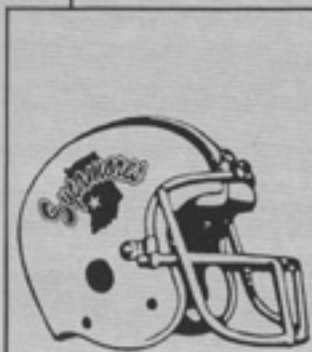

MEDIA INFORMATION

The 1990 Indiana State University Football Media Guide has been prepared to assist the print and electronic media covering the Sycamore football program. Requests for additional information should be made through the Indiana State sports information office. We welcome the media's interest in ISU Athletics and we look forward to serving you throughout the season.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS: Credential requests should be received by the Indiana State sports information office no later than three days before any ISU home game. All written requests should be made on official letterhead. Credentials will not be mailed unless by special arrangement. Single game passes may be picked up at the Memorial Stadium will call window on the south side of the stadium.

Credentials must be visible at all times for proper identification by ISU Security personnel. All photographers must wear Indiana State armbands when working the sidelines. Armbands may be picked up in the pressbox approximately one hour before kickoff.

Passes are not transferrable and are strictly reserved for working media. All press credentials remain the property of Indiana State University and must be returned upon request.

RADIO SPACE: Radio contract requests and information should be directed to Kevin Messenger, Sports Information Director. Designated "official stations" of visiting opponents are provided a courtesy telephone line in a designated press box booth. All other stations requesting broadcast space must pay a rights fee of \$50 to Indiana State University and will be accommodated on the roof of the press box.

SCOUTING PASSES: Professional scouts must make arrangements for passes at least one week in advance of desired game. Seating for scouts is strictly on an availability basis.

TELEPHONES/FAX MACHINE: Three press box phones are available for media use on the upper row of the press box. An automatic facsimile machine is available for media use upon request.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Immediately following a 10-minute cooling period, ISU Head Coach Dennis Raetz will host a postgame press conference in the meeting room adjacent to the Sycamores' lockerroom at the west end of the stadium. Players will be made available upon request. Interviews with visiting players and coaches must be arranged with visiting SIDs.

GAME SERVICES: The Indiana State sports information office provides pregame notes and game programs, and complete NCAA statistical summaries and play-by-play at the conclusion of each quarter. Coaches quotes for both teams will be made available following the game.

WEEKLY INTERVIEW POLICY: All requests for player and coaches' interviews must be made through Kevin Messenger, Sports Information Director. Whether at home or on the road, it is suggested that ALL interviews be requested 48 hours in advance. Coaches and players' home phone numbers will not be released.

SPORTS INFORMATION OFFICE: The proper mailing address for the Sycamore sports information office is: Sports Information Office, Indiana State University, ISU Arena #118, Terre Haute, IN 47809. The sport information office is located in the ISU Arena, on the east side of the building, at the corner of 5th and Chestnut Streets.

MEMORIAL STADIUM



ISU's Memorial Stadium was the site of the world's first outdoor football game on Astroturf.

Standing at its present site since 1924, and acquired by Indiana State University in 1967, Memorial Stadium is the home of Sycamore Football. The 20,500-seat structure is located at the corner of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute.

The stadium's newest addition was a \$400,000 All-Pro Turf surface installed for the 1989 season. The multi-layer turf is the same surface in place at the Universities of Florida and Michigan.

Memorial Stadium is not new to synthetic surfaces though, as the stadium and ISU claim distinction as the world's first university to own and make outdoor application of Astroturf. Following the University's acquisition of the stadium, ISU opened the '67 season with a 41-6 win over Eastern Illinois in the first game played on the new surface. The Astroturf at Memorial Stadium was similar to the indoor turf at the Houston Astrodome which saw the first college game ever played on the artificial surface, in 1966 between Houston and Washington State.

Advantages to using synthetic surfaces include durability (some 15 college and high school football games are played on the surface each year in addition to daily ISU Practices), a constant surface, and sure footing regardless of weather. The newly installed All-Pro Turf is also designed to provide more cushion and reduce injuries.

Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the public for the first time on May 5, 1925 as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria Tractors before an estimated crowd of 9,000. Among the honored guests were major league baseball commissioner Judge Kennesaw

and Charles Barnard, a representative of the Cleveland Indians.

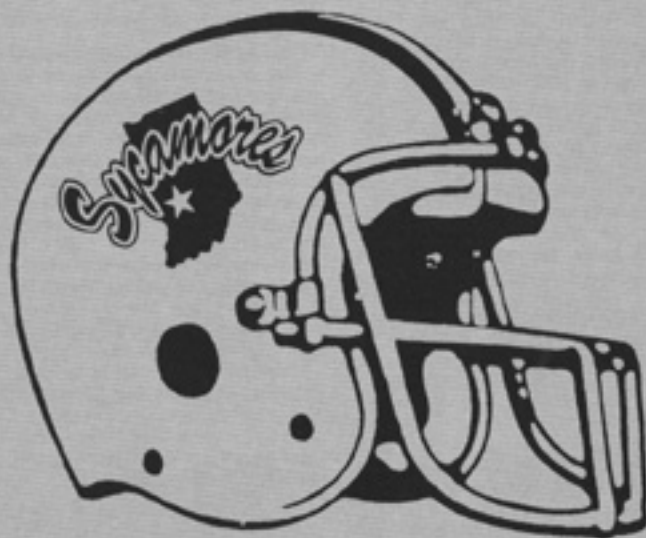
The first use of the playing field was in the fall of 1924 when Wiley and Garfield High Schools played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.

