MEMORIAL STADIUM

Indiana State plays their home football games at Memorial Stadium, which is located on the corners of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute.

The stadium was acquired by the University in 1967 and, prior to that time, was used for both football and baseball. Since the installation of the synthetic playing surface, however, the field has been used for football and field hockey.

The first university in the world to own and make outdoor application of Astroturf was Indiana State and the Sycamores put the new field to good use in September of 1967 as ISU hosted Eastern Illinois.

The Astroturf in use at Indiana State is similar to that used in Houston's famed Astrodome. Plus factors in the use of the synthetic surface include durability (some 12 college and high school football games are played on the field each year; and in addition the ISU football team conducts all practices on the field) and a constant surface which will provide sure footing regardless of weather.

Memorial Stadium was open to the public for the first time May 5, 1925 as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria (IL) Tractors with an estimated crowd of 9,000 on hand for the event.

Among the honored guests at the game were major league baseball commissioner Judge Kennesaw Landis and Charles Barnard, a representative of the Cleveland Indians.



The first use of the playing field was in the fall of 1924 as local high schools, Wiley and Garfield, played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.

Work on Memorial Stadium was begun in 1922 at a cost of \$450,000.

After the University gained control of the stadium in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included the reorientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to an east-west line; installation of Astroturf; and a building of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as rebuilding of seats on the south side of the field.

Capacity of Memorial Stadium is now 20,500.

SYCAMORE PREVIEW

Indiana State's football fortunes for 1984 appear bright as the Sycamores, ranked as high as fifth in the final NCAA I-AA poll of the season a year ago and a participant in the 1983 I-AA post-season playoffs, return nine starters on offense and seven from the defense.

Top among the returning veterans for ISU Coach Dennis Raetz is record-setting junior quarterback Jeff Miller. An honorable mention I-AA All-American last fall, Miller has proven to be an excellent quarterback and an adept field leader. Also among the top returnees are senior cornerback Wayne Davis, senior halfback Kevin Henderson, senior offensive guard Steve Buxton and senior safety Regis Mason.

Indiana State will play a strong schedule in '84, including seven in the friendly confines of Memorial Stadium and one in the new 60,000-plus Hoosier Dome in Indianapolis. Among the teams on the ISU schedule this fall will be I-AA powers Eastern Illinois and Southern Illinois (defending I-AA national champion) as well as I-A toughies Tulsa and Louisville.

OFFENSE

Nine starters return from last year's 9-4 playoff squad, including Miller at quarterback, Henderson and sophomore Jimmy Edwards in the backfield, receivers Terry Bell and Anthony Kimball, tight end Herbert Dawson and linemen Mike Simmonds, Richard Dawson and Buxton.

Miller set ISU marks last fall for passing yardage, pass completions and total offense. All are seasonal records. The 6-foot-3, 205-pounder nearly led the Sycamores to the biggest upset in school history as Indiana State lost a 17-13 decision to I-A power Florida in front of 60,000 fans in Gainesville.

Henderson and Kimball also set records in '83, Henderson with 248 carries (the most since Vincent Allen had 244 in 1976) and Kimball with 40 receptions (breaking the record of 37 which was set by Steve Schmidt in the mid '60's).

Buxton is a possible professional draft choice at guard at 6-6, 268-pounds. Also, Simmonds had a strong freshman season and is still getting bigger (he's already 6-4, 263).

Behind large offensive linemen like Buxton, Simmonds and center Richard Dawson, Henderson rushed for 930 yards for 13 games -- the most for an ISU running back since 1977.

DEFENSE

Indiana State's defensive charge this year will be led by the quartet of senior cornerback Wayne Davis, senior strong safety Regis Mason, senior cornerback Keith Ward and sophomore weak safety Vencie Glenn.

