Athletics Media Relations

To The Media

It is our goal that you find this publication useful while covering Indiana State University's 2006 football team. Every effort has been made to include timely and pertinent information.

Additional requests by accredited media representatives for items such as color photography, video tape, feature material, etc., should be directed to our office. It is our purpose to serve you.

Credentials

Requests for working press, radio, television and photographer passes should be made as early as possible to:

Credentials may be picked up in the Media Relations office prior to the first game, thereafter they will be left at Memorial Stadium Media Will Call. Credentials must be made visible at all times for proper identification by Indiana State security personnel. Weekly print media and non-reporting radio-TV representatives have least priority to media reservations. Likewise, we are unable to accommodate children, spouses or other nonworkers.

Photo / Sideline Credentials

Follow the same procedure as used in requesting press box credentials. A credential must be designated photo for access to field level.

Media Will Call

The Memorial Stadium Media Will Call is located at the West gate area of the stadium. Credentials may be picked up 90 minutes prior to game time.

Press Box

Entrance: The entrance to the Memorial Stadium press box is via the elevator located on the west side of the stadium, directly across from main gate.

Layout: The Memorial Stadium press box is a single-level facility. The main area is reserved for print media personnel. There are separate booths for radio and television networks, coaches and the official stat crew. Film crews are asked to use the photo deck atop the press box.

Radio Networks: The originating station for each team's radio network is provided a booth from which to broadcast. Phone lines are provided in the visitor's radio booth on a reciprocal basis.

Television: Should a station wish to originate live coverage of a game, a broadcast booth will be provided to the originating network. **All telecasts must have the approval of the Indiana State University Athletics Director.**

Coaches Booth: Home and visiting coaching staffs are provided a booth, seating four persons, from which to work.

Pressbox Roof: An open air photo deck is located on the pressbox roof. Secondary radio broadcasts may also be placed on the roof due to space limitations.

Sideline: Indiana State follows NCAA regulations regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers are not permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and must display their credentials at all times. Media may not work inside the team areas at any time. Representatives from the Indiana State Athletics Department will be responsible for sideline control.

Media Parking

There is no designated media parking area at Memorial Stadium. However, there is ample parking available near the press box entrance.

Press Box Services

Statistical and informational materials including pre-game notes, flip cards and gameday programs will be distributed in the press box prior to game time. Two telephone lines are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Play-by-play, complete quarter, halftime and final game statistics and drive charts will be available shortly after the game. A light meal and beverages will be available to accredited media one hour prior to game time. Beverages will be available throughout the game. In-game live statistics will be provided to live electronic broadcast outlets. The Indiana State football press box is equipped with wireless internet technology, with which users may acquire guest access to the university's broadband internet server while working.

Post-Game Procedure

Prior to the end of the contest, Assistant SID Ace Hunt will collect media requests. Media will be escorted to field level with five (5) minutes remaining on the fourth quarter clock. Coach West will be available in the Sycamore media room on the opposite side of the fieldhouse. The opposing coach and two selected players will follow Coach West. Selected ISU players will then be escorted to the media room for interview opportunities.

Radio Information

Radio contract requests and information should be directed to the Indiana State Athletics Media Relations Office. Stations designated as "official" by visiting opponents will be provided a courtesy telephone line on press row. All other stations requesting broadcast space must pay a fee of \$50 to Indiana State University and will be accommodated on the press box roof.

Player Interview Policy

All requests for player interviews must be made through the Media Relations office. Players have been instructed to conduct no interviews unless they have been set up in this manner. The interviews generally will be conducted after practice at Memorial Stadium. Players generally are available throughout the week with the exception of game days. Requests for telephone interviews will be handled by players returning phone calls to the media. **No home telephone numbers will be given out.**

Interviews with Coach Lou West

Interviews with Coach Lou West may be arranged through the Athletics Media Relations Office by calling (812) 237-4159. It is best to arrange phone interviews during the morning. If you are unable to speak with Coach West during the mornings, he is available to talk to the media directly after the conclusion of practice at Memorial Stadium.

Athletics Media Relations

Directions to Memorial Stadium

Memorial Stadium is located on the northeast corner of Wabash and Brown Avenue.

From the east (Indianapolis): Take Interstate 70 west to the first Terre Haute exit (Hwy 46). Turn right onto Highway 46 North and travel approximately two miles to Wabash Avenue. Turn left onto Wabash Avenue and travel approximately one mile to Brown Avenue (second stoplight).

From the west (St. Louis): Take Interstate 70 east to the third Terre Haute exit (Highway 46). Turn right onto Highway 46 North and travel approximately two miles to Wabash Avenue. Turn left onto Wabash Avenue and travel approximately one mile to Brown Avenue (second stoplight).

2006 Season Outlook

For Indiana State University's football team in 2006, the future is now for a program that is looking to rebound from an 0-11 campaign that saw several tough, close defeats to quality opponents along the way. Despite not winning a contest last fall, the Sycamores rewrote the offensive record book versus a brutal schedule that featured a stretch of five consecutive games against nationally-ranked opponents.

After a season of challenges, second-year head coach Lou West and his staff have worked tirelessly to get things ready for what promises to be a coming-out-party for a group of hungry Sycamores. West has worked hard to instill a winning attitude amongst a group of talented players that have experienced difficulty in putting it all together in the past.

"I really think that last year our offense played well enough to win us some ball games", West commented. "Our improved efficiency and the bulk of our work has got to be over on defense. We have got to do a better job this year on defense to complement our offensive game."

OFFENSE

Offensively, the Sycamores return their top two wide receivers in seniors Sam Logan and Carl Berman. Logan is pure receiver, who set a new school record with 77 pass receptions one year ago, en route to being named an All-Gateway Football Conference First Team selection.

His best game in 2005 was a 17-catch outing at Murray State, which proved to be a new single-game best for ISU and the Gateway. Logan will continue to be a top target for the Sycamores this year under the direction of first-year offensive coordinator Blair Hrovat. Despite the change in coordinators, the Sycamore offense will continue to be a high-octane attack with a renewed emphasis on the run.

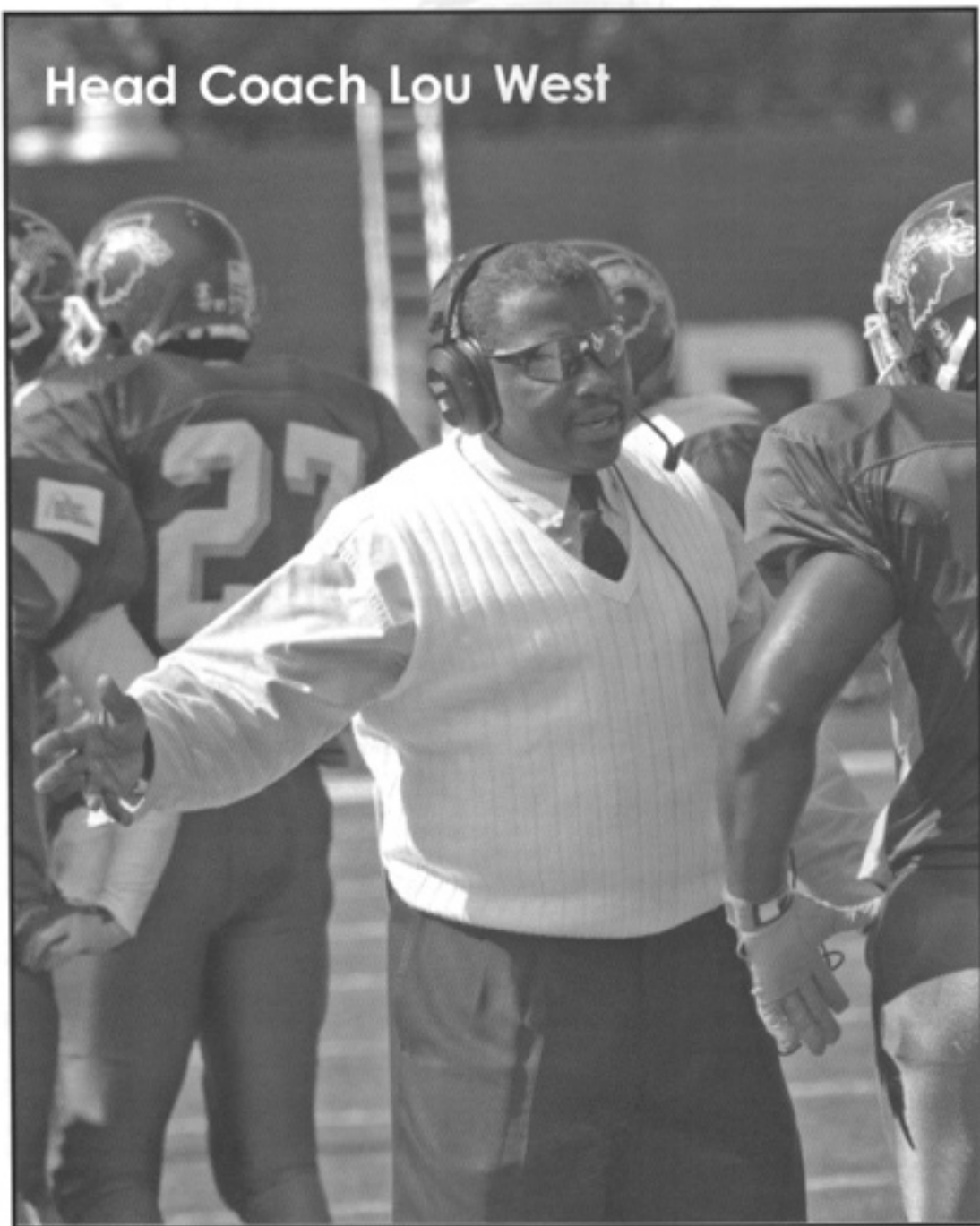
"Our offense is going to be high-speed, and a little bit more diverse," West commented. "We have a year under our belt, and we are going to add some things to our spread offense that are going to provide a lot of fun and excitement. This year hopefully we can step things up another notch on offense."

With Logan, the Sycamores have a very dependable receiver who will continue to make plays when the team needs them in key situations. Coach West calls him the team's most reliable receiver and the leader of a talented receiving corps.

"With Logan leading the way, we think we can get guys in a good, threatening position," West said. "Our biggest issue right now is making sure that we have someone that can get the ball to them. The receiving corps should be a unit that we can lay our hats on this year."

Joining Logan is Berman,

who caught five touchdowns a year ago, en route to amassing 55 catches on the season. The speedy receiver proves his worth at any point as the shifty veteran is used all over the field to create havoc amongst any defensive secondary. Berman also showcases his speed in the running game, as he was used nine times last season on gadget plays that saw him take the ball directly from the quarterback in running situations.

Also adding depth at receiver, will be the return of senior Markus Naves, who caught 16 passes for 128 yards before breaking his foot in the Gateway opener against Western Kentucky. Last season, Naves hauled in a career-best 40-yard pass from the arm of departed quarterback Blayne Baggett. Receivers Greg Hutcherson also returns after catching seven passes for 42 yards last year.

With such a talented group of returnees at receiver, the question on offense then turns to quarterback. With the Sycamores, losing Baggett and back-up Phillip Johnson to graduation, the duties will be fought for amongst a talented group of returnees and newcomers.

Senior quarterback, turned wide receiver Ben Schmidt, returned back to quarterback this spring and performed well enough to get the starting nod heading into the fall. Right behind Schmidt is junior college transfer Reilly Murphy, who enrolled in January and also participated in spring drills. Redshirt freshman J.R. Kirkendoll is also in the mix at quarterback, after getting a year of experience in 2005, and playing several positions during the spring.

Schmidt is the only one of three with any previous NCAA Division I-AA playing experience. He came in as a third string replacement during the 2004 season and led ISU to a thrilling overtime victory at Eastern Illinois, then engineered another victory at Memorial Field over Tennessee-Martin. Since then he has been

used sparingly at the quarterback position, going just 1-for-2 with 12 yards passing in 2005. He proved to be dependable last season at the receiving position, by catching 11 balls and a pair of touchdowns at national runner-up Northern Iowa during October.

"Ben Schmidt is a true competitor," West said. "Coming out of the spring, we are going to start with him, but our quarterbacks are so close. Reilly Murphy won a state championship with Grossmont, and once he fully gets hold of our system, he will also be very good for us. The winner of this battle between these three is going to come down to the work they put in this summer. If they work hard and study the game, that is where these guys are going to have to catch up. They have to be ready to go this summer, and not wait until the fall."

