Indiana State Begins Two Game Homestand Against High Point On Sunday

SETTING THE STAGE

Indiana State continues year three of the Greg Lansing era on Sunday, November 25 when the Sycamores (3-1) return home to take on High Point (3-1) inside Hulman Center. Tip-off is set for 1:05 p.m. (ET). The game will be broadcast live worldwide on a pay-per-view basis on Sycamore Vision with Brian Fritz (pbp) and Matt Renn (color) on the call. The game can also be heard on the radio via WIBQ 98.5 FM and along the Nelligan Sports Marketing Radio Network with Brian Fritz (pbp) and Matt Renn (analyst) on the call. THE HIGH POINT SERIES

Indiana State is facing High Point, of the Big South Conference, for the first time. The Sycamores are 8-1 over members of the Big South, including a 66-55 victory over Winthrop on November 13 inside Hulman Center.

QUICK HITS

- Indiana State earned a 68-48 victory over Ball State on November 20 which was the largest for the Sycamores over the Cardinals since a 32-point win in 1977 and was the biggest margin of victory on the road against BSU since 1919. ISU broke an 11-game road losing skid to the Cardinals with the victory, dating back to 1986.

- Jake Odum is averaging 14.8 ppg through the first four games of the season, which ranks as the seventh-best total in the Missouri Valley Conference. Manny Arop has posted 6.3 rebounds per game and ranks 13th in the MVC.

- Lucas Eitel is 7-of-12 from 3-point range this season (58.3 percent), which ranks tied for fourth in the MVC and his 1.8 treys per game rates in a tie for ninth-best.

- Indiana State is now 3-0 on the season when holding teams to 63 points or less and improved to 29-1 when doing so under third-year head coach Greg Lansing.

- Indiana State has earned 38 close victories (five points or less) since 2005. Under Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 12-5 in close games.

The Indiana State Head Coach

Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing (South Dakota, 1990) is 41-30 (.577) overall in his third season as a head coach. He is 20-16 all-time in MVC games, including a 13-5 mark at home and a 7-11 record on the road. During his career, he is 23-7 in all home games, 11-18 on the road, 7-5 in neutral court contests and 12-5 in games decided by five points or less. Lansing is 0-0 all-time against High Point, and is 0-0 versus the Panthers inside Hulman Center. With the Trees, Lansing is 2-2 in overtime games and 29-1 when holding teams to 63 points or less. Sunday's game will be Greg Lansing's 72nd as Indiana State head coach. Lansing is the second head coach to lead the Sycamores to the NCAA Tournament in their rookie campaign in the history of the program, with the other being Bill Hodges leading ISU to a 33-1 record and a Final Four appearance in the 1979 NCAA Tournament. Lansing was just the 14th rookie head coach in the history of the MVC to lead his team to 20 victories during their debut season.

A Little History

Indiana State is currently in its 117th season of college basketball at the school. The Sycamores are 1,388-1,197 all-time on the hardwood. Indiana State's game at Oral Roberts in 2010 was the historic 2,500th game in the history of the program.

Jake Odum First 20 Point Scorer Of The Season

Jake Odum led the team and was one of three double digit scorers for the Sycamores as they earned a 68-48 road victory over Ball State on November 20. Odum became the first Sycamore to reach 20 points this season as he tallied 21 points (hitting 7-of-13 shots from the field, including a 3-pointer and was 6-of-8 from the free throw line) against the Cardinals. Manny Arop posted his first career double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds while RJ Mahurin reached double figures scoring for the third time this season with 13 points as he hit a trio of 3-pointers at Ball State.

Sycamores Win At Ball State For The First Time Since 1986

Indiana State won 68-48 at Ball State on November 20 to end an 11-game road losing skid to the Cardinals. It was their first victory in Muncie since 1986 and their first at Worthen Arena (which opened in 1991) in nine tries. The Sycamores earned their largest margin of victory over Ball State since 1977 and their largest road win against the Cardinals since 1919.