Original construction of Memorial Stadium was begun in 1922 at a cost of \$450,000. Upon the University gaining control in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included: the re-orientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to its present east-west configuration; the installation of Astroturf; and the construction of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as the rebuilding of seats on the south side.

1990 OUTLOOK

With three new offensive coaches on board, Indiana State's gameplan presents a "new look" for the 1990 campaign. Eleventh-year head coach **Dennis Raetz** welcomes a solid cast of returning talent while promising some new twists for the upcoming season.

The major priority of first-year offensive coordinator **Dave Magazu**, quarterback-receivers coach **Sean Payton** and running backs coach **Mike Calvert** will be finding a quarterback to capably run ISU's multiple offense. John Stites had a strong spring and will be given the first chance at the job vacated when John Sahn graduated last spring. Stites will have plenty of tools with which to work, including running backs Derrick Franklin and Shawn Young, and receivers Charles Swann, John Story, and Charles Sanders.

Defensively, the Sycamore braintrust of coordinator **Dan Ritter**, secondary coach **Alvin Reynolds**, and linebacker coach **Mark Smith** remains intact. The Indiana State defense performed well, for the most part, last season and that level of play is expected to continue this season. Key returnees for ISU include inside linebackers Eric Christensen and Jeff Propst, noseguard Pete Georges, and defensive backs Troy Mickens and Marcus Wilson. Outside linebacker Bryan McGrone, a transfer from the University of Illinois who is now eligible, is expected to give the Sycamores a much needed dose of quickness and strength.

Here is a position-by-position breakdown of the 1990 Indiana State football team.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK: A question mark heading into fall drills. Fifth-year senior **John Stites** (6-1, 190) is the front runner for the starting job after a strong spring. Stites lacks game experience, however, after serving in a reserve role behind graduated

signal callers John Sahn and Todd Jochem the last four years.

Other contenders for the starting job in 1990 include junior college transfers **David Davis** (5-8, 190) and **Ray Allen** (5-9, 175), juniors **Jim Ulrich** (6-2, 200) and **Marvin Bullock** (5-11, 176), sophomore **Dan Osborn** (6-1, 181), and redshirt freshman **Andy Stephenson** (6-0, 180).

FULLBACK: Indiana State's leading rusher from a year ago, senior **Shawn Young** (5-8, 180), was moved to fullback late last season and appears to be the odds-on favorite to be the starter when fall practices begin. Young led the Sycamores in rushing a year ago with 847 yards and seven TDs, and was an All-Gateway Conference second-team selection.

He will, however, receive a strong push from sophomore **David Nicol** (5-9, 210) and junior college transfer **Maurice Wilkins** (6-2, 225). Nicol made tremendous progress during the past spring after missing the last two seasons with knee injuries. Wilkins was a highly recruited offensive back who should see some playing time this year.

Also in the hunt for playing time are juniors **Troy Karshner** (5-11, 225) and **Delmar Hill** (5-10, 200), as well as sophomores **John Deem** (5-9, 206) and **Tony Kassissieh** (5-11, 217). Karshner played in eight games a year ago, rushing for 66 yards in 17 carries.

TAILBACK: Juniors **Derrick Franklin** (5-9, 186) and **Kevin Jackson** (5-9, 183) will be 1-2 at the tailback position this fall.

Franklin, a breakaway threat who is expected to be showcased in the Sycamores' new offensive attack, served in a backup role to starter Shawn Young a year ago and ended the season as the team's second-leading rusher with 425 yards and four TDs. Jackson had 80 yards in 14 carries a year ago while playing in five games.

In addition to Franklin and Jackson, keep an eye peeled for sophomores **David Busch** (5-9, 174) and **Brian Harrington** (5-9, 183), and redshirt freshman **Chris Noone** (5-11, 183).

WIDE RECEIVERS: The Sycamores return four veterans who should offset the loss of 1989 pre-season I-AA All-America selection Steve Elminger to the NFL's Chicago Bears.

Back in 1990 is the "S-Squad"—seniors **Charles Sanders** (5-0, 197) and **John Story** (6-1, 190), and junior **Charles Swann** (6-3, 197), and junior **Tony Brewer** (6-1, 193).

Story and Swann give the Sycamores two of the fastest, most athletic receivers in the Gateway Conference, while Sanders combines great hand-eye coordination with an ability to find open areas in an opponents' pass defense. Swann caught 16 passes a year ago. Sanders 15, and Story eight. Brewer played in a reserve role a year ago, catching three passes, including two for touchdowns.

Expected to push for playing time this season are senior **Steve Maki** (5-1, 186), sophomore **Bernard Redmond** (5-6, 150), and incoming freshman **Scott Crenshaw** (6-1, 175).

