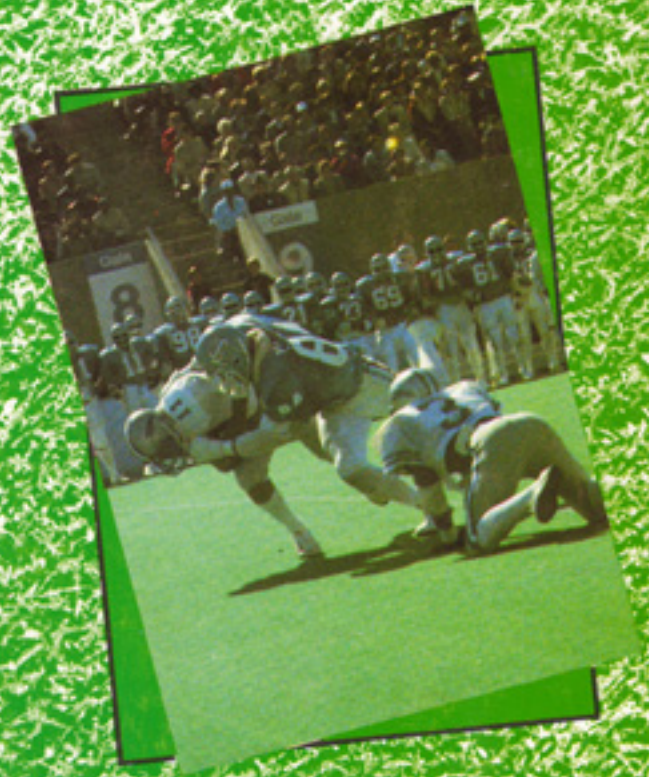

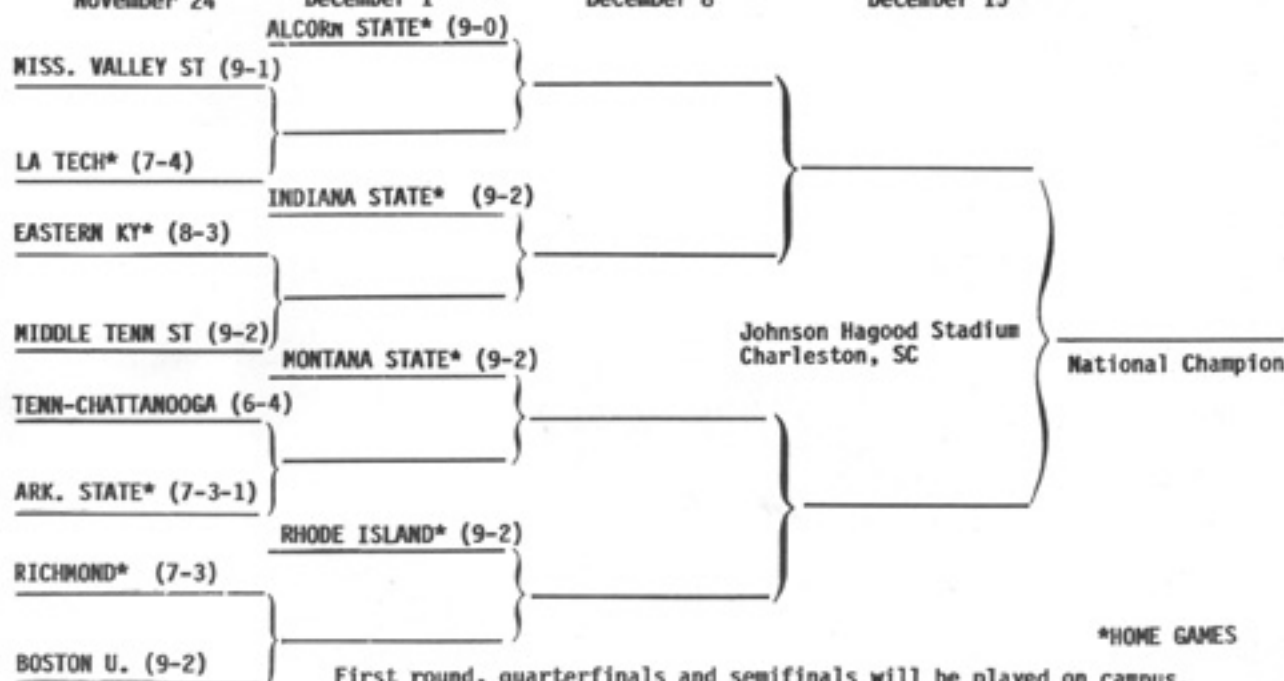

THE UNIVERSITY & ADMINISTRATION

Founded in 1863, Indiana State University serves the community, state and nation through undergraduate and graduate instruction, research and public service. The University offers degrees in education; business; nursing; technology; health, physical education, and recreation; and the arts and sciences.

Nearly 12,000 students attend the main campus in Terre Haute (metro population - 114,000) which is located near the Illinois state line in west central Indiana. The regional campus in Evansville serves nearly 4,000 students.

Programs at Indiana State University are accredited by some two dozen national professional organizations. The teacher education program has been approved by the Teacher Training and Licensing Commission for the State of Indiana and by the National Council of Accreditation for Teacher Education. According to the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business, the undergraduate and graduate programs in the School of Business rank among the top 10 percent in the nation. And ranked among the top four in the nation is the graduate criminology program at ISU.

The University was the first in the nation to offer both undergraduate and graduate instruction in athletic training and today is one of only eight with a graduate program in the field. Indiana State is also one of 30 some universities in the nation to offer a music merchandising program, a music major which combines a solid business minor.

Today the University has seven doctoral programs, 136 baccalaureate programs, 94 master's degree programs and 14 associate degree programs.

The men's athletic teams joined the Missouri Valley Conference in 1976 while the women's teams belong to the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference, which was founded in 1982.

The reputation of Indiana State's academic and athletic programs is enriched by the successes of the University's 56,000 alumni. Graduates have distinguished themselves as Pulitzer Prize-winning journalists, professional basketball players, nationally acclaimed heart specialists, and champion gymnasts. More than 30 have become presidents of colleges and universities.

HEAD COACH DENNIS RAETZ



