## MEDIA INFORMATION

### TO THE MEDIA:

It is our goal that you find this publication useful while covering Indiana State University's 2001 football team. Every effort has been made to include timely, pertinent information.

Additional requests by accredited media representatives for items such as color photography, video tape, feature material, etc. should be directed to our office. It is our purpose to serve you.

### CREDENTIALS:

Requests for working press, radio, television and photographer passes should be made as early as possible to Kent Johnson, Director for Athletics Media Relations, Indiana State University, Student Services Building, Room A-15, Terre Haute, IN 47809. Telephone: (812) 237-4160, FAX (812) 237-4157. Credentials may be picked up in the Media Relations office prior to the first game, thereafter they will be left at Memorial Stadium Media Will Call. Credentials must be made visible at all times for proper identification by Indiana State security personnel. Weekly print media and non-reporting radio-TV representatives have least priority to media reservations. Likewise, we are unable to accommodate children, spouses or other nonworkers.

### PHOTO / SIDELINE CREDENTIALS:

Follow the same procedure as used in requesting press box credentials. Credential must be exchanged for an armband prior to going to field level.

### MEDIA WILL CALL:

The Memorial Stadium Media Will Call is located at the southwest gate area of the stadium. Credentials may be picked up 90 minutes prior to game time.

### PRESS BOX:

**Entrance:** The entrance to the Memorial Stadium press box is via the elevator located on the west side of the stadium, directly across from main gate.

**Layout:** The Memorial Stadium press box is a single-level facility. The main area is reserved for print media and statistics personnel. There are separate booths for radio and television networks, coaches and film crews.

**Radio Networks:** The originating station for each team's radio network is provided a booth from which to broadcast. Phone lines are provided in the visitor's radio booth on a reciprocal basis.

**Television:** Should a station wish to originate live coverage of a game, a broadcast booth will be provided to the originating network. **All telecasts must have the approval of the Indiana State University Athletics Director.**

**Coaches Booth:** Home and visiting coaching staffs are provided a booth from which to work. Each booth can seat four persons.

**Photo Deck:** An open air photo deck is located on the pressbox roof. Secondary radio broadcasts may also be placed on the roof due to space limitations.

**Sideline:** Indiana State follows NCAA regulations regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers are not permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and must display their credential armbands at all times. Media may not work inside the team areas at any time. Representatives from the Indiana State Athletics Media Relations Office will be responsible for sideline control.

### MEDIA PARKING:

There is no designated media parking area at Memorial Stadium. However, there is ample parking available near the press box entrance.

### PRESS BOX SERVICES:

Statistical and informational materials including pre-game notes, flip cards and gameday programs will be distributed in the press box prior to game time. Two telephone lines are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Play-by-play, complete quarter, halftime and final game statistics and drive charts will be available shortly after the game. A light meal and beverages will be available to accredited media one hour prior to game time. Beverages will be available throughout the game.

### POST-GAME PROCEDURE:

Prior to the end of the game, Indiana State Media Relations personnel will collect interview requests. Following a 10-minute cooling off period, Coach McGuire and selected players will be available in the meeting room located to the left as you enter the football fieldhouse. Following the interview session, the Sycamore locker room will also be open to the media, unless otherwise informed by a member of the Media Relations staff. The visiting locker room will be open at the discretion of the visiting SID.

### FAX SERVICE:

Given proper notice, the ISU Athletics Media Relations Office will provide reasonable FAX service to accredited media.

### RADIO INFORMATION:

Radio contract requests and information should be directed to the Indiana State Athletics Media Relations Office. Stations designated as "official" by visiting opponents will be provided a courtesy telephone line on press row. All other stations requesting broadcast space must pay a fee of \$50 to Indiana State University and will be accommodated on the press box roof.

### PLAYER INTERVIEW POLICY:

All requests for player interviews must be made through the Media Relations office. Players have been instructed to conduct no interviews unless they have been set up in this manner. The interviews generally will be conducted before or after practice at Memorial Stadium. Players generally are available throughout the week with the exception of game days. Requests for telephone interviews will be handled by players returning phone calls to the media. **No home telephone numbers will be given out.**

### INTERVIEWS WITH COACH TIM MCGUIRE:

Interviews with Coach Tim McGuire may be arranged through the Athletics Media Relations Office by calling (812) 237-4160. It is best to arrange phone interviews during the morning. If you are unable to speak with Coach McGuire during the mornings, he is available to talk to the media prior to or directly after the conclusion of practice at Memorial Stadium.

## MEDIA INFORMATION

### DIRECTIONS TO MEMORIAL STADIUM:

Memorial Stadium is located on the northeast corner of Wabash and Brown Avenue.

**From the east (Indianapolis):** Take Interstate 70 west to the first Terre Haute exit (Hwy 46). Turn right onto Highway 46 North and travel approximately two miles to Wabash Avenue. Turn left onto Wabash Avenue and travel approximately one mile to Brown Avenue (second stoplight).

**From the west (St. Louis):** Take Interstate 70 east to the third Terre Haute exit (Highway 46). Turn right onto Highway 46 North and travel approximately two miles to Wabash Avenue. Turn left onto Wabash Avenue and travel approximately one mile to Brown Avenue (second stoplight).

## REVISED OFFENSIVE SCHEME TO SPEARHEAD SYCAMORES ATTACK IN 2001 CAMPAIGN

**R**ecognizing the need for a change following last season's forgettable 1-10 record, Indiana State head coach Tim McGuire made a quick decision to overhaul the Sycamores' long-standing run-option offense. That decision, coupled with the arrival of new offensive coordinator Scott Anderson, formerly at Kentucky State, will find the Sycamores moving towards a more balanced multiple offensive scheme.

Likewise, after experimenting with a 4-3 alignment last season, the Sycamores will return to the tried-and true 4-4 base alignment from which they've operated for several years.

### OFFENSIVE OUTLOOK

Five offensive starters among 15 letterwinners return from a year ago. Heading the list of returnees on the offensive side will be tailback Clifton Jones. A 2000 Gateway Conference all-Newcomer Team selection, Jones was one of the Gateway Conferences' most versatile and explosive performers, despite being limited to just eight games due to injuries. Joining Jones as offensive starters returning in 2001 are OL Dan Denaut, QB Jamie Dishroom, RB Robert Boltinghouse and OL Sid Swartzendruber. Denaut and Swartzendruber have anchored the Indiana State offensive line as starters in each of the past two seasons, while Boltinghouse brings the experience gained as a nine-game starter at halfback a year ago. One of the interesting battles in the fall will be at quarterback, where a pair of transfers, Damien Cunningham and Julian Reese, will vie with Dishroom for the signal-calling duties.

### OFFENSIVE LINE

The offensive line should boast plenty of depth despite returning just two starters, Dan Denaut and Sid Swartzendruber, from last season. Denaut (6-1, 250, Sr-2L) looks to move from his previous tackle slot to battle with Richard Ritter (6-2, 265, Sr-1L) at center, while Swartzendruber (6-4, 275, Sr-3L) slides from tackle to the left guard slot. Jason Drumb (6-2, 265, So-1L) appears to have the nod at right guard, while junior transfer Eric Bowman (6-3, 280, Jr-TR) looks to occupy the left tackle slot and redshirt-freshman Fred Freitag (6-3, 240, Fr-RS) is the front-runner at right tackle. Eric Tompkins (6-2, 250, Fr-RS), Marc Phillips (6-2, 295, Fr-RS), Pace McCormick (6-1, 275, Sr-2L), Terry Henry (6-3, 240, Sr-1L), Tim McGuire (6-2, 265, So-SQ) and Herbie Blain (6-3, 275, Fr-RS) should see considerable action as well.