DEFENSE

TIGHT ENDS: A real dog fight is expected as Indiana State returns two sophomores with game experience—**Ed Houston** (6-1, 217), and **James Juillerat** (6-2, 226)—and redshirt freshman **Kirk Christensen** (6-2, 217).

Gone is graduated senior Rodney Porter, who ended his four-year career as one of the most prolific pass receivers in Indiana State history.

Houston and Juillerat were used primarily as run blockers in Indiana State's two-tight end short yardage blocking scheme, although Houston is considered the better pass receiver of the two. Christensen is a converted linebacker who worked at both positions last spring.

A former junior college All-America selection, **Felix Williams** (6-1, 225), could also make some noise.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Another question mark for the Sycamores in terms of overall depth.

The talent is there as Indiana State does retain the services of several key veterans including senior guards **Rick Comer** (6-3, 266), **Ed Robinson** (6-1, 257) and **Jim Huxel** (6-1, 270), senior tackle **Kip Beach** (6-4, 300) and sophomore tackle **Robert Egidi** (6-3, 269), junior guard **Matt Boardman** (6-1, 252) and junior center **George FitzSimmons** (6-1, 244). Boardman started 11 games at center a year ago, but worked at both positions during spring drills. Egidi is a former defensive tackle who made the move to offense during this spring.

Others who must be considered for possible playing time this season are sophomore center **David Sharbaugh** (6-3, 245), sophomore tackle **Tim Carter** (6-7, 320), junior guard **Jim Weber** (6-3, 240), and redshirt freshman center **Chris Schott** (6-1, 244).

A host of incoming freshmen could also move into contention: **Pat Kneller** (6-3, 250), **Pat Martin** (6-3, 285), **Shawn Moore** (6-1, 260), **Mike Bergmeier** (6-1, 230), **Tim Herrin** (6-2, 245) and **Kyle Rizzo** (6-6, 250).

DEFENSIVE LINE: The Sycamores lost one veteran starter from last year's squad in all-conference honoree Mark Bertram, but return 1989 starters **Pete Georges** (6-0, 235) and **Doug Dutton** (6-5, 243). Georges, a senior noseguard, and Dutton, a junior defensive tackle, ranked fifth and sixth on the team in tackles a year ago with 67 and 57, respectively.

Other contenders for playing time include senior **Glenn Skreppen** (6-2, 257), juniors **Anthony Booker** (6-4, 263), **Robert Patton** (6-3, 230), and **Tim Jordan** (6-3, 246), and sophomores **Pete Macri** (6-4, 250) and **Dyrrah Christon** (6-0, 240). Skreppen played in 10 games in 1989, while Patton saw action in eight contests.

Newcomers who could contribute are **Chris Newlin** (6-2, 240) and **Joe Stankowski** (6-2, 235).

LINEBACKERS: Heading what is most likely the strongest and deepest position on the Sycamore squad are ISU's top two tacklers from last year's team, inside linebackers **Eric Christensen** (6-2, 219) and **Jeff Propst** (6-1, 217).

Christensen, a junior who was in his first full season as a starter in 1989, had a team-leading 114 tackles while senior battery mate Propst was close behind with 104 stops.

Both appear solidly entrenched as starters but junior **Clint Davis** (5-11, 229) had a great spring and could give Propst a run for his money.

Former high school All-America **Bryan McGrone** (6-2, 216), a junior, appears to be the frontrunner at one outside linebacking post after transferring from the University of Illinois.

Another junior, **Chris Barrett** (6-4, 205), is in line to replace older brother John at the other outside linebacking position, as well as junior **Scott Foster** (6-2, 218).

Other names to watch are senior **Stu Rathman** (5-11, 216), junior **Charles Orlando** (6-2, 224), sophomore **Bruce Bridgewater** (6-1, 209) and redshirt freshmen **Mark Hughes** (6-0, 222), **Doug Puryear** (6-2, 213), and **Vestal Greer** (6-1, 212).

Sophomores **Sam Whipple** (6-1, 191) and **Damon Clark** (6-0, 220) round out the list of possible linebacker candidates. An incoming freshman who could make things interesting is former Indiana prep all-stater **Matt Egloff** (6-0, 205).

DEFENSIVE BACKS: A pair of former all-conference selections heads the list of returnees in the Indiana State secondary.

Senior safeties **Troy Mickens** (5-9, 187), and **Marcus Wilson** (5-9, 208) have both been honored by the Gateway Conference for their individual play in the past and it's this pair that is expected to lead by example in 1990.

Juniors **Donald Cox** (5-9, 168) and **Solomon Emerson** (5-9, 175) are expected to get the call at

cornerback after seeing extensive game action the last two seasons.

Top reserves in the Sycamore secondary are redshirt freshmen **Kenneth Mullen** (5-10, 183) and **Von Ganaway** (5-9, 173), sophomores **Brian Bridgewater** (6-1, 206) and **Levon Johnson** (5-9, 203), and senior **Tim Swanson** (5-8, 191).

Sophomore **Michael Wilson** (5-9, 208) and redshirt freshman **Eric Hince** (5-9, 176) also return for the Sycamores.

