GAME SIX: No. 1-ranked North Dakota State (5-0, 2-0 Valley Football) is scheduled to host Indiana State (4-2, 2-1 Valley Football) at 3:07 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 13, at Gate City Bank Field at the Fargodome (AstroTurf®'s GameDay Grass™ 3D60 infilled turf / 18,700) ... The Bison exploded past No. 3 Youngstown State 48-7 before a school-record crowd of 19,065 on Saturday ... Indiana State defeated Missouri State 31-17 on Saturday ... North Dakota State has won 10 straight, second longest winning streak in FCS and FBS (Harvard 13, South Carolina 10).

SERIES RECORD: This is the fifth meeting between North Dakota State and Indiana State in a series that started in 2008 ... The Bison lead the series 4-0 ... North Dakota State defeated the Sycamores 27-16 in Terre Haute last season (recap on page 4).

AT HOME: North Dakota State has compiled a 241-36-3 record at home since 1964 ... The Bison are 96-22-0 in the Fargodome since moving from Dacotah Field in 1993 ... NDSU is 17-2 over the last three seasons at home and is 47-11 since head coach **Craig Bohl** took over in 2003.

SELL OUT: North Dakota State recorded its 12th sellout over the past seven seasons with a school record crowd of 19,065 vs. No. 3 Youngstown State at Gate City Bank Field ... NDSU has attracted over 18,000 fans in 10 of its last 11 home games including four sellouts ... Tickets for all 2012 North Dakota State University football home football games are currently **SOLD OUT** ... Additional reserved and standing room tickets may become available on the Friday of game week ... Check GoBison.com/tickets for availability ... To create the best possible home field advantage, NDSU encourages fans to use their tickets for all games at Gate City Bank Field at the Fargodome ... Fans that have purchased season tickets and are unable to attend select games are encouraged to make sure their seats are filled for each game ... Those looking to sell tickets can use online message boards, Craigslist or NDSU's facebook page (facebook.com/NDBison) to broker tickets.

TELEVISION: The game will be televised on the North Dakota NBC Sports Network and ESPN3.com ... Former Valley News Live weekend sports anchor **Brian Shawn** will handle the play-by-play, and KFVR TV Sports Director **Lee Timmerman** and former NDSU quarterback **Kevin Feeney** are the color analysts ... Stations on the North Dakota NBC Sports Network include KVLY-TV (Channel 11, Fargo), KFVR-TV (Channel 5, Bismarck), KMOT-TV (Channel 10, Minot), KQCD-TV (Channel 7, Dickinson) and KUMV-TV (Channel 8, Williston) ... All 11 regular season games in 2012 will be televised for the first time in school history ... The Bison are 105-56-1 (.651) in TV games.

BROCK JENSEN, RYAN SMITH PICK UP WEEKLY VALLEY FOOTBALL HONORS: North Dakota State University quarterback **Brock Jensen** was named Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Week, while wide receiver/return specialist **Ryan Smith** earned Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 7 ... Smith was named the *College Football Performance Awards.com* National Punt Returner of the Week, while Jensen also picked up CFPAs honors ... Jensen, a 6-foot-3, 224-pound junior from Waupaca, Wis. (Waupaca H.S.) completed 15 of 23 passes for 200 yards and two touchdowns as No. 1-ranked North Dakota State defeated No. 3 Youngstown State 48-7 on Oct. 6 before a school record crowd of 19,065 at Gate City Bank Field ... Jensen completed scoring passes to **Zach Vraa** with a 46-yard strike on the flea-flicker with 4:23 left in the first quarter and a 16-yard pass to **Ryan Smith** with 51-seconds left in the second quarter ... He reached 200-yards passing for the eighth time in his career ... Smith, a 5-foot-7, 175-pound, junior from Wahpeton, N.D. (Wahpeton H.S.) returned a punt 76 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter against Youngstown State ... It was the second punt return for a TD for Smith, who went the distance against South Dakota State last season ... He also matched a career-high with seven receptions for 82 yards.

