

## WTHI Radio to Air ISU

### NEWS*Talk* 1480

WTHI

Indiana State University football broadcasts can be heard on WTHI Radio once again this season, continuing a long relationship that has seen WTHI Radio carry Sycamore athletics for 40 years.

All 11 football contests will be aired on "NewsTalk 1480 AM" with the Dennis Raetz Pre-Game show beginning 20 minutes prior to kickoff. A Sycamore assistant coach will handle the post-game analysis.

Veteran broadcaster Steve Smith will also return as the "Voice of the Sycamores", entering his sixth season behind the mike. Smith will be joined again by Sports Information Director Eric Ruden as the color commentator.

The weekly Dennis Raetz Talk Show will air at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesdays throughout the season. The program, hosted by Smith, will feature Coach Raetz and guest interviews with the Sycamore players.

The announcement of the two-year agreement had an immediate impact on ISU athletics. "We are pleased to continue our valued relationship with WTHI Radio," said Athletic Director Brian Faison. "They have an excellent presence in the market, and one that gives great exposure to our athletic teams. We work together as a team to bring the excitement of ISU athletics to our loyal fans."

"WTHI Radio is very happy to be associated with the quality athletic programs at ISU, which allows us to continue to position ourselves as the complete radio station for the Wabash Valley," said David Liston, Vice President and General Manager of WTHI Radio.

# MEDIA INFORMATION

## CREDENTIALS

Requests for working press credentials at Indiana State home games should be made on company letterhead to Eric Ruden in the ISU Sports Information Office. Credentials will be mailed if at all possible. Otherwise, they will be left at the Will Call Booth, which is located directly east of the main archway entrance. Credentials must be made visible at all times for proper identification by Indiana State security personnel. Photographers are asked to wear armbands when working the sideline and follow the established NCAA guidelines marked around the field. Armbands may be picked up in the press box approximately one hour before kickoff. Because of the demand for credentials and the limited space available, media agencies covering the visiting school on a regular basis receive top priority. All other credentials for print media are issued on a basis of circulation. Only local radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting a daily sports show receive consideration for credentials unless special arrangements are made.

## PRESS PARKING

Press parking at Memorial Stadium is located next to the Stadium Golf Course pro shop on Wabash Ave. Your media credential will allow you to park there.

## PRESS BOX SERVICES

Programs, flip cards, statistics and notes will be provided before each game. A play-by-play will be distributed at the conclusion of each quarter. Halftime statistics will also be available. Complete team and individual statistics, a scoring summary and coaches' quotes will be provided after the game.

A snack will be served before each game and at halftime behind the main working press area. Soft drinks will be available throughout the game.

## POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

All post-game interviews will be held in the 200 Club Room located beneath the press box. Coach Dennis Raetz and requested players will be made available at this time to the media. The visiting coach and requested players will also be asked to participate in this media session.

## RADIO

Radio contract requests and information should be directed to the Indiana State Sports Information Office. Stations

designated as "official" by visiting opponents will be provided a courtesy telephone line in a designated press box booth. All other stations requesting broadcast space must pay a fee of \$50 to Indiana State University and will be accommodated on the roof of the press box.

## PLAYER INTERVIEW POLICY

All requests for player interviews must be made through the Sports Information Office. Players have been instructed to conduct no interviews unless they have been set up in this manner. The interviews will generally be conducted before or after practice at the Stadium. Requests for telephone interviews will be handled by players returning phone calls to the media. No home numbers for players will be given out.

## INTERVIEWS WITH COACH DENNIS RAETZ

Interviews with Coach Dennis Raetz can be set up through the Sports Information Office or by calling his office directly at 812/237-4074. The best time to reach Coach Raetz is between 11 a.m. and noon Monday thru Thursday. Meetings are conducted during the morning, but he can return a phone call if he's not available.

# Sycamores

## The Gateway Football Conference

The Gateway Football Conference enters its ninth season of NCAA I-AA football competition in 1993.

The original Gateway Conference was founded as a women's athletic organization in August, 1982, following the dissolution of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. In September of that year, Patty Viverito was named the first commissioner of the newly founded conference, a position she maintains today.

In July of 1992, the 10-team Gateway Conference disbanded as its women's programs realigned with their men's teams in their respective conferences. The league assumed its new name on July 1, 1992, becoming the Gateway Football Conference, an NCAA I-AA football league comprised of seven Midwest institutions.

The Gateway Football Conference was born on August 21, 1985, when the Gateway Conference President's Council voted to add a I-AA football division for six of its

members to the previously all-women's athletic organization. The creation of the Gateway football division marked the first time in college annals that football was added to a women's conference.

Founding members of the football division were Eastern Illinois, Illinois State, Northern Iowa,



Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri State and Western Illinois. In June of 1986, Indiana State University became the seventh member of the Gateway Football Conference.

Gateway Conference football quickly became a force on the NCAA I-AA scene. The strength of the new league was confirmed in

July of 1986 when the NCAA I-AA Football Committee voted to waive the league's two-year waiting period and grant the Gateway an automatic bid to the national playoffs after just one season of play.

The eight seasons of Gateway football have been marked by continual successes. Northern Iowa advanced to the I-AA semifinals in 1985, 1987 and last year, falling by a touchdown or less to the eventual national champions in 1985 and 1987. Six of the seven league schools have been to the playoffs since 1982.

The 1991 edition of the Gateway Conference was perhaps its greatest ever as, for the third straight year, two Gateway teams advanced to the I-AA playoffs. The league compiled the best non-conference record in all of I-AA football at 24-12-2 — the second-best in Gateway history, trailing only a 24-12-1 slate in its first year in 1985.

## TRAVEL PLANS

The Sycamores will generally bus to the away site on Friday and make plans for possible workout or walk-through upon arrival. Bus transportation will be via Turner Coach. Here are the tentative travel plans with road headquarters listed. Please check with the sports information office during game week for an exact itinerary.

**AIR FORCE**--The Sycamores will depart Terre Haute on Thursday afternoon via charter aircraft and fly direct to Colorado Springs. They will workout Friday and depart immediately after the game.

**MINNESOTA**--The Sycamores will fly in day of game and return immediately after.

**SW MISSOURI**--The Sycamores will bus to Springfield Mo. Friday afternoon.

**NORTHERN IOWA**--The Sycamores will bus to Waterloo, IA on Friday and work out.

**ILLINOIS STATE**--The Sycamores will bus to Normal, IL on Saturday.

**YOUNGSTOWN STATE**--State will bus to Youngstown on Friday and work out.

# Sycamores

## ISU FOOTBALL--1993 OUTLOOK

The outlook of the 1993 Indiana State football season may be best delivered using Joe Friday of "Dragnet" fame's famous line "Just the facts ma'am." Well, the facts are very simple. The Sycamores have an outstanding team returning, maybe the best Coach Dennis Raetz has had since the mid-1980s. Fact No. 2 says that State will also face the most challenging schedule in school history.

So it's anyone's guess as to how the Sycamores will fare when they meet this challenge this fall. Coming off of a 4-7 campaign that saw the offense break all kinds of school records and the defense falter, the Sycamores know where they have to get better. "We will get better on defense. I promise you that," says veteran head coach Dennis Raetz.

The offense is coming back almost entirely intact led by quarterback Kip Hennelly, a two-year starter and All-America tailback David Wright. Raetz and Co. were dealt a blow this summer when Demetrius Dowler was drafted in the Major League Baseball Draft by the Chicago Cubs. He is not expected to return for the '93 season, but his final decision may not be made until late August. Here's a look at the offense:

### Offense

#### Offensive Line

Three starters return in left tackle Tim Giebels, right tackle Tim Herrin and All-Gateway right guard

Shawn Moore. Darnell Richardson will move into a starting role at left guard after seeing considerable action in a back-up role in 1992.

The biggest concern here will be replacing All-Conference center David Sharbaugh. Raetz took a look

probable starter. This unit played a big role in the success of the Sycamore running game last season and will be looked to once again to pave the way for All-America tailback David Wright.

