Sycamore Radio Network. All football and men's basketball games will be aired this season on WTHI-AM (1480) and WSDM-FM (97.7).

The broadcasts will begin with a 20 minute pre-game show featuring an interview with the head coach and following the broadcast will be a post-game show, including an interview with a member of the coaching staff.

The network will also carry a weekly half-hour talk show during both football and basketball season. The day and time of the show will be announced at a later date.

WTHI Sports Director and ISU alumnus John Sherman will begin his first season as the "Voice of the Sycamores". He will handle the play-by-play duties for all broadcasts and serve as host for the weekly talk shows. Sherman will be joined by Sports Information Director Eric Ruden as the color commentator.

ISU continues its long association with WTHI Radio and Wabash Valley Broadcasting. Sycamore football and basketball games have been exclusively on WTHI for the last two years and more than 40 of the last 45 seasons. WSDM "Wisdom 98" begins a new relationship with ISU Athletics by carrying football and men's basketball. WSDM has broadcast ISU baseball for the last two years.

MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS . . .

Requests for working press credentials at Indiana State home games should be made on company letterhead to Eric Ruden in the ISU Sports Information Office. Credentials will be mailed if at all possible. Otherwise, they will be left at the Will Call Booth, which is located directly east of the main archway entrance. Credentials must be made visible at all times for proper identification by Indiana State security personnel. Photographers are asked to wear armbands when working the sideline and follow the established NCAA guidelines marked around the field. Armbands may be picked up in the press box approximately one hour before kickoff. Because of the demand for credentials and the limited space available, media agencies covering the visiting school on a regular basis receive top priority. All other credentials for print media are issued on a basis of circulation. Only local radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting a daily sports show receive consideration for credentials unless special arrangements are made.

PRESS PARKING . . .

Press parking at Memorial Stadium is located next to the Stadium Golf Course pro shop on Wabash Ave. Your media credential will allow you to park there.

PRESS BOX SERVICES . . .

Programs, flip cards, statistics and notes will be provided before each game. A play-by-play will be distributed at the conclusion of each quarter. Halftime statistics will also be available. Complete team and individual statistics, a scoring summary and coaches' quotes will be provided after the game.

A snack will be served before each game and at halftime behind the main working press area. Soft drinks will be available throughout the game.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS . . .

All post-game interviews will be held in the 200 Club Room located beneath the press box. Coach Dennis Raetz and requested players will be made available at this time to the media. The visiting coach and requested players will also be asked to participate in this media session.

RADIO . . .

Radio contract requests and information should be directed to the Indiana State Sports Information Office. Stations designated as "official" by visiting opponents will be provided a courtesy telephone line in a designated press box booth. All other stations requesting broadcast space must pay a fee of \$50 to Indiana State University and will be accommodated on the roof of the press box.

PLAYER INTERVIEW POLICY . . .

All requests for player interviews must be made through the Sports Information Office. Players have been instructed to conduct no interviews unless they have been set up in this manner. The interviews will generally be conducted before or after practice at the Stadium. Requests for telephone interviews will be handled by players returning phone calls to the media. No home numbers for players will be given out.

INTERVIEWS WITH COACH DENNIS RAETZ . . .

Interviews with Coach Dennis Raetz can be set up through the Sports Information Office or by calling his office directly at 812/237-4074. The best time to reach Coach Raetz is between 11 a.m. and noon Monday thru Thursday. Meetings are conducted during the morning, but he can return a phone call if he's not available.

The 1994 season is an historic one for the Gateway as the league celebrates its 10th anniversary of NCAA I-AA football.

The original Gateway Conference was founded as a women's athletic organization in August, 1982, following the dissolution of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. In September of that year, Patty Viverito was named the first commissioner of the newly founded conference, a position she maintains today.

In July of 1992, the 10-team Gateway Conference disbanded as its women's programs realigned with their men's teams in their respective conferences. The league assumed its new name on July 1, 1992, becoming the Gateway Football Conference, an NCAA I-AA football league comprised of seven Midwest institutions.

The Gateway Football Conference was born on August 21, 1985, when the Gateway Conference President's Council voted to add a I-AA football division for six of its members to the previously all-women's athletic organization. The creation of the Gateway football division marked the first time in college annals that football was added to a women's conference.

Founding members of the football division were Eastern Illinois, Illinois State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri State and Western Illinois. In June of 1986, Indiana State University became the seventh member of the Gateway Football Conference.

Gateway Conference football quickly became a force on the NCAA I-AA scene. The strength of the new league was

confirmed in July of 1986 when the NCAA I-AA Football Committee voted to waive the league's two-year waiting period and grant the Gateway an automatic bid to the national playoffs after just one season of play.

The nine seasons of Gateway football have been marked by continual successes. Last season, Northern Iowa represented the league in the playoffs, losing at Boston



University in double overtime in a first-round game. Northern Iowa advanced to the I-AA semifinals in 1985, 1987, and 1992, falling by a touchdown or less to the eventual national champions in 1985 and 1987. Eastern Illinois has reached the quarterfinals twice and Southwest Missouri State has done it once. Six of the seven league schools have been to the playoffs since 1982.

The Gateway continues to be one of the best I-AA conferences in the nation as it plays one of the most difficult non-league slates in the country. Last season, the league compiled a 14-22 non-conference record, but 10 of those games were against I-A schools on the road. League member Illinois State defeated the top-ranked team and eventual champion (Youngstown State)

and No. 2 team (McNeese State) when it played them in Normal, IL. Indiana State boasted an impressive win against then 18th-ranked Western Kentucky.

Historically, the Gateway has been among the elite in I-AA. In 1991, the Gateway Conference was perhaps at its greatest as, for the third straight year, two Gateway Conference teams advanced to the I-AA playoffs. And the league compiled the best non-conference record in all of I-AA football at 24-12-2--the second-best in Gateway history, trailing only a 24-12-1 mark in its first year in 1985.

The Gateway retains its automatic berth into the NCAA I-AA playoffs in 1994, joining five other conferences that receive automatic bids. Those include the Big Sky Conference, the Ohio Valley Conference, the Southern Conference, the Southland Conference, and the Yankee Conference. The Gateway and Yankee Conference are the only NCAA I conferences that will sponsor I-AA football as its only sport.

Although the league completed its service to women's athletics at the end of 1991-92, the Gateway has an historical place in the development of intercollegiate athletics for women.

The 10 founders of the original Gateway currently belong to two conferences. Eight members joined their men's programs in the Missouri Valley Conference: Bradley, Drake, Illinois State, Indiana State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri State, and Wichita State. Two members, Eastern Illinois and Western Illinois, compete in the Mid-Continent Conference.

TRAVEL PLANS . . .

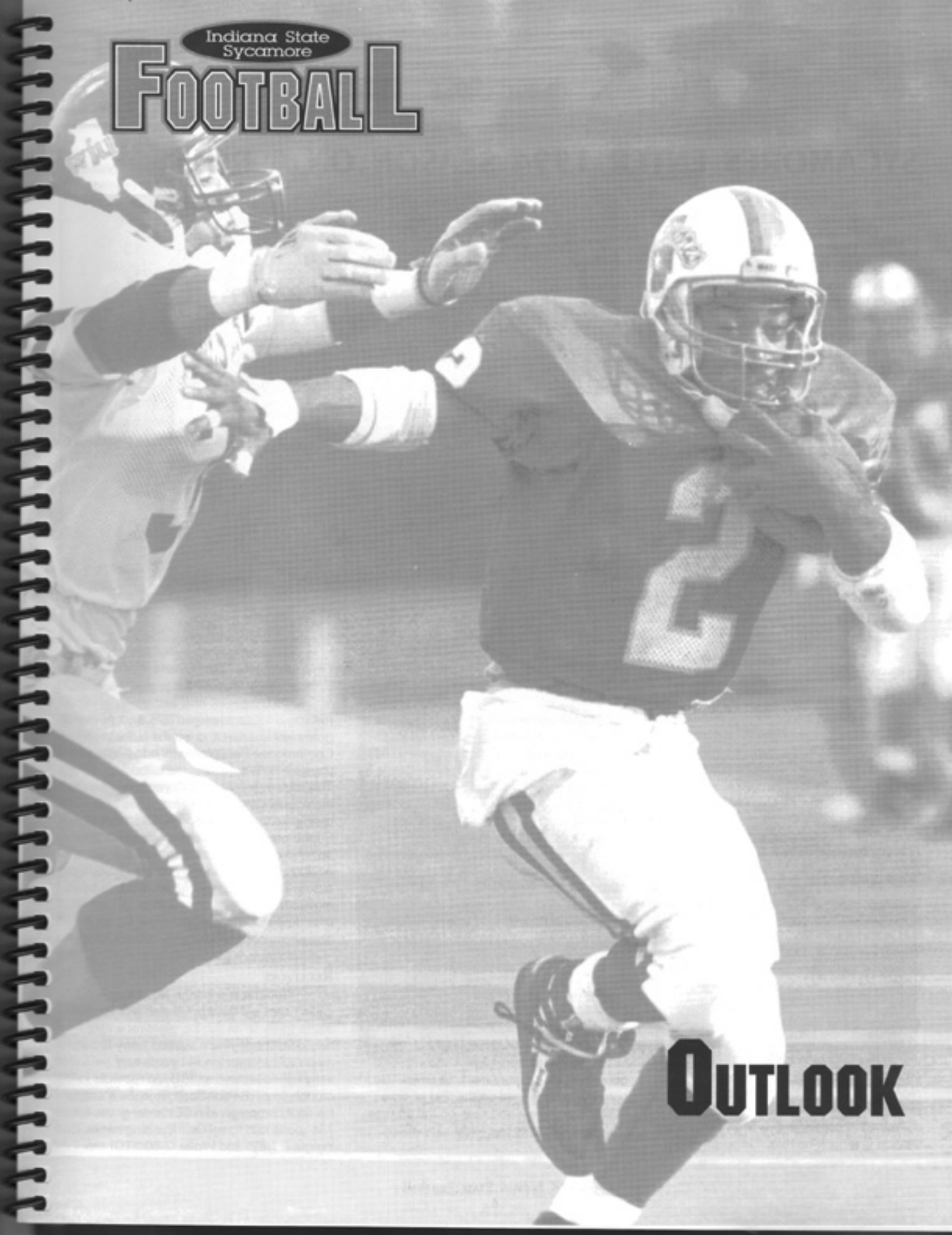

SYCAMORES ENTER 1994 SEASON ON A ROLL

The 1993 Indiana State football team finished the season on a two-game winning streak and knocked Western Illinois out of first place in the Gateway Conference on the last day of the regular season with a 16-6 season-ending victory. The Sycamores hope to take that momentum into the 1994 campaign.