Four newcomers bidding for playing time include freshmen **Jack Hendershot** (6-3, 190) and **Eric Kelly** (5-10, 175), and junior college transfers **Byron Porter** (6-0, 195) and **Wesley Wilson** (5-11, 185).

SPECIALISTS: All-conference punter **Rob Hufty** (5-11, 190) heads the returning special teams players for Indiana State.

Hufty, a junior who averaged 39.5 yards per kick a year ago, may also handle the Sycamores' placekicking duties. He hit on 7 of 10 field goal attempts in 1989—the longest from 47 yards out—and connected on 25 of 26 extra point attempts.

He'll receive a stiff challenge in both departments, however, from sophomore **Steve Krieger** (6-2, 192). Krieger played in two games in 1989 and made 2 of 3 PAT attempts.

Early candidates to replace school record holder **Steve Elminger** as a punt and kickoff returner include **Charles Swann** (6-3, 197), **Von Ganaway** (5-9, 173), and **Solomon Emerson** (5-9, 175). Swann returned six kickoffs for a 35-yard average in 1989, including a 52-yarder against Ball State, and blocked an extra-point attempt against Illinois State.

Sophomore offensive lineman **David Sharbaugh** (6-3, 245) returns as the Indiana State long snapper.

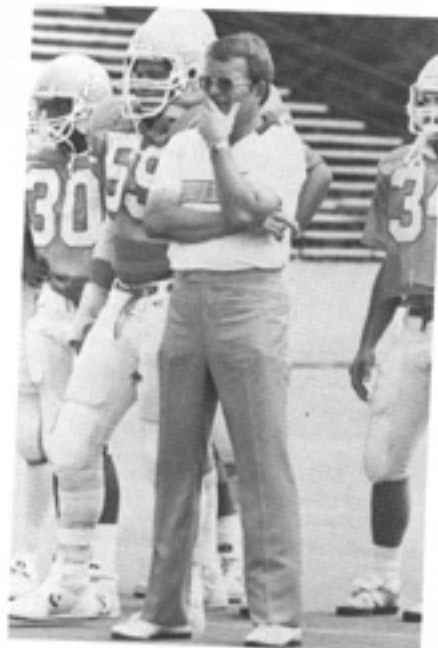

Raetz was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 while also being considered for national coach of the year honors.

Raetz has amassed a 55-56-1 record in ten seasons at ISU which also ranks him second among all-time coaches in terms of longevity. He came to the Terre Haute campus in 1978 as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach under Dick Jamieson, and remained in that capacity for two seasons prior to being named head coach on February 25, 1980.

A native of North Platte, Nebraska, Raetz attended the University of Nebraska on a football scholarship, but his playing career was cut short by a severe knee injury. Following his college graduation in 1968, he was an assistant coach at North Kansas City High School in Missouri for five seasons before accepting head coaching responsibilities at J.C. Harmon High School in Kansas City, KS. In four seasons at Harmon where he coached current Denver Broncos cornerback Mark Haynes, Raetz guided his clubs to two conference championships and a 24-13 won-loss record.

In 1977, Raetz joined the University of Missouri coaching staff where he worked with the varsity defensive ends in addition to his duties as the junior varsity head coach. It was at Mizzou that he began a working friendship with Jamieson who one year later became the head coach at Indiana State.

Raetz followed Jamieson to ISU and, after the 1979 season, became the school's 15th head coach when Jamieson became an assistant with the NFL's St. Louis Cardinals.



HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Since taking over the reins of the ISU program, Raetz has been instrumental in the development of several standout players including Missouri Valley Conference Defensive Players of the Year Gerry Glucsic (1979), Craig Shaffer (1981), Wayne Davis (1984), and Vencie Glenn (1985); and MVC Offensive Players of the Year Reggie Allen (1979) and Jeff Miller (1984).

During Raetz' stint as the Sycamores' gridiron boss, ISU has turned out several I-AA All-Americans including linebacker Ed Martin (1983), cornerbacks Davis (1984) and Glenn (1985), and offensive tackle Mike Simmonds (1986).

Three former Indiana State players are currently starters in the NFL—offensive tackle Tunch Ilkin (Pittsburgh Steelers), and defensive backs Davis (Washington Redskins) and Glenn (San Diego Chargers)—while a fourth, Simmonds, also plays for the Chargers.

Raetz, 44, and his wife Betty reside in nearby Riley with a daughter, Jaime (15), and son, Mark (12).

A former Indiana State University defensive back, Alvin Reynolds is now in his eighth season as a member of the Sycamore football coaching staff. In addition to his duties as secondary coach, the 31-year old Reynolds is in his first season as ISU's assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator.

The New Orleans native, who played four seasons at ISU as a strong safety, was the subject of a student-sponsored write-in campaign for the Heisman Trophy. The campaign worked as Reynolds received national attention from the *New York Times* and *The Sporting News* and got two votes for the nation's most prestigious college football award.

Since taking over as the Sycamores' defensive backfield coach, Reynolds has been instrumental in the development of two All-America selections who now ply their trade in the National Football League—cornerback Wayne Davis (Washington Redskins) and safety Vencie Glenn (San Diego Chargers). A more recent protege, cornerback Lavent Blaylock, signed a free agent contract with the Seattle Seahawks this past spring.