TYLER GIMMESTAD NAMED MVFC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK: North Dakota State offensive guard **Tyler Gimmestad** was selected MVFC Offensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 8 ... Gimmestad, a 6-foot-2, 298-pound junior from Marshall, Minn., graded out to 96 percent and had eight knockdown blocks in North Dakota State's 48-7 win over Youngstown State ... He allowed no QB sacks or hurries as the Bison held a 364-211 advantage in total offense and a 33:12 to 26:48 advantage in time of possession

GARRETT BRUHN SEMIFINALIST FOR NFF'S WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY: North Dakota State University tight end **Garrett Bruhn** is one of 147 candidates for the 2012 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards, presented by Fidelity Investments®, a leading provider of not-for-profit workplace retirement savings plans in higher education ... The 147 nominees also comprise the list of semifinalists for the 2012 William V. 30-yard reception at Western Illinois in 2011, has been a major contributor since his freshman year and has played in 41 games. He helped to open holes for a pair of 1,000-yard rushers last year.

BISON QUICK-HITTERS: Cornerback **Marcus Williams** recorded his third interception of the season and 14th of his career -- a 98-yard pick six against Youngstown State (10-6-12) ... It was his fourth interception return for TD, sixth score overall including lateral and kickoff return ... Williams is tied for second all-time at NDSU with **Rudy Baranko** (1964-66) with the 14 interceptions ... North Dakota State won at Northern Iowa for the first time since 1976 when the Bison posted a 10-9 win at the UNI-Dome ... Wide receiver **Zach Vraa** caught a career and season-high eight passes for 156 yards and two touchdowns vs. Prairie View A&M (9-22-12) ... Vraa caught TD passes of 11 and 69 yards from **Brock Jensen** ... His 69-yard TD reception was the longest for NDSU since **Nick Mertens** and **Gary Williams** hooked up on a school record 95-yard score against Illinois State on Oct. 3, 2009 ... His 156 yards receiving were the most for a Bison receiver since **Warren Holloway** had 184 on seven catches against Western Illinois on Oct. 2, 2010 ... Holloway had eight receptions (96 yards) vs. Georgia Southern in the NCAA FCS semifinals ... North Dakota State's 81 offensive plays against Colorado State (9-8-12) were its most since running 83 against Northern Iowa on Oct. 10, 2009 ... NDSU's 39:52 in time of possession at CSU was its most since holding the ball for 40:17 in a 51-14 win over Cal Poly on Nov. 11, 2006 ... NDSU has allowed just 69 points in its last nine contests, dating back to the start of the 2011 Division I FCS Playoffs ... The Bison have allowed just 55 points in their last eight contests, dating back to a 24-0 shutout victory over Lehigh in the 2011 Division I FCS Quarterfinals ... NDSU has limited its opponent to 10 points or less in 11 of its last 20 games ... Defensive end **Cole Jirik** had 4 tackles including a safety, two tackles for loss and a sack in North Dakota State's 22-7 win over Colorado State on Sept. 8 ... His safety with 5:34 left in the first quarter broke a 7-7 tie and gave the Bison the lead for good ... The safety was the first for North Dakota State since **Matthew Gratzek's** against Robert Morris in the 2010 FCS playoff game ... North Dakota State's field goal block by nose guard **Ryan Drevlow** at Colorado State (9-8-12) was the first since **Matt Veldman's** effort against Illinois State (10-1-11) ... North Dakota State's 52-0 shutout of Robert Morris in the season opener on Sept. 1 at Gate City Bank Field was the first since 2011 when the Bison beat Lehigh 24-0 in the NCAA FCS quarterfinals ... It was NDSU's first shutout in a home opener since defeating Valparaiso 52-0 in 2004 ... North Dakota State improved to 79-30-7 in season openers including 61-17-4 at home ... North Dakota State committed zero (0) turnovers in eight of 15 games played in 2011 and 11 of over its last 20 games ... The Bison committed only 12 turnovers overall

#1 NDSU 27, #16 Indiana State 16

November 5, 2011

TERRE HAUTE, Ind.—D.J. McNorton ran for 100 yards and a touchdown as top-ranked North Dakota State remained unbeaten with a 27-16 victory over 16th-ranked Indiana State in a Missouri Valley Football Conference game played Nov. 5, before a crowd of 6,412 in Memorial Stadium.

