

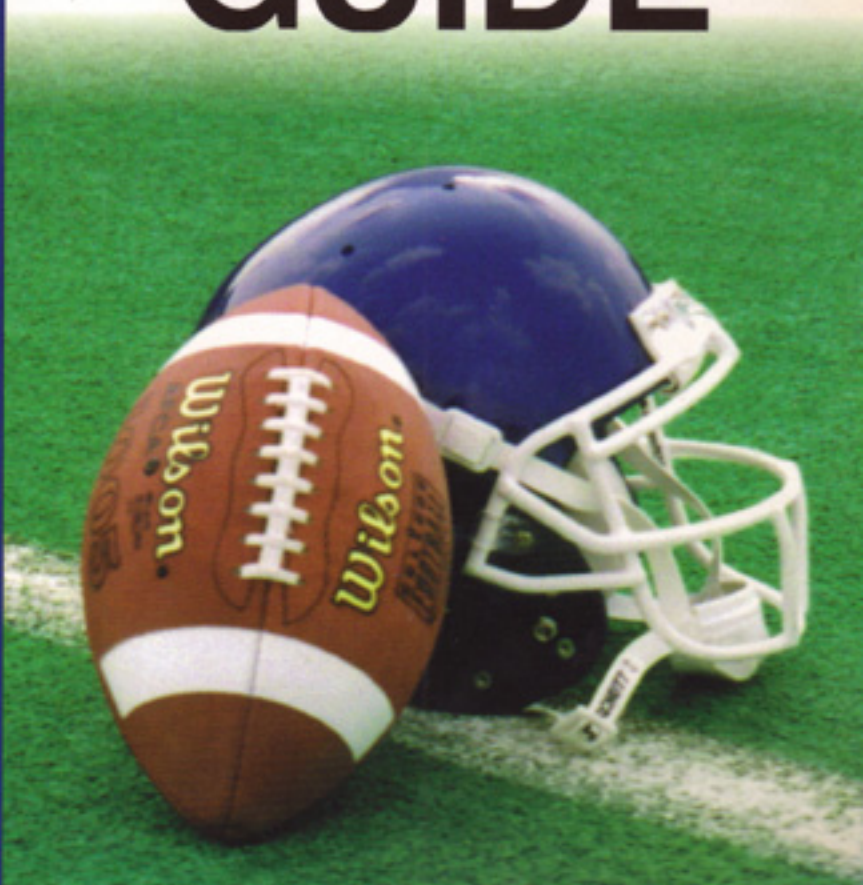

Media Credential Requests:

All requests for working press, radio, television and photographer passes should be made as early as possible to Rob Ervin, Director for Media Relations, Indiana State University, Student Services Building, Room A-15, Terre Haute, IN 47809. Telephone: (812) 237-4160, FAX (812) 237-4157. Media passes allow parking privileges in the south golf course pro shop parking lot on Wabash Avenue. Accredited photographers, with official armbands, are not allowed in the team bench areas in accordance with NCAA regulations. Armbands may be picked up in the press box approximately one hour before kickoff. Media passes will be mailed if possible; otherwise, they will be available at the WILL CALL booth, which is located directly east of the main archway entrance. Media passes must be worn as to be visible at all times for proper identification by Indiana State security personnel.

Radio Information:

Radio contract requests and information should be directed to the Indiana State Athletics Media Relations Office. Stations designated as "official" by visiting opponents will be provided a courtesy telephone line in a designated press box booth.

Press Box:

The press box is located on the south side of Memorial Stadium. It is open and available four hours before kickoff. Telephone lines are available in the press box on a first-come, first-served basis. Game programs, flip cards, statistics, rosters, game notes and other pertinent information will be provided. A light meal will be available to accredited media before each game and at halftime. Soft drinks and coffee will be available throughout the game.

Post-Game Procedure:

Prior to the end of the game, Athletics Media Relations personnel will entertain interview requests. Following a 15-minute cooling off period, head coach Tim McGuire and requested players will be available in the 200 Club Room located beneath the press box at ground level. Visiting coaches and players also will be asked to participate in this media session.

Player Interview Policy:

All requests for player interviews must be made through the Media Relations office. Players have been instructed to conduct no interviews unless they have been set up in this manner. The interviews generally will be conducted before or after practice at Memorial Stadium. Players generally are available throughout the week with the exception of game days.

Interviews with Coach Tim McGuire:

Interviews with Coach Tim McGuire are arranged through the Media Relations Office by calling (812) 237-4160. It is best to arrange an interview during the morning, for this is the best

time of the day for Coach McGuire. If you are unable to speak with Coach McGuire during the mornings, he is available to talk to the media before and after the conclusion of practice at Memorial Stadium.

Gateway Coaches Teleconference:

During the regular season, head coach Tim McGuire and the rest of the Gateway Football Conference head coaches will be available to the media during a conference call. The first such call will be held Wednesday, Sept. 8. The conference begins at 10:00 a.m. (CST). McGuire's slotted time is 10:10 a.m. CST. To access this teleconference, please call (913) 981-5509.

Sycamore Hotline:

The Sycamore Hotline is an audio service that offers daily reports on Sycamore athletic events. Media may call (812) 237-4071 for daily updates on Indiana State athletics.

Sycamores on Teamline:

Indiana State's football games, both home and away, can be heard nationally this season on Teamline. Live radio play-by-play will be available to fans across the country by dialing 1-800-846-4700 and entering the Sycamores' four-digit access code (4780).

Directions to Indiana State University:

From the east: Take Interstate 70 west to the second Terre Haute Exit (U.S. Highway 41). Turn right onto U.S. 41 North and travel approximately three miles and turn right onto Chestnut Street.

From the west: Take Interstate 70 east to the second Terre Haute Exit (U.S. Highway 41). Turn left onto U.S. 41 North and travel approximately three miles and turn right onto Chestnut Street.

Directions to Memorial Stadium:

From the east: Take Interstate 70 west to the first Terre Haute exit (Highway 46). Turn right onto Highway 46 North and travel approximately two miles to Wabash Avenue. Turn left onto Wabash Avenue and travel approximately one mile to Brown Avenue (second stoplight).

From the west: Take Interstate 70 east to the third Terre Haute exit (Highway 46). Follow the directions above.

Indiana State University, home of the Sycamores, is located in Terre Haute, Indiana (population 60,000) in the heart of mid-America. Its urban campus has been transformed with pedestrian brick walkways and landscaped open areas replacing streets and outdated buildings.

Founded in 1865 as a training school for teachers, ISU enrolled its first 21 students in 1870. Today — three name changes later — the University offers its nearly 15,000 full-time and part-time students more than 160 degree programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Business; Education; Technology; Graduate Studies; Nursing; and Health and Human Performance. Degrees are awarded at associate, baccalaureate, masters, educational specialist and doctoral levels.

In addition, ISU offers a variety of non-credit courses, cultural and recreational opportunities, and diversified workshops, seminars and conferences.

Characterized by small classes, Indiana State has a faculty and staff committed to a personal approach to higher education. And full-time professors teach nine out of 10 classes.

ISU's 78,000 alumni occupy positions of leadership in education, business, industry, government and public service.

More than 60 buildings, plazas and walkways comprise the main campus on 90 acres adjacent to the Terre Haute business district. In addition, the University maintains family housing units on a 15-acre site one mile south of the main campus and a 20,500-seat football and athletic facility two miles to the east. The 35-acre river campus located along the Wabash is the site of the University's outstanding baseball program.

Two state-of-the-art facilities — the Center for Performing and Fine Arts and the John T. Myers Technology Center — were recently opened on the continually changing campus. The music building features a rotunda lobby with a 175-seat recital hall, rehearsal rooms, teaching studios and an art gallery. The technology building, with 35 laboratories that employ the highest technology available and a 100-



seat multimedia room, has a skylit, three-story atrium as its major design feature.

Cunningham Memorial Library houses more than two million books, periodicals, documents and audiovisual and microfilm items; it also is a government depository containing more than 100,000 government documents. The Rare Books and Special Collections section houses the Eugene V. Debs papers, early Indiana textbooks and one of the largest early dictionary collections in the world. An

interlibrary loan service and several database-searching units also are available.

