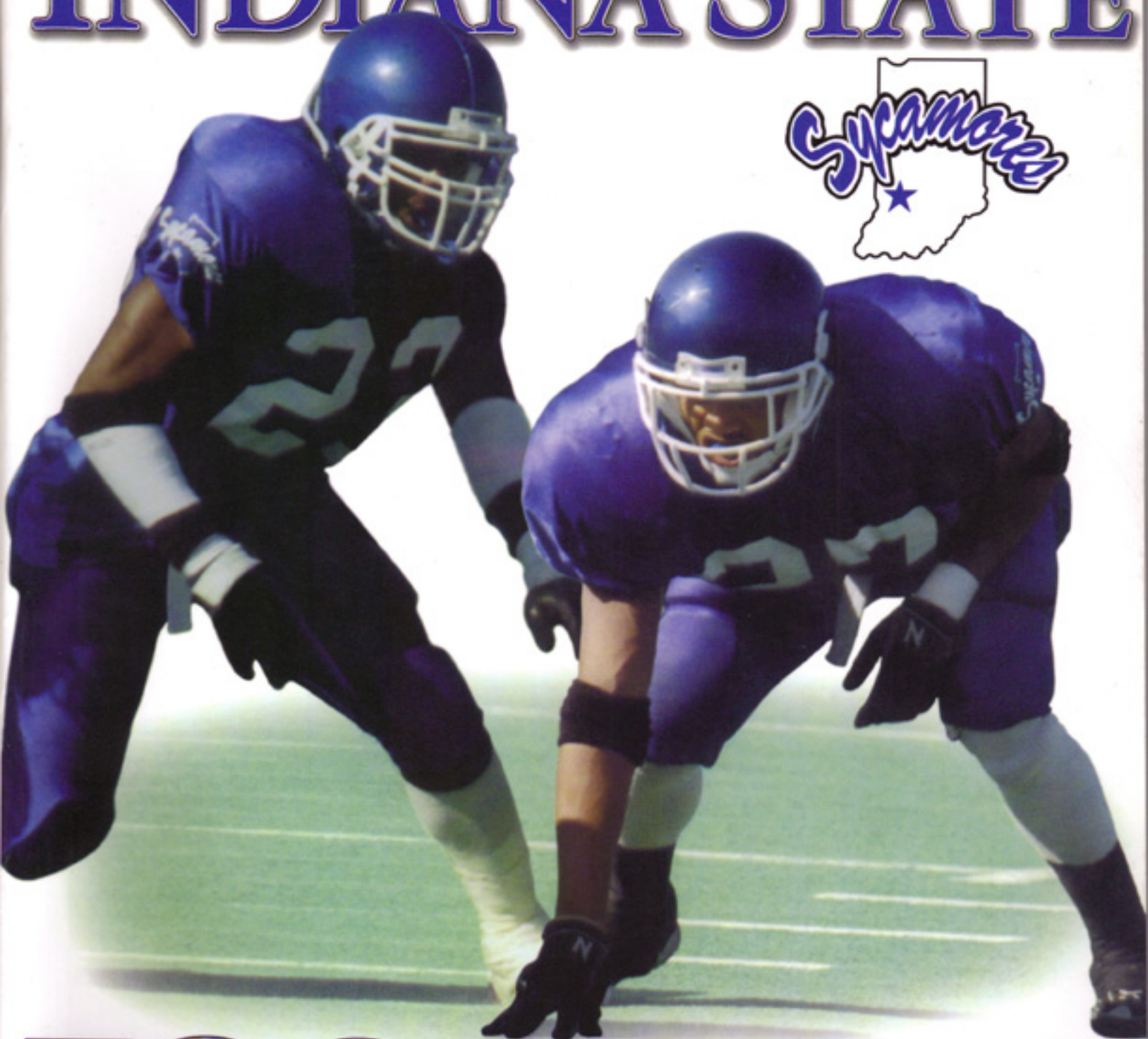

2000 INDIANA STATE MEDIA INFORMATION

TO THE MEDIA:

It is our goal that you find this publication useful while covering Indiana State University's 2000 football team. Every effort has been made to include timely, pertinent information.

Additional requests by accredited media representatives for items such as color photography, video tape, feature material, etc. should be directed to our office. It is our purpose to serve you.

CREDENTIALS:

Requests for working press, radio, television and photographer passes should be made as early as possible to Kent Johnson, Director for Athletics Media Relations, Indiana State University, Student Services Building, Room A-15, Terre Haute, IN 47809. Telephone: (812) 237-4160, FAX (812) 237-4157. Credentials may be picked up in the Media Relations office prior to the first game, thereafter they will be left at Memorial Stadium Media Will Call. Credentials must be made visible at all times for proper identification by Indiana State security personnel. Weekly print media and non-reporting radio-TV representatives have least priority to media reservations. Likewise, we are unable to accommodate children, spouses or other nonworkers.

PHOTO / SIDELINE CREDENTIALS:

Follow the same procedure as used in requesting press box credentials. Credential must be exchanged for an armband prior to going to field level.

MEDIA WILL CALL:

The Memorial Stadium media Will Call is located at the southwest gate area of the stadium. Credentials may be picked up 90 minutes prior to game time.

PRESS BOX:

Entrance: The entrance to the Memorial Stadium press box is via the elevator located on the west side of the stadium, directly across from main gate.

Layout: The Memorial Stadium press box is a single-level facility. The main area is reserved for print media and statistics personnel. There are separate booths for radio and television networks, coaches and film crews.

Radio Networks: The originating station for each team's radio network is provided a booth from which to broadcast. Phone lines are provided in the visitor's radio booth on a reciprocal basis.

Television: Should a station wish to originate live coverage of a game, a broadcast booth will be provided to the originating network. All telecasts must have the approval of the Indiana State University Athletics Director.

Coaches Booth: Home and visiting coaching staffs are provided a booth from which to work. The booth can seat four people.

Photo Deck: An open air photo deck is located on the pressbox roof. Secondary radio broadcasts may also be placed on the roof due to space limitations.

Sideline: Indiana State follows NCAA regulations regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers are not permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and must display their credential armbands at all times. Media may not work inside the team areas at any time. Representatives from the Indiana State Athletics Media Relations Office will be responsible for sideline control.

MEDIA PARKING:

There is no designated media parking area at Memorial Stadium. However, there is ample parking available near the press box entrance.

PRESS BOX SERVICES:

Statistical and informational materials including pre-game notes, flip cards and gameday programs will be distributed in the press box prior to game time. Two telephone lines are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Play-by-play, complete quarter, halftime and final game statistics and drive charts will be available shortly after the game. A light meal and beverages will be available to accredited media one hour prior to game time. Beverages will be available throughout the game.