Coach Dennis Raetz is blessed with 15 returning starters (5 offense/10 defense) and specialists Tom Allison (kicker) and Jay Gerth (punter). The biggest losses the Sycamores suffered came in three-year starting quarterback Kip Hennelly and four starting offensive linemen.

A stingy defense and an efficient offense could be the keys for Raetz and Co. as they look for a winning season. This year's schedule has just one Division I-A foe as compared to last year's trips to Air Force and Minnesota, while it does boast contests against I-AA defending national champion Youngstown State and top twenty-five ranked Western Kentucky.

"I think we will be better defensively and we need to fill some holes in the line offensively," said Raetz.

OFFENSE**Offensive Line**

This area is one of the biggest question marks for the Sycamores as they enter fall drills. ISU loses All-America guard Shawn Moore, Buffalo Bills free agent signee center John Bock, along with tackle Tim Giebels and guard Darnell Richardson. Senior tackle Tim Herrin is the lone returning starter on the line. Junior college transfer Jason Franklin had a good spring and has stepped into one of the guard spots along with veteran Pat Kneller. Kyle Rizzo saw playing time last year in a back-up role and will have the opportunity to earn a starting spot at left tackle and Aaron Stidham will fill the center void. Raasaan Baskerville has moved from defensive tackle to guard and will add depth to the line.

Quarterback

Tom Cerasani, a transfer from Wisconsin, will be the Sycamores' No. 1 quarterback entering fall practice, but is expected to receive stiff competition from senior Chad Distler and sophomore Kevin Cox. The trio combined to complete five of 14 passes last season in a back-up role. Cerasani offers

the offense some similar traits to that of his predecessor--Hennelly. He rushed for 55 yards in eight attempts last season. Distler is known for his passing skills and Cox is a promising youngster that could be ISU's quarterback of the future. Raetz is looking for efficiency from his offense and that begins with the signal-calling spot. "Cerasani is slightly ahead of the other two and will enter the fall as our No. 1, but it's not over," said Raetz. "All of them have their moments. We need to be able to throw the ball better and that is something we spent a lot of time with in spring practice," said Raetz.

Running Back

Any talk about ISU's offense must begin with All-America tailback David Wright. The junior has rushed for 2,575 yards in the last two seasons, scored 17 touchdowns, and gone over the century mark 13 times. He currently stands third on the ISU all-time career rushing list and sixth on the all-time Gateway Conference charts. The ISU

rushing offense averaged 225.6 yards per game last season and led the Gateway Conference. Ben Wolfe will return to pave the way for Wright from his fullback position. The rookie rushed for 213 yards and scored eight touchdowns last season. He is a candidate for postseason honors as well. Sophomore Adam Evans made the position switch from wide receiver to tailback, a position he played in high school, in spring practice, while Charles Alexander has been moved from inside linebacker to fullback to provide depth at this spot. Mike Barwick had an impressive spring at fullback as well.

Receivers

Whoever wins the No. 1 signal-calling spot will have a full stable of receivers to throw to as the top eight receivers return from last year's squad. Larry Brown made 27 catches for 344 yards and established himself as ISU top receiver in crunch-time. Senior Scott Crenshaw enters his final campaign with 56 career grabs for 731 yards and four TDs. Running backs Wright (11/62) and Wolfe (7/60/2TD) are



backfield. Sophomore Micah Reid showed the ability to make the big catch in his rookie season and can utilize his 6-2 frame and leaping ability to go up and get the ball. All three receivers have the skills to stretch the defense and make the long reception.

Larry Gauer could emerge as a force at tight end with starting experience under his belt. The Terre Haute native made three catches for 43 yards last season and improved his blocking skills. He will be backed up by Richard Madura and Tim Stuck. Prentice Henderson, a former fullback, will line up at tight end in the fall with hopes of using his blocking skills in two tight end alignments.

DEFENSE

The most improved area of play for last year's team was the defensive unit. Ten starters return from a squad that led the Gateway Conference in turnover differential and allowed a total of 12 points in the last two games of the 1993 season. Raetz will look to the defensive side of the ball to anchor the 1994 squad.

DEFENSIVE LINE

The key to any good defense starts up front. The Sycamores boast one of the top defensive fronts in the league, led by All-Gateway performer Dan Brandenburg at defensive tackle. The fleet-footed pass rusher was a menace to opposing quarterbacks throughout the season. He recorded a school record 13 sacks in 1993 and was the squad's second leading-tackler with 66. Nose guard Dustin Rusch registered ten tackles for loss and was among the league's best at stuffing the run. The other tackle spot will be manned by Torren White, a part-time starter. West Terre Haute native Mike Likens had a good spring before injuring his hand, but is ready for a big season. Matt Egloff makes the switch from inside linebacker to rush end where he hopes to make a similar transition that Doug Puryear made last year so successfully.

LINEBACKERS

The inside linebacker slots are filled with returnees Mike Nelson and Richard Moss. Moss led the team in tackles as a freshman with 113 and picked off two passes. Bobby Holmberg adds depth to this position and saw considerable action last season in a back-up role. Navy transfer Chris Libaire is

a bit of an unknown commodity. He did not participate in spring practice, but could have an impact in this area. Damani Dickerson, Jack Hendershot and Fred Hunt bring a wealth of starting experience to the alley positions. Hendershot and Hunt will vie for the starting strong safety spot.

SECONDARY

The secondary was much improved last season and young. The 1994 team should benefit from the experience first-year players Dre Knox, Larry Scally, and Shad Morgan gained last season. Knox joined strong safety Fred Hunt leading the squad in interceptions. Scally and Knox enter the fall as starting cornerbacks, while redshirt freshman Robert High and Morgan will battle for the free safety spot. The Sy-

camores will be young in the secondary, but athletic as James Sleet and Danny Allen will provide depth.

KICKING GAME

Kicker Tom Allison and punter Jay Gerth were both pleasant surprises last season as Gerth earned second team all-league honors and Allison was a steady performer. Both return this season as the kicking game is in capable hands. ISU did not fare as well in the punt return and kick return facets of special teams as it has in the past. Some of this was due to the fact that David Wright's injuries kept him off the kick return team for much of the season. Larry Brown paced the squad in kick returns with 18 for 403 yards. Scott Crenshaw returned eight punts for 126