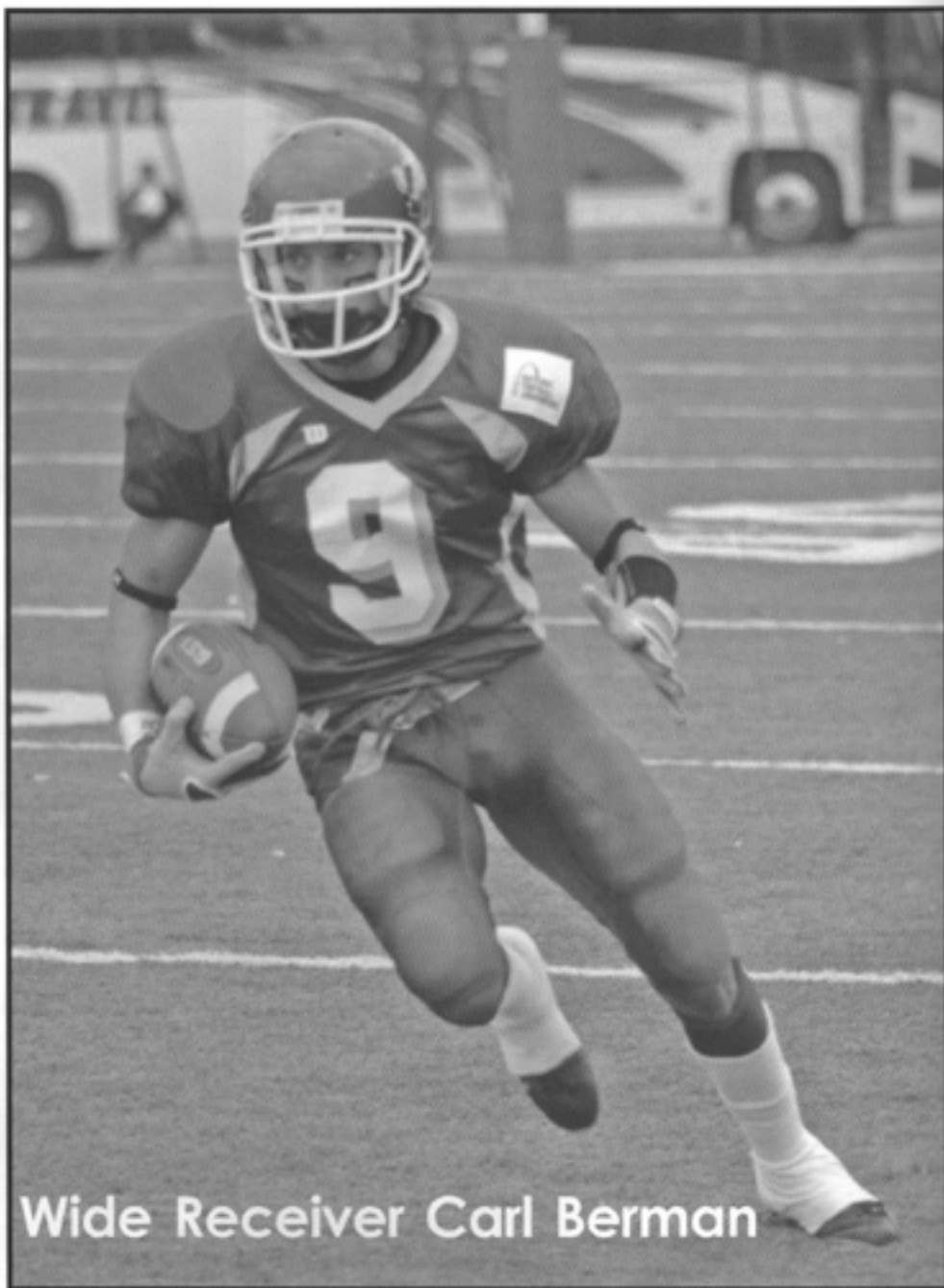
ISU will welcome a bevy of talented newcomers to the fold this fall, and all will initially be given a chance to perform in the early going of pre-season camp. Freshmen Charles Dowdell, Evan Parker, and Kyle Toney will be expected to earn significant snaps under center early on, but with limited numbers at other positions, could move elsewhere as the need arises.

"We also have three or four other young quarterbacks that we are going to throw into the mix," West said of the quarterback situation. "The one thing about all of the young quarterbacks is that they are all athletes. So, if it doesn't pan out for them there, we are going to find a spot for all of them."

Depth will be key at the running back position as ISU plans on retooling the spread offense this season to feature a more prominent running game. Under the new scheme, the Sycamores will use one back at a time and there are three candidates in line to replace the powerful running of departed seniors Andre Forte and Martuan Sample.

Leading the way will be the much anticipated Sycamore debut of Tony West, who originally played at Western Kentucky as a freshman. His best game with the Hilltoppers was a 159-yard effort against the Sycamores as WKU defeated ISU in 2004 at Memorial Stadium. Now the speedy West looks to be a breakaway threat for the Sycamores as the offense looks to gear itself more towards the running game.

"We think that Tony, with his speed, will give us another dimension," West said of his son as the Sycamores featured runner. "If he can get some of the holes that we created last year, he can

go all the way. The one thing that we lose from last year is that guys like Forte and Sample, were good hard runners that could break tackles. Now, we are looking at guys that are going to rely more on their speed."

Also in line for a shot at the running back position will be redshirt freshman Robert Barcliff, who was a talented back at Hargrave Military. Bryan McCulley has emerged as a talented back with the wits and athleticism to succeed in Hrovat's scheme.

The true strength of the Sycamores offensively will be along the front line where the majority of starters from 2005 return for another campaign together in the trenches. Anchored in the middle by All-Gateway Second Teamer Mike Thorpe, the ISU

offensive line will open holes for the Sycamore backs against all comers this fall.

"Deep down, I think that the offensive line is our strong point," West said. "I think they are so strong because they all played well together last year. This is an above average group. I think that they will gel this year, and that will make us a stronger and more competitive offense."

Joining Thorpe will be senior Fred Staugh and junior Zach Odle, who each started last season. Add to them starter Jack Byrne, who saw extensive playing time as a true freshman and ISU returns a solid unit that will prove to be the base of the retooled offensive attack. Transfer Anthony Bullock headlines a group of talented newcomers that will challenge to crack the Sycamore starting lineup and compete for playing time at ISU's deepest position on the team.

In 2005 the Sycamores set new school records for passing and passing yards, and look for more of the same as the offense will look to continue to be a fast paced group on the field. The new component will be the new attitude to look for more running opportunities out of those offensive schemes as the Sycamores' look to control the ball more in 2006, and take some pressure off the defense.

DEFENSE

The Sycamore defense has to answer some question marks heading into the preseason. With heavy graduation losses along the defensive front (Kyle Mitchell & Anipati Mallo), as well as the departure of talented linebackers Doc Gooden and LaDrelle Bryant, the ISU defense will be looking for new faces in an effort to shore up trouble spots that arose last fall.

The strength of the defense will be in the backfield, especially the safeties, where juniors Bryan Jackson and Rafael Price return after stellar debuts last year. Price is the team's leading returning tackler with 75 stops last year, including one tackle for loss. The hard-hitting Purdue transfer also forced a pair of fumbles and broke up two passes on the year.

Jackson battled injury to some degree in 2005, seeing action in only seven games, but still amassed 33 tackles over the year. He forced two fumbles, notched a blocked kick on special teams and recovered one more fumble to show that he will be a major defensive force for ISU this fall.

Coach West and defensive coordinator Aubrey Kelly will search the roster for the best fit at both cornerback positions with seniors Kyle James and Warren English-Malone the leading contenders. Redshirt freshman Elliott Thomas will also be relied upon early to keep the Sycamore defensive backfield up to par.

"We have a couple of guys here that are going to bring a little bit of experience," West said of situation in the backfield. "Bryan Jackson and Rafael Price will be mainstays for us this season."

With heavy losses at the two linebacker positions in the Sycamores' 4-2-5 defensive alignment, ISU will have to replace Gooden and Bryant with lesser experienced players.

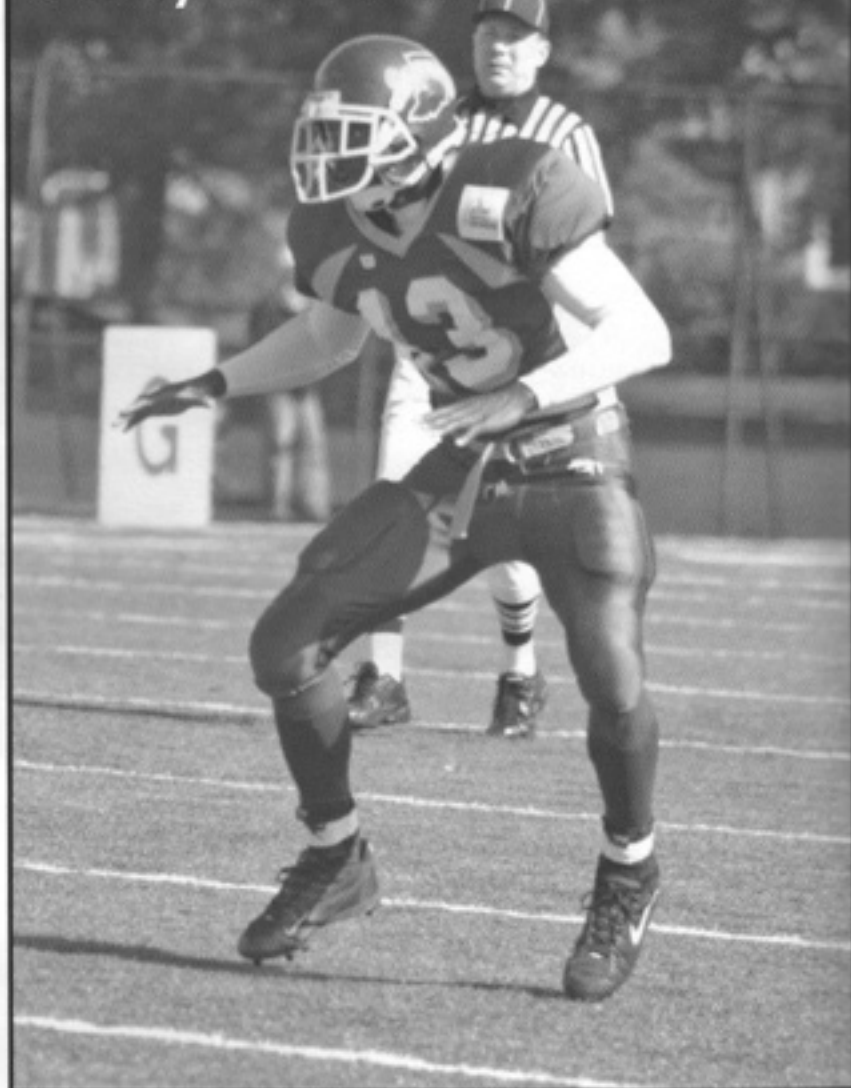
Senior Andy Jones and junior Brandon Logan will be leading contenders at the linebacker positions heading into the fall. Jones played in all 11 games last year for the Sycamores with 29 total tackles, including four for losses. He also posted a three sacks, the team's second-best, coming off the bench after starting in 2004. Logan saw action in nine games, and was credited with eight tackles.

"We are going to have to replace two really good linebackers, but I think Andy Jones and Brandon Logan, if they work hard, will be up to the task," West said. "I am looking forward to seeing what Josh Jones can do as a redshirt freshman, and we also look forward to having Shonda Faulkner back from an injury."

Redshirt freshman Josh Jones as well as senior Shonda Faulkner, who missed all but the first two games of the year due to injury, will be in the mix as well as the Sycamores' replace the talented Gooden and CFL-bound Bryant in the lineup.

Along the defensive front line, ISU must replace defensive end Kyle Mitchell, who set the school's career records for sacks as well as tackles for loss. Mitchell started at one end of the Sycamores' defensive line for each of the past five seasons. Returning at the other end of the line will be senior Madison Miller,

who emerged as a formidable player last season with 56 tackles, seven and a half tackles for loss and three sacks in 10 games.

Coach West expects to see a new level of play from senior Will McDonald as he finally will get a chance to crack the starting lineup with the departure of Mitchell. Redshirt freshman Kevin Wilson will be a long-awaited addition to the lineup after getting a year of experience under his belt in 2005.

