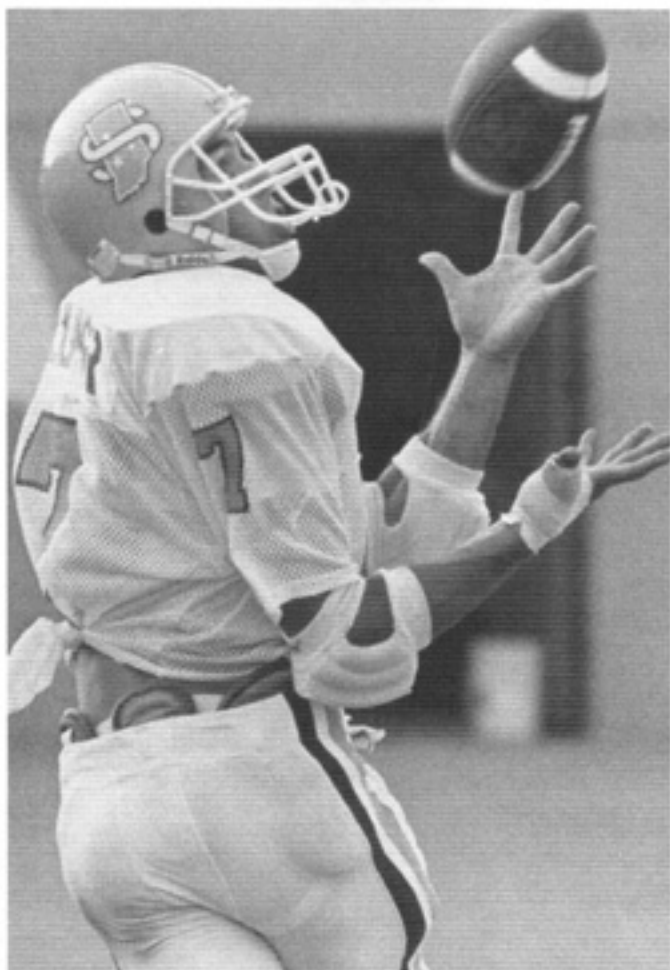

THIS IS INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY

Indiana State University, home of the Sycamores, is located in Terre Haute, Indiana (population 60,000) in the heart of mid-america.

Founded in 1865, ISU today offers its 11,700 students more than 170 programs through the Colleges of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Business; Education, Graduate studies; Nursing; Health, Physical Education and Recreation; and Technology. ISU degrees are awarded at associate, baccalaureate, master's and doctoral levels.

Rich in academic and athletic traditions, Indiana State University anticipates the 21st century with a bold Master Plan designed to enhance the usefulness of existing buildings and replace those no longer cost-efficient. Pedestrian malls will link areas where major campus functions take place.

The first building to be constructed in the \$55 million plan will be completed in 1989. Root Hall will house classrooms and office space for several departments of the College of Arts and Sciences, including English, Humanities, Foreign Languages, Philosophy, Psychology, and Mathematics and Computer Science.

Also underway is the Hulman Memorial Student Union project which calls for the renovation of a nine-story residence hall and construction of a retail services mall and food court complemented by an outdoor plaza.

