SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana kicks off its 128th year of football on Saturday, Sept. 1, hosting the Indiana State Sycamores at Memorial Stadium. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. EDT and BTN will broadcast the game.
- IU returns 16 starters from 2011, including seven on offense, eight on defense and one on special teams. The Hoosiers are multiple on offense and will run a 4-3 base defense.
- ISU returns 14 starters from 2011, including six on offense, six on defense and two on special teams. The Sycamores are multiple on offense and will run a 3-4 base defense.
- Indiana State enters Saturday ranked 23rd in The Sports Network Preseason Poll and 25th in the Football Championship Subdivision Coaches Poll.

THE COACHES

- **Kevin Wilson** is in his second season as head coach at Indiana. Wilson spent the 2002-10 seasons at Oklahoma, where he served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10. OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.
- Trent Miles is in his fifth season as head coach at Indiana State. The Sycamores are coming off back-to-back 6-5 campaigns, marking the first time the program has seen consecutive winning seasons since 1995 and 1996. Miles owns an overall record of 13-32.

NEWS & NOTES

- The Hoosiers are 35-17 in Memorial Stadium openers. Indiana has victories in nine of its last 10 and wins in 26 of its last 30 home starters.
- IU has faced ISU three times, all in Bloomington, and walked away victorious each time. The Hoosiers downed the Sycamores, 55-7, in the 2007 season opener and added victories in 2003 (33-3) and 1925 (31-0).
- Indiana is the youngest team in college football. IU played 32 freshmen (16 true) in 2011, the highest total in the country. The Hoosiers only have eight seniors on the 2012 roster, tied for the fewest in the nation.
- **Kevin Wilson's** coaching staff has 155 combined years of college coaching experience, an average of 15.5 years per coach. In total, the group has coached in 67 bowl games, including 21 BCS bowl contests and seven national championship games with two national titles.
- QB **Tre Roberson** became the first true freshman in IU history to start last season. The Indianapolis native started five times, threw for 937 yards with three touchdowns and added 426 rushing yards with two TDs.
- Indiana's all-time leading rusher and College Hall of Famer **Anthony Thompson** is a Terre Haute native.

The Indiana locker room is closed at all times. A media relations staffer will collect all player requests in the press box midway through the fourth quarter. Requested players will be available in the weight room of the North End Zone complex immediately following head coach **Kevin Wilson's** post-game press conference.

Wilson will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone facility following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.

All requests made during the week of the game will be held at media will call, which is located at ticket booth No. 3 located on the West side of Memorial Stadium and opens three hours prior to kickoff.

**YOUNGEST TEAM IN THE COUNTRY**

Kevin Wilson made it no secret that he was not afraid to play true freshmen, and he certainly lived up to his word by playing 16 in 2011, tied for the third most in the country.

- Additionally, 16 redshirt freshmen saw action. The 32 total freshmen were the highest total in the country.
- Indiana only has eight seniors on its 2012 roster, tied for the fewest in the country. Of the eight, defensive tackles **Larry Black, Jr., Adam Replogle** and **Nicholas Sliger**, center **Will Matte** and tight end **Charles Love III** came to Bloomington on scholarship.
- Of the 105 players invited to camp, 76 were underclassmen (72.4 percent), 39 were freshmen (37.1) and 32 were true freshmen (30.5).

YOUNG YARDS

In 2011, Indiana's underclassmen accounted for:

- 1,958 of 1,932 rushing yards (101.3% - third-highest percentage nationally)
- 4,351 of 4,325 total yards (100.6)
- all of IU's 18 rushing TDs (100.0)
- all of IU's 211 completions, 2,393 passing yards and 10 passing TDs (100.0)
- 1,339 of 1,345 kick return yards (99.6)
- 488 of 492 rushing attempts (99.2)
- 251 of 257 points (97.7)
- nine of 10 receiving TDs (90.0)
- 5,161 of 5,767 all-purpose yards (89.5)
- 1,803 of 2,393 receiving yards (75.3 - seventh-highest percentage nationally)
- 152 of 211 receptions (72.0)