Indiana State University head football coach Dennis Raetz is establishing one of the best total football programs in the Midwest.

After the most successful season in Sycamore football history, one in which ISU participated in the NCAA I-AA post-season playoffs for the first time ever, Raetz and his program received the acclaim which the Sycamore faithful knew would come in a matter of time.

In just four years as the head coach at Indiana State, Raetz has already become the fourth winningest coach in ISU's long football history and his teams have set numerous individual and team records.

A native of North Platte, Neb., Raetz earned a bachelor's degree in math and physical education from the University of Nebraska in 1968. Raetz entered the prep coaching ranks as an assistant at North Kansas City (Missouri) High School, a post he held until being named the first head coach at J.C. Harmon High, also in Kansas City. He also earned a master's degree in physical education from Central Missouri in 1971.

After four successful years at Harmon High, Raetz was hired by former University of Missouri head coach Al Onofrio to become a member of the Tiger staff in 1977. He coached the junior varsity team as well as the varsity defensive ends.

The following year Raetz moved to Indiana

State as the defensive coordinator for former Sycamore head coach Dick Jamieson, a post he held for two years before being elevated to the head coaching position in 1980 when Jamieson left for an assistant's job with the National Football League's St. Louis Cardinals.

Under Raetz, the Sycamores have been known as a strong defensive club, and he has coached such standouts as linebacker Craig Shaffer, formerly with the NFL's Cardinals, and defensive end Gerry Glusic, both Missouri Valley Conference defensive "Players of the Year," as well as I-AA All-American defensive end Ed Martin. Martin was a recent draft choice of the NFL's Dallas Cowboys.

The Indiana State offense has also set several passing, scoring and total offense marks under Raetz' direction, thus showing the all-around aspects of the Sycamore program.

In the past few years the Sycamore football program has become a strong one and Dennis Raetz has been the moving force behind that improvement.

Raetz is married (Betty) and has two children (Jamie 9, and Mark, 6).