### BACKFIELD

Headlining the list of candidates for playing time in the offensive backfield is sophomore tailback Clifton Jones (6-0, 175, So-1L). Injuries limited Jones to just eight games as a freshman, but in that time the Anderson, IN, native averaged 6.8 yards per carry, gaining 225 yards on 33 rushing attempts with three TD's. Additionally, he averaged 23.3 yards per kickoff return with a long return of 67 yards. In his initial collegiate contest, Jones gained 62 yards on just four carries.

Behind Jones, the Sycamores' have numerous experienced halfback candidates to choose among. Robert Boltinghouse (5-8, 175, Jr-2L) made nine starting appearances at halfback last season, while Ben Tompkins (5-5, 155, So-RS) and incoming transfer Sosopriala Dede (5-8, 195, Jr-TR) also figure into the halfback mix. At fullback, Shane Guy (5-10, 205, Sr-2L) gained 273 yards a year ago and looks to be the front runner heading into the fall, while Sylvester Moore (5-11, 210, Sr-SQ), Jason Holok (5-11, 215, Sr-3L) and Steve Orcutt (6-0, 210, So-WO) should also see duty.

The most active battle this fall could be at quarterback, where returning starter, Jamie Dishroom (5-11, 190, Jr-1L), will have to fend off competition from junior Anthony Young (6-1, 188, Jr-SQ) and incoming transfers Damien Cunningham (6-4, 210, Jr-TR) and Julian Reese (6-3, 190, Jr-TR). As an option quarterback a year ago, Dishroom led the Sycamores with 453 yards rushing and an additional 363 passing yards. Both Dishroom and Young spent the spring acclimating themselves to the Sycamores' multiple offense, while Cunningham and Reese each excelled in the passing game during their junior-college careers.

### RECEIVERS

The Sycamores' receiving corps will be one of the more athletic talent pools on the roster. Chris Lewis (5-8, 180, Jr-1L) moves to receiver after spending the 2000 campaign at quarterback. He demonstrated good hands and speed during an outstanding spring session and heads into the fall penciled to start at one wideout slot. Kevin Dean (5-8, 165, Jr-2L) looks to have an advantage on the second wide receiver position. A fine possession receiver, Dean grabbed a trio of passes for 41 yards a year ago. Former defensive back Robin Johnson (6-0, 185, Jr-2L) opened eyes with his adaptation to the receiving role, while the speedy Tommy Signars (6-3, 185, So-SQ) provides Indiana State with a legitimate deep threat. Depth will also be plentiful at tight end, where sophomore Tim Sommer (6-6, 220, So-1L) will again head the list of candidates. Sommer was used primarily as a blocking end in last season's option offense. Support will come in the form of Ryan King (6-4, 250, So-WO), Jon Ferber (6-2, 240, Fr-RS) and Charlie Seale (6-4, 230, Jr-SQ).

## 2001 SEASON OUTLOOK

### DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK

The Sycamores' defensive unit might find the old adage 'a year older and a year wiser' appropriate, as no fewer than nine full or part-time starters among 15 letterwinners return from last year's squad.

Taking the reins as defensive coordinator is Mark Smith, a veteran of 13 seasons on the Indiana State football staff. Smith, who previously headed-up the Sycamore defensive line and special teams units, fields a defensive corps which returns every down lineman and linebacker who made a starting appearance last season.

Leading that list of returnees will be Gateway Conference all-Newcomer Team member Terrance Miles. Other starters returning include DE Rob Dougherty, DT Joe Hellebusch, DT Richard Harris, DT Justin Hess, DE Ryan Holley, OLB Dietrich Lapsley, OLB Max Matthews and Chris Sapp, who will move from strong safety to an outside linebacker slot for the 2001 season.

head into his second season as a starter. A year ago, he logged eight tackles for losses among his 25 stops last season. Kurt Miller (6-4, 230, Jr-SQ) and Isaac Grayson (6-2, 200, Jr-SQ) bring experience to the end slots, while transfer David Martin (6-3, 215, So-TR) and redshirt Tom Brillhart (6-4, 225, Fr-RS) should also see duty. Junior tackle Richard Harris (6-1, 270, Jr-2L) brings the experience gained in four starts a year ago. He, along with Derek Breckner (6-1, 260, Jr-SQ) and Tim Knoob (6-0, 200, So-SQ), should provide adequate depth in the defensive trenches.

### LINEBACKERS

The Sycamores have an experienced linebacking corps, led by inside linebacker Tony Albrinck (6-0, 235, Sr-3L). Albrinck heads into the 2001 season needing just 63 tackles to become

only the 10th member of ISU's 300-tackle club and has logged over 100 tackles in each of the past two seasons. A year ago, the Cincinnati, OH, native notched a team-leading 71 solo tackles. He will be joined at inside linebacker by sophomore Ryan Merriwether (5-10, 215, So-1L), who made three starts and 34 tackles in 2000, redshirt Kevin McDavid (6-3, 215, Fr-RS), junior Cecil Morris (5-9, 210, Jr-SQ) and sophomores Ben Lenderman (6-0, 215, So-SQ) and Carl Hill (6-0, 230, So-SQ). At outside linebacker, Dietrich Lapsley (5-11, 200, Sr-2L) returns after having recorded 96 tackles last season with a team-leading 10 tackles for minus-35 yards. Chris Sapp (6-2, 215, Sr-3L) moves from safety into an outside 'backer slot for 2001. A Gateway Conference all-Academic selection, registered 65 takedowns, two PBU's and one interception last season. Sophomore Max Matthews (6-3, 215, So-1L), who recorded 10 tackles a year ago, senior Adam Parmeter (5-11, 190, Sr-3L) and junior Brandon Simpson (5-11, 175, Jr-SQ) round out a solid linebacking contingent.

### SECONDARY

One of the pleasant surprises of last season was the emergence of Terrance Miles in the defensive secondary. Miles (5-8, 160, Jr-1L), a Fort Wayne (IN) Northside product, made a team-leading 104 tackles last season. He also recorded three pass interceptions with 79 return yards, broke-up a team-high eight pass attempts and recovered a pair of fumbles. Miles is expected to man one corner position with aid coming from Jamal Brown (6-0, 170, Fr-RS). Clythel Branson (5-10, 185, Jr-1L) and senior Chris Lynce (5-9, 170, Sr-2L) should battle for the other starting slot. Mike Gilbert (6-2, 190, Jr-1L), who recorded 46 tackles, four PBU's and a fumble recovery in 10 games a year ago, returns at safety, with help from redshirt Kevin Campbell (6-3, 200, Fr-RS) and William Watson (5-8, 205, Sr-WO).

### SPECIALISTS

The Sycamores kicking chores will again be in the capable hands of kicker Mike Megyesi (6-1, 205, Jr-2L) while Pat Jordan (5-11, 175, So-1L) will again handle the punting chores. Megyesi led the Sycamores in scoring for the second straight season and has proven to be one of the Gateway Conference's most dependable placekickers. As a true freshman, Jordan developed the knack for dropping his punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line.

## MEMORIAL STADIUM

**H**ome for the Sycamores over the past 32 years is venerable Memorial Stadium. The 12,764-seat structure has stood at the corner of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute, IN, since its original construction in 1924. The facility was acquired by Indiana State University in 1967.

The stadium, through constant upkeep, has been kept in excellent condition through the years. Its latest additions are a \$600,000 AstroPlay artificial turf surface, installed this past summer, as well as a refurbished pressbox.

