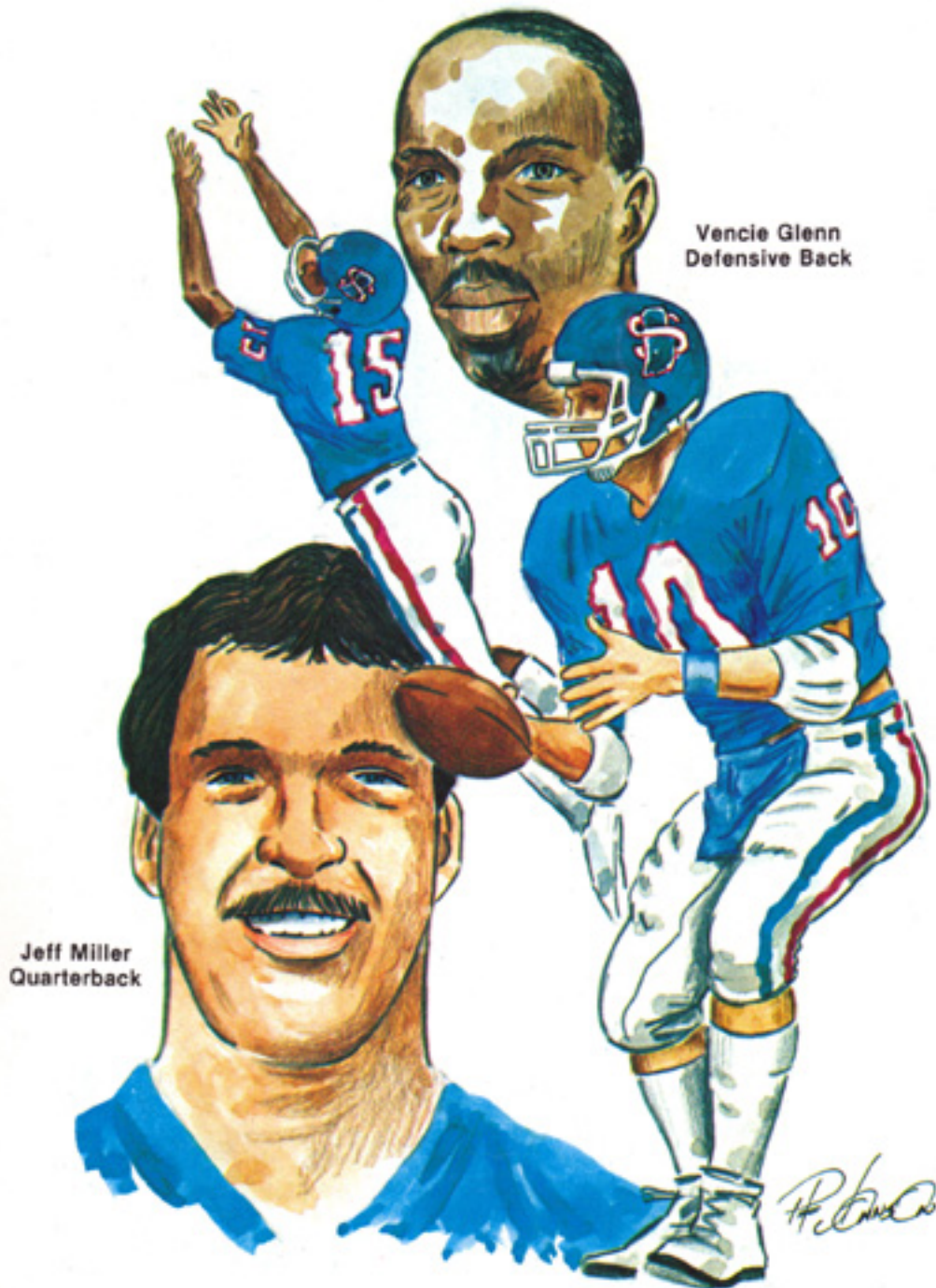

Whether it be in athletics or academics, Indiana State University has a long-standing tradition for excellence.

Established in 1865 along the banks of the Wabash River in west central Indiana, the University has grown to a current enrollment of 11,600 students who are earning degrees in education; business; nursing; technology; health, physical education and recreation; and the arts and sciences.

Diversity in the academic offerings of the institution, as well as in the faculty and student populations, makes Indiana State University uniquely qualified to serve the academic needs of the community of Terre Haute (metro population -- 114,000), the state and the nation.

Perhaps one of the best indicators of ISU's quality of instruction is recognition by accrediting boards nationwide. The University's academic programs are accredited by some two dozen national professional organizations. The teacher education program has been approved by the Teacher Training and Licensing Commission for the State of Indiana and by the National Council for Accreditation for Teacher Education. The American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business ranks the undergraduate and graduate programs in the School of Business among the top 10 percent in the nation. And ranked among the top four in the nation is the graduate criminology

program at ISU.

The University was the first in the nation to offer both undergraduate and graduate instruction in athletic training and today is one of only eight with a graduate program in the field. Indiana State is also one of 30 some universities in the nation to offer a music merchandising program, an intensive music degree which provides a strong business minor.

Today the University offers 114 baccalaureate programs, 13 associate degree programs, 85 master's degree programs, 22 doctoral programs and 11 educational specialist programs.

ISU's athletic programs have been highlighted by such names as Larry Bird, Bruce Baumgartner and Kurt Thomas. This reputation for excellence continues with the athletic teams of today.

The men's athletic teams joined the Missouri Valley Conference in 1976 while the women's teams belong to the Gateway Athletic Conference, which was founded in 1982.

The reputation of Indiana State's academic and athletic programs is enriched by the successes of the University's 56,000 alumni. Graduates have distinguished themselves as Pulitzer-Prize winning journalists, nationally acclaimed heart specialists, University administrators, professional athletes and outstanding members of the communities in which they work and live.

ISU Administration

Dr. Richard Landini

Presently in his 10th year as President of Indiana State University, Dr. Richard Landini has been a strong supporter of all of the University's athletic programs.

Working with representatives of the Athletic Department, he was an advocate of ISU's membership in the Missouri Valley and Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conferences. His concern for the academics of athletes has been evidenced by his active involvement in policy making by the National Collegiate Athletic Association. In 1983 he helped draft the NCAA rule which states that a student athlete must make satisfactory progress toward specific degree requirements.



Landini earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in literature from the University of Miami in 1954 and 1955. After earning his Doctor of Philosophy degree (1959) at the University of Florida, he served on the faculty and administrative staff of Arizona State University for 11 years (1959-70). In 1970, he was appointed academic vice-president and professor of English at the University of Montana. He is ISU's eighth president, succeeding Dr. Alan C. Rankin in 1975.

Dr. Landini and his family reside in historic Condit House on the University campus.



Bernard "Beanie" Cooper



Beanie Cooper was named Athletic Director at Indiana State University on March 13, 1981. Prior to being named AD at ISU Cooper served at the University of South Dakota where he was Chairman and Director of the Department of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Athletics since July, 1975.

Cooper served as head football coach at South Dakota from 1974-79, with his 1978 team capturing the North Central Conference championship. His coaching career began at Algona, IA in 1958, and he recorded a 92-38-2 record in 16 years of high school coaching. Cooper served six highly-

successful years as head coach and athletic director at Heelan High School in Sioux City, where his teams posted an overall record of 43-11.

