Sycamore Homestand Continues On Saturday Against Truman State

SETTING THE STAGE

Indiana State continues year three of the Greg Lansing era on Saturday, November 17 when the Sycamores (1-1) host Truman State (0-2) inside Hulman Center. Tip-off is set for 1:05 p.m. (ET). The game will be broadcast locally on WAWV-TV as well as Sycamore Vision with Jason Pensky (pbp) and Jim Waugh (color) on the call. The game can also be heard on the radio via X 95.9 FM (a change from the normal broadcast channel due to a conflict with Sycamore football at Youngstown State) and along the Nelligan Sports Marketing Radio Network with Brent Holl (pbp) and Matt Renn (analyst) on the call. The web stream on Sycamore Vision is a pay-per-view web stream service of GoSycamores.com. An audio only web stream will also be available at GoSycamores.com.

THE TRUMAN STATE SERIES

The Sycamores have never faced Truman State in a regular season contest, but did defeat them last year inside Hulman Center, 87-33, in an exhibition game. Saturday's game against Truman State is a regular season contest for Indiana State, but is being counted as an exhibition game for Truman State and will not be reflected in their final record.

QUICK HITS

- Indiana State opened up the home portion of the schedule against Winthrop on Tuesday evening with a 66-55 victory. The Sycamores are now 3-0 under head coach Greg Lansing in home openers and have won each of their five last games when playing their first game at Hulman Center.

- In the season opener on November 9 at UCLA, Justin Gant and Manny Arop were the top two rebounders for the Sycamores, which accounted for 42.4 percent of the team's total rebounds.

- Indiana State is now 1-0 on the season when holding teams to 63 points or less and improved to 27-1 when doing so under third-year head coach Greg Lansing.

- Indiana State has earned 38 close victories (five points or less) since 2005. Under Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 12-5 in close games.

The Indiana State Head Coach

Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing (South Dakota, 1990) is 39-30 (.565) overall in his third season as a head coach. He is 20-16 all-time in MVC games, including a 13-5 mark at home and a 7-11 mark on the road. During his career, he is 22-7 in all home games, 10-18 on the road, 7-5 in neutral court contests and 12-5 in games decided by five points or less. Lansing is 0-0 all-time against Truman State, and is 0-0 versus the Bulldogs inside Hulman Center (not including an 87-33 exhibition victory last season). With the Trees, Lansing is 2-2 in overtime games and 27-1 when holding teams to 63 points or less. Tuesday's game will be Greg Lansing's 70th as Indiana State head coach. Lansing is the second head coach to lead the Sycamores to the NCAA Tournament in their rookie campaign in the history of the program, with the other being Bill Hodges leading ISU to a 33-1 record and a Final Four appearance in the 1979 NCAA Tournament. Lansing was just the 14th rookie head coach in the history of the MVC to lead his team to 20 victories during their debut season.

A Little History

Indiana State is currently in its 117th season of college basketball at the school. The Sycamores are 1,386-1,197 all-time on the hardwood. Indiana State's game at Oral Roberts in 2010 was the historic 2,500th game in the history of the program.

Sycamores Improve To 3-0 In Home Openers Under Greg Lansing; Perfect At Home In November

With the 66-55 home court victory over Winthrop on Tuesday, November 13, Indiana State improved to 3-0 in home opening games under third-year head coach Greg Lansing as well as a perfect 5-0 in November home games in the last three seasons.

Sycamores Shoot Over 50 Percent Against Winthrop With Four Players In Double Figures Scoring

Indiana State hit 12-of-19 shots (63.2 percent) and finished the Winthrop game with a 21-of-37 mark from the field (56.8 percent) as they handed the Eagles their first loss of the season on November 13 at Hulman Center. Jake Odum was one of four players to reach double figures scoring as he posted 15 points on the strength of a 9-of-10 performance at the free throw line. Justin Gant reached double figures for the second consecutive game with his 14 point showing while Dawon Cummings hit a pair of crucial second half 3-pointers to score 11 and RJ Mahurin came off the bench to score 10. The Sycamores owned a 26-18 edge in points scored in the paint while ISU converted 12 Winthrop turnovers into 17 points.