#### Quarterback

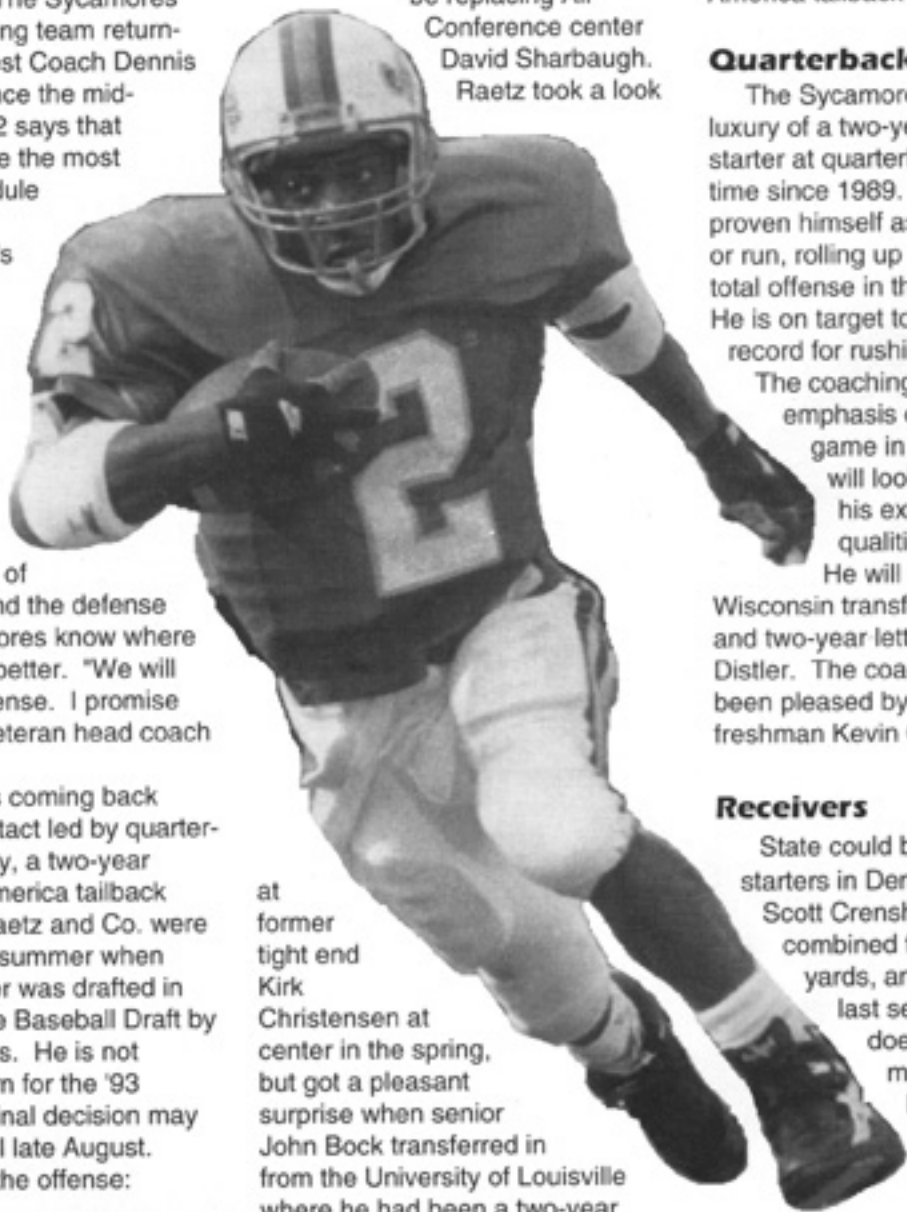
The Sycamores will have the luxury of a two-year returning starter at quarterback for the first time since 1989. Kip Hennelly has proven himself as a threat to pass or run, rolling up 3,148 yards in total offense in the past two years. He is on target to break the school record for rushing yards by a QB.

The coaching staff placed an emphasis on the passing game in spring drills and will look to Hennelly for his excellent leadership qualities again this fall. He will be backed-up by Wisconsin transfer Tom Cerasani and two-year letterman Chad Distler. The coaching staff has also been pleased by the progress of freshman Kevin Cox.

#### Receivers

State could boast two returning starters in Demetrius Dowler and Scott Crenshaw. The pair combined for 77 catches, 997 yards, and 8 touchdowns last season. If Dowler does not return from minor league baseball for his senior season, redshirt freshman Larry Brown, speedy

at former tight end Kirk Christensen at center in the spring, but got a pleasant surprise when senior John Bock transferred in from the University of Louisville where he had been a two-year starter at guard and tackle. He will be immediately eligible under the new NCAA transfer policy allowing student-athletes to transfer down a division and not have to sit out a year. Bock is penciled in as a

Bernard Redmond, and true freshman Micah Reid give the Sycamores good depth in the receiving corps.

### Running Back

ISU fans can only hope that David Wright's sophomore campaign is as successful as his rookie season was. He ran for 1,313 yards and ten TDs despite not starting until the eighth game of the season. He also returned 22 kicks for 593 yards. The fullback spot remains a question mark entering the fall with Ben Wolfe and Prentice Henderson leading the way to replace graduated seniors David Nicol and Scott Wilson. Junior William Hammons made the transition from defensive line to fullback in the spring and could be used in short yardage situations. Lawrence McFarrin, who saw some action last season, can be used at either tailback or fullback, and in one-back alignments.

### Tight End

Raetz has moved Kirk Christensen back to his familiar tight end spot where he has been a two-year starter after taking a look at him in the center spot during spring drills. The cagey veteran and the steady improvement of sophomore Larry Gauer will give the Sycamores a powerful one-two punch at this spot. Gauer saw action last season in two-tight end formations and has the ability to be a solid receiver.

### Defense

If spring practice was any indication, Indiana State should be a much improved team defensively this season. After getting pushed around the field last season, the Sycamores did more than hold their own against the high-octane ISU

offensive attack in a series of spring scrimmages. One scrimmage featured five interceptions by the State secondary. Last year's crew had just ten picks on the season.

State will also have some depth at inside linebacker and in the secondary that has been lacking in the past two campaigns. More muscle up front with the addition of Wisconsin transfer Dustin Rusch, and the maturation process of youngsters Rahsaan Baskerville and Dan Brandenburg should give ISU a much improved pass rush. Here's a look at the defense:

### Defensive Line

The defensive line will reap the benefits of Wisconsin transfer Dustin Rusch, a 6-3 288-pound junior. Returning starter Rahsaan Baskerville will be joined by sophomore Dan Brandenburg at the tackle spots. Brandenburg, a high school quarterback, is making the switch from outside linebacker and showed an ability to get to the passer in spring drills.

Last year's defensive front could only muster 12 sacks and had trouble putting pressure on the quarterback. This group should change the notion in a hurry.

### Linebackers

For the first time in a few seasons, State will have some depth at the inside linebacker slots led by returning starters Mike Nelson and



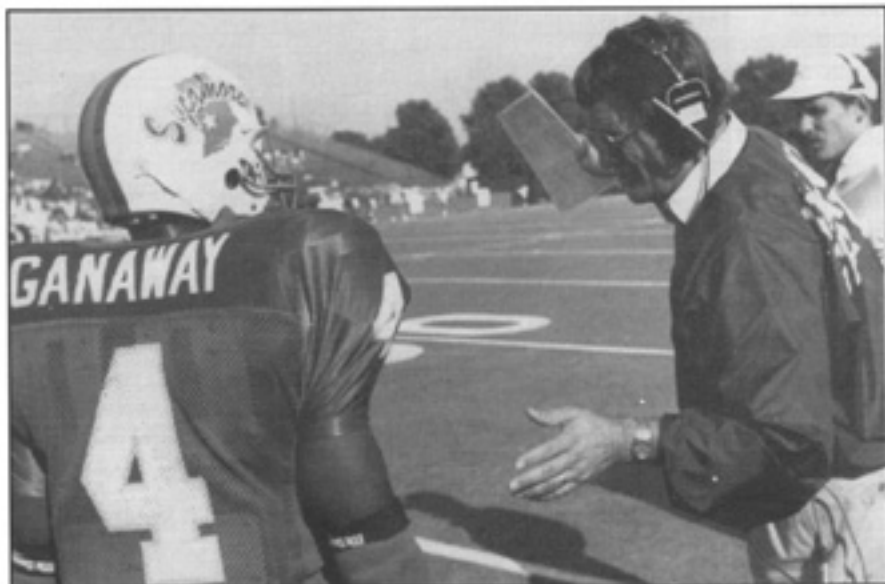
Senior Von Ganaway will be used strictly on defense this season after splitting time between tailback and safety last year.

Matt Egloff. Redshirt freshmen Richard Moss and Charles Alexander will also see considerable action. Moss is no stranger to the Sycamore gridiron program as his uncle, Quintin Mikell starred on Dennis Raetz' playoff teams in the early '80s and recorded 300 career tackles as an inside linebacker.

ISU lost three outside linebackers to graduation from the '92 squad in Byron Porter, Bruce Bridgewater, and Sam Whipple. Jack Hendershot, a former safety, will attempt to fill the void there. Damon Clark and Doug Puryear are making the switch from inside to outside linebacker, while Navy transfer Maurice Weakley had a solid spring and is listed No. 2 behind Hendershot.

### Secondary

Two of the four starting members of the secondary are returning starters in Von Ganaway and Michael Wilson. Sophomore Fred Hunt also saw considerable action here last season. Redshirt freshman Dre Knox made good strides in the spring and his quickness should help the defense in coverage.