Memorial Stadium is not new to synthetic surfaces though, as the stadium and Indiana State University claim distinction as the world's first university to make outdoor application of Astroturf. Following the University's acquisition of the stadium, Indiana State opened the 1967 season with a 41-6 win over Eastern Illinois in the first game played on the new surface.

Advantages to using synthetic surfaces include durability (some 15 college and high school football games are played on the surface each year in addition to daily Indiana State practices), a constant surface and sure footing regardless of weather. The AstroPlay turf is designed to provide more cushion and reduce injuries.

Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the public for the first time on May 5, 1925, as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria Tractors before an estimated crowd of 9,000. Among the honored guests were Major League Baseball Commissioner Judge Kennesaw Mountain Landis and Charles Barnard of the Cleveland Indians.

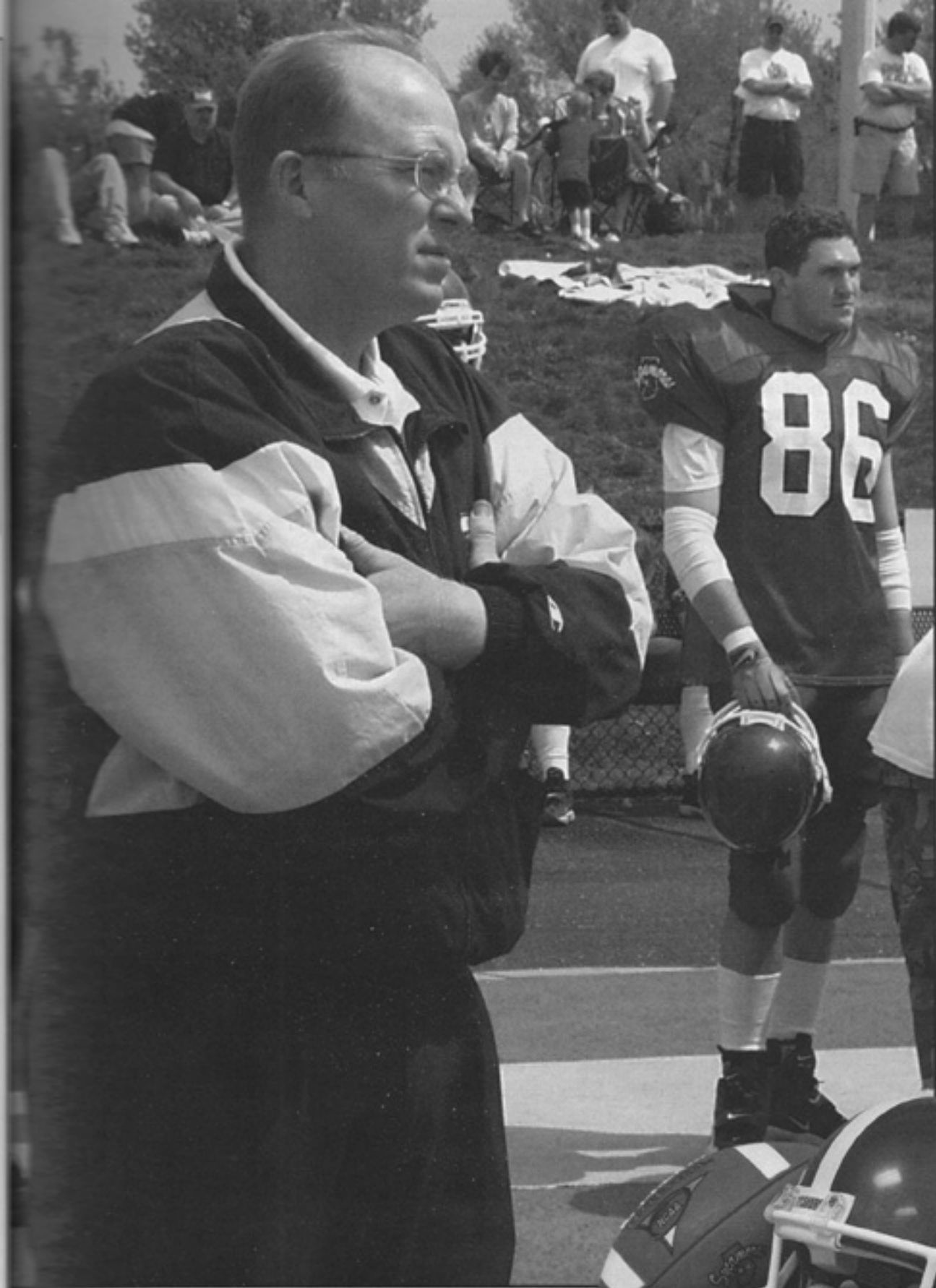

Original construction of Memorial Stadium was begun in 1922, at a cost of \$450,000. Upon the University gaining control in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included: the reorientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to its present east-west configuration; the installation of Astroturf; and the construction of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as the rebuilding of seats on the south side. The original arch still remains from the original structure; however, the bleacher seats, installed in 1967, were removed in the summer of 1996, replaced by a landscaped hill which serves as a general admission section and a site for pre-game tailgating for Sycamore fans.

Former Indiana State head coach Dennis Raetz utilized Memorial Stadium well. His Sycamore teams posted a 67-30-1 mark for a .689 winning percentage in 18 seasons at Memorial Stadium. Under the lights, Raetz's teams compiled a 34-4-1 mark for an .885 winning percentage.

## TIM MCGUIRE – HEAD COACH

NEBRASKA ('75)

9-24 AT INDIANA STATE (THREE YEARS)

16-39 OVERALL (FIVE YEARS)

Entering his fourth season as the head coach of the Sycamores is the personable Tim McGuire. McGuire has been a vital part of Indiana State football program for the past eight seasons, having guided the Indiana State defense as the program's defensive coordinator before becoming head coach prior to the 1998 campaign. He has also served as the assistant head coach, as well as instructing the ISU defensive backs.

During his three seasons as the Sycamores' head coach, McGuire has developed three all-Americans – defensive back/return specialist DeJuan Alfonso and defensive ends Shannon Jackson and Troy Lefevra.

As a defensive coordinator McGuire's Sycamore defensive units have ranked among the top four Gate-



way Football Conference leaders in five of the past seven years. His 1994 squad was first among the Gateway in total defense and 17th in the nation, while the 1995 team finished second in league play and 20th nationally.

In his five years as defensive coordinator, McGuire's units recorded three shutouts and 10 games in which the opposition were held to fewer than 10 points. He also coached three all-Americans, including current Philadelphia Eagle standout Dan Brandenburg, Chris Libaire and Richard Moss.

The Omaha, NE, native has also tutored nine student-athletes who have garnered first-team, all-conference honors, while six have earned second-team. McGuire also has tutored nine academic all-Conference honorees.

Prior to his arrival at Indiana State, McGuire spent two seasons at the United States Naval Academy. In 1991 he coached the linebackers for the varsity squad, and the following year

(1992) he was the defensive coordinator for the academy's lightweight football team. The '92 team finished with a 7-0 record enroute to the East Lightweight Football Championship.

The 2001 campaign represents McGuire's sixth season as a head coach, as he served two seasons (1981-82) as head coach of Morningside College, a Division II school in Sioux City, Iowa. McGuire compiled a 7-15 mark in his two-year head coaching debut at Morningside, but that record is somewhat deceiving. His 1981 team went 5-6, recording the most wins for the school in 10 years, and despite falling to 2-9 the following year, his two recruiting classes eventually posted winning seasons of 6-5 in 1984 and 7-3-1 in 1985.