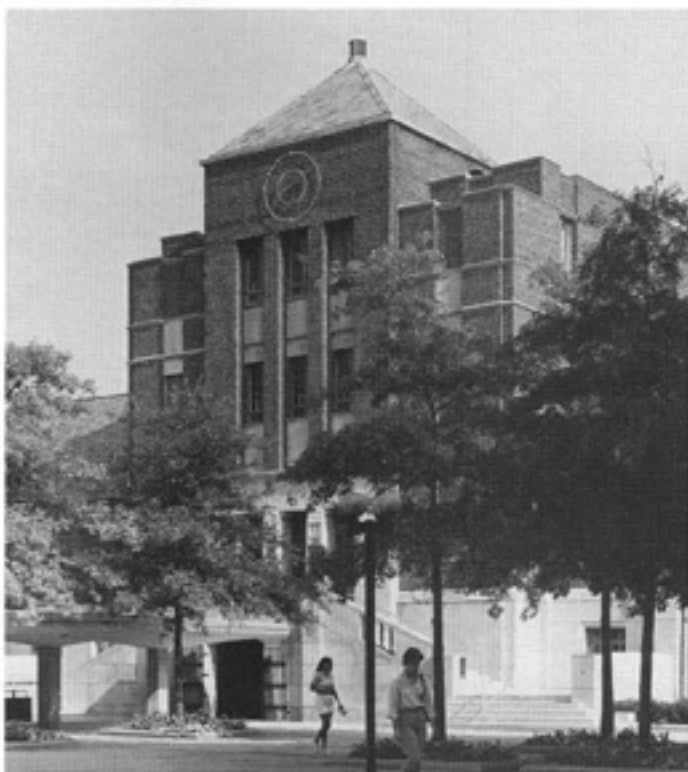


The Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building, with its recently completed 121,000 square-foot addition, continues to provide the University with state-of-the-art athletic facilities. Features include laboratories in motor learning and biomechanics, an indoor track and courts for tennis, basketball, handball and racquetball.

A brand-new athletic facility is the St. John softball complex on the northwest edge of campus. It has two fields, bleachers and parking facilities. The intercollegiate women's team plays its home games on Price Field, so named for ISU's first softball coach, LaFerne Price, a member of the physical education faculty for 24 years.

Memorial Stadium, home of the Sycamore football team and in 1967 the world's first university-owned-and-operated AstroTurf playing field, received a new synthetic playing surface this year, as did the baseball infield on Sycamore Field.

PRESIDENT Dr. Richard Landini

Presently in his 14th year as President of Indiana State University, Dr. Richard Landini has been a strong supporter of all of the University's athletic programs.

Working with representatives of the Athletic Department, he was advocate of ISU's membership in the Missouri Valley and Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conferences. His concern for the academics of athletes has been evidenced by his active involvement in policy making by the National Collegiate Athletic Association. In 1983 he helped draft the NCAA rule which states that a student athlete must make satisfactory progress toward specific degree requirements.

Landini earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in literature from the University of Miami in 1954 and 1955. After earning his Doctor of Philosophy degree (1959) at the University of Florida, he served on the faculty and administrative staff of Arizona State University for 11 years (1959-70). In 1970, he was appointed academic vice-president and professor of English at the University of Montana. He is ISU's eighth president, succeeding Dr. Alan C. Rankin in 1975.

Dr. Landini and his wife Phylliss reside in historic Condit House on the University campus.

Indiana State Athletic Director Brian Faison

Indiana State University Director of Athletics Brian Faison has had a busy and productive initial year at the helm of the Sycamore Athletic program, and he is looking forward to year two with much anticipation.

Faison said, "We are on the road to giving the Sycamore faithful a total athletic program that will be a source of great pride. We will continue to work hard toward that end."

Faison has been the driving force in reorganizing the ISU athletic department to better insure effective management; the institution of several new giving programs as well as the development of the Sycamore Varsity Fund to meet the educational needs of our student-athletes; initiating several major facility renovation projects, including new artificial turf in football and baseball plus a new wooden basketball floor at Hulman Center; and the hiring of new coaches in men's and women's basketball, women's volleyball and track/cross country.

In addition, Faison, has served as Chair of the Director of Athletics' Committee and on the Championships Events Committee in the Missouri Valley Conference; was a member of the Promotions Committee of the Gateway Conference; and was on the Championships Game Committee of the NCAA Baseball South Regional last May in Starkville, Mississippi.

A major impetus has been placed on athletic-related giving at Indiana State, and Faison has initiated Larry Bird's Inner Circle in association with the men's basketball program, the Hoopsters program of women's basketball the RBI club for women's softball, and initiated a billboard advertising campaign in baseball to help meet the need for increased support of Sycamore Athletics.