Alvin Reynolds landed a position on the Denver Broncos' staff. In the process of filling the two vacancies, every coach on the Sycamore staff is tutoring a different position in 1993. Tim McGuire, the Defensive Coordinator on Raetz' 1983 playoff staff, has returned from Navy to coordinate the defense and coach the linebackers. Mike Williams, a former assistant at Western and Eastern Illinois, will coach the running backs. Dan Ritter, Mark Smith, Marty Fine, and Craig Bundy all return from last year's staff, but in different positions.

## Special Teams

Special teams play was one of the strengths of last year's squad, but a large player in the special teams, punter/placekicker Steve Krieger, has graduated. Sophomore Tom Allison saw some action last season and off-season weight training has strengthened his leg considerably. Redshirt freshmen Chad Busch and Jay Gerth will vie for the punting job. The return teams will remain intact with David Wright, Demetrius Dowler, and Von Ganaway returning kicks and Ganaway handling the punt return chores for the fourth straight year.

David Sharbaugh's departure leaves a vacancy in the snapping position. Terry Moore handled short snaps last season and will attempt to do both long and short this fall. He will be backed up by quarterback John Darlington.

## Schedule

The Sycamores will be pitted against a very strong schedule that opens with trips to Division I Air Force and Minnesota. The slate

also includes games at I-AA powers Youngstown State, Northern Iowa, and Southwest Missouri State. The five-game home portion of the schedule does not begin until October 2 when Eastern Illinois comes a calling.

## Gateway Conference

Dennis Raetz has often stated that the Gateway Conference showcases the best in I-AA football every Saturday and this year should be no different. Northern Iowa has won the last two titles and advanced to the semifinal of the Division I-AA playoffs last season before falling to Youngstown State. Southwest Missouri is expected to be much improved this season and would have to be considered a co-favorite with UNI.

## Staff Changes

Dennis Raetz was busy in the off-season making personnel changes as Offensive Coordinator Steve Brickey took a job at Texas Christian and Defensive Back Coach

## Overall

There is little question that the Sycamores will be better than last year's 4-7 club. But the question remains how much better? Offensively, the passing game must improve and David Wright will need to duplicate last season's numbers. The defense will have to get better and showed good strides in spring drills. Special teams have been a plus for ISU in recent years, but the loss of Steve Krieger leaves a void that needs to be filled.

## HEAD COACH DENNIS RAETZ

The winningest coach in Indiana State history, Dennis Raetz, will return to the gridiron this season for his 14th at the helm of the Sycamore program. Raetz surpassed Wally Marks two seasons ago to become the winningest coach in school history with his 63rd victory and now holds a record of 68-76-1.

The "Dean of the Gateway Conference" coaches has guided the ISU program to its greatest heights including a No. 1 national ranking during most of the 1984 season and two trips to the NCAA I-AA playoffs. Raetz was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 while also garnering Kodak I-AA District Coach of the Year honors.

Raetz has been a fixture at ISU since 1978 when he came to Terre Haute to serve on Dick Jamieson's staff as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. He remained in that position for two seasons before taking over the top job on February 25, 1980.

A native of North Platte, Nebraska, Raetz attended the University of Nebraska on a football scholarship, but his playing career was cut short by a severe knee injury. Following his college graduation in 1968, he was an assistant coach at North Kansas City High School in Missouri for five seasons before accepting head coaching responsibilities at J.C. Harmon High School in Kansas City, Kansas. In four seasons at Harmon where he coached former Denver Bronco All-Pro cornerback Mark Haynes, Raetz guided his clubs to two conference championships and a 24-13 record.

In 1977, Raetz joined the University of Missouri coaching staff where he worked with the defensive ends in addition to his duties as the junior varsity head

coach. It was at Mizzou that he began a working friendship with Jamieson who one year later became the head coach at Indiana State.

Raetz followed Jamieson to ISU and, after the 1979 season, became the school's 15th head coach when Jamieson became an assistant with the NFL's St. Louis Cardinals.

Raetz quickly put his stamp on Indiana State football with a stiff defense and efficient offense. After posting 6-5, 5-5-1, and 5-6 marks in his first three campaigns, Raetz broke through in 1983. The Sycamores got out of the gates quickly with two wins to open the season before making a trip to national power Florida. ISU battled the mighty Gators down to the wire only to fall, 17-13. Raetz' crew finished with a flourish in winning the last three regular season

games and earned a Division I-AA playoff berth for the first time in school history. The Sycamores defeated Eastern Illinois in the first round and fell to Southern Illinois in the quarterfinals.

State took that momentum gained from the 1983 season and rattled off nine straight victories to start the 1984 campaign and earn a No. 1 national ranking in the I-AA polls. The Sycamore season came to an end in the NCAA playoffs for the second consecutive season, this time dropping a 42-41 decision to Middle Tennessee State in overtime.

Raetz has led the Sycamore football program to two of its three nine-win seasons, the highest victory total in school history.

Since taking over the reins of the ISU program, Raetz has been instrumental in the development of several standout players including

Missouri Valley Conference Defensive Players of the Year Gerry Gluscic (1979), Craig Shaffer (1981), Wayne Davis (1984), and Vencie Glenn (1985); and MVC Offensive Players of the Year Reggie Allen (1979) and Jeff Miller (1984). The Sycamores' 1991 class included Gateway Offensive Player of the Year and All-American Derrick Franklin along with All-American Charles Swann. In 1992, freshman running back David Wright earned second team All-America honors.

Several of the above mentioned players have gone on to NFL careers. In all, 34 Sycamores have signed NFL contracts under Raetz' tutelage.

The veteran coach has also been extremely successful at turning out top notch coaches. Former Raetz assistants include Dave McGinnis of the NFL's Chicago Bears, Alvin Reynolds of the NFL's Denver Broncos, Steve Brickey and Pete Hoener at Texas Christian University, Pat Henderson and Bobby Turner at Purdue, Trent Miles at Northern Illinois, Kevin Ramsey at West Virginia, Sean Payton at San Diego State, Dave Magazu at Colorado State, and Bobby Boyce at Southwest Missouri State.

Raetz and his wife Betty reside in nearby Riley with their daughter Jaime (18), a freshman at the University of Nebraska, and son Mark (15), a multi-sport freshman athlete at Terre Haute South High School.

## CHATTING WITH COACH DENNIS RAETZ

Dennis Raetz begins his 14th season at the helm of the Indiana State football program. The following is a look at some of his thoughts on this year's team and other topics.

### Could you put David Wright's freshman accomplishments into perspective?

"David Wright is an awfully good tailback as his stats would prove. He proved to be durable and he proved to be capable of handling notoriety in the framework of the team. As good as he is, he can get better. He can be a better blocker, receiver, and improved his physical strength. These are all things he has worked on and will continue to do so. In the narrow scope of first year freshman tailbacks, in my mind, he's the best we've had."

### You have really stressed the improvements you expect in your defense this season. How will it be better?

"We will be better for several reasons, the most important being the fact that we will be faster and more athletic in several, if not all, positions. We've increased our athleticism in our line by taking a kid like Dan Brandenburg, who was a high school quarterback and a starter on the basketball team, and moved him to tackle. We have Dustin Rusch, who played at Wisconsin, and Rahsaan Baskerville with a year under his belt. You take that and add to it a healthy Matt Egloff along with Charles Alexander and Richard Moss, who are very quick, at the linebacker spots. Von Ganaway and Dre Knox give us more speed in the secondary."



### How does the intercollegiate athletic experience prepare a student-athlete for a career and life beyond college?

"Any time you compete in intercollegiate athletics you ultimately help increase your pool of contacts through a large circle of friendships you encounter. You have the opportunity to get ahead through increased exposure to different places, different people, and several different interpersonal relationships."

Intercollegiate athletics teaches you how to prepare, whether it be self-discipline, physically, or mentally. You have to learn how to budget your time. If you can accomplish these things, you can take that and do potentially whatever you want in later life. These qualities are not only by-products of what you can get at ISU, but athletics in general."

### How do you see the Gateway Conference race sizing up?

"Until someone can unseat Northern Iowa, you have to pick them. Southwest Missouri has a lot coming back and time has proved everyone else is pretty even. It's just a matter of a team staying relatively healthy and winning the close games."

### Plenty has changed in intercollegiate athletics over the years, but has anything remained the same?

"Not very much but, kids are still kids. I still get the same joy on the practice field and on game day. The joy from the interpersonal relationships with the kids is something I continue to treasure."

### The graduation rates of your football players continues to be one of the highest on campus, in the conference, and around the country. What do you attribute that to?

"We try to put a great deal of emphasis, along with Dr. Cathy Baker and her assistant Henry Villegas, on academics. You strive to do better at it in regard to the published rates. It will always be a major point of emphasis with our staff."

### How will you tackle the challenging schedule, including opening up on the road at Air Force and Minnesota?

"It is a difficult opening schedule, probably the most difficult in I-AA. As far as our approach, we've been very close to winning one in the past versus teams of this caliber. You just go and try to pull it off."