McGuire honed his skills as a defensive intellect with stints at North-

ern Illinois University as well as at Kansas State University.

At Northern Illinois, McGuire spent four seasons (1986-1990) as the Huskies' defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. While at the Dekalb, IL institution, he coached five players who signed contracts with the NFL, as well as All-Americans Doug Bartlett, Cary Caliendo and Ron Delisi. His 1987 squad ranked third nationally in interceptions, 34th in total defense and 42nd in passing defense, while his 1988 defensive unit held the opposition to an average of 10 points or less per game enroute to ranking 23rd nationally in scoring defense. The 1989 Huskies finished fourth in turnover margin and 29th in rushing defense, allowing just six opponents to eclipse 100 yards in team rushing.

His stint at Kansas State lasted two years from 1984-85. Serving as the Wildcats' defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, McGuire instructed Barton Hundley—a Chicago Bears draft selection and a first-team, all-Big Eight pick.

McGuire acquired his love for Indiana State in a one-year assignment as



defensive coordinator with the Sycamores during their Division I-AA playoff run in 1983. Not only was his defensive unit ranked first in the Missouri Valley Conference in turnover margin and second in both total defense and scoring defense, but it was at this time that McGuire began his streak of producing All-Americans and NFL draft picks.

Former Sycamore standouts Vencie Glenn, Ed Martin, Kevin Ramsey, Walter Seaphus and Sam Suggs all played under McGuire and later signed contracts in the NFL. As for all-Americans, DeJuan Alfonzo, Glenn,

Martin and Wayne Davis all grabbed such honors.

McGuire spent three seasons (1978-80) as an assistant coach instructing the linebackers at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Prior to UNO, McGuire spent the 1977 season as an assistant football coach and mathematics teacher at Millard High School in Omaha, NE. He began his professional career in 1975 as head football coach and mathematics teacher at Archbishop Ryan in Omaha.

McGuire played offensive guard at the University of Nebraska for four seasons (1971-74), receiving his bachelor's degree in mathematics. He later attained a master's degree from the University of Nebraska-Omaha in physical education.

McGuire is a member of several organizations, including American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), American Red Cross and American Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

McGuire and his wife, Judy, are the parents of four children: Lisa, Tim, Jr. (currently an offensive lineman for the Sycamores), Molly and Paul.

**C**harged with implementing the Sycamores' revised offensive scheme is Scott Anderson, who joins the Sycamore football staff with the dual roles of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Anderson spent the past six seasons (1995-2000) as the offensive coordinator at Kentucky State University.

While at the Frankfort, KY, institution, Anderson oversaw an offensive unit which earned the university its first bowl victory in 42 years (1997 Pioneer Bowl). Under his tutelage, the

**Thorobreds** increased their total offensive output by over 200% and their scoring output by 325% from the prior season.

Utilizing a balanced-attack approach, Anderson's offensive units featured the SIAC's top passers in 1997-98-99, boasted the conference's top rushers in 1998-99-2000 and led the league in total offense in



both 1998 and 1999. Kentucky State's running game produced four 1,000-yard rushers during Anderson's tenure. Along the way, the Thorobreds broke school records for single-game and season rushing yardage, passing yardage and scoring and set the Division II single-game rushing mark (Alvon Brown, 405 yards, Sept. 16, 2000). He coached one Burger King/AFCA all-American as well as four first-team Black College all-America selections.

Anderson served as head coach at Navarro (Texas) Junior College in 1994. Anderson also served on the coaching staffs at Duke University (1990-93), West Texas State (1989) and Southern Illinois (1984-85) as well as a graduate assistant at the University of Texas (1978-88), Southern California (1983) and Georgia Tech (1982).

A 1982 graduate of Georgia Tech, Anderson earned a Bachelor of Aerospace Engineering and later received his master's in kinesiology from Texas in 1989. He and his wife, Karen, are the parents of two children, Laura and Wyatt.

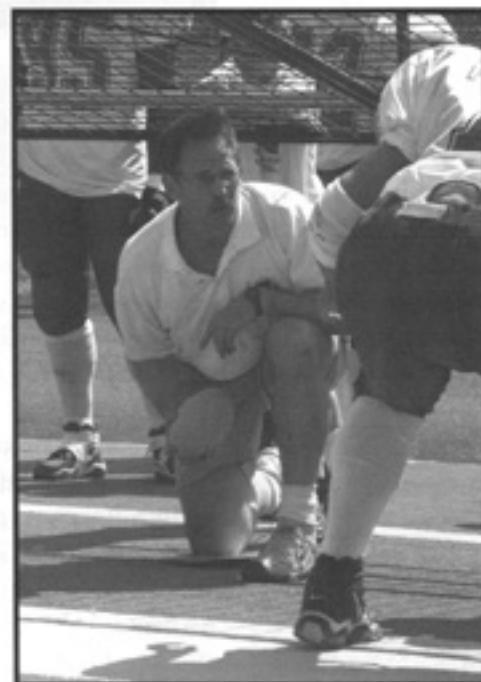

Smith was born September 27, 1956, in Richmond, IN. He and his wife, Kim, are the parents of three children: Heather, Eric and Craig.

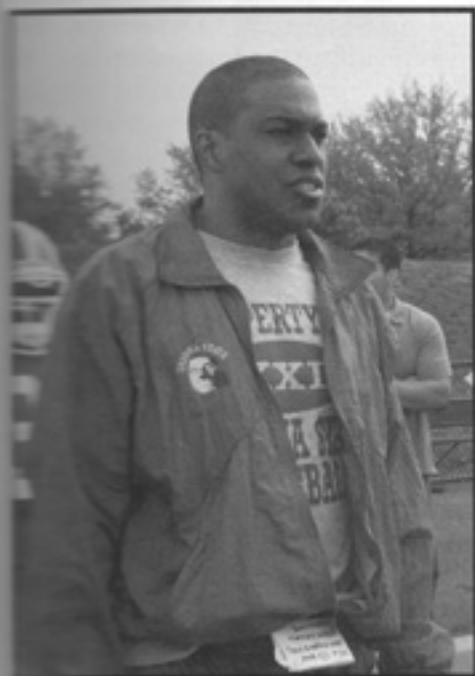
## THE COACHING STAFF

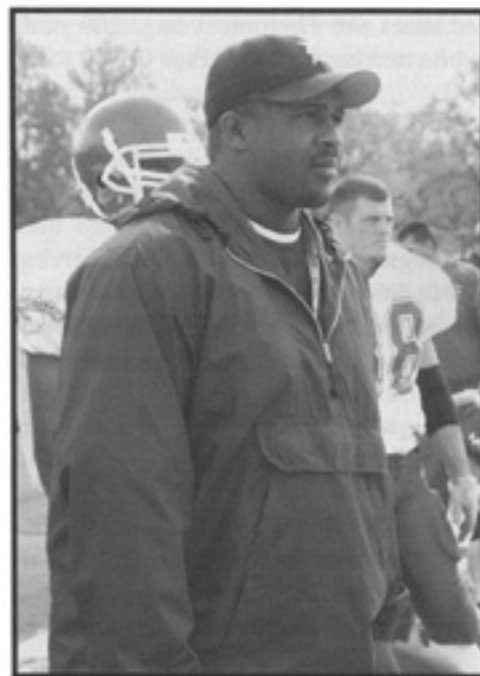
**O**ne of the great defensive players to have recently worn the Sycamore blue, Shannon Jackson is now in his second season as a member of the Indiana State football staff.

attention to the duties associated with developing the Sycamores' defensive linemen.

