ABOUT THE COACHES

Kevin McKenna (Creighton '93) is in his third season as the head coach at Indiana State (29-38). In his first season with the Sycamores, McKenna led the team to its highest win total since the 2000-01 season and an impressive 12-2 record at home in the Hulman Center. Last season, he led the Sycamores to six victories in their final seven regular season games, including three consecutive league road wins in the span of 10 days. McKenna came to Indiana State after spending nine seasons as an assistant coach at Creighton, where he helped the Bluejays advance to four NCAA tournament appearances. From 2001-05, McKenna spent four years as the head coach (89-33) at NCAA Division II Nebraska-Omaha, where he guided the Mavericks to four consecutive 20-win seasons and three appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament. McKenna is one of just two NCAA Division I head men's basketball coaches who have won an NBA World Championship (with the Los Angeles Lakers in 1982). Florida International's Isiah Thomas is the other. He is the only NCAA Division I men's basketball head coach to earn both an NBA and CBA Championship and is the only person in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference to win a MVC Regular Season Title, MVC Tournament Championship, NBA Championship and CBA title. McKenna has never faced Coastal Carolina nor another member of the Big South Conference as a head coach.

Cliff Ellis (Florida State '68) Cliff Ellis is in his third year as head coach of the Coastal Carolina men's basketball program. The 62-year-old Ellis has been a successful coach throughout his career, ranking 47th in the nation in all-time Division I wins prior to the 2006-2007 season is tied for the 12th winningest active Division I coach by victories. He is also just one of 10 coaches in NCAA Division I history to post 100 or more wins at three separate schools and has been named conference Coach of the Year five times in his career. Ellis enters his 33rd season as a collegiate head coach as he has had tremendous success guiding his team to postseason play. Ellis has guided his squads to eight NCAA Tournaments and 11 National Invitation Tournament bids. Ellis' teams have advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament three times: once with Clemson in 1989-1990 and twice with Auburn (1998-1999 and 2002-2003). Ellis has never faced Indiana State as a head coach.

SERIES HISTORY

Indiana State took a 70-46 victory over Coastal Carolina at Hulman Center to open the 2004-05 campaign. That is the only previous meeting between the schools.

A WIN OVER COASTAL CAROLINA WOULD ...

- Improve Indiana State to 2-1 in the Dick's Sporting Goods NIT Season Tipoff event, having split already last week against LSU & Milwaukee.
- Give ISU its best start to a season since opening with a 4-1 record in 2006-07.
- Improve Indiana State's record against the Big South Conference to 6-0 all-time.
- Give Indiana State head coach Kevin McKenna his 30th victory at the helm of the Sycamore program, as well as his 120th victory overall.

A Little History:

Indiana State is currently in its 114th season of college basketball at the school. The Sycamores are 1,334-1,133 all-time on the hardwood. The Sycamores are 33 contests away from playing their historic 2,500th game in the history of the program.

The NIT Continues!:

This year's appearance in the Dick's Sporting Goods Preseason NIT is the first in the history of the program. The Sycamores last appeared in the postseason version of the event following the 1977-78 campaign when they downed Illinois State 73-71 at Hulman Center and lost at Rutgers 57-56 on the road. ISU split with LSU and Milwaukee last week in Baton Rouge, La. The Sycamores travel to Bowling Green, Ky., this week to take on Coastal Carolina and the host Hilltoppers as part of the second week of action.

Stepping Up To The Challenge:

Indiana State did its part for its league in the inaugural Mountain West/Missouri Valley Conference Challenge as the Sycamores downed Colorado State 65-60 at Hulman Center. All nine of the Mountain West Conference schools will face off against a predetermined member of the MVC with the exception of Evansville. So far "The Challenge" is tied at one with ISU's victory and Bradley's 70-60 defeat at the hands of BYU. Southern Illinois is slated to travel to UNLV this weekend.

