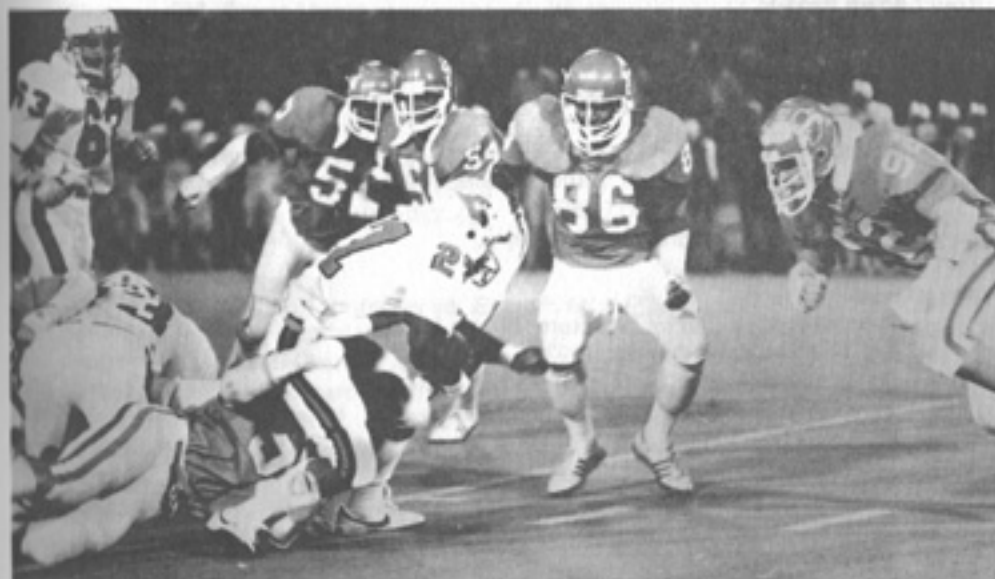

**JERRY HUNTSMAN, Assistant Athletic Director**



Jerry Huntsman, who left the football coaching profession a winner (7-3) in 1972, is assistant athletic director, and served as acting director of athletics prior to the arrival of Bob King.

Huntsman, whose seven-year record here was 43-24-1 (.639), is in his eighth campaign as an athletic administrator. Prior to coming to ISU as backfield coach in 1965, Jerry guided Earlham College to 29 victories in 32 games through four seasons. (His 1962 club was undefeated.) His prep coaching experience was gained at Waveland, Covington, Crawfordsville and Huntington and his final coaching mark was 105-39-4 (.723).

A native of Richmond, Indiana, and a 1952 graduate of Wabash College, Huntsman earned a master's degree from Purdue in 1958. As a quarterback at Wabash he was named an all-state small college gridder in 1951.

Jerry and his wife, Coralee, have three sons -- Brent, 23, Jerry, 21, and Scott, 18.

**DR. JACK JESSELL, NCAA Faculty Athletic Representative**

Dr. John C. Jessell is in his eighth year as ISU's faculty athletic representative to the NCAA. A professor of education and director of the division of guidance and counseling in the graduate education department, Dr. Jessell joined ISU's staff in 1964.

A former college baseball player at New Haven (Connecticut) State (now Southern Connecticut), he gained a master's in education at Ohio University, and a doctoral degree at Wisconsin.



**A LOOK AT INDIANA STATE**

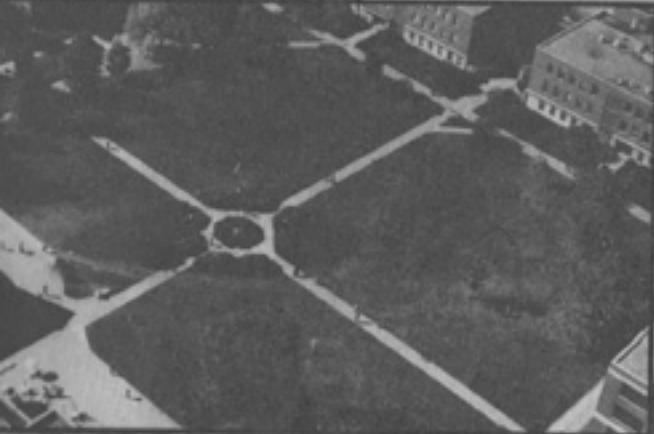
*Indiana State University — formed December 20, 1865 — now is in its 114th year of operation. The University opened its doors to 21 students [13 women and eight men] on January 6, 1870.*

*The announced purpose of forming the University at that time was to found an institution that would "be to teachers what law school is to lawyers and medical school is to doctors."*

*The school was known as Indiana State Normal School from 1870 until 1927, when the name was changed to Indiana State Teachers College. In 1961, the name changed again, this time to Indiana State College. The latest, and probably the final, name change came in the spring of 1965 when the Indiana Legislature renamed the school Indiana State University.*

*From 21 students back in 1870 the enrollment has climbed through the years and this fall stood at 12,056. And thanks to athletics and its athletes, word on Indiana State is spreading throughout the state, region and, indeed, the nation!*