A preseason first-team all-America selection as a senior defensive lineman in 1999, Jackson was selected to two all-America postseason squads following that campaign.

Jackson registered a career-high 89



tackles as a sophomore in 1997, including 48 solo takedowns. A two-time all-Gateway Football Conference performer at defensive end, he also stamped his name in the Indiana State record book with his 24 career quarterback sacks spanning his four-year career (1996-99).

**TED UNBEHAGEN**

The 2001 campaign finds Ted Unbehagen lending his 31 years of collegiate coaching expertise to the Indiana State football staff. Ironically, the Texas native, who most recently was with the staff at the University of Houston, will making his first coaching venture outside the State of Texas.

As the offensive line boss at Houston in 1997, Unbehagen developed an offensive line unit which paved the way for the Cougar offense to average over 331 yards per game in total offense. The balanced attack saw Houston average 209 yards per contest passing while rushing for an average of 122 yards per outing.

As a 10-year member of the Texas Tech football staff from 1987-96, Unbehagen's charges played a major role in a Red Raider offense which averaged almost 30 points and 400 yards per game.

His coaching career began at Texas A&I in 1964, serving two years before a stint in the military and service in Vietnam. He resumed his coaching career at Houston (TX) Westchester High, where he was offensive coordinator for two years from 1969-70.

Unbehagen then journeyed west for his first term at Texas Tech (1971-74) before becoming offensive line coach and later the offensive coordinator at Rice from 1975-79. Following a single season as offensive line coach at Texas A&M 1980, Unbehagen took over as head coach at his high school alma mater, Galveston Ball, compiling a 35-15-2 record from 1981-85. While at Ball, he coached future NFL star Kimble Anders.

In 1986, Unbehagen joined the staff at the University of Houston, as offensive line coach, before returning to Texas Tech prior to the 1987 campaign.

A native of Galveston, TX, Unbehagen played collegiately at Texas A&I, earning all-Lone Star Conference recognition as a tight end in 1963.

Indiana State's strength and conditioning program is conducted in a state-of-the art 10,000-square foot facility which is located in University Hall. The facility, funded by private donations, is divided into three main areas which include free weights and weight machines, movement drills and plyometric training.

Indiana State's strength and conditioning program is an integral part of each player's development. All weight training is coordinated with on-field activities.

The program, which includes a speed and movement program, is designed to improve each individual player's speed and overall athletic ability. Injury prevention also plays an important role in the overall program.

Programming for freshmen student-athletes is centered on value clarification, the development of time management skills, sports nutrition for healthy living and top performance, study skills, stress management, and drug and alcohol education.

"Smart Sex: Sexual Responsibility & Student-Athletes" is a workshop offered to sophomore student-athletes to address issues concerning sexual responsibility and safe dating. Campus facilitators are on hand to educate students on the facts concerning sexual assault and assist in the development of healthy dating lifestyles.

The Athletics Media Relations Department conducts a program on "Dealing with the Media" to help student-athletes develop strong media relations skills. Local media personnel come together to allow student-athletes the opportunity to ask questions and learn through mock interviews.

The Senior "Life After Sports" Seminar assists student-athletes to prepare for what lies on the other side; to help them to bridge the gap from college to professional life in the work world. Guest speakers, former Indiana State Student-Athletes who have made successful transitions, return to give student-athletes advice on how to cope with "Life after sports."

SAFE "Sycamore Athletes for Education" is a volunteer community service program in which student-athletes have the opportunity to make a meaningful contribution to the Terre Haute community. Student-Athletes share their time with elementary school children once a week to stress the importance of education through reading.

## UNIVERSITY 101

The Academic Support Program for Athletics has adopted a proactive approach to academics in order to prepare the student-athlete for the many challenges associated with balancing both academics and athletics. Beginning with the Athletic Department Orientation and Study Skills Class (**University 101**), student-athletes are provided with a wealth of information and strategies for success during their first term at Indiana State. The class, teamed with study halls, tutoring, small study groups, and periodic progress monitoring, helps to ensure that each and every student-athlete at Indiana State has the best possible opportunity for both personal and academic success.

**University 101** is a course to help students make a successful transition into the University by introducing the concepts and values of a University education, of liberal studies, and of the preparation in the disciplines; by fostering a sense of ideas and people; by developing critical thinking skills as well

## 2000-01 INDIANA STATE ATHLETICS ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

- In Spring of 2001, 61 percent (190 of 310) of all student-athletes were on the Honor Roll (3.0), – an all-time high.
- In Fall of 2000, 60 percent (199 of 331) of all student-athletes were on the Honor Roll.

The Academic Support Program has been able to make continuous gains in the level of academic achievement in the percentage of scholar athletes compiling a 3.0 grade point average or better. This past year at least 40 percent of our student-athletes achieved a 3.0 GPA, earning a spot on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll. Coaching staffs, administration, faculty, and the university community have all been very supportive of our efforts as we assist student-athletes working toward that ever important goal of gaining a college degree. Lessons learned through the academic advisement program have proved extremely valuable to several members of the Indiana State football program.

He produced six games with 10+ tackles, including a season-high 16 stops (nine solo, 7 assists) vs. Northern Iowa, 14 takedowns against Southwest Missouri St. (10 solo, 4 assists) and 13 tackles against Eastern Kentucky (11 solo, 2 assists). His 111 total involvements (63 solo, 48 assisted) in 1999 ranked as second-highest on the squad, while his aggressive style resulted in his being credited with three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Albrinck's 79-yard fumble return TD ranks as the second-longest such recovery in Gateway Conference history. He also had three double-digit tackle outings - a season-high 14 tackle game against Western Illinois, an 11 tackle outing against Youngstown State and a 10-tackle day at Northern Iowa. A solid student, Albrinck was a 1999 Gateway Conference all-Academic second-team selection.

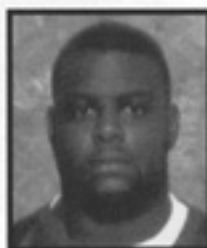
**1997-** Sat out the season as a redshirt.

Lloyd W. Benjamin III, previously vice president for academic affairs at Valdosta State University, was named the 10th president of Indiana State University by the ISU Board of Trustees in a special meeting Feb. 19, 2000.

Benjamin had served in his previous position at Valdosta State for five years. Prior to that, he served on the faculty and as an administrator at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock for 19 years.

Beginning in 1976 as an assistant professor and coordinator of art history, he moved through the faculty ranks to full professor. He served as chair of the department of art from 1980 to 1984 and was named acting dean of the College of Fine Arts in 1983, becoming dean the following year. In 1988, his role expanded to become dean of the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, a position he filled until becoming vice president at Valdosta.

Benjamin also taught for six years at East Carolina University where he was elected president of the faculty and chairperson of the faculty senate. He earned a bachelor of arts degree in art history from Emory University and a Ph.D. in the same field from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

"We are extremely pleased to have selected Lloyd Benjamin to lead Indiana State University. We are impressed with his wealth of experience in many areas, particularly in building collaborative partnerships, using technology to enhance education and his involvement in education reform efforts," said Charlotte Zietlow, president of the ISU Board of Trustees.

Andi, as she is known at the University, served as the University's NCAA Compliance Officer, while also overseeing budgetary matters and many of the day-to-day operations of the 14 intercollegiate sports at Indiana State.

She serves on the Missouri Valley Conference Compliance Committee and is the chair of the Gender Equity Committee. Myers has served as a member of the NCAA's Committee on Committees for Women's Athletics. She recently was elected by the Joint Committee to serve as the Missouri Valley Conference's representative to the NCAA Management Council.