POST-GAME PROCEDURE:

Prior to the end of the game, Media Relations personnel will collect interview requests. Following a 10-minute cooling off period, Coach McGuire and selected players will be available in the 200 Club Room, located beneath the press box on the ground level. The Sycamore locker room will also be open to the media, unless otherwise informed by a member of the Media Relations staff. The visiting locker room will be open at the discretion of the visiting SID.

FAX SERVICE:

Given proper notice, the ISU Athletics Media Relations Office will provide reasonable FAX service to accredited media.

RADIO INFORMATION:

Radio contract requests and information should be directed to the Indiana State Athletics Media Relations Office. Stations designated as "official" by visiting opponents will be provided a courtesy telephone line on press row. All other stations requesting broadcast space must pay a fee of \$50 to Indiana State University and will be accommodated on the press box roof.

PLAYER INTERVIEW POLICY:

All requests for player interviews must be made through the Media Relations office. Players have been instructed to conduct no interviews unless they have been set up in this manner. The interviews generally will be conducted before or after practice at Memorial Stadium. Players generally are available throughout the week with the exception of game days. Requests for telephone interviews will be handled by players returning phone calls to the media. No home numbers for players will be given out.

INTERVIEWS WITH COACH TIM MCGUIRE:

Interviews with Coach Tim McGuire may be arranged through the Athletics Media Relations Office by calling (812) 237-4160. It is best to arrange phone interviews during the morning. If you are unable to speak with Coach McGuire during the mornings, he is available to talk to the media prior to or directly after the conclusion of practice at Memorial Stadium.

DIRECTIONS TO INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY:

From the east: Take Interstate 70 west to the second Terre Haute Exit (U.S. Highway 41). Turn right onto U.S. 41 North and travel approximately three miles. Turn right onto Chestnut Street.

From the west: Take Interstate 70 east to the second Terre Haute Exit (U.S. Highway 41). Turn left onto U.S. 41 North and travel approximately three miles. Turn right onto Chestnut Street.

DIRECTIONS TO MEMORIAL STADIUM:

Memorial Stadium is located on the northeast corner of Wabash and Brown Avenue.

From the east (Indianapolis): Take Interstate 70 west to the first Terre Haute exit (Hwy 46). Turn right onto Highway 46 North and travel approximately two miles to Wabash Avenue. Turn left onto Wabash Avenue and travel approximately one mile to Brown Avenue (second stoplight).

From the west (St. Louis): Take Interstate 70 east to the third Terre Haute exit (Highway 46). Turn right onto Highway 46 North and travel approximately two miles to Wabash Avenue. Turn left onto Wabash Avenue and travel approximately one mile to Brown Avenue (second stoplight).

SYCAMORES SET TO UNLEASH OPTION ATTACK, REVAMPED DEFENSE IN 2000 CAMPAIGN

At the conclusion of the 1999 football season, Indiana State head coach Tim McGuire knew that he and his staff had two primary issues to address in remedying that season's shortcomings. First, they had to find some way for the Sycamores to win the numerous games which ended in defeat by a touchdown or less. And secondly, they knew that, in losing three individuals who earned either pre- or post-season all-America honors, a more 'team-oriented' defensive scheme was in order.

The solutions appear to lie in a more experienced offensive unit, as a whole, as well as a change in defensive alignment combined with more experience at several key defensive positions.

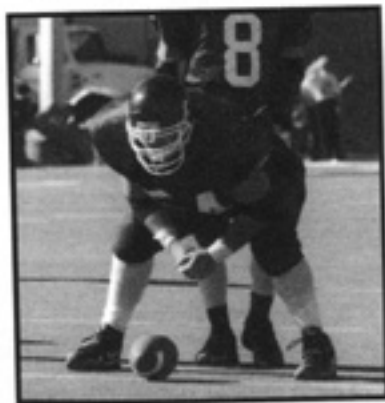
OFFENSIVE OUTLOOK

The basis for any successful running game is a strong offensive line, and so it is with the Sycamores, who return four starters, including center **Eric Martin**, guards **Neal Biggs** and **Ryan Knigga** and tackle **Sid Swartzendruber**. Martin, who earned second-team all-Gateway honors last season provides solid blocking in both run or pass modes. He will be backed by **Pace McCormick**. Biggs and Knigga, each 11-game starters last season, return at the guard positions, with a pair of redshirt-freshmen, **Josh Sewell** and **Jason Drumb**, serving in support roles. Veteran **Dan Denaut** looks to line up at one tackle, while **Sid Swartzendruber**, a starter at tight end a year ago, will be moving his skills to the other tackle position. **Terry Henry** (a former tight end) and **Ryan Ralston** also figure to play into the offensive line rotation.

Quarterback **Sheraton Fox** will be entering his third season as the Sycamores' starting quarterback. One of just four Division-I quarterbacks to rush for 1,000+ yards last season, Fox also became the first quarterback in Gateway Football Conference history to have led his team in rushing yardage in two consecutive seasons. 1999 saw the Bartow, FL, native gain 1,034 yards on a team-high 228 carries and eight touchdowns.

Joining Fox as returnees in the offensive backfield are halfback **Jared Sessum**, and fullbacks **John Effinger**, and **Calvin Thomas**. **Robert Boltinghouse**, **Shane Guy** and **Jason Lane** all saw limited action a year ago but should see plenty of duty in 2000. Sessum accounted for 497 yards on 94 carries and scored five TDs

last season. He also averaged 14.0 yards per catch, with 10 catches for 140 yards and one TD. Effinger and Thomas are prototypical fullbacks. Last season saw Effinger carry the ball 56 times, gaining 223 net yards while being held for minus yardage on just two occasions. He also tallied a pair of touchdowns, one of which was a 46-yard scamper at Eastern Kentucky. Thomas, meanwhile, accounted for 271 yards and four TDs on 57 carries.

The Sycamores return an experienced tandem at split end, led by senior **Marques Clayton**. An eleven-game starter a year ago, the South Bend, IN, native caught 10 passes for 146 yards and 2 TDs. Senior **Keith Herron** (5-72 yds.) has also seen action at halfback as well as spot duty at quarterback in 1999, registered 25 carries for 59 yards last season. **Tommy Signars** brings excellent speed to the position. **Charlie Seale** and **Tim Sommer** will man the tight end slot. Seale was a squadman last season, while Sommer has good size for the position and demonstrated his ability to catch the ball across the middle during spring drills.

DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK

In addressing the defensive concerns, McGuire and his staff elected to sideline the 4-4 alignment from which Indiana State's defense has operated over the past few seasons. With four starters returning from a year ago, the Sycamores will now base out of a 4-3 defensive set, designed to take better advantage of the Sycamores' speed and experience in the secondary.

at least one starting assignment a year ago. Strong safety Chris Sapp, a first-team Gateway Conference all-Academic honoree, is the second-leading tackler returning for the Sycamores in 2000. In nine games year ago, he registered 42 solo and 74 total involvements, one interception, two PBUs and forced a team-high three fumbles. Michael Brooks was an all-Gateway Conference Newcomer honoree as an 11-game starter

at cornerback last season, producing 64 stops (37 solo, 27 assisted) and tied for the team lead with three pass interceptions. Possibly the most athletic Sycamore, Robin Johnson mans the free safety position. As a true freshman in 1999, Johnson logged 11 tackles, two interceptions and blocked a pair of kicks. Chris Lynce saw considerable duty in the secondary and will return at cornerback. Kenny Dinkins and Brandon Simpson, both coming off redshirt campaigns, and Mike Gilbert, a transfer from Illinois, and squadman Clythel Branson look to bolster the secondaries efforts.

The Sycamores should again field a solid kicking game. Mike Megyesi, a 1999 all-Gateway Conference Newcomer Team honoree, was five-of-seven on field goals inside of 40 yards last season and set a Sycamore single-game scoring mark for kickers when he booted 15 points against Western Illinois. Kevin Dean averaged 33.0 yards per punt as a true freshman, downing 11 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line, while freshman Patrick Jordan averaged 42.5 yard average as a prep senior.

2000 INDIANA STATE MEMORIAL STADIUM

Home for the Sycamores over the past 31 years is venerable Memorial Stadium. The 12,764-seat structure has stood at the corner of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute, IN, since its original construction in 1924. The facility was acquired by Indiana State University in 1967.

The stadium has been kept in excellent condition through the years and its latest addition was a \$400,000 All-Pro Turf surface installed prior to the 1989 season.

Memorial Stadium is not new to synthetic surfaces though, as the stadium and Indiana State University claim distinction as the world's first university to own and make outdoor application of Astroturf. Following the University's acquisition of the stadium, Indiana State opened the 1967 season with a 41-6 win over Eastern Illinois in the first game played on the new surface.

Advantages to using synthetic surfaces include durability (some 15 college and high school football games are played on the surface each year in addition to daily Indiana State practices), a constant surface and sure footing regardless of weather. The All-Pro Turf also is designed to provide more cushion and reduce injuries.

Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the public for the first time on May 5, 1925, as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria Tractors before an estimated crowd of 9,000. Among the honored guests were Major League Baseball Commissioner Judge Kennesaw Mountain Landis and Charles Barnard of the Cleveland Indians.

The first use of the playing field was in the fall of 1924, when Wiley and Garfield High Schools played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.



Two photos of Memorial Stadium as it formerly appeared. From these pictures, one can easily make out the Stadium's previous baseball configuration. The main arch and outfield wall remain today.



Original construction of Memorial Stadium was begun in 1922, at a cost of \$450,000. Upon the University gaining control in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included: the reorientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to its present east-west configuration; the installation of Astroturf; and the construction of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as the rebuilding of seats on the south side. The original arch still remains from the original structure; however, the bleacher seats, installed in 1967, were removed in the summer of 1996, replaced by a landscaped hill which serves as a general admission section and a site for pre-game tailgating for Sycamore fans.

Former Indiana State head coach Dennis Raetz took full advantage of Memorial Stadium. His Sycamore teams posted a 67-30-1 mark for a .689 winning percentage in 18 seasons at Memorial Stadium. Raetz's teams were even better under the lights at the stadium, compiling a 34-4-1 mark for an .885 winning percentage.

TIM MCGUIRE – HEAD COACH

Tim McGuire begins his third season as the head coach of the Sycamores. The personable McGuire has been a vital part of Sycamore football for the past seven seasons, having guided the Indiana State defense as the program's defensive coordinator before becoming head coach prior to the 1998 campaign. He has also served as the assistant head coach, as well as instructing the ISU defensive backs.

During his three seasons the Sycamores' head coach, McGuire has developed three all-Americans – defensive back/return specialist DeJuan Alfonzo and defensive ends Shannon Jackson and Troy Lefevra.

McGuire's Sycamore defensive units have ranked among the top four Gateway Football Conference leaders in five of the past six years. His 1994 squad was first among the Gateway in total defense and 17th in the nation, while the 1995 team finished second in league play and 20th nationally.

In his five years as defensive coordinator, McGuire's units recorded three shutouts and 10 games in which the opposition failed to score more than 10 points. He has coached three All-Americans, including current Buffalo Bill standout Dan Brandenburg, Chris Libaire and Richard Moss.

The Omaha, NE, native has also tutored nine student-athletes who have garnered first-team, all-conference honors, while six have earned second-team. McGuire also has tutored nine academic all-Conference honorees.

Prior to his arrival at Indiana State, McGuire spent two seasons at the United States Naval Academy. In 1991 he coached the linebackers for the varsity squad, and the following year (1992) he was the defensive coordinator for the academy's lightweight football team. The '92 team finished with a 7-0 record enroute to the East Lightweight Football Championship.

The 2000 campaign represents McGuire's fifth season as a head coach, as he served two seasons (1981-82) as head coach of Morningside College, a Division II school in Sioux City, Iowa. McGuire compiled a 7-15 mark in his two-year head coaching debut, but his record is

somewhat deceiving. His 1981 team went 5-6, recording the most wins for the school in 10 years, and despite falling to 2-9 the following year, his two recruiting classes eventually posted winning seasons of 6-5 in 1984 and 7-3-1 in 1985.

McGuire honed his skills as a defensive intellect with stints at Northern Illinois University as well as at Kansas State University.

At Northern Illinois, McGuire spent four seasons (1986-1990) as the Huskies' defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. While at the Dekalb, IL, institution, he coached five players who signed contracts with the

NFL, as well as All-Americans Doug Bartlett, Cary Caliendo and Ron Delisi. His 1987 squad ranked third nationally in interceptions, 34th in total defense and 42nd in passing defense, while his 1988 defensive unit held the opposition to an average of 10 points or less per game enroute to ranking 23rd nationally in scoring defense. The 1989 Huskies finished fourth in turnover margin and 29th in rushing defense, allowing just six opponents to eclipse 100 yards in team rushing.

His stint at Kansas State lasted two years from 1984-85. Serving as the Wildcats' defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, McGuire instructed Barton Hundley—a Chicago Bears draft selection and a first-team, all-Big Eight pick.