YOUTH WAS SERVED

IU started 46 different players in 2012:

- Eleven true freshmen, six redshirt freshmen and 10 sophomores appeared in the starting lineup.
- In all, 23.9 percent of the 2011 starters were true freshmen, 37 percent were freshmen and 58.7 percent were underclassmen.
- Indiana started seven freshmen on defense (four true and three redshirt) and five freshmen on offense (four true and one redshirt) against Northwestern. The 12 total freshmen, eight true freshmen and the seven total freshmen defensive starters were the most by a FBS team in a game last year.

LITRELL & FABRIS JOIN STAFF

Seth Littrell and **Jon Fabris** joined the Hoosiers coaching staff in the offseason. Littrell is the team's offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach, while Fabris is the defensive ends coach.

- Littrell came to IU from Arizona, where his 2011 offense ranked third nationally in passing offense (370.8) and 15th in total offense (465.2).
- He spent three seasons in Tucson (2009-11) after a four-year stint as running backs coach at Texas Tech.
- Fabris brings 29 years of experience and has coached in 12 bowl games, including five BCS bowls.
- He has worked at Georgia Tech, Washington State, Iowa State, Notre Dame, Kansas State, South Carolina, Georgia and the Cleveland Browns.

JUNIOR COLLEGE ADDITIONS

The Hoosiers added eight junior college transfers this season, including quarterback **Cameron Coffman** (Arizona Western C.C.), defensive end **Justin Rayside** (Riverside [Calif.] C.C.), linebackers **Jacarri Alexander** (Iowa Central C.C.) and **David Cooper** (Coffeyville

[Kan.] C.C.) and defensive backs **Tim Bennett** (Ellsworth [Iowa] C.C.), **Antonio Marshall** (Georgia Military College), **Ryan Thompson** (Itawamba [Miss.] C.C.) and **Tregg Waters** (Glendale [Ariz.] C.C.).

Coffman, Alexander, Cooper, Rayside, Thompson and Waters enrolled in spring classes and participated in practice. Bennett and Marshall joined the team at the start of preseason camp.

2012 SIGNING CLASS

Twenty-six student-athletes signed National Letters of Intent to play for the Hoosiers in 2012.

IU signed 14 on defense and 12 on offense. The Hoosiers added six defensive linemen, five defensive backs and three linebackers on the defensive side and four offensive linemen, three wide receivers, two quarterbacks, one running back and one tight end on the offensive side.

The class featured players from 10 states, including eight from Indiana, three from Illinois, Georgia and Ohio, two from California, Florida and Texas, and one from Arizona, Mississippi and Missouri.

NEW TURF, NEW PRACTICE SCHEDULE

Continuing to enhance the football program's facilities, a brand new FieldTurf Revolution surface replaced the East grass field at the football practice facility prior to preseason camp.

Indiana took advantage of the surface and also implemented a new practice schedule. The team now practices in the morning and is off the field at 11 a.m. every day.

Head coach Kevin Wilson explained the schedule change: "We were practicing too late, then study hall/academics was starting too late. We're hoping going in the morning will get the academics going in the afternoon and get more of a normal biological clock. Physically, when practice is over, we're done. The players might get back over later and watch a little tape, but they're done physically. Their football day is over and now they're students."

STEPPING UP IN THE CLASSROOM

A school record 24 Indiana football student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2011. Student-athletes must be in at least their second academic year at their institution and carry a grade point average of 3.0 or better to be eligible.

The Hoosiers carried a team GPA of 3.11 this summer. Sixty players earned a 3.0 or higher and nine posted a perfect 4.0.

FRESHMEN HONORED

Indiana linebacker **Chase Hoobler**, safety **Mark Murphy** and offensive lineman **Bernard Taylor** collected freshman postseason honors last year.