High Point Is Second Big South Opponent Of The Season For Indiana State

Indiana State is facing High Point for the first time on the hardwood, but are already 1-0 against the Big South Conference following a 66-55 home court victory over Winthrop on November 13. The Sycamores are 8-1 all-time against members of the Big South heading into Sunday's game.

Jake Odum Averages 16.0 ppg Over Two Game Homestand

Indiana State was led in scoring by Jake Odum in both of the home games last week against Winthrop and Truman State. He averaged 16.0 ppg, while hitting 8-of-11 (72.7 percent) from

the field, including one 3-pointer while making 15-of-16 (93.8 percent) attempts from the charity stripe. He added 2.5 rebounds per game with eight assists and four steals. Odum scored 15 points with five assists, two steals and a blocked shot in 29 minutes of action against Winthrop and then added a season-best 17 points on the strength of a 5-of-6 showing from the field and a 6-of-6 mark from the free throw line with four rebounds, three assists and two steals in 30 minutes of action against Truman State.

Sycamores Improve To 3-0 In Home Openers Under Greg Lansing; Perfect At Home In November

With the 66-55 home court victory over Winthrop on Tuesday, November 13, Indiana State improved to 3-0 in home opening games under third-year head coach Greg Lansing as well as a perfect 5-0 in November home games in the last three seasons.

Jake Odum In Top 10 At Indiana State For Steals, Moving Close In Assists

Indiana State junior Jake Odum has 129 career steals, which ranks him eighth all-time in the Sycamore basketball program, needing only four more to reach seventh place, currently held by David Moss (133 from 2002-06). The Sycamore career record is shared by Nate Green and Larry Bird with 240. Odum currently has 316 career assists, which currently ranks 12th all-time and needs 15 more to catch Greg Thomas (331 from 1989-93) to move into the Top 10.

Good Starter On The Battery

Indiana State improved to 3-0 this season when the Sycamore starters outscore their opponents with the 68-48 victory over Ball State. Under third-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 27-7 when the ISU starting five scores more than their opponent's counterparts.

63 Is The Magic Number

The Sycamores win by the score of 68-48 vs. Ball State on November 20 was ISU's third this season in which they held an opponent to 63 points or less and earned the victory. ISU finished the 2011-12 campaign with an 11-1 mark when holding an opponent under that total. Under third-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 29-1 when allowing less than 63 points to the opposition (including a 13-0 mark when holding teams to 53 or less).

Sycamore Success Inside Hulman Center Under Greg Lansing

The Sycamores are 23-7 (.767) inside Hulman Center under third-year head coach Greg Lansing. The Sycamores have won 14 of their last 18 home games. Additionally, the Sycamores have won 13 of their last 18 MVC games at home.

Sycamores Shoot Over 50 Percent Against Winthrop With Four Players In Double Figures Scoring

Indiana State hit 12-of-19 shots (63.2 percent) and finished the Winthrop game with a 21-of-37 mark from the field (56.8 percent) as they handed the Eagles their first loss of the season on November 13 at Hulman Center. Jake Odum was one of four players to reach double figures scoring as he posted 15 points on the strength of a 9-of-10 performance at the free throw line. Justin Gant reached double figures for the second consecutive game with his 14 point showing while Dawon Cummings hit a pair of crucial second half 3-pointers to score 11 and RJ Mahurin came off the bench to score 10. The Sycamores owned a 26-18 edge in points scored in the paint while ISU converted 12 Winthrop turnovers into 17 points.

Sycamores Help UCLA Open New Pauley Pavilion While Gant Scores First Points In Building

It was a historic night for the Indiana State basketball program on November 9 as the Sycamores were the road team in the opening of New Pauley Pavilion against No. 13 UCLA. Leg-

endary head coach John Wooden spent the 1946-47 and 1947-48 seasons as the head basketball coach at Indiana State before his 27-year run at the helm of the Bruin program. While both of coach Wooden's teams battled it out on the hardwood at New Pauley Pavilion, Sycamore sophomore Justin Gant scored the first points in the new building with a 3-pointer at the 17:11 mark of the first half.