Brock Jensen threw a touchdown pass for the Bison (9-0, 6-0 Missouri Valley), who went ahead to stay on Sam Ojuri's 7-yard TD run in the second quarter that made it 17-10. The Bison had zero turnovers for the sixth time this season.

McNorton's 4-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter put it out of reach at 27-10. McNorton, who had 24 carries, reached 100 yards rushing for the first time this season and 10th time in his career. It was his first 100 yard rushing game since Eastern Washington last December.

With 2,542 career yards, McNorton moved up three spots to 8th all-time in rushing at NDSU, ahead of Kevin Feeney, Tyler Roehl and Pat Paschall. McNorton finished his career with 593 all-purpose yards against Indiana State.

The Sycamores (5-4, 3-3) scored the game's final touchdown with 3 minutes to play on Ronnie Fouch's second TD pass of the game, a 2-yarder to Donald Spencer. Justin Hilton caught four passes for 103 yards for Indiana State.

North Dakota State's defense held Shakir Bell, the nation's top rusher, to 79 yards. The Bison came up with a pair of key turnovers in the second half on Colten Heagle's second interception of the season and Chad Willson's fumble recovery off a Coulter Boyer sack. Heagle led the Bison with 11 tackles, the third time he has reached double-figure stops.

Jensen, who completed passes to seven different receivers, was 17 of 30 for 182 yards and the TD -- a 30-yarder to Warren Holloway. Ryan Smith caught a career-high seven passes for 55 yards.

Indiana State outgained NDSU 373 to 343, but the Bison held a commanding 37:56 to 22:04 advantage in time of possession.

NORTH DAKOTA STATE IN NCAA FCS ATTENDANCE

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind.--North Dakota State University ranked 8th with an average of 18,819 in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) attendance figures released by the NCAA.

The football program has enjoyed 12 sell-outs over the past seven seasons including a school record 19,065 against Youngstown State on Oct. 6. The Bison are 47-11 in the Fargodome over the past 10 years under head coach **Craig Bohl**.

"I think fans in our state and our region have embraced our football program. It's been a collaborative effort by a number of people. It's a good product," said Bohl.

"The atmosphere of the Fargodome has definitely changed. It's become a great part of not only Championship Division football, but college football. It's definitely a collegiate atmosphere."

Appalachian State is No. 1 at 27,921, while Montana is No. 2 at 25,124, and James Madison is No. 3 at 22,855.

North Dakota State was 10th last season in FCS attendance figures.

The 285 passing yards are the most since the 2009 season when the Bison had 308 against UNI ... North Dakota State's 66 points against Prairie View A&M are the most since the Bison defeated Division II Concordia St. Paul 66-7 on Aug. 31, 2006 ... The 45 points in the first half against Prairie View are the most since NDSU led Western State (Colo.) 45-3 at halftime on Sept. 8, 2001 ... The halftime margin was the widest since the 63-0 advantage against Minnesota State Moorhead on Sept. 9, 2000.

THE COACH: North Dakota State University head football coach **Craig Bohl** (Nebraska, 1982) is in his 10th season with an 80-31 record including a 18-8 record against nationally-ranked FCS teams, 6-1 record in the FCS playoffs and a 6-3 mark against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams over the past seven seasons -- including a 22-7 win at Colorado State this season ... With the 80 wins, Bohl is second all-time at the school ... The Bison are 47-11 at home in the Fargodome since he's taken over ... Bohl was elected to the Board of Trustees of the American Football Coaches Association at the 2012 AFCA Convention in San Antonio, Texas ... After leading the Bison to the 2011 Missouri Valley Football Conference championship, he was named the AFCA Region 4 FCS Coach of the Year and MVFC Bruce Craddock Coach of the Year ... It was the program's 28th league title overall and first since the 2006 Great West Football Conference title ... History was made in 2010 when Bohl led the tradition-rich program to its first-ever NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision I (FCS) playoff appearance -- dropping a 38-31 overtime decision at eventual national champion Eastern Washington in the quarterfinals ... NDSU also hosted its first NCAA post-season game against Robert Morris in the Fargodome ... The Bison compiled a 9-5 record in 2010, a dramatic turnaround from the 3-8 ledger the year before ... NDSU finished 4-4 and tied for third in the always rugged Missouri Valley Football Conference ... Bohl was selected the *Football Gazette* FCS National and Northwest Region Coach of the Year ... In 2005, he directed the Bison to a 7-4 record during the 2005 season ... NDSU was ranked in the *ESPN/USA Today Coaches* and *The Sports Network* Top 25 polls for 10-of-12 weeks during the regular season climbing as high as No. 8 in both polls on Sept. 19 ... Charter members of the Great West, North Dakota State won its final three league games to finish with a 3-2 record and tie for third place in the standings ... Bohl started his NDSU career with back-to-back 8-3 seasons ... A native of Lincoln, Nebraska, he was a reserve in the Cornhusker secondary from 1977 through 1979 under Tom Osborne and played on NU's 1979 Orange Bowl and 1980 Cotton Bowl teams ... He holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from Nebraska (1982) ... Bohl and his wife, Leia, reside in Fargo .. He has twin daughters, Mallory and Morgan, and a son, Aaron.