- Murphy and Taylor secured spots on *Yahoo Sports*, *BTN.com* and *ESPN.com* Big Ten All-Freshman teams, while Hoobler earned accolades from *Yahoo Sports* and *BTN.com*.
- True freshman quarterback **Tre Roberson** and true freshman kick returner **Shane Wynn** received honorable mention recognition from *BTN.com*.
- Murphy finished second on the team with 76 tackles and led the way with 44 solos to go along with one interception, which he returned 31 yards for a touchdown, one tackle for loss and four pass breakups.
- Taylor became the first true freshman to play on the offensive line for the Hoosiers in 2011. He appeared in

11 of the team's 12 games and started the last 10 at left guard.

- Facing some of the top defensive tackles in the country, Taylor allowed only three sacks in 295 passing attempts.
- Hoobler finished the year with 48 tackles, 23 solo, two sacks, five tackles for loss and one forced fumble. The redshirt freshman started eight games, including six times in the Big Ten, and played in all 12 games.

WALK-ONS REWARDED

Kevin Wilson awarded seven student-athletes with scholarships for the 2012-13 season.

- At the conclusion of spring practice and after a positive impact during the 2011 season, OL Collin Rahrig and S Alexander Webb earned scholarships.
- With the arrival of fall camp, five more Hoosiers were awarded scholarships - RB David Blackwell, DE John Laihininen, LB Jake Michalek, RB Isaiah Roundtree and S Jake Zupancic.
- As a former walk-on himself, Wilson has now seen 11 walk-ons earn scholarships in his two years at IU after giving four scholarships last season.
- Graduated players Dre Muhammad and Brandon McGhee, as well as current DB Greg Heban and K Nick Freeland, each earned scholarships at the start of the 2011-12 school year.
- In addition, walk-on-turned-scholarship-athletes on the Indiana coaching staff include co-defensive coordinator Mike Ekeler (Kansas State) and graduate assistant Carter Whitson (Oklahoma).

MR. ROBERSON'S NEIGHBORHOOD

Tre Roberson became the first true freshman quarterback in IU history to start when he took the field at Iowa in week eight last season. He was one of just 12 true freshman QBs nationally to start.

- Roberson celebrated his 19th birthday by becoming the third Hoosier (running back D'Angelo Roberts and kick returner Shane Wynn) to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors against the Hawkeyes.
- He completed 16-of-24 (66.7 percent) for 197 yards and a touchdown with zero interceptions. Roberson also rushed for 84 yards on 16 carries (5.2 average).
- Roberson started the rest of the way (five games) and was 68-of-120 (56.7) with 779 yards, three TDs and five INTs to go along with 364 rushing yards on 85 carries (4.3) with one score.
- On the season, Roberson was 81-of-142 (57.0) with 937 yards, three touchdowns and six interceptions to go along with 426 rushing yards on 109 carries (3.9) with two scores in nine games.
- His 426 rushing yards were second on the team and third among true freshman quarterbacks nationally (Braxton Miller, Ohio State - 695 and Brett Smith, Wyoming - 555).
- Roberson became only the second true freshman QB to play at IU. In 1977, Tim Clifford completed 8-of-15 for 143 yards with one touchdown, one interception and 25 rushing yards in one half of work.
- At Lawrence Central High School in Indianapolis, Roberson earned Indiana's 2010 Mr. Football Award
- He passed for 2,611 yards, 24 touchdowns and four interceptions and rushed for 1,992 yards and 21 scores.
- His grandfather, Larry Highbaugh, played defensive back and ran track at IU from 1968-71.
- Highbaugh played briefly with the Dallas Cowboys, spent 13 years in the Canadian Football League and was inducted into the CFL Hall of Fame in 2004.

NO PROBLEM WITH HOUSTON

Stephen Houston joined the Hoosiers in July of 2011 from Independence (Kan.) CC. The 228-pound running back appeared in each of the first four games before earning his first start in the Big Ten opener against Penn State, and he remained in the starting lineup the rest of the way.

