MATCHUP AT A GLANCE

*Indiana State continues MVFC play this weekend traveling to No. 4/5 South Dakota State as the Sycamores take on their fifth Top-10 FCS opponent of the 2025 season.

*The Sycamores last made the trip to Brookings, S.D. in the 2022 season, falling to the Jackrabbits, 49-7.

*The Sycamores are in the midst of one of the toughest stretches of the 2025 season facing ranked opponents in seven of their last eight games of the regular season.

*Indiana State is 0-5 in the 2025 season against ranked FCS opponents on the season falling at both No. 5 Montana (63-20), No. 9 Southern Illinois (55-27), and No. 8 North Dakota (46-17), while falling at home to No. 23 South Dakota (19-14) and No. 1 North Dakota State (38-7).

*The Sycamores continue their road stretch with their third-longest trip of the 2025 season spanning a combined 1,529 miles to and from Brookings.

*Indiana State sits 11th in FCS in blocked kicks with three on the year following B.J. Wuest's blocked punt and touchdown return this past weekend at North Dakota.

No. 1/1 Jackrabbits top Sycamores in MVFC play, 49-7

BROOKINGS, S.D. - No. 1/1 South Dakota State scored touchdowns in each of their seven offensive drives to top visiting Indiana State on Saturday afternoon, 49-7.

The Sycamores were unable to limit the Jackrabbits balanced offensive attack on the day as SDSU posted 409 total offensive yards (247 passing, 162 rushing) in the game.

Indiana State's offensive and special teams unit provided some excitement in the first half with Harry Van Dyne providing an acrobatic 25-yard touchdown reception, while Geoffrey Brown rumbled for 29 yards on a fake punt. SDSU was able to keep control of the game with two late touchdowns in the first half including a three yard pass from Mark Gronowski to Mike Morgan with 0:03 remaining in the opening period to keep the Jackrabbits firmly in command.

The Jackrabbits added touchdowns on each of their first two offensive drives in the second half to cap the scoring on the day. Indiana State had chances late but a goal-line stand from the SDSU defense kept the Sycamores off the scoreboard in closing out the game.

Cade Chambers went 11-of-24 through the air for 114 yards and a touchdown to lead the Sycamore offense before a targeting call took the Sycamore quarterback out of the game in the third quarter. Gavin Screws closed out the game going 2-of-8 for 40 yards as the Sycamores targeted eight different receivers in the loss.

Dante Hendrix led ISU's receiving efforts in the game with a team-high four receptions for 41 yards. Harry Van Dyne made it back-to-back games with a receiving score on his way to finishing with three catches for 39 yards in the loss. Justin Dinka was ISU's leader in the backfield with 16 carries for 52 yards

Rylan Cole led the Sycamores' defensive efforts with a team-high seven tackles (five solo), while Michael Lufile added six stops (four solo) on the afternoon. Casey Miller and Tony Roberts both added tackles for loss.

Blackwell added 14 tackles and two pass breakups, while Kaleal Davis posted 11 tackles in the win.

ELIJAH OWENS

Elijah Owens' first season at the helm of the Indiana State offense was one for the ages in Sycamore history as the Jacksonville, Ill. native set new offensive marks in 2024. Owens set the Indiana State record for most rushing yards (598) and rushing touchdowns (8) by a quarterback, while adding a 68.8% completion percentage through the air, good for eighth overall in the FCS.

Owens was highly decorated in the postseason earning three nods on Freshman All-American teams including the FCS Football Central, Stats Perform FCS, and Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American postseason squads. He wrapped up the postseason accolades finishing ninth overall in the Jerry Rice Award voting, the highest finish in program history for the award that recognizes the top freshman players in the FCS.

Owens looks to break in the Indiana State offense this upcoming season as the rising redshirt sophomore takes the reins under new offensive coordinator John Bear. Bear's system at Bucknell led to new marks for the Bison offense setting 28 school and individual records during his time with the quarterback room setting new marks in game, season, and career passing yards, touchdowns, completion percentage, and completions.

Plez Lawrence knows all about big games and the redshirt junior running back is back to take the reins on an Indiana State rushing attack that averaged 149.9 yards per game over the course of the 2024 season. Lawrence made a splash in his first collegiate start with the Sycamores against Murray State in 2023 carrying the ball a career-high 29 times for 203 rushing yards, while adding touchdown runs of two, 29, and 31 yards throughout the contest.

Plez Lawrence scored three second-half touchdowns in helping Indiana State take the season-opening win over McKendree on Thursday night. Lawrence scored two touchdowns (17-yard rushing, 75-yard receiving) in a decisive third quarter 21-0 swing against the Bearcats to give Indiana State a 34-12 lead. He added his final touchdown in the closing minute of the game with a four-yard rushing score to secure the 41-24 win. The redshirt junior running back finished with a career-high 225 total offensive yards (133 rushing, 92 receiving). His three touchdowns were the most by an Indiana State player since he recorded three scores back in 2023 against Murray State.