Faison assumed his duties at Indiana State in the Summer of 1988 after four years as an Assistant Athletic Director and Executive Director of the Cardinal Athletic Fund at the University of Louisville. Previously he served five years as Assistant Athletic Director at Illinois state and had several capacities in the Athletic Department and Alumni Office at the University of Missouri, his alma mater.

Brian and his wife, Donna, have three sons, Jonathan (9), Matthew (6) and Bradley (2) and reside in Terre Haute.

Associate Athletic Directors



Andi Myers

Andi Myers is in her first year as Associate Athletic Director/Senior Women's Administrator at Indiana State, but she is no stranger to the ISU athletic scene or Terre Haute.

Myers moved into her administrative capacity in April, 1989, after a successful seven-year tenure as Indiana State's women's basketball coach. Previous to that she was the women's basketball coach at Vincennes University and served the school as Coordinator of Women's Athletics and Chairperson of Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

A native of Dana, Indiana, Myers led the ISU women's team to 40 wins over the past two seasons, including a school-best 22-6 mark in 1988, when she earned Gateway Conference "Coach-of-the-Year" honors.

When Myers, an ISU alumna, accepted her new position, she remarked, "This is a great opportunity to go a step beyond being basketball coach and serve the entire athletic department and University. It is a great honor."



Bill Goldring

Bill Goldring begins his ninth year with the Indiana State University Athletic Department. He was recently promoted to the rank of Associate Athletic Director, having previously served as Assistant Athletic Director and Sports Information Director at ISU.

"I really enjoy my association with Indiana State University and the direction the department is headed," Goldring said recently. "We are doing much to upgrade the overall program and restore our winning tradition."

Goldring is a 1975 graduate of Ohio State and earned a Master's degree from Ohio University in Sports Administration in 1977. He was a graduate assistant at Eastern Michigan University for one year before heading to Jacksonville University in 1978 as Sports Information Director, a post he held for three years.

A native of Orrville, Ohio, Bill and his wife, Jean, have two daughters, Beth (7) and Katie (5) and reside in Terre Haute.

Dr. Cathy Baker takes the Athletic Study Center into its fourth year of operation this fall where she and her staff will supervise the academic progress of some 400 Indiana State University student-athletes over the course of the school year. Baker's background includes a BA in English, an MA in English, a PhD in Secondary Education and eight years as a Reading Specialist with the ISU Study Skills Center.

"We've always had great support from the athletic and coaching staffs and we now have support from faculty and administration. This is a young program but down the road I hope we will be able to expand the services we offer, expand our hours of operation, and expand the physical space we have to work with," said Baker. "I'd also like to computerize our record keeping and tutoring services."

Some of the services the Athletic Study Center provides include a required study skills course, tutoring, proofreading services and a reader service for LD Students, counseling, and proctored or oral exams for LD Students. In addition to these services, Baker and her staff provide fundamental instruction in areas such as basic study skills, time management, drug education and testing, and media relations. The Athletic Study Center provides supervised study hall sessions, academic support for student-athletes who are learning disabled, and individual tutoring for those students who need in-depth help with a particular subject. Careful academic records are maintained for each student-athlete.

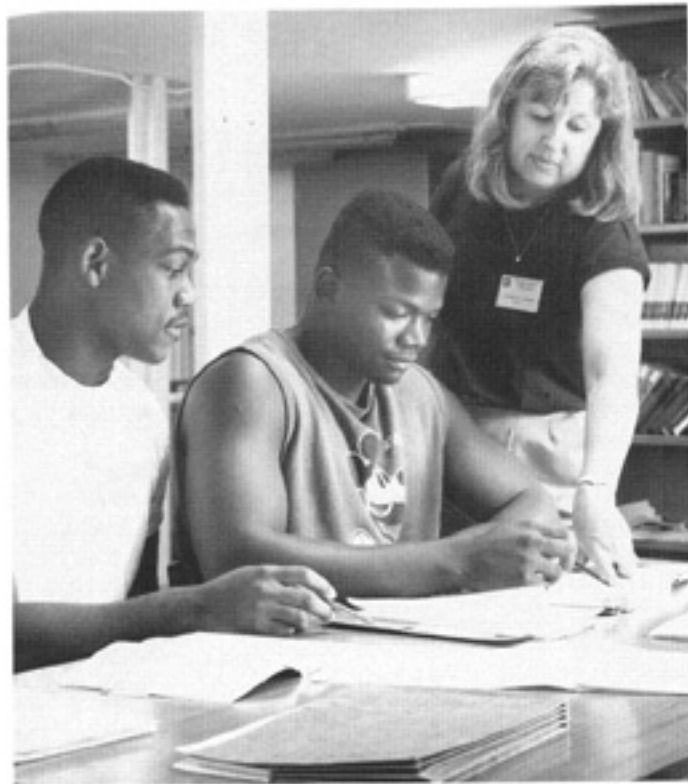
"I think one measure of our success in the past two years has been that a high percentage of our Proposition 48 students are doing very well. Of all our student athletes, 90% are in good academic standing with the university and 25% maintain over a B average," Baker noted.