Myers moved into her administrative capacity in April, 1989, after a successful seven-year tenure as Indiana State's women's basketball coach. An Indiana State graduate, Myers led the Sycamores to 40 wins in her final two seasons, including a school-best 22-6 mark in 1988. In that same year, Myers was named Gateway Conference Coach of the Year after ISU posted a 14-4 league mark, also a school-best.

Prior to accepting the head coaching post at ISU, Myers guided the Vincennes University Lady Trailblazers to an impressive 15-year record of 209-95 and several appearances in the NJCAA postseason tournament. She was twice selected the NJCAA Region 12 Coach of the Year and led VU to two national third-place finishes. While at Vincennes, Myers also served as chairperson of HPER.

A native of Dana, IN, and a graduate of South Vermillion High School, Myers earned both her bachelor's and master's in physical education from ISU. She participated in women's basketball and field hockey and received the Hillman Award as a senior.

Myers is active in the Terre Haute community as a member of the Rotary Club and serves on the board of directors of both the Covered Bridge Girl Scout Council and the YWCA.



**DENNIS RAETZ**

Dennis Raetz is in his fourth year as Associate Athletics Director for Compliance. Raetz assumed his current duties in December of 1997, after serving as the Sycamores' head football coach for the previous 18 years.

Raetz handles the athletics department's compliance department, making sure Indiana State is adhering to NCAA, Missouri Valley and Gateway Football Conferences rules and regulations. He also serves as the department's academic liaison.

Raetz is the most prolific football coach in Indiana State University history. In 1991, Raetz became the all-time winningest coach in Sycamore history, surpassing the legendary Wally Marks. He finished his 18-year career with 93 victories in exactly 200 games.

The former "Dean of the Gateway Conference" guided the ISU program to its greatest heights including a No. 1 national ranking during most of the 1984 season and two trips to the NCAA I-AA playoffs. Raetz was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 while also garnering Kodak I-AA District Coach of the Year honors. The 1995 campaign saw Raetz guide the Sycamores to their fifth-best record in school history.

Raetz has been a fixture at ISU since 1978 when he came to Terre Haute to serve on Dick Jamieson's staff as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. He remained in that position for two seasons before taking over the top job on February 25, 1980.

A native of North Platte, NE, Raetz attended the University of Nebraska on a football scholarship, but his playing career was cut short by a severe knee injury. Following his college graduation in 1968, he was an assistant coach at North Kansas City High School in Missouri for five seasons before accepting head-coaching responsibilities at J.C. Harmon High School in Kansas City, KS.

In 1977, Raetz joined the University of Missouri coaching staff where he worked with the defensive ends in addition to his duties as the junior varsity head coach.

Raetz and his wife Betty reside in nearby Riley, IN. Their daughter Jaime graduated from the University of Nebraska and is a school teacher in the Kansas City, MO, area. Their son Mark is a defensive back at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO.

Cathy Grothe is in her sixth season as head of the athletics marketing department. She is responsible for increasing revenue for the department through the identification and solicitation of corporate sponsorships.

In addition to marketing each of the department's 14 intercollegiate athletics programs, Grothe is responsible for the development of the Gift-in-Kind program, handling the athletics department merchandising and licensing program, is the department liaison for personnel searches as well as being the administrator for the Indiana State fastpitch softball program. She also supervises the Sycamore Radio Network and negotiates all contracts on behalf of the network in addition to contract negotiations for the coaches' television show and game programs. Grothe recently negotiated a media package ensuring numerous televised broadcasts of Sycamore football and men's and women's basketball events over the next three years.

Grothe began her career in sports marketing at The University of Iowa, where she served as graduate assistant for the 1991-92 season.

She is on the board of directors of the YWCA, a member of the Wabash Valley American Marketing Association and the Young Professionals Club of Terre Haute.

Grothe is a 1989 graduate of The University of Iowa, earning a degree in marketing with a communications minor. She later received a master's degree in journalism and public relations in 1994.

Jim Norton is in his third year as the Director of Development for Athletics at Indiana State University.

Norton's primary responsibility is directing fund-raising activities pertaining to intercollegiate athletics. In this role, he is responsible for Indiana State's annual giving program (Sycamore Athletics Scholarship Fund) as well as all planned gifts, bequests and major gifts. Over the last two years, he has established new records for ISU athletics fund-raising, eclipsing the previous amounts by forty-percent.

In October, 2000, Indiana State announced a major capital campaign, its first in several years.

Norton came to the Sycamores following a four-year stint at Central Michigan University, where he served two years as Assistant Director of Admissions and two years as Development Officer.

While at CMU, he was responsible for coordinating a Capital Campaign that helped fund a 10,000-seat football stadium expansion and a new indoor athletic complex.

Prior to CMU, Norton worked three years as Assistant Director of Admissions at Alma College.

The Grand Rapids, MI, native earned a bachelors degree in English in 1991 from Central Michigan and followed that, in 1997, with his Masters in Higher Education Administration.

He and his wife, Kristin, reside in Terre Haute.

Now in her fourth year with Sycamore Athletics, Linda England joined the department in July, 1998 in the capacity of Executive Assistant to the Athletics Director. She was promoted to the position of Business Manager and Assistant to the Athletics Director in September, 1999.

England's primary responsibilities are to oversee the department's operating budgets and to assist in the Athletics Director in the day-to-day operations of the department.

England has been employed at Indiana State since 1987. Initially, she worked in the ISU Foundation before beginning a four-year stint in the University Development Office. She then worked for seven years as the Executive Assistant to the Vice President for Student Affairs.

Born in Landshut, Germany, England was raised in Farmersburg, IN. A graduate of North Central High School, she has three children, Heidi, Shaun and Daniel and three grandchildren.

## THIS IS INDIANA STATE

**I**ndiana State University, home of the Sycamores, is located in the heart of Mid-America, Terre Haute, IN, a thriving community with a population of 60,000.

Founded in 1865 as a training school for teachers, ISU enrolled its first 21 students in 1870. Today — three name changes later — the University offers its 11,000 students more than 160 degree programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Business; Education; Technology; Graduate Studies; Nursing; and Health and Human Performance. Degrees are awarded at associate, baccalaureate, master's, educational specialist and doctoral levels.

In addition, ISU offers a variety of non-credit courses, cultural and recreational opportunities, and diversified workshops, seminars and conferences.

Characterized by small class sizes, Indiana State has a faculty and staff committed to a personal approach to higher education. Nine out of 10 classes are taught by full-time professors.

ISU's 70,000 alumni occupy positions of leadership in education, business, industry, government and public service.

More than 60 buildings, plazas and walkways comprise the main campus on 90 acres adjacent to the Terre Haute business district. In addition, the University maintains family housing units on a 15-acre site one mile south of the main campus and a 12,764-seat football and athletic facility two miles to the east. The 35-acre river campus located along the Wabash is the site of the University's outstanding baseball program.

The campus is continually changing, with two facilities — the Music Rehearsal Hall and the Technology Center — completed within the last year. The music building features a rotunda lobby with a 175-seat recital hall, rehearsal rooms, teaching studios and an art gallery. The technology structure, with 35 state-of-the-art laboratories and a 100-seat multimedia room, has a sky lit, three-story atrium as its major design feature.

Cunningham Memorial Library houses more than 2 million books, periodicals, documents and audiovisual



and microfilm items; it also is a government depository containing more than 100,000 government documents. The Rare Books and Special Collections section houses the Eugene V. Debs papers, early Indiana textbooks and one of the largest

early dictionary collections in the world. An interlibrary loan service and database searching units also are available.

