MATCHUP AT A GLANCE

*Indiana State embarks on the longest road trip of the 2025 season as the Sycamores make the flight to Montana. The 3,420-mile round trip accounts for nearly half the Sycamores' road trip miles in 2025 (8,118) spanning six different states.

*Indiana State is 0-1 all-time in the MVFC-Big Sky Challenge with their lone contest coming in 2022 against Montana.

*The Sycamores have faced only one member of the current Big Sky membership in Indiana State program history with the 2022 meeting against the Grizzlies.

*The MVFC leads the MVFC-Big Sky Challenge to date in the 2025 season with a 5-1 mark against the conference. The lone MVFC loss came this past weekend as Montana topped North Dakota 24-23.

*Indiana State's contest at Montana marks the first of eight consecutive contests against currently ranked FCS opponents. Highlighting the schedule ahead includes MVFC opponents No. 1 North Dakota State, No. 2 South Dakota State, and No. 4 Illinois State.

*The Sycamores' trip to Montana marks the furthest west Indiana State has played a football game.

The Sycamores (1-2) kept the game close throughout the first half thanks to a strong ground game paced by Justin Dinka's 96 rushing yards at the break. The redshirt sophomore added a career-best 54-yard rushing touchdown on the Sycamores' second drive to tie the game up at 7-7.

Montana (3-0) was able to bottle up the Indiana State run game in the second half and quarterback Lucas Johnson accounted for four touchdowns (three passing, one rushing) in leading a relentless Grizzly offense. Montana finished with 406 yards of total offense, 336 through the air, in the win.

Dinka paced the Indiana State offense on the game as the Flower Mound, Texas native posted career-highs in both carries (20) and yards (87) in the loss. Dawson Basinger added eight carries for 25 yards in his first extended action of the fall.

Gavin Screws went 11-for-22 through the air for 115 yards in the Sycamore loss. His favorite targets on the afternoon included Dante Hendrix (3 catches, 36 yards), Harry Van Dyne (3 catches, 27 yards), and Kevin Barnett (3 catches, 20 yards).

Five different Sycamores finished with five tackles in the game to highlight a complete team effort on the defensive side of the ball. Johnathan Edwards led the way with five solo stops and a pass breakup, while Michael Lufile and Micah Hauser both added a career-high five tackles. Maddix Blackwell added a sack and a forced fumble that led to a 15-yard scoop-and-score from Lucas Hunter.

QB NO. 1 ELIJAH OWENS

Elijah Owens' first season at the helm of the Indiana State offense was one for the ages in Sycamore history as the Jacksonville, Ill. native set new offensive marks in 2024. Owens set the Indiana State record for most rushing yards (598) and rushing touchdowns (8) by a quarterback, while adding a 68.8% completion percentage through the air, good for eighth overall in the FCS.

Owens was highly decorated in the postseason earning three nods on Freshman All-American teams including the FCS Football Central, Stats Perform FCS, and Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American postseason squads. He wrapped up the postseason accolades finishing ninth overall in the Jerry Rice Award voting, the highest finish in program history for the award that recognizes the top freshman players in the FCS.

Owens looks to break in the Indiana State offense this upcoming season as the rising redshirt sophomore takes the reins under new offensive coordinator John Bear. Bear's system at Bucknell led to new marks for the Bison offense setting 28 school and individual records during his time with the quarterback room setting new marks in game, season, and career passing yards, touchdowns, completion percentage, and completions.

Plez Lawrence scored three second-half touchdowns in helping Indiana State take the season-opening win over McKendree on Thursday night. Lawrence scored two touchdowns (17-yard rushing, 75-yard receiving) in a decisive third quarter 21-0 swing against the Bearcats to give Indiana State a 34-12 lead. He added his final touchdown in the closing minute of the game with a four-yard rushing score to secure the 41-24 win. The redshirt junior running back finished with a career-high 225 total offensive yards (133 rushing, 92 receiving). His three touchdowns were the most by an Indiana State player since he recorded three scores back in 2023 against Murray State.