Inside, ISU lost the services of Anipati Mallo, but returns the talented senior Prenny Stokes to the defensive tackle position. Inside, Coach West expects Stokes to prove to be a major force for the Sycamores as they look to stop the talented rushing attacks in the Gateway.

"The one place that we have a question mark is along the defensive line," West said. "Losing Kyle Mitchell and Anipati Mallo really put things up in the air. Prenny Stokes will hopefully be alright for us and we also have Shelby Smith coming back. We are looking forward to David Wright joining us from the junior college ranks. We also may look to move some young guys inside out of necessity."

Overall, West expects the defense to shore up their assignments and turn a question mark to a strength despite being somewhat of an unknown heading into the fall. He promises that the defensive coaches will find the best 11 athletes to run his proven defensive schemes and make marked improvements statistically in 2005.

"We are an unknown quantity on defense this year," West said. "There is no doubt that we are going to play some really young guys. I am hoping that they grow up quick, especially by the time that we get into Gateway play. We just want them to be able to hold their own. We lost some players that were pretty good for us, so we have some work ahead in order to fix the holes that were created there."

SPECIAL TEAMS

The rock solid core of the Sycamore special teams is kicker Kyle Hooper, who returns for one more year with the program. Hooper connected on 10-of-14 attempts this past season and Coach West expects those numbers to increase during his senior season.

"Hopefully we may try to extend his range this season," West said on the abilities and expectations of Hooper. "There were a lot of times last year that he felt that he could hit some of those longer range field goals, and I just opted out of doing it. We may go with him a little more, because I think that he is a guy that may add a scoring threat for us this year."

Hooper needs just 12 more consecutive PAT's this season to break the ISU career consecutive PAT record of 80. He has made of the first 69 attempts of his career. Last season, Hooper booted a career-best 47-yarder against Southern Illinois at Memorial Stadium.

ISU will be searching for a punter as the season draws near this fall. Phillip Johnson graduated, and took with him his 36.7 yard average. Hooper and redshirt freshman Chris Johansen will get looks, and expect ISU to workout several players at this key position in the fall.

Senior Nick Urankar returns as the Sycamores' kickoff specialist. Hooper will also get a look at the position, but Coach West expects Urankar to begin the season as the leading candidate for the job.

Coach West also believes that Sam Logan will return for his third year for kick holding duties and junior Brandon Hooks will be the snapping specialist.

Similar to the punting positions, ISU will be looking to put its most speedy athletes back deep on kickoff and punt return formations. The leading returning candidate from last season is sophomore Mike Woods, who returned six kicks for an average of 15.3 yards last fall. On punts, both Carl Berman and Kyle James return after seeing the bulk of those duties one year ago.

THE SCHEDULE

The early portion of the schedule is brutal as the Sycamores begin the season at Big 10 power Purdue. ISU returns West to his Mid-American background as he faces off against Northern Illinois in the season's fourth game. Northern Illinois proved to be a significant rival for West's Toledo Rocket clubs in the MAC Championship race each season.

"The schedule is the schedule, that is the way that the ball bounces," West said. "I really look forward to getting into league play. Hopefully we can come away with a couple of wins before we get there, and then be competitive enough to pick up a couple of victories in the league."

A road game at Eastern Illinois and a home contest against Murray State are in the middle of an NCAA Division I-A sandwich for the Sycamores. ISU dropped contests to both Ohio Valley teams in 2005, and look for redemption this season after the Panthers won the OVC last fall.

The conference schedule is particularly tough as it always is in the nation's No. 1 ranked NCAA Division I-AA football conference, The Gateway. ISU opens at Southern Illinois, as the Salukis are coming off a record-breaking season that saw them win their first-ever playoff contest in the history of the program. SIU forged a three-way tie with Northern Iowa and Youngstown State for the Gateway Championship in 2005. UNI and SIU each received bids to the national playoffs, while the Penguins became the first-ever Gateway Regular Season Champion to not advance to postseason play.

After opening the conference slate at SIU, the Sycamores travel to Youngstown State to face off against the Penguins. ISU has won just once in 15 meetings with YSU, and it came at Stambaugh Stadium in 1995. Coach West will return to coach the Sycamores just some 20 miles away from his hometown of Niles, Ohio when ISU faces the Penguins in early October.

"The Gateway is one tough league," West said of playing two

road contests to open league play. "You have to bring your A-game every week in order to be competitive. I hope that by the time we get to our conference schedule, we are going to have some guys that understand what they are going to have to do in order to win some league games."

Finally, the Sycamores return home to open league play at Memorial Stadium, but they must face 2005 league co-champ Northern Iowa, a team that advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA Playoff Championship Game in 2005. UNI has won each of the last three meetings with ISU.

The Sycamores stay home to face Missouri State in Homecoming on October 21, before hitting the road against Western Kentucky and Western Illinois just before Halloween.

The 2006 slate concludes on November 11 when the Sycamores host Illinois State at Memorial Stadium. ISU has not won a football contest since downing the 'Birds 41-38 in overtime to open the 2004 Gateway schedule.

It all comes together for what promises to be a spectacular season of football in the Wabash Valley. A fast-paced offense combines with an experienced special teams unit and a youthful defensive squad as the Sycamores look to once again tackle one of the nation's toughest schedules in college football.

For Coach West, the work began in the spring and will continue throughout the season as he works to get the Sycamore football ship turned in the right direction.

"We are going to be stressing that all-out hustle, dedication and effort are the keys," West said of changing the fortunes of the Sycamore football program. "When I look at the statistics, we have got to be going in the right direction. If we can continue pushing in the right direction, then that eventually will turn into victories."

Memorial Stadium

Home for the Sycamores over the past 39 years is venerable Memorial Stadium. The 12,764-seat structure has stood at the corner of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute, Ind., since its original construction in 1924. The facility was acquired by Indiana State University in 1967.

The stadium, through constant upkeep, is in excellent condition through the years. Its latest additions are a \$600,000 AstroPlay artificial surface, installed prior to the 2001 season, as well as a refurbished pressbox.

Memorial Stadium is not new to synthetic surfaces, as the stadium and Indiana State University claim distinction as the world's first university to make outdoor application of Astroturf. Following the University's acquisition of the stadium, Indiana State opened the 1967 season with a 41-6 win over Eastern Illinois in the first game played on the new surface.

Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the public for the first time on May 5, 1925, as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria Tractors before an estimated crowd of 9,000. Among the honored guests were Major League Baseball Commissioner

Judge Kennesaw Mountain Landis and Charles Barnard of the Cleveland Indians.

The first use of the playing field was in the fall of 1924, when Wiley and Garfield High Schools played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.

Original construction of Memorial Stadium begun in 1922, at a cost of \$450,000. Upon the University gaining control in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included: the reorientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to its present east-west configuration; the installation of Astroturf; and the construction of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as the rebuilding of seats on the south side. The original arch still remains from the original structure. However, the bleacher seats, installed in 1967, were removed in the summer of 1996 and replaced by a landscaped hill which serves as a general admission section and a site for pregame tailgating for Sycamore fans.

Memorial Stadium features a single-level press box which can accommodate over 50 people for a Sycamore football contest. The press box houses the ISU

Stat Crew, Presidential SkyBox, Broadcast Locations for Visiting and Home Radio as well as Live Television, Visiting A.D. Skybox, Home and Visiting Coaches Booths as well as the stadium's public address and scoreboard operation rooms.

The centerpiece of the ISU press box is a 20-seat media work area which features two levels of spacious accommodations for those media covering Sycamore football.

The ISU fieldhouse is the location of the ISU coaches' meeting room and lockerroom, as the equipment storage, the home and visiting lockerrooms as well as the ISU Athletic Training facility. The fieldhouse is the location of all postgame media interview facilities.

Former Indiana State head coach Dennis Raetz utilized Memorial Stadium well. His Sycamore teams posted a 67-30-1 mark for a .689 winning percentage in 18 seasons at Memorial Stadium. Under the lights, Raetz's teams compiled a 34-4-1 mark for an .885 winning percentage.

Memorial Stadium from field level showing the AstroPlay surface which was installed prior to the 2001 season.

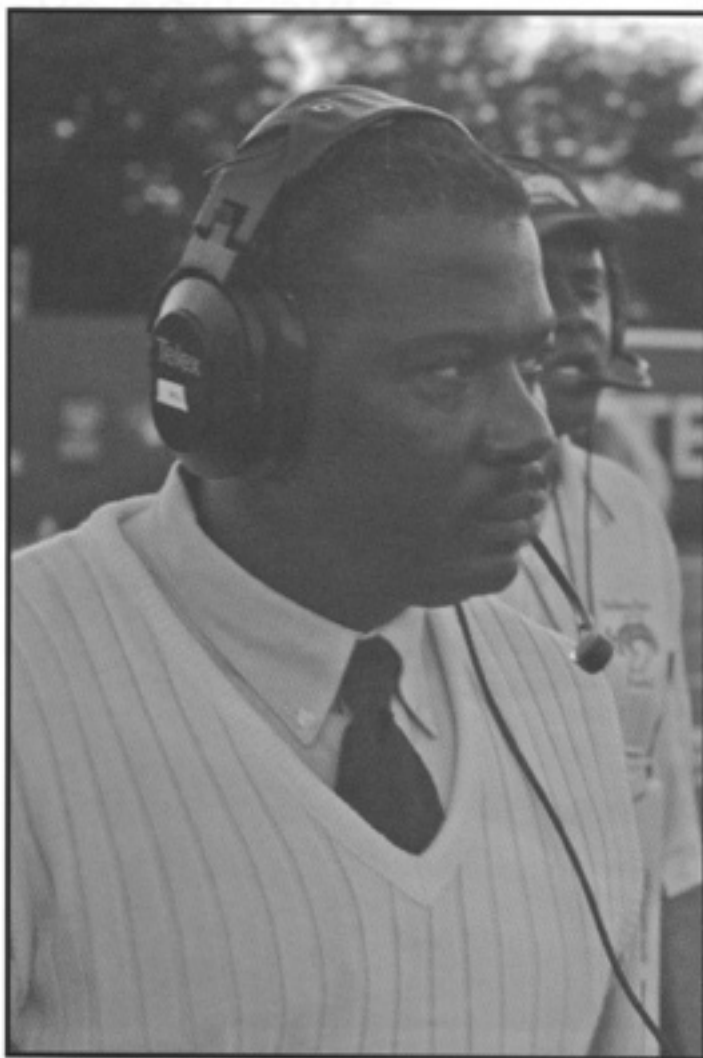


LOU WEST

Indiana State Head Football Coach Second Season

Beginning his second season as head coach of the Indiana State Sycamores is Lou West.

In 2005, the Sycamore defense was led by senior Kyle Mitchell, who was an All-Gateway Football Conference First Team member. Mitchell, an 11-game starter at defensive end, broke the Indiana State career sacks record with 25.5. Mitchell recorded 57 total tackles over the year, including 35 solo stops while pacing the team with 13.5 tackles for loss. Linebacker Doc Gooden was an All-Gateway Second Team selection, giving West two all-conference nods in just his first year at the helm of the defense. Gooden paced the Sycamores with 81 total tackles, including 36 solo stops. He recorded one sack during the season while being credited with 5.5 tackles for loss. Gooden blocked

a kick and had double-digit tackles in four Gateway Football Conference contests.

Last season, the Sycamore offense was simply spectacular. ISU broke the school record for passing yards in a season with 2,906. Quarterback Blayne Baggett set the ISU record for pass completions, pass attempts and yards in a season. Baggett's 396 yards passing at Missouri State were a single-game record, and his 33 pass completions at Murray State also set a school standard.