Davis, Glenn and Mason all started last season and Ward was a starter at weak safety two years ago. Ward, at 5-11, 175 pounds, replaced the graduated Kevin Ramsey at one cornerback slot. Mason was named as the Missouri Valley Conference's "Defensive Player of the Week" for his strong performance against the University of Florida and their All-American quarterback Wayne Peace. Glenn beat out Ward for the safety position last year and has rapidly become one of the best defenders in the league. Davis is perhaps the best of the lot and the Cincinnati, Ohio native is receiving long looks from professional scouts, who have been impressed with his one-on-one coverage skills as well as with his tackling ability.

Also returning for ISU on the defensive side of the football are junior end Kurt Bell, junior linebacker Troy Johnson, senior tackle Brad Verdun and junior noseguard Doug Arnold.

Bell teamed with graduated end Ed Martin to give the Sycamores one of the best one-two punches in the conference last year. Johnson started midway through the year and became one of ISU's leading tacklers. Verdun and Arnold are strong candidates for the MVC's all-conference teams.

KICKERS

Both punter Chuck Standiford and placekicker Scott Bridges return for Indiana State. Bridges, after a subpar regular season, came on strong in the I-AA playoffs and kicked the game-winning field goal against Eastern Illinois in the first-round of post-season action.

Standiford, a former walk-on, attempted 61 punts for an average of 37.8 yards per boot as a freshman last season. He also handled kickoff and backup placekicker chores in his rookie year.

KEY PLAYERS LOST

The top players lost to the Sycamores this fall include linebacker Quintin Mikell (graduation), defensive end Ed Martin (graduation, Los Angeles Express signee), cornerback Kevin Ramsey (graduation, Indianapolis Colts free agent signee), offensive tackle Chris Delaplaine (graduation, Dallas Cowboys free agent signee), and linebacker Jeff Campbell (injury).

SUMMARY

If Indiana State can find needed depth at a couple of key positions, namely offensive line and linebacker, then the Sycamores can have a good year. A good home schedule and tough opposition on the road could provide the Sycamores with another playoff berth in 1984.

DENNIS RAETZ



Indiana State University head football coach Dennis Raetz is establishing one of the best total football programs in the Midwest.

After the most successful season in Sycamore football history, one in which ISU participated in the NCAA I-AA post-season playoffs for the first time ever, Raetz and his program received the acclaim which the Sycamore faithful knew would come in a matter of time.

In just four years as the head coach at Indiana State, Raetz has already become the fourth winningest coach in ISU's long football history and his teams have set numerous individual and team records.

A native of North Platte, Neb., Raetz earned a bachelor's degree in math and physical education from the University of Nebraska in 1968. Raetz entered the prep coaching ranks as an assistant at North Kansas City (Missouri) High School, a post he held until being named the first head coach at J.C. Harmon High, also in Kansas City. He also earned a master's degree in physical education from Central Missouri in 1971.

After four successful years at Harmon High, Raetz was hired by former University of Missouri head coach Al Onofrio to become a member of the Tiger staff in 1977. He coached the junior varsity team as well as the varsity defensive ends.

The following year Raetz moved to Indiana State as the defensive coordinator for

former Sycamore head coach Dick Jamieson, a post he held for two years before being elevated to the head coaching position in 1980 when Jamieson left for an assistant's job with the National Football League's St. Louis Cardinals.

Under Raetz, the Sycamores have been known as a strong defensive club, and he has coached such standouts as linebacker Craig Shaffer, currently with the NFL's Cardinals, and defensive end Gerry Gluscic, both Missouri Valley Conference defensive "Players of the Year," as well as I-AA All-American defensive end Ed Martin. Martin was a recent draft choice of the NFL's Dallas Cowboys.

The Indiana State offense has also set several passing, scoring and total offense marks under Raetz' direction, thus showing the all-around aspects of the Sycamore program.

In the past few years the Sycamore football program has become a strong one and Dennis Raetz has been the moving force behind that improvement.

Raetz is married (Betty) and has two children (Jaime 9, and Mark 6).