MVFC Newcomer of the Week - Larry Stephens - Sept. 8

Larry Stephens III hauled in a game-high five passes for 67 yards and his first touchdown in the Sycamore Blue & White against Eastern Illinois. The redshirt senior found himself wide-open for the four-yard score in the second quarter to make it a 14-0 lead. He added a 23-yard reception on a pass from Rashad Rochelle to set up a Sycamore touchdown in the second quarter.

All-American Elijah Owens

Elijah Owens returns for his sophomore season as the Jacksonville, Ill. native heads up the Indiana State offense for the second consecutive year. Owens, a 2024 Jerry Rice Award Finalist, recorded the highest finish in Indiana State history in the National Freshman of the Year Award after placing ninth overall in the voting. He added a trio of All-American honors last season being named to the FCS Football Central Freshman All-American, STATS Perform FCS Freshman All-American, and the Phil Steele Freshman All-American Teams.

Owens put together a season for the ages with the Sycamores lining up and starting in 11 games, posting 1,717 passing yards and 12 touchdowns while finishing eighth in the FCS in completion percentage (68.8%), while adding 598 rushing yards and eight more scores. The rushing yardage and touchdowns set Indiana State quarterback records. He highlighted his season with three games with 200-plus passing yards, and 100-plus rushing yards.

Elijah Owens garners National Honors

Elijah Owens accounted for 264 yards of total offense and two touchdowns in the Sycamores' win over the Racers as Indiana State picked up its first MVFC win of the 2024 season. Owens completed 25 of 34 passes for 218 yards and a touchdown, adding 46 yards and a TD on the ground. The Sycamores scored the game-winning touchdown with 11 seconds left, and Owens directed the drive with passes or runs on seven of the nine plays.

Lawrence Bringing It Back

Plez Lawrence knows all about big games and the redshirt junior running back is back to take the reins on an Indiana State rushing attack that averaged 149.9 yards per game over the course of the 2024 season. Lawrence made a splash in his first collegiate start with the Sycamores against Murray State in 2023 carrying the ball a career-high 29 times for 203 rushing yards, while adding touchdown runs of two, 29, and 31 yards throughout the contest.

He wrapped up his second season with the Sycamores with three career 100-yard rushing games, including a 17-carry, 160-yard contest last season against Houston Christian, while adding 14 carries for 100 yards and a score against North Dakota. The Kokomo, Ind. native has posted 211 career carries for 912 yards, while averaging 4.3 yards per carry over the last two seasons.

Additionally, Lawrence became the first freshman running back to break the 100-yard rushing mark since Shakir Bell (2010) and the first freshman to break 100 yards in the MVFC since South Dakota State's Pierre Strong Jr. (2018). His 209-yard game was the most since Dominique Dafney (244 vs. Missouri State, 2019).

KIMAL CLARK

The Third Team All-American has found a new home this year as Kimal Clark is set to patrol the Indiana State defensive backfield in the 2025 season. The Lackawanna, N.Y. native is the reigning Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Year after setting Central Connecticut State recorded in tackles (117), while adding three pass breakups.

Clark looks to lead an Indiana State defense that lost its top six tackling leaders, including the 17th member of the Sycamores' 300-tackle club, Geoffrey Brown. Clark is set to join with MVFC All-Newcomer selection Jorge Valdes to provide a powerful 1-2 punch in the Sycamore secondary.

Clark recorded five double-digit tackling efforts in the 2024 season on his way to finishing 16th in FCS in solo tackles (5.1) and 26th overall in total tackles (9.0) per game. He recorded a career-high 18-tackle game against Massachusetts, while adding 13 stops in games against both Fordham and Robert Morris.

Clark is set to be one of the leaders in the new-look defense under first-year defensive coordinator David Elson and joins Dallas Westhoff, Lucas McAllister, Valdes, and Braxton Sampson among the top Sycamores hitting the field in 2025.