SUPER SYCAMORES



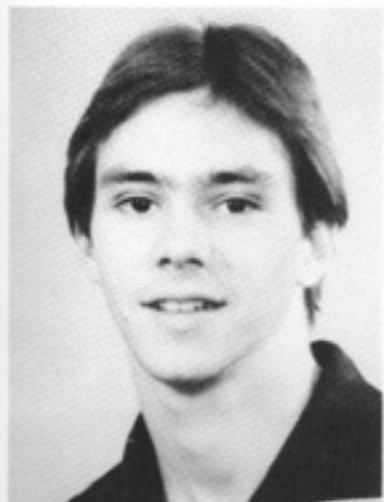
LARRY BIRD

Larry Bird led a "Cinderella" Indiana State basketball team to the NCAA championship game in 1979 and into the hearts of basketball fans everywhere. A former Indiana High School All-Star performer, Bird was the best thing to hit the ISU net scene in a long time.

The 6-foot-9 "Blond Bomber" was a first-round draft choice of the NBA's Boston Celtics in 1979. Bird's selection caused one Boston scribe to write, "Larry Bird is a 6-9, sturdy, blond-haired amalgam of Bob Pettit, Dan Issel and Rick Barry.

He has the shooting range and stick-it-in-your-face shooting style of Pettit, the all-around inside game and scoring savvy of Issel and the passing ability of Barry. Just thinking of him playing for the Celtics makes me want to go out and buy seven basketball magazines."

Since his first year in the NBA, Bird has been selected to play in every All-Star game and helped lead the Celtics to the league crown in 1981 and 1984. Following the 1984 campaign Larry was named the NBA's Most Valuable Player.



KURT THOMAS

Truly the greatest name in American men's gymnastics is that of former ISU performer Kurt Thomas.

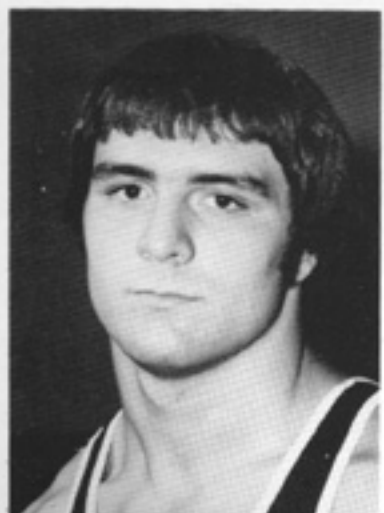
All the Miami, Fla., native did during his five-year career at ISU was to achieve All-American honors four times and win the NCAA All-Around competition twice. He led the Sycamores to first and so far only NCAA title in 1977 and a third place finish in 1979.

The first American in 46 years to win a gold medal in international competition when he accomplished the feat in

Strasbourg, France in 1978, Thomas' personality and great athletic ability made him the envy of gymnasts everywhere.

Thomas was a member of the 1976 United States Olympic team, which competed in Montreal, and was on the US team in 1980. He was denied the opportunity to compete in his second Olympiad due to the Moscow boycott.

Thomas is now contemplating an acting career but has been working as a personal coach to several of America's top gymnastic prospects.



BRUCE BAUMGARTNER

Former Indiana State University wrestler Bruce Baumgartner has to go down as perhaps the greatest wrestler in the long history of ISU.

Baumgartner, who hails from Haledon, NJ, won the 1981 NCAA heavyweight crown with a 4-2 decision of Oklahoma's Steve Williams and in the process became the only ISU grappler to ever win an NCAA crown.

During his amazing four-year collegiate career, "Big Bruce" amassed an incredible 143-12 record, including 70 pins.

Baumgartner also participated

on the United States national team and has won championships in national AAU competition and the US Federation tournament. During the summer of 1981, Bruce won a gold medal in the World University Games in Bucharest, Rumania.

In 1983, Baumgartner was one of the recipients honored by the NCAA with the "Big Five" award. This past summer in the games of the 23rd Olympiad in Los Angeles, Bruce won the gold medal in the heavyweight division of freestyle wrestling competition.