COACHING EXPERIENCE: Coached for 18 years on the high school level in Missouri and Kansas before coming to Indiana State... began career in 1962 as the head coach at South Harrison High School in Bethany, MO ...was named as an assistant coach at North Kansas City, MO, High School in 1968 and worked there until 1975 when he was selected to be the head coach at Kansas City, KS, Wyandotte High School ...while at Wyandotte, Payne's teams won three Kansas City Area Conference championships ...came to the attention of ISU Coach Dennis Raetz while both were prep coaches in Kansas City...was named as an assistant coach at Indiana State in 1980...was ISU's defensive line coach for two years...moved over to the offense as the running backs' coach in 1982...given the additional duties of assistant head coach prior to the start of the 1983 season...also serves as the Sycamores' special teams coordinator.

COACHING EXPERIENCE: Started coaching career in 1970 as an assistant coach at Fort Wayne, IN Central Catholic High School ...worked as a graduate assistant at Indiana State from 1972 to 1974 ...named as the head football coach at Sullivan, IN High School in 1974 ...was an assistant football coach at St. Joseph's College from 1975 to 1979 ...also served as executive alumni director at St. Joseph's as well as defensive coordinator ...named as defensive coordinator at Rose-Hulman in 1979 ...also served as the head tennis coach at Rose-Hulman ...was selected as the head coach at Manchester College in 1980 ...became an assistant coach at Indiana State University in 1982 ...was elevated to defensive coordinator in the spring of 1984 ...is also in charge of all walk-on tryouts.

COACHING EXPERIENCE: Was a student and graduate assistant at the University of Missouri for two seasons, 1976 and 1977, after a knee injury curtailed his collegiate playing career ...named as a graduate assistant in January of 1977 and worked with the Tigers' junior varsity offense in addition to helping with recruiting ...came to Indiana State in 1978 along with former ISU coach Dick Jamieson from Missouri ...has done an outstanding job with the Sycamore quarterbacks, helping to develop the talents of record setting passers Reggie Allen and Jeff Miller ...works closely with offensive coordinator Pete Hoener in mapping out game day strategy ...excellent technician of the passing game ...has been in charge of ISU recruiting efforts since 1980.

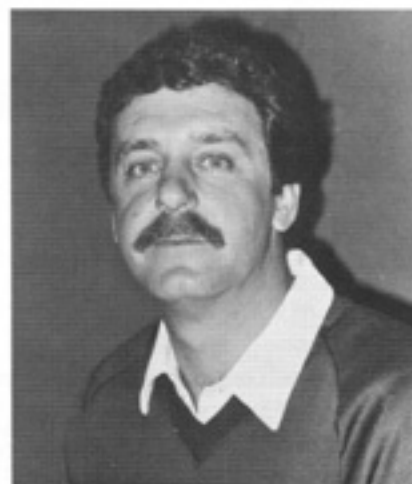


ALVIN REYNOLDS (Indiana State University '82) Defensive Backs, Computer Analysis.

COACHING EXPERIENCE: Selected to be a graduate assistant at Indiana State for 1982 season ...elevated to full-time assistant coaching status in 1983 ...is in charge of breaking down films of each opponent and putting together computerized scouting reports.

PLAYING CAREER: Played defensive back for Indiana State for four seasons (1978-1981) ...two-year starter at strong safety ...was the main figure in the "Our Pal Al" promotional campaign three years ago as several ISU marketing students promoted Reynolds for the Heisman Trophy award ...as a result of the promotion, Reynolds received mention in the New York Times and The Sporting News as well as being a focus of a feature on the NBC Nightly News ...is the only Indiana State player to receive votes in the Heisman balloting, garnering two ...all-district, All-New Orleans and prep All-American as a high school senior ...attended West Jefferson High School in Marrero, LA, graduating in 1978.

THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1865, Indiana State University serves the community, state and nation through undergraduate and graduate instruction, research and public service. The University offers degrees in education; business; nursing; technology; health, physical education, and recreation; and the arts and sciences.

Nearly 12,000 students attend the main campus in Terre Haute (metro population - 114,000) which is located near the Illinois state line in west central Indiana. The regional campus in Evansville serves nearly 4,000 students.