Starting on Defense

Indiana State's defensive side of the ball features just seven players who have earned starts on the field in the Indiana State Blue & White, with all starts coming over the course of the 2024 season. The Sycamores do not have a player returning to the field with more than four starts on the field under their belts as a mostly unproven defensive front will take the field in the 2025 season.

Rochelle Finds the Open Field

Indiana State wide receiver and return specialist Rashad Rochelle returns to the field for his senior season as the Springfield, Ill. native was one of the most dangerous return threats in the FCS over the 2024 season. Rochelle finished eighth in the NCAA in combined kick return yards (751) and 28th in kick return yard average (23.7), while posting 107.08 all-purpose yards per game.

Rochelle, a former Rutgers transfer, broke through as Indiana State's top receiving threat over the 2024 season finishing with a team-high 58 catches for 527 yards and four touchdowns in his first season with the Sycamores. He highlighted his inaugural season at Indiana State with three games with at least eight receptions, including a season-high 10 catches for 105 yards and a touchdown against Illinois State. He added eight catches against both Murray State and Southern Illinois, while adding a season-long 63-yard reception against Missouri State.

Getting Funk-y With It

Offensive Line Coach Darrell Funk returns to the Indiana State sidelines for the second time over his coaching career after taking over the reins of assistant head coach, run game

coordinator, and offensive line in January 2025. Funk coached at Indiana State in 2017 as the offensive line coach and is a 35-year veteran of the coaching ranks, including 10 seasons as a coordinator. Funk has coached offensive line for 27 seasons, including overseeing the offensive fronts at schools like Michigan, Purdue, San Diego State, Colorado State and Ball State in addition to BYU.

In his last stint at Indiana State, Funk served as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator in 2017. His line helped pave the way for All-Missouri Valley Conference honorable mention running back LeMonte Booker, who rushed for 941 yards. His son, Tyler Funk, previously served on the Indiana State coaching staff as the tight ends and offensive line coach, while also serving as Indiana State's recruiting coordinator.

Grin and "Bear" It

John Bear joined the Indiana State coaching staff as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in January 2025. The long-time coordinator made previous stops at Bucknell, Southeastern, Georgetown, University of Chicago, North Park, Akron, Emory & Henry, and Liberty over his coaching career prior to joining the Sycamores.

Bear's recent stint at Bucknell over the 2023 and 2024 seasons featured the program's best overall record and most Patriot League wins (4-2) since the 2014 season. Overall, the offense set 28 school and individual records during his time with the quarterback room setting new marks in game, season, and career passing yards, touchdowns, completion percentage, and completions.

The Bison increased their total offense from 123rd overall to 42nd in FCS and boasted the top overall offense in the Patriot League. The scoring offense improved from 12 points to 32 points per game led by All-Conference First Team and Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year Ralph Rucker.

Elijah Owens and Rashad Rochelle are back to being teammates for the second consecutive season following a storied rivalry during their times at both Jacksonville High School (Owens) and Springfield High School (Rochelle). The duo lined up on opposite sidelines as the pair of All-State quarterback backups combined to throw for nearly 15,000 yards and 200 touchdowns over their prep careers.

Linebacker Legacy

Dallas Westhoff looks to build off the linebacker legacy that has surrounded Indiana State over the last decade with the inclusion of Katrell Moss, Jonas Griffith, and most recently, Garret Ollendieck and Geoffrey Brown. Westhoff will be given the first crack at the middle of the Indiana State defense that is going to see an overhaul with just four players returning with extensive playing time in 2024.

The Cedar Falls, Iowa native showed flashes of brilliance on the field following Ollendieck's mid-season injury highlighted by a career-high 12-tackle, 1.0-sack game at Missouri State, while adding three tackles and one sack against Purdue. He looks to take the reins of the defense in their first year under new defensive coordinator David Elson.