Following his playing career, Reynolds served as a graduate assistant coach at ISU for one season before being elevated to a full-time position. His new duties include working with ISU Athletic Academic Coordinator Cathy Baker, assisting Head Coach Dennis Raetz with various off-the-field administrative decisions, and developing a recruiting plan that makes best use of the Sycamore coaching staff.

Former Wichita State football and track standout Dan Ritter is in his fifth season as a member of the Indiana State football coaching staff and his third year as the Sycamores' defensive coordinator.

Since arriving on the scene in Terre Haute, Ritter has made a name for himself as he has developed the Sycamore defensive line into one of the strong points of the ISU football program. Former ISU defensive tackle Mark Bertram earned all-conference and honorable mention All-America honors under Ritter's tutelage.

Ritter and ISU Head Coach Dennis Raetz have been friends since the early 1970's when the Kansas City, KS native served as a member of Raetz' coaching staff at Kansas City's Harmon High School. Since then, Ritter has been an assistant coach at Turner High School in Kansas City; head coach at Miami High School in Miami, AZ; head coach at University High School in San Diego, CA; and

an assistant coach at the University of San Diego. As the head coach at Miami High School, Ritter led his club to two consecutive trips to the Arizona state playoffs. His midas touch continued at his next coaching stop when he took over an ailing program at University High School and improved its fortunes each season, finally posting a winning season (6-5) in 1985. Among the quality players produced during his four-year stint at the San Diego school include offensive lineman Mark Marshall (Indiana State) and linebacker Mike Wilson (Southern Cal). Ritter competed in football and was a shot putter on the Wichita State track and field team. He also participated in wrestling while in high school.

Calvert compiled a 16-14 won-loss record at ICC, leading his 1987 team to a Top 10 national ranking, a conference championship, and a spot in the Dixie Rotary Bowl played at St. George, UT. A key member of that 1987 team was wide receiver Reggie Rember, who earned All-America status at West Virginia last season, and was a first-round selection of the New York Jets last spring.

A native of Sioux City, IA, where he earned all-state mention as a quarterback at West High School, Calvert was named the Jayhawk Conference Coach of the Year in 1987.

Prior to his head coaching stint at ICC, Calvert served as the school's offensive coordinator for two seasons; was the head coach at Dana College in Blair, NE; and was a graduate assistant at the University of South Dakota.

SYCAMORES OUTLAST MULES

Indiana State thoroughly dominated the statistics, but the game was much closer in the most important statistic: the final score.

The Sycamores more than doubled Central Missouri State in total yardage, 418-183, and had 18 first downs to the Mules' five but managed just a six point victory. Six ISU turnovers kept CMSU in the game.

ISU opened the scoring with 11:19 remaining in the first quarter on a 2-yard run by Shawn Young. The Mules scored on an 18-yard pass from Jim Niehaus to Mark Brown but missed the extra point to make the score 7-6. One-yard touchdown runs by Young and Derrick Franklin put the Sycamores up 21-6 with 7:51 left in the first half, but ISU would not score again.

Central Missouri got within six points following a safety and a 1-yard plunge by Neil Tuihalamaka with 9:41 remaining in the game. The Mules got the ball back at the ISU 43-yard line after John Sahn's fourth interception of the game. Trailing 7-0 at the half, ISU pushed across two third quarter touchdowns on runs by senior quarterback Todd Jochem. A 6-yard run early in the stanza allowed the Sycamores to knot the score at 7-7, but it was Jochem's handling 85-yard scoring jaunt with 1:20 left in the quarter that gave Indiana State the victory. On the play, Jochem dropped back to pass—nearly back to his own goal line—before being flushed out of the pocket. He picked up several blockers as he made his way downfield before falling into the endzone.

With ISU leading 13-7, WIU made it into Sycamore territory in the fourth quarter, but the ISU defense stiffened and held Western on downs at the ISU 22-yard line.

The Sycamores finished the season at 4-7, 2-4 in the Gateway Conference.

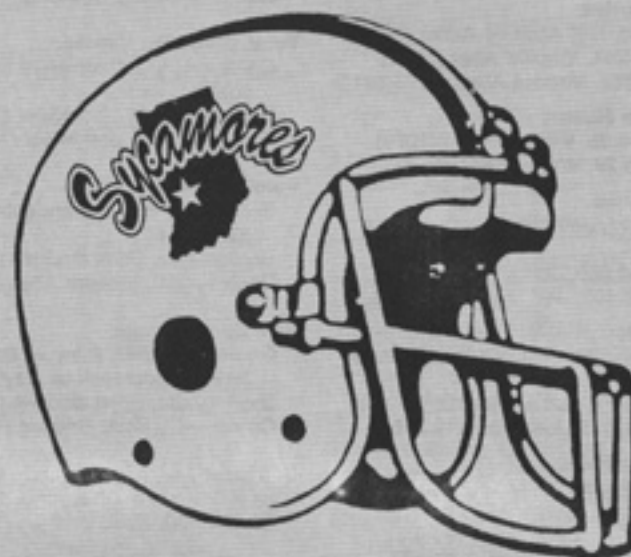

Indiana State University, home of the Sycamores, is located in Terre Haute, Indiana (population 60,000) in the heart of mid-America.