Trying To Stay Perfect Against The Big South:

Indiana State hasn't faced a member of the Big South Conference very often, but have been extremely successful when doing so. The Sycamores are currently 5-0 against the league, including a 1-0 mark against Coastal Carolina. In addition to the perfect mark versus the Chanticleers, the Sycamores are unblemished against Gardner-Webb (1-0); Liberty (1-0); and VMI (2-0).

Defense Impressive Through Four Games:

The Indiana State team defensive effort has impressive and consistent for the Sycamores through the first four games of the 2009-10 campaign. ISU has held all four opponents under 40 percent shooting from the field, with Colorado State's 39.6 percent being the highest shooting performance of the four so far. The Rams were held to a paltry 28.6 percent mark in the second half by the Sycamores as ISU kept its strong defensive streak alive. The Sycamores are allowing just 59.2 ppg this season which is currently fourth in the league. ISU is allowing opponents to hit just 36.5 percent of their shots, which is second in the league.

Lathan In Double Figures Three Consecutive Contests:

Indiana State sophomore Dwayne Lathan came off the bench for the Sycamores this week as ISU posted victories over Milwaukee and Colorado State and fell to LSU on their home court. Lathan paced the team by averaging 14.7 ppg and was also the team's leading rebounder with a 5.3 average. Lathan was perfect from the field against LSU and Milwaukee, hitting all 10 of his field goal attempts. He ended the three-game stretch with a blazing 76.2 field goal percentage, hitting 16-of-21 shots. He was 1-for-3 from 3-point range. Lathan also was effective at the free throw line, hitting 11-of-14, for a 78.6 percentage. He added four assists, a blocked shot and a pair of steals. Lathan led ISU to a 65-60 victory over Colorado State by scoring 18 points, including a trio of highlight reel dunks in transition. Lathan posted 14 points against Milwaukee and had 12 points, all in the second half against LSU. Lathan's 14.7 ppg average is 10th-best in the MVC so far this season. He leads the league in field goal percentage with a 76.2 percent mark.

WEEKLY MVC PLAYER AWARDS

Best Shooting Performance In Five Seasons:

Indiana State connected on 30-of-52 field goals in the 76-63 victory against Milwaukee. That performance equates to a 57.7 percent mark. The 57.7 percent showing is the best by an Indiana State state team since they hit 59.6 percent from the field in January of 2004 against Drake.

No Place Like Home To Open The Season:

Indiana State won its season opener for the eighth time in the last ten seasons by taking an 88-58 victory over Nebraska-Kearney at Hulman Center. When the Sycamores have opened the season at home, the Sycamores have been victorious in each of its last 18 attempts. The Sycamores have won each of their season openers which have occurred at Hulman Center since falling by the score of 66-63 to Armstrong State to open the 1979-80 campaign.

Local Flavor Of Team To Get Some Seasoning:

All four of Indiana State's incoming freshmen are expected to redshirt this season. Jake Odum, a native of Terre Haute, along with RJ Mahurin (Rockville, Ind.,) and Logan & Lucas Eitel (nearby Marshall, Ill.) will all sit out their initial seasons in the program and take a redshirt season. Subject to change as the season progresses, the four local student-athletes will push the total to of six freshmen to redshirt in head coach Kevin McKenna's three seasons. Jordan Printy redshirted during the 2007-08 campaign while Koang Doluony took a redshirt season last year and made his Sycamore debut on Friday against Nebraska-Kearney.

Sycamore Signees:

Indiana State inked three student-athletes to national letters of intent as part of the NCAA Early Signing Period. Steve McWhorter, Myles Walker and Jake Kitchell comprised the Sycamores' 2009 Signing Class.

McWhorter, a 6-2, 185, point guard from Racine, Wis., won a Division 3 state championship last season at Saint Catherines High School as he averaged 10.0 points, 5.0 assists and shot 57.6 percent from the field for coach Bob Letsch. McWhorter took over as the starter at point guard when he was a sophomore. As a junior, he was on a team with nine seniors, and his talent shined in the state tournament. He had 12 points, seven assists and five rebounds in a 48-34 state championship victory against La Crosse Aquinas. In the state semifinals, McWhorter had nine points and nine assists.