All-American Status

Kimal Clark was honored by the national media ahead of the upcoming 2025 season as the Central Connecticut State transfer was honored on the Stats Perform FCS Preseason All-American Team (Third Team). Clark becomes the second Sycamore defensive player to be recognized on a preseason

All-American squad in as many years and third since 2020 joining Garret Ollendieck (2024 Stats Perform) and Inoko Moala (2020 Phil Steele) to achieve the feat.

The Lackawanna, N.Y. native was a Third Team All-American and was a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist this past season with the Blue Devils. The Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Year recorded 117 total tackles, including a season-high 18 tackles against UMass, among his five double-digit tackling efforts on the year. He finished 16th in the FCS in solo tackles (5.1) and 26th overall in total tackles (9.0) per game.

Patrolling the Secondary

Joining Clark in the Indiana State defensive backfield includes the return of rising sophomore safety Jorge Valdes. The 2024 MVFC All-Newcomer selection took over a starting role in the Indiana State defensive backfield early in the season on his way to finishing among the Sycamore leaders in multiple defensive categories. The Fort Wayne, Ind. native tied for the team lead with two interceptions, while finishing sixth in the MVFC in passes defended with eight on the year.

Valdes highlighted his season with a 90-yard pick-six early in the season that sparked Indiana State's defensive efforts in the 24-13 win over Dayton. He added a season-high seven tackles and his second interception of the year against Youngstown State.

Elson On the Call

While new faces abound on the offensive coaching staff, the defensive coaching staff will also see a new head as David Elson takes over the calling duties following the departure of former defensive coordinator Brad Wilson (LB, South Florida). Elson joins the Sycamores following two seasons at Wake Forest after serving the Demon Deacons as a defensive analyst. He came to Indiana State with 31 years of coaching at the collegiate level. During the 2022 season, the Boilermakers turned over opponents 21 times, ranking 38th nationally while Purdue also ranked 12th nationally in defensive touchdowns, totaling three in 2022. The Boilermakers won the Big 10 West Division for the first time in school history last fall. Elson had served as the defensive coordinator at a number of stops during his coaching career including: Western Illinois, Southern Illinois, New Mexico State and WKU.

Elson's recent defensive coordinator stints include spending the 2020 season as the defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach at Marion University in Indianapolis. Prior

to his lone season at Marion, Elson spent three years (2017-19) at Ball State as the Cardinals' defensive coordinator. BSU led the Mid-American Conference in interceptions (15) and turnovers gained (24) during his final season in Muncie. Both stats cracked the top 15 nationally.

Staying Home

Head Coach Curt Mallory has prided himself on recruiting the state of Indiana and the Wabash Valley and this year's team is a continued reflection of that recruiting philosophy. The Sycamores roster features 49 players who hail from the Hoosier State including six players who were homegrown in Terre Haute. Notable names on the 2025 roster from the Terre Haute locale include Damon Sturm, Nic Yatsko, Adam Mohamed, Alex Rose, Jaden Wayt, and newcomer to the roster Brady Wilson.

Last season, Indiana State boasted the largest number of Hoosier State football players among all FBS and FCS institutions topping Ball State, Purdue, Indiana, Butler, and Valparaiso.

Indiana State football hit the books and got it done over the 2024-25 academic year as the Sycamores posted a 3.266 cumulative team GPA. The mark was second in the Missouri Valley Football Conference this past season and behind just reigning GPA leader North Dakota. The Sycamores' team's prowess in the classroom continues to stand out both on and off the field with five Indiana State players named to the MVFC All-Academic Team, including Garret Ollendieck, Maddix Blackwell, Ethan Chambers, Braxton Sampson, and Jack Sherman.

Punter from Down Under

Harry Traum is the undisputed Indiana State punting leader heading into the 2025 season as the Adelaide, Australia native hits the field for this fourth season in the Sycamore Blue & White. Traum led the Sycamores with a 40.1 YPK average over the course of the 2024 season while adding holder duties.

Traum, an Aussie-style punter, has utilized both traditional and Australian-style punts over his collegiate career. He enters his third season playing traditional American football after stepping foot on campus in 2022 having not caught a snap from center before.