Hulman Center, completed in 1973, probably is best known as the arena basketball star Larry Bird played in during his college career. Its versatility also provides an ideal location for conferences, conventions, concerts, banquets, stage shows and other services.

Hulman Memorial Student Union became the hub of campus upon its completion in 1991. Students gather by the attractive outdoor plaza and its circular fountain. The soothing sounds of cascading water set the tone for the activity that takes place in the renovated nine-story building.

Within its walls, the Dede Activity Center provides meeting space as well as recreational and fitness opportunities while a variety of retail services and food is available in The Commons — from favorite fast-food franchises and a sit-down restaurant to a bookstore, bank and convenience store.

Tilson Auditorium, located in Tiley Hall, houses the Terre Haute Symphony Orchestra and the University's Convocation Series, which brings touring Broadway productions and other entertainment to campus. The former union building also has a recital hall, which features weekly concerts by University faculty and students.

The New Theater offers a modern "in-the-round" setting for year-round dramatic presentations. ISU's successful SummerStage program has provided excellent entertainment for more than 30 years. The Dreiser Theater, located in Dreiser Hall, provides a proscenium stage for more traditional performances.

For more than a century and a quarter, Indiana State has played an important role in Indiana's public service. Today, ISU makes a number of contributions to economic development locally, regionally and nationally.

The Technology Services Center in the School of Technology contracts with small- and medium-sized manufacturing companies to facilitate technology transfer to increase productivity and improve competitiveness. The Center for Research and Management Services in the School of Business contracts with businesses throughout Indiana to provide targeted industry studies, applied research, consultation and training. A Small Business Development Center is part of the larger center.

The Interdisciplinary Center for Cell Products and Technology focuses on areas concerned directly with biotechnology, its commercialization and its social and ethical implications.

Also on campus is the Indiana Institute on Recycling, the country's first state-created institute charged with developing effective voluntary recycling programs.





Terre Haute is the center of the United States. Literally! More than half the population of the United States live within a 500-mile radius of Terre Haute, and the city is circled by a number of metropolitan areas.

Indianapolis is only 68 miles away; Louisville, 196 miles; and Chicago, St. Louis and Cincinnati are all within 180 miles.

Terre Haute is located along the western edge of Indiana and is supplied with an efficient network of highways, which have contributed to the city's official designation as the "Crossroads of America."

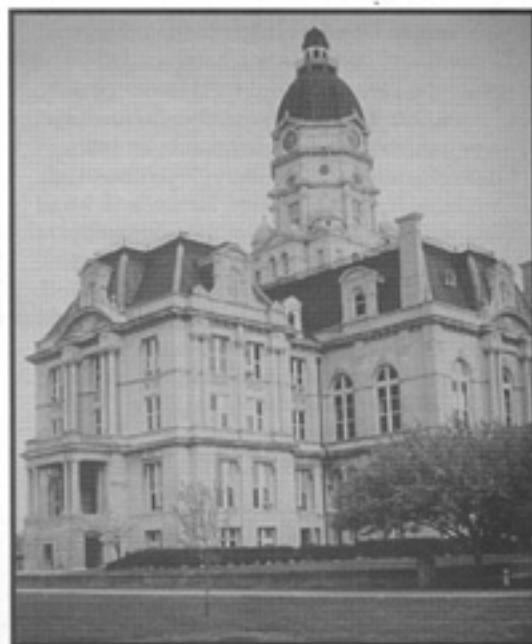
Terre Haute is a city of 59,196 people, located in West-Central Indiana. Terre Haute has over 1,716 hotel rooms in 19 hotels, 125 or so restaurants, 14 movie screens in four theaters; 90 bowling lanes, 90 tennis courts, approximately 1.8 million volumes of books in five libraries (and the world's largest collection of English language dictionaries), and the nation's first and largest compact disc manufacturing facility.

A town for all seasons, Terre Haute is a community with big-city advantages, a small-town touch and a distinct personality. It can be energetic or easy-going. You can dress up for dinner and the symphony or go casual for hot dogs on the grill. Densely forested hills and urban skylines along with gracious old neighborhoods and modern suburbs truly make Terre Haute a city of contrasts.

The Terre Haute and Vigo County parks and recreational facilities offer an array of activities such as swimming, hiking, fishing, boating, golfing, tennis and even ice skating.

Festivals abound in this area, from the city's Ethnic Festival and Vigo County's Pioneer Days to those in the area, including the Parke

County Covered Bridge Festival, the Cory Apple Festival, the Fontanet Bean Dinner, and Sullivan's Corn Festival. Terre Haute has several points of interest, including historical landmarks and museums, plus a planetarium. Of particular interest are the Children's Science and Technology Museum, the Historical Museum of the Wabash Valley and the Dobbs Parks Nature Center.



In addition to Indiana State, Terre Haute is home to four other higher education institutions—Indiana Vocational Technical College, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, St. Mary-of-the-Woods College, and Indiana Business College. The history of Terre Haute, like that of any other Indiana community, can be traced through its roads, waterways, people and natural resources. The city is built on a high bluff on the east bank of the Wabash River. The 18th-century French maps called this location "terre haute," meaning "high land."

A variety of national figures have called Terre Haute their home, among them Eugene V. Debs, early labor leader and five-time presidential candidate; Paul Dresser, composer of the Indiana state song, "On the Banks of the Wabash;" his brother, Theodore Dreiser, who wrote

"An American Tragedy" and other early 20th-century novels; poet Max Ehrmann, best known for his work "Desiderata;" Edward James Royce, who became the fifth president of Liberia; and actor-musician Scatman Crothers. Tony Hulman, Jr., had a powerful impact on the Terre Haute community. The Hulman Family still owns and operates the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

Terre Haute has also seen its share of quality athletes and coaches, including basketball's Larry Bird, John Wooden, Clyde Lovellette and Bobby Leonard; baseball's "Three-Fingered" Mordacai Brown, Tommy John and Dizzy Trout; and Olympians Greg Bell (track), Kurt Thomas (gymnastics), and Bruce Baumgartner (wrestling).

The Sycamore Mascot & Nickname

In 1921 a contest was held to pick a name for the athletic teams at what was then called Indiana State Normal School. Up until this time the term "Fighting Teachers" was frequently used in press accounts of athletic contests. In January, 1922, it was announced that the name Sycamores had won a popular vote of the student body, although there is some question as to how serious the student body was in picking the name. Nevertheless, Indiana State University has used this rather unique name since this date. The problem has been that a Sycamore is a tree and does not lend itself very well to creation of a mascot. Athletic teams have been known in the past as "The Fighting Trees," which was not considered a very glamorous or intimidating a concept. For a period of time in the 1950s and 1960s, there actually was a tree mascot developed, but this posed obvious problems of embar-

assment with other mascots, when the University played such schools as the Butler Bulldogs or the Ball State Cardinals.

In 1969 a committee created the Chief Quabachi concept as a mascot for the school. This Indian Chief (and accompanying legend) was used as a mascot until 1989, when the University dropped its use of the Indian in response to a variety of objections over use of the Indian caricature. In 1995, the Indiana State University Department of Athletics announced plans for a search for a new mascot to accompany the traditional Sycamores nickname. After taking suggestions the Department of Athletics submitted a list of finalists for the ISU student body to vote. On December 6, 1995, Sycamore Sam—a unique blue and white animal—made its debut at a Sycamore men's basketball game versus Loyola University.

The University

The University was created on December 20, 1865, in which the General Assembly of the State of Indiana established "a State Normal School, the object of which shall be the preparation of teachers for teaching in the common schools of Indiana." The school was known as **Indiana State Normal School** and its first president, William Allen Jones, was brought on board in 1869.

For 64 years the University was known as the Normal School, but in 1929 under the guidance of president Linnaeus Neal Hines, the school changed to **Indiana State Teachers College**. It remained a teachers college for 31 years, and in 1960 the institu-

tion evolved again, this time into **Indiana State College** while Raleigh Warren Holmstedt was the president.

For a brief five years ISU maintained the designation of State College, but in the fall of 1965, under the new president, Alan Carson Rankin, the school elevated to university status, known as **Indiana State University** as it is today.