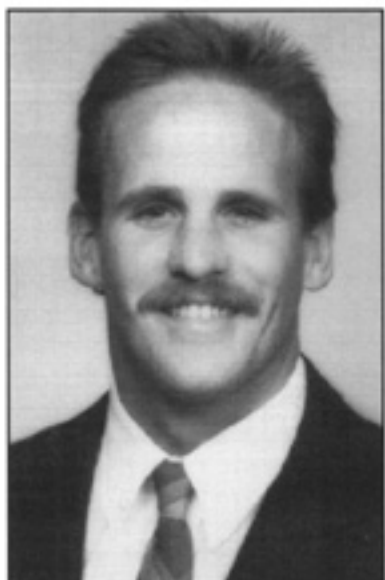

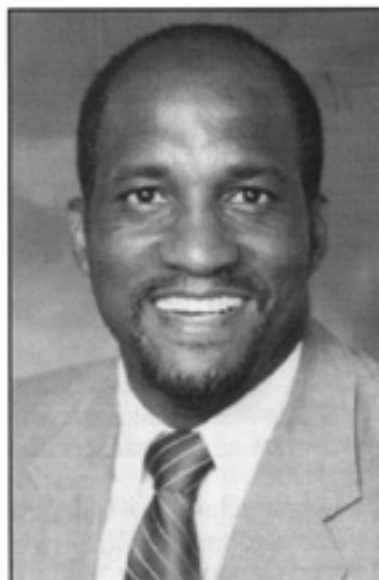

Bob Elson joined the Indiana State equipment room staff in August 1975 as an assistant equipment manager and was promoted to head equipment manager in July 1984.

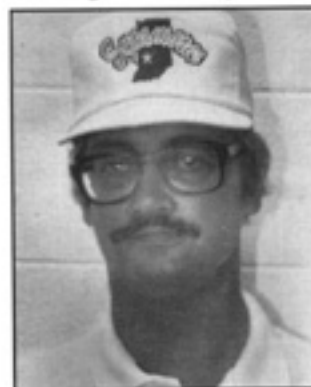
A native of Brazil, Ind., Bob graduated from Indiana State in 1973. He served two years in Germany with the United States Army.

Paul Schiess is in his third year as the head football trainer at Indiana State University.

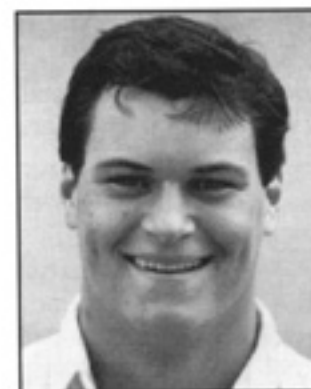
Schiess, formerly an athletic trainer at Utah State, originally came to ISU in 1990 as a graduate assistant working with the Sycamore baseball program.

# PRESIDENT JOHN W. MOORE

## JOHN W. MOORE IS ISU'S 9TH PRESIDENT



After one year as president of Indiana State University, Dr. John W. Moore is finding the challenges of his job enough to keep him busy around the clock.

Since his arrival in August, 1992, Moore has logged many hours traveling throughout the state, talking with alumni, parents, students and legislators. He has battled for more state funding; opened lines of communication on campus; and reorganized the administration.

"I have enjoyed immensely my first year here at ISU and in Terre Haute," he said from his office in Condit House, the oldest structure on campus. "I've met a lot of people and received much helpful advice."

Broad campus-wide participation characterizes the strategic planning process instituted earlier this year. The process provides faculty, staff and students with an opportunity to focus on important issues, opportunities and challenges pertaining to the long-term development of ISU.

"Public universities like Indiana State are now being asked to provide educational services of quality to a new generation of students, including the

adult learner, under-represented ethnic and racial populations, and people with disabilities. What we have to offer also will be increasingly sought by those persons in the worlds of business, education, public affairs, health care, human services, the arts, and many others," he said.

State universities are being asked to address the complex problems of both urban and rural America — hunger, poverty, disease, illiteracy, pollution and social alienation, to name but a few," Moore added. "By matching ISU's distinctive strengths with society's most pressing needs, appropriate goals and directions for the future development of the University are being formulated."

The author of numerous papers, publications and presentations on topics related to higher education and administration, Dr. Moore came to ISU from the presidency of California State University, Stanislaus. He also has had leadership experience at Old Dominion University and the University of Vermont.

A professor of educational administration, Moore received a bachelor's degree from Rutgers University and earned a doctoral degree from Pennsylvania State University. He was awarded a master's degree by Indiana University. He attended the Higher Education Management Institute,

Claremont Graduate School, and has done post-graduate work on the campuses of Dartmouth College, Princeton University and Stanford University.

Nationally, he is on the Cultural Diversity Committee of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and a member of the NCAA Presidents Commission and the ACE National Commission on Women.

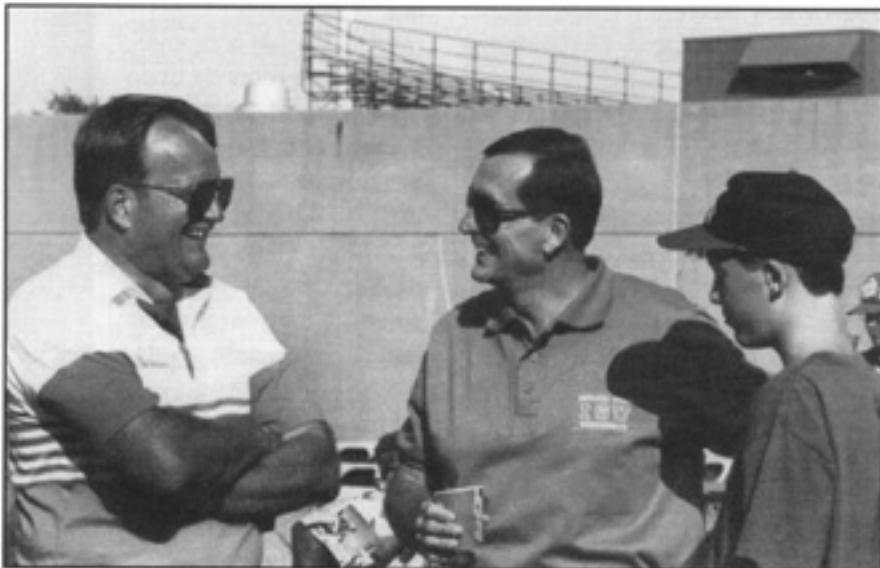
He is past president of the Society for College and University Planning and a member of the American Association of Higher Education, American Educational Research and the National Association of College and University Research Administrators.

He and his wife, Nancy, are the parents of Matthew, 21; Sarah, 18 (an ISU student); and David, 14.

## ATHLETIC DIRECTOR BRIAN FAISON



ISU Athletic Director Brian Faison has led a busy and productive five years for the Sycamore Athletics program. Faison has thrown his energies into overseeing facilities improvements, orchestrating major growth in fundraising, and reorganizing the athletic department to insure effective management to move ISU to its goal of success in the Gateway and Missouri Valley Conferences.

Several major facility projects have been initiated and completed during Faison's tenure, including an All-Pro artificial turf at Memorial Stadium, an Omni Turf artificial infield and lights for night baseball at Sycamore Field, a new portable wooden basketball floor at the Hulman Center, and the renovation and restoration of Marks' Field for Outdoor Track and Field.

Contributions have continued to increase dramatically with the Sycamore Varsity Fund setting a fourth straight year of record athletic annual giving. In addition, new designated giving programs have also been put

into place for men's basketball (Larry Bird's Inner Circle), women's basketball (HoopstHERS), softball (RBI Club), track, volleyball and a baseball billboard advertising program.

Along with supervising the day-to-day operations of the athletic department, Faison has focused upon reorganization of the department to provide better service for our student-athletes, coaches and supporters.

Faison is active in numerous community fundraising activities. He serves on the Executive Board of the Wabash Valley Council of the Boy Scouts of America, chairs the Council's National Eagle Scout Association, is a member of the Terre Haute Rotary Club, and serves on the Sports Advisory Committee of the Terre Haute Convention and Visitors Bureau.

On the conference level, Faison has served the Missouri Valley Conference as Chair of the Directors of Athletics Committee and the Basketball Officiating Committee. For the Gateway Conference, Faison has chaired the Promotions Committee.

On the national level, Faison has recently been named board chairman of the R.E. "Bob" Smith Award institutional board of directors. The board plays an active role in the selection of the college baseball player of the year and the national collegiate all-star team.

Faison came to Indiana State from the University of Louisville where he was Assistant Athletic Director for Development and Ex-

ecutive Director of the Cardinal Athletic Fund (1984-88). During his four years at Louisville, annual giving increased from \$560,000 to over \$2.9 million, thirty-four endowed scholarships were established, and special designated giving programs were developed for the non-revenue sports. Among his other duties, he served as tournament director for the 1986 and 1987 Metro Conference Basketball Tournaments and the 1987 NCAA Regional Basketball Tournament.