- In his eight starts, Houston recorded 711 rushing yards on 129 carries with seven scores, a 5.5 average and 88.9 yards per game.
- His 711 yards were the most for a Hoosier in Big Ten action since 2003 (BenJarvus Green-Ellis - 784) and his seven touchdowns were the most since 2001 (Levron Williams - 16).
- Overall, Houston rushed for 802 yards on 151 attempts with eight touchdowns, 5.3 yards per carry and 66.8 yards per game in all 12 contests.
- His 802 yards were the most for a Hoosier since 2003 (Green-Ellis - 938) and his eight touchdowns were the most for a running back since 2002 (Yamar Washington - nine).
- He added 17 receptions for 164 yards and two kickoff returns for 13 yards to finish second on the team with 979 all-purpose yards (81.6 per game).
- In Big Ten games only, Houston shared seventh in scoring (5.2) and was 10th in all-purpose yards.
- He fumbled just once in his 151 carries (170 touches) and did not fumble in his final 113 attempts (124 touches).
- Houston surpassed the century mark three times (at No. 4 Wisconsin - 135, Northwestern - 151 and Purdue - 129) and scored from 67 yards against the Badgers and from 52 vs. the Boilermakers.
- He rushed for 1,082 yards and five touchdowns on 165 carries at Independence.

GROUND GAINS

The Hoosiers rushed for 1,374 yards in league play last season, the program's highest total since 2001, and posted 1,932 overall, the program's highest total since 2008.

- Indiana's running backs lost just one fumble in 272 attempts.
- IU posted five overall games with 200-plus rushing yards, including a 319-yard effort against Northwestern, the most for Indiana in a conference game since 2003 (against NU).
- Stephen Houston rushed for 151 yards and quarterback Tre Roberson collected a career-high 121 yards against the Wildcats.
- The last time the Hoosiers had two 100-yard rushers came back in the 2003 Northwestern game - BenJarvus Green-Ellis (136) and Brian Lewis (128).
- Indiana collected three straight 200-plus yard rushing games - at No. 4 Wisconsin (223), at Iowa (217) and against Northwestern - for the first time in league action since 2001.

IT STARTS UP FRONT

Indiana used seven different starting combinations along the offensive line last season.

- Fifth-year center Will Matte anchors the line. He started his first 32 career games at center before suffering an injury last season.
- Prior to the injury, he was the only offensive lineman to start every game from 2009-11. He finished 2011 with nine starts and has started 33 times in his career.
- For the first time since Rodger Saffold (left tackle) and Pete Saxon (left guard) started together in 2006,

THE START CHART

Indiana started 46 different players during the 2012 season, including 24 on the offense and 22 on the defense.

- Eleven true freshmen, six redshirt freshmen and 10 sophomores appeared in the lineup.
- In all, 23.9 percent of the 2012 starters were true freshmen, 37 percent were freshmen and 58.7 percent were underclassmen.

the Hoosiers started a pair of true freshmen on the offensive line. **Bernard Taylor** (left guard) and **Peyton Eckert** (right tackle) each earned their first career starts against South Carolina State in week three.

- Taylor started the rest of the season (10 overall) and earned a spot on the *Yahoo Sports*, *BTN.com* and *ESPN.com* Big Ten All-Freshman teams.

- He moved from the defensive line to offensive line during 2011 preseason camp and allowed only three sacks in 295 passing attempts.

- Eckert finished the year with six starts and appeared in eight games.

- Redshirt freshman **Collin Rahrig** made his first career start at right guard against SCSU. He played in the final 10 games, with eight starts, including five at right guard and three at center.

- The South Bend, Ind., native was named Indiana's 2011 Outstanding Walk-On Player of the Year. He earned a scholarship during 2012 preseason camp.

BOLSER-ING THE OFFENSE

For the second straight season, junior tight end **Ted Bolser** is on the John Mackey Award Watch List. Bolser, who stepped up as one of the team's leaders this offseason, figures to be a fixture in new offensive coordinator **Seth Littrell's** offense.