Other Information

Here are some other interesting information about Indiana State University:

Blue and White

The school colors of Indiana State University since 1899, when it was announced the Yale Blue and White would replace the colors of Salmon Pink and White. The colors are also applied to the Blue and White Parade and the Blue and White Dance held during Homecoming each fall.

Book and Torch

The book and torch are official symbols of the University. The book symbolizes knowledge and truth gained at ISU, and the torch symbolizes the light of inspiration that comes to students in the University's halls.

Homecoming

The term Home-coming was first used in print announcements for the Alumni-Varsity Basketball Game on December 9, 1916. By the year 1919 this even became known as Blue and White Day and featured dances and entertainments for alumni of the Normal School. In 1921 the events were organized around a football game scheduled earlier in the autumn. A bonfire and pep rally were added to the festivities in 1922; the Blue and White Parade in 1923; and in 1937, Bette Whitmore (Kappa Kappa) was elected Homecoming Queen.

Logo

The Sycamore leaf symbol was designed by Dan Davis in 1985. His concept for the design was an outgrowth of a class project at a time when the University was looking for a new visual image.

The Alma Mater

The Alma Mater was authored by Charles M. Curry, Professor of English and Literature. It was originally entitled, "Indiana's Normal" and first printed in a June, 1912, issue of the *Normal Advance*. It was originally written as follows:

*Out upon the swelling breezes,
Let our voices ring,
As to thee, our Alma Mater,
Heartfelt praises sing,
Indiana's dear State Normal,
Friends and comrades true,
Though the years to come may part us,
Hail, all hail to you.*

This is the version that is sung today:

*Out upon the swelling breezes,
let your voices ring as to thee,
our alma mater, heartfelt praise
we sing through the years come may part us,
friends and comrades true ISU,
our alma mater, here's our pledge to you.*

The Fight Song

"On You Fighting Sycamores," the University's fight song, was authored and arranged by Joseph A. Gremelspacher, Professor of Music, as a pep song. It was first performed at a Homecoming even pep rally on October 20, 1939. It goes as follows:

*March on, march on, you fighting
Sycamores, Sycamores
March on, you Statesman tried and true
March on, march on to glorious victory
Raise that flag of royal blue*

*March on, march on you fighting
Sycamores, Sycamores
Shout out that victory song
Onward, ever onward to our goal
As we march on and on*

Seal of the University

The current seal includes the symbols of the Book and Torch and the founding date of 1865. It was approved for use by the Board of Trustees in 1929, the year that the Normal School became the Indiana State Teachers College.

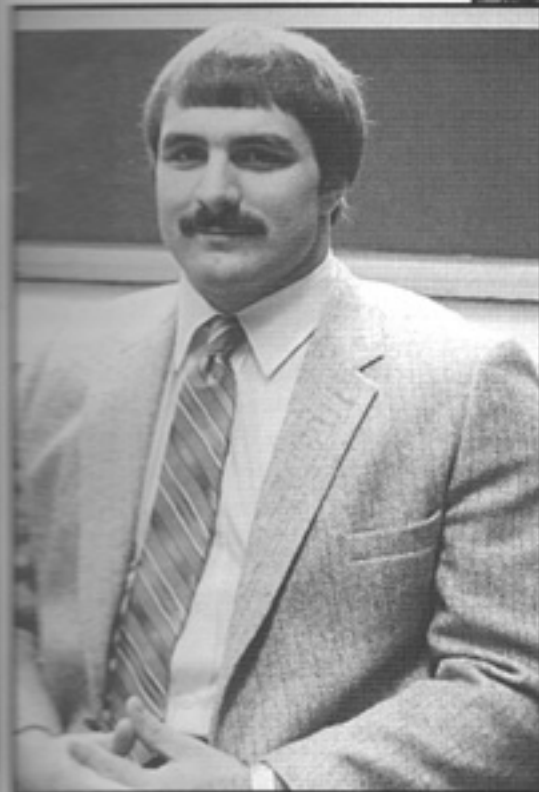
The ISU Athletic Tradition is rich and full of spectacular moments from John Wooden's great basketball teams of the late 1940s to Bruce Baumgartner's Olympic wrestling heroics of the 1980s. And don't forget Larry Bird! These three names along with hundreds of others have helped form the memorable tradition of Sycamore athletics.

The origins of the athletic department at ISU can be traced back to the turn of the century when the school was called Indiana State Normal School. Arthur Westphal (1912-17) and Birch E. Bayh (1917-23) have been given the majority of credit for establishing the administrative framework for athletic programs at ISU to emerge competitively on the intercollegiate level. Arthur Strum was appointed head of the Men's Physical Training Department as well as "Coach" and Director of Athletics in 1923. His charge was to establish intercollegiate teams in football, basketball, baseball and track. Men's tennis, golf and a women's varsity basketball program were introduced at this time as well.

From these modest beginnings, the athletic program has grown to what we know it as today—an NCAA Division I program offering programs in men's and women's basketball, football, baseball, softball, volleyball, men's and women's

tennis, men's and women's cross country, and men's and women's indoor/outdoor track and field.

The success of the ISU programs has been consistent, but perhaps the most memorable time period came about in the late 1970s and early 1980s when Sycamore athletics clearly reached its zenith. Nineteen seventy-nine will always be a year talked about in Sycamore athletic lore. But that year offered more than Larry Bird's march to the Final Four and eventual runner-up finish in the NCAA basketball tournament. The Sycamores also boasted the leading hitter in Division I baseball in Wally Johnson. The Sycamore football team posted an 8-3 record, and Kurt Thomas was ranked number one in the world among male gymnasts. The early 1980s brought about heavyweight Bruce Baumgartner's reign



as the number-one heavyweight wrestler in the country. The women's basketball team boasted the high-scoring efforts of Barbara Graves, later a finalist for the Harlem Globetrotters. Benita Edds made the U.S. Olympic Archery team during this era.

The Sycamore baseball program was also churning out pro prospects like Zane Smith, Dick Grapenthin, Bill Hayes, Tim Barrett, Brian Dorsett and Greg Baker. The football program continued its success with back-to-back 9-4 and 9-3 seasons, consecutive trips to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs, and a number-one regular season ranking in 1984.

The tradition is rich and deep-rooted as the Sycamores roll toward the 21st century.

Dr. John W. Moore has served as a faculty member and administrator at seven institutions of higher education since his graduation from college in the early '60s. His administrative experience spans academic affairs, student affairs and athletics, institutional advancement, educational support services, planning and financial management.

Moore came to Indiana State University in August 1992 as its ninth president. He formerly served as president of California State University, Stanislaus, and in senior level positions at Old Dominion University as executive vice president and at the University of Vermont as associate vice president for academic affairs. He continues to be an active faculty member, teaching graduate courses in leadership through ISU's Schools of Business and Education.

Active nationally in higher education, Moore has occupied significant leadership roles with the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, the American Council on Education, the National Collegiate Athletic Association's Presidents' Commission and as president of the Society for College and University Planning. He was elected to the AASCU Board of Directors in 1995 and has been invited to serve as a faculty member for the organization's New President's Academy.

On the state level, he is a member of the Governor's Indiana Economic Development Council Board of Directors, serves as a board member of the Indiana Business Modernization and Technology Corporation and on the Public Service Indiana Advisory Board. He is chair of the Indiana Conference on Higher Education.

Locally, he serves on the boards of the Alliance for Growth and Progress, the Greater Terre Haute Chamber of Commerce, Sheldon Swope Art Museum, Union Hospital, Why Me and United Way of the Wabash Valley.

Born in Bayonne, New Jersey, Moore received a bachelor's degree from Rutgers University, a master's from Indiana University and a doctorate from Pennsylvania State University.

An avid sportsman, he enjoys skiing, jogging, swimming and golfing. He also has been active in youth athletics for many years.

His wife, Nancy, is a counselor at Crawford Elementary School. They are the parents of Matthew, a medical student at Indiana University; Sarah, a graduate student at ISU; and David, a sophomore at ISU.

Myers
Director of Athletics*

Certainly no stranger to Indiana State University and Sycamore athletics, Andrea Myers begins her first full year as the Director of Athletics, having spent the last eight years as a part of the Indiana State athletics administration. She also was Interim Athletics Director during the 1994-95 academic year, and part of the 1998-99 year.