Traum recorded career-highs in 73 punts for 2,931 yards, including a career-long 67-yard punt against Dayton last season, while adding 31 fair catches and 22 balls downed inside the 20 yard line.

Traum was also the Indiana State holder on field goals and extra point attempts.

Winning the Kicking Battle

Sebastian Lopez won the kicking battle immediately out of camp and lived up to his expectations over the opening week with a pair of field goals in the Sycamores' win over McKendree.

It marked his first collegiate field goals after attempted his previous lone attempt against Purdue in the 2024 season opener.

Should he falter, newcomers Spencer Conrad and Rylan Vinard will also battle for playing time in 2025.

Conrad is a kicker/punter who transferred in by way of Toledo after spending his freshman season with the Rockets. He attempted one kick against Duquesne, making his lone PAT, while kicking off twice. Vinard was a three-time Special Teams Player of the Year at Mt. Vernon High School in Fortville, Ind. where he finished as the program's all-time leader in field goals made, field goal percentage, and PAT conversion rate.

Vincent Allen Jersey Retirement

Former Indiana State University football player Vincent Allen will have his No. 26 jersey retired, as announced by the athletic department this summer.

The Sycamore running back, who will be the first Indiana State player to be recognized with the accolade, will be honored prior to the September 6 game against Eastern Illinois at Memorial Stadium.

Allen gained over a thousand rushing yards in each of his four seasons at Indiana State from 1973-77, finishing up his playing career with a school-record 832 carries for 4,335 yards. He holds the Indiana State record for most 100-yard career rushing games (26) and most consecutive 100-yard rushing games (14), while adding the most career touchdowns scored (33) for the Sycamores.

The Richmond, Ind. native was a four-time All-American selection, including earning 1975 Associated Press Little First Team All-American, and 1976 American Football Coaches Association First Team honors. He was also honored on the 1974 AP All-American Second Team and 1973 AP All-American Honorable Mention squad.

Allen wrapped up his collegiate career as one of only four NCAA Division I rushers at the time to record four 1,000-yard seasons, a list that included Pitt legend Tony Dorsett at the time. He also earned Second Team All-American honors in 1974 behind only Jackson State star running back Walter Payton.

Allen pursued his bachelor's degree in physical education, before leaving Indiana State in 1978 in starting his professional career in the Canadian Football League (1978-79) and with the National Football League's Chicago Bears (1980). He was inducted into the Indiana State Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998, the Indiana Football Hall of Fame in 2000, and has been on the College Football Hall of Fame ballot since 2025.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

NINTH SEASON AT INDIANA STATE NINTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH

After being named the 21st head coach in the history of Indiana State on Jan. 23, 2017, Mallory enters his ninth season at the helm of the program in 2025.

Mallory, a 22-year veteran as an assistant coach in the college ranks, is part of one of the more prominent football families in the United States, as he is the son of Indiana University's all-time winningest head coach Bill Mallory, who coached the Hoosiers from 1984-96. Bill Mallory was also the head coach at Miami of Ohio (1969-73), Colorado (1974-78) and Northern Illinois (1980-83) over an illustrious 27-year coaching career. Mallory also has two brothers in the NFL coaching ranks: Doug, the defensive backs coach for the Atlanta Falcons, and Mike, a special teams coach with the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Mallory and his staff mounted the biggest turnaround in collegiate football in 2018 after leading the Sycamores to a 7-4 finish, a third-place finish in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and a No. 22 national ranking. The Sycamores closed out the season winning five-straight games, including three on the road to make push for the postseason. Entering the season, ISU was tabbed to finish last in the MVFC with just one voter not picking the Sycamores to finish last. With the turnaround, Mallory became the just the second head coach in program history to earn MVFC Coach of the Year honors. He was named a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson award, which honors the National Coach of the Year. Mallory was tabbed the FCS Coach of the Year by Phil Steele.