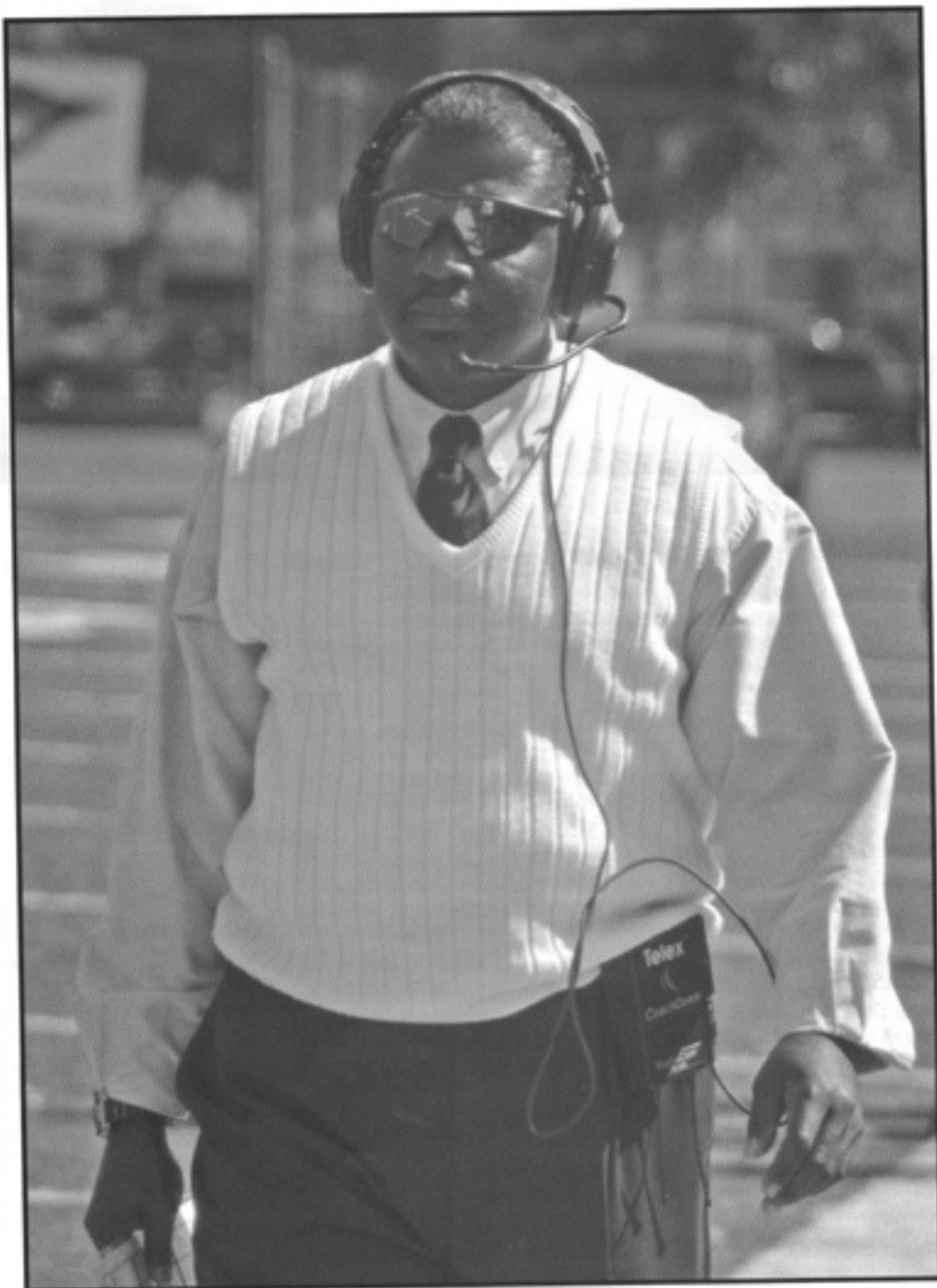
Sycamore wide receiver Sam Logan etched his name in the records book by catching a school-record 77 passes during the season. Versus Murray State, Logan set a Gateway standard with 17 receptions en route to being named first team all-conference. Tight end Jamie Petrowski enjoyed a stellar final season with the program as he caught 57 passes for 517 yards en route to being named first team all-conference as well as Third Team All-American by *The Sports Network* as well as the *Associated Press*. Offensive center Mike Thorpe was a second team all-conference member while Baggett and tailback Andre Forte were honorable mention All-Gateway selections.

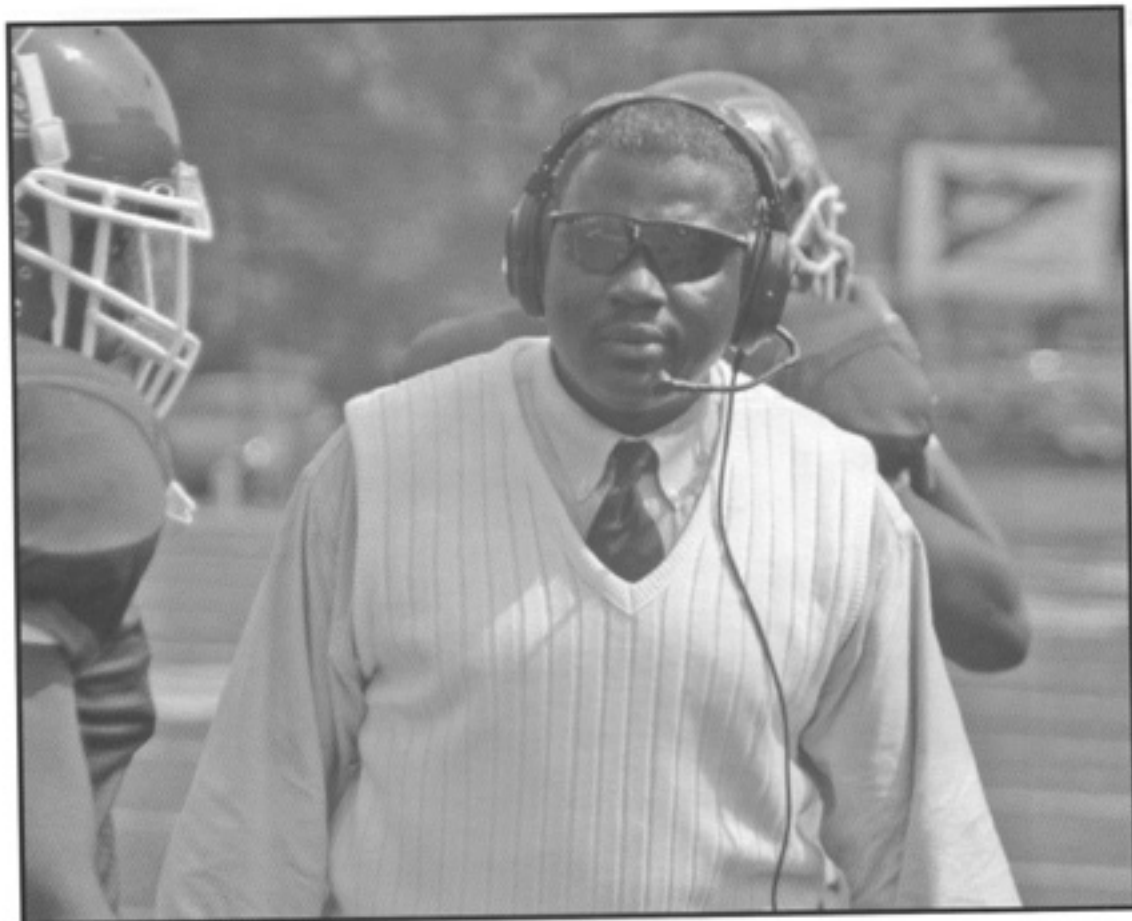
Also starring for the Sycamores in West's inaugural season was kicker Kyle Hooper, who earned his second consecutive All-Gateway Honorable Mention selection. He saw action in all 11 contests, connecting on 10-of-14 field goal attempts. Hooper put together a string of 14 consecutive made field goals — stretching a streak that began last season. He booted a career-best 47-yard field goal against Southern Illinois, and made his first six field goal attempts of the season. Hooper was a Preseason All-American selection by *CollegeSportsReport.com*.

From 2001 until 2004, West worked as the defensive coordinator at the University of Toledo. While on staff with the Rockets, Toledo posted a 36-14 record, the eighth-best mark in all of Division I over that span. Toledo knocked off Miami (Ohio) 35-27 for the Mid-American Conference championship in 2004.

Over his four years with the Rockets, they won two MAC championships, and three MAC-West titles. Toledo earned three bowl game invitations with West in charge of the defense. The Rockets have defeated five Top 25 teams and have recorded eleven comeback wins when trailing by double digits with West on the coaching staff.

During the 2004 season, the Rockets finished fourth in the league in rush defense (113.4) and had two defenders earn All-MAC honors. In 2003, the Rockets finished fifth in scoring defense (23.8) and fifth in rush defense (150.1), while two Rockets garnered All-MAC plaudits.





In 2001, the Rockets' defense was second in the MAC in rushing yards allowed (105.6), second in total defense (321.8), and third in scoring defense (25.5). Toledo claimed the MAC and Motor City Bowl Championships in his first season on staff. During the 2002 season, the Rockets produced a pair of All-MAC linebackers in Tom Ward and David Gardner, as they made their second-consecutive bowl appearance.

Prior to joining the Rockets staff, West worked as the safeties coach at the University of Notre Dame for two seasons (1999-2000). In West's first year, A-Jani Sanders led the team in tackles for loss and was named to the All-Independent squad. Sanders, along with fellow safety Deke Cooper signed free agent contracts with NFL teams. Cooper is in his third full season with the Jacksonville Jaguars. During West's second season (2000) in South Bend, Ind., the Fighting Irish went 9-3 and made an appearance in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. Tony Driver, a free safety for the Irish, was drafted in the sixth round of the 2001 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills after earning All-Independent squad honors.

From 1995-98, West served as the defensive backs coach at Virginia Tech. In 1998, the Hokies ranked second nationally in interceptions (23), fourth in scoring defense (12.9), seventh in total defense (284.9), and 11th in pass efficiency defense (103.4 rating). Virginia Tech also led the Big East in scoring defense, total defense, rushing defense and passing defense

during the 1998 campaign. The Hokies picked off three passes en route to a 38-7 win over Alabama in the Music City Bowl that season.

During his four years at Virginia Tech, the Hokies appeared in four consecutive bowl games and posted a combined win-loss mark of 36-12 (.750). In 1995 (Sugar) and 1996 (Orange) the Hokies participated in New Year's Day Bowl games under the Bowl Alliance. VT ranked in the Top 25 in three of his four years on staff. Under his tutelage, five Hokies garnered First Team All-Big East honors, while one player earned second team accolades. Two players (Torrian Gray and Antonio Banks) were selected in the first four rounds of the 1997 National Football League Draft by the Minnesota Vikings, while Pierson

Prioleau was a fourth-round selection of the San Francisco 49ers in 1999.

West spent one season as the secondary coach at Kent State (1994) after six seasons (1988-93) as defensive backs, outside linebackers, and tight ends coach at Cincinnati. He began his career as a graduate assistant with Arizona in 1977 before working as the defensive backs coach at Arizona Western JC from 1979-80. West took over as defensive backs coach at Middle Tennessee State for two seasons (1981-82) before spending the 1983 season with the University of Minnesota. From 1984-85, he worked at Western Michigan University as defensive backs coach.

A product of Niles, Ohio, West graduated from McKinley High School before attending the University of Cincinnati (1973-76), where he played defensive back. West earned three letters and recorded four interceptions and six fumble recoveries during his career. Following his senior campaign, he played in the Blue-Gray Classic and the North-South Shrine Bowl. West earned his bachelor's degree from Cincinnati and his master's degree from Arizona in 1980.

West and his wife Gail, are the parents of four children - Andre, Adrian and Alexandria West as well as Orenthal Magazine.

Offensive Coordinator

First Season

Blair Hrovat begins his first season with the Indiana State Sycamore football program under head coach Lou West. Hrovat serves as the team's Offensive Coordinator. He will also coach the Sycamore quarterbacks.

Hrovat spent the 2005 season as an assistant football coach at Sequoyia High School in Canton, Ga. While there he was the team's offensive coordinator as well as a special education instructor.

He spent four seasons as the head coach at NCAA Division III Allegheny College (Pa.) from 1998-2002. While with Allegheny, Hrovat compiled a 26-14 record while his squads broke 15 team records. Hrovat coached and recruited the school's career passing leader, while he also coached the school's all-time rushing, scoring, receiving and touchdown receptions leaders. His offense averaged over 35 points and 435 yards per game during his stay. In 2001, the Allegheny offense averaged 214 yards rushing as well as 214 yards passing per game. From 1992-98, Hrovat was the Assistant Head Coach and Offensive Coordinator at the University of South Dakota. During his stay in Vermillion, S.D., he also served as the program's recruiting coordinator and led an offense that broke 10 school records in his seven seasons. He coached the school's career passing as well as the No. 2 career TD leaders.

For three seasons, he was the offensive coordinator as well as quarterbacks coach at San Francisco State University. His offense enjoyed a No. 1 conference ranking, while he oversaw a unit that broke or tied 11 school records. At SFSU, he also served as a fundraising assistant to the Athletic Director.