MVFC Newcomer of the Week - Larry Stephens - Sept. 8
Larry Stephens III hauled in a game-high five passes for 67 yards and his first touchdown in the Sycamore Blue & White against Eastern Illinois. The redshirt senior found himself wide-open for the four-yard score in the second quarter to make it a 14-0 lead. He added a 23-yard reception on a pass from Rashad Rochelle to set up a Sycamore touchdown in the second quarter.

Cracking the 200-yard Mark
Indiana State's Nick Osho became the second Sycamore running back on the current roster to break the 200-yard rushing mark when the Burnaby, British Columbia, Canada native went for 211 yards on 28 carries and two touchdowns against Southern Illinois on October 4 in Carbondale, Ill. Osho broke loose with touchdown runs of 39 and 66 yards against the Salukis in recording Indiana State's 20th 200-yard rushing effort in program history.

Running back Nick Osho scored multiple rushing touchdowns in back-to-back games after scoring twice at both Montana and Southern Illinois. He currently leads the Sycamores with six rushing touchdowns through the first five games of the season, failing to score against only Indiana on the season.

He had touchdown runs of 55 and 79 yards against Montana on Sept. 20, while adding scores of 39 and 66 yards against Southern Illinois on Oct. 4. He became the first Sycamore to score multiple rushing touchdowns in back-to-back games since Ja'Quan Keys achieved the feat twice in the 2018 season, including a three-game stretch over Oct. 6-20 against South Dakota State, Missouri State, and Southern Illinois.

Possessing The Ball
Indiana State's Saturday afternoon contest against South Dakota featured one of the largest disparities in time of possession in program history as the Sycamores held onto the ball for just 14:39 in the 2025 Homecoming Game against the Yotes. USD recorded 45:21 in time of possession in the October 11 game in Memorial Stadium, holding the 77-42 edge in total plays and 23-8 advantage in first downs.

Saturday's game marked Indiana State's first game with under 20 minutes of possession in a game since October 18, 2014, when the Sycamores took on then No. 1 North Dakota State in Fargo, N.D. NDSU held onto the ball for 41:12 in the game, limiting Indiana State to just 18:48 in possession, 53 offensive plays, and 12 first downs in the Bison's 34-17 win.

KIMAL CLARK

The Third Team All-American has found a new home this year as Kimal Clark is set to patrol the Indiana State defensive backfield in the 2025 season. The Lackawanna, N.Y. native is the reigning Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Year after setting Central Connecticut State recorded in tackles (117), while adding three pass breakups.

Clark looks to lead an Indiana State defense that lost its top six tackling leaders, including the 17th member of the Sycamores' 300-tackle club, Geoffrey Brown. Clark is set to join with MVFC All-Newcomer selection Jorge Valdes to provide a powerful 1-2 punch in the Sycamore secondary.

Clark recorded five double-digit tackling efforts in the 2024 season on his way to finishing 16th in FCS in solo tackles (5.1) and 26th overall in total tackles (9.0) per game. He recorded a career-high 18-tackle game against Massachusetts, while adding 13 stops in games against both Fordham and Robert Morris.

Clark is set to be one of the leaders in the new-look defense under first-year defensive coordinator David Elson and joins Dallas Westhoff, Lucas McAllister, Valdes, and Braxton Sampson among the top Sycamores hitting the field in 2025.

Big Plays Galore

Indiana State's offense broke loose for a trio of 50-plus yard touchdowns in their last contest back on September 20 at Montana. It marked the first time the Sycamores had achieved the feat in the Curt Mallory era as Rashad Rochelle hauled in a 51-yard touchdown reception from Keegan Patterson, while Nick Osho broke loose with fourth-quarter touchdown runs of 55 yards and 79 yards amidst a career-high 134-yard rushing effort.

Prior to Montana, the Sycamores last game with at least a 50-plus yard rushing touchdown and a 50-plus yard receiving touchdown came in the 2024 season finale at Northern Iowa. Kevin Barnett hauled in a deflected Elijah Owens pass for a 73 yard touchdown reception, while Shen Butler-Lawson broke loose for a 68-yard touchdown run in the Sycamores' 41-34 loss to the Panthers.

Rochelle Finds the Open Field
Indiana State wide receiver and return specialist Rashad Rochelle returns to the field for his senior season as the Springfield, Ill. native was one of the most dangerous return threats in the FCS over the 2024 season. Rochelle finished eighth in the NCAA in combined kick return yards (751) and 28th in kick return yard average (23.7), while posting 107.08 all-purpose yards per game.

Rochelle, a former Rutgers transfer, broke through as Indiana State's top receiving threat over the 2024 season finishing with a team-high 58 catches for 527 yards and four touchdowns in his first season with the Sycamores. He highlighted his inaugural season at Indiana State with three games with at least eight receptions, including a season-high 10 catches for 105 yards and a touchdown against Illinois State. He added eight catches against both Murray State and Southern Illinois, while adding a season-long 63-yard reception against Missouri State.