Cooper was named Iowa Coach-of-the-Year in 1971 and was Siouxlant Coach-of-the-Year in 1979. He has served as president of the Iowa Football Coaches Association (1971) and was on the board of directors for the Iowa High School Athletic Directors Association. For his hard work and devotion to Iowa High School football he was inducted into the Iowa Football Coaches Hall-of-Fame in 1972.

While at Indiana State Cooper has served as the Chairman of the Missouri Valley Conference Television Committee and on the MVC Finance Committee. He still keeps his hand in the football establishment, serving as the Chairman of the Central District NCAA 1-AA Football Committee, and as a member of the National Association of Athletic Directors.

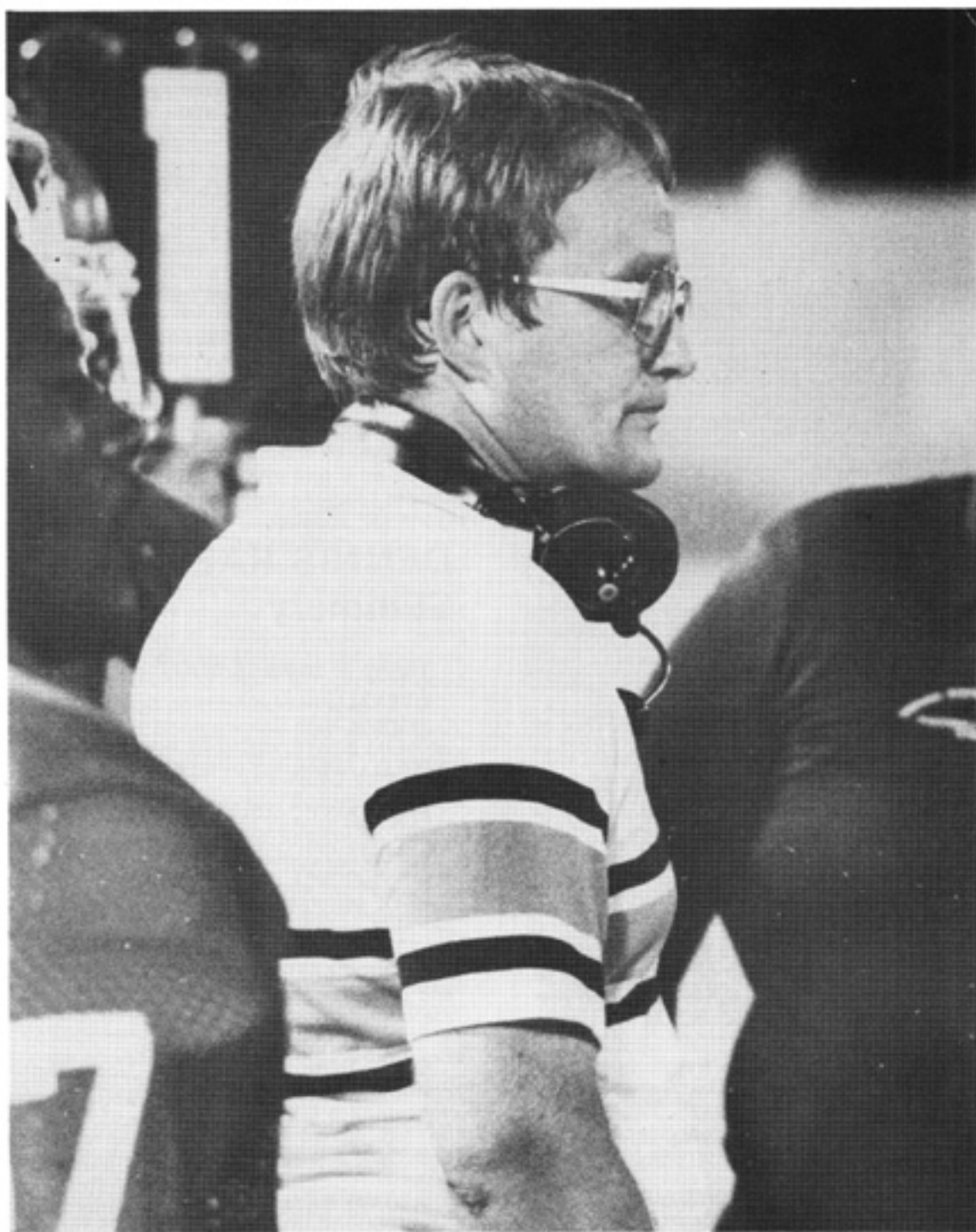

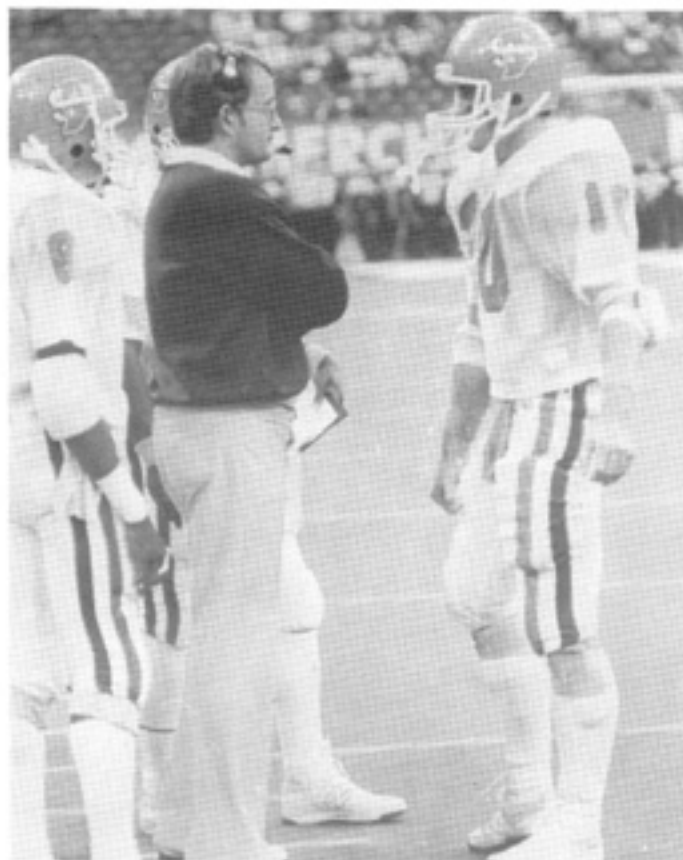

The Coaches



Head Coach Dennis Raetz



Indiana State's Dennis Raetz is fast becoming known as one of the nation's up-and-coming collegiate football coaches.

In five short years as the Sycamores' head football coach, Raetz has guided ISU into the upper echelons of the NCAA I-AA football world. Included in that rise have been back-to-back trips to the I-AA playoffs and a No. 1 regular season ranking (in both the official NCAA national poll as well as the "unofficial" Lexington, Ky., Herald-Leader ratings).

For the past two seasons, in fact, the Indiana State football program has been among the nation's winningest at any level of competition. Eighteen victories over a two-year span is a tough record to beat and few schools have come close to that mark.

But it shouldn't really come as a surprise that the Sycamores have done so well under Raetz' stewardship. He had shown himself to be a winner as a high school coach before coming to ISU as an assistant coach in 1978, and the North Platte, Neb., native has proven to be quite deserving of such a reputation.

Already the third-winningest coach (total victories) in Indiana State football history, the 1984 Missouri Valley Conference "Coach of the Year" has guided histeams to 34 wins in 58 games. That's a .595 winning percentage, fourth-best in ISU history.