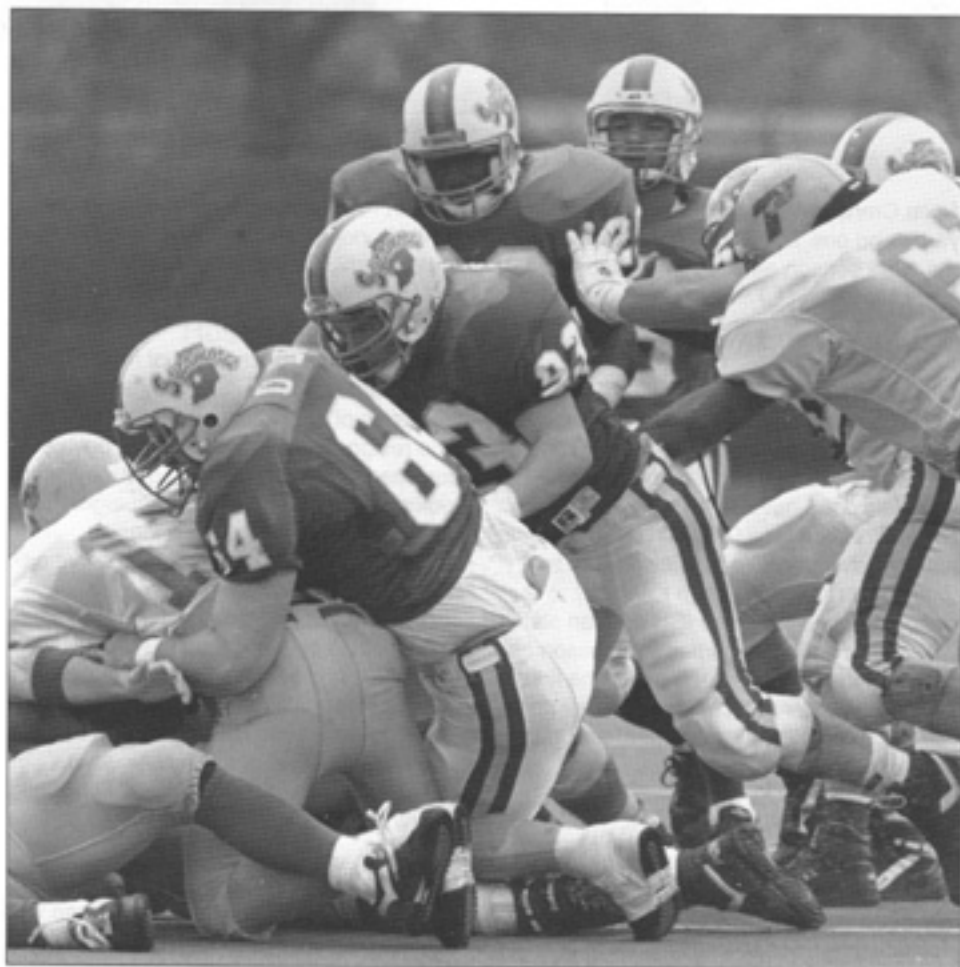

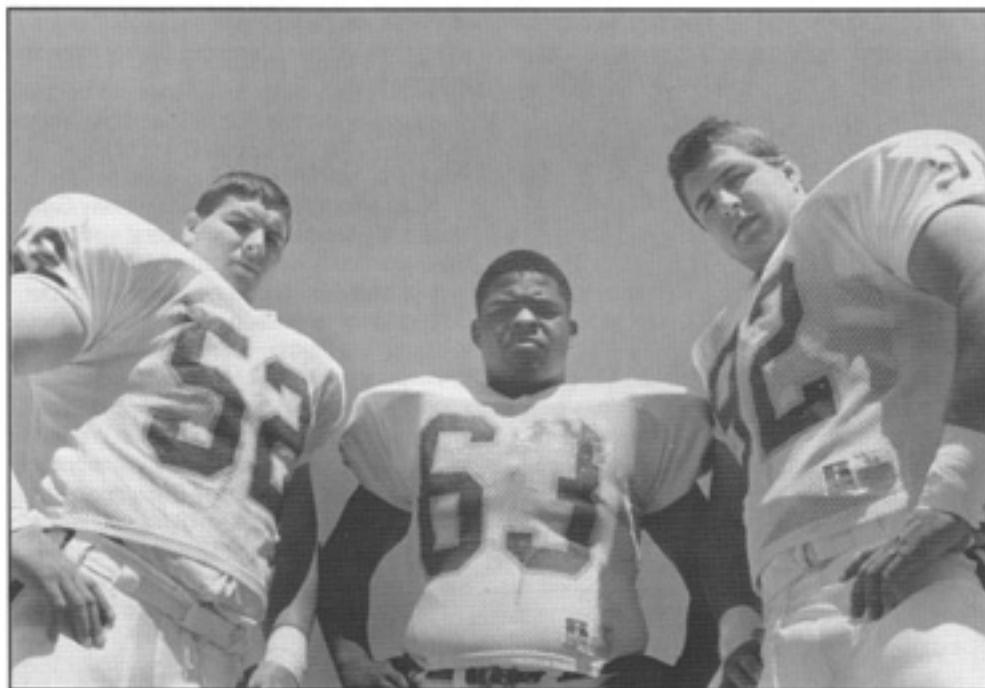

The Sycamores are not short on big guys this season as senior offensive tackle **Tim Herrin (52)**, senior defensive tackle **Torren White (63)**, and senior nose guard **Dustin Rusch (92)** can attest. Herrin is the only returning starter on the offensive line. White and Rusch will anchor the defensive line along with Dan Brandenburg.

Scott Crenshaw returned eight punts for 126 yards and one TD. Both players return for the 1994 season as does long snapper Terry Moore.

Schedule

The 1994 schedule is a little more in the Sycamores favor than last season's rigorous slate. After opening at Division I-A Toledo, ISU will play four straight home games. The schedule does have some teeth in it as the Sycamores will face Division I-AA defending national champion Youngstown State and top twenty ranked Western Kentucky in nonconference tilts. The ISU gridiron slate will feature six home games this season as opposed to five last year. Four of the first five contests will be at Memorial Stadium as the Sycamores finish with four of six on the road.

GATEWAY CONFERENCE

Northern Iowa has to be considered the favorite as the Panthers have claimed the last three conference crowns. Illinois State posted upsets of national champion Youngstown State and top ten squad McNeese State last season. The Redbirds could be ready to make some noise in the Gateway along with always tough Southwest Missouri State. The premier confer-

ence in I-AA football is always tough and tightly bunched which makes the predicted order of finish anyone's guess.

STAFF CHANGES

Raetz will have the majority of his coaching staff returning for the 1994 season with the exception of offensive coordinator Dan Ritter who resigned in January to enter private business in Florida, and Craig Bundy, who took a high school job in Champaign, IL. Marty Fine moves into the offensive coordinator position and will also serve as line coach. Tim McGuire returns for his second campaign as defensive coordinator and is joined by Mark Smith as defensive line coach and Mike Williams as linebackers coach. Raetz will have four restricted earnings assistants in Doug Dutton (defensive line), Tim Giebels (offensive line), Darryl Jackson (secondary), and David Nicol (running backs).

OVERALL

The Sycamores enter the 1994 season with a feeling of confidence coming from last year's strong finish. The 1993 team was extremely young as 19 players saw their first action in an Indiana State uniform. They were in every game and easily could have posted more than four victories. This year

will tell if the squad has benefitted from that valuable experience. The defense is well-tested for the most part and has the potential to be the anchor of this football team. The offense must fill some holes created by graduation, especially at quarterback and in the offensive line. Raetz and staff spent a good portion of spring drills working on improving the passing game and bringing along the offensive line and had these thoughts. "Our priorities offensively will be trying to have a quarterback assert himself in order to produce in the fall, filling the holes in the offensive line, and continuing to work and improve on our ability to throw the football. Defensively, we need to continue to progress and be more physical. We basically have the same group of kids back. We have to get better on special teams, especially in terms of coverage."

GATEWAY Adds OVERTIME

For the first time in league history, the Gateway Football Conference will utilize the NCAA I-AA tie-breaker format to decide the outcome of conference games that are deadlocked after regulation. Gateway coaches voted to add overtimes during their coaches meeting earlier this spring, and league administrators have approved the addition of the overtime period for 1994. The tie-breaker will only be used for league games.

The tie-breaker works as follows:

- 1) In an overtime, one end of the field is used and each team gets an offensive series beginning at the 25-yard line.
- 2) Each team retains the ball during a series until it scores or fails to make a first down. A possession ends on an interception, fumble or unsuccessful field goal try.
- 3) Teams are awarded one time-out per extra period. Timeouts not used during regulation may not be carried over into the overtime. Unused extra-period time-outs may not be carried over to other extra periods.
- 4) The team scoring the greater number of points after the completion of both possessions is the winner. A team may score on defense.
- 5) If, after both possessions, there is no score or the score is tied, there will be subsequent overtime periods until a winner can be declared.
- 6) The final score will be the total of all points scored by each team in regulation and overtime periods.

Five of the six conferences with automatic qualification into the I-AA playoffs will now use overtimes during their league games. Next season, the Gateway, the Big Sky, the Ohio Valley, the Southern and the Yankee conferences will utilize the NCAA I-AA tie-breaker. The lone automatic qualifying conference that does not use the overtime is the Southland.

HEAD COACH
DENNIS RAETZ

The winningest coach in Indiana State history, Dennis Raetz, will return to the gridiron this season for his 15th at the helm of the Sycamore program. Raetz surpassed Wally Marks two seasons ago to become the winningest coach in

school history with his 63rd victory and now holds a record of 72-83-1.

The "Dean of the Gateway Conference" coaches has guided the ISU program to its greatest heights including a No. 1 national ranking during most of the 1984 season and two trips to the NCAA I-AA playoffs. Raetz was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 while also garnering Kodak I-AA District Coach of the Year honors.

Raetz has been a fixture at ISU since 1978 when he came to Terre Haute to serve on Dick Jamieson's staff as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. He remained in that position for two seasons before taking over the top job on February 25, 1980.

A native of North Platte, Nebraska, Raetz attended the University of Nebraska on a football scholarship, but his playing career was cut short by a severe knee injury. Following his college graduation in 1968, he was an assistant coach at North Kansas City High School in Missouri for five seasons before accepting head coaching responsibilities at J.C. Harmon High School in Kansas City, Kansas. In four seasons at Harmon where he coached former Denver Bronco All-Pro cornerback Mark Haynes, Raetz guided his clubs to two conference championships and a 24-13 record.

In 1977, Raetz joined the University of Missouri coaching staff where he worked with the defensive ends in addition to his duties as the junior varsity head coach. It was at Mizzou that he began a working friendship with Jamieson who one year later became the head coach at Indiana State.

Raetz followed Jamieson to ISU and, after the 1979 season, became the school's 15th head coach when Jamieson became an assistant with the NFL's St. Louis Cardinals.

Raetz quickly put his stamp on Indiana State football with a stiff defense and efficient offense. After posting 6-5, 5-5-1, and 5-6 marks in his first three campaigns, Raetz broke through in 1983. The Sycamores got out of the gates quickly with two wins to open the season before making a trip to national power Florida. ISU battled the mighty Gators down to the wire only to fall, 17-13. Raetz' crew finished with a flourish in winning the last three regular season games and earned a Division I-AA playoff berth for the first time in school history. The Sycamores defeated Eastern

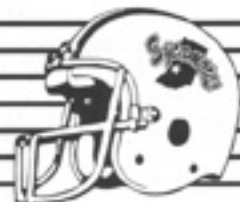
Illinois in the first round and fell to Southern Illinois in the quarterfinals.