"Steve McWhorter is first and foremost a leader," McKenna commented. "He is a very quick, aggressive point guard whose strengths are passing, ability to penetrate and defense. He continues to improve as a shooter and he has experience playing for a quality championship caliber program. He had a great summer and is working hard this fall as well. He will fill a need for us with the graduation of Harry Marshall and Rashad Reed next season. We feel very strong about the abilities he is going to be able to bring right away into the program."

Walker is a 6-8, 250, junior college post player from South Plains Junior College who averaged 7.4 points and 4.8 rebounds, while shooting 46.7 percent from the floor and 38.6 percent (32 for 83) from the free-throw line as a freshman last season for coach Steve Green. Walker's best game was a 24-point, 13-rebound performance on Jan. 1. He averaged 1.0 blocks per game with a season-high of five, and he twice had three steals in a game.

At Antonian College Prep in San Antonio, Texas he played for head coach Andre Walker. Myles was named to the all-state team three times and all-district four times. He was once named to the North-South All-Star tournament. As a middle linebacker for the football team Myles earned all-state recognition three times and played in the Army All-American Bowl. He also ran track, boasting a time of 48.07 seconds in the 400 meter dash.

"Myles Walker is a good post player prospect," McKenna said. "He plays the game with a physical presence especially on defense. Myles is an extremely athletic player who can score around the basket. His physical presence was one of the things that attracted us to Myles because that is something that I feel we need to improve on. He has been very well coached in high school and at the junior college levels and that also was a key factor in his recruitment."

Kitchell is a 6-9, 225, power forward from Union Mills, Ind., and played for coach John Steinhilber at South Central High School. Kitchell averaged 20 points, 14 rebounds, six assists and six blocks per game for a team that finished the 2008-09 season with a record of 17-5. He is expected to be a first team all-state selection later this month in the upcoming edition of the annual Hoosier Basketball Magazine. He was a member of the Indiana Junior All-Stars last spring.

"Jake Kitchell is a inside/outside post player that will remind those that watch our games of Jay Tunnell," McKenna commented. "He is a tough, physical player that can shoot from the perimeter well. He comes from both a winning high school and AAU program (SYF). He has put up some big numbers in several categories and we are looking forward to having him join the program next season."

Preseason Valley Predictions:

The Indiana State basketball team has been picked to finish seventh in the Missouri Valley Conference Preseason Poll as announced today by the league office. Additionally, senior Harry Marshall and junior transfer Jake Kelly were named Preseason All-MVC Honorable Mention selections in the annual vote of conference head coaches, media and sports information directors.

The Sycamores' seventh place predicted finish is its highest since the 2001-02 campaign when Indiana State was picked to finish third. Last season, ISU won six of its final seven regular season contests to finish with an 11-21 record, including winning three MVC road contests in the span of ten days. Indiana State captured the league's No. 8 seed at the State Farm MVC Tournament and downed Drake in the opening round before being nipped in the waning moments against eventual league champion Northern Iowa, 71-67, in the tournament quarterfinals.

UNI is picked to repeat as the league's champion with 38 first place votes (389 points) and are followed by the only other team to garner a first place tally, Creighton (336). Picked to finish third is Illinois State (299), followed by Southern Illinois (272), Wichita State (216), Bradley (208), Indiana State (173), Drake (105), Missouri State (92) and Evansville (55).

Marshall was an All-MVC Honorable Mention selection at the end of last season after leading the team with a 13.6 ppg average. Kelly will make his Sycamore debut this season after earning All-Big Ten Honorable Mention status last year before transferring from Iowa.

Indiana State stays on the campus of Western Kentucky University and will face the Hilltoppers on Tuesday, November 24 inside E.A. Diddle Arena. Tipoff is slated for 8:00 p.m. (ET) and can be heard live on The Crock 92.7 FM as well as online at GoSycamores.com. The game will be made available on a video Webstream via WKUSports.com on a pay-per-view basis.