Dr. Baker's philosophy is simply this: "I like to say that 'my team' wins when these guys graduate. But actually, there's a lot more I want for these students. I want them to learn something while they're here; I want them to be personally and professionally successful."

The student-athletes at Indiana State University are in good hands.

Dennis Raetz

Head Football Coach



Coach Raetz won his 50th game last year and is now second on the all-time win list at Indiana State with a 51-49 record in eight seasons. He is trailing Wally Mark's 62 career wins.

Now preparing to enter his ninth season as the head football coach at Indiana State University, Dennis Raetz (pronounced RATES) came to the Terre Haute campus in 1979 to work as the defensive coordinator to former Sycamore head coach Dick Jamieson.

The North Platte, Neb., native has guided the ISU football program to its greatest heights during his nine-year stint as head coach as his Sycamores were ranked No. 1 in the national I-AA poll for most of the 1984 season while also earning trips to the I-AA post-season playoffs in 1983 and 1984. Raetz was named as the Missouri Valley Conference's "Coach of the Year" in 1984 and was a candidate for national I-AA "Coach of the Year" honors as well.

During his nine seasons at ISU, Raetz has amassed a 51-49-1 won-loss record and is the second all-time winningest head coach in Sycamore grid history.

Raetz, 42, attended the University of Nebraska on a football scholarship, but a severe knee injury brought a quick, disappointing end to his college playing career. But the injury did not quell his desire to stay involved in the game as a coach.

After graduating college in 1968, Raetz was an assistant coach at North Kansas City, Mo., High School for three seasons. From 1973 to 1976, he was the head coach at J.C. Harmon High School in Kansas City, Ks., where his teams compiled a 24-13 record and won two conference championships. While at Harmon, Raetz had the opportunity to coach current Denver Broncos All-Pro cornerback Mark Haynes.

In 1977, Raetz joined the University of Missouri coaching staff, where he worked with the varsity defensive ends in addition to being the school's junior varsity head coach. It was there that he began a working friendship with Jamieson, who was to become the head coach at Indiana State a year later.

When Jamieson left ISU after the 1979 season to become an assistant coach with the NFL's St. Louis Cardinals, Raetz was the natural choice to replace him, thus becoming the 15th head football coach in school history.

Since taking over the reins of the Indiana State program, Raetz has been instrumental in the development of such standouts as linebacker Gerry Gluscic (1979 MVC "Defensive Player of the Year"), Craig Shaffer (1981 MVC "Defensive Player of the Year"), cornerback Wayne David (1984 MVC "Defensive Player of the Year"), quarterback Reggie Allen (1979 MVC "Offensive Player of the Year"), and quarterback Jeff Miller (1984 MVC "Offensive Player of the Year").

Also during his tenure as head coach, the Sycamores have had several I-AA All-Americans, including: linebacker Ed Martin (1983), Wayne Davis (1984), Vencie Glenn (1985), offensive tackle Mike Simmonds (1986), safety Steve McKeel (1987), and split end Steve Elminger (1988).