Hulman Center, completed in 1973, probably is best known as the arena in which basketball star Larry Bird played in during his college career. Its versatility also provides an ideal location for conferences, conventions, concerts, banquets, stage shows and other services.

Hulman Memorial Student Union became the hub of campus upon its completion in 1991. Students gather by the attractive outdoor plaza and its circular fountain. The soothing sounds of cascading water set the tone for the activity that takes place in the renovated nine-story building.

Within its walls, the Dede Activity Center provides meeting space as well as recreational and fitness opportunities, while a variety of retail services and food is available in The Commons, from favorite fast-food franchises and sit-down restaurant to a bookstore, bank and convenience store.

Tilson Auditorium, located in Tirey Hall, houses the Terre Haute Symphony Orchestra and the University's Convocation Series, which brings touring Broadway productions and other entertainment to campus. The former union building also has a recital hall which features weekly concerts by University faculty and students.

The New Theater offers a modern "in-the-round" setting for year-round dramatic presentations. ISU's successful Summer-Stage program has provided excellent entertainment for more than 30 years. The Dreiser Theater, located in Dreiser Hall, provides a proscenium stage for more traditional performances.

For more than a century and a quarter, Indiana State has played an important role in Indiana's public service. Today, ISU makes a number of contributions to economic development locally, regionally and nationally.

The Technology Services Center in the School of Technology contracts with small and medium-sized manufacturing companies to facilitate technology transfer to increase productivity and improve competitiveness. The Center for Research and Management Services in the School of Business contracts with businesses throughout Indiana to provide targeted industry studies, applied research, consultation and

training. A Small Business Development Center is part of the larger center.

The Interdisciplinary Center for Cell Products and Technology focuses on areas concerned directly with biotechnology, its commercialization and its social and ethical implications.

Also on campus is the Indiana Institute on Recycling, the country's first state-created institute charged with developing effective voluntary recycling programs.

## THE SYCAMORE MASCOT & NICKNAME

In 1921 a contest was held to pick a name for the athletic teams at what was then called Indiana State Normal School. Up until this time the term "Fighting Teachers" was frequently used in press accounts of athletic contests. In January, 1922, it was announced that the name Sycamores had won a popular vote of the student body, although there is some question as to how serious the student body was in picking the name. Nevertheless, Indiana State University has used this rather unique name since this date. The problem has been that a Sycamore is a tree and does not lend itself very well to creation of a mascot. Athletic teams have been known in the past as "The Fighting Trees," which was not considered a very glamorous or intimidating a concept. For a period of time in the 1950s and 1960s, there actually was a tree mascot developed, but this posed obvious problems of embarrassment with other

mascots, when the University played such schools as the Butler Bulldogs or the Ball State Cardinals.

In 1969 a committee created the Chief Quabachi concept as a mascot for the school. This Indian Chief (and accompanying legend) was used as a mascot until 1989, when the University dropped its use of the Indian in response to a variety of objections over use of the Indian caricature. In 1995, the Indiana State University Department of Athletics announced plans for a search for a new mascot to accompany the traditional Sycamores nickname. After taking suggestions the Department of Athletics submitted a list of finalists for the ISU student body to vote. On December 6, 1995, Sycamore Sam - a unique blue and white animal - made its debut at a Sycamore men's basketball game versus Loyola University.

## THE UNIVERSITY

The University was created on December 20, 1865, in which the General Assembly of the State of Indiana established "a State Normal School, the object of which shall be the preparation of teachers for teaching in the common schools of Indiana." The school was known as Indiana State Normal School and its first president, William Allen Jones, was brought on board in 1869.

For 64 years the University was known as the Normal School, but in 1929 under the guidance of president Linnaeus Neal Hines, the school changed to Indiana State Teachers College. It remained a teachers college for 31 years, and in 1960 the institution evolved

again, this time into Indiana State College while Raleigh Warren Holmstedt was the president.

For a brief five years ISU maintained the designation of State College, but in the fall of 1965, under the new president, Alan Carson Rankin, the school elevated to university status, known as Indiana State University as it is today.

## OTHER INFORMATION

*Other interesting information about Indiana State University:*

### BLUE AND WHITE

The school colors of Indiana State University since 1899, when it was announced the Yale Blue and White would replace the colors of Salmon Pink and White. The colors are also applied to the Blue and White Parade and the Blue and White Dance held during Homecoming each fall.

### BOOK AND TORCH

The book and torch are official symbols of the University. The book symbolizes knowledge and truth gained at ISU, and the torch symbolizes the light of inspiration that comes to students in the University's halls.

### SEAL OF THE UNIVERSITY

The current seal includes the symbols of the Book and Torch and the founding date of 1865. It was approved for use by the Board of Trustees in 1929, the year that the Normal School became the Indiana State Teachers Col-

lege.

### HOMECOMING

The term Homecoming was first used in print announcements for the Alumni-Varsity Basketball Game on December 9, 1916. By the year 1919 this event became known as Blue and White Day and featured dances and entertainments for alumni of the Normal School. In 1921 the events were organized around a football game scheduled earlier in the autumn. A bonfire and pep rally were added to the festivities in 1922; the Blue and White Parade in 1923; and in 1937, Bette Whitmore (Kappa Kappa) was elected Homecoming Queen.

### UNIVERSITY LOGO

The Sycamore leaf symbol was designed by Dan Davis in 1985. His concept for the design was an outgrowth of a class project at a time when the University was looking for a new visual image.

## THE ALMA MATER

The Alma Mater was authored by Charles M. Curry, Professor of English and Literature. It was originally entitled, "Indiana's Normal" and first printed in a June, 1912, issue of the *Normal Advance*. It was originally written as follows:

*Out upon the swelling breezes,  
Let our voices ring,  
As to thee, our Alma Mater,  
Heartfelt praises sing,  
Indiana's dear State Normal,  
Friends and comrades true,  
Though the years to come may part us,  
Hail, all hail to you.*

This is the version that is sung today:

*Out upon the swelling breezes,  
let your voices ring as to thee,  
our alma mater, heartfelt praise  
we sing through the years  
come may part us,  
friends and comrades true ISU,  
our alma mater,  
here's our pledge to you.*

## THE FIGHT SONG

"On You Fighting Sycamores," the University's fight song, was authored and arranged by Joseph A. Gremelspacher, Professor of Music, as a pep song. It was first performed at a Homecoming even pep rally on October 20, 1939. It goes as follow:

*March on, march on, you fighting  
Sycamores, Sycamores  
March on, you Statesman tried and true  
March on, march on to glorious victory  
Raise that flag of royal blue*

*March on, march on you fighting  
Sycamores, Sycamores  
Shout out that victory song  
Onward, ever onward to our goal  
As we march on and on*

*Go Big Blue, Fight Big Blue  
GO! STATE! WIN!*

## HISTORY & TRADITION

The ISU Athletic Tradition is rich and full of spectacular moments from John Wooden's great basketball teams of the late 1940s to Bruce Baumgartner's Olympic wrestling heroics of the 1980s. And don't forget Larry Bird! These three names along with hundreds of others have helped form the memorable tradition of Sycamore Athletics.

Most recently, the men's basketball team has captured consecutive Missouri Valley Conference championships and made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, the men's tennis team has won three straight MVC Championships while both the men's and women's track and field programs can also claim Valley Championships.

This Sycamores' winning tradition is most evident as they march into the 21st century. But it's also a deep-rooted heritage.