After four successful years as the head coach at Harmon High School in Kansas City, Kan., where he coached

former All-American defensive back Mark Haynes (now an all-pro performer for the NFL's New Jersey Giants), Raetz was lured to the University of Missouri by former Tiger head coach Al Onofrio to become an assistant with the Tigers. While at Missouri, Raetz coached the junior varsity team as well as the varsity defensive ends.

In 1978, the University of Nebraska graduate moved to ISU as the defensive coordinator for former Sycamore coach Dick Jamieson. When Jamieson left just two years later to become an assistant with the St. Louis Cardinals, Raetz was the natural choice to take over the head coaching duties.

Since taking over the helm, Raetz has fielded several strong defensive ballclubs and he has coached such ISU standouts as linebacker Craig Shaffer, defensive end Gerry Gluscic and cornerback Wayne Davis, all former MVC "Defensive Players of the Year." Also, defensive end Ed Martin and Davis have been selected first-team I-AA All-Americans.

Just last season, quarterback Jeff Miller earned the MoVal's "Offensive Player of the Year" award, attesting to the all-around aspects of Raetz' program.

The Indiana State University football program continues to grow and prosper under Raetz' leadership and the best might just be around the corner.

Quoting Raetz on the Sycamores

THE QUARTERBACK -- "Since we have the Missouri Valley Conference "Offensive Player of the Year" returning in Jeff Miller, we're in good shape one deep. After that, however, we have some kids who have yet to take a snap in a college game in Kevin Clancy & Eric Roberts. I think this might be one position that one of our freshman recruits (Shawn Long and John Sahn) could come in and play an important part in a backup role. I do think that all of our quarterbacks made progress this past spring."

THE RECEIVERS -- "I think we have as much depth at the receiver position as anywhere on the team. We have three kids in Joe Downing, Terry Bell and Anthony Kimball who have been starters for us for the past two years. And then there's Gary Cannon, Chris Johnson, Jeff Chestnut and Pat Duncan -- all underclassmen -- who can play if the need arises."

THE TIGHT ENDS -- "We do have some depth returning here in Don Hitz, who started half of the games when Herbert Dawson was injured last year; Bill Hayes and Jamie McLaughlin. Hayes saw some action last year and I think that McLaughlin has a good college career ahead of him. He's a 6-6, 220-pound redshirt freshman, so I think he's going to be a good one down the road for us. And then we recruited a great athlete in Darnell White."

THE OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD -- "We lost a lot of kids here. But I do think we have a good group of athletes returning for us. What we lack in experience, we should make up in talent. At tailback, Charles Walls and Tracy Stewart should do a good job in replacing Darold Clardy and Kevin Henderson. Jimmy Edwards is a good college fullback who has seen plenty of game action over the past two years. We have a group of younger players in Darrin O'Neal, Henry Dixon, and William Martin at tailback while Linus Schepers and Leonard Winborn will provide good depth at fullback."

THE OFFENSIVE LINE -- "This is an area where depth may be a problem for us. We do return starting tackles Mark Boster and David Heuser, and starting guard Mike Simmonds from a year ago. But we must find replacements for graduated starters Steve Buxton (guard) and Richard Dawson (center). Right now, David Fleet and Mark Blakey are penciled in at those positions. That could change before the season starts. Some of our other top linemen include Stu Sevald and Carl Uccellini. Blakey's flexibility gives us some other possibilities since he could also play guard."

NEW OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR -- "You don't change from what has been working for you. Coach (Jerry) Boyce has made some suggestions and we have listened to those suggestions. I see no radical changes from what we have done in the past, however. If anything, the emphasis may change on one or two things but that's about it."

THE DEFENSIVE SECONDARY -- "Another area of concern. While we do have Vencie Glenn coming back for his senior year, we lost the services of Keith Ward (cornerback), Regis Mason (strong safety) and Wayne Davis (cornerback). I do think that Vencie has as much ability as anyone we've had in the defensive backfield. He's an excellent weak safety. Steve Bidwell should step in for Mason and Steve McKeel will take over at Ward's spot. Both of them saw action as starters last fall. Redshirt freshmen Keith Mullen and Donald Robinson will both get

a look at Davis' vacated cornerback position. Steve Brown had a strong spring at weak safety when he took over for Glenn, who had injured his shoulder. Depth may be a problem here but we took steps to bolster that area by signing several high school defensive backs."

THE INSIDE LINEBACKERS -- "Along with receiver, we have as much depth at the inside linebacking position as anywhere on the team. We return both starters from a year ago, Troy Johnson and Tim Cunningham, as well as top reserves Greg Corsaro and Tom Albright. A starter from the 1983 season, Jeff Campbell, returns to the team after sitting out last year with an injury. All five can play without losing too much ability. We also have two redshirt freshmen who will give us good depth in Matt Campbell and Kenny Hopp."

THE DEFENSIVE ENDS -- "One deep we're pretty good. Bobby Boyce and Kurt Bell are both veteran starters, Kurt has been starting for the past three years while Bobby is in his second year. After those two, we're very inexperienced. The depth is there but not one player has taken a snap in a college game. Matt Cole and Kevin Buchannan are currently listed as the top backups."

THE DEFENSIVE LINE -- "With Doug Arnold returning at noseguard, we have a very good foundation. We lost both of our starting tackles (Brad Verdun and Mark Miller) but top reserves Rob McIntyre, Mark Brice and Andy Kondracki are back and redshirt freshman Rhett Schmidt has made the move to the line from linebacker during the spring. Dan Curley is a strong backup to Arnold at noseguard. Again, good depth but lacking in game experience."

THE KICKING GAME -- "A strength. Placekicker Scott Bridges returns as does punter Chuck Standiford. Standiford can also placekick if needed. We lost our long snapper, Brad Verdun, to graduation. Joe Downing once again will be the holder for extra-points and field goals. Right now Tracy Stewart is the only kickoff returner with any extensive experience but several players could see action there. Downing returns as our punt returner."

MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE RACE -- "As always, Tulsa should be the team to beat. They've got an excellent program. Wichita State should also have a shot. Drake and Southern Illinois are improved while Illinois State has some very good young players. West Texas State has got a new coach so you really don't know what to expect from them."

GOALS FOR THE SEASON -- "We really only have three goals before each season: 1. Have a winning season, 2. Win the conference championship, 3. Make the I-AA playoffs. If we can do those things, we'll feel like we've had a successful season."

I-AA PLAYOFFS -- "We've had some success in the playoffs the past couple of seasons. Two years ago we were beaten in the quarterfinals by the eventual national champion, Southern Illinois. They had a great team so there's no reason to feel bad about that. Then last year we lost a triple-overtime game to Middle Tennessee in a game we had every chance to win."