State took that momentum gained from the 1983 season and rattled off nine straight victories to start the 1984 campaign and earn a No. 1 national ranking in the I-AA polls. The Sycamore season came to an end in the NCAA playoffs for the second consecutive season, this time dropping a 42-41 decision to Middle Tennessee State in overtime.

Raetz has led the Sycamore football program to two of its three nine-win seasons, the highest victory total in school

history.

In recent years the Sycamores have given several scares to much bigger Division I-A foes, including last year's 27-10 setback at Big Ten foe Minnesota. Perhaps the most memorable near-miss was in 1991 at Kansas State. The Sycamores took a 25-24 lead over their Big Eight Conference opponents with 3:24 to play in the game and set up for a two-point conversion. The two-point pass attempt was intercepted and returned for a two-point defensive conversion and a Kansas State, 26-25, victory.

Perhaps what is even more impressive than Raetz' teams hard-fought battles against Division I-A opposition is that fact that his Sycamores have never lost a contest against a team in a lower classification than I-AA. State will face two of those teams this year in Lock Haven and West Virginia Tech.

Since taking over the reins of the ISU program, Raetz has been instrumental in the development of several standout players including Missouri Valley Conference Defensive Players of the Year Gerry Gluscic (1979), Craig Shaffer (1981), Wayne Davis (1984), and Vencie Glenn (1985); and MVC Offensive Players of the Year Reggie Allen (1979) and Jeff Miller (1984). The Sycamores' 1991 class included Gateway Offensive Player of the Year and All-American Derrick Franklin along with All-American Charles Swann. Running back David Wright earned All-America honors in 1992, while offensive guard Shawn Moore was an All-American selection last fall.

Several of the above mentioned players have gone on to NFL careers. In all, 38 Sycamores have signed NFL contracts under Raetz' tutelage.

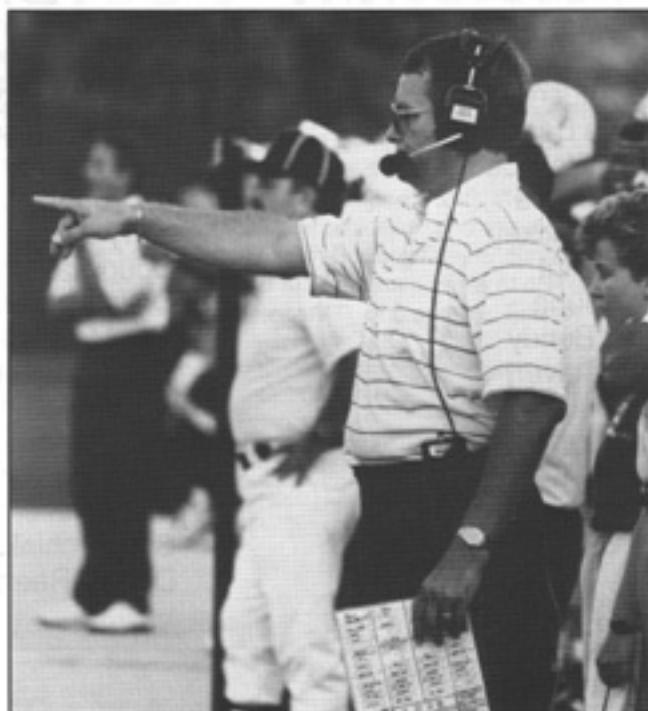
The veteran coach has also been extremely successful at turning out top notch coaches. Former Raetz assistants include Dave McGinnis of the NFL's Chicago Bears, Alvin Reynolds of the NFL's Denver Broncos, Steve Brickley, Pat Henderson and Pete Hoener at Texas Christian University, Bobby Turner at Purdue, Trent Miles at Northern Illinois, Kevin Ramsey at West Virginia, Sean Payton at Miami of Ohio, Dave Magazu at Colorado State, and Bobby Boyce at Southwest Missouri State.

Raetz and his wife Betty reside in nearby Riley with their daughter Jaime (19), a sophomore at the University of Nebraska, and son Mark (16), a multi-sport sophomore athlete at Terre Haute South High School.

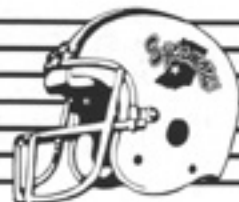

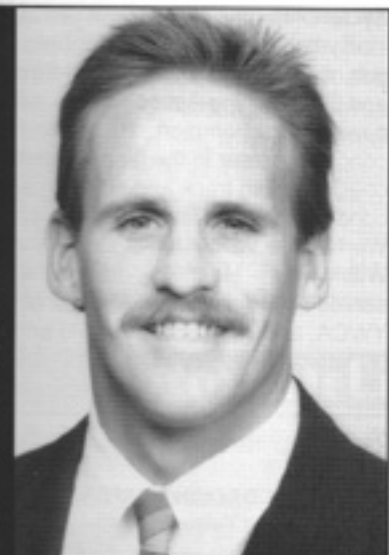

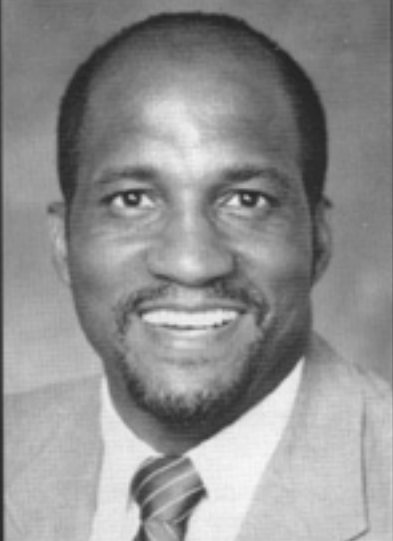

• Expansion of knowledge

ISU will be recognized for the value it places on scholarship and for the support it gives to faculty and students in the pursuit of new knowledge.

• Transfer of knowledge and expertise to society

ISU will be nationally known among progressive public university for its contributions through the development of "public service partnerships" with particular focus on the quality of life in Indiana.

• Enhancement and advocacy of multicultural and international values

ISU will be recognized for its commitment to equal educational opportunity, its ethnic and cultural diversity, and its international perspective.

• Promotion of an interdisciplinary culture

ISU will be known for fostering intellectual and creative activity within the University and in partnership with the larger community.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR BRIAN FAISON



ISU Athletic Director Brian Faison has led a busy and productive six years for the Sycamore Athletics program. Faison has thrown his energies into overseeing facilities improvements, orchestrating major growth in fundraising, and reorganizing the athletic department to insure effective management to move ISU to its goal of success in the Gateway and Missouri Valley Conferences.

Several major facility projects have been initiated and completed during Faison's tenure, including an All-Pro artificial turf at Memorial Stadium, an Omni Turf artificial infield and lights for night baseball at Sycamore Field, a new portable wooden basketball floor at the Hulman Center, renovation and restoration of Marks' Field for Outdoor Track and Field, and the recent improvements at the Price Softball Field.

Contributions have increased dramatically with the Sycamore Varsity Fund setting record athletic annual giving numbers in five of the last six years. In addition, new designated giving programs have also been put into place for men's basketball (Larry Bird's Inner Circle), women's basketball (HoopstHERS), softball (RBI Club), track, volleyball and a baseball

billboard advertising program.

Along with supervising the day-to-day operations of the athletic department, Faison has focused upon reorganization of the department to provide better service for our student-athletes, coaches and supporters.

Faison is active in numerous community fundraising activities. He serves on the Executive Board of the Wabash Valley Council of the Boy Scouts of America, chairs the Council's National Eagle Scout Association, is a member of the Terre Haute Rotary Club, and serves on the Sports Advisory Committee of the Terre Haute Convention and Visitors Bureau.

On the conference level, Faison has served the Missouri Valley Conference as Chair of the Directors of Athletics Committee and the Officiating Committee, while serving on the Championships and Gender Equity Committees. For the Gateway Conference, Faison chaired the Promotions Committee.

On the national level, Faison is the chairman of the R.E. "Bob" Smith Award institutional board of directors. The board plays an active role in the selection of the college baseball player of the year and the national collegiate all-star team.

Faison came to Indiana State from the University of Louisville where he was Assistant Athletic Director for Development and Executive Director of the Cardinal Athletic Fund (1984-88). During his four years at Louisville, annual giving increased from \$560,000 to over \$2.9 million, thirty-four endowed scholarships were estab-

lished, and special designated giving programs were developed for the non-revenue sports. Among his other duties, he served as tournament director for the 1986 and 1987 Metro Conference Basketball Tournaments and the 1987 NCAA Regional Basketball Tournament.

Previously, he served five years as assistant athletic director at Illinois State and had several capacities in the athletic and alumni departments at the University of Missouri, his alma mater.

Brian and his wife, Donna, have three sons, Jonathan (14), Matthew (11), and Bradley (8), and reside in Terre Haute.





ANDI MYERS ASSOC. ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Andi Myers enters her seventh year as associate athletic director/women's senior administrator at Indiana State. Myers is primarily responsible for the day to day operation of all sports and serves as the University's NCAA compliance officer.

She serves on the Missouri Valley Conference's Championships Committee and is the chair of the Gender Equity Committee. Myers is also a member of the NCAA's Committee on Committees for Women's Athletics.

Myers moved into her administrative capacity in April, 1989, after a successful seven-year tenure as Indiana State's women's basketball coach. An Indiana State graduate, Myers led the Sycamores to 40 wins in her final two seasons, including a school-best 22-6 mark in 1988. In that

While at Vincennes, Myers also served as chairperson of HPER and co-ordinator of Women's Athletics.

A native of Dana, Indiana, and a graduate of South Vermillion High School, Myers earned both her bachelor's and master's in physical education from Indiana State. She participated in women's basketball and field hockey and received the Hillman Award as a senior.