Three former Indiana State players are currently starters in the NFL—offensive tackle Tunch Ilkin (Pittsburgh Steelers), Wayne Davis (Buffalo Bills), and Vencie Glenn (San Diego Chargers) while a fourth, Mike Simmonds, is on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers roster. Ilkin played in the 1989 Pro Bowl, while Davis was a key performer for Buffalo during its drive to the 1988 ABC East title. Glenn has been a starter since his rookie year in San Diego and just missed being named to the Pro Bowl this past season.

Raetz is married, Betty, and is the father of two children: daughter Jaime, 14, and son, Mark, 11.

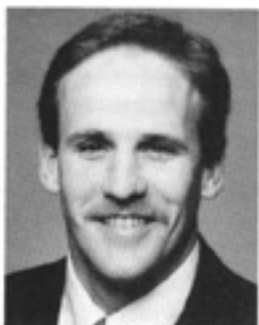

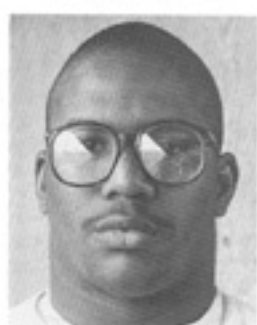

NOTE TO THE MEDIA...

The 1989 Indiana State University Football Media Guide has been assembled in an effort to assist you in your coverage of the Sycamores this fall.

We have tried to anticipate many of your questions and hope the answers may be easily found on the following pages. However, if you have additional questions or needs, do not hesitate to contact the Indiana State Sports Information Office. We appreciate your interest in Indiana State University football and look forward to working with you throughout the year.

PRESS CREDENTIALS: Working press and photographer credentials will be handled by Indiana State University Sports Information Office, ISU Arena. ISU is the home team for this year's Indiana State-Ball State game at the Hoosier Dome and will accept all credential requests.

Credential requests should be made in writing by sports editors or sports directors of accredited media outlets on company letterhead. All requests should be made as early as possible, at least 10 days prior to the game date and should be limited to working press only.

All requests should be sent to: Indiana State, Sports Information Director, Arena Room 118, Indiana State University, Terre Haute, Indiana, 47809.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS: Interviews with our players are encouraged. We do ask, however, that all player interviews be arranged through the sports information office. Players are available at least an hour before practices and after practice in most instances. Dorm room, locker rooms and the training room are off limits to everyone except athletic department staff. All practices are open to the media, although it is requested that reporters and photographers stay on the sidelines for safety reasons. Telephone interviews may also be arranged, although player telephone numbers will not be given out. The procedure is for the players to contact you by telephone at a pre-arranged time.

OTHER INFORMATION

WMGI OFFICIAL STATION: Broadcasts of Indiana State University football will be offered by WMGI Radio in West Terre Haute. Steve Smith handles the play-by-play with Tom McClanahan providing the color analysis. Stations interested in picking up the broadcasts should contact Smith at WMGI, P.O. Box 3190, West Terre Haute, Ind., 47803, or call (812)-533-2141.

VISITING RADIO: The official radio station must be designated in writing by the visiting team's athletic director or sports information director. A courtesy line and radio booth is available for the official station free of charge. All other stations must contact General Telephone of Indiana (812-238-5222) for loop installation. Due to space limitations, additional stations will be seated on top of the pressbox.

GAME DAY FACILITIES AND SERVICES Indiana State's Memorial Stadium pressbox has limited working space, so only those members of the media actually covering the game will be given seats. Those members of the media who are not covering the game, but still want to attend must contact Assistant Athletic Director Bill Goldring (812-237-4087) for complementary ticket information.

Press passes are not transferrable and use by anyone other than members of the working press is unauthorized. Passes used in an unauthorized manner will be taken up immediately. All press credentials remain the property of the Indiana State University Athletic Department and must be returned upon request. News organizations allowing unauthorized persons to use their credentials will have their passes revoked for the remainder of the year.

Three telephones are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Reporters on tight deadlines are urged to contact General Telephone of Indiana (812-238-5222) for personal telephones. GTE will then contact the sports information office for telephone placement.