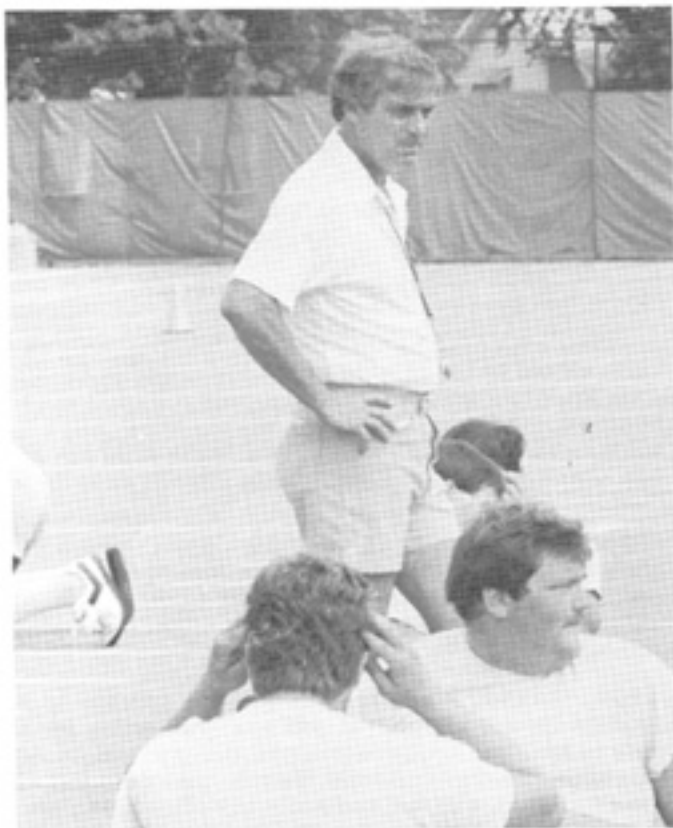

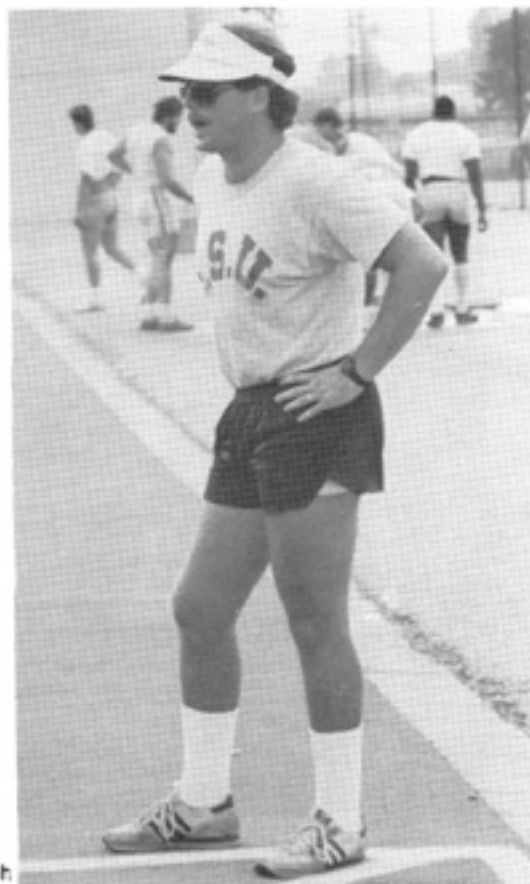

Memorial Stadium



Indiana State plays their home football games at Memorial Stadium, which is located on the corners of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute.

The stadium was acquired by the University in 1967 and, prior to that time, was used for both football and baseball. Since the installation of the synthetic playing surface, however, the field has been used for football and field hockey.

The first university in the world to own and make outdoor application of Astroturf was Indiana State and the Sycamores put the new field to good use in September of 1967 as ISU hosted Eastern Illinois.

The Astroturf in use at Indiana State is similar to that used in Houston's famed Astrodome. Plus factors in the use of the synthetic surface include durability (some 15 college and high school football games are played on the field each year; and in addition the ISU football team conducts all practices on the field) and a constant surface which will provide sure footing regardless of weather.

Each blade of grass is 3/8 inches long and is attached to a sponge-

rubber pad 1/4 inches thick. This sponge pad is then set upon a fiber pad 1/2 inch thick. Both the sponge pad and the fiber pad are set on a two-inch layer of asphalt. Memorial Stadium was open to the public for the first time May 5, 1925 as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria (IL) Tractors with an estimated crowd of 9,000 on hand for the event.

Among the honored guests at the game were major league baseball commissioner Judge Kennesaw Landis and Charles Barnard, a representative of the Cleveland Indians.

The first use of the playing field was

in the fall of 1924 as local high schools, Wiley and Garfield, played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.

Work on Memorial Stadium was begun in 1922 at a cost of \$450,000.

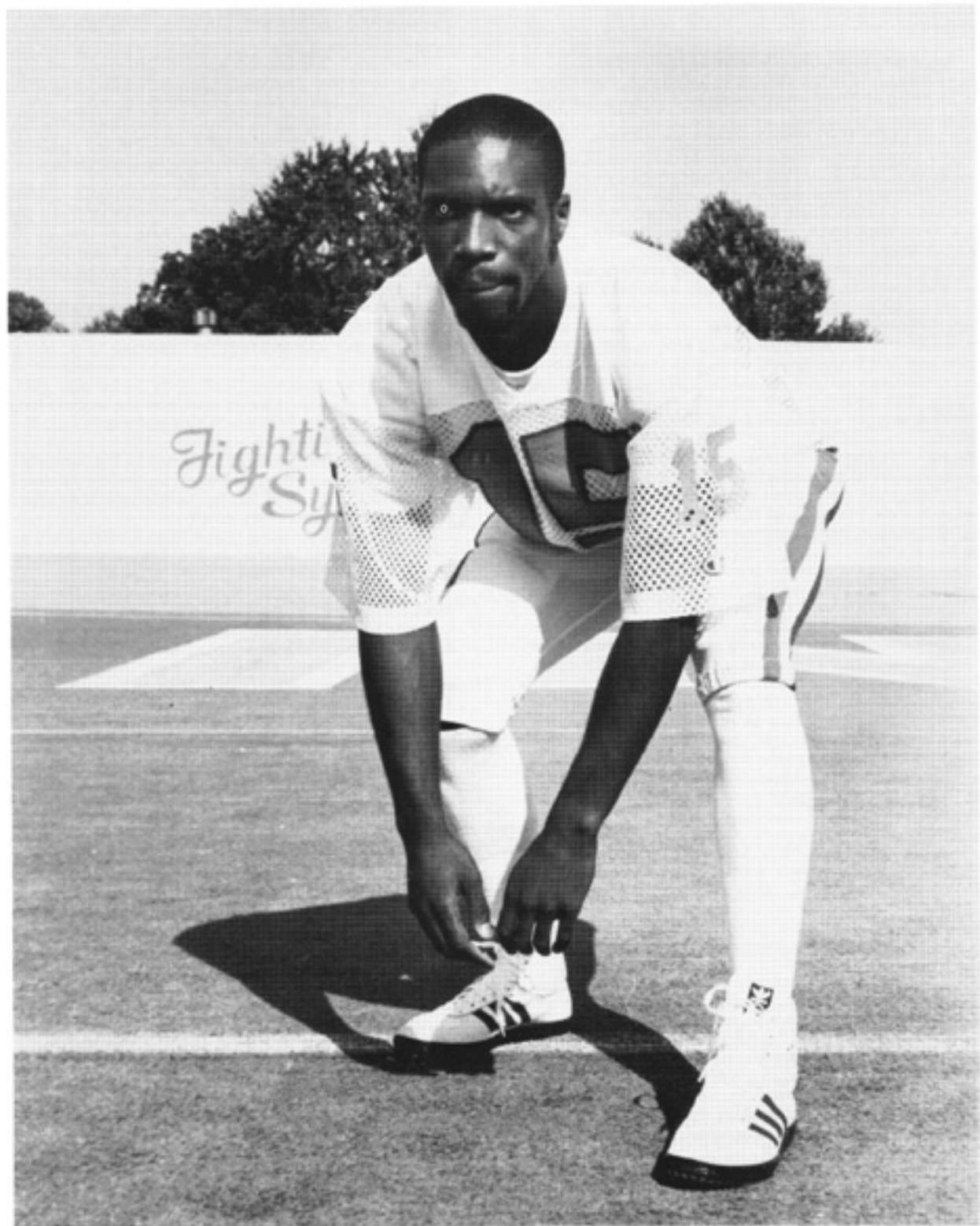
After the University gained control of the stadium in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included the reorientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to an east-west line; installation of Astroturf; and a building of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as rebuilding of seats on the south side of the field.