Six Make Sycamore Debut At UCLA

The Sycamores game against UCLA marked the debut of six new Indiana State players on the roster for the 2012-13 campaign. Indiana State is returning just one starter from last season in junior guard Jake Odum. Freshman Khristian Smith led the newcomers with 11 points off the bench while starting forward Manny Arop tallied 10 points. Two Sycamores, Arop and Dawon Cummings made their Sycamore debuts in the starting lineup against UCLA while Devonte Brown, Rhett Smith, Brandon Burnett and Smith came off the bench in their first games in the Blue & White.

Sycamores In Postseason Play For Third Consecutive Season

With Indiana State's appearance in the 2012 CollegelInsider.com Postseason Tournament, the Sycamores have now made three consecutive trips to postseason play. ISU played in the 2010 College Basketball Invitational as well as the 2011 NCAA Tournament in addition to the CIT Tournament in 2012. The last time the Sycamores reached postseason play for three consecutive seasons came in 1977-79 when Indiana State played in the 1977 & 1978 NIT as well as the 1979 NCAA Tournament. The last time Indiana State hosted a postseason game came on March 10, 1978 when the Sycamores hosted Illinois State in the first round of the NIT.

Jake Odum Named To The Preseason All-Missouri Valley Team

Indiana State guard Jake Odum was one of five student-athletes named to the Preseason All-Missouri Valley Conference Team on October 29. Odum finished third in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 4.9 assists per game average. That mark was ranked 61st nationally. Odum recorded a career-high 12 assists against Fairfield as part of the Old Spice Classic, a number which ranked tied for fourth all-time at ISU in a single game. Odum is third in the MVC in steals per game with a 1.8 average, which ranks 81st nationally. Additionally, Odum's 4.5 assists per game average of his career is fifth-best in the history of the program while his 119 steals are ranked ninth-best in the Sycamore record books, while his 1.8 steals per game average ranks third.

Sycamores Picked To Finish 7th In Missouri Valley Conference Race

The Indiana State Sycamores were picked to finish seventh in the Missouri Valley Conference race according to a poll of league head coaches, sports information directors and a media panel. ISU finished eighth last season, with an 8-10 MVC record, just one game out of a large logjam for third place at 9-9.

Indiana State Posts Three Exhibition Victories In The Bahamas In August

Indiana State took advantage of the NCAA rule allowing teams to participate in a foreign tour of exhibition contests once every four years when they travelled to Nassau, Bahamas from August 12-14 and defeated the Giants 95-76, the Real Deal Shockers 116-75 and the PJ Stingers 76-55. Manny Arop scored 17 points to lead ISU against the Giants, while Dawon Cummings had 18 to pace the Sycamores against the Real Deal Shockers. The Sycamores were led in the final exhibition game of the tour by Lucas Eitel who scored 15 points versus the PJ Stingers.

Indiana State Reaches 17 Regular Season Victories For Third Consecutive Season; First Time Since Larry Bird Era

With its 59-46 victory over Missouri State on February 22, the Sycamores have now posted at least 17 regular season victories for the third consecutive season, which is the first time three Indiana State teams have reached that mark in succession since the 1976-77, 1977-78 & 1978-79 seasons. The Sycamores won 25 in 76-77, 19 in 77-78 and 26 in 78-79.

Triple-Double For Odum And Tournament Record To Boot

Jake Odum battled a foot injury while playing three games in four days at the 2011 Old Spice Classic. After two solid performances in the first two days of the event, Odum saved his best for last as he posted 10 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists against Fairfield on November 27. That triple-double was the first by a Sycamore since Larry Bird posted one in 1979 versus Drake and the first by a member of the MVC in 14 seasons. Additionally, the 12 assists are an Old Spice Classic single-game record. His 12 assists is the first double digit assist total in his career and the first by a Sycamore since Michael Menser had 11 against Wichita State in 2001.