- Bolser broke out as a redshirt freshman in 2010, where he caught 27 passes for 407 yards with five touchdowns and an average of 15.1 yards per reception.

- He caught 14 passes for 165 yards with one touchdown and appeared in all 12 games last year.

- In 2010, Bolser set an IU tight end record, ranked first nationally among freshman tight ends and tied for seventh nationally among all tight ends in scores.

- Bolser posted Hoosier freshman tight end records in catches and yards, and he finished with the sixth-most yards all-time in a single season among IU tight ends.

- He was named to *Rivals.com* and Football Writers Association of America Freshman All-America teams.

- The Cincinnati native collected the most yards for an Indiana tight end since 1991 (Rod Coleman) and the most receptions since 1992 (Ross Hales).

GONE WITH THE WYNN

Shane Wynn produced one of the top seasons by a true freshman in school history in 2011. Wynn, who was posted a 4.37 40-yard dash in the offseason, led the Hoosiers with 1,249 all-purpose yards, including 1,015 via kick return, 197 receiving and 37 rushing.

- His 1,015 kick return yards were an Indiana true freshman record, second on the single-season list (one yard short of first), fifth on the Big Ten's single-season list, ninth on the school's career list and the sixth-most nationally (second among true freshmen).

- Wynn set an IU true freshman single-season all-purpose yardage mark and became just the third true freshman to lead the Hoosiers in all-purpose yards.

- The Cleveland native recorded eight games over the century mark in all-purpose yardage, including two 150-plus games and surpassed 100 kick return yards five times. Wynn averaged 104.1 all-purpose yards per game (eighth) and 123.4 in Big Ten games only (fifth).

- Wynn returned the opening kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown against Illinois. He became the first true freshman in IU history to collect a kickoff return TD and earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.

- The return was the fourth-longest in school history (three 100-yarders), the second-longest in the Big Ten and the 14th-longest nationally in 2011.

- Wynn finished the game with 148 kick return yards, an IU true freshman record and tied for the seventh-best single-game total in school history.

JUST FOR KICKS

Very quietly **Mitch Ewald** has put together an assault on Indiana's kicking records. The junior enters 2012 as IU's all-time career field goal percentage leader. He is 29-of-35 (82.9 percent) in his career and a perfect 63-of-63 on extra points.

- His percentage is also seventh among active kickers.

- Ewald's 29 field goals are seventh on IU's career list and his 63 extra points are ninth.

- He is tied for third and eighth on the school's single-season field goals list and seventh on the school's single-season extra points list.

- In 16 career Big Ten games, Ewald is 20-of-23 (87.0) from field goal range and 35-of-35 on extra points.

- For the second straight season he has earned a spot on the Lou Groza Award Watch List after going 13-of-16 (one blocked) from field goal range (81.2 percent) and 30-of-30 on extra points last season.

- Ewald also took over kickoff duties in week two after **Nick Freeland** suffered a season-ending ACL injury and averaged 61.7 with eight touchbacks.

- As a redshirt freshman in 2010, the Naperville, Ill., product hit 16-of-19 field goals (84.2 percent) and all 33 extra points.

- His 16 field goals tied an Indiana freshman record.

- Ewald forced overtime with a 26-yarder and hit the game-winner from 31 yards in the team's Old Oaken Bucket victory at Purdue.

IN HIS BACKYARD

D'Angelo Roberts produced a record-setting career at Bloomington North High School, and the hometown product appeared in 11 games as a true freshman last season.

- Roberts rushed for 263 yards with four scores and a 4.4 average.

- He earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors and added his name to the Hoosier record book following the South Carolina State game.

- Roberts became the eighth IU true freshman and the first since BenJarvus Green-Ellis (vs. Purdue on Nov. 22, 2003) to go over 100 yards with 102.

- Most impressive is the fact that Roberts gained all 102 of his rushing yards in the second half alone.

- Roberts received 19 carries (5.4 average) and added a 7-yard score, the first of his career, with a long rush of 33 yards. He also made two catches for 12 yards.