ISU ATHLETICS

THE TOTAL PROGRAM

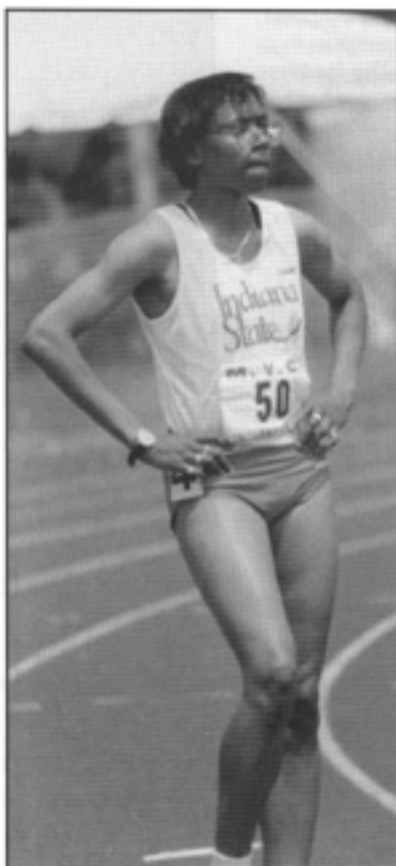
The Indiana State athletic program continues to reach new heights in the 1990s. For the second year in a row, the Sycamores claimed three conference crowns and several individual NCAA titles.

The ISU athletic program consists of football, volleyball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis, and men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field. All Indiana State athletic teams compete on the NCAA Division I level with the exception of football which is Division I-AA. The football program is a member of the Gateway Football Conference and the other programs all compete in the Missouri Valley Conference.

The conference crowns were won by the women's cross country teams, women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams. The Sycamores posted a school record second consecutive first division finish in the Missouri Valley Conference All-Sports Standings in 1993-94.

Senior sprinter Holli Hyche is following in the tradition of ISU's national caliber athletes like Larry Bird, Bruce Baumgartner, and Kurt Thomas by putting the Sycamores in the national spotlight. She won NCAA titles in the 55m and 200m events indoors and was favored to win the 100m and 200m events outdoors, establishing herself as the top collegiate sprinter in the country and one of the best in the world.

Hyche was not the only star the track program produced last season as Steve Parker earned All-America honors in the high jump indoors and seven qualified for NCAA's outdoors. Shawn Moore earned All-

American plaudits in football.

Indiana State has also seen continued improvement in its athletes' academic progress. More than 100 student-athletes posted a 3.0 or better grade point average in the 1993-94 school year and several earned Academic All-Conference and Academic All-American distinction. The football placed 22 of its athletes on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll last spring, while Coach Donna Bonebrake's softball squad had 14 of its team members earn a 3.0 GPA or higher.

The improvement of the Sycamore athletic facilities continues. Softball's Price Field underwent many changes this past year to include bullpens, expanded dugouts, a new drainage system, and renovation of the infield and outfield. ISU will host the 1995 MVC Softball tournament next May. In recent years, the Marks Field track was resurfaced and lights were installed at Sycamore Field

so the baseball team can play night games.

Another improvement this year that will benefit the total athletic program is the renovation of the University School gymnasiums for strength and conditioning purposes. A strength and conditioning coaching position was created and has quickly benefitted the total program.

Many of the improvements in facilities and elsewhere would not be possible without the corporate support from the Terre Haute community. ISU corporate sponsors play a big hand in several different promotions and game-day giveaways. They also lend their support through the three Sycamore summer golf outings.

The combination of support both internally and externally for Sycamore Athletics goes a long way in making ISU Athletics a total program. ISU continues to climb the ladder of success on the playing field and in the classroom as a school to watch in the '90s.

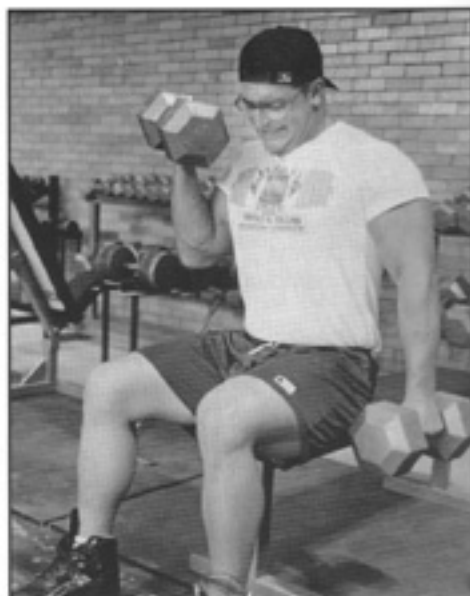
ISU's strength and conditioning program has doubled in size in the last year and added its first-ever full-time strength and conditioning coach. The University Hall on campus houses the Sycamores' strength and conditioning 5,850 square foot facilities. The facility, funded by private donations, is under the supervision of strength and conditioning coach Nick Kyros and assistant Jeff Fryar.

Indiana State's strength and conditioning program is an integral part of a football player's development and is divided into eight week cycles that include a base phase, a strength phase, and a speed and explosion phase. The phases are coordinated between the weight room and what is taking place on the practice field.

"We don't do heavy lifting while we are working on speed and explosion on the field," explains Kyros.

The program also includes agility and running drills that are designed not only to keep the athletes in excellent shape, but also to improve their speed and quickness. The strength room and its equipment are also used in the prevention of injuries.

The University Hall houses rooms for work with free weights and weight machines, as well as areas for exercise bicycles and stairmasters. Renovation is currently underway on locker areas for men and women as well as an athletes' lounge area.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

The Academic Support Program for Athletics, headed by Coordinator of the Athletic Study Center Henry Villegas and under the direction of the Director of Student Academic Services Dr. Cathy Baker, is based upon the belief that the STUDENT in Student-Athlete comes first, and for that reason we have developed a program that insures every student-athlete the best possible opportunity for personal success. The Academic Support Services Program for Athletics provides academic support for all male and female, scholarship and walk-on participants on all 14 Intercollegiate Athletic teams, approximately 350 students per year. The goals of the program are as follows:

GOALS

- To enhance the academic performance of student athletes.
- To help student athletes make normal progress toward graduation.
- To assist freshmen student athletes in making a successful transition to college life.
- To assist student-athletes in managing the demands of participating in Intercollegiate Athletics.
- To provide student athletes with the means to assume responsibility for their education.
- To help student-athletes bridge the gap from college life to professional life through the Life Skills program.

The Academic Support Program for Athletics has adopted a pro-active approach to academics in order to prepare the student for the many challenges associated with balancing both academics and athletics. Beginning with the Athletic Department Orientation and Study Skills Class, student-athletes are provided with a wealth of information and strategies for success during their first team at Indiana State. The class, teamed with study halls, tutoring, small study groups, and periodic progress monitoring, helps to ensure that each and every student-athlete at Indiana State has the best possible opportunity for both personal and academic success.

The Academic Support Program has been able to make continuous gains in the level of academic achievement in the percentage of scholar athletes compiling a 3.0 grade point average or better. Each semester at least 30 percent of our student-athletes achieve a 3.0 GPA, earning a spot on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll. Coaching staffs, administration, faculty, and the university community have all

been very supportive of our efforts as we assist student-athletes work toward that ever important goal of gaining a college degree.

Lessons learned through the academic advisement program have proved extremely valuable to several members of the ISU football program. In 1991, Eric Christensen earned GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American honors while current Sycamore Fred Hunt and Chad Distler were named GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-District last year.

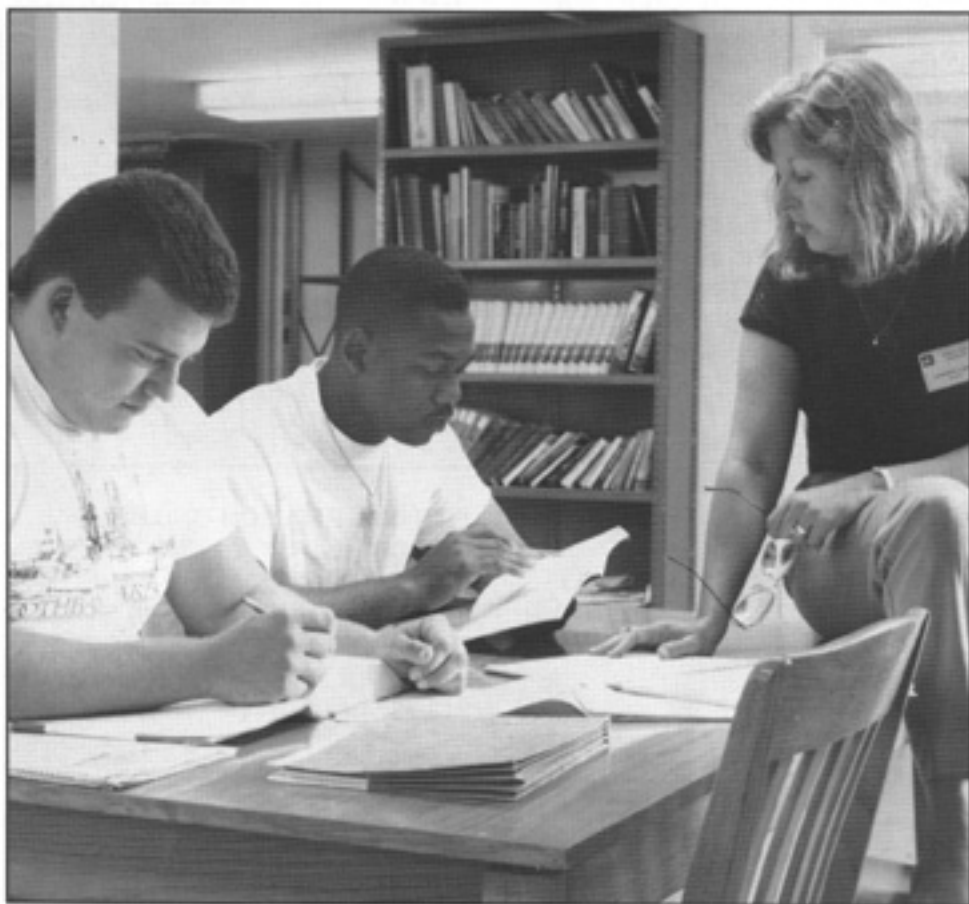

'93 IN REVIEW

SYCAMORES FINISH SEASON ON A TWO-GAME WINNING STREAK

The Indiana State football team ended its 1993 season with a 16-6 upset of Western Illinois to finish with a 4-7 overall record and 2-4 in Gateway Conference play. The victory was the Sycamores' second straight and marked the first time since 1989 that ISU finished the season with a winning streak.