Capacity of Memorial Stadium is now 20,500.

1985 Indiana State Sycamores



1985 Indiana State University Football Preview:

After back-to-back appearances in the NCAA I-AA postseason playoffs, consecutive nine wins seasons, a second place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference, and a I-AA Top 5 ranking for the past two years, Indiana State's Sycamores have had one of the winningest college football programs in the nation during the mid-1980's.

However, key losses along the offensive and defensive lines, as well as in both the offensive and defensive backfields, have the Indiana State coaching staff working in an attempt to keep the winning formula alive.

Gone from last year's MVC runnerup team are All-America cornerback Wayne Davis, honorable mention All-America offensive guard Steve Buxton; and All-MoVal players Richard Dawson (C), Darrold Clardy (RB) and Brad Verdun (DT). Additional losses include veteran strong safety Regis Mason, cornerback Keith Ward, running back Kevin Henderson, tight end Herbert Dawson, defensive tackle Mark Miller and fullback Rick Dwenger.

What's left are 36 lettermen and 12 returning starters, six each on offense and defense. Among the top returners for the Sycamores are senior quarterback Jeff Miller, the Missouri Valley Conference's "Offensive Player of the Year" in 1984; senior weak safety Vencie Glenn, senior noseguard Doug Arnold, senior defensive ends Kurt Bell and Bobby Boyce; and junior inside linebacker Troy Johnson. ISU also returns its senior receiving trio of Joe Downing, Terry Bell and Anthony Kimball as well as senior placekicker Scott Bridges and junior punter Chuck Standiford.

THE OFFENSE:

Quarterbacks - The Indiana State quarterbacking duties are in the very capable hands of senior Jeff Miller (6-2, 215), who has the distinction of being the winningest signal caller in ISU history. Since Miller took over the reins of the ISU offense in the third game of the 1982 season, the Sycamores have won 22 of 32 games in which he has started.

An extremely intelligent quarterback, Miller has proven to be quite adept at picking out the second, third and sometimes even the fourth receiver on a given play. His leadership abilities are without question as he has directed Indiana State to wins over such quality programs as the University of Louisville, Northeast Louisiana and McNeese State and to near upsets of the University of Florida and the University of Tulsa.

Sophomore Kevin Clancy (6-2, 212) has healed nicely from knee surgery to supplant himself solidly as the team's No. 2 quarterback prospect. An excellent thrower, this lefthander made great strides during spring drills and was the winning quarterback in this past spring's Blue-White intrasquad game.

Redshirt freshman Eric Roberts (6-1, 204) rank third on the team's summer depth charts but don't count out incoming freshmen recruits Shawn Long (5-11, 180) and John Sahn (6-2, 195). Long was the Kansas City, Mo., Metro Player of the Year in 1984 playing for Grandview High while Sahn directed his Indianapolis Chatard prep team to three consecutive state championships.

Tailbacks - With the graduation of senior ballcarriers Darrold Clardy and Kevin Henderson, the Sycamores may be short on experience at this key position.

Sophomore Charles Walls (6-0, 208) is the heir apparent to Clardy and Henderson after putting together a strong spring. An excellent athlete, Walls played well in limited duty a year ago, rushing for 75 in one half against Central Missouri and scoring on a touchdown run against the University of Louisville. His 65-yard touchdown scamper in the 1985 spring game provided the margin of victory for the winning White team.

Behind Walls are junior Tracy Stewart (5-9, 173), sophomore William Martin (6-1, 220) and redshirt freshmen Darrin O'Neal (5-10, 207) and Henry Dixon (5-11, 193).

Stewart is an exciting runner, who specialized last season as a kick returner and, like Walls, saw limited action at the tailback position last fall. O'Neal, Martin and Dixon all impressed during spring drills and could be factors when fall practice starts.

Fullbacks - Another spot hurt by graduation is fullback as three-year starter Rick Dwenger was lost. Indiana State does return an experienced runner and blocker in junior Jimmy Ed-

wards (5-8, 200), a part-time starter two years ago. Edwards has the necessary tools to be a quality fullback for the Sycamores.

Senior Linus Schepers (5-10, 205) gives ISU another strong blocker and has been impressive as a runner as well. Juniors Leonard Winborn (5-7, 213) and Willie Davis (6-0, 199) are two other possibilities as is redshirt freshman Brent Fleming (5-10, 222).

Receivers - Experience abounds at this position as Indiana State retains the services of seniors Joe Downing (5-9, 176), Terry Bell (5-7, 160) and Anthony Kimball (5-10, 163).

Downing was the Sycamores' leading pass catcher in 1984 while Kimball held that honor in 1983. All three are possession type of receivers but they can also surprise by getting downfield in a hurry for the long pass.

The backups are high quality as well. Sophomore Gary Cannon (5-9, 184) is improving daily and will push all three seniors for increased playing time this fall. Also in reserve for ISU are sophomore Pat Duncan (6-2, 204), juniors Trent Miles (5-6, 156) and Jeff Chestnut (5-11, 188) and redshirt freshman Chris Johnson (5-11, 175).

Tight Ends - Gone is three-year starter Herbert Dawson but returning for the Sycamores are senior Don Hitz (6-2, 242), junior Bill Hayes (6-3, 233) and redshirt freshman Jamie McLaughlin (6-6, 222).

With Dawson sidelined with injury a year ago, Hitz and Hayes each saw increased playing time and the experience gained will no doubt help the Sycamores this coming fall. Both are capable receivers and blockers.

McLaughlin may be ISU's tight end of the future but also keep an eye out for incoming freshman Darnell White (6-4, 225).

Offensive Line - How do you replace veterans Steve Buxton and Richard Dawson. Not very easily.

But Indiana State does return three starters from a year ago in junior guard Mike Simmonds (6-4, 272), and senior tackles Mark Boster (6-2, 249) and David Heuser (6-3, 247).

Given the top chances for earning a starting nod are sophomore Mark Blakey (6-2, 258), who can play guard or center; junior center Carl Uccellini (6-1, 242), redshirt freshman guard David Fleet (6-2, 266), and sophomore tackle Stu Sevald (6-3, 255).

Depth is a question here. Youth and inexperience prevail once you get past the top five or six linemen.

THE DEFENSE:

The Secondary - Only one starter returns from a year ago, senior weak safety Vencie Glenn (6-0, 179). Gone are long-time starters Wayne Davis (CB), Regis Mason (SS) and Keith Ward (CB).

However, Sycamore fans have strong reason to hope for another good season. Penciled in to replace the multi-talented Davis is redshirt freshman Keith Mullen (5-11, 167) while senior Steve Bidwell (6-1, 194) steps in for Mason at strong safety and sophomore Steve McKeel (5-11, 191) takes over at the boundary cornerback spot. Bidwell and McKeel each saw varsity action a year ago and are strong replacements. Mullen may be the only question mark but judging by his performance this past spring, ISU may have another excellent performer at the wide side cornerback position.