Getting Funk-y With It
Offensive Line Coach Darrell Funk returns to the Indiana State sidelines for the second time over his coaching career after taking over the reins of assistant head coach, run game coordinator, and offensive line in January 2025. Funk coached at Indiana State in 2017 as the offensive line coach and is a 35-year veteran of the coaching ranks, including 10 seasons as a coordinator. Funk has coached offensive line for 27 seasons, including overseeing the offensive fronts at schools like Michigan, Purdue, San Diego State, Colorado State and Ball State in addition to BYU.

In his last stint at Indiana State, Funk served as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator in 2017. His line helped pave the way for All-Missouri Valley Conference honorable mention running back LeMonte Booker, who rushed for 941 yards. His son, Tyler Funk, previously served on the Indiana State coaching staff as the tight ends and offensive line

coach, while also serving as Indiana State's recruiting coordinator.

New Coordinators Grin and "Bear" It
John Bear joined the Indiana State coaching staff as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in January 2025. The long-time coordinator made previous stops at Bucknell, Southeastern, Georgetown, University of Chicago, North Park, Akron, Emory & Henry, and Liberty over his coaching career prior to joining the Sycamores.

Bear's recent stint at Bucknell over the 2023 and 2024 seasons featured the program's best overall record and most Patriot League wins (4-2) since the 2014 season. Overall, the offense set 28 school and individual records during his time with the quarterback room setting new marks in game, season, and career passing yards, touchdowns, completion percentage, and completions.

David Elson took over the calling duties following the departure of former defensive coordinator Brad Wilson (LB, South Florida). Elson joins the Sycamores following two seasons at Wake Forest after serving the Demon Deacons as a defensive analyst. He came to Indiana State with 31 years of coaching at the collegiate level. Elson had served as the defensive coordinator at a number of stops during his coaching career including: Western Illinois, Southern Illinois, New Mexico State and WKU.

Elson's recent defensive coordinator stints include spending the 2020 season as the defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach at Marion University in Indianapolis. Prior to his lone season at Marion, Elson spent three years (2017-19) at Ball State as the Cardinals' defensive coordinator. BSU led the Mid-American Conference in interceptions (15) and turnovers gained (24) during his final season in Muncie. Both stats cracked the top 15 nationally.

Owens-Rochelle Connection
Elijah Owens and Rashad Rochelle are back to being teammates for the second consecutive season following a storied rivalry during their times at both Jacksonville High School (Owens) and Springfield High School (Rochelle). The duo lined up on opposite sidelines as the pair of All-State quarterbacks combined to throw for nearly 15,000 yards and 200 touchdowns over their prep careers.

Linebacker Legacy
Dallas Westhoff looks to build off the linebacker legacy that has surrounded Indiana State over the last decade with the inclusion of Katrell Moss, Jonas Griffith, and most recently, Garret Ollendieck and Geoffrey Brown. Westhoff will be given the first crack at the middle of the Indiana State defense that is going to see an overhaul with just four players returning with extensive playing time in 2024.

The Cedar Falls, Iowa native showed flashes of brilliance on the field following Ollendieck's mid-season injury highlighted by a career-high 12-tackle, 1.0-sack game at Missouri State, while adding three tackles and one sack against Purdue. He looks to take the reins of the defense in their first year under new defensive coordinator David Elson.

2025 INDIANA STATE FOOTBALL

All-American Status

Kimal Clark was honored by the national media ahead of the upcoming 2025 season as the Central Connecticut State transfer was honored on the Stats Perform FCS Preseason All-American Team (Third Team). Clark becomes the second Sycamore defensive player to be recognized on a preseason All-American squad in as many years and third since 2020 joining Garret Ollendieck (2024 Stats Perform) and Inoke Moala (2020 Phil Steele) to achieve the feat.

The Lackawanna, N.Y. native was a Third Team All-American and was a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist this past season with the Blue Devils. The Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Year recorded 117 total tackles, including a season-high 18 tackles against UMass, among his five double-digit tackling efforts on the year. He finished 16th in the FCS in solo tackles (5.1) and 26th overall in total tackles (9.0) per game.

Patrolling the Secondary

Joining Clark in the Indiana State defensive backfield includes the return of rising sophomore safety Jorge Valdes. The 2024 MVFC All-Newcomer selection took over a starting role in the Indiana State defensive backfield early in the season on his way to finishing among the Sycamore leaders in multiple defensive categories. The Fort Wayne, Ind. native tied for the team lead with two interceptions, while finishing sixth in the MVFC in passes defended with eight on the year.

Valdes highlighted his season with a 90-yard pick-six early in the season that sparked Indiana State's defensive efforts in the 24-13 win over Dayton. He added a season-high seven tackles and his second interception of the year against Youngstown State.