All photographers (still, video) must wear an Indiana State armband when working on the sidelines. Armbands may be picked up in the pressbox approximately one hour before kickoff. Any photographers without an armband will be asked to leave the sidelines by security personnel.

Quarterly play-by-play, offensive and defensive statistics and quotes from coaches of both teams will be passed out as soon as they are compiled.

The Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference enters its eighth year of existence and fifth season of operating a seven-school NCAA I-AA football division.

The Gateway Conference was founded, as a women's athletic organization, by ten midwestern universities with similar academic and athletic interests in 1982.

The conference is comprised of schools which are members of two different conferences for other men's sports and is spread out over five states. Six Gateway members belong to the Missouri Valley Conference: Bradley University, Drake University, Illinois State University, Indiana State University, Southern Illinois University and Wichita State University. Four others belong to the Association of Mid-Century Universities (AMCU): Eastern Illinois University, University of Northern Iowa, Southwest Missouri State University and Western Illinois University.

The Gateway sponsors championships in nine women's sports and one men's sport, football. The women's sports include cross-country, volleyball, basketball, indoor track and field, swimming and diving, golf, tennis, softball and outdoor track and field.

On August 21, 1985, the Gateway Conference Presidents' Council voted to add a I-AA football division, for six of its members, to their previously all-women's athletics organization. Forming the football division were Eastern Illinois, Illinois State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri and Western Illinois. This move marked the first time in college annals that men's football was added to a women's conference. In June 1986, Indiana State University enrolled as the seventh member of the Gateway Conference football division.

Patty Viverito has governed the Gateway Conference since its birth. In fact, Mrs. Viverito became the first woman commissioner to govern a conference associated with men's athletics.

The football division of the Gateway, a conglomeration of former Missouri Valley Conference and Mid-Century Conference football playing institutions, has quickly become a national power. The strength of the fledgling Gateway was confirmed in July of 1986 when the NCAA I-AA Football Committee voted to waive the league's two-year waiting period and grant the Gateway an automatic bid to the national championships after just one season of play.

The Gateway's first three football seasons have been marked by continual successes. Northern Iowa has advanced to the NCAA I-AA Playoff semifinals twice in three years, only to drop decisions to the eventual national champions while Eastern Illinois was a playoff quarterfinalist in 1986. Western Illinois is the defending league champion and was ranked among the nation's 1-AA top five throughout the 1988 season.

Sycamores Six Points Away From 1988 Gateway Title Look For League Championship and 1-AA Playoff Bid in 1989

Ending 1988 with their highest finish ever in Gateway Conference play, the Sycamores look for added improvement in the league standings from a second place tie to the top in 1989. Indiana State was six points away from an unbeaten league season losing only 24-21 to Western Illinois and 10-7 at Southern Illinois last year enroute to a 4-2 Gateway Conference record.

"I feel very good about the team coming back this season," said ninth-year Head Football Coach Dennis Raetz. "We have the quality players at skill positions returning both offensively and defensively. Our overall team depth is not what we would like, but the talent is there on the starting units. As always, if we can stay healthy and win the close games, we could be a very good football team in 1989."

Indiana State was 5-6 in 1988 with road losses at Florida, Southern Illinois, Youngstown State, Cincinnati and Ball State at the Hoosier Dome. The Sycamores beat Northern Iowa 24-6 in their most impressive road game last year, but also dropped a home contest to Western Illinois at Memorial Stadium to finish the home slate 4-1 overall.

Optimism is in the air for Sycamore followers entering the 1989 season with All-Gateway players QB John Sahn, WR Steve Elmlinger, TE Rodney Porter, DT Mark Bertram, DB Troy Mickens returning along with eight other starters and 34 lettermen off the 1988 squad.

"We have the most talent we've had here since the playoff teams three/four years ago," said Coach Raetz. "A lot can happen from August to the end of November, but we feel the opportunity is there this season for us to have a good year."