FARGO, N.D.—**Brock Jensen** threw three touchdown passes, and North Dakota State kicked off the defense of its Football Championship Subdivision title Sept. 1 with a 52-0 domination of Robert Morris in the season opener for both teams at Gate City Bank Field in the Fargodome.

Jensen was 16 of 23 for 217 yards, hitting **Ryan Smith, Taylor Nelson** and **Trevor Gebhart** for scores. **Sam Ojuri, John Crockett, Derrick Lang** and backup quarterback **Carson Wentz** added rushing touchdowns and **Adam Keller** kicked a 24-yard field goal for the Bison, playing their first game since beating Sam Houston State 17-6 in the FCS championship game Jan. 7.

The NDSU defense held Robert Morris to 88 yards of total offense, the lowest total since 2001 when the defense allowed 80 (-9 rushing, 89 passing) against Angelo State. The 22 yards allowed rushing is the lowest total yielded since 14 yards allowed at Ball State in 2006.

The Bison tallied three fumbles and an interception of the Colonials' Matt Layman, who was 10 of 21 for 66 yards. NDSU allowed just 22 rushing yards on 29 RMU attempts.

NDSU recorded its second shutout over the past four games as the Bison blanked Lehigh 24-0 in the NCAA FCS quarterfinals. It was the first regular season shutout since 2006 when it blanked Mississippi Valley State 45-0. The shutout was the first for the Bison in their home opener since topping Valparaiso 52-0 in 2004.

Junior receiver **Ryan Smith** racked up 131 all-purpose yards -- 68 receiving and 63 punt return yards -- to claim MVP in honors in the 23rd Trees Bowl.

Junior linebacker **Grant Olson** led the Bison defense with eight total tackles, 1.0 TFL and a forced fumble.

Gate City Bank Field was sold out for the 11th time in the past seven seasons, as NDSU's dominant performance took place in front of a crowd of 18,769.

North Dakota State won its only previous meeting with Robert Morris, 43-17 in the opening round of the 2010 FCS playoffs.

FORT COLLINS, Colo.—**Sam Ojuri** scored two touchdowns and **Marcus Williams** had a big day on defense and special teams as reigning Division I FCS national champion North Dakota State beat Colorado State 22-7 on Sept. 8 at Hughes Stadium.

NDSU now has six wins over FBS schools since 2006 -- the most among all FCS schools. The Bison are 6-3 against FBS opponents over that stretch.

Ojuri had a 6-yard TD scamper in the first quarter and scored another on a 10-yard screen pass. Williams accumulated 135 yards on five returns and also had an interception -- all in the first half.

The Bison dominated time of possession by nearly 20 minutes and outgained the Rams by 123 yards, a figure that was more lopsided until a last-minute drive by the Rams that was halted when NDSU recovered a fumble.

NDSU's 81 offensive plays were its most since running 83 against Northern Iowa on Oct. 10, 2009, and its 39:52 mark in time of possession was its most since holding the ball for 40:17 in a 51-14 win over Cal Poly on Nov. 11, 2006.