Hrovat spent two summers (1991 & 1994) as an offensive backfield guest coach for the Canadian Football League's Winnipeg Blue Bombers.

"I'm looking forward to this challenge, and the opportunity to work with Coach West," coach Hrovat said. "I am intrigued and excited to work and help mold the spread offense here at Indiana State. I am ready to help the Sycamores continue to build their tradition."

He received a B.A. degree for Specialized Studies in Business and Computer Science from Edinboro University (Pa.) in 2003. Hrovat was inducted into the Edinboro University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005, following a successful football career at the school where Olympic Champion and ISU alum Bruce Baumgartner is the current Director of Athletics.

As a quarterback, he was ranked second in the nation for passing at the NCAA Division II level. He set 17 Edinboro records and received the Sox Harrison Award as the school's outstanding senior athlete in 1984. As a starter, he posted a career record of 25-6 and ranks amongst the PSAC's Top 10 for career passing yards as well as touchdowns. He completed 49 TD passes as a senior.

Second Season

Aubrey Kelly begins his second season with the Indiana State Sycamore football program under head coach Lou West. Kelly serves as the team's Defensive Coordinator. He will also coach the Sycamore linebackers.

In 2005, the Sycamore defense was led by senior Kyle Mitchell, who was an All-Gateway Football Conference First Team member. Mitchell, an 11-game starter at defensive end, broke the Indiana State career sacks record with 25.5. Mitchell recorded 57 total tackles over the year, including 35 solo stops while pacing the team with 13.5 tackles for loss. Linebacker Doc Gooden was an All-Gateway Second Team selection, giving Kelly two all-conference nods in just his first year at the helm of the defense. Gooden paced the Sycamores with 81 total tackles, including 36 solo stops.

Kelly finished off his first year with the program on a high-note as he was one of 25 collegiate coaches nationwide to be selected to attend the 2006 NCAA Expert Coaches' Academy in Miami, Fla.

Kelly came to ISU from Delaware State, where he was the team's defensive coordinator in 2004. The Hornets were fourth in the 11-team Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference in sacks with 24. Defensive back Sam Smith finished second in the MEAC in sacks (6.5), third in tackles (104) and third in tackles-for-loss (14-for-79 yards). In addition, defensive end Brent Davis was third in the MEAC in sacks with 5.5, while Smith and Davis were All-MEAC First Team selections.

Kelly joined the Delaware State staff after one season as offensive coordinator/quarterback and receivers coach at Division II Elizabeth City State University (N.C.). In 2002, he was defensive coordinator at fellow MEAC member Norfolk State. In 1999 & 2000, he was head coach of the National All-Stars in the annual Division III Red/Blue Game. In 2001, he was inducted into the National All-Star Hall of Fame. Kelly also served as defensive coordinator/secondary and kickers coach at Division II Clarion University in Pennsylvania from 1994 to '97. In 1996, Clarion was 11-2 overall and reached the NCAA Division II playoffs semifinals.

From 1990 to '93, he was defensive coordinator at Division III Salisbury University (Md.). He also served as the team's secondary coach and recruiting coordinator. During the 1987 to '89 seasons, Kelly was an assistant coach in charge of receivers, tight ends and the secondary at Division I-AA Southwest Texas State University. Kelly began his coaching career as a graduate assistant and junior varsity head coach at Division II Southern Connecticut University from 1986 to '87.

He has also served summer fellowships with the National Football League's Washington Redskins and Houston Oilers. In addition, he was a physical education instructor at Elizabeth City, Salisbury State and Southwest Texas. Kelly is a member of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and the Black Coaches Association. He served a three-year term on the AFCA Coach-of-the-Year Committee.

Fifth Season

David Hutchison is beginning his fifth season with the Indiana State football program working his first year under offensive coordinator Blair Hrovat and second with head coach Lou West. Hutchison serves as the program's recruiting coordinator as well as offensive line coach.

Offensive tackle Stuart Williams took All-Gateway Football Conference honors under Hutchinson's tutelage in 2003. During that season, he coached a Sycamore offensive front which blocked for Jake Shields during the school's fourth-best single-game rushing effort against Florida International.

Working with the ISU running backs in 2002, Hutchison guided Shields to a season in which he gained 5.4 yards per carry and scored seven touchdowns for the Sycamores. He was instrumental in the development of Soso Dede and Sydney Montfort, who combined for seven rushing touchdowns on the season.

He came to the Sycamores' football program after spending one year as a graduate assistant with the offensive unit at Missouri. Prior to working on the Tigers' staff, Hutchison logged two seasons as a graduate assistant at Toledo (1999-2000), where he also worked with the offensive unit, tutoring tight ends and wide receivers. Sycamore wide receiver Sam Logan etched his name in the records book by catching a school-record 77 passes during the season. Versus Murray State, Logan set a Gateway standard with 17 receptions en route to being named first team all-conference. Tight end Jamie Petrowski enjoyed a stellar final season with the program as he caught 57 passes for 517 yards en route to being named first team all-conference as well as Third Team All-American by The Sports Network as well as the Associated Press. Offensive center Mike Thorpe was a second team all-conference member while Baggett and tailback Andre Forte were honorable mention All-Gateway selections.

Elson first joined the Sycamores in 1975, working as an assistant to then equipment manger Russ Branum. He then served as assistant equipment manger from 1876-83.

Elson was named head equipment manager in July of 1983 — a position he has held since that time.

One only has to watch other collegiate football games on Saturday afternoons around the United States or National Football League contests on Sunday or Monday to see the fruits of Elson's labors. He continues to run one of the best equipment rooms in all of college football, and many of his former student and graduate assistant equipment managers have moved on to manage equipment operations throughout the country. Some of Elson's former workers now run or have run the equipment operations for several major college football programs as well as NFL teams such as the New York Jets and Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

A native of Brazil, Ind., Elson graduated from Brazil High School in 1966. Following a three-year stint in the U.S. Army, Elson received his bachelor's degree in sociology from ISU in 1973. He and wife, Marilyn, have two daughters, Carol and Tish, as well as five grandchildren.

Henry Villegas is now in his 15th year as the academic coordinator for athletics at Indiana State University. Villegas and his staff provide academic support for all 16 intercollegiate sports programs at ISU. Sycamore athletes were most recently recognized by the Missouri Valley Conference with their second Academic Excellence Award for having the highest cumulative grade point average in the conference. ISU has either won or shared the award in two of its three years of existence.

In 2004, ISU had three sports teams (softball, women's cross country and women's basketball) gain national recognition for having the highest gpa's in the nation among all Division I schools in their respective sports. During the past 10 years, Villegas has coordinated the nationally-recognized Life Skills Program. The program is designed to help all ISU student-athletes bridge the gap from college to professional life.

Lloyd W. Benjamin III became the tenth president of Indiana State University on July 1, 2000.

Prior to coming to ISU, President Benjamin served as vice president for academic affairs at Valdosta State University in Valdosta, Georgia, from 1995 to 2000. He was dean of the College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Studies at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock from 1988 to 1995 and dean of the College of Fine Arts, UALR from 1984-1988. He also served as acting dean of the College of Fine Arts and chair of the department of art, UALR, from 1983-1984.

Benjamin graduated from Emory University in 1966 with a bachelor of arts degree in the history of art. In 1973, he earned his Ph.D. in art history from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. His dissertation focused on "The Empathetic Relation of Observer to Image in 15th Century Flemish Painting."

In addition to his duties as university president, Benjamin also serves as president of the ISU Foundation, and serves on the boards of Union Hospital, the Swope Art Museum, the Alliance for Growth and Progress and United Way of the Wabash Valley, as well as for the Indiana Economic Development Council, and the Indiana Higher Education Telecommunication System.

Dr. Benjamin is married to Wieke van der Weijden, who earned a Ph.D. in biochemistry from Leiden University, The Netherlands. The Benjamins have two grown children: a daughter, Saskia Jansje, and son, Lloyd William.

Ron Prettyman enters his second year as Indiana State University's Director of Athletics. He was tabbed to take over ISU's athletics department on March 31, 2005 after ten successful years as Director of Athletics at California State-Dominguez Hills.

Prettyman was named NCAA/NACDA Administrator of the Year in 2004 and is a past president of both the NCAA Division II Athletic Directors Association and the California Collegiate Athletic Association. During his 10-year tenure at Dominguez Hills, the school won a NCAA Division II men's soccer national championship and was national runner-up in 2001. The school hosted the NCAA Division II Final Four women's soccer championship and first and second round NCAA Division II men's soccer championships.

In addition to the athletics success, Prettyman helped coordinate the renovations of the baseball, softball, and tennis facilities at CSUDH, while also presiding over the construction of offices and remodeling programs for the gymnasium and weight room.

He played an integral role in the construction of the \$200 million Home Depot Center, built on the CSUDH campus. The Home Depot Center was recently designated as a USA Olympic Training Center, which is the only such designation on any college campus in the nation. It also serves as host of the LA Galaxy and Chivas USA of Major League Soccer.

Prior to his time at California State-Dominguez Hills, where he has been since 1995, Prettyman served as athletics director at Vanguard University, where he had also been an associate professor of health, physical education and recreation classes, and head coach for the men's and women's tennis teams, baseball and women's basketball teams.

He was NAIA District III Administrator of the Year in 1991, 1992 and 1994, and was on the LA 2012 Olympic Bid Committee in 2001. He is a member of the Carson Coordinating Council and Carson Boys and Girls Club Board of Directors, and a past member of the Gardena/Carson YMCA Executive Board, LA Watts Summer Games Advisory Committee, Pigskin Classic Organizing Committee and Professional In-Residence Program at the NCAA/Betty Ford Center.

Prettyman holds a bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation from Vanguard University and a master's degree in education from California State University at Stanislaus.

Prettyman was also selected by his peers to serve on two NCAA national committees as well as the executive committee of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and National Directors Cup Executive Committee.

Prettyman and Carol, his wife of 30 years, have two children, Shara, 28, and Ronnie, 25.

Indiana State University student-athletes have access to one of the finest athletic training programs in the country. Under the guidance of Interim Chairperson Dr. Jeffrey L. Edwards, the Athletic Training Department at Indiana State University is currently one of only a handful of institutions nationwide that offers an accredited entry-level athletic training education program, an accredited Master's advanced athletic training program, and Ph.D specialization in sports medicine.

Indiana State University's Baccalaureate and Master's degree programs were the first to be accredited by the National Athletic Trainers' Association (NATA), and have been continuously accredited for over 30 years. Consequently, ISU offers an extremely progressive, contemporary, and high quality health care network to over 375 student-athletes. Athletic Training Services continually seeks to provide all Sycamore student-athletes the best available care in sports medicine. Sport-specific programs are carefully designed and implemented in an effort to prevent, manage, and treat a spectrum of athletic injuries.

Additionally, the staff athletic trainers direct rehabilitation programs that are focused on returning the student-athlete to his/her pre-injury activity level in an efficient and safe manner.

Athletic Training Services is directed by Paul Plummer, LAT, ATC. Mr. Plummer supervises three full-time staff athletic trainers: Lori Vancza, LAT, ATC, Erick Buitrago, LAT, ATC, and Amy Reinhart, LAT, ATC, an intern and eight additional graduate assistants. All of the full-time staff, intern and graduate assistants are certified by the NATA - Board of Certification, and Licensed in the State of Indiana to practice athletic training. Together they serve to provide health care services for all ISU student-athletes, as well as serving as clinical instructors for students in the entry-level athletic training education program.

The Athletic Training Department is fortunate to have four physicians assist in delivering health care to the students-athletes at Indiana State, while also playing a key role in educating athletic training students within the De-



partment. Dr. Tom Klootwyk serves as the Team Orthopedic Surgeon for ISU, and Team Physician for the Indianapolis Colts. His private practice resides at Methodist Sports Medicine Center in Indianapolis. Dr. Pat Kersey, Dr. John Welch and Dr. James Welch serve as Team Physicians in Athletic Training Services. Both are trained as Primary Care Physicians with an additional certification in Sports Medicine.

Dr. Kersey practices medicine at Methodist Sports Medicine Center in Indianapolis and Dr. John and James Welch is in private practice in Terre Haute. In addition to their clinical affiliation with Indiana State University, Dr. Klootwyk holds the rank of Adjunct Professor and Dr. Kersey and Dr. John and James Welch hold the rank of Adjunct Assistant Professor within the Athletic Training Department.