Getting It Done in the Classroom

Indiana State football hit the books and got it done over the 2024-25 academic year as the Sycamores posted a 3.266 cumulative team GPA. The mark was second in the Missouri Valley Football Conference this past season and behind just reigning GPA leader North Dakota. The Sycamores' team's prowess in the classroom continues to stand out both on and off the field with five Indiana State players named to the MVFC All-Academic Team, including Garret Ollendieck, Maddix Blackwell, Ethan Chambers, Braxton Sampson, and Jack Sherman.

Punter from Down Under

Harry Traum is the undisputed Indiana State punting leader heading into the 2025 season as the Adelaide, Australia native hits the field for this fourth season in the Sycamore Blue & White. Traum led the Sycamores with a 40.1 YPK average over the course of the 2024 season while adding holder duties.

Traum, an Aussie-style punter, has utilized both traditional and Australian-style punts over his collegiate career. He enters his third season playing traditional American football after stepping foot on campus in 2022 having not caught a snap from center before.

Traum recorded career-highs in 73 punts for 2,931 yards, including a career-long 67-yard punt against Dayton last season, while adding 31 fair catches and 22 balls downed inside the 20 yard line.

Traum was also the Indiana State holder on field goals and extra point attempts.

Vincent Allen Jersey Retirement

Former Indiana State University football player Vincent Allen had his No. 26 jersey retired in a pregame ceremony prior to kickoff against Eastern Illinois. The Sycamore running back was the first Indiana State player to be recognized with the accolade.

Allen gained over a thousand rushing yards in each of his four seasons at Indiana State from 1973-77, finishing up his playing career with a school-record 832 carries for 4,335 yards. He holds the Indiana State record for most 100-yard career rushing games (26) and most consecutive 100-yard rushing games (14), while adding the most career touchdowns scored (33) for the Sycamores.

NINTH SEASON AT INDIANA STATE

NINTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH

After being named the 21st head coach in the history of Indiana State on Jan. 23, 2017, Mallory enters his ninth season at the helm of the program in 2025.

Mallory, a 22-year veteran as an assistant coach in the college ranks, is part of one of the more prominent football families in the United States, as he is the son of Indiana University's all-time winningest head coach Bill Mallory, who coached the Hoosiers from 1984-96. Bill Mallory was also the head coach at Miami of Ohio (1969-73), Colorado (1974-78) and Northern Illinois (1980-83) over an illustrious 27-year coaching career. Mallory also has two brothers in the NFL coaching ranks: Doug, the defensive backs coach for the Atlanta Falcons, and Mike, a special teams coach with the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Mallory and his staff mounted the biggest turnaround in collegiate football in 2018 after leading the Sycamores to a 7-4 finish, a third-place finish in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and a No. 22 national ranking. The Sycamores closed out the season winning five-straight games, including three on the road to make push for the postseason. Entering the season, ISU was tabbed to finish last in the MVFC with just one voter not picking the Sycamores to finish last. With the turnaround, Mallory became the just the second head coach in program history to earn MVFC Coach of the Year honors. He was named a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson award, which honors the National Coach of the Year. Mallory was tabbed the FCS Coach of the Year by Phil Steele.

In year two Mallory coached 10 All-MVFC honorees including the League's Newcomer of the Year in quarterback Ryan Boyle. Running back Ja'Quan Keys and linebacker Jonas Griffith were tabbed with First Team All-MVFC honors. Boyle, center Wyatt Wozniak, linebacker Katrell Moss, defensive back Rondell Green and place kicker Jerry Nunez earned Second Team accolades. The Sycamores also claimed three Honorable Mention selections in offensive linemen Isaiah Edwards and Tate Leavitt to go along with wide receiver Dante Hendrix. Indiana State saw five players named to the MVFC Newcomer Team after the Sycamores put four on the offensive side of the ball led by quarterback Ryan Boyle. Redshirt freshman wide receiver Dante Hendrix also earned the honor while a pair of offensive linemen in Isaiah Edwards and Tate Leavitt rounded out the offensive honors for the Trees. First-year safety Denzel Bonner picked up the honor for the Sycamores on the defensive side of the ball.

Mallory's 2019 team finished 5-7 after several key pieces were lost due to injuries including Preseason MVFC Quarterback Ryan Boyle, who was injured in the fourth game of the season. Mallory led his team to a 3-5 in the MVFC including back-to-back wins over Youngstown State and Missouri State to end the season. Wide receiver Dante Hendrix, linebacker Jonas Griffith and return specialist Dakota Caton earned First Team All-MVFC honors while fullback Dominique Dafney, center Wyatt Wozniak and place kicker Jerry Nunez earned Second Team accolades. The Sycamores also claimed three Honorable Mention selections as linebacker Clayton Glasco, defensive lineman Inoke Moala and safety Michael Thomas were recognized.

The Sycamores were back on the field in 2021 after enduring a COVID-shutdown for the entirety of the 2020 season. Indiana State topped Eastern Illinois in their first game back on the field and followed up with wins at Eastern Kentucky, at home against both Western Illinois and Youngstown State, before wrapping up the year with a road win at Illinois State. ISU went 5-6 in its first campaign back in action with a 3-5 mark in MVFC play. Accolades continues to come in for the Sycamores as defensive end Inoke Moala recorded First Team All-Conference honors after sitting among the MVFC leaders in sacks and tackles for loss. Dante Hendrix (WR), JJ Henderson (DB), and Wyatt Harwood (LS) were all honored on the Honorable Mention squad.