OFFENSE

All-Gateway Conference running back Tori Vactor is gone (1052 yards rushing and nine TDs), but the Gateway's top receiving corp, senior QB John Sahn and an improved offensive line are all back in 1989 to lead the Sycamores offense. Sahn (6-0,210,Sr), has had injury problems in the past but played all 11 games in 1988 throwing for over 1900 yards and 10 TDs directing the Sycamore offense. Sahn's health is of key concern and a healthy 11 games again in 1989 will pay big dividends for the ISU passing game and overall offense. The strong-armed Sahn has thrown for over 3300 yards and 21 TDs in only 21 games as a starter in his ISU career.

All-Gateway and All-American players Steve Elmlinger (6-0,190,Sr/WR) and Rodney Porter (6-2,215,TE/Sr) return for their senior seasons and the combo has over 140 career receptions entering 1989. Elmlinger set a new school single season receiving mark with 51 catches last year to lead the Gateway Conference and rank 13th in NCAA 1-AA stats. Combine Porter and Elmlinger with speed burner John Story (5-11,170,Jr/FLK) and Charles Sanders (6-1,175,Jr/FLK), the Sycamores have an outstanding fleet of receivers to rank among the nation's best units.

Returning three starters in the offensive line will bolster the Sycamore running attack and in pass protection for Sahn and backup QBs Todd Jochem (6-2,187,Sr) and Marvin Bullock (5-11,175,So). Steve Engel (6-2,255,Sr), Dan Quick (6-3,265,So) and Pat Christie (6-1,260,Sr) return up front and will be joined by sophomore center Matt Boardman (6-1,235) and Ed Robinson (6-1,255,Jr) in the pre-season starting offensive line. Quick was ISU's first red-shirt freshman to start since former All-American and current Tampa Bay Buccaneer Mike Simmonds started as a frosh during his career.

1989 ISU Football Outlook



Senior running back Ray Wallace (5-10,200) has moved to fullback his final season and the hard-running Indiana native looks for a big senior campaign. Red-shirt sophomore Derrick Franklin (5-9,185) has earned his starting spot at RB following a good spring and Sycamore coaches like his break-away ability and speed out of the backfield. As in other years, the Sycamores will rotate a number of running backs to keep runners fresh as the long season winds down. Vactor was ISU's first 1000 yard rusher since Vincent Allen in 1977.

DEFENSE

The Sycamores lost two starters off the defensive line, two from the linebacking crew and one defensive back off last season's Gateway Conference's top defensive scoring unit (15.7 points allowed per league game). Returning in 1989 are two-time All-Gateway DT Mark Bertram (6-3,245,Sr) and All-league free safety Troy Mickens (5-9,167,Jr) along with five other starters back for Coach Dan Ritter's defense.

The defensive line lost some outstanding players and pre-season starters Pete Georges (6-0,235,Jr/NG) and Glenn Skreppen (6-3,266,Jr/DT) look to fill the vacancies with strong play inside combining with Bertram. A host of freshman and sophomores will give the line depth, but unproven in college play.

Inside linebackers Eric Christensen (6-1,210,So) and Jeff Propst (6-2,225,Jr) were back-ups in 1988 and earned their starting positions this spring. They team with veteran starters Darnell White (6-2,232,Sr) and John Barrett (6-3,238,Jr) at the outside linebacker positions. Quality LB backups are Stuart Rathman (6-0,220,Jr), Clint Davis (5-11,215,So) and Scott Foster (6-2,22-,So).

The defensive secondary returns three starters and former starter Curtis Daley (5-10,205,Sr) who sat out the 1988 season academically ineligible. Daley returns with 1989 starters Mickens, Don Cox (5-9,161,So) and Marcus Wilson (5-9,200,Jr). Add backups Walter Crutchfield (5-11,200,Sr) and Solomon Emerson (5-11,175,So) and ISU has a veteran defensive back line. The Sycamores must pick off more passes this season after totaling only six interceptions to the opponents' 21 in 1988. Three of those interceptions were by departed Lavent Blaylock (suspension) and two by senior LB Matt Campbell. Mickens has the only INT returning in 1989.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Last year's place kicker/punter Rob Hufty returns in 1989 and he will be pressed in fall camp for his kicking positions by incoming freshman Steve Kreiger (Indiana's top high school kicker last season). Hufty hit only 5 of 14 field goals but has an outstanding strong leg which helped him punt for a 38.7 average to rank among the Gateway Conference leaders. The P/PK duties will be in good hands, whoever wins the kicking battle.

