## MEMORIAL STADIUM

Home for the Sycamore football program for the past 49 years is venerable Memorial Stadium, which is in its third year of being the home of Sycamore soccer as well.

The 12,764-seat structure has stood at the corner of Wabash and Brown Avenues in Terre Haute, Ind., since its original construction in 1924. The facility was acquired by Indiana State University in 1967.

The Sycamores have competed in football at Memorial Stadium since the 1967 campaign and the women's soccer program began using the facility in 2009.

The stadium, through constant upkeep, is in excellent condition through the years. Its latest additions are a state-of-the-art FieldTurf artificial surface, installed prior to the 2018 season as well as brand new locker room facilities for the football and women's soccer programs.

The press box also received a major overhaul with a newly designed president's and athletic director's entertainment area, as well as upgraded amenities for the media.

Despite receiving the new FieldTurf, Memorial Stadium is not new to synthetic surfaces, as the stadium and Indiana State University claim

distinction as the world's first university to make outdoor application of Astroturf. Following the University's acquisition of the stadium, Indiana State opened the 1967 season with a 41-6 win over Eastern Illinois in the first game played on the new surface.

Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the public for the first time on May 5, 1925, as the local minor league baseball team, the Terre Haute Tots, played the Peoria Tractors before an estimated crowd of 9,000. Among the honored guests were Major League Baseball Commissioner Judge Kennesaw Mountain Landis and Charles Barnard of the Cleveland Indians.

The first use of the playing field was in the fall of 1924, when Wiley and Garfield High Schools played their traditional Thanksgiving Day game.

Original construction of Memorial Stadium began in 1922, at a cost of \$450,000. Upon the University gaining control in 1967, a three-part renovation project was started which included: the reorientation of the playing field from a north-south direction to its present east-west configuration; the installation of Astroturf; and the construction of some 4,500 bleacher seats on the north side of the field as well as the rebuilding of seats on the south side. The original arch still remains from the original structure. However, the bleacher seats,

installed in 1967, were removed in the summer of 1996 and replaced by a landscaped hill which serves as a general admission section and a site for pregame tailgating for Sycamore fans.

Memorial Stadium features a single-level press box which can accommodate over 50 people for a Sycamore football contest. The press box houses the ISU Stat Crew, presidential box, broadcast locations for visiting and home radio as well as live television, home and visiting coaches booths as well the stadium's public address and scoreboard operation rooms.

The centerpiece of the ISU press box is a 20-seat media work area which features two levels of spacious accommodations for those media covering Sycamore football.

The ISU fieldhouse is the location of the ISU coaches' meeting room and locker room, as well as equipment storage, the home and visiting locker rooms and the ISU Athletic Training facility.

Former Indiana State head coach Dennis Raetz utilized Memorial Stadium well. His Sycamore teams posted a 67-30-1 mark for a .689 winning percentage in 18 seasons at Memorial Stadium. Under the lights, Raetz's teams compiled a 34-4-1 mark for an .885 winning percentage.





## SPORTS PERFORMANCE CENTER

Indiana State Sports Performance program is an integral part of each student-athlete's development. The goals and expectations of the program are to promote team unity, student-athlete education, competition and discipline. The Sports Performance staff is committed to providing an environment that continually improves individual athletic performance and produces winners.

### SPORT PERFORMANCE FACILITY

The Indiana State Sports Performance Program is conducted in a state-of-the-art 10,000 square foot facility located in the Health and Human Performance Building. The Sport Performance facility was completed in August 2017. It features seven double sided power racks, seven half racks with cable pulley systems on the back side, fourteen in-laid platforms made with ISU logos, and a three tiered dumbbell rack with iron grip dumbbells featuring the Sycamore logos. The facility also has six water powered rowers, three sprint treadmills, over thirty medicine balls and a variety of rack and cable attachments that allow for a variety of training to take place.

### SYCAMORE FUELING STATION & NUTRITION CENTER

The Sycamore Fueling Station & Nutrition Center was completed in 2017 as a part of the Sport Performance Facility renovation. The bar features a Gatorade fueling station, six top of the line Vitamix blenders, three large refrigerators and a fully stocked pantry. All of this allows Sycamore athletes to fuel and recover their bodies after tough training sessions.







# SHERARD CLINKSCALES

**DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS  
THIRD YEAR**

Now in his third year as the Director of Athletics at Indiana State University is Sherard Clinkscales.

From the moment it was announced that he would take the helm of Sycamore Athletics, Clinkscales has brought a "Bound and Determined" philosophy to the department.

Clinkscales in year one helped secure the future of the Sycamores with the development and introduction of the department's first-ever comprehensive strategic plan. The strategic plan focuses on four different areas which will bring success to the department over the next five years: Operational Excellence, Student-Athlete Success, Win Championships and Build Revenue. Additionally, Clinkscales has overseen the redevelopment of the Athletics Mission Statement – its first revision in over 20 years.

Another first for Sycamore Athletics under the direction of Clinkscales is the introduction of Elevate – The Campaign For Sycamore Athletics. Elevate is the first-ever athletics only fundraising campaign in the history of Indiana State University. It is a two-year campaign that will look to raise funds for the renovation of the Sports Performance Center and Nutrition Station, addition of the Sycamore Fuel Initiative (meals for student-athletes), redesign and renovation of the Sycamore Football Coaches Offices and Players Lounge as well as the introduction of an Interactive Track & Field Display at the coaches' offices and indoor training center. Additionally, through the support of the university, new lights have been added to Memorial Stadium and a brand new state of the art Field Turf playing surface was installed during the spring of 2018. The brand new John McNichols Training Track has been installed at the ISU Athletics Annex and is ready to host winter workouts for the Track & Field program. As Elevate hits the halfway mark in the summer of 2018, so far the campaign has raised nearly \$400,000 to support our student-athletes.