Before ascending into the director's role, Myers was the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director. Andi, as she is known at the University, served as the University's NCAA Compliance Officer, while also overseeing sports budgets and many of the day-to-day operations of the 14 intercollegiate sports at Indiana State.

She serves on the Missouri Valley Conference Compliance Committee and is the chair of the Gender Equity Committee. Myers has served as a member of the NCAA's Committee on Committees for Women's Athletics. She recently was elected by the Joint Committee to serve as the Missouri Valley Conference's representative to the NCAA Management Council.

Myers moved into her administrative capacity in April, 1989, after a successful seven-year tenure as Indiana State's women's basketball coach. An Indiana State graduate, Myers led the Sycamores to 40 wins in her final two seasons, including a school-best 22-6 mark in 1988. In that same year, Myers was named Gateway Conference Coach of the Year after ISU posted a 14-4 league mark, also a school-best.

Prior to accepting the head coaching post at ISU, Myers guided the Vincennes University Lady Trailblazers to an impressive 15-year record of 209-95 and several appearances in the NJCAA postseason tournament. She was twice selected the NJCAA Region 12 Coach of the Year and led VU to two national third-place finishes. While at Vincennes, Myers also served as chairperson of HPER.

A native of Dana, Ind., and a graduate of South Vermillion High School, Myers earned both her bachelor's and master's in physical education from ISU. She participated in women's basketball and field hockey and received the Hillman Award as a senior.

Myers is active in the Terre Haute community as a member of the Rotary Club and serves on the board of directors of both the Covered Bridge Girl Scout Council and the YWCA.



Dennis Raetz
Associate Athletics Director
for Compliance

Dennis Raetz begins his second year as Associate Athletics Director for Compliance. Raetz was named to his new position in December of 1997, when he resigned as head football coach after 18 years as the Sycamore top mentor.

Raetz handles the athletics department's compliance department, making sure Indiana State is adhering to NCAA, Missouri Valley and Gateway Football Conferences rules and regulations. He also serves as the department's academic liaison.

Raetz is the most prolific football coach in Indiana State University history. Six seasons ago Raetz became the all-time winningest coach in Sycamore history, surpassing the legendary Wally Marks. He finished his 18-year career with 93 victories in exactly 200 games.

The former "Dean of the Gateway Conference" guided the ISU program to its greatest heights including a No. 1 national ranking during most of the 1984 season and two trips to the NCAA I-AA playoffs. Raetz was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 while also garnering Kodak I-AA District Coach of the Year honors. Three seasons ago Raetz guided the Sycamores to their fifth-best record in school history.

Raetz has been a fixture at ISU since 1978 when he came to Terre Haute to serve on Dick Jamieson's staff as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. He remained in that position for two seasons before taking over the top job on February 25, 1980.

A native of North Platte, Nebraska, Raetz attended the University of Nebraska on a football scholarship, but his playing career was cut short by a severe knee injury. Following his college graduation in 1968, he was an assistant coach at North Kansas City High School in Missouri for five seasons before accepting head-coaching responsibilities at J.C. Harmon High School in Kansas City, Kansas.

In 1977, Raetz joined the University of Missouri coaching staff where he worked with the defensive ends in addition to his duties as the junior varsity head coach.

Raetz and his wife Betty reside in nearby Riley. Their daughter Jaime (23), graduated from the University of Nebraska and is a school teacher in the Kansas City, Mo., area. Their son Mark (19) is a redshirt freshman defensive back at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.



Cathy Grothe
Assistant Athletics Director
for Marketing

Cathy Grothe enters her fourth season as head of the athletics marketing department. She is responsible for increasing revenue for the department through the identification and solicitation of corporate sponsorships.

In addition to marketing each of the department's 14 intercollegiate athletics programs, Grothe is responsible for the development of the Gift-in-Kind program, handling the athletics department merchandising and licensing program, as well as being the administrator for the Indiana State fastpitch softball program. She also supervises the Sycamore Radio Network and negotiates all contracts on behalf of the network in addition to contract negotiations for the coaches' television show and game programs. Grothe recently negotiated a media package ensuring numerous televised broadcasts of Sycamore football and men's and women's basketball events over the next three years. She has also developed a network of affiliate stations in Indiana and Illinois, which will expand the coverage of Sycamore radio and television broadcasts outside the Terre Haute area.

Prior to her arrival at Indiana State, Grothe spent four years as Athletic Promotions Director at the University of Montana in Missoula. While at Montana she was credited with developing community support for the athletics programs, increasing attendance in women's basketball to more than 5,000 fans each of their last two years, and drawing record crowds of more than 15,000 spectators.

Grothe began her career in sports marketing at The University of Iowa, where she served as graduate assistant for the 1991-92 season. She was responsible for the production of all promotional materials and developing game promotions to increase attendance for all Hawkeye events. Before her career began in sports marketing, she was a marketing representative for Iowa State Bank & Trust in Iowa City, Iowa.

She is on the executive board of directors of the YWCA, a member of the Wabash Valley American Marketing Association and the Young Professionals Club of Terre Haute.

Grothe is a 1989 graduate of The University of Iowa, earning a degree in marketing with a communications minor. She later received a master's degree in journalism and public relations in 1994.

Assistant Athletics Director
Operations/
Facility
Management

Kerri Fagan enters her second year as Athletics Operations and Facility Management Coordinator at Indiana State University. Fagan comes to Terre Haute from the Indianapolis Local Organizing Committee for the 1997 Final Four, having worked primarily with merchandising and special events. Fagan's responsibilities at Indiana State include coordinating game management operations and overseeing the scheduling and maintenance of ISU's athletics facilities.

A 1992 graduate of the University of Massachusetts sport management program, Fagan spent two years at the United States Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., as a Program Director with the United States Field Hockey Association. She coordinated and worked with special events, including National and International tournaments.

Co-Head Athletic Trainer

David Ralston is beginning his fourth season as Indiana State's Co-Director of Athletic Training Services. In this capacity Ralston serves as the Head Athletic Trainer for men's basketball teams, as well as an instructor in Indiana State's acclaimed Athletic Training education program.

Mark McAllister begins his fourth season as the Head Strength and Conditioning Coach for Indiana State University. McAllister is responsible for the weight lifting and conditioning of all 14 Sycamore athletic programs.

McAllister came to ISU from Columbia University, where he was the Head Strength and Conditioning coach for all 27 varsity sports from 1990 until 1996. He also served two seasons as the defensive line coach for the freshman team.

Before his stint at the Ivy League school, McAllister was the Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach for football and field hockey at the Ohio State University from 1988-1990. He earned his master's degree while at the Columbus, Ohio, school.

McAllister began his career at Texas A&M University, where for two years he was the assistant strength coach for several sports, including women's basketball, baseball, women's tennis, volleyball and football.

A native of Wichita, Kan., McAllister received his bachelor's degree from Kansas State University in 1986. The 40-year old McAllister and his wife, Hjerda, have one son, Kiernan, who just turned four.

Rob Ervin is in his second year as Director for Athletics Media Relations. Ervin comes to ISU from Jacksonville (Fla.) University where he served one year as Director of Sports Information. Prior to working in Florida, he served as an assistant for four years in the media relations office here at Indiana State.

Ervin's main duties include publicity for Indiana State's men's basketball and football teams as well as overseeing all operations of the media relations office.

During his previous stint at ISU, he served as District V Coordinator for Academic All-America teams in a program sponsored by GTE and the College Sports Information Directors of America.

A native of Centralia, Illinois, Ervin is a 1992 graduate of Murray State University, earning a degree in radio and television. He is single and resides in Terre Haute.



The Academic Support Program for Athletics, headed by Coordinator of the Athletic Study Center Henry Villegas, is based upon the belief that the STUDENT in Student-Athlete comes first, and for that reason we have developed a program that insures every student-athlete the best possible opportunity for personal success. The Academic Support Services Program for Athletics provides academic support for all male and female, scholarship and walk-on participants on all 14 Intercollegiate Athletic teams, approximately 350 students per year. The goals of the program are as follows:

- To enhance the academic performance of student-athletes.
- To help student-athletes make normal progress toward graduation.
- To assist freshmen student-athletes in making a successful transition to college life.
- To assist student-athletes in managing the demands of participating in intercollegiate athletics.
- To provide student-athletes with the means to assume responsibility for their education.
- To help student-athletes bridge the gap from college life to professional life through the Life Skills Program.

INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY'S ATHLETIC ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

University 101

The Academic Support Program for Athletics has adopted a pro-active approach to in order to prepare the student for the many challenges associated with balancing both academics and athletics. Beginning with the Athletic Department Orientation and Study Skills Class (University 101), student-athletes are provided with a wealth of information and strategies for success during their first term at Indiana State. The class, teamed with study halls, tutoring, small study groups, and periodic progress monitoring, helps to ensure that each and every student-athlete at Indiana State has the best possible opportunity for both personal and academic success.

University 101 is a course to help students make a successful transition into the University by introducing the concepts and values of a University education, of liberal studies, and of the preparation in the disciplines; by fostering a sense of ideas and people; by developing critical thinking skills as well as academic and personal skills necessary for success; and by providing an introduction to the resources and services of the University.

The Academic Support Program has been able to make continuous gains in the level of academic achievement in the percentage of scholar athletes compiling a 3.0 grade point average or better. This past year at least 40 percent of our student-athletes achieved a 3.0 GPA, earning a spot on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll. Coaching staffs, administration, faculty, and the university community have all been very supportive of our efforts as we assist student-athletes works toward that ever important goal of gaining a college degree. Lessons learned through the academic advisement program have proved extremely valuable to several members of the ISU football program.

Indiana State part of new NCAA CHAMPS Life Skills Program

"Preparing Student-Athletes for the Challenges of Life....."

Programming for freshmen student-athletes is centered on value clarification, the development of time management skills, sports nutrition for healthy living and top performance, study skills, stress management, and drug and alcohol education.

"Smart Sex: Sexual Responsibility & Student-Athletes" is a workshop offered to sophomore student-athletes to address issues concerning sexual responsibility and safe dating. Campus facilitators are on hand to educate students on the facts concerning sexual assault and assist in the development of healthy dating lifestyles.

The Sports Information Department conducts a program on "Dealing with the Media" to help student-athletes develop strong media relations skills. Local media personnel come together to allow student-athletes the opportunity to ask questions and learn through mock interviews.

The Senior "Life After Sports" Seminar assists student-athletes to prepare for what lies on the other side: to help them to bridge the gap from college to professional life in the work world. Guest speakers, former Indiana State Student-Athletes who have made successful transitions, return to give student-athletes advice on how to cope with "Life after sports."

SAFE "Sycamore Athletes for Education" is a volunteer community service program in which student-athletes have the opportunity to make a meaningful contribution to the Terre Haute community. Student-Athletes share their time with elementary school children once a week to stress the importance of education through reading.

Standing at its present site since 1924, and acquired by Indiana State University in 1967, Memorial Stadium has been the home of Sycamore football for 31 years. The 12,764-seat structure is located at the corner of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute.

The stadium has been kept in excellent shape through the years and its latest addition was a \$400,000 All-Pro Turf surface installed prior to the 1989 season.

Memorial Stadium is not new to synthetic surfaces though, as the stadium and Indiana State University claim distinction as the world's first university to own and make outdoor application of Astroturf. Following the University's acquisition of the stadium, Indiana State opened the 1967 season with a 41-6 win over Eastern Illinois in the first game played on the new surface. The Astroturf at Memorial Stadium was similar to the indoor turf at the Houston Astrodome which saw the first college game ever played on the artificial surface in 1966, between Houston and Washington State.

Advantages to using synthetic surfaces include durability (some 15 college and high school football games are played on the surface each year in addition to daily Indiana State practices), a constant

surface and sure footing regardless of weather. The All-Pro Turf also is designed to provide more cushion and reduce injuries.

Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the public for the first time on May 5, 1925, as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria Tractors before an estimated crowd of 9,000. Among the honored guests were Major League Baseball Commissioner Judge Kennesaw Mountain Landis and Charles Barnard of the Cleveland Indians.

The first use of the playing field was in the fall

of 1924, when Wiley and Garfield High Schools played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.

Original construction of Memorial Stadium was begun in 1922, at a cost of \$450,000. Upon the University gaining control in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included: the reorientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to its present east-west configuration; the installation of Astroturf; and the construction of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as the rebuilding of seats on the south side. The original arch still remains from the original structure; however, the bleacher



seats installed in 1967, were torn down in the summer of 1996, replaced by a landscaped hill which serves as a general admission section and a site for pre-game tailgating under tents.

No one took better advantage of Memorial Stadium than former Indiana State head coach Dennis Raetz. His Sycamore teams posted a 67-30-1 mark for a .689 winning percentage in 18 seasons at the friendly confines of Memorial Stadium. Raetz was even better under the lights at the stadium, compiling a 34-4-1 mark for an .885 mark.

and has been home to men's and women's basketball, volleyball, gymnastics and wrestling teams, as well as the school's seasonal sports programs. The gymnasium is serviced by 30 rows of mechanized, rolling bleachers which provide seating for 2,500. The facility now features a new sportcourt and scoreboards which were installed in 1988.

Arena, the ISU Tennis Complex enters its sixth year of use by the men's and women's tennis teams, students and staff of the ISU and Terre Haute communities.

With eight courts and modern lighting set around a central viewing tower

and equipment kiosk, the facility proved a gracious host for the 73rd annual Missouri Valley Conference Tennis Championships in the spring of 1991, as well as the MVC Women's Tennis Championships this past spring.

The newest athletic facility on campus is the Eleanor Forsythe St. John Softball Complex, which opened in the spring of 1989. Located across the street from the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building, the softball facility features two playing fields which can be used for both athletics

and intramurals. In 1999, a new electronic scoreboard and press box were added to the complex. Other additions include bullpens, expanded dugouts, a new drainage system, batting cage and renovation of the infield and the outfield. The north field on the complex is Price Field, site of ISU's home games. Indiana State hosted the MVC Softball Tournament at the complex in 1994.

Indiana State's men's and women's track teams compete at Marks Field, also located across the street from the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building.

Marks Field, named for longtime Sycamore coach Wally Marks, has been the home of the track and field program for over 20 years. In 1992 a new, state-of-the-art polyurethane track surface was installed

and the new track served as a superb host for the 1996 Missouri Valley Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships.



Hulman Center

Hulman Center has been the home of the men's basketball team since the 1973-74 season, and this season marks the 25th anniversary of the storied arena. This season also is the fourth year as the home site of the women's basketball

program. The facility gives the city and the university a large auditorium to accommodate convocations, meetings and conventions, in addition to dramatic and musical presentations. Hulman Center is the largest athletic building of its kind in west-central Indiana, providing a seating capacity of 10,206.

The base for one of the Midwest's finest Division I collegiate baseball programs,

Sycamore Field has undergone a number of changes in recent years. The installation of a new Omni Turf infield in 1999, as well as a state of the art scoreboard and sound system were part of a planned renovation project for

the entire facility. Among other future changes planned include a new seating area, locker rooms and a modernized press box.



The Athletic Training program at Indiana State University has long prided itself as a leader in the field of sports. Having nationally-recognized programs of study for both undergraduate and graduate athletic training students, ISU offers an extremely progressive and high quality of health care to its varsity athletes.

Three athletic training rooms, located in the Health and Human Performance Building, the Hulman Center and at Memorial Stadium, are all equipped with the latest therapeutic and rehabilitative equipment. This allows all treatment and rehabilitation for the most minor to significant injury to take place right on campus.

The athletic training staff is comprised of three certified staff athletic trainers-Lori Vancza, David Ralston and Troy Hirshman-plus a team of nearly thirty graduate athletic trainers and undergraduate student trainers. The athletic training staff is undergirded by three sports medicine trained team physicians-Dr. Tom Klootwyk, orthopaedist of the Methodist Sports Medicine Center; and Drs. John and James Welch, primary care physicians from the AP&S Northside Family Medicine Clinic-together offer the latest methods and technology in the care of athletic injury and illness. At their access is a network of medical specialists and consultants which round out a comprehensive sports medical system.