Together, the staff athletic trainers, physicians and faculty in the Athletic Training Department comprise a comprehensive network of sports medicine professionals that utilizes cutting-edge methods and technology in caring for student-athletes at ISU.

Serving as Assistant to the Chair of the Athletic Training Department and Executive Director for Athletic Training Services, Mr. Paul Plummer enters his fifth year at Indiana State University. In addition to coordinating and administering Athletic Training Services for all ISU student-athletes, Plummer specifically serves as the Head Athletic Trainer for the men's basketball team.

Plummer also serves as a clinical instructor in Indiana State's nationally recognized athletic training education programs. In service to his profession, Plummer is the Chair of the Reimbursement Committee for the Indiana Athletic Trainer's Association and is the Chair of the College/University Athletic Training Student Committee for the Great Lakes Athletic Trainers Association. He is also President-Elect of the Indiana Athletic Trainers.

Prior to joining the

staff here at ISU, Plummer was recognized by his peers as the 2002 North Carolina College/University Athletic Trainer of the Year. Paul served as Head Athletic Trainer and Program Director at Campbell University from 1995-2002. During his tenure at Campbell, he created an entry-level athletic training education program that achieved CAAHEP Accreditation while he coordinated the medical coverage for the Fighting Camel athletic teams. He also sat on the Board of Directors for the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA) Research and Education Foundation as the Chair for District 3.

He also serves the NATA Board of Certification by training other Certified Athletic Trainers to administer the practical portion of the national certification examination for athletic trainers. Prior to his time at CU, Plummer served as the Head Athletic Trainer at Manchester College from 1991-1995. Plummer earned his Master's degree from Michigan State University in 1991 and his Bachelor's degree from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale in 1989. A native of Albion, Ind., Paul and his wife, Deb (also a certified athletic trainer), have three children, Stephanie (17), Robert (15), and Courtney (11).

2005 Game Recaps



TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Indiana State gained 398 yards of total offense, including 260 in the air, but it was Eastern Illinois who converted two critical third quarter touchdowns as the Panthers controlled the second half and defeated the Sycamores 24-13 in the season opener for both teams.

With the score tied 10-10 at the intermission, Eastern Illinois took the lead on a 40-yard scoring pass from Mike Donato to Charles Owens that capped an eight-play, 86-yard drive for a touchdown lead with 8:00 minutes left in the third quarter.

Indiana State began the ensuing drive at its

own 30, and was driving down the field until Eastern Illinois' Tristan Burge picked off a Blayne Baggett pass and took the ball back 76 yards for a score and a 24-10 advantage.

ISU's Kyle Hooper rounded out the scoring with a 23-yard field goal with 49 seconds left in the third quarter. Hooper has now connected on each of his last 10 field goal tries dating back to last season.

With ISU trailing 24-13, the Sycamores gained the field position advantage by stopping Eastern Illinois on its first drive of the fourth quarter. But Andre Forte would fumble at the 50, giving the Panthers back the ball and the ability to control the field position battle for the remainder of the contest.

EIU punter Tom Schofield punted eight times for an average of 38.0 yards, and pinned the Sycamores inside their own 20 five times. Eastern opened the scoring with a 17-yard touchdown by Charles Owens to Mike Donato for a 7-0 lead with 11:47 remaining in the first quarter. Hooper kicked the first of his two field goals to cut the advantage to 7-3. EIU's Zach Yates added a field goal of his own for a 10-3 lead, before ISU tied the contest on a 34-yard touchdown pass to Matt Beste from Baggett.

Baggett was 32-of-54 on the night for 260 yards and a touchdown with three interceptions. Baggett's 32 pass completions tied an Indiana State school record also held by Jeff Miller, who connected on 32 passes vs. Ball State in 1985. He hit Jamie Petrowski, Sam Logan and Carl Berman with seven passes each as well as Markus Naves, who recorded five receptions.

Andre Forte rushed the ball 12 times for 63 yards in the contest. Defensively, Kyle James was the leading tackler for ISU with seven total stops. James also forced a fumble on the evening. Darryl Morton and Warren English-Malone each recorded a fumble recovery in the game.

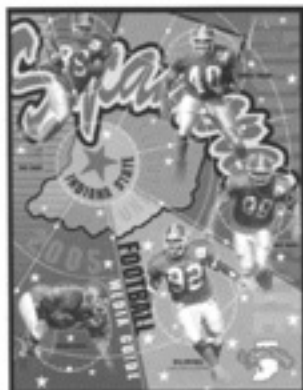

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Indiana State University (0-2) dropped a decisive 42-10 decision to NAIA St. Francis (Ind.) (1-0) at home in what turned into a stunner for the 3,160 fans in attendance at Memorial Stadium. The Cougars reached the NAIA national championship contest one year ago, and showed impressive speed and skill to down its first NCAA Division I-AA opponent in school history.

Indiana State surrendered 409 yards of total offense in the contest, giving up 28 second-half points after the score was a tight 14-10 at the

half. USF's Cory Jacquay opened the scoring with a five-yard burst to put the Cougars up 7-0 with 7:14 showing on the first quarter clock. ISU's Kyle Hooper countered with 3:06 remaining in the first as he booted a 36-yard field goal to inch the Sycamores closer at 7-3. With the make, Hooper has connected on each of last 11 field goal attempts dating back to last year's game against SMS (now Missouri State).

St. Francis would add another score with 1:06 seconds remaining in the first quarter on a six-yard run by Adam Denning to put the Cougars up 14-3.

Andre Forte found the end zone with 4:02 remaining in the first half as he bolted in from three yards out to get ISU back within four at 14-10. The Sycamores drove down to USF's territory on its final drive of the half, but the clock expired before ISU could get within field goal range.

The second half was all USF as they stopped the Sycamores on a three-and-out after ISU's first second half possession. They then blocked a Phillip Johnson punt and Chris Schmitt scooped the loose ball up at the 27-yard line and raced to the end zone to put the Cougars up 21-10.

Sycamore quarterback Blayne Baggett was 25-of-40 passing for 243 yards in the contest. He found Sam Logan and Forte a team-high six times each. Forte carried the ball 12 times for 72 yards with the touchdown.

For USF, Jacquay rushed for 94 yards and two TDs while Michael Ledo amassed 80 yards on the ground. Quarterback Chris Trammell was 10-of-14 with an interception and 118 yards in the contest.

2005 Game Recaps



MURRAY, Ky. — Nick Turner returned a kickoff 91 yards for a touchdown, threw a TD pass and ran for a third score to lead Murray State to a 27-15 win over Indiana State.

Turner rushed for 86 yards for the Racers (1-1), who came back from an early 10-0 deficit. Kyle Hooper opened the scoring with a 23-yard field goal four minutes into the game. Blayne Baggett threw a 6-yard TD pass to Sam Logan six minutes later for a 10-0 Indiana State lead.

Baggett completed a school-record 33 passes in the effort while also attempting a school-most 58. He threw for 262 yards in the contest.

Baggett had tied the school-record with 32 pass completions in the season opener against Eastern Illinois. He is the first ISU quarterback to pass for over 200 yards in each of his first three games as a Sycamore.

Logan finished with a school-record 17 catches for 151 yards. Those 17 receptions also are a Gateway Football Conference single-game record, besting the previous mark of 16, set by Northern Iowa's Eddie Galles against Southern Illinois in 2003.

He entered the contest with 13 total receptions on the season. His total of 30 through three games is 25 shy of the school-record 55 receptions he tallied in 2004. After Logan's touchdown, Turner got the Racers on the board with his long return.

Hooper kicked a 40-yard field goal in the final minute of the opening quarter to give the Sycamores a 13-7 lead. He has now connected on each of his last 13 attempts. Hooper is a perfect 5-for-5 on the season.

ISU expanded its lead to 15-7 when Murray State's Ken Topps slipped in his own end zone for a safety. Madison Miller and Kyle Mitchell combined for the sack of Topps. Mitchell recorded a pair of sacks in the contest, which upped his career total to 23 — just one off the career school-record.

Turner, a senior running back, found Mauri Marchman for a 71-yard pass play with 8:11 left in the first half and added a 5-yard touchdown run seven minutes later to give the Racers the lead for good.

Chad Cook had a 1-yard TD run in the third quarter. The Sycamores outgained the Racers 457-354, but had 14 penalties and converted only 5 of 18 third downs.

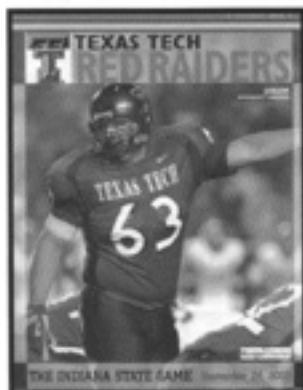

LUBBOCK, Texas — Indiana State hung tough with I-A Big 12 Conference opponent Texas Tech on their home field in the early going, but the Red Raiders proved worthy of their No. 16 national ranking as they rolled to a 63-7 victory over Indiana State at Jones SBC Stadium. With ISU trailing 7-0 in the first quarter, senior Rocky Alo intercepted a pass by Cody Hodges, but fumbled on the return.

After that possession, Texas Tech rattled off 42 consecutive points in the first half en route to the victory. Indiana State scored its lone touchdown of the contest at the 4:12 mark of

the fourth quarter when Blayne Baggett found Jamie Petrowski for a five-yard touchdown pass. Texas Tech opened the scoring with an 11-play, 89-yard yard drive on their second possession of the contest which ended with a Taurean Henderson three-yard run for a touchdown with 7:32 remaining in the first quarter. The Raiders were able to capitalize on the ISU mistake with a five-yard drive that ended with Henderson reaching the end zone for the second time in the contest. Henderson broke several Sycamore tackles and squirted through the line of scrimmage for a 44-yard rush that gave TTU a 14-0 advantage with 7:32 remaining in the first quarter. Henderson continued his stellar outing on the ensuing drive as he capped a nine-play, 82-yard scoring march with a six-yard run at the 12:46 mark in the second quarter. The touchdown gave TTU a 21-0 lead, with the Raiders reaching the end zone on three of its four possessions.

The Red Raiders would go on to score 28 points in the final 12 minutes of the second quarter. Hodges tossed touchdown passes to Jarrett Hicks and two to Joel Filani for a 42-0 lead. The first half scoring ended when Phillip Johnson's punt was blocked by Brandon Douglas and returned two yards for the TD and a 49-0 advantage at the half. Texas Tech would add just two more scores in the second half, to produce the final tally, 63-7. Blayne Baggett led ISU in passing, as he completed 16-of-32 passes for 120 yards in the contest. The Sycamores' leading rusher was Andre Forte, who finished with 17 attempts for 65 yards. Petrowski recorded a teamhigh five receptions for 44 yards and the Sycamores' lone score. Junior Sam Logan, who caught a league and school-record 17 passes one week ago at Murray State, was held without a catch for the first time this season. It broke a string of 14 consecutive games with a pass reception for Logan.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Indiana State took the lead in the fourth quarter over No. 3 Western Kentucky, but the Hilltopper rushing attack proved too much as the Sycamores fell 38-28 in the first Gateway contest of the season. ISU rolled up an impressive 490 yards of total offense but it was not enough to overcome 293 rushing yards by WKU.

WKU posted 521 total yards but the Sycamores were equally impressive in the offensive slugfest. ISU racked up 365 yards through the air. Blayne Baggett went 32-of-53 for 297 yards from the QB position and the Sycamores completed three passes on fake kicks. Phillip Johnson was two-for-two on fake punt attempts for 61 yards, and Sam Logan passed for a seven yard TD on a fake FG. But at the end of the game, the WKU rushing

attack took its toll on the Sycamore defense as the Hilltoppers scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to overcome a 28-24 deficit and earn the win.

Western Kentucky took control of the game early as it scored on its first play from scrimmage on a 73-yard pass from Haddix to Maurice Perkins to take a 7-0 lead just 16 seconds into the game. The Hilltoppers' Don Cline then picked off a Blayne Baggett pass on the Sycamores' first play to regain possession on the ISU 30-yard line. Haddix and Perkins tried to make it two TD's in two plays, but the pass was over the head of an open Perkins. The Sycamores answered with a big play as the defense forced a fumble by Leron Moore to halt the WKU momentum. ISU then marched the ball down the field and tied the score, 7-7, on a 28-yard scamper by Cornel Johnson to finish off a seven-play drive that covered 75-yards.