Junior quarterback **Brock Jensen** was efficient all evening, completing 18 of 29 passes for 189 yards. He also ran for 42 yards as the Bison spoiled the home debut of CSU coach Jim McElwain.

Early on, the game looked like it might be a high-scoring affair. CSU tight end Crockett Gillmore hauled in a pass over the middle and outraced the Bison secondary for a 69-yard TD just 90 seconds into the contest.

NDSU (2-0) quickly answered just over a minute later when Ojuri glided into the end zone. Soon after, **Cole Jirik** tackled tailback Tommey Morris in the end zone for a safety, giving the Bison a lead they wouldn't relinquish.

The stingy Bison defense allowed CSU to convert just 1-of-10 third-down plays all game and sacked quarterback Garrett Grayson four times. The Bison converted 12-of-21 third-down plays.

Sophomore **Zach Vraa** led a balanced Bison receiving attack, hauling in six passes for 67 yards.

The Bison have allowed just 20 points in their last five contests, dating back to a 24-0 shutout victory over Lehigh in the 2011 Division I FCS Quarterfinals. NDSU has limited its opponent to 10 points or less in nine of its last 17 games.

Junior linebacker **Grant Olson** led NDSU in tackles for the second straight game, recording nine stops and 2.0 TFL.

#1 NDSU 66, Prairie View A&M 7

September 22, 2012

FARGO, N.D.— **Brock Jensen** threw for 192 yards and matched a career-high with three touchdown passes as No. 1-ranked North Dakota State easily beat Prairie View 66-7 before 18,623 fans at Gate City Bank Field in the Fargodome on Sept. 22.

North Dakota State has won eight straight game dating back to the loss to Youngstown State last November.

Jensen completed 13 of 15 pass attempts for the Bison, connecting with wide receiver **Zach Vraa** for two touchdowns, including a 69-yard pass, in the first quarter. Backup quarterback **Carson Wentz** completed all eight pass attempts for 93 yards.

Vraa, who had 156 receiving yards in three previous games in his career, finished with eight receptions for 156 yards to lead a group of nine receivers for NDSU.

The Bison scored 28 points in the second quarter with touchdowns from **Nate Moody**, **John Crockett**, **Sam Ojuri**, and **Taylor Nelson**, and kicks by **Adam Keller**. In the third quarter, **Deveon Dinwiddie** took over the scoring with three TDs on the ground.

North Dakota State led 45-0 at halftime, the most since September 2001 when the Bison led Western State (Colo.) 45-3 at the intermission.

The Panthers were scoreless until the fourth quarter when D.J. Harris caught a 7-yard pass from Jerry Lovelocke, followed by an extra point from Chris Barrick.

North Dakota State rolled up 605 yards of total offense compared to 200 for Prairie View A&M. The Bison rolled up 320 yards on the ground with six different ball carriers. Dinwiddie rushed 11 times for 87 yards, while Crockett picked up 77 yards on nine carries.

Defensive end **Mike Hardie** led NDSU with six tackles and a pair of sacks, while linebacker **DeShawn Dinwiddie** had six tackles. Free safety **Christian Dudzik** and nose guard **Brian Schaetz** each came up with fumble recoveries. The Bison combined for nine tackles for loss, three forced fumbles and three sacks.

It was NDSU's highest offensive outburst since defeating Division II Concordia-St. Paul 66-7 in the 2006 season opener.

#1 NDSU 33, #14/17 Northern Iowa 21

September 29, 2012

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa—North Dakota State junior quarterback **Brock Jensen** threw for a career-high 243 yards, and the Bison defense forced three turnovers in a 33-21 win over Northern Iowa in the UNI-Dome on Sept. 29.

Top-ranked NDSU earned its eighth consecutive road win and its ninth straight victory overall.

Sophomore **John Crockett** rushed for 122 yards and two touchdowns to help the Bison kick off their Missouri Valley Football Conference schedule with their first victory in Cedar Falls since 1976. Crockett used 19 carries to become the first Bison this season to surpass 100 rushing yards in a game.