The Last Time Out ...

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. -- The Indiana State Sycamores held Colorado State to under 30 percent shooting in the second half en route to earning a 65-60 victory over the Rams in front of 4,308 fans at Hulman Center.

The win by the Sycamores evens the score for the Missouri Valley in the Mountain West/MVC Challenge at one. BYU downed Bradley 70-60 one week ago.

ISU improves to 3-1 on the season while Colorado State dropped to 2-2.

Indiana State's victory gives them a pair of wins out of the gate at Hulman Center for the first time since coach Kevin McKenna's initial squad won their first nine at home in 2007-08. ISU also broke a two-game losing streak against the Mountain West Conference, winning against the league for the first time since downing TCU by the score of 89-77 in 1999.

Colorado State was hot in the first half as they connected on 11-of-20 shots from the field before the break, including five 3-pointers. The Sycamore defense clamped down in the second half, allowing the Rams to hit just 28.6 percent of their shots after the break (8-of-28), including one triple.

"I think it's a credit to our guys, our depth and their ability to stay fresh," coach McKenna stated. "Dwayne had a pretty darn good second half. Dwayne is an emotional kid and we've talked to him about channeling his emotions towards the game. He's a great athlete, I think he had 14 points and seven rebounds in the second half."

ISU was consistent in both halves, hitting 9-of-21 in the opening stanza (42.9 percent) and then posting a 45.5 percent mark (10-of-22) after halftime.

ISU was paced by the play of sophomore Dwayne Lathan who scored 18 of the Sycamores' 28 points off the bench. Lathan was 6-of-11 in the game and was also 6-of-8 at the free throw line. He nearly missed his first career double-double as he pulled down a team-high nine rebounds in the contest.

Lathan was one of three Sycamores to reach double figures scoring as Harry Marshall parlayed a 7-of-10 showing at the charity stripe into 15 points. Jake Kelly scored 13 as he connected on 8-of-11 free throws and added two more field goals.

The Sycamores found themselves down 19-10 with 10:59 left in the first half as the Rams came out of the gates blazing, hitting 7 of their first 9 shots. Things cooled for Colorado State as the Sycamores embarked on a 17-0 run which gave ISU a 27-19 advantage.

CSU countered by scoring 10 of the first half's final 12 points, including a jumper by Andre McFarland with just over a minute before the break as the game was knotted at 29 at the half.

The Sycamores came out hot in the second half with a jumper by Marshall and then tip-in by Brant Leitnaker to take a 33-29 lead. Carl Richard added a 3-point shot as the ISU took a 36-29 lead.

CSU took a brief lead at 40-39 on a Travis Franklin lay-up at the 10:42 mark but Lathan used an offensive rebound opportunity and hit a pair of free throws to give ISU a 41-40 lead that they would not lose.

In fact ISU outscored Colorado State by a 9-2 count, taking a 49-42 lead with 6:52 left on a jumper by Isiah Martin.

The Sycamores ground the lead up to 11 twice, both on points by Lathan, including one of three second half highlight reel fastbreak dunks by the talented sophomore. Lathan's dunk at the 2:32 mark sent Hulman Center into a frenzy and gave the Sycamores a 57-46 lead.

"He went up and got a couple rebounds, ran the floor really well, obviously getting out on the break and getting a few highlight reel dunks helps us and helps get the crowd behind us," McKenna commented. "Our crowd was really good tonight, students were great. My vision here is hoping that this is contagious, people see how hard we're playing, the excitement we're creating here and hopefully they'll keep coming out. That

means a lot to our program."

Colorado State used a mixture of offensive rebounds and missed Sycamore free throws to cut the ISU lead down to 60-58 with 33 seconds left, but free throws by Kelly and Lathan cemented the 65-60 victory.

ISU forced 17 CSU turnovers and turned them in 19 points. The Sycamores also posted eight fast break points in the contest, six of which came on terrific dunks by Lathan.