The Sycamores battled through one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2022 with four of the preseason top-six ranked teams in the country on the slate. ISU had plenty of bright spots throughout the year including the MVFC Freshman of the Year (Cade Chambers), while six Sycamores earned All-Conference accolades. ISU was further honored by Rylan Cole earning Sophomore All-American status by HERO Sports.

Another tough slate awaited the Sycamores in 2023 as Indiana State faced off against eight ranked teams over the course of the regular season, while adding two games against FBS opponents. The Sycamores had five players named to the MVFC All-Conference team with both Garrett Ollendieck and Maddix Blackwell eclipsing the 100-tackle mark over the course of the season.

Prior to coming to Indiana State, Mallory was the pass coordinator and secondary coach under former North Dakota State head coach Craig Bohl at the University of Wyoming in 2015 and 2016. There, Mallory mentored 2016 Thorpe Award semifinalist Andrew Wingard, who was a First-Team All-Conference honoree as a sophomore. The previous year in 2015, Mallory helped Wingard and Marcus Epps to nods as Honorable Mention All-Americans.

Mallory spent the previous four seasons at his alma mater, the University of Michigan, as a secondary coach under Brady Hoke. There, he worked with several superb defenses, including the seventh best in the FBS his final year in 2014 that only allowed 311.3 YPG. That same year, Michigan ranked 15th in rushing defense (117.7 YPG), tied for 19th in passing defense (193.7 YPG) and 27th in scoring defense (22.4 PPG).

The Wolverine secondary also finished top-15 in the nation in pass defense in both 2011 and 2012. The 2011 defense was an especially impressive feat that first season, as they jumped from 107th in scoring defense in 2010 to sixth nationally in 2011. In Ann Arbor, Mallory had the opportunity to coach current Jacksonville Jaguars safety Jarrod Wilson, as well as help recruit and coach 2016 Heisman Trophy finalist and projected top 2017 NFL Draft pick Jabrill Peppers during his freshman season in 2014.

Mallory was the defensive coordinator at Akron for the 2010 season, and before that he spent five successful seasons at the University of Illinois from 2005-09 under head coach Ron Zook (now the special teams coordinator of the Green Bay Packers). Mallory's first two seasons in 2005 and 2006 were spent as the secondary coach, and his final three years he was promoted to co-defensive coordinator.

At Illinois, Mallory was instrumental in one of the best teams in Illini history in the 2007 Rose Bowl team. That year, Mallory's Illini defense held opponents to under 20 points per game en route to a 9-4 finish. Illinois also ranked second in the Big Ten in passing defense (182.2 YPG) in 2006 and led the Big Ten in sacks and tackles for loss in 2008. Mallory's 2006 secondary only allowed 11 passing touchdowns and 6.5 yards per pass attempt all season. At Illinois, Mallory's prized pupil was All-American Vontae Davis, who was a two-time Thorpe Award semifinalist and a 2009 First-Round NFL Draft Pick of the Miami Dolphins. Davis has been a two-time Pro Bowl selection during his NFL career and has been a member of the Indianapolis Colts since 2012.

Other notable pupils at Illinois include current Detroit Lions safety Tavon Wilson, a 2012 Second Round pick of the New England Patriots and a member of New England's Super Bowl XLIX champion team, and Jeremy "J" Leman, a 2007 All-American linebacker for the Illini Rose Bowl team and current Big Ten Network color analyst.

Mallory spent three seasons at Indiana as a secondary coach from 2002-04, which was preceded by one year as the secondary coach at Central Michigan in 2001 and six seasons at Ball State from 1995-2000 in charge of both the linebackers and secondary. Mallory was on staff for Ball State's 1996 team that went to the Las Vegas Bowl. His coaching career began as a student assistant at Michigan in 1992, followed by two years as a graduate assistant under his father at Indiana in 1993-94.

Mallory was a four-year player at the University of Michigan from 1988-91 under legendary head coach Bo Schembechler his first two seasons, followed by Gary Moeller his last two. Mallory was on four Wolverine teams that won a Big Ten title, including three teams that went to a Rose Bowl. His freshman season in 1988 he was on a Rose Bowl champion team that finished the season ranked No. 4 nationally after defeating USC. Mallory capped off his Wolverine career with an interception in Michigan's 35-3 win over Ole Miss in the 1991 Gator Bowl. Longtime Michigan head coach Lloyd Carr, who led the Wolverines to a national title in 1997, was Mallory's defensive coordinator during his playing career.

Mallory earned his bachelor's in sport management and communication from the University of Michigan in 1992, and he finished his master's in outdoor recreation at Indiana University in 1999. Mallory and his wife, Lori, have three children: sons James and Sam, and a daughter, Margo.