Indiana State faced the toughest schedule in school history during the 1993 season that included games at Air Force, Minnesota, Southwest Missouri State, Northern Iowa, and Youngstown State. Coach Dennis Raetz felt that the final record was not indicative of how well his team played throughout the season. "We're a lot closer to being an awfully good football team than we have been for a long time."

Raetz is optimistic for the 1994 because he fielded such a young team in 1993. In the year's first game against Air Force, 19 Sycamores were seeing their first action in an ISU uniform. As is the case with most young teams, they battled hard, but fell short against veteran teams in the end. State dropped games by narrow margins at Minnesota, Southwest Missouri State, Northern Iowa, and Youngstown State.

The biggest win of the season was a 41-14 Homecoming thrashing of then 18th-ranked Western Kentucky. The Sycamores played the complete game in pulling off the upset.

One of the most impressive components of this young squad was its resiliency. Despite playing five of its first six games on the road, they continued to play hard right until the final gun sounded. Defeats at Minnesota, Southwest Missouri State, Northern Iowa, and Youngstown State easily could have gone the other way. But time and time gain Raetz and staff had the Sycamores regrouped and ready to play the next week.

Several Sycamores turned in outstanding individual performances. Sophomore tailback David Wright (Harvey, IL/Thornton) went over the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the second straight year with 1,262 yards and finished second in the conference and 17th in I-AA with a 114.7-yard average per game. He had six games over 100-yards to give him 13 on his career. He has 2,575 career rushing yards to rank third in school history. The ISU rushing attack led the

league with a 225.6-yard average and ranked 18th in I-AA. It was the first time in league history that someone other than Southwest Missouri led the league in rushing. State also shared the league lead in turnover differential with a +.64 per game.

Senior quarterback Kip Hennelly (Woodridge, IL/Downers Grove S./DuPage CC) broke his own school record with 532 rushing yards by a signal-caller. The three-year starter finished his ISU career with 4,615 yards (3,160 passing/1,455) in total offense to rank fourth in school history and his 3,160 passing yards rank him fourth on the charts. His 1,455 rushing yards put him in tenth place on the school's career rushing list.

Sophomore defensive tackle Dan Brandenburg set a school record with 13 sacks and recorded three apiece in three different outings. Redshirt freshman punter Jay Gerth (Seymour, IN) won the Gateway Conference punting title with an average of 39.7 yards per boot. He had 43 punts for 1,709 yards with a long of 54. His average ranked him 22nd in I-AA.

Several Sycamores gathered postseason honors. Senior offensive guard Shawn Moore led the way as he was named first team All-American by Kodak and the American Football Coaches Association. Tailback David Wright,

defensive tackle Dan Brandenburg, offensive tackle Tim Giebels, offensive guard Shawn Moore, and free safety Von Ganaway were first team All-Gateway Conference selections, while punter Jay Gerth was named to the second team, and quarterback Kip Hennelly and center John Bock were tabbed honorable mention.

Coach Dennis Raetz will return 16 (5 offense, 9 defense, both kickers) starters for the 1994 season as the Sycamores will open play on Sept. 3 at Toledo.

Despite the 16 starters that return, Raetz will have some holes to fill. Four-year starting defensive back Von Ganaway leaves with his name dotting the school record books. He holds ISU marks for career punt returns, return yardage, and average return. Offensively quarterback Kip Hennelly has graduated and three-year starting tight end Kirk Christensen finished his collegiate career. The offensive line will also miss the services of guards Shawn Moore and Darnell Richardson, center Jon Bock and tackle Tim Giebels.

Defensively, several young Sycamores gained valuable experience during the 1993 campaign. First year players Richard Moss, Dre Knox, Larry Scally, and Shad Morgan saw action that should benefit them in preparation for the 1994 season. Offensively, fullback Ben Wolfe, wide receivers Larry Brown and Micah Reid fit into that same category.

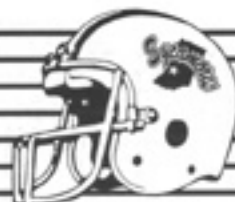

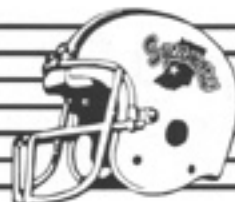

Terre Haute, IN — The Sycamores were again factors in determining the Gateway Conference champion. The visiting Leathernecks needed only a victory over ISU to win the Conference Championship and earn a berth in the NCAA 1-AA playoffs.

And that just wasn't going to happen!

The Sycamore ground attack rushed for 328 yards on 72 carries, including 160 yards by David Wright and 109 yards by quarterback Kip Hennelly. Hennelly also completed 6-of-8 passes for 58 yards in the final game of his career.

ISU set the tone on defense early as Fred Hunt intercepted a Matt Seman pass on the game's second play. But, Tom Allison missed a 33-yard field goal giving the ball back to WIU.

Four and out was the offensive series by the Leathernecks and ISU took over at its own 41-yard line. ISU went 14 play, 55 yard drive that led to an Allison field goal and a 3-0 lead.

Indiana State made it a 10-0 lead on a one-yard Hennelly touchdown run. That touchdown run capped a 12 play, 80-yard drive that took 4:58 off the clock.

The ISU defense was again brilliant allowing WIU only 88 yards of total offense in the first half. Richard Moss and Dan Brandenburg spearheaded the Sycamore defense. Moss recorded 16 tackles, while Brandenburg had three sacks.

Western turned it up a notch as the second half began. The Leatherneck defense stuffed ISU at the one-yard line on four successive plays and then marched 99 yards on 12 plays for a seven-yard touchdown run by Kendall McDonald. Ross Schulte's PAT kick was no good.

ISU responded with a 76 yard, 17 play drive that salted the game away. Ben Wolfe capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown dive over left tackle. Allison missed the PAT to set the final score.

Standing at its present site since 1924, and acquired by Indiana State University in 1967, Memorial Stadium is the home of Sycamore Football. The 20,500-seat structure is located at the corner of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute.

The stadium has been kept in excellent shape through the years and its latest addition was a \$400,000 All-Pro Turf surface installed prior to the 1989 season.

Memorial Stadium is not new to synthetic surfaces though, as the stadium and ISU claim distinction as the world's first university to own and make outdoor application of Astroturf. Following the University's acquisition of the Stadium, ISU opened the 1967 season with a 41-6 win over Eastern Illinois in the first game played on the new surface. The Astroturf at Memorial Stadium was similar to the indoor turf at the Houston Astrodome which saw the first college game ever played on the artificial surface in 1966 between Houston and Washington State.

Advantages to using synthetic surfaces include durability (some 15 college and high school football games are played on the surface each year in addition to daily ISU practices), a constant surface, and sure footing regardless of weather. The All-Pro Turf is also designed to provide more cushion and reduce injuries.

Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the public for the first time on May 5, 1925 as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria Tractors before an estimated crowd of 9,000. Among the honored guests were Major League Baseball Commissioner Judge Kennesaw Mountain Landis and Charles Barnard of the Cleveland Indians front office.

The first use of the playing field was in the fall of 1924 when Wiley and Garfield High Schools played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.

Original construction of Memorial Stadium was begun in 1922 at a cost of \$450,000. Upon the University gaining control in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included: the re-orientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to its present east-west configuration; the installation of Astroturf; and the construction of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as the rebuilding of seats on the south side.

No one has taken better advantage of Memorial Stadium than current ISU coach Dennis Raetz. His Sycamore teams have

The Sycamores will play three home night games in 1994 against Lock Haven, West Virginia Tech, and Illinois State.

INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY...

Indiana State University, home of the Sycamores, is located in Terre Haute, Indiana (population 60,000), in the heart of mid-America. Its urban campus has been transformed with pedestrian brick walkways and landscaped open areas replacing streets and outdated buildings.

Founded in 1865 as a training school for teachers, ISU enrolled its first 21 students, in 1870. Today — three name changes later — the University offers its 12,000 students more than 200 programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Business; Education; Technology; Graduate Studies; Nursing; and Health, Physical Education and Recreation. Degrees are awarded at associate, baccalaureate, master's, educational specialist and doctoral levels.

In addition, ISU offers a variety of non-credit courses, cultural and recreational opportunities, and diversified workshops, seminars and conferences.

Characterized by small classes, Indiana State has a faculty and staff committed to a personal approach to higher education. And nine out of ten classes are taught by full-time professors.

ISU's 70,000 alumni occupy positions of leadership in education, business, industry, government, and public service.