Up Next

The Last Time Out ...

MUNCIE, Ind. -- Paced by a 21-point scoring performance by junior Jake Odum, Indiana State earned a 65-45 victory over Ball State in front of 3,128 fans inside Worthen Arena.

The Sycamores won for the third time in a row and moved to 3-1 on the season while the Cardinals were dealt their first defeat of the season and fell to 2-1. Indiana State won at Ball State for the first time in Worthen Arena as well as the first time in 11 tries dating back to 1986.

Odum hit 7-of-12 shots from the field and was 6-of-8 from the free throw line to lead the team with 21 points. Manny Arop recorded the first double-double of his Indiana State career as he scored 13 points and pulled down 11 rebounds while RJ Mahurin scored 13 points off the bench.

Odum added six assists and seven rebounds to his game-high 21 points.

The Sycamore offense was efficient and shot at a 45.7 percent clip for the game, but it was the defense that set the tone in the contest. Indiana State improved to 29-1 under head coach Greg Lansing when holding teams under 63 points, including a mark of 13-0 when limiting the opposition to under 53.

Ball State was held to just 16-of-50 shooting (32 percent) and only were able to connect on 1-of-10 from the free throw line. The Sycamores hit 21-of-46 (45.7 percent) from the field, including a season-best eight 3-pointers. The Sycamores got 27 points off the bench and forced 14 Cardinal turnovers and scored 12 points off of them.

Indiana State raced out to a quick 8-0 lead, led by a pair of Manny Arop free throws just 40 seconds into the game and continued with four points in a row by Odum and ended with a second chance lay-up from RJ Mahurin as the Sycamores owned an 8-0 advantage four minutes in.

Jawaia Scafe drilled a 3-pointer for Ball State's first points of the game, but Odum then found Khristian Smith for an alley-oop dunk with 14:03 on the clock to restore a 10-3 lead. Scafe would score again but Mahurin got the lead into double figures at the 12 minute mark of the first half with his two 3-pointers before the half to make it 15-5.

The Sycamore lead would volley between nine and 11 points until Odum hit another driving lay-up with 5:42 left before the break and Mahurin followed it up with a pair of free throws 30 seconds later to stretch the cushion out to 28-15.

Mahurin hit a triple and Arop added a jumper as the clock ticked towards one minute to go and both defenses held to send the Sycamores into the lockerroom with a 35-24 advantage.

Ball State scored first in the second half, but Odum converted a fast break lay-up and Arop drilled a 3-pointer with 16:40 on the clock to run the ISU advantage back out to 40-28. Devonte Brown answered three points in a row after two Odum free throws with a 3-pointer as the Sycamores moved ahead 45-31 with just over 14 minutes remaining.

The Cardinals cut the Sycamore lead down to 11 points yet again, but this time Lucas Eitel had the answer with a triple after Mahurin saved a loose ball and the lead ran out to 49-35 with 12:40 remaining. Cummings ended a dry spell for the Sycamores with a steal and break-away dunk to make it 51-37 with under 10 minutes to go.

The Sycamores allowed four points in a row as Ball State cut the lead down to 10 points, but Justin Gant hit 1-of-2 free throws and Kitchell took a nice feed in the paint from Odum with just over eight minutes left to run the advantage back out to 54-41. Arop would hit two more charity tosses with just over five minutes remaining as the Sycamore advantage hit 56-41 after he was fouled hauling in a long rebound.

Indiana State's run hit 8-0 when Odum hit a 3-pointer at the 4:25 mark to stretch the Sycamore lead out to 59-42. Brown hit 1-of-2 free throws after the final media timeout, and Mahurin hit another 3-pointer as the clock ticked under three minutes to go as the lead ballooned to 63-42.