On July 1, 2017 Indiana State Athletics entered into his first-ever department-wide apparel deal with Under Armour. This announcement puts Sycamore student-athletes in the same gear used by many Power 5 schools and professional athletes. In conjunction with this partnership, Sycamore Athletics adopted the "March On" mantra which helped unify the Indiana State message across different platforms. In May of 2017, Sycamore Athletics introduced a brand new toolkit with a standard athletics font and refreshed Indiana State Athletics logo. The new Under Armour deal as well as the toolkit will provide for new updated uniforms for most Sycamore teams and affords Sycamore fans the chance to purchase new gear at the games and online at GoSycamores.com.

The Sycamores Coaches Caravans made trips through the state of Indiana in both 2016 and 2017. Beginning in 2016 with a single stop in Indianapolis, the 2017 caravans made stops in Evansville, Indianapolis, Griffith and Terre Haute. These events gave Sycamore fans the chance to meet and greet with our coaches and hear about exciting additions coming to the programs during the upcoming season. In 2018, the annual kickoff party will be held in Terre Haute while raising funds for local charities.

Six new head coaches have been welcomed into Sycamore Athletics headlined by the introduction of head football coach Curt Mallory during January of 2017. Also new to the program are women's soccer head coach Julie Hanley who led the program to the MVC Tournament semifinals in 2016, Track and Field head coach Angie Martin who took four qualifiers to the NCAA Outdoor Championships





in 2017, Volleyball head coach Lindsay Allman who is the daughter of former Sycamore Football All-American John Allman plus Mike Perniciaro who was named the Sycamore Softball head coach after previous stints at Power 5 schools and Wichita State. The latest addition is Vicki Hall, who was selected in March of 2018 to lead the Sycamore women's basketball program after a successful career as a professional athlete and collegiate assistant coach. Hall is a native of Indianapolis and was named the 1988 Indiana Miss Basketball.

Other internal changes that have been introduced include a reorganization of athletics staff responsibilities to better align work assignments with abilities as well as Clinkscales and his administrative team have announced concrete expectations of themselves and the coaching staff. The goal for the department is to be in top 100 nationally of the Learfield Director's Cup standings. Working towards that goal, the Sycamores enjoyed a No. 4 ranking in the 2017-18 Missouri Valley Conference All Sports Trophy -- its highest finish since the 2013-14 academic year.

A new department-wide software program has been introduced to enhance NCAA Compliance initiatives which will streamline information to all staff members. Under Clinkscales the Sycamore Athletics department hosted the first-ever Samy's in April of 2017 inside Hulman Center. The event is a modern take on a traditional athletics banquet, similar to a televised awards show which highlighted student-athletes' successes across the board. The event returned for a second time in March of 2018.

Under the direction of Clinkscales, the Sycamores enjoyed one of the best years academically in the history of the program thanks in part to the addition of a Student Athlete Success Coach in 2017-18. Brooke Porter serves in that role which helps ensure academic success for Sycamore student-athletes and prepares them for life after college. The new program is geared toward not only assuring success now but building a foundation for continued success in the future. Additionally, all 15 Sycamore sports programs continued their unblemished record by exceeded expectations in the NCAA Academic Progress Report (APR).

On the court, the Sycamores enjoyed success as the volleyball program won their first-ever MVC Tournament contest on Thanksgiving 2017. The Sycamore men's cross country team tied for first place at the annual championship and the men's basketball team achieved a historic 21-point season opening victory over Indiana in November of 2017. Overall, the department finished fourth in the MVC All Sports Trophy.

Clinkscales came to Indiana State from North Carolina State where he most recently served as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Student Services and Sport Administration. Clinkscales joined NC State in July 2011 as an Associate Director of Athletics and was quickly promoted in January of 2012. While with the Wolfpack, he worked for legendary athletics administrator Debbie Yow. He provided oversight to multiple administrative units and sports at NC State, including strength and conditioning, sports medicine, nutrition, housing, and student services. He also served as the departmental liaison to the Academic Support Program for Student Athletes (ASPSA) and supervised baseball, wrestling, volleyball, as well as the men and women's soccer programs. He was also a member of the Athletics Cabinet and participated in financial and capital deliberations. Clinkscales served as Vice Chair for the ACC Wrestling Committee as well.

Clinkscales was selected following a national search, chaired by Diann McKee, Indiana State University Senior Vice President for Finance and Administration/University Treasurer.

He served as the chair of the NCAA Committee on Sportsmanship and Ethical Conduct for two years. In the summer of 2013, Clinkscales attended the prestigious DIA Athletics Directors' Association Athletic Directors' Institute, a "by invitation only" gathering of the most talented intercollegiate professionals.

Clinkscales is a graduate of Purdue University with a B.A. in history and came to NC State after working two years for the NCAA at its main headquarters in Indianapolis, Ind. With the NCAA, he served as an assistant director of championships. In addition, he was chosen to serve on a number of internal committees.

He drafted and presented sport-specific legislation to the NCAA Championship Cabinets and Management Council, and also led the NCAA's Division III branding initiative throughout all championships.