More than 60 buildings, plazas and walkways comprise the main campus on 90 acres adjacent to the Terre Haute business district. In addition, the University maintains family housing units on a 15-acre site one mile south of the main campus and a 20,500-seat football and athletic facility two miles to the east. The 35-acre river campus located along the Wabash is the site of the University's outstanding baseball program.

Cunningham Memorial Library houses more than 2 million books, periodicals, documents and audiovisual and microfilm items; it also is a government depository containing more than 100,000 government documents. The Rare Books and Special Collections section houses the Eugene V. Debs papers, early Indiana textbooks and one of the largest early dictionary collections in the world. An interlibrary loan service and several database searching units also are available.

Hulman Center, which celebrated its 20th anniversary last year, probably is best known as the arena basketball star Larry Bird played in during his college career.

Hulman Memorial Student Union became the hub of campus upon its completion in 1991. Students gather by the attractive outdoor plaza and its circular fountain. The soothing sounds of cascading water set the tone for the activities that take place in the renovated nine-story building.

Within its walls, the Dede Activity Center provides meeting space as well as recreational and fitness opportunities while a variety of retail

services and food is available in The Commons — from favorite fast-food franchises and sit-down restaurant to a bookstore, copying center and bank.

The original union building (Tirey Hall, built in 1940) continues to be a venue for musical/theatrical attractions but underwent some renovation to also house the offices of Admissions and Financial Aids in 1992. A new wing (Parsons Hall) and adjacent circular structure (Rankin Hall) are home to the central computing facility and several key administrative offices.

Tilson Auditorium, located in Tirey Hall, houses the Terre Haute Symphony Orchestra and the University's Convocation Series, which brings touring Broadway productions and other entertainment to campus. The former union building also has a recital hall which features weekly concerts by University faculty and students.

The New Theater offers a modern "in-the-round" setting for year-round dramatic presentations. ISU's successful SummerStage! program has provided excellent entertainment for 29 years. The Dreiser Theater, located in recently renovated Dreiser Hall, provides a proscenium stage for more traditional performances.

For more than a century and a quarter, Indiana State has played an important role in

Indiana's public service. Today, Indiana State makes a number of contributions to economic development locally, regionally, and nationally.

As a public service, ISU contributes its expertise in various ways.

The Technology Services Center in the School of Technology contracts with small and medium-size manufacturing companies to facilitate technology transfer to increase productivity and improve competitiveness. The Center for Research and Management Services in the School of Business contracts with businesses throughout Indiana to provide targeted industry studies, applied research, consultation and training. A Small Business Development Center is part of the larger center.

The Interdisciplinary Center for Cell Products and Technologies focuses on areas concerned directly with biotechnology, its commercialization, and its social and ethical implications. Research in the center focuses on recombinant DNA, hybridoma technology, biotechnical support, and the adoption of the technologies and products.

Also on campus is the Indiana Institute on Recycling, the country's first state-created institute charged with developing effective voluntary recycling programs.

Terre Haute is the center of the United States. Literally! More than half the population of the United States live within a 500-mile radius of Terre Haute, and the city is circled by a number of metropolitan areas. Indianapolis is only 68 miles away; Louisville, 196 miles; and Chicago, St. Louis and Cincinnati are all within 180 miles.

Terre Haute is located along the western edge of Indiana and is supplied with an efficient network of highways, which have contributed to the city's official designation as the "Crossroads of America."

Terre Haute is a city of 59,196 people, located in West-Central Indiana. Terre Haute has over 1,550 hotel rooms in 200 hotels, 125 or so restaurants, 15 movie screens in five theaters; 90 bowling lanes, 60 tennis courts, approximately 1.8 million volumes of books in five libraries (and the world's largest collection of English language dictionaries), and the nation's first and largest compact disc manufacturing facility.

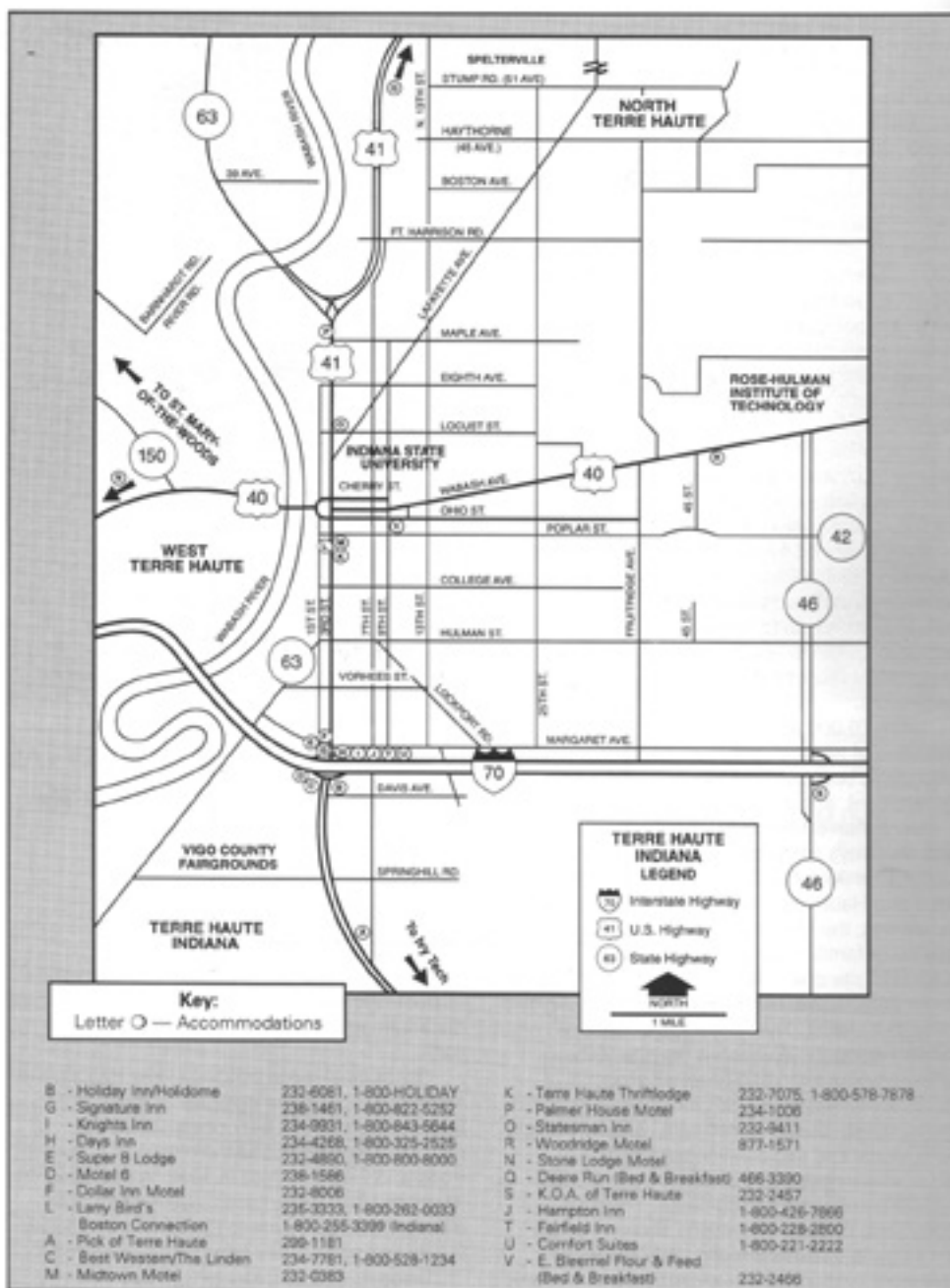
A town for all seasons, Terre Haute is a community with big-city advantages, a small-town touch and a distinct personality. It can be energetic or easy-going. You can dress up for dinner and the symphony or go casual for hot dogs on the grill. Densely forested hills and urban skylines along with gracious old neighborhoods and modern suburbs truly make Terre Haute a city of contrasts.

The Terre Haute and Vigo County parks and recreational facilities offer an array of activities such as swimming, hiking, fishing, boating, golfing, tennis and even ice skating.

Festivals abound in this area, from the city's Ethnic Festival and Vigo County's Pioneer Days to those in the area, including the Parke County Covered Bridge Festival, the Cory Apple Festival, the Fontanet Bean Dinner, and Sullivan's Corn Festival. Terre Haute has several points of interest, including historical landmarks and museums, plus a planetarium. Of particular interest are the Children's Science and Technology Museum, the Historical Museum of the Wabash Valley and the Allen Memorial Planetarium.

In addition to Indiana State, Terre Haute is home to four other higher education institutions--Indiana Vocational Technical College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, St. Mary-of-the-Woods College, and Indiana Business College.

The history of Terre Haute, like that of any other Indiana community, can be traced through its roads, waterways, people, and



natural resources. The city is built on a high bluff on the east bank of the Wabash River. The 18th-century French maps called this location "terre haute," meaning "high land."