Programs at Indiana State University are accredited by some two dozen national professional organizations. The teacher education program has been approved by the Teacher Training and Licensing Commission for the State of Indiana and by the National Council of Accreditation for Teacher Education. According to the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business, the undergraduate and graduate programs in the School of Business rank among the top 10 percent in the nation. And ranked among the top four in the nation is the graduate criminology program at ISU.

The University was the first in the nation to offer both undergraduate and graduate instruction in athletic training and today is one of only eight with a graduate program in the field. Indiana State is



also one of 30 some universities in the nation to offer a music merchandising program, a music major which combines a solid business minor.

Today the University has seven doctoral programs, 136 baccalaureate programs, 94 master's degree programs, 10 educational specialist programs and 14 associate degree programs.

The men's athletic teams joined the Missouri Valley Conference in 1976 while the women's teams belong to the

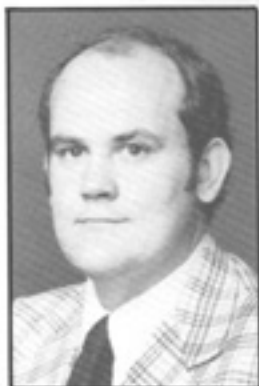
Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference, which was founded in 1982.

RICHARD G. LANDINI

Presently in his 9th year as President, Dr. Landini is an enthusiastic supporter of athletic programs for men and women at Indiana State University. Working with representatives of the Athletic Department, he was a strong advocate of Indiana State University's membership in the Missouri Valley and the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conferences.

He earned Bachelor of Arts (1954) and Master of Arts (1955) degrees in literature at the University of Miami and the Doctor of Philosophy degree (1959) at the University of Florida. He served on the faculty and administrative staff at Arizona State University for 11 years (1959-70), earning his professorship there in 1968. In 1970, he was appointed Academic Vice-President and Professor of English at the University of Montana. He was appointed to the presidency of Indiana State University, succeeding Dr. Alan Rankin, in 1975.

Dr. Landini, his wife Phyllis and their children reside in Condit House on the University campus.

BERNARD "BEANIE" COOPER

Beanie Cooper was named athletic director at Indiana State University three years ago. Cooper came to the Terre Haute campus from the University of South Dakota, where he had served as Chairman and Director of the Department of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Athletics since July, 1975.

Cooper served as head football coach at South Dakota from 1974-79, with his 1978 team capturing the North Central Conference championship. His coaching career began at Algona, IA, in 1958, and he recorded a 92-38-2 record in 16 years of high school coaching. Cooper served six highly-successful years as head coach and athletic director at Heelan High School in Sioux City, where his teams posted an overall record of 43-11.

Cooper and his wife, Ruby, have nine children, five boys and four girls.

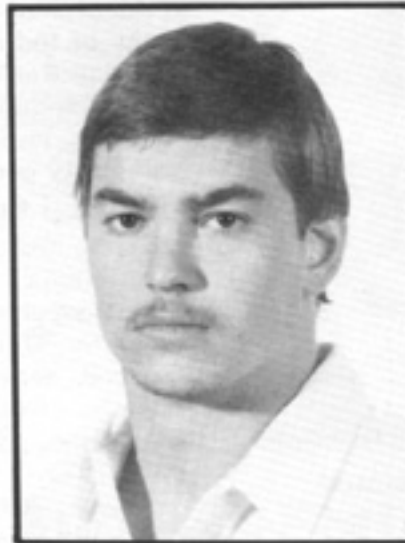

TUNCH ILKIN
Pittsburgh Steelers

Born in Istanbul, Turkey, Tunch (pronounced TOO-ch) is quite possibly the top offensive lineman

in the history of Indiana State. A former top prep player at Highland Park High School in Chicago, IL, Ilkin quickly earned a reputation as one of the most efficient blockers in the Missouri Valley Conference. He helped pave the way for ISU's last 1,000 yard ground gainer, Vincent Allen turning the trick in 1977.