Lucas Eitel hit a 3-pointer with 33 seconds left on the ISU's final offensive possession to seal the 68-48 victory.

Indiana State Head Basketball Coach Third Season

Greg Lansing is in his third season as the head basketball coach at Indiana State. He previously spent eight seasons with the program as an assistant coach, including the previous three as associate head coach.

Lansing burst onto the scene as a rookie head coach with the Sycamore basketball program in 2010-11 as he became just the second-ever Indiana State head coach to lead the team to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. He led the team to a 20-14 record, becoming just the 14th head coach in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference to lead a team to 20 or more victories in their first year at the helm.

In 2011-12, the Sycamores finished the year with an 18-15 record and advanced to the CollegelInsiders.com Postseason Tournament. It marked the third consecutive year the team has reached postseason play -- its longest such stretch since the 1977, 1978 and 1979 seasons when Larry Bird donned the Indiana State uniform.

Jake Odum was one of just four players nationally to average at least 10 points, five rebounds and 4.5 assists per game during his sophomore season and was a Second Team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection as well as Second Team All-District selection as announced by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

The Sycamores downed No. 25 nationally-ranked Vanderbilt on the road and finished third at the Old Spice Classic -- the best-ever finish by a MVC team in the event.

ISU reached the NCAA Tournament and took on Syracuse in Cleveland, Ohio based on the program's third-ever MVC Tournament Championship won at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis, Mo. ISU raced to the title with victories over No. 6 Evansville, No. 2 Wichita State and No. 1 Missouri State in the Championship Game as the Sycamores entered as the No. 3 seed in the tournament. Freshman Jake Odum was named to the MVC All-Tournament Team.

Odum was named a CollegelInsider.com Mid Major Freshman All-American and was named an All-MVC Honorable Mention selection as well as a member of the MVC All-Freshman, All-Newcomer and All-Defense Team. Carl Richard was also named to the All-MVC's Honorable Mention squad. ISU took two thrilling buzzer beating victories over league foes Missouri State and Creighton during the regular season at Hulman Center. The buzzer beater over Creighton by Richard was voted the No. 2 play of the weekend by ESPN's SportsCenter.

In 2009-10 the Sycamores overcame a ton of adversity to still put together its best season in nearly a decade under the professional leadership of the ISU coaching staff. Despite only having its full compliment of student-athletes for just 28 minutes of the rough and tumble Missouri Valley Conference slate, the Sycamores still recorded its first winning season since 2001 as they finished 17-15. ISU also finished the year with a 9-9 record in league play, bolstering the Sycamores out of the MVC Opening Round at the State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament by securing the league's No. 6 seed after

finishing in a tie for fifth in the standings.

Starting guard Jake Kelly suffered a season ending knee injury with 12 minutes left in the conference opener at Southern Illinois and subsequently also lost Dwayne Lathan and Harry Marshall for extended periods over the course of the year.

Marshall, who was the heart and sole of the team, led the MVC in scoring in league contests with a 16.0 ppg average. Marshall was tabbed Second Team All-MVC and was named to the MVC's All-Defensive Team after turning in shutdown performances against most of the league's all-conference opposition. Running a well-rounded program, the Sycamores also two representatives on the MVC's Scholar Athlete Team as both Jordan Printy and Aaron Carter took those plaudits.

The payoff for the Sycamores continued as ISU reached postseason play for the first since 2001 when they accepted a bid to the 2010 College Basketball Invitational, appearing in a road contest at Saint Louis.

With a keen attention to details that most coaches think of as an afterthought, the Sycamores concentrated on extreme efficiency on the court, finishing the year as the nation's second leading free throw shooting team. ISU's 76.9 percent mark at the line finished just behind NCAA qualifier BYU on the NCAA Division I list for the best free throw shooting teams in the country.