As Assistant Director of Championships, Clinkscales had direct oversight over seven different championships, including men's and women's soccer, women's lacrosse, national collegiate rifle and men's hockey. He directed a staff of 35, and was charged with leading the individual sports committees during tournament selections, building relationships with external constituencies and creating revenue opportunities around championships while managing a budget of roughly \$500,000.

Clinkscales came to administration after a long and distinguished career as an athlete, coach and scout in college and professional baseball. A first-round draft pick of the Kansas City Royals, he played three seasons in the Royals minor league organization before injuries derailed his playing career.

Clinkscales parlayed his connections into a position with the Atlanta Braves as an area scouting supervisor (1997-99). He later was the Tampa Bay Devil Rays assistant director of scouting (1999-2001) and returned to the Braves as an area scouting supervisor (2001-05) before being promoted to the position of Professional Scout.

He left the professional ranks in 2006 and served as an assistant baseball coach at Notre Dame from 2006-09, where he was the pitching coach and assisted in recruiting.

While at Purdue, Clinkscales did walk on and play for Gene Keady's 1989-90 basketball team, which finished as Big Ten runner-up. His teammate and roommate on the road was Matt Painter, now head coach of the Boilermakers.

Clinkscales is the cofounder of After Sport Group, an organization that conducts on-campus career workshops for student-athletes.

In 2016, he completed his master's degree in parks, recreation and tourism with a concentration in sports management at North Carolina State.

Clinkscales and his wife Monica reside in Terre Haute. She completed her undergraduate studies at MVC rival, Drake University, and earned professional and graduate degrees from the University of Iowa (juris doctor) and Tulane University (master of business administration).

Clinkscales has two children, a son Alex, and a daughter Tara. His son Alex is a rising junior at North Carolina Wesleyan University where he is a member of the school's basketball team. Tara enters Carnegie Mellon University in the fall of 2018 to pursue a degree in Music Theater.

# CURT MALLORY

**HEAD COACH  
THIRD SEASON  
MICHIGAN (1992)**

After being named the 21st head coach in the history of Indiana State on Jan. 23, 2017, Mallory enters his third season at the helm of the program in 2019.

"Curt Mallory is a grinder who has coaching in his DNA," Director of Athletics Sherard Clinkscles said. "His dedication to developing young men into leaders on the field and in life has been a core piece of his coaching philosophy throughout his career. He will raise the competitive bar and hold all accountable to that end. He is the right person at the right time to lead this program into becoming a nationally recognized school. I am excited to welcome Curt, his wife, Lori, and his three children into the Sycamore family."

Mallory, a 22-year veteran as an assistant coach in the college ranks, is part of one of the more prominent football families in the United States, as he is the son of Indiana University's all-time winningest head coach Bill Mallory, who coached the Hoosiers from 1984-96. Bill Mallory was also the head coach at Miami of Ohio (1969-73), Colorado (1974-78) and Northern Illinois (1980-83) over an illustrious 27-year coaching career. Mallory also has two brothers in the NFL coaching ranks: Doug, the defensive backs coach for the Atlanta Falcons, and Mike, a special teams coach with the Jacksonville Jaguars.

"I'm extremely excited to be coming back home to the state of Indiana to become part of the Indiana State University family," Mallory said. "I would like to thank President Dan Bradley, Sherard Clinkscles and the whole administration at Indiana State for this great honor. This University and the city of Terre Haute are very intriguing to me as a coach, as there is a lot of potential to build a strong football program here. Most of all, it feels amazing to be back in this great state again and work alongside all the wonderful people I know throughout the state."

In Mallory's first season in Terre Haute, the Sycamores finished 0-11 overall and 0-8 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference with seven games coming against nationally ranked foes. He coached five All-MVFC players in 2017 including linebacker Jonas Griffith and tight end Jacquet McClendon who were tabbed to the Second Team while running back LeMonte Booker, punter Thomas Bouldin and linebacker Katrell Moss were named Honorable Mention.

Mallory and his staff then went on to mount the biggest turnaround in collegiate football in 2018 after leading the Sycamores to a 7-4 finish, a third-place finish in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and a No. 22 national ranking. The Sycamores closed out the season winning five-straight games, including three on the road to make push for the postseason. Entering the season, ISU was tabbed to finish last in the MVFC with just one voter not picking the Sycamores to finish last.

With the turnaround, Mallory became the just the second head coach in program history to earn MVFC Coach of the Year honors. He was named a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson award, which honors the National Coach of the Year. Mallory was tabbed the FCS Coach of the Year by Phil Steele.

In year two Mallory coached 10 All-MVFC honorees including the League's Newcomer of the Year in quarterback Ryan Boyle. Running back Ja'Quan Keys and linebacker Jonas Griffith were tabbed with First Team All-MVFC honors. Boyle, center Wyatt Wozniak, linebacker Katrell Moss, defensive back Rondell Green and place kicker Jerry Nunez earned Second Team accolades. The Sycamores also claimed three Honorable Mention selections in offensive linemen Isaiah Edwards and Tate Leavitt to go along with wide receiver Dante Hendrix.



Indiana State saw five players named to the MVFC Newcomer Team after the Sycamores put four on the offensive side of the ball led by quarterback Ryan Boyle. Redshirt freshman wide receiver Dante Hendrix also earned the honor while a pair of offensive linemen in Isaiah Edwards and Tate Leavitt rounded out the offensive honors for the Trees. First-year safety Denzel Bonner picked up the honor for the Sycamores on the defensive side of the ball.