Ilkin was selected in the sixth-round of the National Football League draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1980. After two seasons as a reserve, Ilkin became Pittsburgh's starting offensive tackle in 1983 and played in the last season's American Football Conference playoffs against the Los Angeles (Oakland) Raiders.



ED MARTIN
L A Express

Ed, after being drafted in the seventh round by the National Football

League's Dallas Cowboys in 1984, was signed as a free agent by the Los Angeles Express of the United States Football League.

A I-AA All-American defensive end in 1983, Martin was drafted by the Pittsburgh Maulers of the USFL early in the spring of '84 but decided not to sign with the new league at that time. After contract negotiations with the Cowboys broke down, Ed reached agreement with the Express in May of 1984.

Martin was runnerup for MYC "Defensive Player of the Year" honors in 1983, narrowly missing becoming the third ISU player in five years to win the honor.

ERIC ROBINSON
Washington Federals

A high school All-American while playing at John F. Kennedy High School in Silver Springs, Maryland, Eric gained over 2,000 yards in all-purpose yardage while playing at running back for Indiana State.

An environmental health major while at ISU, Robinson was named to the CoSida

District IV All-Academic team as a junior and senior. He also was named to the Missouri Valley Conference's All-Academic team both years.

Following an early graduation (December 1982), Robinson was signed as a free agent by the newly formed Washington Federals of the United States Football League. As a rookie in the USFL, Robinson led the fledgling league in kickoff returns, averaging 28.7 yards per return. He also was ranked among the Top Ten in punt returns and became the first player in league history to return a kickoff for a touchdown (95 yards versus Tampa Bay).

As a reward for his fine effort, Eric was named to the first-ever All USFL honor team as a kickoff returner.

He is again among the league leaders in kickoff and punt returns in 1984 and stands a good chance of being selected All-pro once again.



CRAIG SHAFFER
St. Louis Cardinals

Craig has the distinction of being the highest player drafted in Indiana State football history, being selected early

in the sixth-round of the 1982 National Football League draft. An All-Missouri Valley Conference performer at linebacker for two consecutive seasons, Shaffer was named as the league's "Defensive Player of the Year" at the conclusion of the 1981 season.

A former walk-on at Indiana State, Shaffer was a four-sport athlete at Schulte High School in Terre Haute and was named as Vigo County's top prep athlete as a senior.

The 1982 NFL player's strike and injuries have limited Shaffer's playing time with the Cardinals but this hard-hitting young linebacker has made a name for himself in the world of professional football.

Missouri Valley Conference

Midwestern athletic history was made at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Missouri on January 12, 1907, when eight faculty members representing five universities gathered to form the Missouri Valley Conference, the first intercollegiate athletic organization west of the Mississippi River.

Attending the first organizational meeting of the Missouri

Valley Conference were: Prof. Clark W. Hetherington and Dr. M. J. Monilaw, University of Missouri; Mark Catlin, University of Iowa; Captain John G. Workizer, University of Nebraska; Prof. C. M. Woodward, Washington University; Prof. A. T. Walker, W. C. Landson and Dr. James Naismith, University of Kansas.

Five schools formally organized the conference at a second meeting at the Coates House in Kansas City on February 16, 1907. They were Washington University of St. Louis and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska.

On March 15, 1908, Drake University and Iowa State College (now Iowa State University) were voted membership and admitted on April 1, at which time the conference's official name was adopted, the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

The MVC charter members

are the University of Iowa, the University of Kansas, the University of Missouri, and Washington University of St. Louis. Added by election were the University of Nebraska, Iowa State College and Drake University.

Today the Missouri Valley Conference has nine members. They are Bradley University, Creighton University, Drake University, Illinois State University, Indiana State University, Southern Illinois University, The University of Tulsa, West Texas State University and Wichita State University.

MEMO TO THE MEDIA

The 1984 Indiana State Football Media Guide has been prepared to assist both the print and electronic media in covering Indiana State University football this fall. Contents of the guide and changes in personnel as well as travel plans will be updated before and during the season by the Sports Information Office.