The team of medical professionals caring for Sycamore intercollegiate athletes is contemporary in its methods and is constantly seeking continuing education in an effort to remain on the cutting edge of sports medicine.



Strength &

Conditioning



ISU's strength and conditioning program has recently doubled in size. The 10,000-square foot facility is housed in University Hall on campus. The facility is funded by private donations.

Indiana State's strength and conditioning program is an integral part of a player's development. All weight training is coordinated with activities on the court.

The program also includes a speed and movement program designed to improve the players' speed and athletic ability. Prevention of injuries is an important part of the total picture.

The facility is divided into three main areas, which include free weights and weight machines, movement drills and plyometric training.

SYCAMORES OPTION UP FOR 1999 SEASON

ISU AGAIN FACES A TOUGH GRIDIRON SCHEDULE

A new era of Sycamore football hopes to continue as Tim McGuire gets ready to begin his second season as the head coach for Indiana State University. McGuire, 45, became the 17th head coach at ISU in 1998. In McGuire's first year in Terre Haute, Ind., the Sycamores finished 5-6 overall and 2-4 in the Gateway Football Conference. With three losses last season, all by less than six points, McGuire had the Sycamores on roll. The season finished on high note with ISU trouncing nationally ranked Murray State 66-10.

In 1997, ISU entered the season with the toughest schedule in I-AA football next to Delaware. The 1999 schedule should also rank as one of the toughest in the land. ISU will play two Big12 schools in 1999 back-to-back to open the season. The first will come in the season opener when McGuire and his players travel to Ames, Iowa, to take on the Cyclones of Iowa State.

The following week will pit the Sycamores against the Oklahoma Sooners, Saturday, Sept. 11, 1999. Just like in 1998, the Sycamores' third game will also be a road contest, this time in Richmond, Kentucky against the Eastern Kentucky Colonels. Always tough Youngstown State comes to Memorial Stadium as the home opener. Illinois State, who has been picked by many to be the team to beat this season and one of the top three teams in the country will host the Sycamores in Normal. Western Illinois will be ISU's homecoming foe and non-conference opponent Western Kentucky will also travel to Terre Haute this fall.

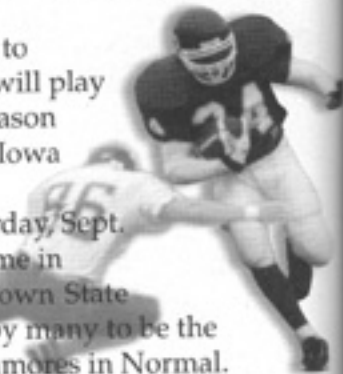
"We really believe that facing Iowa State, Oklahoma and Eastern Kentucky on the road to open the season will definitely strengthen us to make a run at our conference," said Tim McGuire. "We will have to play at a tremendous level throughout those games on the road. It will give us a great mindset as we go into our open week and as we approach Youngstown State."

OPTION OFFENSE ENTERS SECOND SEASON

"We had kind of a high coming off that Murray State game last year," said McGuire. "One game doesn't make a football team, but we were able to get through the winter and into the spring and that's where we saw a different football team."

McGuire has 18 total starters returning in the fall, including almost the entire offensive unit from a year ago. Offensively, sophomore quarterback Sheraton Fox returns after appearing in nine games and starting the last three contests. Fox (5-9, 170), from Bartow, Fla., was named to the 1998 All-Newcomer team by the Gateway Football Conference. He led the squad in rushing with 431 yards on 147 carries and rushed for three touchdowns. Fox also led all ISU quarterbacks with 345 yards in the air and 14 touchdowns. Quarterbacks Steve Englehart and new-comer Chris Lynce will battle for a starting spot in the fall. Lynce was a partial qualifier last season and has shown great skills in running the triple option. Englehart is a veteran with great experience giving ISU a lot of depth at quarterback.

Joining Fox in the backfield will be junior running back Jared Sessum (5-11, 205) who rushed for 401 yards on 73 carries (5.5 yards per carry) and four touchdowns in his first year at ISU. Senior running back Matt Nelson (5-10, 185) averaged 6.5 yards per carry last season and had three TDs and 252 yards combined. Nelson also a versatile athlete who has been known to throw the ball occasionally will also fight for a starting spot at halfback.





Leading the way up front for both Fox will be junior Eric Martin (6-2, 260). Martin was tabbed a Second Team All Gateway Football Conference member last season at the center position. Veterans Doug Hurt and Dan Denaut will assist up front. Sophomore Pace McCormick saw a lot of playing time last season and will also fight for a starting spot.

James McAtee and Marques Clayton both have solid experience at the wideout positions and should open up the offense even more.

VETERANS ANCHOR ANOTHER STINGY DEFENSE

"We really didn't have a letdown last season on defense," said the coach. "With the players we have back I think we have some pretty good defensive play- ers." "We do think we have a number of seniors and that is mixed with some younger kids so I think we have a good situation there."

Seven starters return for the Sycamores on the defensive side of the ball in 1999. Among them are four seniors, including cornerback DeJuan Alfonzo (5-11, 190), lineman Shannon Jackson (6-2, 270), end Troy Lefevra (6-3, 216) and inside linebacker Tony Pryor (6-2, 205).

Alfonzo is a force in the backfield after leading the team with four interceptions in 1998. He also excels on special teams where he returns punts. Jackson was a 1998 Preseason All-America selection in Division I-AA, then sustained a knee injury that kept him out for the latter half of the season. He is expected to return fully recovered.

At the other end position, Lefevra hopes to build off of a season that saw him named a Division I-AA All-America in the Hansen Poll after recording 11 sacks for 71 yards and two fumble recoveries. At linebacker is Tony Pryor, who led ISU a year ago with 147 tackles, including two interceptions. He was a second team All-Gateway selection. Also at linebacker, senior Mike Bandy is ready for another solid season. Bandy was fourth on the team a year ago with 78 tackles, 48 of those solos. Sophomores Jason Holok and Tony Albrink are also looking to battle for some playing time at sport along with Cory Pirce who should see alot of time at the outside linebacker spot.

In the backfield with Alfonzo, Chris Sapp and La-Var Luster are both available. Sapp started most of last season as a freshman and the junior Luster is a solid veteran.

WHO'S NEW

Tim McGuire and his staff hits the highways of Indiana hard this spring and came away with a host of players from the state to fill his roster.

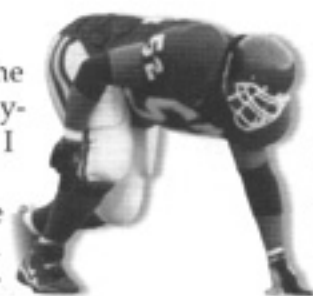
"I think it's a very well balanced class," said McGuire. "I think we got a lot of talent at a lot of positions. Our goal along here was to recruit Indiana kids and we are happy about that."

Evansville Harrison standout **Ryan Merriwether** (5-10, 190, OLB) will join the Sycamores after completing a very successful career in southern Indiana. Merriwether was named to the Indiana Top-50 all-state team and was a finalist for Mr. Football.

Ft. Wayne Snider quarterback **Anthony Young** (6-1,190) completed a stellar senior season with 1,272 yards passing and 17 touchdowns. He led the Snider offense to a 50.8 ppg. average and 443.2 yards per game average.

Also among the class is defensive lineman **Ryan Holley** (6-2, 220) of Homestead High School in Roanoke. Holley helped lead his squad to the Indiana 5A State Championship game last season. He finished his senior season with 86 total tackles and 14 sacks.

A pair of Valparaiso brothers are also set to join the Indiana State program. **Steve Sibb** (6-2, 240) will shore up the offensive and defensive line for Indiana State while his brother **Tom Sibb** (6-3, 250) will join an already talented defense at linebacker. **Josh Sewell** (6-2, 280/Lincoln, Neb./Southeast) also hails from the midwest and could jump into a backup role on the defensive line right away.

A new era of Sycamore football continues in 1999, as Tim McGuire begins his second season as the head coach of the Sycamores. The personable McGuire, 46, is no stranger to Sycamore football, as the Omaha, Neb., native spent the five seasons crafting the Indiana State defense as the program's defensive coordinator. He also served as the assistant head coach, as well as instructing the ISU defensive backs.