Gant Scores 11 Points, Pulls Down A Career High Eight Rebounds At No. 13 UCLA

Indiana State sophomore Justin Gant tied for the team lead with 11 points and paced the squad with a career-high eight rebounds as the Sycamores opened New Pauley Pavilion at No. 13 UCLA on the opening night of college basketball season. Gant went 4-of-11 from the field, and hit a 3-pointer while adding two free throws in 25 minutes of action while earning the start. Gant drilled a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 17:11 left in the first half to score the first-ever points in New Pauley Pavilion. He posted seven points and seven rebounds in the first half alone. Gant currently ranks tied for sixth in the MVC in rebounds per game.

An Indiana State Win Over Truman State Would ...

- Give the Sycamores at least a 2-1 start out of the gate for the third time in the last four years.
- Give the Sycamores a 23-7 record inside Hulman Center under Lansing, including a perfect 6-0 mark in the month of November.
- Be the Sycamores' first-ever regular season victory over Truman State.

Khristian Smith Ties For Team Lead With 11 Points In Sycamore Debut At UCLA

Indiana State freshman Khristian Smith tied for the team lead in points scored with 11 as the Sycamores opened the campaign at No. 13 UCLA. Smith came off the bench to hit 4-of-8 shots from the field, including a mark of 2-of-3 from 3-point range with three rebounds and a steal in 27 minutes of action. Smith tallied five points and three rebounds in the first half.

Sycamores Help UCLA Open New Pauley Pavilion While Gant Scores First Points In Building

It was a historic night for the Indiana State basketball program on November 9 as the Sycamores were the road team in the opening of New Pauley Pavilion against No. 13 UCLA. Legendary head coach John Wooden spent the 1946-47 and 1947-48 seasons as the head basketball coach at Indiana State before his 27-year run at the helm of the Bruin program. While both of coach Wooden's teams battled it out on the hardwood at New Pauley Pavilion, Sycamore sophomore Justin Gant scored the first points in the new building with a 3-pointer at the 17:11 mark of the first half.

Defense Forces Turnovers And Converts Them To Points At UCLA

The Indiana State defense forced a total of 16 UCLA turnovers in the season opener against the Bruins, netting the Sycamores a total of 24 points off turnovers. The Sycamores recorded 10 steals in the contest, paced by four from Jake Odum as well as three more from RJ Mahurin. Odum and Mahurin currently rank 1-2 in the MVC in steals per game average after the opening weekend of play.

Six Make Sycamore Debut At UCLA

The Sycamores game against UCLA marked the debut of six new Indiana State players on the roster for the 2012-13 campaign. Indiana State is returning just one starter from last season in junior guard Jake Odum. Freshman Khristian Smith led the newcomers with 11 points off the bench while starting forward Manny Arop tallied 10 points. Two Sycamores, Arop and Dawon Cummings made their Sycamore debuts in the starting lineup against UCLA while Devonte Brown, Rhett Smith, Brandon Burnett and Smith came off the bench in their first games in the Blue & White.

Indiana State Secures 17 Offensive Rebounds At UCLA

Indiana State recorded 33 total rebounds in the season opener at UCLA, including 17 offensive rebounds. The Sycamores are averaging 10.0 offensive rebounds per game, which ranks tied for fourth in the Missouri Valley Conference through the first week of play.

Good Starter On The Battery

Indiana State improved to 1-0 this season when the Sycamore starters outscore their opponents with the 66-55 victory over Winthrop. Under third-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 25-7 when the ISU starting five scores more than their opponent's counterparts.

63 Is The Magic Number

The Sycamores win by the score of 66-55 vs. Winthrop on November 13 was ISU's first this season in which they held an opponent to 63 points or less and earned the victory. ISU finished the 2011-12 campaign with an 11-1 mark when holding an opponent under that total. Under third-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 27-1 when allowing less than 63 points to the opposition (including a 12-0 mark when holding teams to 53 or less).

Sycamore Success Inside Hulman Center Under Greg Lansing

The Sycamores are 22-7 (.759) inside Hulman Center under third-year head coach Greg Lansing. The Sycamores have won 13 of their last 17 home games. Additionally, the Sycamores have won 13 of their last 18 MVC games at home.