The Sycamores held the Hilltoppers on their next possession to force a punt and ISU again put together a sustained drive. However, it was not without a little trickery as ISU used a 28-yard pass by Phillip Johnson on a fake punt to keep the drive going. Indiana State also converted a second fourth down play later on the drive. But the third time the Sycamores rolled the dice on fourth down the Hilltoppers would not budge and the ISU drive was stopped on the five-yard line. WKU responded with an impressive 14-play drive that covered 95 yards and regained a 14-7 lead on a Haddix two-yard plunge. The Hilltoppers held the ball for 5:52 during the possession, which saw WKU use 11 running plays for 90 yards. But ISU did not back down as they again marched down the field behind the passing of Baggett and tied the score on a 15-yard touchdown pass to Jamie Petrowski on the eighth play of the drive. Baggett completed five-of-six attempts on the possession, which knotted the score at 14-14. The Sycamore defense stepped up and made a stop on the next WKU possession and gave the ball back to the offense at the 34-yard line. ISU moved the ball down to the seven yard line, where the Hilltoppers stopped the Sycamores and forced ISU to line up for a field goal. But ISU converted on its second fake kick of the day as Sam Logan found Andy Jones wide open for a seven-yard TD and a 21-14 advantage, which ISU maintained heading into halftime.

WKU drew first blood in the second half with a 25-yard field goal by Chris James on its first possession of the half to cut the Sycamore lead to 21-17. The Hilltoppers then forced an ISU punt after four plays and the WKU offense was back on the attack. A two-yard score by Leron Moore culminated a 12 play, 64-yard WKU drive to give them its first lead since the early going, 24-21.

The Sycamores looked like they had another drive stall on the 43-yard line, but Phillip Johnson's second converted pass on a fake punt in the game went for 33 yards on 4th-and-15 to keep the ISU offense on the field. ISU eventually punched it in the end zone on a one-yard run by Cornel Johnson as the Sycamores went back up, 28-24. The ISU drive finished with 15-plays and covered 74 yards.

WKU did not mess around on its next possession, as they went 78 yards on three plays, to score what turned out to be the gamewinning touchdown on a 47-yard pass from Haddix to Jamison Link. The TD gave the Hilltoppers a 31-28 lead and after stopping ISU, the opposition would add the final score on a 30-yard Haddix strike to Curtis Hamilton.



TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Youngstown State scored 35 first half points and didn't look back as they ran away with a 45-0 victory in Gateway Football Conference play at Memorial Stadium.

It did not take Youngstown long to take the lead as the Penguins scored on their first possession going 58 yards on three plays in 50 seconds.

After the Sycamores failed to get a first down, YSU took over and again went down the field pushing the score to 14-0 after a two-yard TD by Monquantae Gibson.

The ISU defense held Youngstown on their next two possessions, but then the Penguin rushing attack started to take its toll. YSU put together an impressive 12-play, 90 yard drive that took 5:28 off the clock to push the lead to 21-0.

After the next ISU drive stalled, the Penguins used a nice punt return to get the ball in great field possession as they only needed 22 yards to punch in its next score. The final tally of the first half came with just 27 seconds remaining in the period and gave YSU a 35-0 lead.

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa—ISU had revenge on the mind after UNI rolled into Memorial Stadium and defeated the Sycamores by a score of 58-6 during the Trees' 2004 Homecoming.

It was Homecoming at UNI this year, but the Panthers were able to hold onto a tight contest, and pull away in the second half for a 31-10 Gateway Football Conference victory. Northern Iowa raced to a quick 7-0 lead with 10:41 left in the first quarter when tailback Terrance Freaney plunged into the end zone from one yard out on a fourth and goal play. The Panthers started the drive at the ISU 34-yard line after receiving a short Sycamore punt.

After the Sycamore offense failed to get a first down on its next possession, the Panthers went back to work and moved the ball down to the ISU six yard line in just three plays. Junior defensive back Warren English-Malone thwarted that score with his third interception of the season to hold the UNI advantage to 7-0.

ISU was able to move the ball into the UNI red zone, but on a third-and-long, senior quarterback Blayne Baggett bobbled the snap out of the shotgun and the Sycamores lost possession. Early on in the next drive senior defensive end Kyle Mitchell recovered a UNI fumble to regain possession. The Sycamores held onto the ball for 14 plays and 74 yards as the drive ended with a 16-yard field goal from junior kicker Kyle Hooper to inch the Sycamores closer at 7-3 with 5:46 remaining in the first half.

UNI's David Horne had the answer for the Panthers and he raced in from 40 yards out give UNI a 14-3 lead with 4:30 remaining in the half. Indiana State once again got near the red zone, but time ran out on the Sycamores before they could get any points before the half.

Following the half, UNI took the kickoff and marched down the field to the ISU eight-yard line where kicker Brian Wingert kicked a 25 yard field goal to extend the advantage out to 17-3. The Sycamores would answer with their first points of the second half as Baggett found sophomore wide receiver Ben Schmidt for his first career touchdown reception, a 20-yard catch, to inch closer at 17-10 with 6:51 left in the third quarter.

Mitchell would recover another UNI fumble with just over four minutes remaining in the third period to stop a UNI scoring drive that moved just inside the ISU 10. After the Trees went three-and-out, UNI once again moved inside the 10-yard line as time wound down in the third period. This time, they reached the end zone and extended their lead to 24-10 with 48 seconds left before the final stanza on a seven-yard run by quarterback Dexter Hill.

Baggett finished the contest with a 25-for-42 passing mark for 241 yards. Baggett's 25 pass completions, give him 178 for the season, which is a new school record. The old mark was 176 which was set by Jeff Miller during the 1985 season. Andre Forte was the Sycamores' leading rusher with 20 yards while Jamie Petrowski caught a game-best six passes for 57 yards. Sam Logan caught five as well, while Forte also added five receptions of his own. Defensively, Mitchell had two key fumble recoveries in the contest.

UNI's Horne and Freaney each rushed for over 100 yards in the contest. It was the first time since the 2004 home victory over Murray State, that the Sycamores had allowed a pair of 100-yard rushers in a single contest.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — After two seasons of dropping its Homecoming contests by wide margins to some of the nation's top-ranked NCAA Division I-AA teams, Indiana State held its own against No. 10 Southern Illinois, before falling 42-20.

The Salukis used 14 fourth quarter points to reach the final margin of victory. ISU had a banner day offensively; with senior quarterback Blayne Baggett tossing for 289 yards, hitting 32-of-45 attempts. He passed for two scores, finding Carl Berman on a pair of touchdown strikes in the contest. Berman scored on catches of 10 and 42 yards.

Southern Illinois took the opening kickoff and drove the ball 81 yards in 13 plays as Antoine Jackson scored on fourth-and-goal from the Sycamore one-yard line with 9:11 remaining in the first quarter to stake Southern to a quick 7-0 advantage. The Sycamores answered as Baggett found Berman on a 10-yard TD with 6:10 showing in the first period, to even the score at seven.

SIU opened up the space in the score that it would need at the end with a pair of TD strikes from quarterback Joel Sambursky — a 21-yarder to Brent Little and a 7-yarder to J.T. Wise — which put the Salukis up 21-7 with 4:29 left in the first half.

Baggett hit Berman in stride for a 42-yard pitch with 2:38 left before the half to inch ISU closer at 21-14. The halftime spread would prove to be 14 points when Alan Turner caught a 10-yard pass from Sambursky with just over 30 seconds left in the half for the 28-14 lead at the break. ISU used a pair of Kyle Hooper field goals, one from 27 and a career-long from 47, to get the margin within one score at 28-20 with 10:23 left in the game. SIU's Arkee Whitlock took control over the final 10 minutes, scoring on a two-yard run and a 19-yard run to boost Southern to a 42-20 victory.

On defense, ISU senior defensive end Kyle Mitchell recorded seven tackles, including four solos and 3.5 tackles for loss as well as a sack in the effort. Mitchell's fourth quarter sack of Sambursky gave him 24.5 for his career — which is a new ISU record. He added a forced fumble and fumble recovery in the game.

Berman had nine catches for 102 yards and two TDs in the contest. This was the second time this season that Berman has reached the 100-yard receiving mark. Andre Forte rushed for 104 yards in the contest, going over 100 for the second time as well this season. Hooper was 2-of-4 kicking on the day, hitting from 47 and 27 while missing from 42 and 33 yards. He had his string of 14 consecutive made field goals broken in the game's second quarter, but has hit 16 of his last 18 attempts.

Sam Logan caught six passes for 79 yards in the contest, giving him 52 pass receptions for the season. He needs just three more to tie his own school record of 55 receptions set last year.

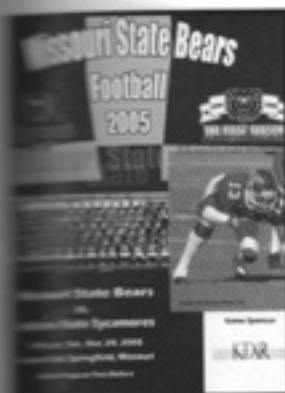

2005 Game Recaps



SPRINGFIELD, Mo. — For the second time this season, Indiana State took a fourth quarter lead over a Gateway Football Conference opponent, but for the second time they came up short as Missouri State scored with 28 seconds remaining to take a 31-27 victory over the Sycamores.

Junior wide receiver Sam Logan tied his own school record with 55 catches on the season in the game's first quarter. The record-tying catch was a 40-yard pass from senior quarterback Blayne Baggett for a touchdown which gave the Sycamores a 7-0 cushion with 7:07 left in the game's first quarter. Logan would break the record with his 56th catch of the season on a three-yard reception in the second period.

Missouri State answered the early Logan touchdown with a three-yard run by quarterback Scott Carroll at the 1:55 mark of the first quarter. The Sycamore defense had all of Carroll's options covered, but he found a seam up the middle and scooted into the end zone for the TD which tied the score at seven. The two teams traded field goals early in the second quarter when Kyle Hooper booted a 27-yarder with 14:51 left in the period before MSU's Jon Scifres booted a 22-yard field goal of his own to knot the score at 10. The Bears were able to forge ahead with 6:07 left in the first half when backup quarterback A.J. Porter found Michael Sparks on a 13-yard catch-and-run for the score and a 17-10 lead.

ISU was able to move the ball inside the MSU 30-yard line with just over a minute remaining, but an illegal forward pass and a sack of Baggett ended the Sycamores hopes of knotting the score before the half.

Following a defensive stand to begin the second half, the Sycamore offense marched from inside its own one-yard line for a score when Logan caught a 32-yard pass and raced into the end zone to tie the score at 17 with 8:51 remaining in the third quarter. Scifres booted a perfect punt that was downed at the one, but a personal foul on MSU gave ISU improved field position at the 16-yard line. Eleven plays later, Logan caught the scoring pass from Baggett. The score gave Logan the first multi-touchdown game of his career. ISU took its first second-half lead since the Western Kentucky contest when Baggett found Carl Berman for a six-yard touchdown with 14:51 remaining in the contest. The scoring play gave the Sycamores a 24-17 advantage, with Baggett going over 300 yards passing for the first time this season during the drive.

The Indiana State defense held their ground with the lead, giving the ball back to the Sycamore offense just outside its own 20-yard line. During the drive, Baggett completed a screen pass to Jamie Petrowski, but he fumbled to give the Bears excellent field position. Porter took advantage of the situation as he reached the end zone on a six-yard TD run to even the score at 24.

ISU marched down the field in putting together a 7-play, 48-yard drive that ended with a 26-yard field goal by Hooper which gave ISU a 27-24 lead with 7:03 remaining in the contest. On Missouri State's final drive, Kaya Farris made an amazing over-the-shoulder catch in the end zone on a pass from A.J. Porter to take the final lead, 31-27. The score came with 28 seconds remaining.

ISU could not muster a first down on their final drive as ISU dropped its 15th consecutive contest. Baggett hit 32-of-48 passes for a school-record 396 yards and three touchdowns. Logan finished the game with 13 receptions for 194 yards and two scores.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Indiana State recorded its most points of the season, but the Sycamore defense could not find an answer to a potent Western Illinois offense that racked up 63 points and over 600 yards of total offense in a 63-35 victory over ISU on Senior Day at Memorial Stadium.

Senior quarterback Blayne Baggett found junior wide receiver Carl Berman on a scoring pass to cap the Sycamores' first drive and stake ISU to a quick 7-0 lead with 11:25 left in the first quarter.

Western Illinois' Travis Glasford scored back-to-back rushing touchdowns to give the Leathernecks a 14-7 lead midway through the first period.