Founded in 1865, ISU today offers its 12,000 students more than 190 programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Business; Education; Technology; Graduate Studies; Nursing; and Health, Physical Education and Recreation. ISU degrees are awarded at associate, baccalaureate, master's and doctoral levels.

Rich in academic and athletic traditions, Indiana State University anticipates the 21st century with a bold Master Plan designed to enhance the usefulness of existing buildings and replace those no longer cost-efficient. A landscaped, lighted pedestrian walkway will link areas where major campus functions take place.

The first new building in the \$55 million plan—Root Hall—was completed in 1989. The handsome brick and limestone structure houses classrooms and office space for several departments of the College of Arts and Sciences, including English, Humanities, Foreign Languages, Philosophy, Psychology, and Mathematics and Computer Science.

To be completed in 1990-91 is the Hulman Memorial Student Union complex in the newly defined center of campus. An attractive outdoor plaza with a fountain as the centerpiece sets the tone for the renovated nine-story building with its new Dede Activity Center and attached retail services mall and food court.

When that project is completed, the original union building—built in 1940—will undergo some changes to become the University's central computing and administrative services facility. The \$7.8 million project involves internal renovation as well as additional new construction.

The Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building continues to provide the University with state-of-the-art athletic facilities. Features include laboratories in motor learning, biomechanics, an indoor track and courts for tennis, basketball, handball and racquetball.

Memorial Stadium, home of the Sycamore football team and in 1967 the world's first university-owned-and-operated AstroTurf playing field, received a new synthetic playing surface in 1989, as did the baseball infield on Sycamore Field. A portable hardwood basketball court was also installed in Hulman Center.

Nor has the newness worn off the Eleanor Forsythe St. John softball complex on the west edge of campus. Completed last year, it consists of two fields, bleachers and parking facilities. The intercollegiate women's team plays its home games there on Price Field.

ISU: 125th ANNIVERSARY

INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY

During the 1990-91 academic year, Indiana State University is celebrating the 125th anniversary of its founding while continuing to prepare for the changing demands of the future.

Indiana State Normal School was established on December 20, 1865, by an act of the Indiana General Assembly. The city of Terre Haute bid \$50,000 together with the site of the Vigo County Seminary, valued at \$25,000, to have the school located in its community.

On January 6, 1870, 21 students began their studies at the Indiana State Normal School.

Following a devastating fire on April 9, 1888, which destroyed the school, the city of Terre Haute once again pledged its support. The City Council appropriated \$50,000 to rebuild the school.

Enrollment continued to increase until World War I when more than 1,000 students saw active military service. Due to the drop in enrollment, the school decided to support a plan for establishing an extension campus in Muncie to attract additional students. The new campus was a success and later became a separate institution now known as Ball State University.

In 1929, the General Assembly changed the name from Indiana State Normal School to Indiana State Teachers College in recognition of the collegiate level coursework—including a master's program—the institution was offering.

World War II greatly affected the country's colleges and universities. Indiana State provided military training for the Navy V-5 and V-12 programs. After the war, enrollment increased and the campus continued to grow.

During the 1950s, hundreds of courses were added to the College's curriculum including a program leading to the advanced degree in education. In

1961, the institution became Indiana State College.

The curriculum continued to expand and by 1965 the institution had developed the Schools of Education, Graduate Studies, Nursing and Business and the College of Arts and Sciences. On February 8, 1965, the governor of Indiana signed a bill changing the name of the institution to Indiana State University.

Also in 1965, the University opened a branch campus in Evansville which, in 1985, became the University of Southern Indiana.

By 1967, the University had added two more schools—Health, Physical Education, and Recreation, and Technology.

The University now offers its 12,000 students more than 200 undergraduate and graduate degree programs.

The tremendous growth the University has experienced since its founding 125 years ago will serve as a strong foundation for the future.

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Dr. Richard G. Landini has served as Indiana State University's eighth president since 1975.

Whether handling a myriad of administrative responsibilities from his office in Gillum Hall or quoting poetry to students in his English classes, this chief executive officer of 15 years does it all with aplomb. He is a "people" person who lives on campus in a house constructed in the 1860s—readily available to students and colleagues.

The intellectual climate has been enhanced by the addition of several new degree programs and a broader base for the general education program since Landini's arrival. A vastly improved physical environment is also the result of efforts instituted during his administration.

His interest in making the campus more attractive and functional led to the initiation of a long-term \$55 million Master Plan in 1986. The first building in the plan is Root Hall (1989), a brand-new classroom and office building for departments in the College of Arts and Sciences. Construction of a new student union is underway and should be ready for use this fall. Also in the works is a facility for central computing and student administrative services.

To give a feeling of spaciousness, green spaces have been added wherever possible, often with the help of students, faculty and staff in a spring cleanup that has become a tradition.

While in Indiana, Landini has served as president of the Indiana Conference of Higher Education and the Indiana Partners of the Americas. Currently he is a member of the Board of Directors of the Indiana Corporation for Science and Technology and the Indiana Commission for Economic Development.