Sycamores In Postseason Play For Third Consecutive Season

With Indiana State's appearance in the 2012 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, the Sycamores have now made three consecutive trips to postseason play. ISU played in the 2010 College Basketball Invitational as well as the 2011 NCAA Tournament in addition to the CIT Tournament in 2012. The last time the Sycamores reached postseason play for three consecutive seasons came in 1977-79 when Indiana State played in the 1977 & 1978 NIT as well as the 1979 NCAA Tournament. The last time Indiana State hosted a postseason game came on March 10, 1978 when the Sycamores hosted Illinois State in the first round of the NIT.

Jake Odum Named To The Preseason All-Missouri Valley Team

Indiana State guard Jake Odum was one of five student-athletes named to the Preseason All-Missouri Valley Conference Team on October 29. Odum finished third in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 4.9 assists per game average. That mark was ranked 61st nationally. Odum recorded a career-high 12 assists against Fairfield as part of the Old Spice Classic, a number which ranked tied for fourth all-time at ISU in a single game. Odum is third in the MVC in steals per game with a 1.8 average, which ranks 81st nationally. Additionally, Odum's 4.5 assists per game average of his career is fifth-best in the history of the program while his 119 steals are ranked ninth-best in the Sycamore record books, while his 1.8 steals per game average ranks third.

Sycamores Picked To Finish 7th In Missouri Valley Conference Race

The Indiana State Sycamores were picked to finish seventh in the Missouri Valley Conference race according to a poll of league head coaches, sports information directors and a media panel. ISU finished eighth last season, with an 8-10 MVC record, just one game out of a large logjam for third place at 9-9.

Indiana State Posts Three Exhibition Victories In The Bahamas In August

Indiana State took advantage of the NCAA rule allowing teams to participate in a foreign tour of exhibition contests once every four years when they travelled to Nassau, Bahamas from August 12-14 and defeated the Giants 95-76, the Real Deal Shockers 116-75 and the PJ Stingers 76-55. Manny Arop scored 17 points to lead ISU against the Giants, while Dawon Cummings had 18 to pace the Sycamores against the Real Deal Shockers. The Sycamores were led in the final exhibition game of the tour by Lucas Eitel who scored 15 points versus the PJ Stingers.

Jake Odum Posts Career-High 34 Points Against Illinois State

Jake Odum scored a team season-high 34 points against Illinois State on February 14, giving him six consecutive games of reaching double figures scoring and marked the sixth 20-point game of his career. Add in his seven assists and seven rebounds, Odum is the first player to go 34-7-7 in the NCAA this season. Odum is the first college basketball player to post 17 made free throws and seven assists in the same game since North Dakota State's Ben Woodside did it in 2008 against Stephen F. Austin. Odum's 34 points marked the first Sycamore with a 30-point game since Marico Stinson's 37 points in December of 2006 against Drake and is the fifth-highest single game performance in the MVC this year.

Indiana State Reaches 17 Regular Season Victories For Third Consecutive Season; First Time Since Larry Bird Era

With its 59-46 victory over Missouri State on February 22, the Sycamores have now posted at least 17 regular season victories for the third consecutive season, which is the first time three Indiana State teams have reached that mark in succession since the 1976-77, 1977-78 & 1978-79 seasons. The Sycamores won 25 in 76-77, 19 in 77-78 and 26 in 78-79.

Triple-Double For Odum And Tournament Record To Boot

Jake Odum battled a foot injury while playing three games in four days at the 2011 Old Spice Classic. After two solid performances in the first two days of the event, Odum saved his best for last as he posted 10 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists against Fairfield on November 27. That triple-double was the first by a Sycamore since Larry Bird posted one in 1979 versus Drake and the first by a member of the MVC in 14 seasons. Additionally, the 12 assists are an Old Spice Classic single-game record. His 12 assists is the first double digit assist total in his career and the first by a Sycamore since Michael Menser had 11 against Wichita State in 2001.

The Last Time Out ...

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. -- The Indiana State Sycamores placed four different players in double figures scoring en route to a 66-55 victory over Winthrop in the home opener in front of 4,916 fans at Hulman Center.

The Sycamores improved to 27-1 when holding teams to 63 points or less and are now 22-7 at home under Lansing's watch.

The Sycamores were led in scoring by Jake Odum who finished with 15 points on the strength of an 9-for-10 shooting night at the free throw line. Justin Gant added 14 points while Dawon Cummings drilled a pair of 3-pointers en route to scoring 11. Off the bench, RJ Mahurin tallied 10 points to go with four rebounds.