Key reserves figure to be weak safety Steve Brown (6-2, 209, So.) and redshirt freshman cornerback Don Robinson (5-7, 172). Also look for incoming freshmen Lavent Blaylock (5-9, 175), Walter Crutchfield (5-11, 183), Milton Seaton (5-11, 170) and Derek Williams (5-10, 183) to make a push for playing time.

Inside Linebackers - One of the deepest positions on the Indiana State team this fall has to be at inside linebacker as the Sycamores return 1984 starters Tim Cunningham (6-4, 229, Jr.) and Troy Johnson (6-0, 222, Jr.); top reserves Tom Albright (6-2, 222, Sr.) and Greg Corsaro (6-1, 218, So.); and 1983 starter Jeff Campbell (6-0, 225, Sr.), who missed all of last season with a neck injury.

Add to those five players redshirt freshmen Matt Campbell (5-11, 214) and Kenny Hopp (6-1, 204), who both made great strides during spring drills, and you have the makings for a strong group of linebackers.

Defensive Line - Senior Doug Arnold (6-2, 265) returns for his final season at nose-guard to anchor the ISU defensive line but the Sycamores did lose the services of 1984 starters Brad Verdun and

The Indiana State coaching staff entered spring drills looking for replacements and came out with a lineup that consisted of seniors Rob McIntyre (6-2, 250), junior Andy Kondracki (6-2, 245), sophomore Mark Brice (6-1, 246) and redshirt freshman Rhett Schmidt (6-2, 227).

Junior Dan Curley (6-2, 220) and redshirt freshman Mike Hribar (6-0, 226) back up Arnold at noseguard.

The Ends -- Seniors Bobby Boyce (6-0, 223) and Kurt Bell (6-3, 214) once again patrol the outside for ISU after strong seasons a year ago. Boyce is in his second year as a starter while Bell is a three-year veteran.

Transfer Kevin Buchannan (6-0, 224, Jr.) provides the Sycamores with help while sophomore Matt Cole (6-2, 221) and redshirt freshmen Antoine Liddell (6-2, 205) and Mike Smith (6-2, 186) are also in reserve.

THE KICKING GAME:

Placekickers -- Senior Scott Bridges (5-10, 184), after a record-setting year in 1984, returns for the Sycamores as placekicker. An All-MVC selection as well as an I-AA honorable mention All-America, Bridges is one of the top returning placekickers in I-AA football.

Junior Chuck Standiford (6-3, 195) is the Sycamores' backup kicker. He saw extensive playing time as a kicker two years ago when Bridges was sidelined with an injury.

Punters -- Junior Chuck Standiford (6-3, 195) is in his third season as ISU's starting punter. A good, all-around athlete, Standiford has steadily improved each season and is one of the top returning punters in the Missouri Valley Conference. Junior Darryl Harshman (6-0, 175) is Standiford's backup.

The 54th renewal of the Indiana State-Ball State Blue Key Victory Bell football game will again be played in the magnificent Indianapolis Hoosier Dome.

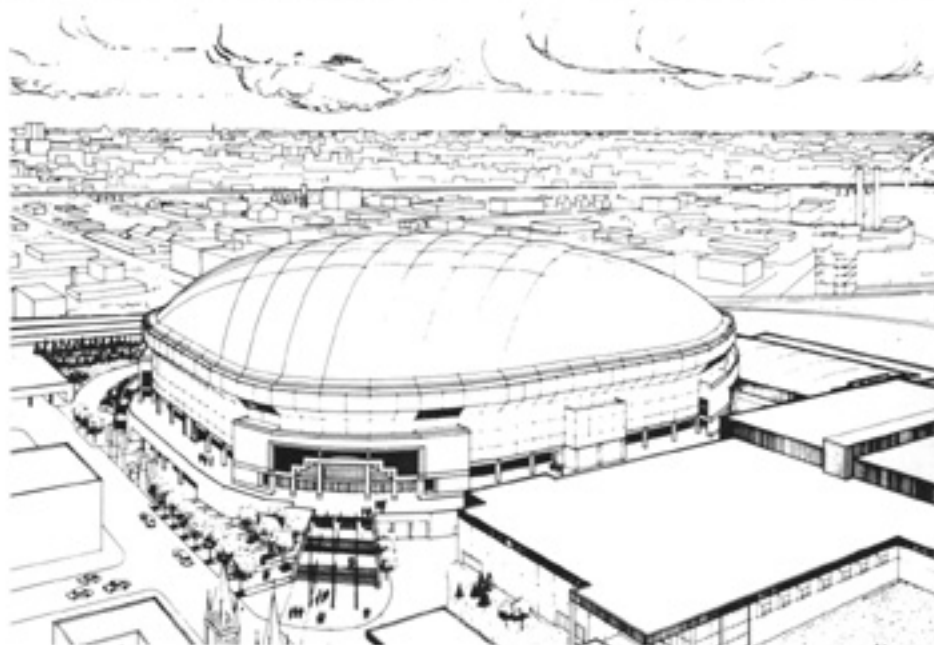
Last season the Sycamores defeated the Cardinals 34-6, before the largest crowd to ever gather for an ISU-BSU contest (20,242). Indiana State has defeated their Ball State rivals the past four seasons, and five of the last six.

Indiana State is again eligible for the NCAA 1-AA football title in 1985. The Sycamores, who joined the 1-AA ranks in 1983, reached the 12 team playoffs in each of the last two seasons before bowing out in the quarterfinal round.

Nearly 85 teams vie for the playoff berths. Many of the teams earning playoff spots are determined by the weekly poll conducted by the NCAA. ISU finished the 83 and 84 seasons as the fifth ranked team in Division 1-AA.

Five conferences, the Big Sky, the Ohio Valley, the Southern, the Southland, and the Yankee, receive automatic bids for their respective champions into the tournament. The remaining teams receive at-large bids to round out the field.

This year the National Championship game will be held at the Tacoma Dome in Tacoma, Washington on December 21.