Crockett scored on a three-yard run late in the second quarter and from six yards early in the third. Jensen added 243 yards passing, including a 19-yard touchdown to **Kevin Vaadeland** in the fourth quarter, for the Bison (4-0), who haven't lost a road game since the 2010 season.

The Panthers (1-4, 0-2 MVFC) pulled within 20-14 midway through the third quarter when Sawyer Kollmorgen hit Wes Smith for a 27-yard score. Later, though, Kollmorgen threw an interception to set up Vaadeland's first career touchdown.

Kollmorgen added a 20-yard TD to Terrell Sinkfield in the final minute and finished with 213 yards passing, while David Johnson had 85 yards rushing and a touchdown.

Ultimately, NDSU outgained UNI 419-285 and owned a plus-three turnover margin for the game.

Jensen posted new career highs in passing yards (243) and attempts (31) and matched his career-best 22 completions in his performance against UNI last season. He moved up to No. 2 on the NDSU all-time list for completions (347), passing Tony Stauss.

NDSU's **Adam Keller** made four of his five field-goal attempts, including a career-long 43-yarder late in the third quarter. He tied the school record for field goals made (4), previously set by **Ken Kubisz** vs. Augustana in 1983, and field goal attempted (4), previously set by **Shawn Bibeau** at Minnesota in 2006.

Safety **Bryan Shepherd** and linebacker **Grant Olson** each recorded six tackles to lead the Bison defense. Sophomore linebacker **Travis Beck** registered 2.5 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble in the game.

Junior cornerback **Marcus Williams** reeled in his second interception of the season and the 13th of his career, tying him for third all-time at NDSU.

#1 NDSU 48, #3 Youngstown State 7

October 6, 2012

FARGO, N.D.—**Marcus Williams** returned an interception 98 yards for a touchdown to help No. 1-ranked North Dakota State blow open a close game Oct. 6 and explode past No. 3 Youngstown State 48-7 in a matchup of highly regarded Football Championship Subdivision teams.

Williams stepped in front of a Kurt Hess pass at the NDSU 2 midway through the second quarter as the Penguins were driving for a possible tying score. Instead, it made the score 21-7 and the Bison tacked on two more touchdowns on the stunned visitors before halftime to take a 35-7 lead.

"Anytime the quarterback throws a pick-six, that's really hard for a quarterback to overcome," NDSU coach **Craig Bohl** said of the interception. "I thought it was a great play by Marcus."

The Bison (5-0, 2-0 Missouri Valley Football Conference) also returned a punt for a touchdown when **Ryan Smith** zig-zagged through the middle of the field for a 76-yard score in the third quarter. That made it 45-7.

Brock Jensen passed for 200 yards and two touchdowns and **John Crockett** ran for 103 yards and two scores for NDSU. The Bison defense forced three turnovers in the first half, including a fumble on the first play from scrimmage that was recovered by **Christian Dudzik**.

"We came out of the gate hot, just like we wanted to," Jensen said. "We know how good of a football team we can be if we play clean football."

NDSU has played turnover-free football in 11 of 20 games since losing to Eastern Washington in the quarterfinals of the 2010 playoffs.

The Penguins (4-1, 1-1) had enjoyed success against NDSU, coming in with a 4-2 series advantage and a 2-0 record at the Fargodome. They handed the defending FCS champions their only loss last season. Youngstown also had last week off to prepare for the game.

"It's obviously very disappointing," Youngstown coach Eric Wolford said. "It's one game, though."

Hess, a first-team all-conference selection last year, came into the game leading all FCS quarterbacks in passing efficiency. He had completed 55 of 83 passes for 765 yards, with eight touchdowns and no interceptions.

Hess finished with 11 completions in 20 attempts for 117 yards and two interceptions. Bohl said the Bison took him out of his comfort zone.

"Anytime you can harass the quarterback with your defensive line, that can create problems," Wolford said. "But we let this game get out of control very early on because of self-inflicted turnovers."

Linebacker **Grant Olson**, who led the Bison defense with 12 tackles, pointed to the Williams interception return as the key play.

"That was a 14-point swing. It would have been a different game without that," Olson said. "We didn't look back from there."

The game was played before a record crowd of 19,065 at Gate City Bank Field at the Fargodome.