Nationally, he is presently a member of the Committee on the Arts of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. He has served on several other AASCU committees, and as Indiana's legislative liaison representative.

A strong advocate of the University's athletic program, he was a Missouri Valley Conference representative to the NCAA Annual Conference of College and University Presidents from 1980-84 and a member of the American Council on Education Committee on Division I Athletics.

He has received honorary degrees from the University of Miami, his alma mater, from Quincy College in Illinois and from Baiku Jo Gakuin University in Japan.

A native of Pittsburgh, Pa., Landini has bachelor's and master's degrees in literature from the University of Miami and a Doctor of Philosophy degree from the University of Florida. At Arizona State University for 11 years (1959-1970), he spent five years at the University of Montana as academic vice president and professor of English before moving to Terre Haute.

Dr. Landini and his wife, Phyllis, reside in historic Condit House on the University campus. They are the parents of five adult children.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Indiana State University Athletic Director, Brian Faison has had a busy and productive two years at the helm of the Sycamore Athletics program. Wasting little time, Faison has thrown immense energies into overseeing facilities improvements, orchestrating major growth in fund-raising, and reorganizing the athletic department to insure improved and effective management to move ISU to its goal of success in the Gateway and Missouri Valley Conferences.

Several major facility projects have been initiated by Faison, including an All-Pro artificial turf at Memorial Stadium, a new Omni Turf artificial infield at Sycamore Field, and a new portable wooden basketball floor at the Hulman Center. In addition, renovations have been made to the Eleanor Forsythe St. John's Softball Complex and the men's basketball locker rooms in the Hulman Center as well as the moving of the men's basketball offices from the Hulman Center to the ISU Arena.

Contributions have increased dramatically under Faison's leadership. Last year, the Sycamore Varsity Fund raised the most annual giving dollars for athletics in the history of the program. New giving programs have also been put into place for men's basketball (Larry Bird's Inner Circle), women's basketball (HoopstHERS), softball (R.B.I. Club), and a baseball billboard advertising program to help meet the critical need for increased support for Sycamore Athletics.

Faison's management philosophy is simple . . . service, service, service! Along with supervising the day-to-day operations of the athletic department, Faison has focused upon reorganization of the department to provide better service for our student-athletes, coaches, and supporters.

Stressing community involvement by coaches, administrative staff, and student-athletes to maintain the special bond between Sycamore Athletics and the Wabash Valley, Faison is active in numerous community fund raising activities. He serves on the Executive Board of the Wabash Valley Council of the Boy Scouts of America, chairs the Councils' National Eagle Scout Association, is a member of the Terre Haute Rotary Club and the Aero Club, and serves on the Sports Advisory Committee of the Terre Haute Convention and Visitors Bureau.

On the conference level, Faison has served the Missouri Valley Conference as Chair of the Directors' of Athletics Committee and the Basketball Officiating Committee in addition to serving on the Executive and the Championship Events Committees. For the Gateway Conference, Faison has chaired the Promotions Committee.

Faison assumed his duties at Indiana State in the summer of 1988 after four years as an assistant athletic director and executive director of the Cardinal Athletic Fund at the University of Louisville. Previously, he served five years as assistant athletic director at Illinois State and had several capacities in the athletic department and alumni office at the University of Missouri, his alma mater.

Brian and his wife Donna, have three sons, Jonathan (11), Matthew (7), and Bradley (4), and reside in Terre Haute.

ATHLETIC TRAINING

Indiana State University was the first school in the nation to offer an athletic training curriculum, in 1969, and has since been consistently placing quality professionals in the field all over the country.

It is one of only two schools to offer both undergraduate and graduate training programs. There are more trainers in the country with ISU degrees than any other program. The growth of the training program can, in part, be attributed to the large number of alumni athletic trainers spreading the word.

"We get calls from all over the country every year from people looking for more of our graduates," Head Athletic Trainer and Assistant Professor Vince Stilger said. "The growing interest in sports medicine over the past five to 10 years has even limited us in how many students we can accept each year. Right now, we accept between 8-10 undergraduate and 20-25 graduate students each year. We have a pretty high job placement of our graduates."

Stilger is among the ISU alumnus, having received his bachelor's and master's degree from the program.

A potential student trainer at ISU applies to the program at the end of his or her sophomore year and works six sports at five weeks each during the junior year. The student is evaluated on those performances and is tested with practical examinations before staying with one sport for an entire season during the senior year.

Actual experiences to develop skills and talents, a nationally recognized faculty with invaluable knowledge and experience, in addition to the reputations and placement of ISU graduates throughout the country have led to the continued success of ISU Athletic Training in the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Department.

ATHLETIC STUDY CENTER

Dr. Cathy Baker takes the Athletic Study Center into its fifth year of operation this fall where she and her staff supervise the academic progress of some 400 Indiana State University student-athletes over the course of the school year. Baker's background includes bachelor's and master's degrees, a Ph.D. in Secondary Education and eight years as a Reading Specialist with the ISU Study Skills Center.

"We've always had great support from coaching staffs and we now have support from faculty and administration. This is a young program but down the road I hope we will be able to expand the services we offer, expand our hours of operation, and expand the physical space we have to work with," said Baker.