World-class sprinter John Story set a new Indiana State football record last year returning a kickoff 95 yards vs. Ball State in the season finale. Story looks to improve on last year's 21.1 kickoff return average and when opponents don't kick to him, Steve Elmlinger averaged 24.1 yards per kickoff return including a 94 yarder vs. Salem College in last year's opener. The duo gives Indiana State as dangerous a kickoff return unit as anyone in NCAA football.

Elmlinger also handles the punt return duties and with his sure hands and speed helped ISU to rank among the league leaders with a 7.1 return avg. per punt runback. In 1988, Indiana State allowed only 20.2 per kickoff return and 8.3 per punt return and no TDs overall.

1989 SCHEDULE

Another challenging schedule is ahead in 1989 with five home games at Memorial Stadium, five road games and one neutral site game with Ball State at the Hoosier Dome. ISU opens the season September 2 hosting Central Missouri State, then open Gateway league play at Southwest Missouri State the following Saturday.

The Big Ten Conference's Minnesota Golden Gophers will host Indiana State September 30 at the MetroDome in Minneapolis as the Sycamores then host 1-AA foes Youngstown State and Northern Iowa the next two Saturdays. Northern Iowa is the homecoming opponent at Memorial Stadium October 14. The Sycamores hope to contend for the 1989 Gateway Conference title and an automatic bid to the NCAA 1-AA playoffs in late November. Indiana State will also look to win back the Victory Bell from Ball State hosting the Cardinals at the Hoosier Dome, Thursday, 7:00 PM, October 26.

Steven P. 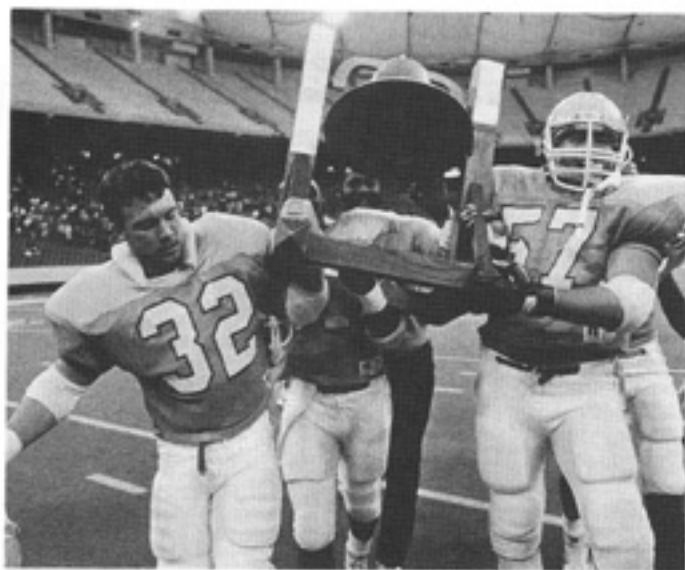

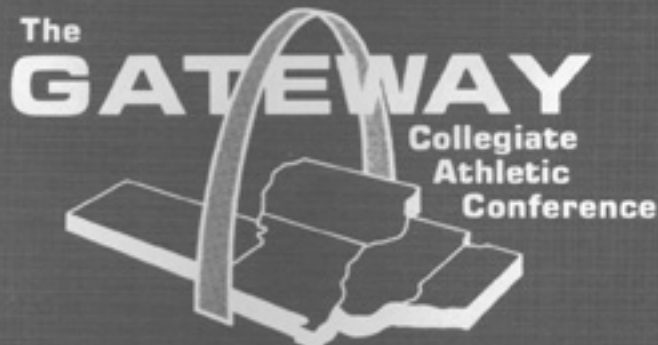