McGuire acquired his love for Indiana State in a one-year assignment as defensive coordinator with the Sy-



camores during their Division I-AA playoff run in 1983. Not only was his defensive unit ranked first in the Missouri Valley Conference in turnover margin and second in both total defense and scoring defense, but it was at this time that McGuire began his streak of producing All-Americans and NFL draft picks.

Former Sycamore standouts DeJuan Alfonso, Vencie Glenn, Ed Martin, Kevin Ramsey, Walter Seaphus and Sam Suggs all played under McGuire and later signed contracts in the NFL. As for all-Americans, Alfonso, Glenn, Martin and Wayne Davis all grabbed such honors.

McGuire spent three seasons (1978-80) as an assistant coach instructing the linebackers at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Prior to UNO, McGuire spent the

1977 season as an assistant football coach and mathematics teacher at Millard High School in Omaha, NE. He began his professional career in 1975 as head football coach and mathematics teacher at Archbishop Ryan in Omaha.

McGuire played offensive guard at the University of Nebraska for four seasons (1971-74), receiving his bachelor's degree in mathematics. He later attained a master's degree from the University of Nebraska-Omaha in physical education.

McGuire is a member of several organizations, including American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), American Red Cross and American Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

McGuire and his wife, Judy, are the parents of four children: Lisa, Tim, Jr. (currently an offensive lineman for the Sycamores), Molly and Paul.





GENE BOLEY
OFFENSIVE LINE
(CENT. CONNECTICUT ST. '72)

Heading into his third season at Indiana State, Boley will tutor the offensive line. Prior to joining the Indiana State football staff, Boley served one season as the head coach at Maury High School in Norfolk, VA.

Previously, Boley spent one season as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at King George (VA) High School.



Boley also served a stint as the offensive line coach at Western New Mexico in 1995, where he coached alongside current Sycamore running backs coach Sam Murphy.

Boley spent the 1994 campaign as the head football coach at the Marine Military Academy in Harlingen, TX. He also coached the lightweight football team at the U.S. Naval Academy for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one season as the head

coach of the Naval Academy's junior varsity team.

He attended Central Connecticut State in New Britain, CT, where he was a two-year performer at offensive tackle. He also played two seasons at Grand Rapids Junior College.

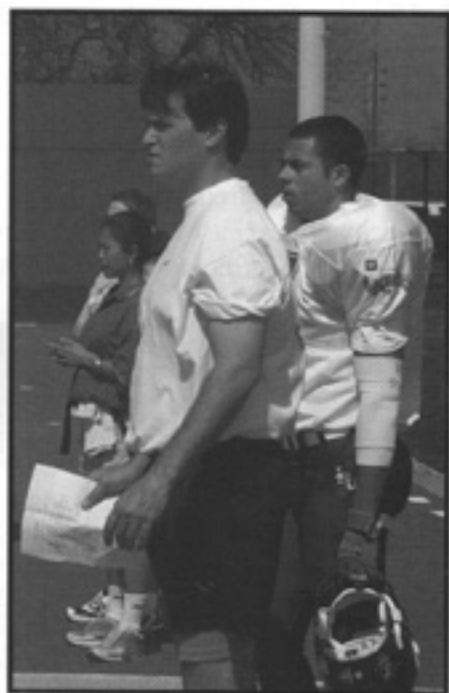

One of the great performers in Gateway Football Conference history, Smith enters his second season with the Indiana State football program. In his first year, he served as the Sycamores' quarterbacks coach, mentoring Sycamore QB Sheraton Fox who gained over 1,000 rushing yards. This season will find Smith undertaking the additional responsibilities of coordinating the entire offensive unit.



As a standout quarterback for Southwest Missouri State, Smith starred at quarterback and was a first team All-Gateway selection, as well as the Gateway Offensive Player of the Year in both 1989 as well as 1990. Smith finished his career with 36 rushing TDs and is the only Gateway QB to

rush for more than 2,000 yards in a career.

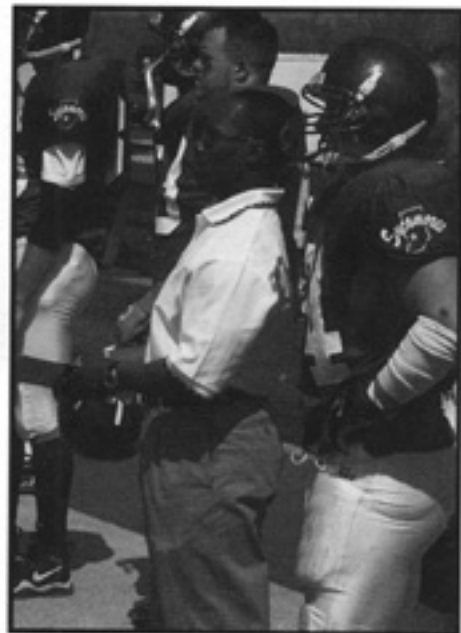
From 1993-98, Brown held an assortment of duties in the minor league football system. In 1998, he served as Commissioner of the South Central Football League (SCFL).

Indiana State part of NCAA CHAMPS Life Skills Program

"Preparing Student-Athletes for the Challenges of Life....."

Programming for freshmen student-athletes is centered on value clarification, the development of time management skills, sports nutrition for healthy living and top performance, study skills, stress management, and drug and alcohol education.

"Smart Sex: Sexual Responsibility & Student-Athletes" is a workshop offered to sophomore student-athletes to address issues concerning sexual responsibility and safe dating. Campus facilitators are on hand to educate students on the facts concerning sexual assault and assist in the development of healthy dating lifestyles.

The Athletics Media Relations Department conducts a program on "Dealing with the Media" to help student-athletes develop strong media relations skills. Local media personnel come together to allow student-athletes the opportunity to ask questions and learn through mock interviews.

The Senior "Life After Sports" Seminar assists student-athletes to prepare for what lies on the other side; to help them to bridge the gap from college to professional life in the work world. Guest speakers, former Indiana State Student-Athletes who have made successful transitions, return to give student-athletes advice on how to cope with "Life after sports."

SAFE "Sycamore Athletes for Education" is a volunteer community service program in which student-athletes have the opportunity to make a meaningful contribution to the Terre Haute community. Student-Athletes share their time with elementary school children once a week to stress the importance of education through reading.

UNIVERSITY 101

The Academic Support Program for Athletics has adopted a proactive approach to academics in order to prepare the student-athlete for the many challenges associated with balancing both academics and athletics. Beginning with the Athletic Department Orientation and Study Skills Class (**University 101**), student-athletes are provided with a wealth of information and strategies for success during their first term at Indiana State. The class, teamed with study halls, tutoring, small study groups, and periodic progress monitoring, helps to ensure that each and every student-athlete at Indiana State has the best possible opportunity for both personal and academic success.