In year two Mallory coached 10 All-MVFC honorees including the League's Newcomer of the Year in quarterback Ryan Boyle. Running back Ja'Quan Keys and linebacker Jonas Griffith were tabbed with First Team All-MVFC honors. Boyle, center Wyatt Wozniak, linebacker Katrell Moss, defensive back Rondell Green and place kicker Jerry Nunez earned Second Team accolades. The Sycamores also claimed three Honorable Mention selections in offensive linemen Isaiah Edwards and Tate Leavitt to go along with wide receiver Dante Hendrix. Indiana State saw five players named to the MVFC Newcomer Team after the Sycamores put four on the offensive side of the ball led by quarterback Ryan Boyle. Redshirt freshman wide receiver Dante Hendrix also earned the honor while a pair of offensive linemen in Isaiah Edwards and Tate Leavitt rounded out the offensive honors for the Trees. First-year safety Denzel Bonner picked up the honor for the Sycamores on the defensive side of the ball.

Mallory's 2019 team finished 5-7 after several key pieces were lost due to injuries including Preseason MVFC Quarterback Ryan Boyle, who was injured in the fourth game of the season. Mallory led his team to a 3-5 in the MVFC including back-to-back wins over Youngstown State and Missouri State to end the season. Wide receiver Dante Hendrix, linebacker Jonas Griffith and return specialist Dakota Caton earned First Team All-MVFC honors while backback Dominique Dafney, center Wyatt Wozniak and place kicker Jerry Nunez earned Second Team accolades. The Sycamores also claimed three Honorable Mention selections as linebacker Clayton Glasco, defensive lineman Inoke Moala and safety Michael Thomas were recognized.

The Sycamores were back on the field in 2021 after enduring a COVID-shutdown for the entirety of the 2020 season. Indiana State topped Eastern Illinois in their first game back on the field and followed up with wins at Eastern Kentucky, at home against both Western Illinois and Youngstown State, before wrapping up the year with a road win at Illinois State. ISU went 5-6 in its first campaign back in action with a 3-5 mark in MVFC play. Accolades continues to come in for the Sycamores as defensive end Inoke Moala recorded First Team All-Conference honors after sitting among the MVFC leaders in sacks and tackles for loss. Dante Hendrix (WR), JJ Henderson (DB), and Wyatt Harwood (LS) were all honored on the Honorable Mention squad.

The Sycamores battled through one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2022 with four of the preseason top-six ranked teams in the country on the slate. ISU had plenty of bright spots throughout the year including the MVFC Freshman of the Year (Cade Chambers), while six Sycamores earned All-Conference accolades. ISU was further honored by Rylan Cole earning Sophomore All-American status by HERO Sports.

Another tough slate awaited the Sycamores in 2023 as Indiana State faced off against eight ranked teams over the course of the regular season, while adding two games against FBS opponents. The Sycamores had five players named to the MVFC All-Conference team with both Garret Ollendieck and Maddix Blackwell eclipsing the 100-tackle mark over the course of the season.

Prior to coming to Indiana State, Mallory was the pass coordinator and secondary coach under former North Dakota State head coach Craig Bohl at the University of Wyoming in 2015 and 2016. There, Mallory mentored 2016 Thorpe Award semifinalist Andrew Wingard, who was a First-Team All-Conference honoree as a sophomore. The previous year in 2015, Mallory helped Wingard and Marcus Epps to nods as Honorable Mention All-Americans.

Mallory spent the previous four seasons at his alma mater, the University of Michigan, as a secondary coach under Brady Hoke. There, he worked with several superb defenses, including the seventh best in the FBS his final year in 2014 that only allowed 311.3 YPG. That same year, Michigan ranked 15th in rushing defense (117.7 YPG), tied for 19th in passing defense (193.7 YPG) and 27th in scoring defense (22.4 PPG).

The Wolverine secondary also finished top-15 in the nation in pass defense in both 2011 and 2012. The 2011 defense was an especially impressive feat that first season, as they jumped from 107th in scoring defense in 2010 to sixth nationally in 2011. In Ann Arbor, Mallory had the opportunity to coach current Jacksonville Jaguars safety Jarrod Wilson, as well as help recruit and coach 2016 Heisman Trophy finalist and projected top 2017 NFL Draft pick Jabrill Peppers during his freshman season in 2014.