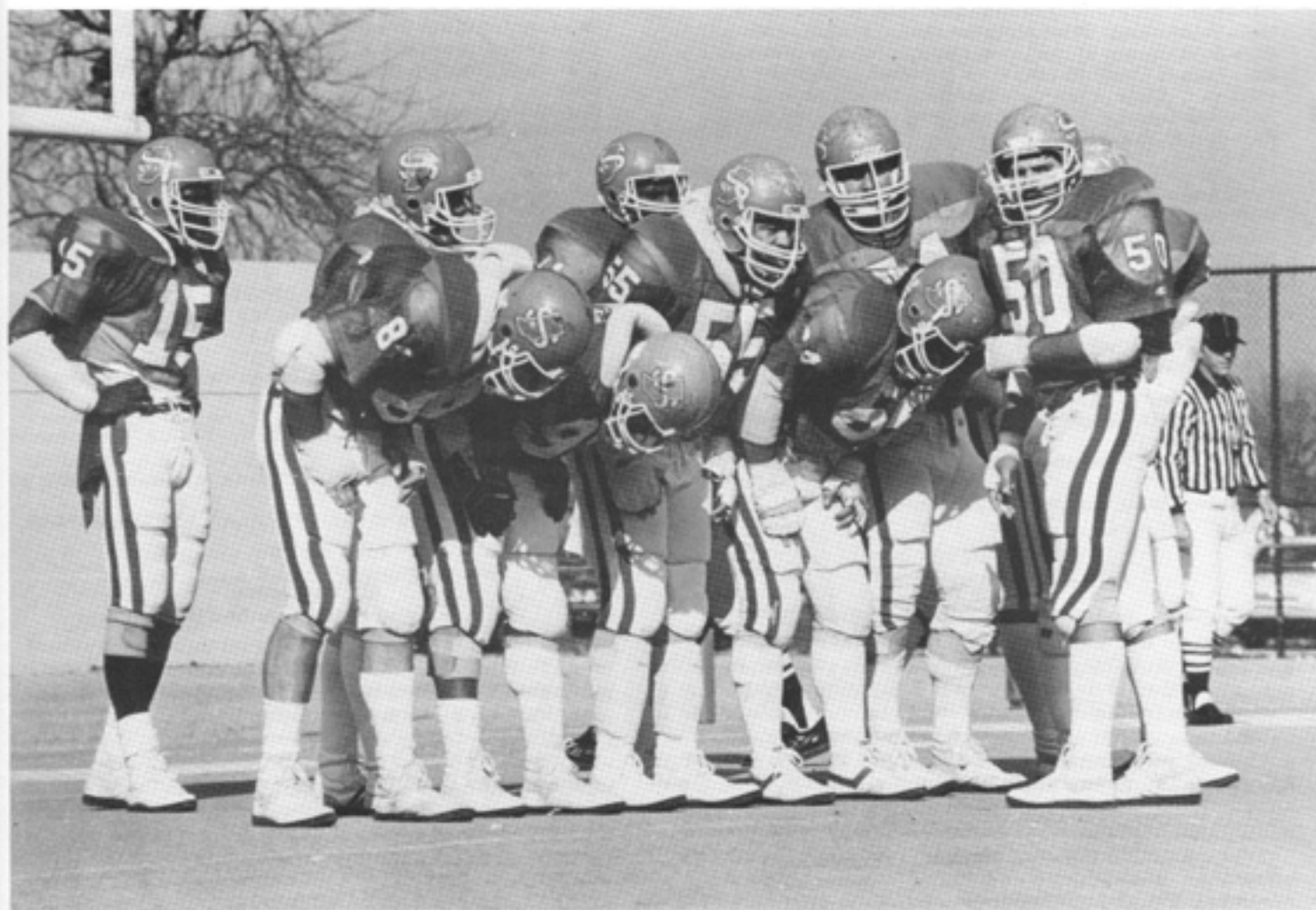

TERRE HAUTE, IND. -- Six different players scored touchdowns for Indiana State's football team Saturday night at Memorial Stadium as the Sycamores opened the 1984 season with a 42-6 victory over Wayne State.

Junior placekicker Scott Bridges was kept busy as he converted seven extra point attempts and was put into use on kickoffs for part of the game as well.

ISU got on the board three times in the first period to put a damper on any hopes of an upset built up by the visitors from Detroit.

Kevin Henderson capped an 81-yard, 11-play drive with 5:34 left in the first period and then it appeared as if the Tartars might tie the game. Taking advantage of three kickoffs going out of bounds, the visitors started a drive on their own 40. With Rich Popp at quarterback, WSU had a first down at the Sycamore 17 and then moved to the ISU 11-yard line.

Popp then attempted a pass that weak safety Vencie Glenn intercepted at the goal line and returned 100 yards for a touchdown. ISU was up 14-0 with 2:51 left to play in the quarter.

TERRE HAUTE, IND. -- That sudden gust of wind that hit the east side of Terre Haute late Saturday afternoon wasn't the start of a storm. It was merely 9,125 football fans breathing a collective sigh of relief as Indiana State's Wayne Davis picked off an Eastern Illinois pass with 1:05 remaining to preserve a 24-17 Sycamore victory over the Panthers at Memorial Stadium.

Davis' heroics occurred at the ISU 5-yard line just as it seemed that the visitors were certain to tie up the contest for the third time.

ISU had taken a 10-0 lead into the locker room at intermission and seemed to be controlling the game, but the Panthers, with quarterback Sean Payton completing passes seemingly at will, came roaring back into a 17-17 tie in the third quarter.

Payton tossed no fewer than 56 passes during the windy afternoon, completing 31 of them for 323 yards and two touchdowns.

That was a sizeable performance to overcome but the Sycamores managed it with a balanced scoring attack that produced 284 yards rushing and 88 yards through the air.