The origins of the athletic department at ISU can be traced back to the turn of the century when the school was called Indiana State Normal School. Arthur Westphal (1912-17) and Birch E. Bayh (1917-23) have been given the majority of credit for establishing the administrative framework for athletic programs at ISU to emerge competi-

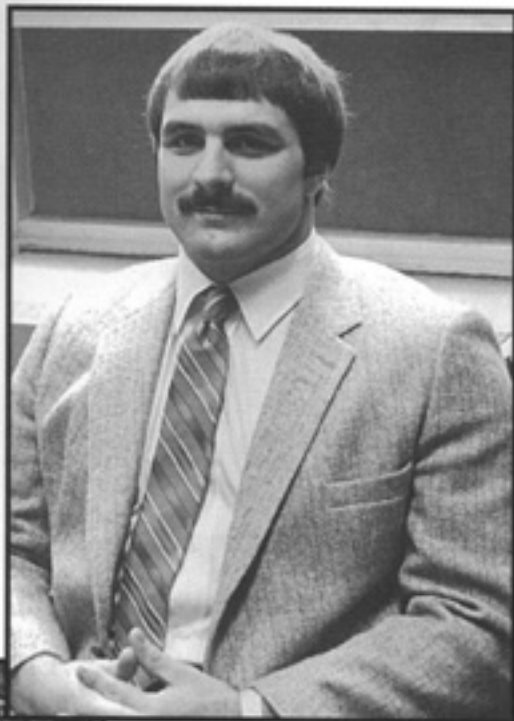

tively on the intercollegiate level. Arthur Strum was appointed head of the Men's Physical Training Department as well as "Coach" and Director of Athletics in 1923. His charge was to establish intercollegiate teams in football, basketball, baseball and track. Men's tennis, golf and a women's varsity basketball program were introduced at this time as well.

From these modest beginnings, the athletic program has grown to what we know it as today—an NCAA Division I program offering programs in men's and women's basketball, football, baseball, softball, volleyball, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's cross country, and men's and women's indoor/outdoor track and field.

about in Sycamore athletic lore. But that year offered more than Larry Bird's march to the Final Four and eventual runner-up finish in the NCAA basketball tournament. The Sycamores also boasted the leading hitter in Division I baseball in Wally Johnson. The Sycamore football team posted an 8-3 record, and Kurt Thomas was ranked Number 1 in the world among male gymnasts.

The early 1980s brought about heavyweight Bruce Baumgartner's reign as the number-one heavyweight wrestler in the country. The Sycamore baseball program was churning out pro prospects such as pitcher Zane Smith. The football program recorded consecutive trips to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs and a number-one regular season ranking in 1984.

The Sycamores have won one team championship and 18 individual titles. The breakdown on the individual titles shows 12 championships for the men and six titles won by the women.

## ATHLETICS FACILITIES

One hallmark of any winning program are outstanding facilities, and Indiana State boasts some of the finest in both the Gateway and Missouri Valley Conferences.

The **Hulman Center** is the home for Indiana State's men's and women's basketball program. The facility provides the

university, as well as Terre Haute, a large auditorium in which to accommodate convocations, meetings, conventions, dramatic and musical presentations. Hulman Center is the largest athletic building of its kind in west-central Indiana, providing a seating capacity of 10,206.

intramural sports programs. The gymnasium provides seating for 2,500. The facility now features a new Volleyball sportcourt and scoreboards.

Located on the northwest side of campus adjacent to the ISU Arena, the **ISU Tennis Complex** enters its seventh year of use by the men's and women's tennis teams, students and staff of the ISU and Terre Haute communities.

With eight courts and modern lighting set around a central viewing tower and equipment kiosk, the facility is a gracious host for numerous Missouri Valley Conference Tennis Championships as well as NCAA Regional Tournaments.

The **Eleanor Forsythe St. John Softball Complex** softball facility features two playing fields which can be used for both athletics and intramurals. In 1999, a new electronic scoreboard and press box were added to the complex. Other additions include bullpens, expanded dugouts, a new drainage system, batting cage and

renovation of the infield and the outfield. The north field on the complex is **Price Field**, site of ISU's home games. Indiana State hosted the MVC Softball Tournament at the complex in 1994.

## THE GATEWAY CONFERENCE

The Gateway Football Conference will have a new look in 2001, but despite the addition of Western Kentucky and three head coaching changes, all signs point to continued national prominence for a league that enters its 17th season this fall.

In recent years, the Gateway has established itself as a leader among Division I-AA conferences. The league has a national championship (Youngstown State in 1997), and four other Final Four trips in the past five years. Last year, both Western Illinois and Youngstown State reached the playoffs.

During the past four playoffs, the Gateway Conference has posted an impressive mark of 12-7, bettered only by the Southern Conference. Also, the Gateway is one of just two conferences (Atlantic-10) to send eight teams during the past four tournaments, and the GFC has had two representatives each of the past six seasons. In addition, the Gateway is the only I-AA conference to have each of its members make the playoffs. Southern Illinois (1983) and Youngstown State (four times) have earned national titles.

In fact, during the decade of the 1990s, current members of the Gateway compiled a 34-19 mark in the I-AA playoffs, bettered only by the Southern Conference, whose members were 37-19 in that decade.

Team accomplishments have helped solidify the Gateway as a I-AA elite, but individuals at the league's member institutions are the real source of pride within the conference. Last year, four Gateway student-athletes were finalists for the I-AA's top awards. A total of 25 Gateway players earned All-America honors. LB Edgerton Hartwell of Western Illinois was named the Buck Buchanan Award winner, given to the nation's best defender.

The 2000 season-ending poll had four Gateway teams in its Top 25, while Western Kentucky -- a playoff participant last season -- was also ranked in the season-ending Top 25, giving this year's Gateway membership 1/5 of the teams in last year's poll. Additionally, four Gateway teams were ranked in the same poll three times last year (including the final Sports Network poll) and nine times in 1999.

Tough scheduling is not an aberration for the Gateway, as last year, five Gateway schools had four or more games against top-25 I-AA foes, and all seven league schools played at least two ranked teams; while all seven played at least one I-A opponent. The Gateway picked up two wins against I-A schools, as Youngstown State won at Kent, while Western Illinois defeated Ball State. In fact, the Gateway has 20 I-A wins in its history.

The original Gateway Conference was founded as a women's athletic organization in August, 1982, following the dissolution of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. In September of that year, Patty Viverito was named the first commissioner of the newly founded conference, a position she maintains today.

In July of 1992, the 10-team Gateway Conference disbanded as its women's programs realigned with their men's teams in their respective conferences. The league assumed its new name on July 1, 1992, becoming the Gateway Football Conference, a NCAA I-AA football league comprised of seven Midwest institutions.

The Gateway Conference football division was born on August 21, 1985, when the Gateway Conference President's Council voted to add a I-AA football division for six of its members to the previously all-women's athletics organization. Founding members of the football division were Eastern Illinois, Illinois State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri State and Western Illinois. In June of 1986, Indiana State became the seventh member of the Gateway Conference. In the 16 years of the football division, league membership has been stable as only three times since 1986 have there been fluctuations in league membership. Eastern Illinois left the Gateway to join the Ohio Valley Conference in 1996, while Youngstown State joined the Gateway Football Conference for 1997. League membership reached an all-time high of eight members for the start of the 2001 season with the addition of Western Kentucky.

The Gateway is among eight I-AA conferences that receive automatic bids to the NCAA I-AA Championship. The Gateway Conference is the only automatic I-AA qualifying conference that sponsors football as its only sport, as the league completed its service to women's athletics following the 1991-92 season. Although the league no longer sponsors women's sports, the Gateway has an historical place in the development of intercollegiate women's athletics.