Prior to coming to Indiana State, Mallory was the pass coordinator and secondary coach under former North Dakota State head coach Craig Bohl at the University of Wyoming in 2015 and 2016. There, Mallory mentored 2016 Thorpe Award semifinalist Andrew Wingard, who was a First-Team All-Conference honoree as a sophomore. The previous year in 2015, Mallory helped Wingard and Marcus Epps to nods as Honorable Mention All-Americans.

Mallory spent the previous four seasons at his alma mater, the University of Michigan, as a secondary coach under Brady Hoke. There, he worked with several superb defenses, including the seventh-best in the FBS his final year in 2014 that only allowed 311.3 YPG. That same year, Michigan ranked 15th in rushing defense (117.7 YPG), tied for 19th in passing defense (193.7 YPG) and 27th in scoring defense (22.4 PPG).

The Wolverine secondary also finished top-15 in the nation in pass defense in both 2011 and 2012. The 2011 defense was an especially impressive feat that first season, as they jumped from 107th in scoring defense in 2010 to sixth nationally in 2011.

In Ann Arbor, Mallory had the opportunity to coach current Jacksonville Jaguars safety Jarrod Wilson, as well as help recruit and coach 2016 Heisman Trophy finalist and projected top 2017 NFL Draft pick Jabrill Peppers during his freshman season in 2014.

Mallory was the defensive coordinator at Akron for the 2010 season, and before that he spent five successful seasons at the University of Illinois from 2005-09 under head coach Ron Zook (now the special teams coordinator of the Green Bay Packers). Mallory's first two seasons in 2005 and 2006 were spent as the secondary coach, and his final three years he



was promoted to co-defensive coordinator.

At Illinois, Mallory was instrumental in one of the best teams in Illini history in the 2007 Rose Bowl team. That year, Mallory's Illini defense held opponents to under 20 points per game en route to a 9-4 finish. Illinois also ranked second in the Big Ten in passing defense (182.2 YPG) in 2006 and led the Big Ten in sacks and tackles for loss in 2008. Mallory's 2006 secondary only allowed 11 passing touchdowns and 6.5 yards per pass attempt all season.

At Illinois, Mallory's prized pupil was All-American Vontae Davis, who was a two-time Thorpe Award semifinalist and a 2009 First-Round NFL Draft Pick of the Miami Dolphins. Davis has been a two-time Pro Bowl selection during his NFL career and has been a member of the Indianapolis Colts since 2012.

Other notable pupils at Illinois include current Detroit Lions safety Tavon Wilson, a 2012 Second Round pick of the New England Patriots and a member of New England's Super Bowl XLIX champion team, and Jeremy "J" Leman, a 2007 All-American linebacker for the Illini Rose Bowl team and current Big Ten Network color analyst.

Mallory spent the previous three seasons at Indiana as a secondary coach from 2002-04, which was preceded by one year as the secondary coach at Central Michigan in 2001 and six seasons at Ball State from 1995-2000 in charge of both the linebackers and secondary. Mallory was on staff for Ball State's 1996 team that went to the Las Vegas Bowl.

His coaching career began as a student assistant at Michigan in 1992, followed by two years as a graduate assistant under his father at Indiana in 1993-94.

Mallory was a four-year player at the University of Michigan from 1988-91 under legendary head coach Bo Schembechler his first two seasons, followed by Gary Moeller his last two. Mallory was on four Wolverine teams that won a Big Ten title, including three teams that went to a Rose Bowl. His freshman season in 1988 he was on a Rose Bowl champion team that finished the season ranked No. 4 nationally after defeating USC. Mallory capped off his Wolverine career with an interception in Michigan's 35-3 win over Ole Miss in the 1991 Gator Bowl. Longtime Michigan head coach Lloyd Carr, who led the Wolverines to a national title in 1997, was Mallory's defensive coordinator during his playing career.

Mallory earned his bachelor's in sport management and communication from the University of Michigan in 1992, and he finished his master's in outdoor recreation at Indiana University in 1999. Mallory and his wife, Lori, have three children: sons James and Sam, and a daughter, Margo.

# MARK SMITH

**ASSISTANT HEAD COACH - DEFENSIVE LINE**  
**THIRD SEASON**  
**PURDUE (1979)**

Mark Smith returned to his longtime home of Terre Haute to be head coach Curt Mallory's assistant head coach and defensive line coach prior to the 2017 season.

Under Smith, senior defensive tackle Rex Mosley earned Preseason All-Missouri Valley Football Conference accolades in 2018 and went on to finish his career as one of the most consistent run stoppers on the defensive line.

Smith was a prominent defensive coach for the Sycamores from 1988-2002, working as the special teams coordinator, defensive line and inside linebackers coach before two seasons as the defensive coordinator in 2001 and 2002. Smith was also an assistant coach at Rose-Hulman in 1986-87 before moving across town to Indiana State, where he helped guide the Engineers to a 1986 conference title.

Prior to coming to Terre Haute to coach at Rose-Hulman and Indiana State, Smith was an assistant coach at Bowling Green from 1982-85. Smith was on two staffs that took the Falcons to conference titles and California Bowl trips in 1982 and 1985.

During his career at Indiana State, Smith coached several defensive units that gained national acclaim while coaching 14 all-conference players and six All-Americans – including NFL Draft pick Dan Brandenburg, who played in 42 games in three seasons with the Buffalo Bills from 1997-99.