A variety of national figures have called Terre Haute their home, among them Eugene V. Debs, early labor leader and five-time presidential candidate; Paul Dresser, composer of the Indiana state song, "On the Banks of the Wabash;" his brother, Theodore Dreiser, who wrote "An American Tragedy" and other early 20th-century novels; poet Max Ehmann, best known for his work "Desiderata;" Edward James Royce,

who became the fifth president of Liberia; and actor-musician Scatman Crothers. Tony Hulman, Jr., had a powerful impact on the Terre Haute community. Hulman owned and operated the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

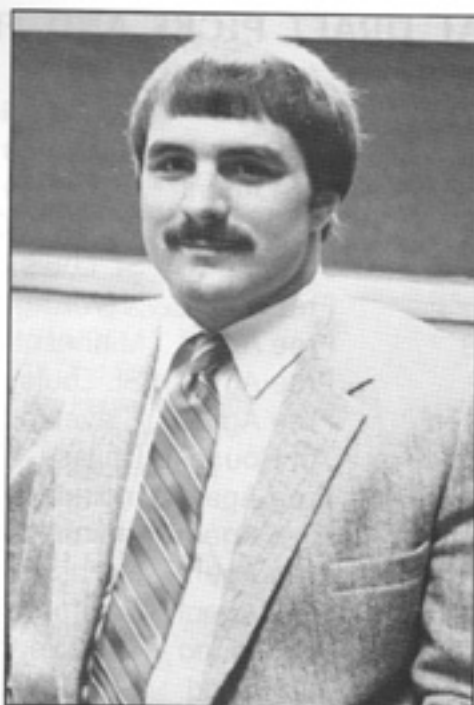
Terre Haute has also seen its share of quality athletes and coaches, including basketball's Larry Bird, John Wooden, Clyde Lovellette and Bobby Leonard; baseball's "Three-Fingered" Mordakai Brown, Tommy John and Dizzy Trout; and Olympians Greg Bell (track), Kurt Thomas (gymnastics), and Bruce Baumgartner (wrestling).

ISU ATHLETIC TRADITION

The ISU Athletic Tradition is rich and full of spectacular moments from John Wooden's great basketball teams of the late 1940s to Bruce Baumgartner's Olympic wrestling heroics of the 1980s, and don't forget Larry Bird! These three names along with hundreds of others have helped form the memorable tradition of Sycamore Athletics.

The origins of the athletic department at ISU can be traced back to the turn of the century when the school was called Indiana State Normal School. Arthur Westphal (1912-17) and Birch E. Bayh (1917-23) have been given the majority of credit for establishing the administrative framework for athletic programs at ISU to emerge competitively on the intercollegiate level. Arthur Strum was appointed head of the Men's Physical Training Department as well as "Coach" and Director of Athletics in 1923. His charge was to establish intercollegiate teams in football, basketball, baseball, and track. Men's tennis, golf and a women's varsity basketball program were introduced at this time as well.

From these modest beginnings, the athletic program has grown to what we know it as today--an NCAA Division I program offering programs in men's and women's basketball, football, baseball, softball, volleyball, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's cross country, and men's and women's indoor/outdoor

track and field.

The success of the ISU programs has been consistent, but perhaps the most memorable time period came about in the late 1970s and early 1980s when Sycamore athletics clearly reached its zenith. 1979 will always be a year talked about in Sycamore athletic lore. But that year

offered more than Larry Bird's march to the Final Four and eventual runner-up finish in the NCAA basketball tournament. The Sycamores also boasted the leading hitter in Division I baseball, in Wally Johnson. The Sycamore football team posted an 8-3 record, and Kurt Thomas was ranked No. 1 in the world among male gymnasts. The early 1980s brought about heavyweight Bruce Baumgartner's reign as the No. 1 heavyweight wrestler in the country. The women's basketball team boasted the high-scoring efforts of Barbara Graves, later a finalist for the Harlem Globetrotters. Benita Edds made the U.S. Olympic Archery team during this era.

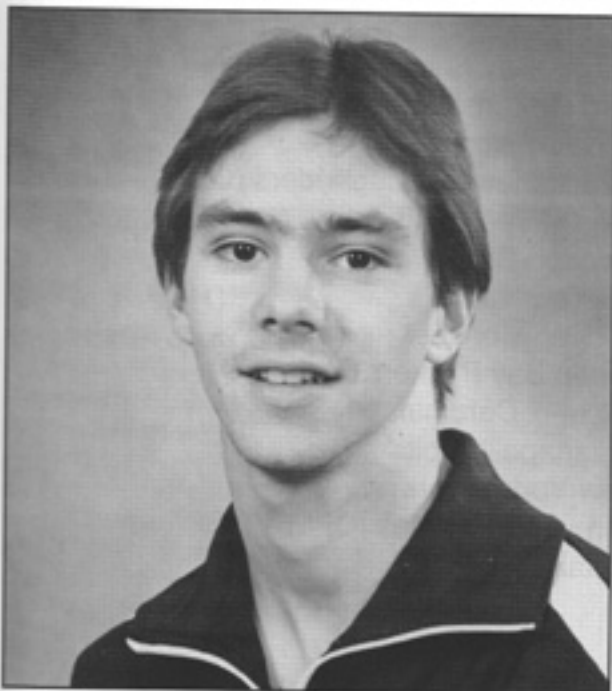

program was also churning out pro prospects like Zane Smith, Dick Grapenthin, Bill Hayes, Tim Barrett, Brian Dorsett, and Greg Baker. The football program continued its success with back-to-back 9-4 and 9-3 seasons, consecutive trips to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs, and a No. 1 regular season ranking in 1984.

The tradition is rich and deep-rooted as the Sycamores roll toward the 21st century.

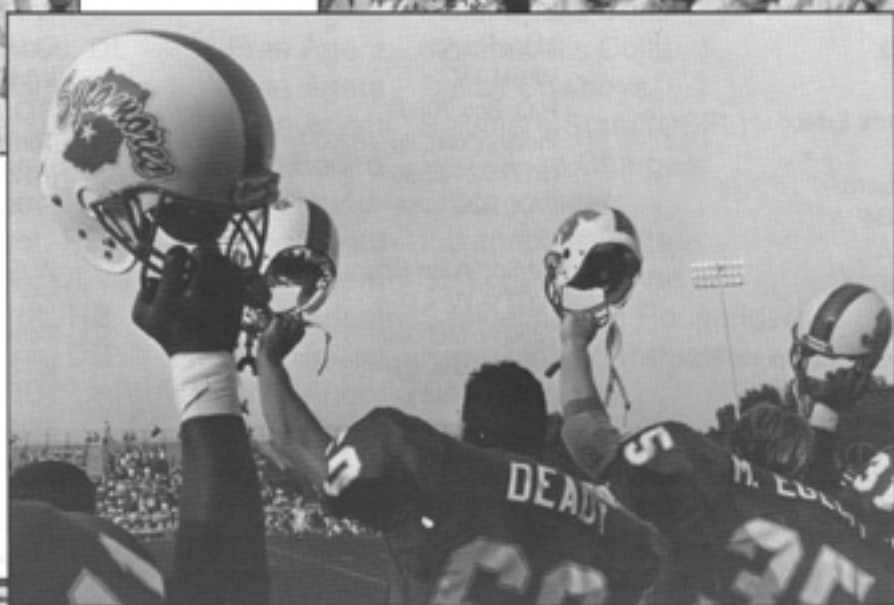

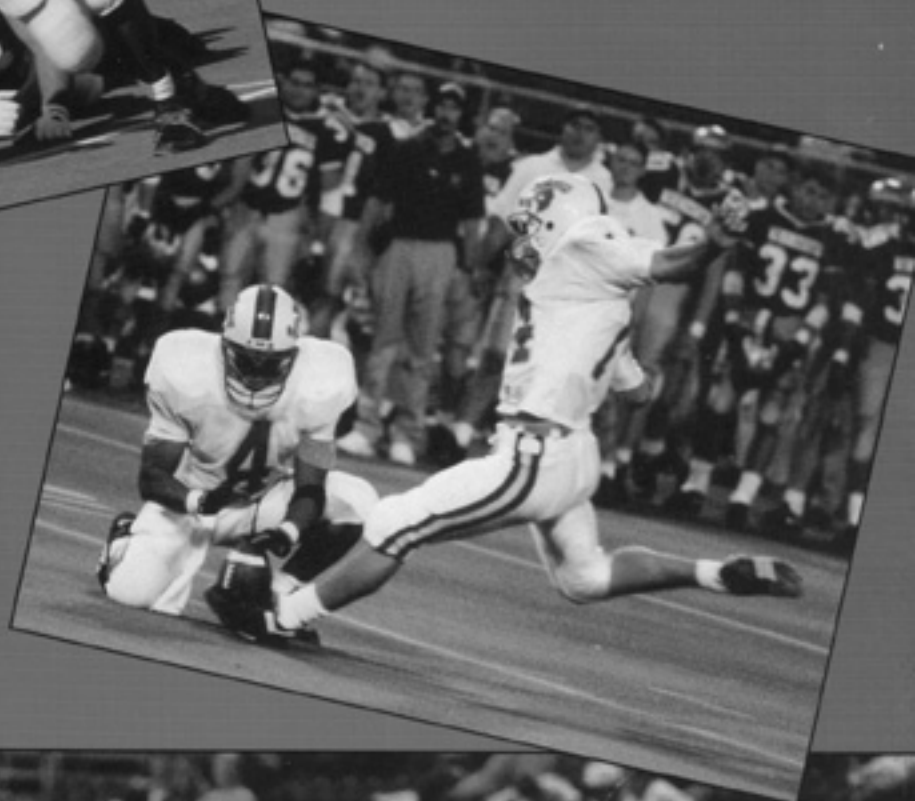
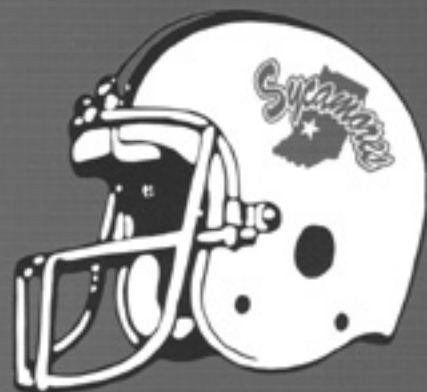