Indiana State hit 21-of-37 shots from the field (56.8 percent), including five 3-pointers and were 12-of-19 shooting (63.2 percent) in the first half. Winthrop was limited to just 19-of-59 shooting (32.2 percent), but did hold a 34-28 margin in rebounding. ISU converted 12 Eagle turnovers in 17 points. The bench posted 22 points in the game for Indiana State.

Indiana State would lead by as many as 14 points, but Winthrop cut the advantage down to 60-52 before Odum hit a free throw with 1:15 remaining to stretch the lead back out to nine points. After another Indiana State defensive stop, Odum was fouled with 1:08 remaining and drilled both of his free throws to make it 63-52. Gant would tack on a conventional 3-point play with 45.6 seconds on the clock for a 66-52 lead and capped a 6-0 run.

The Sycamores expanded its 36-30 halftime lead when Jake Odum drove baseline and found Dawon Cummings wide open at the top of the key for his first 3-pointer of the season at the 18:17 mark and following a Winthrop free throw, he hit another one with 17:20 on the clock to stretch the Sycamore cushion out to 42-33 which forced the Eagles to take a timeout.

Winthrop came storming right back with a conventional 3-point play as well another lay-up to inch closer at 42-38. Gant scored his first points of the second half on a driving lay-up over the defense to stretch the advantage back out to 44-38 with 16:01 on the clock. Gant took a nice feed in the paint from Odum on the Sycamores' next possession to send him into double figures scoring for the second consecutive game and it stretched the lead out to 46-38 with 14:57 on the clock.

The Sycamores would not score again for over three minutes, but the defense allowed just two points themselves when RJ Mahurin picked up an offensive rebound as the clock ticked down towards 11 minutes to go and he laid the ball back in to extend the advantage out to 48-40. Mahurin followed up yet another Sycamore defensive stop with a pair of free throws as the lead reached 10 points at 50-40 with 10:45 remaining.

Winthrop would end a spell of scoring just two points over five minutes with a trey as the clock ticked under 10 minutes remaining to cut into the lead at 50-43. Odum went over double figures scoring on a fastbreak jumper after Gant secured a steal at midcourt to make it 53-43. Arop hit driving lay-up at the 8:08 mark to stretch the cushion out to 55-43. The lead reached 57-43 as the Sycamores completed a 7-0 run on an emphatic steal and fastbreak dunk by Khristian Smith with 7:20 on the clock.

A 4-0 short run by Winthrop whittled the lead down to just 10 points, but Odum stepped up with 5:05 remaining in the game and hit a pair of free throws to extend the advantage back out to 59-47.

Indiana State drew first blood in the contest as Justin Gant opened the contest with a bucket, just as he did in the season opener at UCLA, just 11 seconds in to stake the Sycamores to a quick 2-0 lead.

An Arop lay-up answered an early Winthrop basket before the Eagles tied it at four with 17:11 on the clock. The Eagles lead would grow to 10-4 until Gant drilled a 3-pointer at the 15:09 mark which began a 10-0 spurt for the Sycamores which resulted in Indiana State owning a 14-10 lead as the run was capped by an RJ Mahurin triple with 12:29 remaining in the half.

The Eagles scored the game's next four points to knot the game at 14, but Lucas Eitel would remain perfect on the year from long range as he swished a 3-pointer with 11:13 on the clock for a 17-14 advantage.

Indiana State would be held without a field goal for the next four minutes until a driving lay-up by Devonte Brown knotted the game at 19 with 7:10 remaining. The defense allowed just two points to the Eagles during the offensive dry spell.

Brown added a free throw with 5:46 left before the half to take the Sycamores to a 20-19 advantage, but Winthrop scored the next four points of the game to head out to a 23-20 lead. Mahurin ended the Eagle mini-run with a turnaround hook shot with 3:49 remaining to cut the Winthrop cushion down to 23-22.

Dawon Cummings entered the action and hit a high-arching jumper off the glass and added a free throw to complete the conventional 3-point play at the 3:06 mark to tie the game for the sixth time at 25. Odum drilled a pair of charity tosses with 2:23 left before the break as the Sycamores retook the lead at 27-25.