Smith left Indiana State in 2003 to join Brady Hoke's staff at Ball State, starting a relationship that would carry him on his next two stops. At Ball State, Smith was the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2003-08. In 2008, the Cardinals were nationally ranked and went 12-1 overall, ending with a trip to the 2008 GMAC Bowl. That season, Smith's defense ranked 29th nationally in scoring defense, 28th in tackles for loss and 38th in opposing pass efficiency. That same year, Smith helped mentor MAC Freshman of the Year, Sean Baker.

Ball State also went to the 2007 International Bowl with Smith on staff.

Smith followed Hoke out to San Diego State in 2009 and 2010, eventually taking the Aztecs to the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl.

From there, Smith was brought on with Hoke at Michigan from 2011-14, where he was the Wolverines' linebackers coach from 2011-13 and the defensive line coach in 2014. In Ann Arbor, Smith was part of three Michigan teams that went to bowl games in 2011 (Sugar Bowl), 2012 (Outback Bowl) and 2013 (Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl).

In 2011, Smith's group helped the Wolverines to an 11-2 record and a Sugar Bowl victory. U-M's defense ranked second in the Big Ten and sixth in the FBS in scoring defense, surrendering only 17.4 points per game. The Wolverines defense also ranked third in the conference in rushing defense (131.7 yards per game), fourth in total yards per game (322.2) and fifth in passing defense (190.5 ypg). The linebackers also contributed to a conference best 29 turnovers forced and FBS-best 20 fumbles recovered.



The 2012 group was led by All-Big Ten second team linebacker Jake Ryan's 88 tackles, 16.0 stops for loss, 4.5 sacks and four forced fumbles, while Kenny Demens had 82 tackles, including six tackles for loss and Morgan had 81 stops, 5.5 for loss. The linebacking corps in 2012 helped U-M limit opponents to 19.8 points per game, fourth in the Big Ten and 20th nationally, and 320.0 total yards per game, second in the conference and 13th in the country.

Smith's unit produced two of the Wolverines' top three leading tacklers in 2013 in James Ross III (85 tackles) and Desmond Morgan (79 tackles) and the team's top three tackles leaders in 2012.

Smith's 2014 season was highlighted by second-round NFL Draft pick defensive end Frank Clark, who posted 42 tackles, 13.5 TFL, 4.5 sacks, two PBU and a fumble recovery during his final year.

Smith has spent the last two seasons in 2015 and 2016 at Division II Florida Tech, where he served as the associate head coach and defensive line coach both years and the defensive coordinator in 2016.

Smith began his coaching career at Defiance High School in Ohio after graduating from Purdue with a bachelor's in 1979 and a master's from Bowling Green in 1983. Smith and his wife, Kim, have three children: Heather, Eric and Craig. Smith's son Craig will serve on Indiana State's staff as the director of operations and the video coordinator.





# MICHAEL SWITZER

**OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR - OFFENSIVE LINE**  
**SECOND SEASON**  
**BALL STATE (2010)**

Michael Switzer joined the Sycamore Football program in February 2018 as the teams' offensive line coach. Following the season Switzer was elevated to offensive coordinator while continuing to work with the offensive line.

"Coach Switzer has tremendous leadership qualities and that is obviously something we want emphasize to our whole offensive unit," Mallory said. "His enthusiasm for the game is infectious and I know he'll keep our offense going in the direction it needs to go to win in the Missouri Valley Football Conference."

As an offense, Indiana State improved dramatically over the course of a year, finishing the season ranked 14th in the nation with 241.5 rushing yards per game. Overall, the Sycamores finished the year with 2,656 yards rushing in 2018 after rushing for just 1,185 yards in 2017 prior to Switzer's arrival.

Consistency was key up front with all five offensive linemen starting each of ISU's 11 games in 2018, including three linemen who were named All-MVFC in Wyatt Wozniak, Isaiah Edwards and Tate Leavitt. The Sycamores had three players (Ja'Quan Keys, Ryan Boyle and Titus McCoy) surpass the 500-yard rushing mark led by First Team All-MVFC running back Ja'Quan Keys who finished fourth in total yards (948) in the MVFC at the conclusion of the regular season after missing the final four games of the year due to injury.

In 2017, Switzer served as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for the Blue Streaks. In this time, John Carroll ranked fourth in touchdowns per season with 45. Switzer also helped lead John Carroll to 22 rushing touchdowns which ranked second in the OAC. Switzer also coached OL Drew Turner to first team All-OAC and RB Ro Golphin to second team All-OAC.

Prior to John Carroll, Switzer spent three seasons working with the University of Michigan Football team. He spent the 2015-16 season working as an offensive analyst specifically with the offensive line and assisting with the tight ends.

During the 2014 season he was a graduate assistant working directly with the Offensive Lineman.

Prior to joining Michigan, Switzer served one season as an offensive graduate assistant at Eastern Michigan working with the Offensive Line in 2013.

In 2011, Switzer spent time with the Buffalo Bills in the National Football League as an undrafted free-agent offensive lineman.

Switzer was a four-year letterman and four-year starter on the offensive line at Ball State (2007-10). He started all 51 career games for the Cardinals, where he helped block for an offense which tallied a school record 5,972 yards of total offense in 2008 when the team went 12-1 under head coach Brady Hoke.

Switzer earned his bachelor's degree in general studies from Ball State.

He attended Lawrence North High School, where he earned all-conference honors and was a finalist for Mr. Football Offensive Lineman of the Year as a senior.