- He rushed for 6,002 yards, the most in Monroe County history, and 75 TDs at Bloomington North.

DON'T SLEEP ON STONER

Nick Stoner showcased his speed and why he is always in the conversation as one of the fastest Hoosiers during the 2012 track season.

- Stoner was a member of Indiana's indoor (Big Ten champions) and outdoor track and field teams.

- As a carry on the 4x400m relay, Stoner helped clinch Indiana's first Big Ten team title in indoor track and field since 1992.

- He earned All-America honors as a member of the 4x400m relay, taking eighth at the NCAA Championships.

- During the outdoor season, Stoner collected All-Big Ten honors, finishing second in the 4x100m relay and third in the 4x400m relay at the Big Ten Championships.

- He qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 4x100m and 4x400m relays, advancing to the semifinals in the 4x400m.
- As a true freshman, Stoner started 2011 at cornerback before moving to wide receiver in week 11.
- The Greenwood, Ind., native played in all 12 games and made six tackles, returned six kicks for 120 yards and had one punt return for 10 yards.

INTERIOR THREAT

Defensive tackles **Adam Replogle, Larry Black, Jr., and Nicholas Sliger** make up Indiana's most experienced group. They represent three of the team's eight seniors and have played together in 35 of Indiana's 36 games over the past three seasons.

- Replogle and Black have started alongside each other 28 times in their three seasons, including all 12 games at defensive tackle in 2012.
- The duo has played in each of IU's 36 games over the last three years, with Replogle starting the last 35 games at tackle or end and Black starting 28 times.
- Sliger has only missed one game (2010) and appeared in 35 since the beginning of 2009.
- Replogle enters 2012 leading all Hoosier defenders with 113 tackles and 10 sacks in his career. He and Black are tied with 15.5 tackles for loss.
- The Centerville, Ohio, native was elected a team captain, earned All-District V honors (second straight year), was a finalist for the ARA Sportsmanship Award and collected Academic All-Big Ten honors (second straight year) in 2011.
- Replogle led the team with four sacks, finished second with seven TFLs and led all defensive linemen with 49 stops.
- Black owns four sacks and 91 tackles to go along with his 15.5 career tackles for loss.
- The Cincinnati product tied for third on the team with 5.5 TFLs and collected 47 stops and 1.5 sacks one year ago.
- Sliger set career highs with 25 tackles and added 1.5 tackles for loss and his first career forced fumble last season. The Cicero, Ind., native has 41 career stops and four TFLs.

YES, HE-BAN!

Nickelback **Greg Heban** started his IU career as a pitcher for head coach Tracy Smith's baseball team. After dominating the 2009 intramural flag football season, Smith urged Heban to give football, one of three sports he played at Delta High School in Muncie, Ind., along with basketball and baseball, another shot.

Heban arrived at preseason camp in 2010, made the team, worked his way up the depth chart and eventually started four of the team's final five games at cornerback and played in all 12 contests.

- Head coach **Kevin Wilson** awarded the now junior defensive back a scholarship prior to the season.
- Heban started all 12 games at cornerback in 2011 and led the team with two interceptions. He shared the top spot with six pass breakups and finished third with 62 tackles.
- This season, Heban has moved inside as a nickel back and will continue to be a driving force on special teams. He was named IU's Special Ops Player of the Year and also was awarded the team's Academic Excellence Award following the 2011 campaign.
- The Muncie, Ind., native also earned Academic All-District V honors and Academic All-Big Ten recognition (second straight year) last year.

- Despite being just 6-foot-1, he can dunk a basketball from standing flat-footed and can throw 90 mph, as he pitched 1 1/3 innings for the 2010 IU baseball team.

ON THE MARK

Safety **Mark Murphy** earned a spot on the *Yahoo Sports, BTN.com* and *ESPN.com* Big Ten All-Freshman teams last season. Murphy led all Big Ten true freshmen with 76 tackles, the most for a Hoosier true freshman since 2003 (Will Meyers - 83).