Sycamores downed by Boilermakers in 2024 season opener

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. – Purdue scored touchdowns on three of their first four possessions and added two more to start the second half as Indiana State fell in the 2024 season opener at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sunday afternoon, 49-0.

Garret Ollendieck and Maddix Blackwell both finished with double-digit tackles for Indiana State (0-1) as the Sycamore defense kept the game within striking distance over the first 30 minutes of the contest. Purdue (1-0) quarterback Husdon Card went 24-of-25 through the air for 273 yards and four touchdowns, the final coming midway through the third quarter to seal the season-opening win for the home team.

Ollendieck finished with a game-high 14 tackles (13 solo) and added a tackle-for-loss and jumped on a Maddix Blackwell forced fumble for a recovery in the first quarter to highlight a standout game for the preseason All-American. Blackwell added 10 tackles to go with the forced fumble, while Geoffrey Brown and Dallas Westhoff both had sacks to highlight the Indiana State defense in the loss.

Indiana State nearly put points on the board as the momentum appeared to shift late in the first half after the Sycamore defense forced a Purdue punt. Quarterback Elijah Owens escaped the pocket for a 20-yard carry down to the Purdue 26-yard line with 22 seconds remaining. After Owens was unable to connected with Rashad Rochelle on a pass in the end zone, the Sycamores rushed to the center of the field to set up a field goal attempt. However, the attempt sailed left and kept the 21-0 Purdue lead intact at the break.

Owens finished 5-of-10 through the air for 50 yards targeting four different receivers throughout the contest. The redshirt freshman quarterback added a team-high 47 rushing yards on nine carries. Rochelle hauled in three catches for 26 yards in his first game in the Sycamore Blue & White, while Matt Ross and Zavion Taylor added catches in the game.

Plez Lawrence (12 carries, 27 yards) and Shen Butler-Lawson (11 carries, 23 yards) did the majority of the work in the backfield for Indiana State as the Sycamores posted 43 carries for 104 rushing yards in the game.

Sycamores fall to No. 19/22 Indiana in Friday night showdown

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. - No. 19/22 Indiana seized control of Friday night's game early utilizing a strong offense and stifling defensive effort to top visiting Indiana State, 73-0, inside Memorial Stadium.

The Sycamores (2-1) were unable to gather momentum throughout the contest as Indiana State was limited to 77 yards of total offense (39 rushing, 38 passing) in the eighth matchup all-time against the Hoosiers. Indiana (3-0) was able to control the tempo of the game with 680 yards of total offense and 33 first downs and led the time of possession battled 33:37-26:23 in securing the nonconference win.

Indiana State was unable to gain traction in the first half in front of an announced crowd of 46,219 inside Memorial Stadium and the Hoosiers rode the crowd's momentum with touchdown drives in six of their seven possessions in the half. IU quarterback Fernando Mendoza had five touchdown passes, three to Omar Cooper Jr., and added a seven-yard touchdown run over the first half as the Hoosiers built a 45-0 lead at the break.

The Hoosiers added four more scores in the second half with Alberto Mendoza throwing two touchdown passes (one to Omar Cooper Jr.), while Khobie Martin had a pair of touchdown runs to cap the IU scoring in the matchup.

Brock Riddle led Indiana State's passing efforts in the game as the redshirt freshman completed 3-of-4 attempts for a team-high 25 yards. Keegan Patterson was 8-of-16 for 13 yards, while getting sacked four times by the IU pass rush.

Angelo St. Louis was the Sycamores' leading rusher with 22 yards on five carries, while Plez Lawrence (six carries, 11 yards) and Deion Brown (eight carries, 10 yards) both reached double-digits on the ground. Keshon Singleton was Indiana State's leading receiver with one catch for 17 yards, while Zack Drawdy Jr. hauled in three catches for 12 yards.

Defensively, Kimal Clark and Braxton Sampson paced the Sycamores with seven tackles apiece on Friday night. J.T. Anderson added six stops and a pass breakup, while Alex Rose recorded six tackles, 1.0 tackles-for-loss, and one forced fumble in his first start of the 2025 season.

Sycamores close out 2025 non-conference slate with loss at No. 5/5 Montana

MISSOULA, Mont. - Nick Osho broke off a pair of long touchdown runs and Rashad Rochelle hauled in a 51-yard touchdown reception to highlight the Indiana State offensive efforts as the Sycamores fell on the road to No. 5/5 Montana on Saturday afternoon at Washington-Grizzly Field, 63-20.

The Sycamores, making the return trip of the home-and-home series started in 2022, started off strong defensively with Bryce Patterson stuffing a 3rd-and-2 for a two-yard loss on the opening drive of the game, while the Indiana State defense forced a Montana punt on the second possession.

The Griz broke free on their ensuing possession as Eli Gillman went 69 yards down the right sideline for an early Montana touchdown with 4:28 remaining in the first quarter. Indiana State answered four plays later as Keegan Patterson targeted Rashad Rochelle up the seam and completed the 51-yard touchdown pass to the senior wide receiver to even the score at 7-7.