# BRAD WILSON

**DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR - LINEBACKERS**  
**THIRD SEASON**  
**ASHLAND (2007)**

Brad Wilson joined Coach Mallory's staff in 2017 as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach for the Sycamores following five seasons as the defensive coordinator at Wayne State from 2012-16.

In his first season at Indiana State he saw two defensive players named All-MVFC including linebackers Jonas Griffith who earned named Second Team and Katrell Moss who garnered Honorable Mention honors.

Wilson led a much improved Sycamore defense in 2018 which allowed 16.9 fewer points than 2017, one of the best improvements in the entire FCS.

Three defensive players were named to the 2018 MVFC All-Conference team, including linebackers Jonas Griffith (First Team) and Katrell Moss (Second Team), and cornerback Rondell Green (Second team). Griffith also led the country in solo tackles with 81 and ranked fifth nationally in total tackles. Griffith earned three All-American honors in 2018; the first Sycamore to do so in nearly 10 seasons. He was named a Third Team All-American by STATS FCS All-American, Second team All-American by Hero Sports and Third Team All-American by Phil Steele.

Senior safety Jamal Jones ranked fifth nationally in fumbles recovered and cornerback Kaelub Newman ranked 16th nationally in forced fumbles. As a team, Indiana State ranked in the top-20 nationally in fumbles recovered and 10th nationally in turnover margin.

In 2015, he helped mentor two Second Team All-GLIAC performers in Jamiil Williams and Zak Bielecki, along with one Academic All-GLIAC honoree (James Hendrix). The WSU defense finished 44th nationally in first downs defense allowing just 197 throughout the season.

In addition, Bielecki was selected as the squad's Defensive Most Valuable Player, while Williams received the Ron Solack "35" Award for wearing his uniform with unmatched pride and playing the game with enthusiasm.

In 2014, two of his players earned All-Region accolades as Bielecki was a Daktronics Second Team All-Region honoree, while Gerren DuHart was a Beyond Sports Network Second Team All-Region selection prior to being named to the USA Football All-America Second Team. Bielecki tied for first in the GLIAC and was ninth nationally in solo tackles per game (6.6), while also earning Academic All-GLIAC honors. DuHart was a First Team All-GLIAC honoree while Bielecki was named to the All-GLIAC Honorable Mention Team.

As a unit, the 2014 Warrior defense led the GLIAC in both tackles for loss (9.3) and sacks (2.91) per game, which ranked eighth and 22nd nationally, respectively. WSU finished 38th in Division II in total defense allowing 338.5 yards per game.



In 2013, five of his student-athletes received Academic All-GLIAC honors (Zak Bielecki, Kevin Buford-Wilson, James Hendrix, Austin Nelson and Mike Sawchuk) with redshirt freshman Valorian Cunningham being voted the Warriors Defensive Rookie of the Year by his teammates. His contingent totaled seven interceptions, 17 pass break-ups and six tackles for loss. His defense ranked 35th nationally allowing just 197.5 passing yards per game.

Four of his student-athletes received Academic All-GLIAC accolades (Zak Bielecki, Kevin Buford-Wilson, Austin Nelson and Mike Sawchuk) for the 2012 season with another, Gerren DuHart, being voted First Team All-GLIAC as well as Second Team All-Super Region 4. In addition, the Warriors ranked ninth nationally in pass defense allowing just 165 yards per game through the air. His defensive back corps recorded 15 pass break-ups and four interceptions during the 2012 campaign. In addition, redshirt freshman Jamiil Williams was voted WSU's Defensive Rookie of the Year.

Prior to Wayne State, Wilson spent the previous four seasons (2008-2011) as the secondary coach at Ashland University. A 2007 AU graduate with a degree in education, Wilson also spent two seasons (2005-2006) as a student assistant coach with the Eagles. In that role he worked with the defensive backs, tutoring the cornerbacks and helping to break down film.

He began his coaching career at his high school alma mater (Shelby) from 2002-04, where he was the special teams coordinator and at various times coached the outside linebackers, defensive backs and wide receivers.

Wilson was on the staff at Bowling Green for one year (2007) as the defensive graduate assistant coach with the Falcons.

He and his wife, Amber, have two sons, Brady and Logan.





# KEVIN ABRAMS

**SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR - RECRUITING COORDINATOR**  
**THIRD SEASON**  
**ILLINOIS (2013)**

Kevin Abrams joined the Sycamore coaching staff in 2017 as the Special Teams Coordinator and Recruiting Coordinator.

The Indiana State Special Teams unit ranked second in the MVFC and 30th nationally in punt return average in 2018. Place Kicker Jerry Nunez finished the season ranked fourth in the conference and 32nd national in scoring and was named Second Team All-MVFC for the second time in his career. Freshman punt returner Dakota Caton was tabbed a First Team Freshman All-American returner by HERO Sports in 2018.

The 2019 recruiting class features four transfers including three Junior College and one FBS player joining the program. Of the 18 players in the 2019 class, nine hail from Indiana or Illinois, and 16 are from the Midwest. With local recruiting efforts being emphasized, the Sycamore roster now features 44 players from the state of Indiana and 62 total players between Illinois and Indiana.

In his first year with the program, Abrams coached Thomas Bouldin to Honorable Mention All-MVFC honors at punter. Bouldin had 72 punts on the season for 3,050 total yards and averaged 42.4 yards per punt. Bouldin had 16 punts of 50 or more yards and pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line, 23 times. As a senior, Bouldin also booted an ISU and MVFC record 90-yard punt against Southern Illinois.