Some of the services the Athletic Study Center provides include a required study skills course, tutoring, proofreading services and a reader service for LD Students, counseling, and proctored or oral exams for LD Students. In addition to these services, Baker and her staff provide fundamental instruction in areas such as basic study skills, time management, drug education and testing, and media relations. The Athletic Study Center provides supervised study hall sessions, academic support for student-athletes who are learning disabled, and individual tutoring for those students who need in-depth help with a particular subject. Careful academic records are maintained for each student-athlete.

Of all our student athletes, 90% are in good academic standing with the university and 25% maintain over a B average," Baker noted.

Dr. Baker's philosophy is simply this: "I like to say that 'my team' wins when these guys graduate. Actually, there's a lot more I want for these students. I want them to learn something while they're here. I want them to be personally and professionally successful."

The student-athletes at Indiana State University are in good hands.

ATHLETIC FACILITIES

Indiana State University student-athletes are blessed with some of the finest athletic facilities in the nation.

Hulman Center, recently renovated with a new portable wooden playing surface, has been the home of the basketball Sycamores since the 1973-74 season. The facility gives the city a large auditorium to accommodate convocations, meetings and conventions, as well as musical and dramatic presentations. Hulman Center is the largest athletic arena of its kind in west-central Indiana, providing a seating capacity of 10,200.

The **ISU Arena** has been in service since 1962 and since that time has been the home to men's and women's basketball, volleyball, gymnastics, and wrestling teams, and the school's many intramural sports programs. The gymnasium is serviced by 30-rows of mechanized, folding bleachers which provide seating for some 2,500 of the facility's 3,000 capacity. An \$11 million addition to the Arena—which includes several indoor tennis courts, 12 basketball courts (which can be used for either men's or women's teams practice sessions, or intramurals), an indoor track, racquetball and handball courts—was finished in 1988. New state-of-the-art outdoor tennis courts are located adjacent to the Arena.

Memorial Stadium is the home of the Indiana State football program. The facility, a former minor league baseball ballpark, is one of the few Division I-AA football stadiums in the country with an All-Pro Turf playing surface, which was added prior to the 1989 season. Among the other changes at the 20,500 seat stadium are a remodeled weight room and athletic training complex. Indiana State, in 1967, was the first university in the world to own and maintain outdoor use of an artificial playing surface.

The base for one of the Midwest's finest Division I collegiate baseball programs, **Sycamore Field** has undergone a number of changes in recent months. The installation of an OmniTurf infield in the fall of 1989 was just the first step in a planned renovation project for the entire facility. Among the other changes planned include the installation of lights, a new seating area, and a modernized press box.

Perhaps the newest athletic facility on campus is the **Eleanor St. John-Ferne Price Softball Complex**, which opened for the first time in the spring of 1989. Located across the street from the ISU Arena, the softball facility features two playing fields which can be used for both athletics and intramurals. While the complex is still in its infancy, planned changes promise to make the facility one of the best in the Midwest.

Indiana State's men's and women's track teams compete at **Marks Field**, also located across the street from the ISU Arena. Marks Field, named for longtime Sycamore coach Wally Marks, has been the home of the ISU track and field programs for the past 20 years. **Hulman Links**, one of the finest public golf courses in the state of Indiana, is also the home to ISU's men's and women's cross country teams.

GATEWAY CONFERENCE

The Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference enters its ninth year of existence and sixth season of operating a seven-school NCAA I-AA football division.

The Gateway Conference was founded, as a women's athletic organization, by ten midwestern universities with similar academic and athletic interests in 1982.

The conference is comprised of schools which are members of two different conferences for other men's sports and is spread out over five states. Seven Gateway members belong to the Missouri Valley Conference: Bradley University, Drake University, Illinois State University, Indiana State University, Southern Illinois University, Southwest Missouri State University, and Wichita State University. Three others belong to the Association of mid-Continent Universities (AMCU): Eastern Illinois University, University of Northern Iowa and Western Illinois University.

The Gateway sponsors championships in nine women's sports and one men's sport, football. The women's sports include cross-country, volleyball, basketball, indoor track and field, swimming and diving, golf, tennis, softball and outdoor track and field.

On August 21, 1985, the Gateway Conference Presidents' Council voted to add a I-AA football division, for six of its

members, to their previously all-women's athletics organization. Forming the football division were Eastern Illinois, Illinois State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri and Western Illinois. This move marked the first time in college annals that men's football was added to a women's conference. In June 1986, Indiana State University enrolled as the seventh member of the Gateway Conference football division.

Patty Viverito has governed the Gateway Conference since its birth. In fact, Mrs. Viverito became the first woman commissioner to govern a conference associated with men's athletics.

The football division of the Gateway, a conglomeration of former Missouri Valley Conference and Mid-Continent Conference football playing institutions, has quickly become a national power. The strength of the fledgling Gateway was confirmed in July of 1986 when the NCAA I-AA Football Committee voted to waive the league's two-year waiting period and grant the Gateway an automatic bid to the national championships after just one season of play.

Southwest Missouri State and Eastern Illinois both qualified for the I-AA playoffs in 1989, and SW Missouri was ranked among the nation's top ten most of the season.