Mallory was the defensive coordinator at Akron for the 2010 season, and before that he spent five successful seasons at the University of Illinois from 2005-09 under head coach Ron Zook (now the special teams coordinator of the Green Bay Packers). Mallory's first two seasons in 2005 and 2006 were spent as the secondary coach, and his final three years he was promoted to co-defensive coordinator.

At Illinois, Mallory was instrumental in one of the best teams in Illini history in the 2007 Rose Bowl team. That year, Mallory's Illini defense held opponents to under 20 points per game en route to a 9-4 finish. Illinois also ranked second in the Big Ten in passing defense (182.2 YPG) in 2006 and led the Big Ten in sacks and tackles for loss in 2008. Mallory's 2006 secondary only allowed 11 passing touchdowns and 6.5 yards per pass attempt all season. At Illinois, Mallory's prized pupil was All-American Vontae Davis, who was a two-time Thorpe Award semifinalist and a 2009 First-Round NFL Draft Pick of the Miami Dolphins. Davis has been a two-time Pro Bowl selection during his NFL career and has been a member of the Indianapolis Colts since 2012.

Other notable pupils at Illinois include current Detroit Lions safety Tavon Wilson, a 2012 Second Round pick of the New England Patriots and a member of New England's Super Bowl XLIX champion team, and Jeremy "J" Leman, a 2007 All-American linebacker for the Illini Rose Bowl team and current Big Ten Network color analyst.

Mallory spent three seasons at Indiana as a secondary coach from 2002-04, which was preceded by one year as the secondary coach at Central Michigan in 2001 and six seasons at Ball State from 1995-2000 in charge of both the linebackers and secondary. Mallory was on staff for Ball State's 1996 team that went to the Las Vegas Bowl. His coaching career began as a student assistant at Michigan in 1992, followed by two years as a graduate assistant under his father at Indiana in 1993-94.

Mallory was a four-year player at the University of Michigan from 1988-91 under legendary head coach Bo Schembechler his first two seasons, followed by Gary Moeller his last two. Mallory was on four Wolverine teams that won a Big Ten title, including three teams that went to a Rose Bowl. His freshman season in 1988 he was on a Rose Bowl champion team that finished the season ranked No. 4 nationally after defeating USC. Mallory capped off his Wolverine career with an interception in Michigan's 35-3 win over Ole Miss in the 1991 Gator Bowl. Longtime Michigan head coach Lloyd Carr, who led the Wolverines to a national title in 1997, was Mallory's defensive coordinator during his playing career.

Mallory earned his bachelor's in sport management and communication from the University of Michigan in 1992, and he finished his master's in outdoor recreation at Indiana University in 1999. Mallory and his wife, Lori, have three children: sons James and Sam, and a daughter, Margo.

Indiana State nearly put points on the board as the momentum appeared to shift late in the first half after the Sycamore defense forced a Purdue punt. Quarterback Elijah Owens escaped the pocket for a 20-yard carry down to the Purdue 26-yard line with 22 seconds remaining. After Owens was unable to connect with Rashad Rochelle on a pass in the end zone, the Sycamores rushed to the center of the field to set up a field goal attempt. However, the attempt sailed left and kept the 21-0 Purdue lead intact at the break.

Owens finished 5-of-10 through the air for 50 yards targeting four different receivers throughout the contest. The redshirt freshman quarterback added a team-high 47 rushing yards on nine carries. Rochelle hauled in three catches for 26 yards in his first game in the Sycamore Blue & White, while Matt Ross and Zavion Taylor added catches in the game.

Plez Lawrence (12 carries, 27 yards) and Shen Butler-Lawson (11 carries, 23 yards) did the majority of the work in the backfield for Indiana State as the Sycamores posted 43 carries for 104 rushing yards in the game.