As for being a head coach, McGuire knows a little about this tough task as well. For two seasons (1981-82) McGuire served as head coach of Morningside College, a Division II school in Sioux City, Iowa. McGuire compiled a 7-15 mark in his two-year head coaching debut, but his record is deceiving. His 1981 team went 5-6, which was the most wins for the school in 10 years, and his two recruiting classes eventually posted winning seasons of 6-5 in 1984 and 7-3-1 in 1985.

McGuire's Indiana State defenses have ranked in the top four in the Gateway Football Conference all five years. His 1994 squad was first in GFC in total defense

and 17th in the nation, while the 1995 team finished second in league play and 20th nationally.

In his five years as defensive coordinator, McGuire's charges recorded three shutouts and 10 games in which the opposition failed to score more than 10 points. He has coached three All-Americans, including current Buffalo Bill Dan

Brandenburg, as well as Chris Libaire and Richard Moss.

Six of his defensive stars garnered first-team, all-conference honors, while four snared second-team and seven grabbed honorable mention. McGuire also has tutored six academic, all-conference honorees.

For McGuire this elevation to head coach allows him an opportunity to get the Sycamores back to the conference championship game.

"I'm very excited to be the head football coach at Indiana State," commented McGuire.

"I'm not inheriting something I don't know anything about. This is a place I've been for five years, and I have invested a lot of time and effort. Now I have an opportunity to run the ship like the captain and see if we can get through some choppy waters and get ourselves back to the championship game, and this time, win it."

Prior to Indiana State, McGuire spent two seasons at the United States Naval Academy. In 1991 he coached the linebackers for the varsity squad, and the following year (1992) he was the defensive coordinator for the lightweight football team. The '92 team finished with a 7-0 record en route to the East Lightweight Football Championship.

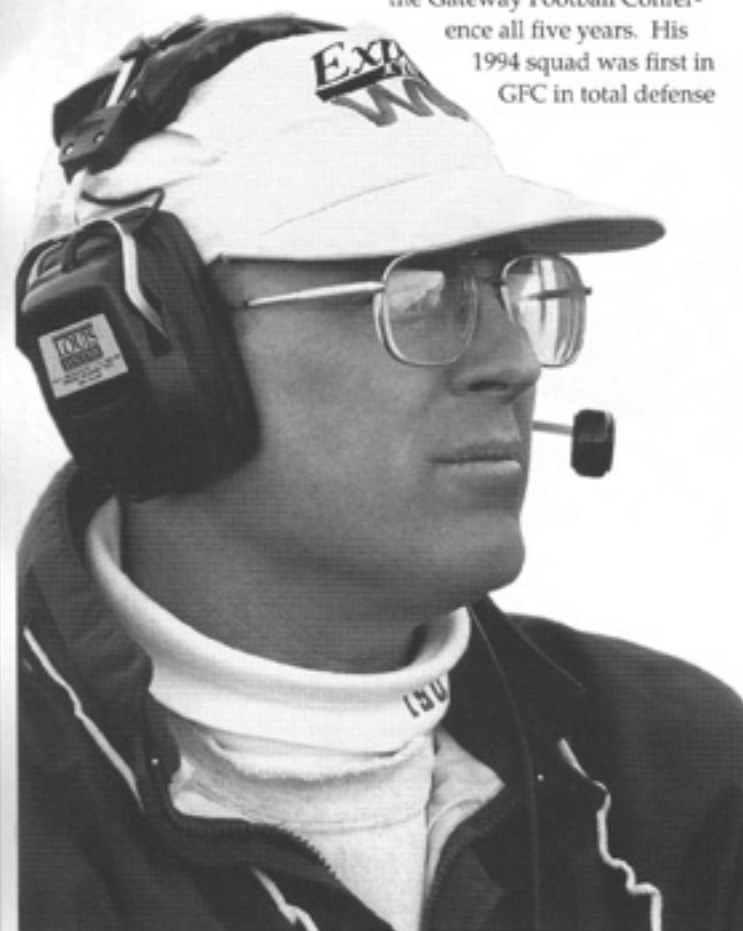
McGuire has honed his skills as a defensive intellect with stints at both Northern Illinois University and Kansas State University.

At Northern Illinois McGuire spent four seasons (1986-1990) as the Huskies' defensive coordinator, while also instructing the linebackers. He coached five players who signed contracts with the NFL, as well as All-Americans Doug Bartlett, Cary Caliendo and

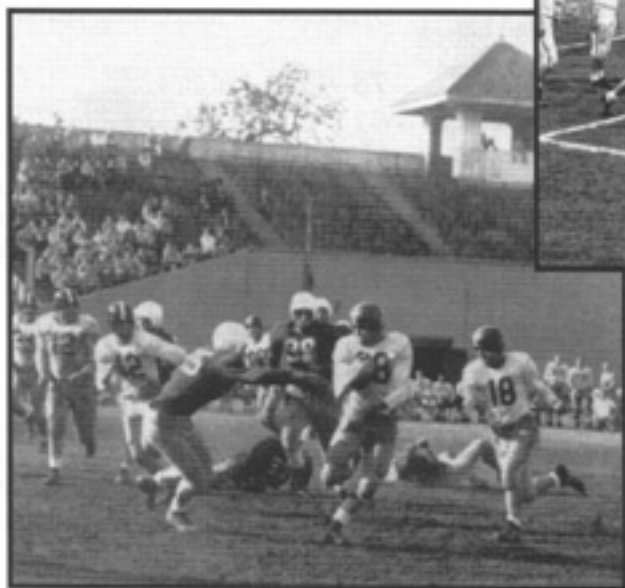

The remaining teams in the field will be selected on an at-large basis with a minimum of two of those teams coming from outside the eight leagues with automatic bids. All I-AA teams will be assigned to one of four regions — East, Central, South and West.

"I've always said that it's tougher to win our league than it is to win the national championship... and now I've got proof."

Indeed.

Commissioner Patty Viverito made that observation after league member Youngstown State earned the league's first national title in 1997. Youngstown State won four games in four tries in the NCAA tournament in winning its fourth national crown this decade and first for the Gateway Football Conference. Youngstown State joined the Gateway for the start of 1997 after previously competing as an independent.

Oddly, Youngstown State (4-2 in the Gateway) won the national title despite finishing third in the league, behind Western Illinois (6-1) and Northern Iowa (5-1). Despite finishing third in the conference, Youngstown State received an at-large berth in the NCAA tournament, and the Penguins became the first-ever third-place team to capture a I-AA title.

Obviously, the 1997 national title was the crowning jewel for the Gateway, as the league had one of its most successful seasons. In addition to claiming the league's first national title, Youngstown State also finished the year ranked No. 1, marking the first time a league member has held that spot in a season-ending poll. League champ Western Illinois ended at No. 6, marking the first time the Gateway Conference ended the year with two teams ranked among the top six.

The 1997 season is only a memory, but the league has high hopes as it enters its 14th season of I-AA football competition in the fall of 1998. The original Gateway Conference was founded as a women's athletics organization in August, 1982, following the dissolution of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women.

In September of that year, Patty Viverito was named the first commissioner of the newly founded conference, a position she maintains today. Before moving to its permanent headquarters in St. Louis, the Gateway spent three organizational months on the campus of Eastern Illinois University. Eastern Illinois was the original president institution of the league, a role filled this season by Western Illinois.

In July of 1992, the 10-team Gateway Conference disbanded as women's programs realigned with their men's teams in their respective conferences. The league assumed its new name on July 1, 1982, becoming the Gateway Football Conference, a NCAA I-AA football league comprised of seven Midwest institutions.

The Gateway Conference football division was born on August 22, 1985, when the Gateway Conference President's Council voted to add a I-AA football division for six of its members to the previously all-women's athletics organization. Founding members of the football division were Eastern Illinois, Illinois State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri State and Western Illinois. The creation of the Gateway football division marked the first time in college annals that football was added to a women's conference. In June of 1986, Indiana State became the seventh member of the Gateway Conference.

In the 13 years of the football division, league membership has been stable as only twice since 1985 has there been fluctuations in league membership. Eastern Illinois left the Gateway to join the Ohio Valley Conference in 1996, while Youngstown State joined the Gateway in 1997 to return league membership to its current seven-member status.