University 101 is a course to help students make a successful transition into the University by introducing the concepts and values of a University education, of liberal studies, and of the preparation in the disciplines; by fostering a sense of ideas and people; by developing critical thinking skills as well as academic and personal skills necessary for success; and by providing an introduction to the resources and services of the University.

The Academic Support Program has been able to make continuous gains in the level of academic achievement in the percentage of scholar athletes compiling a 3.0 grade point average or better. This past year at least 40 percent of our student-athletes achieved a 3.0 GPA, earning a spot on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll. Coaching staffs, administration, faculty, and the university community have all been very supportive of our efforts as we assist student-athletes working toward that ever im-

portant goal of gaining a college degree. Lessons learned through the academic advisement program have proved extremely valuable to several members of the Indiana State football program.

INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY'S ATHLETIC ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

- In Spring of 1999, 52 percent (137 of 266) of all student-athletes were on the Honor Roll (3.0), an all-time high.
- In Fall of 1998, 50 percent (144 of 286) of all student-athletes were on the Honor Roll.
- In Spring of 1999, 40 percent (117) of student-athletes on the Missouri Valley and Gateway Conference Honor Rolls.
- 47 percent of all student-athletes had a 3.0 or higher cumulative grade-point average.

In this capacity Ralston serves as head athletic trainer for the Sycamore football and men's basketball teams, as well as an instructor in Indiana State's acclaimed Athletic Training education program.

Honored as the 2000 Athletic Trainer of the Year - College/University Level by the Indiana Athletic Trainers' Association, Ralston served from 1990-95 as Athletic Trainer and Team Travel Coordinator for the men's basketball program at the University of Michigan, a role which took him to two NCAA Final Fours with the "Fab Five."

Ralston served as Coordinator of Sports Medicine at Terre Haute's Union Hospital from 1987-90, and as Assistant Athletic Trainer at Eastern Kentucky University from 1985-87.

Three athletic training rooms, located in the Health & Human Performance Building, the Hulman Center and at Memorial Stadium, are all equipped with the latest therapeutic and rehabilitative equipment. The athletic medicine staff is directed by three sports medicine trained team physicians—Dr. Tom Klootwyk, orthopaedist of the Methodist

Sports Medicine Center; and Dr.'s John and James Welch, primary care physicians from the AP&S Northside Family Medicine Clinic. Together, our athletic trainers and physicians offer the latest methods and technology in the care of athletic injury and illness. At their access is a network of medical specialists and consultants that round out a comprehensive sports medical system.

The team of medical professionals caring for Sycamore intercollegiate athletes is contemporary in its methods and is constantly seeking continuing education in an effort to remain on the cutting edge of sports medicine.

2000 INDIANA STATE STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

ISU's strength and conditioning program is conducted in a state-of-the art 10,000-square foot facility which is located in University Hall. The facility, funded by private donations, is divided into three main areas which include free weights and weight machines, movement drills and plyometric training.

Indiana State's strength and conditioning program is an integral part of each player's development. All weight training is coordinated with on-field activities.

The program, which includes a speed and movement program, is designed to improve each individual player's speed and overall athletic ability. Injury prevention also plays an important role in the overall program.

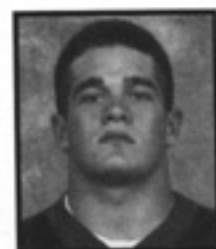
1997– Sat out the season as a redshirt.

In this age of six-foot-plus signal-callers, Sheraton Fox may seem diminutive. However, there may not be a quarterback better suited to running the option offense than the Sycamores' exciting triggerman, who last season became the first quarterback in Gateway Football Conference history, and one of just four Division I QB's in the country, to rush for 1,000 yards in a single-season.

1999- In addition to becoming the first quarterback in Gateway history to eclipse the 1,000-yard rushing mark, Fox became the first quarterback in Gateway Football Conference history to lead his team in rushing two consecutive seasons as he gained 1,034 yards rushing on 228 carries. One of just four Gateway Conference individuals to rush for 1,000 yards, the Bartow, FL, native orchestrated 17 plays of 20-yards or more (seven of which went for 30+ yards), including a long run of 54 yards. He had eight rushes from scrimmage of 20 yards or longer, while his 94.0 yard-per-game rushing average ranked fourth among Gateway Conference leaders. Fox scored a team-leading eight rushing TDs, including a two rushing TD performance (a 49-yarder and a one-yard dive) against Western Illinois. Against those Leathernecks, he rushed for a career-high 163 yards on 24 carries. He concluded the season with a 22-carry, 161-yard effort at Southwest Missouri St., and had total of five 100+yard outings, including rushing for 128 yards vs. Youngstown St. Fox accounted for 214 yards in total offense against YSU (recording one rushing and one passing touchdown, scoring on a 17-yard run in the first quarter and later hitting Marques Clayton with a 27-yard tally), 123 yards vs. Western Kentucky and a 110-yard performance at Northern Iowa. Against Southern Illinois, he registered 249 yards in total offense, completing 13-of-17 passes for 179 yards and three TDs and rushing for 70 yards and one TD.

1998- Fox stepped into the starting QB role seven games into the season and led the Sycamore ground attack with 431 yards, 3 TDs and a pair of 100-yard rushing efforts. He started the final five games of the year and was named to the Gateway Conference All-Newcomer team. Fox had two 100-yard rushing performances versus SE Missouri State (106) and Murray State (140). He also passed for 345 yards and six TDs against Southern Illinois, completing 7-of-8 for 209 yards and three TDs.

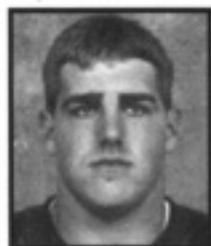

Lloyd W. Benjamin III, previously vice president for academic affairs at Valdosta State University, was named the 10th president of Indiana State University by the ISU Board of Trustees in a special meeting Feb. 19, 2000.

Benjamin had served in his previous position at Valdosta State for five years. Prior to that, he served on the faculty and as an administrator at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock for 19 years.

Beginning in 1976 as an assistant professor and coordinator of art history, he moved through the faculty ranks to full professor. He served as chair of the department of art from 1980 to 1984 and was named acting dean of the College of Fine Arts in 1983, becoming dean the following year. In 1988, his role expanded to become dean of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, a position he filled until becoming vice president at Valdosta.