Previously, he served five years as assistant athletic director at Illinois State and had several capacities in the athletic and alumni departments at the University of Missouri, his alma mater.

Brian and his wife, Donna, have three sons, Jonathan (13), Matthew (10), and Bradley (7), and reside in Terre Haute.

Andi Myers enters her fifth year as associate athletic director/women's senior administrator at Indiana State. Myers is primarily responsible for the day to day operation of all sports and serves as the University's NCAA compliance officer.

## ISU ATHLETICS--THE TOTAL PROGRAM

The Indiana State athletic program continues to reach new heights in the 1990s. The Sycamores claimed three conference crowns last season, won four individual NCAA titles, and sent five baseball players into the professional ranks.

The ISU athletic program consists of football, volleyball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's

tennis, and men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field. All Indiana State athletic teams compete on the NCAA Division I level with the exception of football which is Division I-AA. The football program is a member of the Gateway Football Conference and the other programs all compete in the Missouri Valley Conference.

The conference crowns were won by the women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams and the men's outdoor track and field squad.

Junior sprinter Holli Hyché is following in the tradition of ISU's national caliber athletes like Larry Bird, Bruce Baumgartner, and Kurt Thomas by putting the Sycamores

in the national spotlight. She won NCAA titles in the 55m and 200m events indoors and the 100m and 200m events outdoors, establishing herself as the top collegiate sprinter in the country and one of the best in the world.

Hyché was not the only star the track program produced last season as Matt Quinn (hammer throw), Steve Smith (high jump) and Julie Koebecke (discus) earned All-American honors outdoors. David Wright earned All-American plaudits in football.

Several Sycamores earned

Academic All-Conference selections while Greg Thomas of the men's basketball team earned GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors.

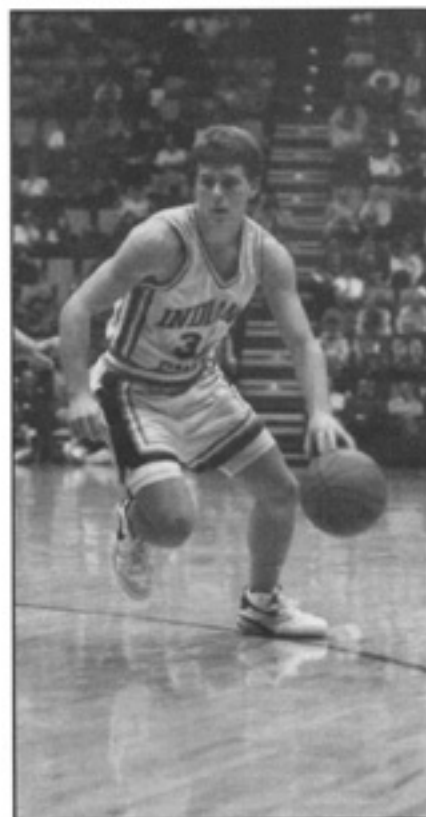
Casey Whitten, a second round draft pick of the Cleveland Indians headlined the five professional signees from Bob Warns Sycamore baseball program last season.

The improvement of the Sycamore athletic facilities continues. The most noticeable change last season was the restoration and renovation of the Marks Field track complex. The Terre Haute community was treated to national caliber competition when ISU hosted the

1993 MVC Men's and Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championships last spring.

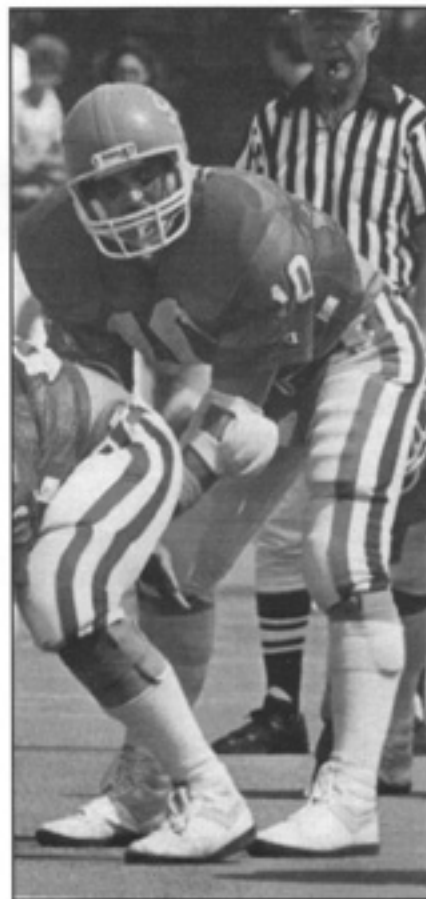

Dr. Cathy Baker takes the Athletic Study Center into its seventh year of operation this fall where she and her staff supervise the academic progress of more than 400 Indiana State University student-athletes



in the course of the school year. Baker's background includes a B.A. in English, an M.A. in English, a Ph.D. in Secondary Education, and eight years as a Reading Specialist with the ISU Study Skills Center.

Baker and her staff provide fundamental instruction in areas such as basic study skills, time management, drug education and testing, and media relations. The Athletic Study Center provides supervised study hall sessions, academic support for student-athletes who are learning disabled, and individual tutoring for those students who need in-depth help with a particular subject. Careful academic records are maintained for each student-athlete.