Prior to his time at Indiana State, Abrams was a two-year graduate assistant at Vanderbilt University from 2015-16 with the offense and special teams, earning his master's in higher education administration in the process. He also spent the 2014 season as a GA at Buffalo, working with the offense and defense.

Abrams completed his bachelor's in finance at University of Illinois, where he was a student assistant with the football program for his entire undergraduate career from 2009-12. There, he worked primarily with the Special Teams and worked alongside current ISU head coach Curt Mallory.

A native of St. Louis, Mo., Abrams earned varsity letters in football and track at John Burroughs School.



# JOE HASTINGS

**PASS GAME COORDINATOR - WIDE RECEIVERS**

Joe Hastings joined the Sycamore football staff in February 2018 as the teams wide receivers coach. He added the title of pass game coordinator prior to the 2019 season.

In 2018, Hastings coached four receivers with over 200 receiving yards, and the number of receiving touchdowns by wide receivers doubled from 2017. Redshirt Freshman Dante Hendrix was part of the Missouri Valley Football All-Conference Team, All-Newcomer Team, and was named to Phil Steele's Freshman All-American Team.

Hastings completed his third season with Michigan in 2017 as the team's wide receivers coach and offensive assistant. He was responsible for receiver scouting reports, film breakdown, in-game substitutions, position group recruiting and practice drills.

He spent his first two seasons in Ann Arbor as a defensive graduate assistant coach for the Wolverines, working with the defensive line. Hastings spent the 2014 season as a pro personnel assistant for the Philadelphia Eagles.

Hastings played in the NFL for three seasons (2011-13) as a wide receiver for the San Francisco 49ers and Miami Dolphins and the UFL for one season with the Sacramento Lions.

Hastings was an All-American and four-year Letterman at wide receiver for Washburn University (2005-10). He appeared in 34 games, collecting 119 receptions for 2,033 yards and 17 touchdowns. He set Washburn's all-time single season catch record with 87 in 2010 to go along with 1,546 yards. His 15 receiving touchdowns in 2010 also placed him second in single season touchdowns at Washburn. Hastings finished his career sixth all-time in career receiving yards, ninth all-time in receptions and seventh in career receiving touchdowns.

Hastings earned his bachelor's in marketing and finance from Washburn and his master's in sports administration at Michigan.

Hastings, a native of Wichita, Kan., resides with his wife, Jenna in Terre Haute.





# DEON BROOMFIELD

**CORNERBACKS  
THIRD SEASON  
IOWA STATE (2014)**

Former Iowa State standout Deon Broomfield joined Indiana State as the Sycamores' cornerbacks coach in 2017.

Under Broomfield, cornerback Rondell Green was named to the Missouri Valley Football All-Conference Second Team in 2018 and Kaelub Newman ranked second in the MVFC and ninth nationally with three forced fumbles in his first season at Indiana State.

Broomfield's cornerback duo of Green and Anthony Tucker both finished top-10 in the MVFC in passes defended in 2017 while Green and Newman ranked in the top-10 in passes defended and forced fumble in the League a year later in 2018.

Broomfield was already acquainted with the Missouri Valley Football Conference after spending the 2016 season at Western Illinois as the cornerbacks coach for the Leathernecks. At WIU, Broomfield was on a Leatherneck staff that upset FBS opponent Northern Illinois, along the way mentoring two true freshmen Mike Viti and Daron Wheeler, who both started at least four games.

He worked at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wis., during the 2015 season in charge of the safeties. In May of 2014, Broomfield signed a contract with the Buffalo Bills as an undrafted free agent. He spent the regular season on the practice squad and eventually signed a futures contract in December 2014.

Broomfield was a standout safety during his collegiate career at Iowa State. He played in all 50 games from 2010-13, starting 18 times. He recorded 133 career tackles, 16 pass break-ups, forced four fumbles and three interceptions. He came up with key stops late in the game to help the Cyclones record a win over West Virginia and No. 2 Oklahoma State.

A native of Palm Bay, Florida, Broomfield earned his bachelor's degree from ISU in liberal studies with an emphasis in family and child services.



# TYLER FUNK

Tyler Funk, joined the Indiana State coaching staff prior to the 2017 season as the tight ends coach.

Under Funk's leadership, tight end Zach Larkin was named to the Missouri Valley Football Conference All-Academic team in 2018.

In his first season coaching the tight ends, he helped Jacquet McClendon to Second Team All-MVFC honors.

McClendon was the Indiana State leader in receptions with 54 for a total of 595 yards. He finished the regular season fourth in the MVFC in receptions, averaging 11.0 yards per catch and 54.1 yards receiving per game. McClendon had a team high four receiving touchdowns, including a 73-yard receiving touchdown against Youngstown State.

Funk comes to Terre Haute following two seasons as Mount Union's defensive line coach.

Funk was a two-year member of the football team at Colorado Mesa before working as an intern at Colorado State – then under current Florida head coach Jim McElwain.

Indiana State head football coach Curt Mallory announced the addition of Marcus Knight to the Sycamore Football staff in January of 2019. Knight will serve as the running backs coach.

Knight played at Michigan, helping the Wolverines to the national championship in 1997 and a victory in the 1998 Rose Bowl. He played with the Oakland Raiders in the NFL from 2001-02 and played in Super Bowl XXXVII and had playing stints in the Arena Football League and in NFL Europe.

Knight joined the Central Michigan football staff as the wide receivers coach prior to the 2017 season, and he led a standout group of veterans who excelled in the Chippewas' no-huddle uptempo offense.