Benjamin also taught for six years at East Carolina University where he was elected president of the faculty and chairperson of the faculty senate. He earned a bachelor of arts degree in art history from Emory University and a Ph.D. in the same field from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

"We are extremely pleased to have selected Lloyd Benjamin to lead Indiana State University. We are impressed with his wealth of experience in many areas, particularly in building collaborative partnerships, using technology to enhance education and his involvement in education reform efforts," said Charlotte Zietlow, president of the ISU Board of Trustees.

Benjamin was impressed with the rigor of the search process and with the campus and community participation. The broad participation also was evident in the university's planning efforts, he added.

"I was impressed with what I had seen going on, the processes that had been put in place on campus, and the quality of the dialogue on campus about very significant issues. I think there has been a tremendous foundation laid and a number of really important initiatives put into place that are going to bear fruit for this institution. Indiana State clearly is a gem. It has the potential for a tremendous future."

Originally from Ohio, Benjamin moved to Georgia when he was 10. His wife, Wieke van der Weyden, is a biochemist with a Ph.D. from Leiden University in the Netherlands. They have two children, Saskia, who lives in Atlanta, GA, and Lloyd, a resident of Little Rock, AR.

Certainly no stranger to Indiana State University and Sycamore athletics, Andrea Myers is in her second year as the Director of Athletics, having spent the last nine years as a part of the Indiana State athletics administration. She served as Interim Athletics Director during the 1994-95 academic year as well as a portion of the 1998-99 year.

Before ascending into the director's role, Myers was the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director. And, as she is known at the University, served as the University's NCAA Compliance Officer, while also overseeing budgetary matters and many of the day-to-day operations of the 14 intercollegiate sports at Indiana State.

She serves on the Missouri Valley Conference Compliance Committee and is the chair of the Gender Equity Committee. Myers has served as a member of the NCAA's Committee on Committees for Women's Athletics. She recently was elected by the Joint Committee to serve as the Missouri Valley Conference's representative to the NCAA Management Council.

Myers moved into her administrative capacity in April, 1989, after a successful seven-year tenure as Indiana State's women's basketball coach. An Indiana State graduate, Myers led the Sycamores to 40 wins in her final two seasons, including a school-best 22-6 mark in 1988. In that same year, Myers was named Gateway Conference Coach of the Year after ISU posted a 14-4 league mark, also a school-best.

Prior to accepting the head coaching post at ISU, Myers guided the Vincennes University Lady Trailblazers to an impressive 15-year record of 209-95 and several appearances in the NJCAA postseason tournament. She was twice selected the NJCAA Region 12 Coach of the Year and led VU to two national third-place finishes. While at Vincennes, Myers also served as chairperson of HPER.

A native of Dana, IN, and a graduate of South Vermillion High School, Myers earned both her bachelor's and master's in physical education from ISU. She participated in women's basketball and field hockey and received the Hillman Award as a senior.

Myers is active in the Terre Haute community as a member of the Rotary Club and serves on the board of directors of both the Covered Bridge Girl Scout Council and the YWCA.

Dennis Raetz is in his third year as Associate Athletics Director for Compliance. Raetz assumed his current duties in December of 1997, after serving as the Sycamores' head football coach for the previous 18 years.

Raetz handles the athletics department's compliance department, making sure Indiana State is adhering to NCAA, Missouri Valley and Gateway Football Conferences rules and regulations. He also serves as the department's academic liaison.

Raetz is the most prolific football coach in Indiana State University history. In 1991, Raetz became the all-time winningest coach in Sycamore history, surpassing the legendary Wally Marks. He finished his 18-year career with 93 victories in exactly 200 games.

The former "Dean of the Gateway Conference" guided the ISU program to its greatest heights including a No. 1 national ranking during most of the 1984 season and two trips to the NCAA I-AA playoffs. Raetz was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 while also garnering Kodak I-AA District Coach of the Year honors. The 1995 campaign saw Raetz guide the Sycamores to their fifth-best record in school history.

Raetz has been a fixture at ISU since 1978 when he came to Terre Haute to serve on Dick Jamieson's staff as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. He remained in that position for two seasons before taking over the top job on February 25, 1980.

A native of North Platte, NE, Raetz attended the University of Nebraska on a football scholarship, but his playing career was cut short by a severe knee injury. Following his college graduation in 1968, he was an assistant coach at North Kansas City High School in Missouri for five seasons before accepting head-coaching responsibilities at J.C. Harmon High School in Kansas City, KS.

In 1977, Raetz joined the University of Missouri coaching staff where he worked with the defensive ends in addition to his duties as the junior varsity head coach.

Raetz and his wife Betty reside in nearby Riley, IN. Their daughter Jaime graduated from the University of Nebraska and is a school teacher in the Kansas City, MO, area. Their son Mark is a defensive back at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO.

Cathy Grothe is in her fifth season as head of the athletics marketing department. She is responsible for increasing revenue for the department through the identification and solicitation of corporate sponsorships.

In addition to marketing each of the department's 14 intercollegiate athletics programs, Grothe is responsible for the development of the Gift-in-Kind program, handling the athletics department merchandising and licensing program, as well as being the administrator for the Indiana State fastpitch softball program. She also supervises the Sycamore Radio Network and negotiates all contracts on behalf of the network in addition to contract negotiations for the coaches' television show and game programs. Grothe recently negotiated a media package ensuring numerous televised broadcasts of Sycamore football and men's and women's basketball events over the next three years. She has also developed a network of affiliate stations in Indiana and Illinois, which will expand the coverage of Sycamore radio and television broadcasts outside the Terre Haute area.

Prior to her arrival at Indiana State, Grothe spent four years as Athletic Promotions Director at the University of Montana in Missoula. While at Montana she was credited with developing community support for the athletics programs, increasing attendance in women's basketball to more than 5,000 fans each of her last two years, and drawing record crowds of more than 15,000 spectators.

Grothe began her career in sports marketing at The University of Iowa, where she served as graduate assistant for the 1991-92 season. She was responsible for the production of all promotional materials and developing game promotions to increase attendance for all Hawkeye events. Before her career began in sports marketing, she was a marketing representative for Iowa State Bank & Trust in Iowa City, Iowa.

She is on the executive board of directors of the YWCA, a member of the Wabash Valley American Marketing Association and the Young Professionals Club of Terre Haute.

Grothe is a 1989 graduate of The University of Iowa, earning a degree in marketing with a communications minor. She later received a master's degree in journalism and public relations in 1994.

Jim Norton is in his second year as the Director of Development for Athletics at Indiana State University.

Norton came to the Sycamores following a four-year stint at Central Michigan University, where he served two years as Assistant Director of Admissions and two years as Development Officer.