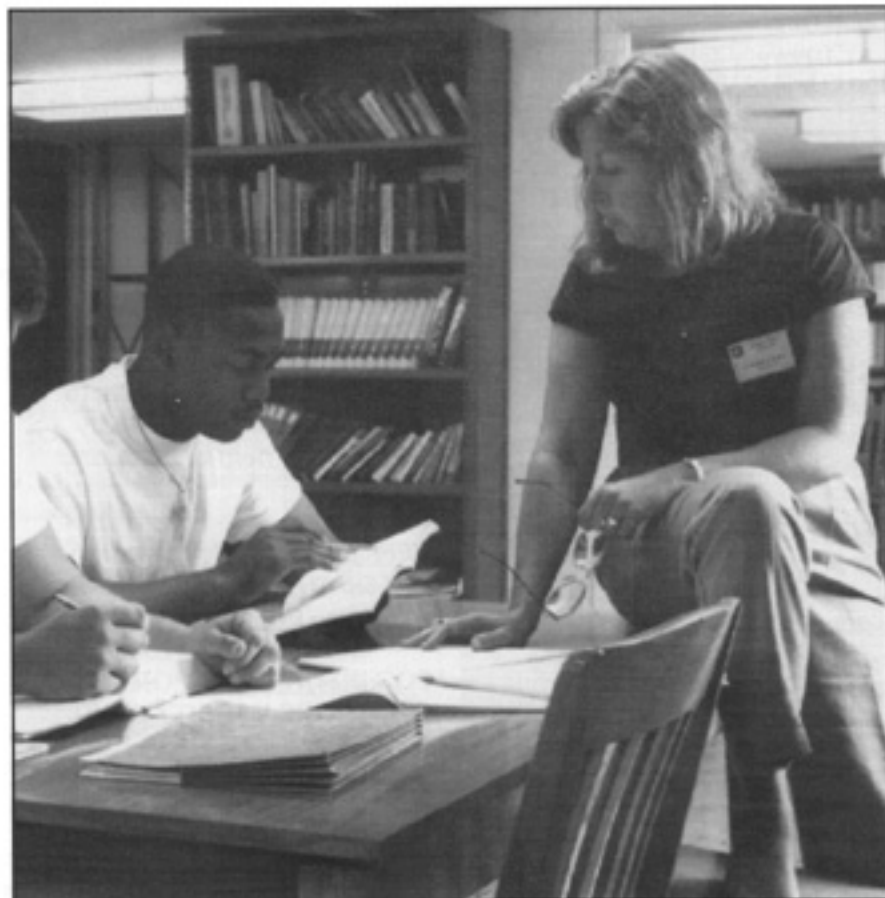

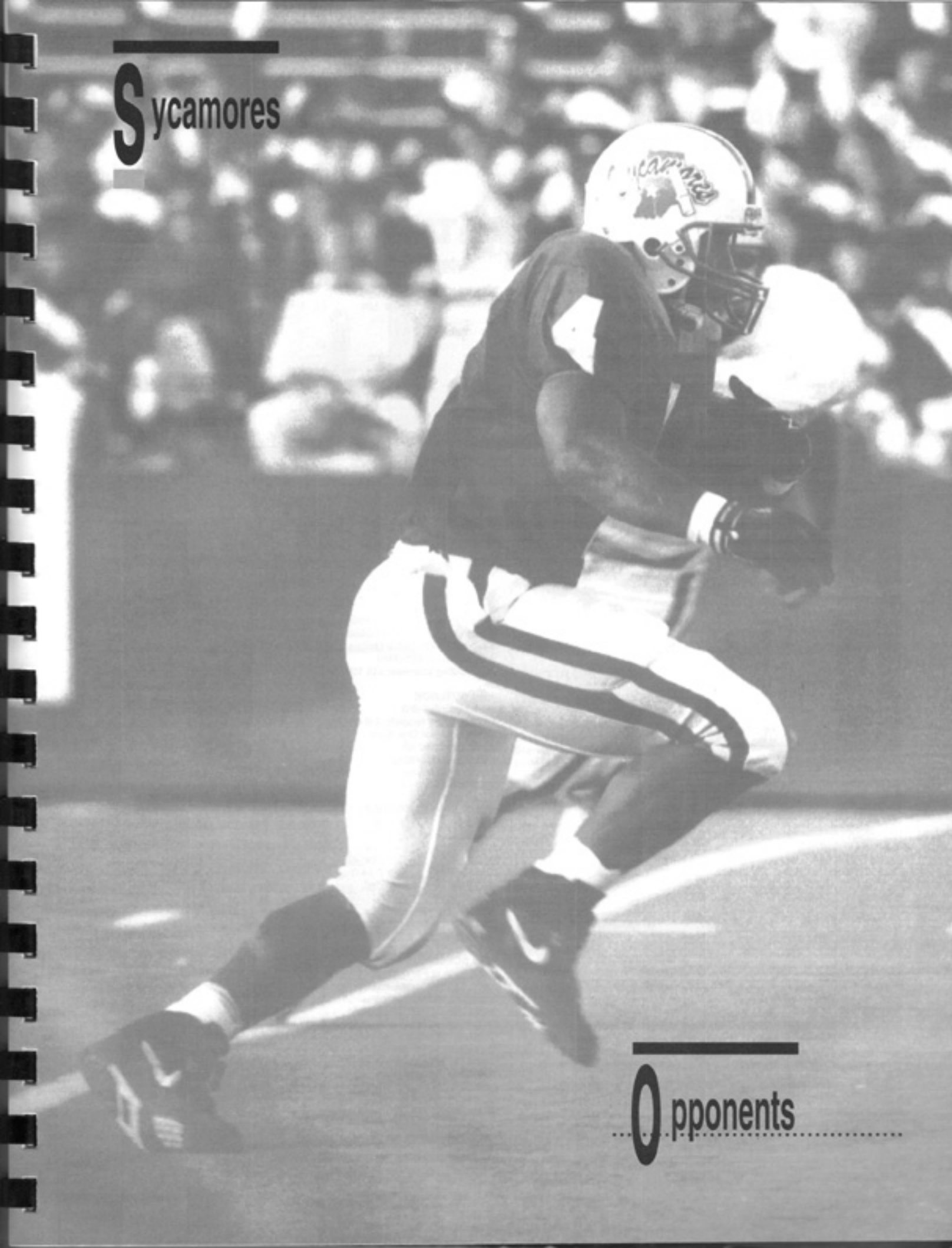
The foundation of the academic advisement program is set through the weekly study skills course which is required for all ISU athletes on scholarship. The course is centered around study skills, NCAA rules, media relations, and several other facets of the athletic world at ISU.

Lessons learned through the academic advisement program have proved extremely valuable to several members of the ISU football program. In 1991, Eric Christensen earned GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American honors while fellow senior linebacker Scott Foster was named GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-District. ## 1992 SEASON IN REVIEW

### OFFENSIVE FIREWORKS LED BY ISU'S "MR. WRIGHT"

The 1992 Indiana State football team featured one of the most explosive offenses in I-AA football. The Sycamores set school records with 319 points and 43 touchdowns, while tallying the second and third highest scoring games in school history with 66 points in one contest and 63 in another. Here's a look at some of the Sycamore fireworks:

The hub of the offense was clearly freshman tailback David Wright who set numerous NCAA, Gateway Conference, and Indiana State records with 2,014 all-purpose yards, 1,313 rushing yards, and eight games with over 100 yards. His best effort was a record-setting 225-yard day against Western Illinois. Wright was among the country's rushing leaders and paced all of I-AA in all-purpose running. He broke Herschel Walker's freshman Division I all-purpose yardage record and was among the national leaders in kickoff returns with a 27-yard average. For his efforts, the rookie was named first team all-conference and received All-American consideration. He accomplished all this while not earning his first starting assignment until the eighth game of the season. The future is definitely bright for Indiana State's Mr. Wright.

Despite Wright's phenomenal year, the Sycamores were more than a one-dimensional attack. Quarterback Kip Hennelly showed opponents that he is a threat running or throwing. The junior rushed for over 400 yards for the second consecutive season and threw for 1,326 yards and 9 touch-

downs. He now stands fifth on the school's all-time passing charts and sixth in total offense.

Hennelly had a fine stable of receivers who all return for next season led by Scott Crenshaw and Demetrius Dowler. Crenshaw led the team with 39 catches and three touchdown grabs.

Dowler was Indiana State's Mr. Clutch with 38 receptions for 554 yards and five touchdowns. He concluded the season just one receiving touchdown shy of the school record. Dowler also returned 21 kicks for 524 yards and a 25-yard average.

The Sycamores excelled on special teams as well ranking among the national leaders in kickoff returns and net punting. Placekicker/punter Steve Krieger put his name in the school record books and established himself as one of the finest combination kicker-punters in recent memory. He set the ISU mark for career punting average and set another school record with a perfect 38 for 38 on PATs. He concluded his career hitting on his final 48 extra points. He earned Gateway all-conference honors.

Coach Dennis Raetz utilized the versatile Von Ganaway as a tailback, safety, holder, and punt returner this season. Ganaway started the first seven games at tailback, rushing for 594 yards and five touchdowns. The Fort Wayne native anchored the secondary in the last four games from his safety spot, making 55 tackles and two interceptions.

The highlight of the Sycamore gridiron campaign was without a doubt ISU's stunning 31-28 upset of 11th ranked Southwest Missouri State in the final home game of the season. The lead see-sawed

throughout the game and the Sycamores scored midway through the fourth quarter on Kip Hennelly's pass to tight end Kirk Christensen. The State defense tightened and held off a last-second rally attempt by the Bears who came into the game atop the conference standings with an unblemished 4-0 mark.

The win marked the second straight year that ISU has knocked off the conference leader with an unbeaten league record this late in the season. Last year it was 17th ranked Western Illinois.

Several Sycamores were accorded All-Gateway Conference honors including David Wright, offensive guard Shawn Moore, center David Sharbaugh, Demetrius Dowler, Steve Krieger, nose guard Dyrrah Christon, and fullback David Nicol.

Christon, the senior from Kankakee, IL, led the young defensive unit as just one of two returning starters from last season. He paced the team with three sacks, nine tackles for loss, and was third on the squad in tackles with 86, despite being double and triple-teamed on almost every play.

Coach Dennis Raetz has a reputation of playing the best competition and this year was no exception.

The Sycamores lined it up against Big Eight foe Oklahoma State, defending I-AA champ Youngstown State, and No. 1 ranked Northern Iowa.

Sycamore fans can look for more explosions in 1993 as the fireworks continue for Indiana State.

Stillwater, OK — The final score was not indicative of how close this one was played. Perhaps the key play to this one came early in the fourth quarter with OSU clinging to a 14-3 lead. ISU tailback David Wright sprinted 50 yards inside the OSU ten-yard line only to have it called back due to a disputed clipping call. Oklahoma State ended a school-record seven game home losing streak as they defeated the Sycamores 35-3.

