

Gambling

As Super Bowl XLVI approaches, the Compliance Office would like to remind you that the NCAA prohibits athletic department staff members, nonathletic department staff members, who have responsibilities within or over the athletics department, and student-athletes from wagering on athletic events. Betting on the game can jeopardize student-athlete eligibility to compete in NCAA athletics and detrimentally impact an athletics department staff member's ability to be employed at an NCAA member institution. Sometimes even the friendliest wager is a violation—keep in mind that **nothing of material value can change hands as the result of a wager (e.g., cash, shirt, dinner)**. Even participating in a “squares pool” at your Super Bowl party is prohibited by NCAA legislation.

Official Visit Reminders

When submitting official visit requests to the compliance office, please make sure you fill in **ALL** the required information. Leave nothing blank! If you are unsure as to what to write, please ask us! Remember the prospective student athlete must be registered with the clearinghouse, we must have copies of transcripts as well as test scores (ACT and/or SAT). We will review the paperwork and make hotel accommodations for you. After the visit is over, submit it to Angie Lansing, including all receipts with detailed information as to who was included in the meal and when. Please be as detailed as possible, if not we will give the paperwork back for you to complete and re-submit. If you cancel an official visit, please submit the paperwork with the word “cancelled” at the top. Any questions, feel free to contact anyone in compliance.

E – Employment

Student-athletes wishing to obtain a job during the academic year must have approval from the compliance office. You must be compensated at a rate commensurate with the going rate in that locality for similar services. Failure to obtain approval could result in the temporary or permanent loss of athletic eligibility. ([Employment Form Here](#))

D – Drug Testing

To participate in practice or compete, student-athletes must sign an NCAA Drug-Testing Consent form. A student-athlete who tests positives for an NCAA banned substance will be declared ineligible for one calendar year after the positive drug test AND shall be charged with the loss of a minimum of one season of competition in all sports. Student-athletes may be randomly drug tested at any point during their career at ISU. Failure to appear when called upon to be drug tested automatically results in a positive test result. S – Summer School

Needing to take summer school classes? Student-athletes, please let your coaches know if you need to take summer school. Important points to remember: summer school is not guaranteed for any student-athlete, may only be received if you are on an athletic scholarship, the percentage of athletic aid for summer school cannot exceed the amount of aid you receive during the academic year, and you must provide a written explanation as to why you need to take the course(s) listed in the application. Summer classes may not be used to make up classes avoided or dropped during the academic year or to repeat a failed course because of excessive absenteeism. SUMMER SCHOOL AID WILL NOT BE GRANTED SO THAT YOU MAY “BANK” CREDIT HOURS. Please let your coach know if you think you will need to take summer school courses. ([Application](#))