While at CMU, he was responsible for coordinating a Capital Campaign that helped fund a 10,000-seat football stadium expansion and a new indoor athletic complex.

Prior to CMU, Norton worked three years as Assistant Director of Admissions at Alma College.

Norton's primary responsibility is directing fund-raising activities pertaining to intercollegiate athletics. This includes the annual giving program (Sycamore Athletics Scholarship Fund).

The Grand Rapids, MI, native earned a bachelors degree in English in 1991 from Central Michigan and followed that, in 1997, with his Masters in Higher Education Administration.

Norton and his wife, Kristin, reside in Terre Haute.

Prior to coming to ISU, Vancza served as the Head Athletic Trainer for Dunbar High School in Lexington, KY, from 1989-91. She also worked as an athletic trainer for Central Baptist Hospital Sports Medicine Clinic. Vancza served as Bryan Station High School's first full-time athletic trainer in connection with the Kentucky Sports Medicine Clinic from 1985-89.

Vancza spent six years on the Kentucky Governor's Task Force for Sports Medicine and helped develop the first athletic trainer outreach program in Lexington, which provided athletic training services to 17 secondary schools.

Vancza was a graduate assistant athletic trainer at the University of Kentucky from 1983-85 and graduated from Purdue University with a bachelor's degree in 1983.

Indiana State University, home of the Sycamores, is located in the heart of Mid-America, Terre Haute, IN, a thriving community with a population of 60,000.

Founded in 1865 as a training school for teachers, ISU enrolled its first 21 students in 1870. Today — three name changes later — the University offers its 11,000 students more than 160 degree programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Business; Education; Technology; Graduate Studies; Nursing; and Health and Human Performance. Degrees are awarded at associate, baccalaureate, master's, educational specialist and doctoral levels.

In addition, ISU offers a variety of non-credit courses, cultural and recreational opportunities, and diversified workshops, seminars and conferences.

Characterized by small class sizes, Indiana State has a faculty and staff committed to a personal approach to higher education. Nine out of 10 classes are taught by full-time professors.

ISU's 70,000 alumni occupy positions of leadership in education, business, industry, government and public service.

More than 60 buildings, plazas and walkways comprise the main campus on 90 acres adjacent to the Terre Haute business district. In addition, the University maintains family housing units on a 15-acre site one mile south of the main campus and a 12,764-seat football and athletic facility two miles to the east. The 35-acre river campus located along the Wabash is the site of the University's outstanding baseball program.

The campus is continually changing, with two facilities — the Music Rehearsal Hall and the Technology Center — completed within the last year. The music building features a rotunda lobby with a 175-seat recital hall, rehearsal rooms, teaching studios and an art gallery. The technology structure, with 35 state-of-the-art laboratories and a 100-seat multimedia room, has a sky lit, three-story atrium as its major design feature.



Collections section houses the Eugene V. Debs papers, early Indiana textbooks and one of the largest early dictionary collections in the world. An interlibrary loan service and several database searching units also are available.

Hulman Center, completed in 1973, probably is best known as the arena in which basketball star Larry Bird played in

during his college career. Its versatility also provides an ideal location for conferences, conventions, concerts, banquets, stage shows and other services.

Hulman Memorial Student Union became the hub of campus upon its completion in 1991. Students gather by the attractive outdoor plaza and its circular fountain. The soothing sounds of cascading water set the tone for the activity that takes place in the renovated nine-story building.

Within its walls, the Dede Activity Center provides meeting space as well as recreational and fitness opportunities, while a variety of retail services and food is available in The Commons, from favorite fast-food franchises and sit-down restaurant to a bookstore, bank and convenience store.

Tilson Auditorium, located in Tirey Hall, houses the Terre Haute Symphony Orchestra and the University's Convocation Series, which brings touring Broadway productions and other entertainment to campus. The former union building also has a recital hall which features weekly concerts by University faculty and students.

The New Theater offers a modern "in-the-round" setting for year-round dramatic presentations. ISU's successful Summer-

Stage program has provided excellent entertainment for more than 30 years. The Dreiser Theater, located in Dreiser Hall, provides a proscenium stage for more traditional performances.



For more than a century and a quarter, Indiana State has played an important role in Indiana's public service. Today, ISU makes a number of contributions to economic development locally, regionally and nationally.

The Technology Services Center in the School of Technology contracts with small and medium-sized manufacturing companies to facilitate technology transfer to increase productivity and improve competitiveness.

The Center for Research and Management Services in the School of Business contracts with businesses throughout Indiana to provide targeted industry studies, applied research, consultation and training. A Small Business Development Center is part of the larger center.

The Interdisciplinary Center for Cell Products and Technology focuses on areas concerned directly with biotechnology, its commercialization and its social and ethical implications.

Also on campus is the Indiana Institute on Recycling, the country's first state-created institute charged with developing effective voluntary recycling programs.

THE SYCAMORE MASCOT & NICKNAME

In 1921 a contest was held to pick a name for the athletic teams at what was then called Indiana State Normal School. Up until this time the term "Fighting Teachers" was frequently used in press accounts of athletic contests. In January, 1922, it was announced that the name Sycamores had won a popular vote of the student body, although there is some question as to how serious the student body was in picking the name. Nevertheless, Indiana State University has used this rather unique name since this date. The problem has been that a Sycamore is a tree and does not lend itself very well to creation of a mascot. Athletic teams have been known in the past as "The Fighting Trees," which was not considered a very glamorous or intimidating a concept. For a period of time in the 1950s and 1960s, there actually was a tree mascot developed, but this posed obvious problems of embarrassment with other

mascots, when the University played such schools as the Butler Bulldogs or the Ball State Cardinals.

In 1969 a committee created the Chief Quabachi concept as a mascot for the school. This Indian Chief (and accompanying legend) was used as a mascot until 1989, when the University dropped its use of the Indian in response to a variety of objections over use of the Indian caricature. In 1995, the Indiana State University Department of Athletics announced plans for a search for a new mascot to accompany the traditional Sycamores nickname. After taking suggestions the Department of Athletics submitted a list of finalists for the ISU student body to vote. On December 6, 1995, Sycamore Sam – a unique blue and white animal – made its debut at a Sycamore men's basketball game versus Loyola University.

THE UNIVERSITY

The University was created on December 20, 1865, in which the General Assembly of the State of Indiana established "a State Normal School, the object of which shall be the preparation of teachers for teaching in the common schools of Indiana." The school was known as Indiana State Normal School and its first president, William Allen Jones, was brought on board in 1869.