ISU managed just 207 yards of total offense. The majority of this offense coming from Von Ganaway, who had 88 yards on 25 carries. QB Kip Hennelly couldn't get the offense going, as he threw for 37 yards and two interceptions. Scott Crenshaw caught 30 of the 45 total yards passing. 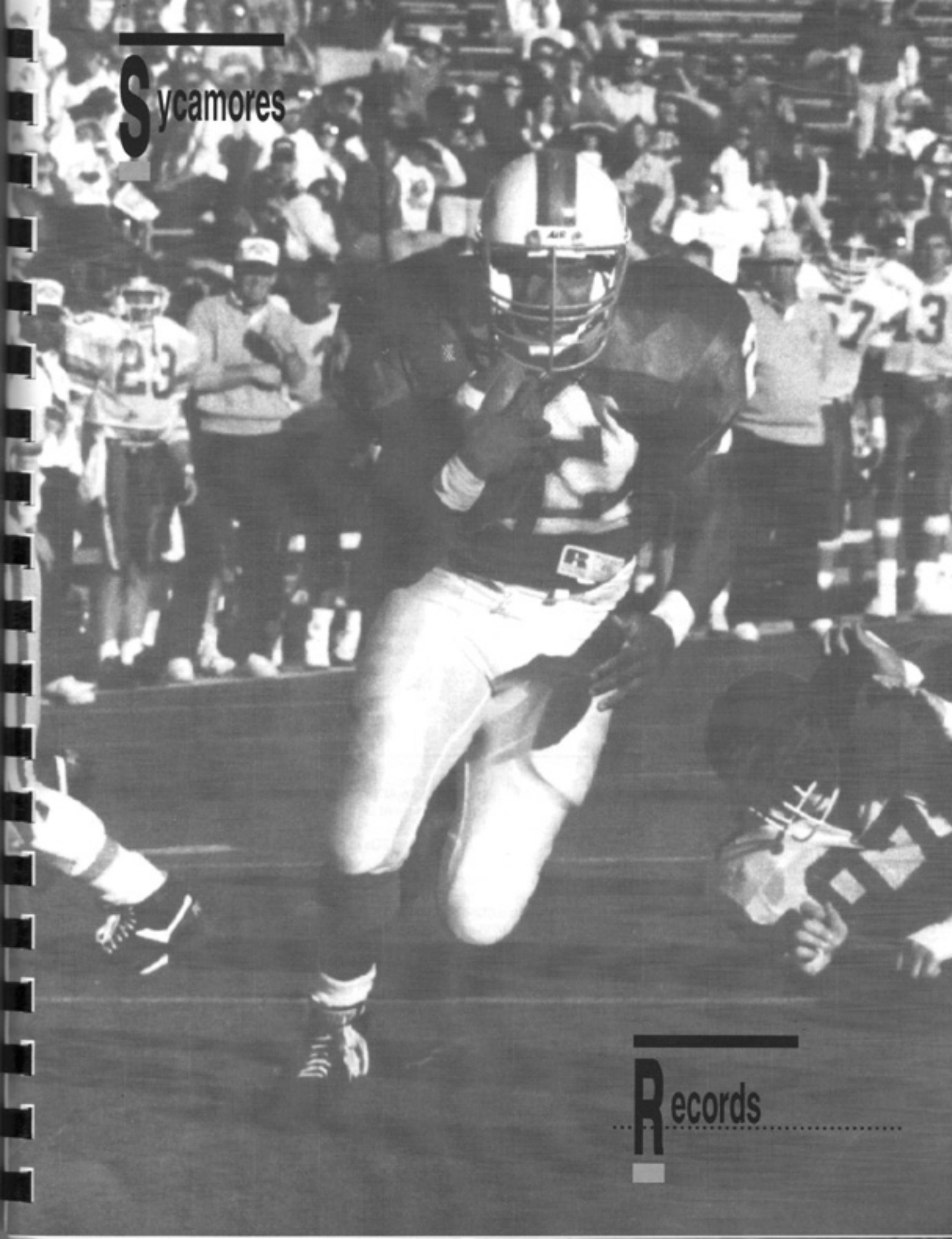

# 1983--A YEAR TO REMEMBER

## 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE 1983 INDIANA STATE FOOTBALL TEAM



**Crunch Bunch Defense—Quintin Mikell, Poncho Martin, Kevin Lynch, Kevin Ramsey**

Indiana State's football program has recorded only three nine-win football seasons in its long history. Two of those nine-win campaigns have come under the tutelage of current head coach Dennis Raetz.

The Indiana State University athletic department will honor the first of those Raetz-led teams — the 1983 Sycamores — during halftime ceremonies of the Eastern Illinois game on October 2. Former team members and coaches will be on hand to help celebrate an outstanding football season.

One of the finest teams to ever don helmet and pads at ISU, the Sycamores posted a 9-4 record and advanced into the second round of the I-AA post-season playoffs before being eliminated by eventual NCAA national champion Southern Illinois. How much talent was on that 1983 team? Seventeen players from that squad eventually signed professional contracts at the conclusion of their collegiate careers. One — Minnesota Vikings safety Vencie Glenn — is still toiling in the National Football League.

With quarterback Jeff Miller directing a potent offensive attack and the "Crunch Bunch" defense — keyed by outside linebacker Ed "Poncho" Martin — Indiana State's losses came at the hands of I-A Florida, Illinois State and Southern Illinois.

After winning their first two games of the season, Downing Northeast Louisiana (10-9) and Northern Iowa (26-

0), the Sycamores — ranked 15th nationally — traveled to Gainesville, Fla., to face the University of Florida and tailback Neal Anderson.

Given virtually no chance to com-

pete, much less win, against the powerful Gators, ISU lost a 17-13 heartbreaker in front of 68,191 stunned fans at Florida Field. As a matter of fact, the Sycamores had a chance to win the game with less than a minute to play but the drive stalled deep the Florida territory as time ran out.

Still, Indiana State's football team had made its point. Former University of Florida Head Coach Charlie Pell certainly got the message.

"They (Indiana State) didn't care whether we were from the Southeastern Conference, the Big Ten or the NFL," Pell said afterward. "They came to play. They did a great job and earned the respect of our players. They showed a lot of class. We fought hard. We had to."

Miller completed 14-of-30 passes for 126 yards and tailback Darrold Clardy rushed for 78 yards and a touchdown to pace the Sycamore offense. Defensively, safety Regis Mason and inside linebacker Quintin Mikell led the way with eight tackles each.

A week later, Indiana State downed Central Missouri State 33-7 in a home game. But the Sycamores lost their next contest, 37-20 at Illinois State. Mikell had an outstanding performance defensively for ISU with a school-record 25 total tackles. Tailback Kevin Henderson, subbing for an injured Clardy, ran 29 times for 158 yards and two TDs. Henderson was named as the Chevrolet "Player of the Game" as the

game was televised on a regional basis by CBS.

But the Sycamores regrouped in a hurry, knocking off I-A foe Ball State 35-14 and Missouri Valley Conference opponent Wichita State 24-22 in consecutive home games.

A 34-21 Homecoming loss to Southern Illinois dropped Indiana State to a 5-3 won-loss mark on the year, but then the Sycamores strung together three consecutive victories at the end of the regular season — downing Eastern Illinois 17-13, West Texas State 31-20 and Drake 38-0.

In the first-round of the NCAA I-AA post-season playoffs, Indiana State pulled off a wild 16-13 double-overtime win at Memorial Stadium. With the score tied at 10-10 at the end of regulation play, the Sycamores took a 13-10 lead on a 26-yard field goal by Scott Bridges. EIU then tied the game at 13-13, to send the contest into a second extra session.

The Panthers had the football to begin the second overtime, but the Sycamores' defense held as Mikell picked off a Sean Payton pass on third down. Two plays later, Bridges split the uprights with a 25-yard field goal to give ISU the victory.

Henderson rushed for 112 yards to lead the offense, but it was the defense that won this game as cornerback Wayne Davis had 13 tackles, while Glenn recorded two interceptions.

But ISU's good fortunes turned sour a week later as the Sycamores' season ended with a 23-7 loss to eventual I-AA national champion Southern Illinois. Jeff Miller's 4-yard touchdown pass to tight end Don Hitz midway through the first quarter proved to be all the offense that the Sycamores could muster on a cold, rainy day in Carbondale.

At the conclusion of the season, numerous honors were accorded to members of the 1983 Sycamores. Here's a brief breakdown of some of those awards:

## MEMORIAL STADIUM

Standing at its present site since 1924, and acquired by Indiana State University in 1967, Memorial Stadium is the home of Sycamore Football. The 20,500-seat structure is located at the corner of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute.

The stadium has been kept in excellent shape through the years and its latest addition was a \$400,000 All-Pro Turf surface installed prior to the 1989 season.

Memorial Stadium is not new to synthetic surfaces though, as the stadium and ISU claim distinction as the world's first university to own and make outdoor application of Astroturf. Following the University's acquisition of the Stadium, ISU opened the 1967 season with a 41-6 win over Eastern Illinois in the first game played on the new surface. The Astroturf at Memorial Stadium was similar to the indoor turf at the Houston Astrodome which saw the first college game ever played on the artificial surface in 1966 between Houston and Washington State.

Advantages to using synthetic surfaces include durability (some 15 college and high school football games are played on the surface each year in addition to daily ISU practices), a constant surface, and sure footing regardless of weather. The All-Pro Turf is also designed to provide more cushion and reduce injuries.

Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the public for the first time on May 5, 1925 as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria Tractors before an estimated crowd of 9,000. Among the honored guests were Major League Baseball Commissioner Judge Kennesaw Mountain Landis and Charles Barnard of the Cleveland Indians front office.



The first use of the playing field was in the fall of 1924 when Wiley and Garfield High Schools played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.

Original construction of Memorial Stadium was begun in 1922 at a cost of \$450,000. Upon the University gaining control in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included: the re-orientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to its present east-west configuration; the installation of Astroturf; and the construction of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as the rebuilding of seats on the south side.

# THIS IS INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY...

Indiana State University, home of the Sycamores, is located in Terre Haute, Indiana (population 60,000), in the heart of mid-America. Its urban campus is not far from the intersection of major highways — U.S. 40 with U.S. 41 and U.S. 41 with Interstate 70. Chicago, St. Louis, Cincinnati and Louisville are within a three-hour drive and Indianapolis is only an hour and a half away.