Winthrop owned a 30-29 lead with 1:35 left before the half on a 3-pointer by Christian Farmer, but the Sycamores closed the staza on a 7-0 run as Gant drilled a jumper with 1:11 left and then Odum connected on a pair of free throws at the 54 second mark to make it 33-30 in favor of ISU.

Odum would go on to connect on a jumper with 40 seconds left and Brown drilled a free throw with just five seconds on the clock for the 36-30 halftime lead. Farmer hit a 3-pointer after the buzzer for Winthrop, and it was confirmed by video replay to be late.

The Sycamores were led in scoring during the first half by Odum with eight points while Gant tallied seven. ISU connected on 12-of-19 shots, including a mark of 3-of-5 from 3-point range for a blazing 63.2 percent. Winthrop was limited to a 10-of-28 mark in the first half, shooting just 35.7 percent.

Two players reached double figures scoring for Winthrop as Derrick Henry had 15 and Andre Smith tallied 11.

Indiana State Head Basketball Coach Third Season

Greg Lansing is in his third season as the head basketball coach at Indiana State. He previously spent eight seasons with the program as an assistant coach, including the previous three as associate head coach.

Lansing burst onto the scene as a rookie head coach with the Sycamore basketball program in 2010-11 as he became just the second-ever Indiana State head coach to lead the team to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. He led the team to a 20-14 record, becoming just the 14th head coach in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference to lead a team to 20 or more victories in their first year at the helm.

In 2011-12, the Sycamores finished the year with an 18-15 record and advanced to the CollegelInsiders.com Postseason Tournament. It marked the third consecutive year the team has reached postseason play -- its longest such stretch since the 1977, 1978 and 1979 seasons when Larry Bird donned the Indiana State uniform.

Jake Odum was one of just four players nationally to average at least 10 points, five rebounds and 4.5 assists per game during his sophomore season and was a Second Team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection as well as Second Team All-District selection as announced by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

The Sycamores downed No. 25 nationally-ranked Vanderbilt on the road and finished third at the Old Spice Classic -- the best-ever finish by a MVC team in the event.

ISU reached the NCAA Tournament and took on Syracuse in Cleveland, Ohio based on the program's third-ever MVC Tournament Championship won at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis, Mo. ISU raced to the title with victories over No. 6 Evansville, No. 2 Wichita State and No. 1 Missouri State in the Championship Game as the Sycamores entered as the No. 3 seed in the tournament. Freshman Jake Odum was named to the MVC All-Tournament Team.

Odum was named a CollegelInsider.com Mid Major Freshman All-American and was named an All-MVC Honorable Mention selection as well as a member of the MVC All-Freshman, All-Newcomer and All-Defense Team. Carl Richard was also named to the All-MVC's Honorable Mention squad. ISU took two thrilling buzzer beating victories over league foes Missouri State and Creighton during the regular season at Hulman Center. The buzzer beater over Creighton by Richard was voted the No. 2 play of the weekend by ESPN's SportsCenter.

In 2009-10 the Sycamores overcame a ton of adversity to still put together its best season in nearly a decade under the professional leadership of the ISU coaching staff. Despite only having its full compliment of student-athletes for just 28 minutes of the rough and tumble Missouri Valley Conference slate, the Sycamores still recorded its first winning season since 2001 as they finished 17-15. ISU also finished the year with a 9-9 record in league play, bolstering the Sycamores out of the MVC Opening Round at the State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament by securing the league's No. 6 seed after

Starting guard Jake Kelly suffered a season ending knee injury with 12 minutes left in the conference opener at Southern Illinois and subsequently also lost Dwayne Lathan and Harry Marshall for extended periods over the course of the year.

Marshall, who was the heart and sole of the team, led the MVC in scoring in league contests with a 16.0 ppg average. Marshall was tabbed Second Team All-MVC and was named to the MVC's All-Defensive Team after turning in shutdown performances against most of the league's all-conference opposition. Running a well-rounded program, the Sycamores also two representatives on the MVC's Scholar Athlete Team as both Jordan Printy and Aaron Carter took those plaudits.

The payoff for the Sycamores continued as ISU reached postseason play for the first since 2001 when they accepted a bid to the 2010 College Basketball Invitational, appearing in a road contest at Saint Louis.