For 64 years the University was known as the Normal School, but in 1929 under the guidance of president Linnaeus Neal Hines, the school changed to Indiana State Teachers College. It remained a teachers college for 31 years, and in 1960 the institution evolved

again, this time into Indiana State College while Raleigh Warren Holmstedt was the president.

For a brief five years ISU maintained the designation of State College, but in the fall of 1965, under the new president, Alan Carson Rankin, the school elevated to university status, known as Indiana State University as it is today.

OTHER INFORMATION

Other interesting information about Indiana State University:

BLUE AND WHITE

The school colors of Indiana State University since 1899, when it was announced the Yale Blue and White would replace the colors of Salmon Pink and White. The colors are also applied to the Blue and White Parade and the Blue and White Dance held during Homecoming each fall.

BOOK AND TORCH

The book and torch are official symbols of the University. The book symbolizes knowledge and truth gained at ISU, and the torch symbolizes the light of inspiration that comes to students in the University's halls.

SEAL OF THE UNIVERSITY

The current seal includes the symbols of the Book and Torch and the founding date of 1865. It was approved for use by the Board of Trustees in 1929, the year that the Normal School became the Indiana State Teachers College.

HOMECOMING

The term Homecoming was first used in print announcements for the Alumni-Varsity Basketball Game on December 9, 1916. By the year 1919 this event became known as Blue and White Day and featured dances and entertainments for alumni of the Normal School. In 1921 the events were organized around a football game scheduled earlier in the autumn. A bonfire and pep rally were added to the festivities in 1922; the Blue and White Parade in 1923; and in 1937, Bette Whitmore (Kappa Kappa) was elected Homecoming Queen.

UNIVERSITY LOGO

The Sycamore leaf symbol was designed by Dan Davis in 1985. His concept for the design was an outgrowth of a class project at a time when the University was looking for a new visual image.

THE ALMA MATER

The Alma Mater was authored by Charles M. Curry, Professor of English and Literature. It was originally entitled, "Indiana's Normal" and first printed in a June, 1912, issue of the *Normal Advance*. It was originally written as follows:

*Out upon the swelling breezes,
Let our voices ring,
As to thee, our Alma Mater,
Heartfelt praises sing,
Indiana's dear State Normal,
Friends and comrades true,
Though the years to come may part us,
Hail, all hail to you.*

This is the version that is sung today:

*Out upon the swelling breezes,
let your voices ring as to thee,
our alma mater, heartfelt praise
we sing through the years
come may part us,
friends and comrades true ISU,
our alma mater,
here's our pledge to you.*

THE FIGHT SONG

"On You Fighting Sycamores," the University's fight song, was authored and arranged by Joseph A. Gremelspacher, Professor of Music, as a pep song. It was first performed at a Homecoming even pep rally on October 20, 1939. It goes as follows:

*March on, march on, you fighting
Sycamores, Sycamores
March on, you Statesman tried and true
March on, march on to glorious victory
Raise that flag of royal blue*

*March on, march on you fighting
Sycamores, Sycamores
Shout out that victory song
Onward, ever onward to our goal
As we march on and on*

*Go Big Blue, Fight Big Blue
GO! STATE! WIN!*

2000 INDIANA STATE GATEWAY FOOTBALL CONFERENCE

In the closing years of the last millennium, the Gateway Football Conference made a convincing argument that it is the best I-AA conference in the country. With the onset of a new millennium, all signs point to continued national prominence.

The league had the best non-conference record in I-AA last season, posting a 30-12 record against non-league foes. That also set an all-time Gateway standard, but the success of the conference was not top heavy, as for the first time in league history, four Gateway teams reached seven or more wins. Illinois State (11), Northern Iowa (8) and Youngstown State (12) gave the league three eight-game winners for just the second time in conference annals, while Western Illinois recorded a seven-win campaign.

In recent years, the Gateway has established itself as a leader among Division I-AA conferences. The league has a national championship (Youngstown State in 1997), and four other Final Four trips in the past four years. Last year, both Illinois State and Youngstown State reached the semis, with YSU reaching the title game.

During the past three playoffs, the Gateway Conference has posted a I-AA best mark of 12-5. Also, the Gateway is one of just four conferences to send six teams during the past three tournaments, and the GFC has had two representatives each of the past five seasons. The Gateway is the only I-AA conference to have each of its members make the playoffs. Additionally, Southern Illinois (1983) and Youngstown State (four times) have earned national titles.

Now in its 16th year of play, the current league sponsors only football after the 10 women's sports at member institutions originally comprising the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference from 1982 until 1992 merged July 1, 1992, to put all the men's and women's sports of the member schools of the Gateway and Missouri Valley Conferences, except football, under the MVC banner.

The Gateway Football Conference remains a separate league administered from headquarters in St. Louis, MO.

The original Gateway was formed in the summer of 1982 as a 10-school Division I conference for women's athletics.

The new league was composed of the women's programs from four schools whose men's teams were in the Mid-Continent Conference and six institutions which were members of the Missouri Valley Conference.

With the four-team Mid-Continent needing additional schools to have a chance to be considered for automatic qualification status for the NCAA I-AA playoffs, and the Missouri Valley Conference dropping football as a conference sport, schools which had enough similarity of athletic philosophy to establish the Gateway, found the GCAC made an excellent vehicle for the addition of football as a league sport.

A series of meetings in the summer of 1985 led to the establishment of the Gateway football division for six schools, including SMS, Western Illinois, Eastern Illinois, Southern Illinois, Illinois State and Northern Iowa. The creations of Gateway football marked the first time in college annals that football was played in a women's conference.

The SMS Bears defeated Southern Illinois in the first football game in Gateway history on Sept. 7, 1985, in Carbondale, IL. Northern Iowa went undefeated through its 1985 league schedule to win the first conference gridiron championship.

The summer of 1986 included the addition of Indiana State as a seventh league school, and the granting of automatic qualification status for the conference champion into the NCAA Division I-AA championship playoffs after just a one-year waiting period. Eastern Illinois captured the 1986 Gateway title to carry the league banner into the NCAA national playoffs.

Membership changes since then have included the departure of charter member Eastern Illinois after the 1995 season and the addition of Youngstown State in 1997.

The quality of league play has continued to excel, indicated by the presence of two or more GFC teams in the playoffs eight times.

Patty Viverito has been Gateway commissioner since the league began in 1982. The Chicago, IL native has been a member of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, and is currently on the NCAA Council in addition to four other NCAA committee assignments.

Assistant Commissioner Mike Kern is in his 10th year heading the league's information operations, while Ed Tschannen, a former president of the Big Eight Conference Officials Association, serves as supervisor of officials for the Gateway.