For additional information concerning Indiana State football, please contact Bill Goldring or Tom James, Indiana State Sports Information Office, Arena Annex, Indiana State University, Terre Haute, Indiana, 47809. The Sports Information Office phone number is 812-232-6311, ext. 2587 or 2590.

PRESS BOX - The Memorial Stadium press box is located on the south side of the stadium complex and is serviced by an elevator from ground level to the press box proper. Booths for visiting coaches and for visiting radio stations will be provided. A large outside booth on the west end of the press box is also available for visiting camera personnel.

CREDENTIALS - Space limitations in the press box make it mandatory that only WORKING members of the media be granted credentials. Indiana State's football credential policy is as follows: a) local newspapers, wire services, national publications, newspapers from an opponent's area, and student newspapers representing both Indiana State and an opponent; b) other daily newspapers with preference to those which regularly cover Indiana State athletics; c) radio and television personnel not actually broadcasting but considered reporting; d) professional scouts.

Credentials will NOT be mailed. Please arrange to pick up press passes at the Memorial Stadium will-call window (on the right hand side of the arch entrance-way). Please do not request credentials for non-working members of the media.

All photographers MUST wear a press pass while working on the sidelines. Those not wearing passes will be asked to leave the playing field with no exceptions.

RADIO-TV-The Indiana State press box has been designated for use by radio and television broadcasting crews, both home and opponent. Each booth is enclosed and soundproof. Spotters will be provided upon request.

SERVICES-Programs, lineups, depth charts and game background are provided before each home game. Team statistics will be distributed at halftime. Play-by-play running accounts are provided at each quarter's end. Complete team and individual statistics, lineups and substitutions, scoring summary and coaches' comments are available after the game.

Telephone-Telephone and radio service should be secured directly from the General Telephone Company of Indiana at 812-238-5444. General Telephone will contact the sports information office for location. If a visiting radio station has been designated as the official station for that school, a courtesy telephone line will be available. Other stations must pay a right's fee of \$50 to Indiana State.

Teletypewriter-Four telephones and one teletypewriter are available for media use on a first-come, first-served basis. If you plan to use your own phone and teletypewriter, please contact the Indiana State Sports Information Office in

advance.

Portable Computer-The Indiana State Sports Information Office recently purchased a Radio Shack TRS-80 Model 100 Portable Computer. For a rental fee of \$25, newspapers covering ISU athletics will be allowed to use the computer in order to file game stories. This will be on a first-come, first-served basis only, so please contact the Sports Information Office well in advance of a home game to inquire about its use.

Coach and Player Interviews-Coach Dennis Raetz will be available for interviews between 10 a.m. and noon Monday through Thursday at 812-232-6311, ext. 5445. Player interviews through the week must be arranged through the Sports Information Office at 812-232-6311, ext. 2587.

Videotape Interviews and Highlights-Videotape highlights of all home games and most road games will be available through the Indiana State Sports Information Office. Videotaped player interviews are also available.