The Leatherneck lead would grow on a Steve LaFalce pass to Carl Sims for a 21-7 advantage with two minutes showing on the first quarter game clock. Junior Cornell Johnson tied a school-record on the ensuing kickoff with a 97-yard touchdown to get ISU back within one score at 21-14 just before the end of the first quarter. Western added a score of their own on a LaFalce run, then Baggett hooked up Berman for another score to get ISU within striking distance at 28-21.

The Leathernecks went on to score the next 28 points in the contest, with Baggett finding Sam Logan for a five-yard touchdown to inch the Sycamores closer at 56-28 late in the third quarter. Baggett tossed his fourth score of the contest, when he found Ben Schmidt on a 27-yard score early in the fourth quarter before Western tacked on a final TD for a 63-35 win.

Baggett set a career-high with four touchdown passes in the contest, as he tossed for 353 yards. It was the second week in a row that Baggett eclipsed the 300-yard passing mark.

ISU was paced in receptions by Berman, who caught 11 balls for 78 yards in the contest. Logan went over the 100-yard mark for the seventh time in his career, with eight catches for 165 yards and a TD.

Cornell Johnson had two kickoff returns for 107 yards, including the 97-yard return for a TD in the second quarter. It was ISU's first kickoff return for a touchdown since the 2000 season opener when Soso Dede had a 95-yarder at Western Michigan.

NORMAL, Ill. — For the first time since the 1951 season, the Indiana State Sycamores will not win a football game. ISU broke out to a 7-0 lead early in the contest, but Illinois State's high-powered offense was just too much as they burst out with 42 first half points en route to a 70-28 victory. Indiana State's season ends at 0-11, while the 'Birds finish off a 7-4 campaign.

ISU senior Andre Forte ended his career with a solid outing, rushing 15 times for 103 yards.

Forte scored the game's first touchdown of the day with a nine-yard run to spot ISU to its early 7-0 lead with 12:40 remaining in the first quarter. Illinois State would go on to rattle off the next 35 points as they took a 35-7 advantage.

Forte continued to be ISU's featured offensive weapon as he inched the Sycamores closer at 35-14 with 4:07 remaining before halftime with a 17-yard touchdown run. Illinois State would re-up its lead before the half as they made it a 42-14 spread on a 14-yd pass from Luke Drone to Jason Horton with just over a minute remaining before the break.

Junior kicker Kyle Hooper entered the contest having made 8-of-10 field goal attempts, but missed each of his attempts in the contest.

In the second half, Illinois State added a pair of touchdowns in the game's third quarter and two more in the fourth to go up 70-14 in the game's final period. Indiana State added a pair of scores in the waning minutes of the contest on a five-yard TD pass from Baggett and a six-yard TD run by Forte to make the final score 70-28.

Forte went over 100 yards rushing for the third time this season with his 142-yard rushing effort. ISU's leading receiver was Carl Berman who finished the contest with three catches for 16 yards.

Indiana State finishes the season without a win for the first time since 1951. Despite the winless season, the Sycamores re-set virtually every offensive passing record and Blayne Baggett and Sam Logan each put their names in the school and Gateway Football Conference records.

Logan finished the season with 77 catches, a school record and Baggett set the school and conference records for completions.

The Gateway Football Conference

Fresh off its fourth national championship game appearance in the past nine years, the Gateway Football Conference has high expectations this season, as the nation's premier I-AA league enters its 22nd year in 2006.

There's not much that has eluded the Gateway Football Conference in its first two decades of existence. The league's first 21 years have included national championships, national players of the year, national coaches of the year, No. 1 national rankings, and countless All-Americans.

Last year, UNI became the fourth Gateway school to reach the I-AA championship game since 1997, while Southern Illinois and Western Kentucky combined to hold the nation's No. 1 ranking in the top-25 polls for five weeks.

In 2004, Southern Illinois spent a league-record 11 weeks as the nation's top-ranked team, while all eight Gateway teams received votes for the Top 25 at some point in the season. LB Boomer Grigsby of Illinois State earned a National Defensive Player of the Year honor, while SIU's Jerry Kill was National Coach of the Year.

Three years ago, four Gateway teams represented the league in the 16-team NCAA I-AA playoffs, marking the first time any league has sent that many to the playoffs in the same year. And in 2002, Western Kentucky won the I-AA national championship.

Strong coaching and great players have helped make the league a national force, but the stability and leadership of Commissioner Patty Viverito — the only commissioner the league has ever known — has helped make the Gateway Conference a standard bearer on the I-AA scene. Indeed, all signs point to continued national prominence for the league as it enters its 22nd season.

The Gateway Conference has two recent national championships (Western Kentucky - 2002; Youngstown State - 1997), and Gateway members YSU (3) and Southern Illinois (1) own additional titles prior to their Gateway membership, meaning six I-AA championship trophies are housed on Gateway campuses, in addition to three (Youngstown State twice and UNI last year) second-place awards. Only five I-AA leagues possess more than a single I-AA championship trophy, and the Gateway Conference is among that elite.

In recent years, the Gateway has established itself as a leader among Division I-AA conferences. During the past 10 years, the league has two national championships, and six other semifinal trips. The Gateway's 28-20 playoff mark in that span is second only to the Southern Conference (38-20), and the Gateway has had four teams reach the title game, topped only by the Southern Conference's five championship game appearances since 1997.

Additionally, the Gateway's 20 playoff berths in the past eight years trails only the Atlantic-10 (23) for I-AA supremacy, and the Gateway has had two representatives each of the past 11 seasons. Also, the Gateway is the only I-AA conference to have each of its members make the playoffs.

The Gateway's success is not limited to the immediate past. During the decade of the 1990s, current members of the Gateway compiled a 34-19 mark in the I-AA playoffs, bettered only by the Southern Conference, whose members were 37-19 in that decade.

Last year, the league was an impressive 22-15 against non-conference teams, which included a 15-5 record against I-AA teams. Three of those five I-AA losses came against teams that reached the I-AA playoffs.

Team accomplishments have helped solidify the Gateway as a I-AA elite, but individuals at the league's member institutions are the real source of pride within the conference. Last year, four Gateway student-athletes were finalists for the I-AA's top awards, while more than a dozen Gateway players earned All-America honors. In addition, UNI's Mark Farley and Youngstown State's Jon Heacock were finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award, given to the nation's top I-AA football mentor. Thanks to strong coaching, the Gateway has reached and will maintain its place among the I-AA best.

During the past nine seasons, the Gateway has compiled a 235-150 record in non-conference games. Of the 150 losses, 120 came against ranked I-AA or I-A opponents. Said another way: Only 30 times in those 385 games did a Gateway team lose to a non-ranked I-AA team or to a non-I-A team. Notably, the Gateway has posted 52 wins against top-25 I-AA teams in the past 10 years alone. Last year, despite tough scheduling, five teams in the Gateway Conference had winning records, setting an all-time high. The Gateway has had four teams with better than .500 records in the same season 12 times now, including the past eight seasons. A minimum of two league teams have won at least nine games in each of the past four seasons.

In 1997, Youngstown State grabbed the crowned jewel for the Gateway, as the league had one of its most successful seasons. In addition to claiming the league's first national championship, the Penguins finished the year ranked No. 1, marking the first time a league member has held that spot in a season-ending poll. That year,

The Gateway Football Conference

Western Illinois was at No. 6, marking the first time the Gateway ended the year with two teams ranked among the top six.

In 1999, the Gateway trumped that, as YSU finished the year No. 2, and Illinois State was No. 3. UNI, too, finished in the top 20 in both nationally recognized polls.

In 2002, Western Kentucky added to the league's national championship trophy case with a I-AA crown, while both WKU (No. 1) and WIU (No. 5) finished among the nation's top five in the season-ending polls.

On the subject of national polls, the Gateway has had two teams ranked among the Top 10 in the same poll 100 times (including 11 times last year) with 99 of the 100 coming post-1996.

In 1999, five Gateway teams (Illinois State, UNI, Southern Illinois, Western Illinois, and Youngstown State) were ranked in the same poll for the first time in league history. Five teams were ranked in the same top-25 poll twice in 2005 and a total of five times in league history.

Three times in the past three years (9/13/04, 9/22/03, and 9/29/03) four Gateway teams were ranked in the Top 25, and four more Gateway teams were receiving votes — meaning all eight teams in the league were receiving votes or were ranked during the same week. Prior to 2003, the last time that happened was Sept. 6, 1999, but no I-AA league (including the Gateway Conference) has had that happen as late as Sept. 29 in a season.

Four Gateway teams were in the Top 15 of the ESPN/USA Today Coaches top-25 rankings of Oct. 1, 2001 (Youngstown State-5; Western Kentucky-11; Western Illinois-14; and UNI-15). That marked the first time in league history that four league teams were in the Top 15 the same week. That's happened 17 times in league history, including three times last season.

Last year, Southern Illinois and Western Kentucky held the top two spots in the national poll in back-to-back weeks (Sept. 12-19), marking the first time the Gateway has held the national No. 1 and No. 2 spots in the same week. Notably, the league has had two of the top three spots in the top-25 rankings on seven occasions, including four times in 2005.

A minimum of four Gateway teams have been ranked in the same top-25 poll 50 times in league history, including a league-record 11 times in 2003.

And in 2003, all four playoff teams (UNI, SIU, WIU, and WKU) represented the Gateway Conference in the Top 10 in the final national rankings — marking the first time that's ever happened in league history. Including the season-ending poll, those four teams represented the Gateway in same-week top-10 polls a total of five times.

Certainly, the Gateway will be hard-pressed to continue its non-conference success, particularly because the league schedules tough opponents year after year. Tough scheduling is not an aberration for the Gateway. This year's schedule features nine games against I-A opponents. Last year, the Gateway had nine I-A foes, while all league teams played at least three or more ranked teams a season ago.

The original Gateway Conference was founded as a women's athletic organization in August 1982, following the dissolution of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. In September of that year, Patty Viverito was named the first commissioner of the newly founded conference, a position she maintains today. Before moving to its permanent headquarters in St. Louis, the Gateway spent three organizational months on the campus of Eastern Illinois University.

In July of 1992, the 10-team conference disbanded as its women's programs realigned with their men's teams in their respective conferences. The league assumed its new name on July 1, 1992, becoming the Gateway Football Conference, an NCAA I-AA football league comprised of seven Midwest institutions.

The Gateway Conference football division was born on August 21, 1985, when the Gateway Conference President's Council voted to add a I-AA football division for six of its members to the previously all-women's athletics organization. Founding members of the football division were Eastern Illinois, Illinois State, UNI,

Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State), and Western Illinois. The creation of the Gateway football division marked the first time in college annals that football was added to a women's conference. In June of 1986, Indiana State became the seventh member of the Gateway Conference.

In the 21 years of the football division, league membership has been stable — with only three fluctuations since 1986. Eastern Illinois left the Gateway to join the Ohio Valley Conference in 1996, while Youngstown State joined the Gateway for 1997 to return league membership to its original seven-member status. League membership reached an all-time high of eight members for the start of the 2001 season with the addition of Western Kentucky.

The Gateway is among eight I-AA conferences that receive automatic bids to the NCAA I-AA Championship. Those other leagues include the Atlantic-10 Conference (formerly the Yankee), the Big Sky Conference, the Mideastern Athletic Conference, the Ohio Valley Conference, the Patriot League, the Southern Conference, and the Southland Football League. The Gateway Conference has had an automatic bid since 1986, as the I-AA Football Committee waived the league's two-year waiting period and granted the league an automatic bid after just one year. The Gateway Conference is the only automatic I-AA qualifying conference that sponsors football as its only sport, as the league completed its service to women's athletics following the 1991-92 season. Although the league no longer sponsors women's sports, the Gateway has an historical place in the development of intercollegiate women's athletics.

The 10 founders of the original Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference currently belong to three conferences. Eight members joined their men's programs in the Missouri Valley: Bradley, Drake, Illinois State, Indiana State, Missouri State, UNI, Southern Illinois, and Wichita State. Eastern Illinois is in the Ohio Valley Conference, while Western Illinois competes in the Mid-Continent; Youngstown State's sports, other than football, are in the Horizon League, while Western Kentucky's home for non-football sports is in the Sun Belt. In its decade of operation, the Gateway sponsored championships in ten women's sports and football. The women's sports were basketball, cross country, golf, indoor and outdoor track & field, swimming and diving, tennis, softball, volleyball and, early on, field hockey.