Montana broke loose from there scoring 49 consecutive points as Gillman added two more touchdown runs, while quarterback Keali'I Ah Yat added a 14-yard touchdown run and completed scoring passes to both Josh Gale (19 yards) and Jordan Dever (62 yards). The Griz added a defensive touchdown in the second quarter on a Solomon Tuliaupupu strip-sack recovered by TJ Rausch in the end zone to pull away.

Indiana State rallied late in the fourth quarter as senior running back Nick Osho broke loose with a pair of long touchdown runs. His first went for 55 yards down the left sideline with 12:14 left in the first quarter to end the Sycamores' scoring draught. His second, a 79-yard carry, featured several broken tackles near the line of scrimmage before he outran the Montana defense down the sideline for the score.

Osho finished with a career-high 134 rushing yards on five carries with his two rushing touchdowns highlighting the Indiana State offense. Plez Lawrence added 15 carries for 57 yards as the Sycamores racked up 198 total rushing yards on 30 carries in the game.

Keegan Patterson was 15-of-27 through the air for 189 yards with a touchdown and an interception. The Sycamore quarterback completed passes to eight different receivers with Rochelle the top target with four catches for a season-high 75 yards and a touchdown.

Sycamores rush for 322 yards in MVFC opening loss at No. 10/11 Southern Illinois

CARBONDALE, Ill. - Nick Osho broke loose for the first 200-yard rushing game of his collegiate career highlighting a 322-yard rushing attack for the Indiana State offense in the Sycamores' 55-27 Missouri Valley Football loss to No. 10/11 Southern Illinois on Saturday night in Saluki Stadium.

Osho, who scored on 39-yard and 66-yard rushing touchdowns on the evening, totaled new career-highs in carries (28) and rushing yards (211), while adding his second consecutive multi-touchdown rushing effort to lead the Indiana State offense. Keegan Patterson and Brock Riddle both added quarterback keeper touchdown runs on the game as all four Indiana State scores came on the ground.

Southern Illinois jumped ahead 21-0 in the first quarter as DJ Williams targeted Jay Jones for a 20-yard touchdown pass, while Chandler Chapman added a 39-yard score on the first two SIU possessions. Williams took it himself on a one-yard touchdown plunge to give SIU the three-touchdown lead eight minutes into the game.

The Sycamores fought back on Patterson's nine-yard rushing touchdown on an 11-play, 75-yard drive highlighted by a 20-yard Osho carry, while Patterson found Bryan Domino for an 18-yard reception near midfield. Osho added his first touchdown run late midway through the second quarter on a 39-yard run answering an 83-yard touchdown pass from SIU's Williams to Vinson Davis III.

Southern Illinois went up 38-14 just before the halftime break on Williams' second rushing touchdown of the game. Osho and Riddle added touchdowns for the Sycamores in the second half, but Indiana State was unable to mount a comeback in the Missouri Valley Football opener loss.

Angelo St. Louis added a career-high 10 carries for 54 yards, while Patterson finished with four carries for 27 yard and a score. Riddle added six carries for 21 yards and his first collegiate rushing touchdown for the offense. Zack Drawdy Jr. (four catches, 58 yards) and Domino (four catches, 34 yards) both posted new career-highs on the evening.

Nic Yatsko recorded the first double-digit tackling effort of his collegiate career with a team-high 10 stops, including 1.0 tackles-for-loss on the day. Kimal Clark added nine tackles, a forced fumble, and fumble recovery, while Alex Rose had eight tackles on the day. Kaden Gajewski added his first forced fumble of the season, while Shane Bennett added a fumble recovery defensively.

Sycamores unable to complete comeback against No. 23 South Dakota

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. - Indiana State fought their way back against No. 23/RV South Dakota on Saturday afternoon in the Sycamores' annual Homecoming Game, but the Coyotes were able to run out the clock in securing the 19-14 win at Memorial Stadium.

The Sycamores pulled back within one score with 4:39 left in the fourth quarter as running back Nick Osho secured a one-yard touchdown reception from quarterback Brock Riddle pulling Indiana State back within one touchdown. The scoring drive was aided by a 21-yard completion from Riddle to Keshon Singleton that put the Sycamores inside the 10-yard line, while Deion Brown added a 13-yard carry on his first touch of the game.

The Indiana State defense forced a three-and-out on the following South Dakota drive with Mason Knipp making the key stop on 3rd-and-4 at the Yotes' 31 with a tackle-for-loss forcing a punt and giving the Sycamores the chance for the go-ahead drive.

The Sycamores last chance started near midfield following a short USD punt with Brown taking the first carry up the middle moving the ball to the INS 48. After back-to-back passes to Torey French set up a 4th-and-long, the Yotes' defense held strong with Nate Ewell breaking up the first-down pass intended for Osho and allowing South Dakota to run out the clock.