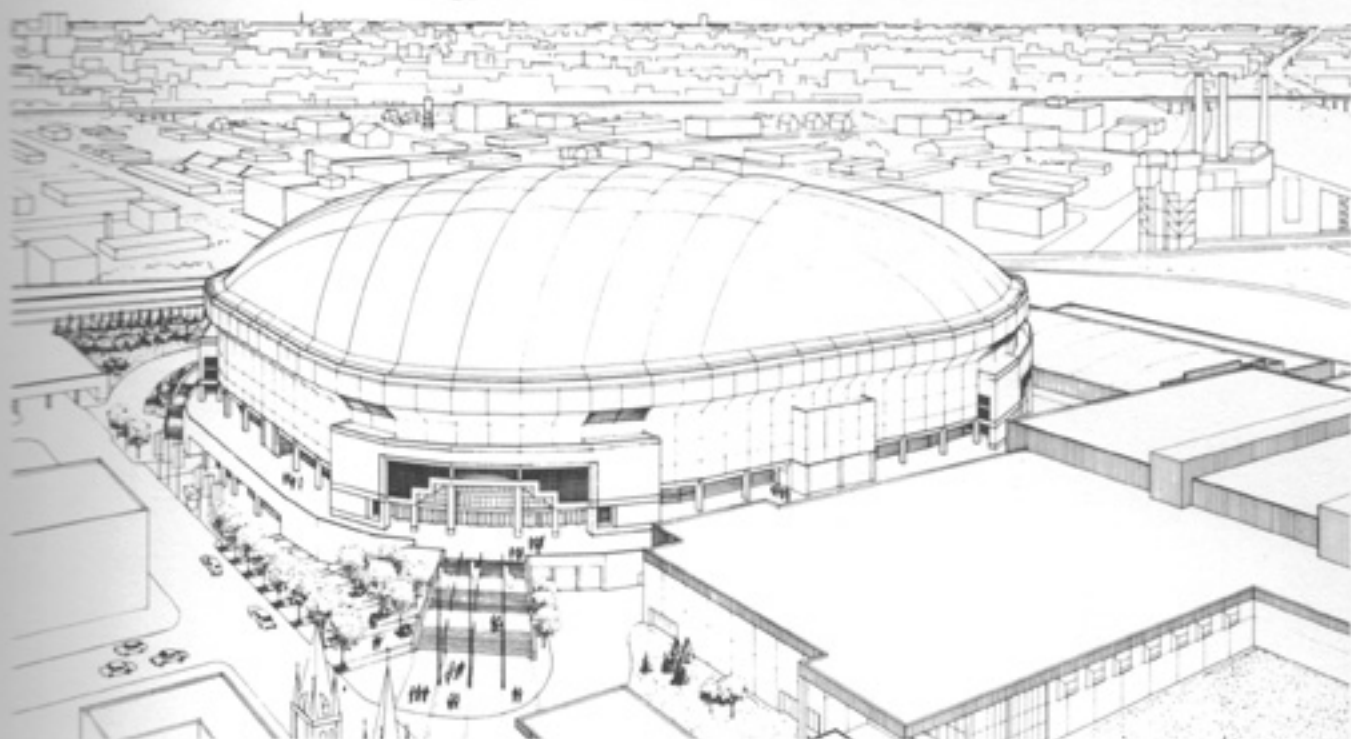

HOOSIER DOME



The 53rd renewal of the Indiana State-Ball State Blue Key Victory Bell football game will be played before the largest crowd to ever witness a contest between the two institutions in the magnificent new Indianapolis Hoosier Dome.

The Hoosier Dome, built at the cost of \$82 million, will hold a football crowd of 60,500. Indiana State and Ball State hope

to sell 30,000 tickets for the game, which would be the largest gathering to see these two teams play, by far.

Indiana State has defeated the Cardinals the past three seasons, and four of the last five years, and the Sycamores are hoping to keep the string going in the new surroundings. The annual rivalry will also be played in the Hoosier Dome in 1985.

I-AA FOOTBALL

Indiana State is again eligible for the NCAA I-AA football title in 1984. The Sycamores, who joined the I-AA ranks last season, reached the 12-team playoffs at the end of last season and advanced to the quarter finals before losing to eventual national champion Southern Illinois.

Nearly 85 teams vie for the 12 coveted playoff berths, with the four top seeds earning first round byes. Indiana State and Eastern Illinois played a first round game in Terre Haute last season, which the Sycamores won in double overtime, 16-13.

A weekly poll is conducted by the NCAA throughout the season, with a Top 20 ranking released each week. ISU finished the year rated No. 5 in the country.

Five conferences, the Big Sky, the Ohio Valley, the Southern, the Southland, and the Yankee, receive automatic bids for their respective champions into the tournament. Two independents are also invited as are five at-large qualifiers.

Once again this year the national championship game will be held at Charleston, South Carolina on Dec. 15. All preliminary contests will

be at campus sites.