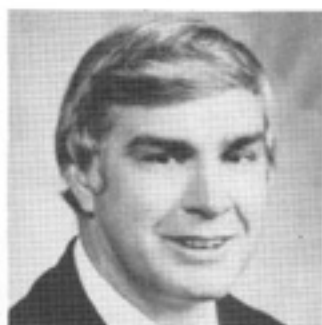

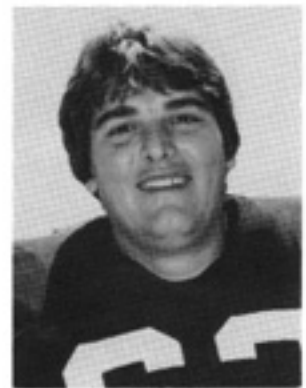

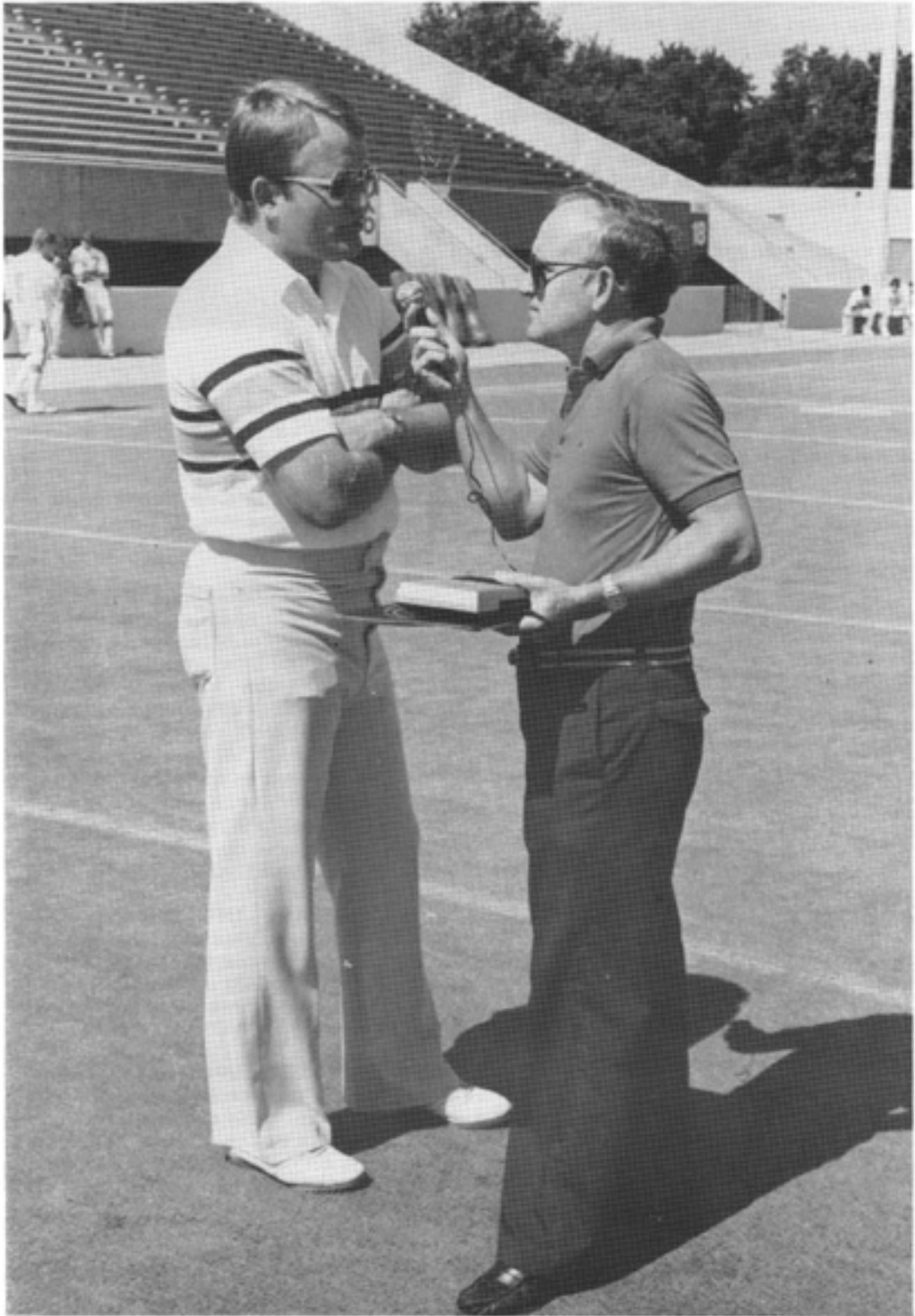

Memo To Media

The 1985 Indiana State University Football Media Guide has been prepared to assist both the print and the electronic media in covering ISU football this fall. Contents of the guide and changes in personnel as well as travel plans will be updated before and during the season by the Indiana State Sports Information Office.

For additional information concerning Indiana State University football, please contact either Marty Lotz, ISU Sports Information Director; or Tom James, ISU Assistant Sports Information Director. Our mailing address is: Indiana State Sports Information Arena Annex "B", Indiana State University, Terre Haute, Indiana 47809. Our phone number is (812) 237-4160.

ADMISSION TO PRESS FACILITIES: Admission to the press box area for all Indiana State University football games at Memorial Stadium and the Hoosier Dome is allowed on the following basis.

1. Daily Newspapers covering for Sunday publication.
2. Sports Editors only of other Indiana daily newspapers.
3. Sports Editors only of local Illinois daily newspapers.
4. Radio broadcast crews.
5. School publications (official campus publications of ISU and opposing school are limited to two working press and two photographic passes for all phases of school publication, including yearbook, newspaper, radio station, alumni magazine, etc.)
6. Accredited game photographers (same priority as writers).
7. Accredited television photographers.
8. Approved special coverage.

Space limitations prevent weekly press representatives and non-broadcasting radio personnel from being admitted. Only fully accredited personnel directly involved in the coverage of the game will be admitted. The Indiana State University Athletic Department reserves the right to revoke any passes issued to any individual not fully accredited or any individual not in compliance with press box and/or photographer standards or any individual bearing a working pass issued to someone else.

REQUESTS FOR CREDENTIALS: All requests for press box and photographic passes should be made through Marty Lotz, Sports Information Director, Indiana State University.

PICKING UP CREDENTIALS: No press box or photographic credentials for Indiana State University football games at Memorial Stadium or the Hoosier Dome will be mailed. Pick up credentials for Memorial Stadium games at the Will Call window underneath the main archway. Pick up credentials for the Hoosier Dome at the east side ground level entrance.

PARKING PASSES: Press parking is extremely limited at Memorial Stadium. Parking passes will be mailed at least one week prior to the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES: All representatives in the working press box will receive a game program, flip card, flash statistics, final defensive stats, scoring summary, drive charts and play-by-play besides the customary statistics and post-game quotes.



TELEPHONE: Telephones are available in the Memorial Stadium pressbox for collect and credit card calls only. These phones are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Anyone wishing to install a phone for exclusive use should contact Marty Lotz for seat location, then call General Telephone in Terre Haute (812-238-5444). For telephones at the Hoosier Dome, call (317) 262-3453 for further information.

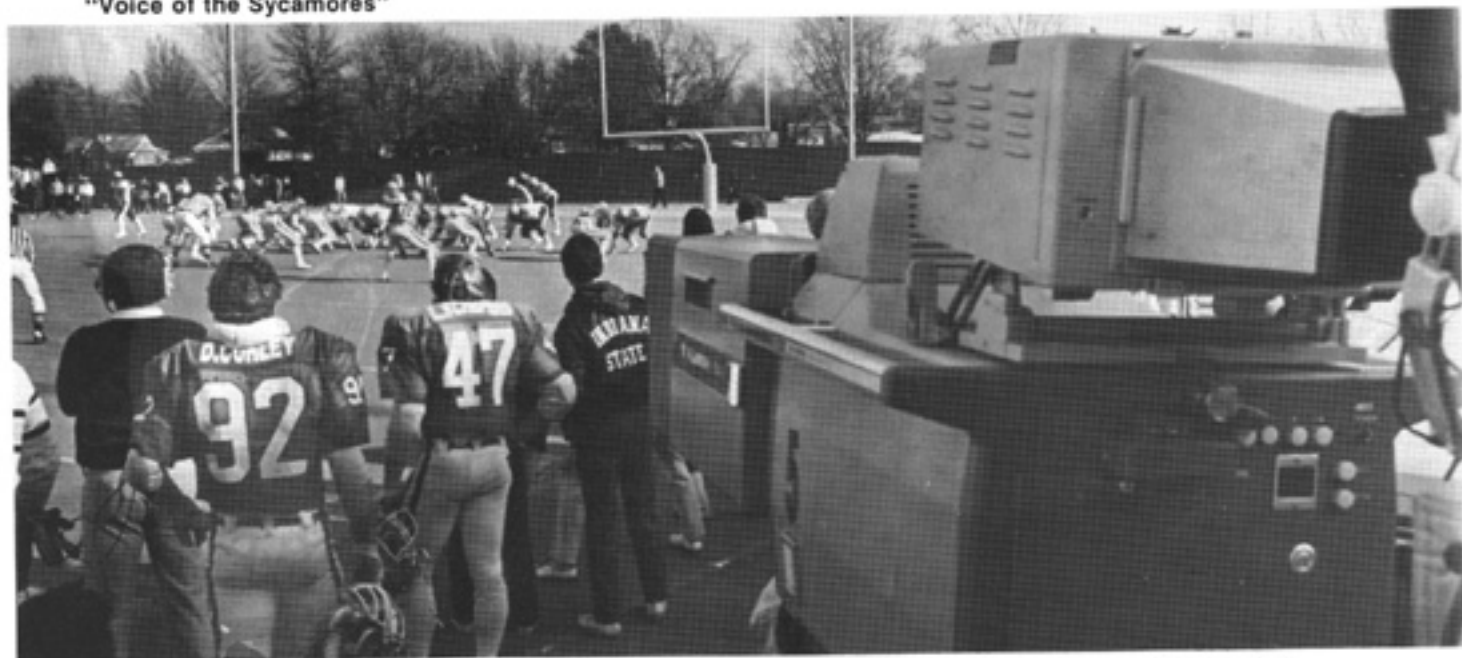