Founded in 1865 as a training school for teachers, ISU enrolled its first 21 students, in 1870. Today — three name changes later — the University offers its 12,000 students more than 200 programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Business; Education; Technology; Graduate Studies; Nursing; and Health, Physical Education and Recreation. Degrees are awarded at associate, baccalaureate, master's, educational specialist and doctoral levels.

In addition, ISU offers a variety of non-credit courses, cultural and recreational opportunities, and diversified workshops, seminars and conferences.

Characterized by small classes, Indiana State has a faculty and staff committed to a personal approach to higher education. And nine out of ten classes are taught by full-time professors.

ISU's 70,000 alumni occupy positions of leadership in education, business, industry, government, and public service.

For more than a century and a quarter, Indiana State has played an important role in Indiana's public service. Today, Indiana State makes a number of contributions to economic development locally, regionally, and nationally.

More than 60 buildings, plazas and walkways comprise the main campus on 90 acres adjacent to the

Terre Haute business district. In addition, the University maintains family housing units on a 15-acre site one mile south of the main campus and a 20,500-seat football and athletic facility two miles to the east. The 35-acre river campus located along the Wabash is the site of the University's outstanding baseball program.

Cunningham Memorial Library houses more than 2 million books, periodicals, documents and audiovisual and microfilm items; it also is a government depository containing more than 100,000 government documents. The Rare Books and Special Collections section houses the Eugene V. Debs papers, early Indiana textbooks and one of the

largest early dictionary collections in the world. An interlibrary loan service and several database searching units also are available.

Hulman Center, which celebrates its 20th anniversary in December, probably is best known as the arena basketball star Larry Bird played in during his college career; its versatility, however, also provides an ideal location for conferences, conventions, concerts, banquets, stage shows and other services.

Hulman Memorial Student Union became the hub of campus upon its completion in 1991. Students gather by the attractive outdoor plaza and its circular fountain. The soothing sounds of cascading water

sets the tone for the activity that takes place in the renovated nine-story building.

Within its walls, the Dede Activity Center provides meeting space as well as recreational and fitness opportunities while a variety of retail services and food is available in The Commons — from favorite fast-food franchises and sit-down restaurant to a bookstore, copying center and bank.

The original union building (Tirey Hall, built in 1940) continues to be a venue for musical/theatrical attractions but underwent some renovation to also house the offices of Admissions and Financial Aids in 1992. A new wing (Parsons Hall) and adjacent circular structure (Rankin Hall) are home to the central computing facility and several key administrative offices.

The New Theater offers a

modern "in-the-round" setting for year-round dramatic presentations. ISU's successful SummerStage! program has provided excellent entertainment for 28 years. The Dreiser Theater, located in recently renovated Dreiser Hall, provides a proscenium stage for more traditional performances.

Tilson Auditorium, located in Tirey Hall, house the Terre Haute Symphony Orchestra and the University's Convocation Series, which brings touring Broadway productions and other entertainment to campus. The former union building also has a recital hall which features weekly concerts by University faculty and students.

As a public service, ISU contributes its expertise in various ways.

The Technology Services Center in the School of Technology contracts with small and medium-size manufacturing companies to facilitate technology transfer to increase productivity and improve competitiveness. The Center for Research and Management Services in the School of Business contracts with businesses throughout Indiana to provide targeted industry studies, applied research, consultation and training. A Small Business Development Center is part of the larger center.

The Interdisciplinary Center for Cell Products and Technologies focuses on areas concerned directly with biotechnology, its commercialization, and its social and ethical implications. Research in the center focuses on recombinant DNA, hybridoma technology, biotechnical support, and the adoption of the technologies and products.

Also on campus is the Indiana Institute on Recycling, the country's first state-created institute charged with developing effective voluntary recycling programs.

## THIS IS TERRE HAUTE

Terre Haute is the center of the United States. Literally! More than half the population of the United States live within a 500-mile radius of Terre Haute, and the city is circled by a number of metropolitan areas. Indianapolis is only 68 miles away; Louisville, 196 miles; and Chicago, St. Louis and Cincinnati are all within 180 miles.

Terre Haute is located along the western edge of Indiana and is supplied with an efficient network of highways, which have contributed to the city's official designation as the "Crossroads of America."

A town for all seasons, Terre Haute is a community with big-city advantages, a small-town touch and a distinct personality. It can be energetic or easy-going. You can dress up for dinner and the symphony or go casual for hot dogs on the grill. Densely forested hills and urban skylines along with gracious old neighborhoods and modern suburbs truly make Terre Haute a city of contrasts.

The Terre Haute and Vigo County parks and recreational facilities offer an array of activities such as swimming, hiking, fishing, boating, golfing, tennis and even ice skating. The city's newest 18-hole professional golf course has been rated by *Golf Digest* as one of the 75 best public courses in the United States. It has played host to such tournaments as the Men's and Women's Golf Association Championships.

Terre Haute has several points of interest, including historical landmarks and museums, plus a planetarium. Of particular interest are the Children's Science and Technology Museum, the Historical Museum of the Wabash Valley and the Allen Memorial Planetarium, along with the well-known Farrington's Grove Historical District.

In addition to Indiana State, Terre Haute is home to four other higher



education institutions. The Indiana Vocational Technical College is one of 22 instructional centers in the state and the Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology is one of the oldest private engineering and science colleges in the United States. Now in its second sesquicentennial, St. Mary-of-the-Woods College offers more than 25 majors including journalism, biology, marketing and gerontology. The Woods was founded by French nuns in 1840. The Indiana Business College offers associate degrees in accounting, secretarial and business management, and office specialist.

The history of Terre Haute, like that of any other Indiana community, can be traced through its roads, waterways, people, and natural resources. The city is built on a high bluff on the east bank of the Wabash River. The 18th-century French maps called this location "terre haute," meaning "high land."

A variety of national figures have called Terre Haute their home, among them Eugene V. Debs, early labor leader and five-time presidential candidate; Paul Dresser, composer of the Indiana state song, "On the Banks of the Wabash;" his brother, Theodore Dreiser, who wrote "An American

Tragedy" and other early 20th-century novels; poet Max Ehrmann, best known for his work "Desiderata;" Edward James Royce, who became the fifth president of Liberia; and actor-musician Scatman Crothers. Tony Hulman, Jr., had a powerful impact on the Terre Haute community. Hulman, who owned and operated the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, became famous for the words, "Gentleman, start your engines," which opens the race each May.

Terre Haute has also seen its share of quality athletes and coaches, including basketball's Larry Bird, John Wooden, Clyde Lovellette and Bobby Leonard; baseball's "Three-Fingered" Mordacai Brown, Tommy John and Dizzy Trout; and Olympians Greg Bell (track), Kurt Thomas (gymnastics), and Bruce Baumgartner (wrestling).

## ISU ATHLETIC TRADITION

The ISU Athletic Tradition is rich and full of spectacular moments from John Wooden's great basketball teams of the late 1940s to Bruce Baumgartner's Olympic wrestling heroics of the 1980s, and don't forget Larry Bird! These three names

along with hundreds of others have helped form the memorable tradition of Sycamore Athletics.

The origins of the athletic department at ISU can be traced back to the turn of the century when the school was called Indiana State Normal School. Arthur Westphal (1912-17) and Birch E. Bayh (1917-23) have been given the majority of credit for establishing the administrative framework for



athletic programs at ISU to emerge competitively on the intercollegiate level. Arthur Strum was appointed head of the Men's Physical Training Department as well as "Coach" and Director of Athletics in 1923. His charge was to establish intercollegiate teams in football, basketball, baseball, and track. Men's tennis, golf and a women's varsity basketball program were introduced at this time as well.

From these modest beginnings, the athletic program has grown to what we know it as today—an NCAA Division I program offering programs in men's and women's basketball, football, baseball, softball, volleyball, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's cross country, and men's and women's indoor/outdoor track and field.

The success of the ISU programs has been consistent, but perhaps

the most memorable time period came about in the late 1970s and early 1980s when Sycamore athletics clearly reached its zenith. 1979 will always be a year talked about in Sycamore athletic lore. But that year offered more than Larry Bird's march to the Final Four and eventual runner-up finish in the NCAA basketball tournament. The Sycamores also boasted the leading hitter in Division I baseball, in Wally Johnson. The Sycamore football team posted an 8-3 record, and Kurt Thomas was ranked No. 1 in the world among male gymnasts. The early 1980s brought about heavyweight Bruce Baumgartner's reign as the No. 1 heavyweight wrestler in the country. The women's basketball team boasted the high-scoring efforts of Barbara Graves, later a finalist for the Harlem Globetrotters. Benita Edds made the U.S. Olympic Archery team during this era.

The Sycamore baseball program was also churning out pro prospects like Zane Smith, Dick Grapenthin, Bill Hayes, Tim Barrett, Brian Dorsett, and Greg Baker. The football program continued its success with back-to-back 9-4 and 9-3 seasons, consecutive trips to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs, and a No. 1 regular season ranking in 1984.

The tradition is rich and deep-rooted as the Sycamores roll toward the 21st century.