Knight's receiving corps, led by the likes of Corey Willis and Mark Chapman, amassed 3,324 yards and caught 27 touchdown passes as the Chippewas finished 8-5 and earned a berth in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in 2017.

Both Chapman and Willis closed standout careers at their respective peaks: Willis caught 45 passes for 669 yards and nine TDs, and Chapman finished with 59 receptions for 875 yards and five scores. In April, Chapman was selected by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats with the No. 1 overall pick in the CFL draft.

The Chippewa passing game averaged 255.7 yards per game in 2017, ranking fourth in the MAC.

Prior to his time with Central Michigan, Knight served as the wide receivers coach, the passing game coordinator, and the recruiting coordinator at Northern Michigan. He spent four seasons as an assistant at Valparaiso before moving on to Northern Michigan. He broke into coaching at Grenada (Calif.) High School.

Not only has Knight won a national title in college and played in a Super Bowl, he also played in the Arena Bowl and as a high school senior helped lead B.B. Comer High School to a state-title game.

Knight was a four-year letter winner at Michigan and was named All-Big Ten Second team in 1999, leading the Wolverines in yards per catch (20.4). When he left the program, he ranked 13th in career receptions (88) and 11th in career receiving yards (1,508).

He earned a bachelor's degree from Michigan and his master's in sports administration from Valparaiso.

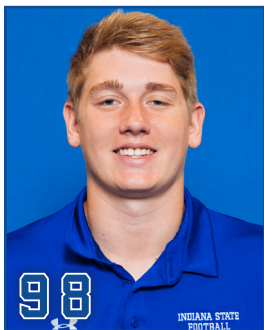

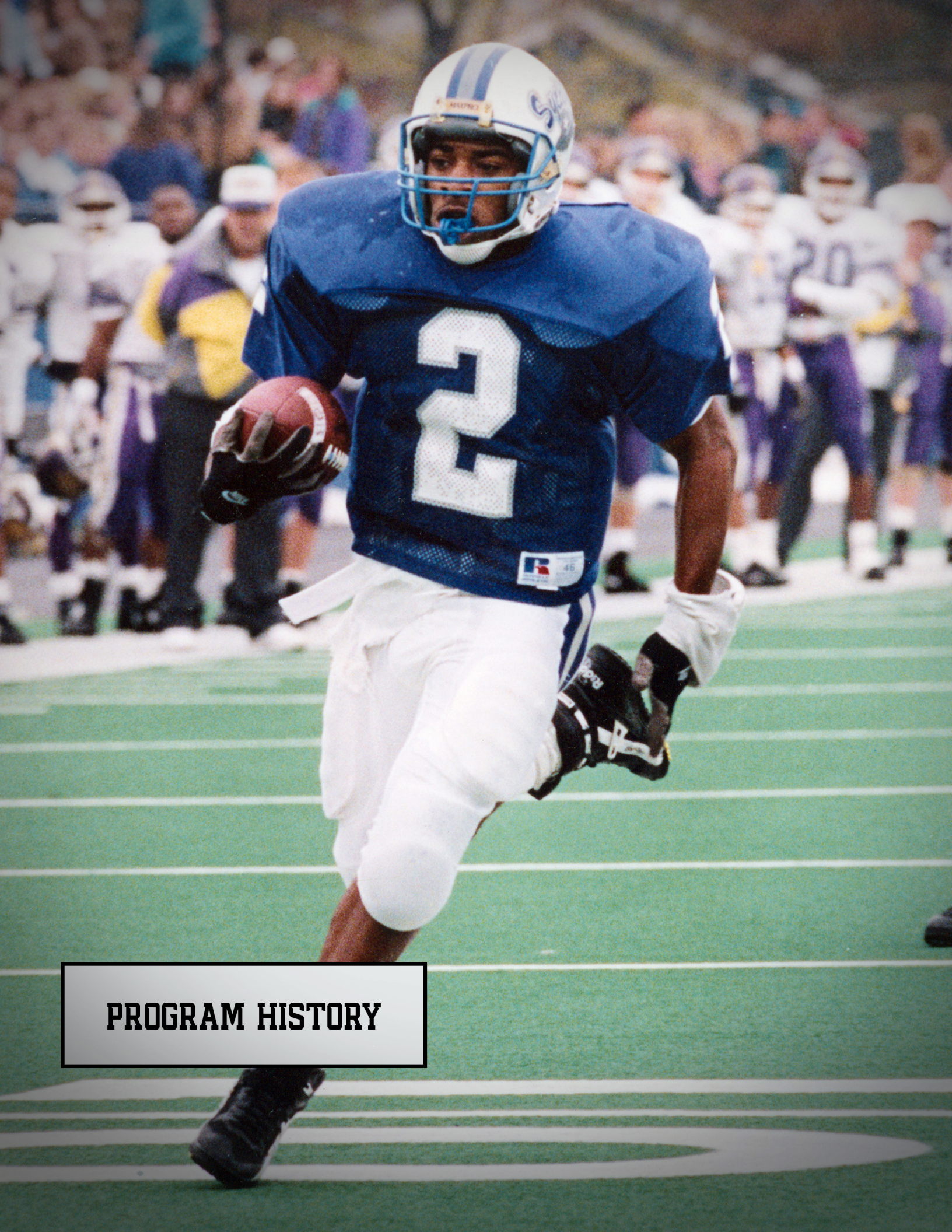