- The Akron, Ohio, native started the season working with the safeties, joined the linebackers before game three and returned to safety prior to game seven, where he remained the rest of the season.
- Murphy played in all 12 games, started three times at weak-side linebacker and the final six at safety.
- He finished second on the team with 76 tackles and led the way with 44 solos to go along with one tackle for loss, one interception and four pass breakups.
- In Big Ten play, Murphy paced the Hoosiers by 13 tackles with 62 stops, including a team-best 35 solos.
- He collected double-digit tackles three times, including a career-high 13 stops against Purdue, and recorded at least eight tackles on five occasions.
- Murphy intercepted his first pass and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown at North Texas, becoming the first true freshman since Tracy Porter (2004) to do so.
- Murphy's father, Mark, played safety for the Green Bay Packers from 1980-91 and was enshrined into the Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame in 1998.

• One of the most innovative and prolific offensive minds in the country, Kevin Wilson was named Indiana University's 28th head football coach on Dec. 7, 2010.

• Spent the 2002-10 seasons at the University of Oklahoma. He served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10.

• Led some of the most productive offenses in the history of college football, coached in 10 consecutive bowl games and made seven BCS bowl appearances, including three national championship games (2003, '04, '08).

• OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.

• In Wilson's nine years at Oklahoma, 22 offensive players were drafted into the NFL, including seven first-round selections, with three going among the first 10 picks and two in the top five.

• Served as position coach for three All-Americans, an Outland Trophy winner (Jammal Brown), a Mackey Award finalist (Jermaine Gresham) and a two-time Rimington Trophy finalist (Vince Carter).

• Twice a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award - awarded to the nation's top assistant coach, Wilson won the award in 2008.

• As position coach, Wilson tutored three first-round draft picks (Jermaine Gresham, TE - 2010, Davin Joseph, OL - 2006 and Jammal Brown, OL - 2005), a second-round pick (Chris Chester, OL - 2005), a fifth-round pick (Brody Eldridge, TE - 2010), a sixth-round pick (Wes Sims, OL - 2004) and six free agents at Oklahoma.

• Indiana played 32 freshmen last season, the highest total in the country. Linebacker Chase Hoobler, safety Mark Murphy and offensive lineman Bernard Taylor each collected freshman postseason honors.

• Murphy and Taylor secured spots on the *Yahoo Sports*, *BTN.com* and *ESPN.com* Big Ten All-Freshman teams, while Hoobler earned accolades from *Yahoo Sports* and *BTN.com*.

• The Hoosiers excelled in the classroom as well. A school record 24 football student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, 37 posted 3.0 grade point averages in the fall and 36 currently hold cumulative 3.0 GPAs.

• In 2010, the Sooners earned a 48-20 victory over Connecticut in the Fiesta Bowl and also claimed the seventh Big 12 championship in school history.

• During the 2010 campaign, running back DeMarco Murray set the school record for career touchdowns and also broke the OU mark for career all-purpose yards.

• Guided wide receiver Ryan Broyles to eight Sooner receiving records, including career marks for receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns. Broyles led the nation with 131 receptions in 2010.

• His 2008 offense shattered NCAA records by scoring 60 or more points in five straight games and 716 total points for the entire season to average more than 51 points per contest.

• The 2008 team played in the BCS National Championship Game behind Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Sam Bradford.

• In 2008, Bradford passed for 4,720 yards and 50 touchdowns, Chris Brown and DeMarco Murray both rushed

for over 1,000 yards, Juaquin Iglesias recorded 1,150 yards (74 catches) and Jermaine Gresham added 950 yards (66).

• Bradford ranked No. 1 nationally in passing efficiency as a freshman and sophomore, as he threw for more touchdowns (86) in two seasons than anyone in NCAA history.

• In the 2010 NFL Draft, Bradford was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the St. Louis Rams. He captured the 2010 Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honor.