The Yotes dominated the possession battle on the game holding onto the ball for 45:21 in the game, compared to the Sycamores' 14:39. South Dakota utilized four Will Leyland field goals (32, 26, 23, 42) to end scoring drives of 9:36, 3:04, 6:42, and 6:11, while their 10-play, 57-yard second quarter scoring drive was capped by L.J. Phillips Jr.'s one-yard touchdown run as the Yotes kept control of the game offensively.

Osho saw his 100-yard game streak come to an end on Saturday afternoon as the redshirt junior running back recorded 12 carries for 71 yards. He added four receptions for seven yards and a touchdown, marking his third consecutive game with a score.

Riddle was 13-of-23 through the air in his first collegiate start for 125 yards and two touchdowns. The redshirt freshman quarterback targeted both Singleton and Osho for his first two scoring passes with Singleton hauling in two passes for a game-high 78 yards, while French (three catches, 21 receptions) and Zack Drawdy Jr. (three catches, 19 yards) both had multi-catch games.

Lucas McAllister returned to the field with a career-high 12 tackles, including 3.0 tackles-for-loss as the Sycamores continually attacked one of the best offensive lines in the FCS on the afternoon. Kimal Clark and Ahmond Glass both finished with 10 tackles apiece, while Dallas Westhoff recorded a season-high eight stops in his first start of the season. Overall, the Sycamores recorded four total sacks and 11 tackles-for-loss on the day.

Indiana State struck first as Jorge Valdes intercepted a tipped Cole Payton pass inside the red zone, and the Sycamores converted on the other end with Nick Osho taking a three-yard touchdown plunge to put Indiana State ahead 7-0 with 4:11 to play in the first quarter.

NDSU rallied back before the break with a Truman Werremeyer three-yard touchdown pass from Payton and Eli Ozick connected on a 54-yard field goal to give the Bison the 10-7 lead just before the halftime break.

Coming out of the half, lightning struck as the teams were forced to sit through a 2:17 delay before reconvening play on the field around 5 p.m.

Indiana State quarterback Keegan Patterson threw an interception on the first play of the second half and the Bison converted it into points as Payton took it himself for a three-yard touchdown run to stretch the NDSU lead to 17-7. From there, it was all Bison as NDSU outgained the Sycamores 261-66 in the second half with Barika Kpeenu highlighting the offense with two rushing touchdowns, while DJ Scott added a fourth quarter score to provide the final 38-7 margin.

Indiana State had its moments throughout the game as the Sycamores went deep in the playbook with punter Harry Traum gaining 18 yards on a fake punt attempt, while Nick Osho added his team-leading seventh rushing touchdown of the season.

Patterson went 14-of-24 through the air for 107 yards with Zack Drawdy Jr. (three catches, 49 yards) and Rashad Rochelle (three catches, 18 yards) the favorite targets. Osho recorded a team-high 16 carries for 48 yards and a rushing touchdown to pace the rushing game.

Kimal Clark led three Sycamores with double-digit tackles on Saturday afternoon as the redshirt senior safety posted a game-high 15 stops on the game. Braxton Sampson (13) and Drew Covington (10) were also in double-digits on the day, while Lucas McAllister finished with five tackles, 1.0 sacks, and 1.5 tackles-for-loss on the afternoon.

Sycamores fall in Saturday MVFC battle at No. 8/10 North Dakota

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. – No. 8/10 North Dakota pulled away from Indiana State in the second half following a 20-point third quarter as the Sycamores fell on the road in Missouri Valley Football play on Saturday afternoon inside the Alerus Center, 46-17.

Rashad Rochelle recorded his first 100-yard receiving game of the 2025 season with four catches for 113 yards, while Keshon Singleton hauled in a seven-yard touchdown pass for the Sycamores (2-6, 0-4) during a third quarter swing that featured two Indiana State defensive turnovers. BJ Wuest added a tipped punt and returned the ball 16 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to highlight the Indiana State scoring efforts.

North Dakota (6-2) utilized a balanced offensive attack in the game recording 300 passing yards from Jerry Kaminski and 104 rushing yards from Sawyer Seidl to control the MVFC matchup. Kaminski added four touchdown passes, targeting Caden Dennis, BJ Fleming, Seidl, and Nathan Hromadka for scores, while Seidl and Kaminski both recorded rushing scores on the ground.

Kimal Clark had a team-high 12 tackles and added a fumble recovery in the third quarter for the Sycamores. Jerome Robinson added a career-high 11 stops and a forced fumble, while Nic Yatko recorded his first interception of the season. The Sycamores were active on the defensive line with Shane Bennett (2), Kolten Gajewski, and Sirmaine Campbell all recording pass breakups at the line of scrimmage.

Malachi McNeal led the North Dakota defensive efforts with five tackles, including a tackle-for-loss. Avery Scott had four pass breakups, while Antonio Bluiett and Jonnie Wiltshire both finished with interceptions.

Sebastian Lopez added a 46-yard field goal for the Sycamores in the loss.