With a keen attention to details that most coaches think of as an afterthought, the Sycamores concentrated on extreme efficiency on the court, finishing the year as the nation's second leading free throw shooting team. ISU's 76.9 percent mark at the line finished just behind NCAA qualifier BYU on the NCAA Division I list for the best free throw shooting teams in the country.

Additionally, the Sycamores overcame a 24-point deficit in the second half at Missouri State before falling in overtime. The 24-point comeback in front of a national television audience was the largest in the history of the MVC by a team that at least forced overtime.

During his second stint with the Sycamore basketball program, Lansing has been a key recruiting for many talented student-athletes. Lansing has also been a major part of the several all-conference accolades for several players, including Harry Marshall and Jay Tunnell, who took All-MVC honors following the 2008-09 campaign. Last season, the Sycamores concluded the regular season by winning six of their final games, including a trio of road contests.

Lansing returned to Indiana State after a seven year stint with the Iowa Hawkeyes. During Lansing's seven years as assistant coach at Iowa, the Hawkeyes went 135-92, received three NCAA Tournament invitations, three NIT appearances and won a pair of Big Ten tournament titles, the first of which came on four wins in four games making Iowa the first team in the Big Ten to ac-

complish such a feat. In 2005-06, Iowa earned a 25-9 record, the second-most wins in school history, the first undefeated (17-0) home record in the school's history and a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Iowa earned seven All-Big Ten selections, 17 Academic All-Big Ten selections and four Academic All-Americans. Lansing coached four of the last five Big Ten rebounding champions, three straight conference leaders in blocked shots and, the league's 2005-06 defensive player of the year. Three of his student-athletes reached the NBA and two from the 2005-06 team were invited to NBA camps.

In Lansing's final two seasons of his first stint at Indiana State, the Sycamores posted back-to-back winning campaigns for the first time since 1979 and 1980. When the Sycamores posted a 16-11 record in 1998 it marked the first winning season for Indiana State since 1980. Indiana State advanced to the NCAA Tournament in both 2000 and 2001.

Prior to joining the staff at Indiana State, Lansing was the head basketball coach at Roosevelt High School in Des Moines, Iowa. Roosevelt had not had a winning season in 12 years before Lansing's initial season. The Roughriders went on to have back-to-back winning seasons under Greg's direction.

Lansing earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of South Dakota in 1990 and a master's degree in counseling from USD in 1992. As a member of the Coyote basketball team Lansing helped South Dakota reach the NCAA Division II Tournament during his junior and senior seasons, the first NCAA invitation for USD since 1954. He was twice named the South Dakota Defensive Player of the Year. Greg is currently ranked among the leaders in career assists at USD. Following his playing career, Lansing served as a graduate assistant coach at South Dakota for two seasons. In 1992-93 he was a full-time assistant.

Greg's father, Dave Lansing, coached high school basketball for 33 years in Iowa. Dave Lansing was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Coaches Hall of Fame during the 1999 Iowa boys state basketball tournament. Lansing's dad, his mother, Diane, his sister, Angela, and his nephew, Jordan, live in West Des Moines. His brother, Steve, is the head basketball coach at Faribault High School (Minn.), where he was named Regional Coach of the Year in 2004. Lansing is married to the former Angie Menser, who is an Indiana State graduate and a former track and cross country academic All-American for the Sycamores. She currently serves as ISU's senior women's administrator and athletics business manager.

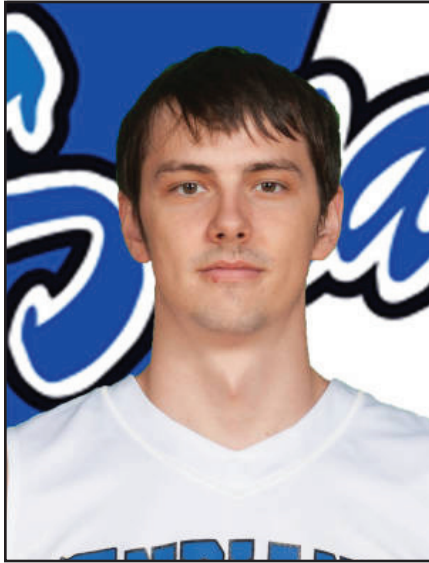