• Three of Wilson's tight ends, Jermaine Gresham, Brody Eldridge and Joe Jon Finley, earned All-Big 12 honors (2007).

• Wilson was also instrumental in the development of Adrian Peterson. Peterson rushed for 1,925 yards in his freshman campaign (2004), which set an OU single-season record and marked the highest total for a freshman in NCAA history.

• Peterson went on to place second in the Heisman voting, the highest finish ever by a freshman. He was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings as the seventh pick in the 2007 NFL Draft, where he was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year.

• Prior to his stint in Norman, Wilson was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Northwestern University in 2001 after serving as offensive coordinator in 1999 and 2000. He worked with the quarterbacks during his time in Evanston.

• Helped NU to the 2000 Alamo Bowl and quarterback Zac Kustok, a Unitas Award finalist, led the Big Ten in total offense.

• Running back Damian Anderson earned All-America honors and became the sixth-best rusher in Big Ten history.

• Followed Randy Walker to Northwestern from Miami University after spending nine years in Oxford, coaching alongside former Indiana head coach Terry Hooppner.

• Served as offensive line coach for his first two years at Miami and was promoted to offensive coordinator for the next seven, spending 1992-1997 in charge of the offensive line and the 1998 season with the quarterbacks.

• His offenses produced outstanding running backs, including Travis Prentice and Indiana running backs coach Deland McCullough.

• Prentice became the NCAA all-time leading scorer and the fifth-most prolific rusher in NCAA history, breaking McCullough's school records in the process.

• Wilson was the head coach and athletic director at Foard High School in North Carolina during the 1989 campaign and the offensive coordinator at North Carolina A&T in 1988.

• Spent a year as the offensive line coach at Winston Salem State in 1987. Wilson began his career in coaching as a student and graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina.

• A walk-on offensive lineman at North Carolina, Wilson earned a scholarship while playing in four bowl games - the 1980 Bluebonnet, the 1981 Gator, the 1982 Sun and the 1983 Peach Bowls.

• Earned his bachelor's degree in education (1984) and his master's degree in physical education (1987).

• Wilson was a three-sport star at Maiden High School in Maiden, N.C.

• Kevin and his wife, Angela, have five children, including three daughters, Elaina (16), Makenzie (14) and Marlee (11) and two sons, Trey (12) and Toby (9).

Indiana increased its strength and conditioning staff from three to five in the 2010 offseason and named **Mark Hill** as its new head football strength and conditioning coach. Hill and the entire football program enjoy a 25,000-square-foot weight room, one of the nation's largest.

- **Will Peoples** and **Rick Danison** are in their second seasons on Hill's staff. They are joined by **Lyonel Anderson** and **Deonte Mack** this year.

- **Amy Freel** also joined the department as director of performance nutrition during the 2010 offseason. Freel is one of only four sports nutritionists in the Big Ten.

- Mack served as an intern during the 2011 campaign. He was a four-year letterwinner on IU's defensive line from 2007-10. Mack played in 36 career games and recorded 45 tackles, two sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.

AMY FREEL

- Responsible for developing a comprehensive nutrition program geared toward improving the training, performance and recovery of Indiana's student-athletes.

- A registered dietitian and a certified specialist in sports dietetics, Freel spent 2003-10 building the same program at Virginia Tech.

DON FISCHER

This marks the 40th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. The past 25 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the

Indiana University Radio Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 18 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts.

During his 39 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 26 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 22 times, including the last three seasons, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers

Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by IU with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast more than 1,600 Indiana University games - a total that includes eight bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 44 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and nine grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoined the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator in 2010. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, reunited with the Voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-game and halftime).

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory.

After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From

1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a school-record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 30th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his

43rd year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Joe worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook.

In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Joe has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, who currently resides in Indianapolis with his wife, Kristen, is a 2002 graduate with a bachelor's degree in sport communications.

Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, currently reside in Bloomington. Jamie earned her bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2005, and her master's in sports management at the University of Tennessee in 2006.