Additionally, the Sycamores overcame a 24-point deficit in the second half at Missouri State before falling in overtime. The 24-point comeback in front of a national television audience was the largest in the history of the MVC by a team that at least forced overtime.

During his second stint with the Sycamore basketball program, Lansing has been a key recruiting for many talented student-athletes. Lansing has also been a major part of the several all-conference accolades for several players, including Harry Marshall and Jay Tunnell, who took All-MVC honors following the 2008-09 campaign. Last season, the Sycamores concluded the regular season by winning six of their final games, including a trio of road contests.

Lansing returned to Indiana State after a seven year stint with the Iowa Hawkeyes. During Lansing's seven years as assistant coach at Iowa, the Hawkeyes went 135-92, received three NCAA Tournament invitations, three NIT appearances and won a pair of Big Ten tournament titles, the first of which came on four wins in four games making Iowa the first team in the Big Ten to ac-

complish such a feat. In 2005-06, Iowa earned a 25-9 record, the second-most wins in school history, the first undefeated (17-0) home record in the school's history and a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Iowa earned seven All-Big Ten selections, 17 Academic All-Big Ten selections and four Academic All-Americans. Lansing coached four of the last five Big Ten rebounding champions, three straight conference leaders in blocked shots and, the league's 2005-06 defensive player of the year. Three of his student-athletes reached the NBA and two from the 2005-06 team were invited to NBA camps.

In Lansing's final two seasons of his first stint at Indiana State, the Sycamores posted back-to-back winning campaigns for the first time since 1979 and 1980. When the Sycamores posted a 16-11 record in 1998 it marked the first winning season for Indiana State since 1980. Indiana State advanced to the NCAA Tournament in both 2000 and 2001.

Prior to joining the staff at Indiana State, Lansing was the head basketball coach at Roosevelt High School in Des Moines, Iowa. Roosevelt had not had a winning season in 12 years before Lansing's initial season. The Roughriders went on to have back-to-back winning seasons under Greg's direction.

Lansing earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of South Dakota in 1990 and a master's degree in counseling from USD in 1992. As a member of the Coyote basketball team Lansing helped South Dakota reach the NCAA Division II Tournament during his junior and senior seasons, the first NCAA invitation for USD since 1954. He was twice named the South Dakota Defensive Player of the Year. Greg is currently ranked among the leaders in career assists at USD. Following his playing career, Lansing served as a graduate assistant coach at South Dakota for two seasons. In 1992-93 he was a full-time assistant.

Greg's father, Dave Lansing, coached high school basketball for 33 years in Iowa. Dave Lansing was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Coaches Hall of Fame during the 1999 Iowa boys state basketball tournament. Lansing's dad, his mother, Diane, his sister, Angela, and his nephew, Jordan, live in West Des Moines. His brother, Steve, is the head basketball coach at Faribault High School (Minn.), where he was named Regional Coach of the Year in 2004. Lansing is married to the former Angie Menser, who is an Indiana State graduate and a former track and cross country academic All-American for the Sycamores. She currently serves as ISU's senior women's administrator and athletics business manager.

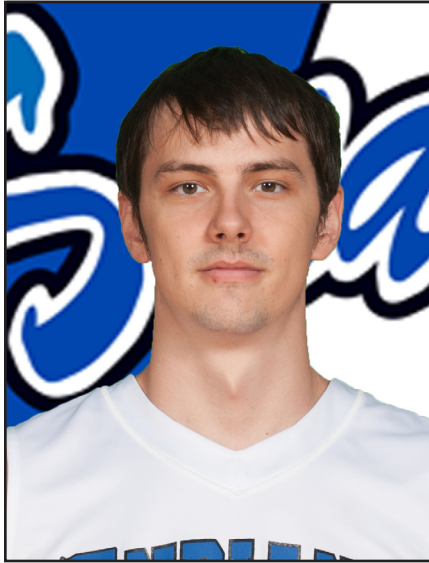