Highlighted by the 1997 national championship by Youngstown State, the first 13 seasons of Gateway football have been marked by continual successes. Last season, two Gateway teams (Western Illinois and

Youngstown State) represented the league in the I-AA playoffs, marking the third straight season (and sixth time overall) the league has sent two teams to the NCAA tournament.

Although Youngstown State is the only Gateway team to reach the title game, Northern Iowa has four times reached the semifinals, while the league sports an all-time playoff record of 17-18. Five different teams have represented the conference in the I-AA playoffs during the league's first 13 years of existence, while six of the seven current members have been to the playoffs since 1982. Southern Illinois won a national crown in 1983, prior to its Gateway membership.

The Gateway continues to be one of the best I-AA conferences in the nation as it plays one of the most difficult non-league slates in the country. Last season, the league compiled a 23-18 non-conference record, winning a league-record eight games against teams ranked among the top 25. Over the past two years, the league has compiled a non-league record of 50-31, which includes 15 wins against I-AA teams and two wins against I-A teams. Notably, of the 31 non-league losses in the past two years, 24 have come against teams either ranked in the I-AA top 25 or against I-A teams. Only four times in 41 non-conference games last year did a Gateway team lose to an unranked non-Division I-A foe.

Historically, the Gateway Conference has been among the elite in I-AA, posting winning non-league records in eight of 13 previous seasons. In 1996, the Gateway was perhaps at its greatest as the league compiled the best non-conference record in its history at 27-13, which included a I-AA best 19 wins against I-AA non-conference foes.

The league's success on the field has translated into national respect, as the Gateway has been well represented in national polls in each of its 13 years. In 1992, Northern Iowa achieved the conference's first No. 1 national ranking, as the Panthers were ranked No. 1 by the NCAA and by the Sports Network for five weeks. Youngstown State also claimed a No. 1 ranking for the league, holding the spot two weeks during the season in 1997, plus the final season-ending Sports Network ranking. The final national poll in eight of the past nine years has had at least two Gateway members among its Top 25.

On the subject of national polls, Northern Iowa, Southwest Missouri State, Western Illinois and Youngstown State have helped the Gateway achieve some milestones over the past two seasons.

In the last two years, the Gateway has had two teams ranked among the top ten in the same poll 23 times (13 in 1997 and 10 in 1996). Prior to 1996, that had only happened once. Additionally, two Gateway teams were ranked among the nation's top five in the same Sports Network top-25 poll nine different times in 1997. Again, that had only happened one time (in 1996) prior to last year.

The Gateway is among eight I-AA conferences that receive automatic bids to the NCAA I-AA Championship. Those other leagues include the Atlantic-10 Conference (formerly the Yankee), the Big Sky Conference, the Midwestern Athletic Conference, the Ohio Valley Conference, the Patriot League, the Southern Conference

and the Southland Conference. The Gateway has had an automatic bid since 1986, as the NCAA I-AA Football Committee waived the league's two-year waiting period and granted the league an automatic bid after just one season of play.

The Gateway Conference is the only automatic I-AA qualifying conference that sponsors football as its only sport, as the league completed its service to women's athletics following the 1991-92 season. Although the league no longer sponsors women's sports, the Gateway has an historical place in the development of intercollegiate women's athletics.

The 10 founders of the original Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference currently belong to three conferences. Eight members joined their men's programs in the Missouri Valley: Bradley, Drake, Illinois State, Indiana State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri and Wichita State. Eastern Illinois is in the Ohio Valley Conference, and Western Illinois is in the Ohio Valley Conference, and Western Illinois competes in the Mid-Continent, which is also home to Youngstown State's sports, other than football.

In its decade of operation, the Gateway sponsored championships in ten women's sports and football. The women's sports were basketball, cross country, golf, indoor and outdoor track & field, swimming and diving, tennis, softball, volleyball and, in its early years, field hockey.

1998 Season Review





A new era of Sycamore Football began in the 1998 season. A new coach in the form of Tim McGuire and a new offense in the form of the triple option were some of the highlights already happening before the first day of practice even began.



ISU has always faced a tough schedule

each fall and 1998 was no different. Only the Blue Hens of Delaware had it tougher on the gridiron coming into the season and with three straight road games to start the season things could have been bleak.

On tap first for ISU was national power Kansas State. Thought by many to be the number one team in the country and a favorite to win the national championship, the Wildcats lived up to their billing at least this night by smacking the Sycamores 66-0. Following the game, Wildcats head coach Bill Snyder addressed the weary Sycamores and told them their season starts the following week and to keep their heads up high—that's exactly what they did.

The Sycamores would bus to Cape Girardeau, Missouri to face the Indians of Southeast Missouri State and would head home happy. Starting quarterback Steve Englehart would go down with an injury early and backup freshman Sheraton Fox would burst on the scene. Fox would rush for over 100 yards as ISU pulled out a 21-14 win and had the momentum heading into the next week at Youngstown State.

Always tough at home, the Penguins held off a last second pass attempt into the end zone by quarterback Englehart to Matt Nelson. The catch was waived off incomplete and the Sycamores fell to YSU 20-14.

It was time to head home to the friendly Memorial Stadium the next week. St. Joseph's would be a test for ISU because it's own triple option offense. ISU would be the better team in that night rolling to a 38-7 victory.

Illinois State came to town the following week and a win would have given ISU a two-game winning streak with a week off to follow. Things were rolling well as the Sycamores led 20-10 with ten minutes to play in the game. The Redbirds scored on a ten play drive to cut the lead to 20-17. The two teams would battle until the final two minutes when the Sycamores downed a punt on the ILSU two yard line. Things

looked to in hand until Redbird quarterback Kevin Glenn hit Ricky Garrett for a 98 yard scoring strike and an eventual 20-14 win.

ISU would back after the break and put together a two game winning streak with league wins over Southwest Missouri State at home and Southern Illinois on the road. Fox hit it big against the Salukis with a 7-8 performance in the air and 200 yards passing including an 80-yard touchdown strike into the hands of Nelson.

A disappointing three-point loss to Northern Iowa was the third loss off the season where the difference was less than a touchdown. ISU would struggle in losses at Western Illinois and Western Kentucky. Against the Hilltoppers, Matt Nelson ran back a 97 yard kickoff return for a touchdown tying an Indiana State and Gateway Conference record.

With a possible playoff berth now out of the question, #21 ranked Murray State was hoping to help itself into the playoffs with a win over the

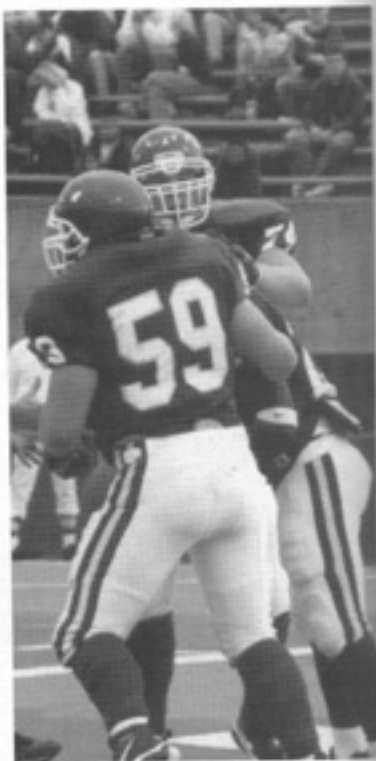
Sycamores. It wouldn't even be close. The Sycamores rolled to a 66-10 win over the Racers and sent them packing with out a playoff berth.

The triple option was at its best in this game as ISU would rack up 485 yards of total offense in the game and held Murray to just 181. All-American Troy Lefevra would set an ISU record with four sacks in the game. Fox would rack up 140 yards on the ground and two touchdowns. He threw for another.

ISU closed the season at 5-6 overall and had three losses by less than a touchdown and were really only out of one game—a 42-14 loss at Western Kentucky.

Alfonzo, Lefevra and center Eric Martin all earned All-Gateway honors. Lefevra was first-team All-America selection by Don Hanson's Football Gazette. Alfonzo was an honorable mention selection as a return specialist.
