

## Why the Bengals?

How did Idaho State's athletic teams become the Bengals, when there just aren't any to be found in the region? A good question.

Originally, when the school was the Academy of Idaho in 1902, the school's athletic teams were dubbed "Bantams", and it stayed that way until 1917, when J.A. Fogt became head football coach. Now Idaho Tech, the team's nickname was changed to "Tigers", in part due to Ralph Hutchinson, who was the Director of Physical Education and Athletics. Hutchinson was a graduate of Princeton (the Tigers), so he founded the school's first booster club, the "I" Club, and brought the "Tiger" mascot with him.

When the school became the University of Idaho-Southern Branch in 1927, the nickname switched to "Bengals", although many newspaper and yearbook accounts refer to the team by both "Bengals" and "Tigers". The freshman teams during this time suffered the unfortunate distinction of the nickname "Kittens".

As a branch of the University of Idaho, the school's colors were black and gold, just like the Vandals, and although the official colors switched to black and orange sometime in the 1940s, the football team wore black jerseys with gold trim through the 60s. The squad also used red numerals for a while in the late 1940s, and the squads' 1970 home jerseys were more red than orange. It wasn't until 1971 that a truly orange jersey was used by the football team for the first time.

The school's official colors are black and orange (PMS 165), and the trim color is gold (PMS 137), a small remembrance to harken back to ISU's rich history.

education in the health professions and trains healthcare professionals in fields ranging from dental hygiene and dietetics to nursing, physical therapy and radiology, as well as offering a residency for physicians specializing in family practice.

Current enrollment is 15,575 students with students attending the main campus in Pocatello as well as outreach centers in Idaho Falls, Twin Falls, Meridian-Boise, and Coeur d'Alene. ISU draws students from 48 states, 59 countries and every county in Idaho.


The main campus is in the midst of a major renovation of the Pond Student Union. Construction is underway on a new, expanded food court to be completed by the end of Fall Semester. A more expansive variety of food options, including Einstein Bros. Bagels, Mandalay Express, as well as gourmet burgers from Grille Nation will help satisfy student appetites. The Idaho State University

ISU Credit Union has just completed construction of a new high technology branch in the Pond Student Union to serve the University. This branch features a unique service philosophy, 'dialogue banking', that eliminates teller lines and allows members to actually see and

participate in transactions on their account by working side by side with Credit Union team members.

Idaho State University prides itself on innovation and opportunity. The Veterans' Sanctuary at ISU is the first transition and support program of its kind in the United States, providing first-class service to military veterans of all eras attending the University. A support team provides assistance with G.I. Bill benefits and offers guidance on campus from the moment student veterans arrive until they graduate. The "one-stop-shop" approach allows vets to access all campus services through a single office. The Veterans' Sanctuary is ISU's response to the urgent need for veterans' services expressed by veterans' groups throughout the country.



### Idaho State Academic Services

Every academic institution's first responsibility is to prepare its students for the best opportunity to graduate with their fullest potential. Idaho State understands this responsibility very well and instituted the Student-Athlete Support Center for its student-athletes, to enable them to balance the time requirements for both academics and athletics with the ultimate goal of obtaining their degree.

Under the direction of Nancy Graziano, and assisted by a strong and caring staff, the Student-Athlete Support Center provides a variety of services with that in mind.

The center's function begins even before a student-athlete sets foot on campus with transcript evaluation, and continues in helping the newcomer make the transition from high school or junior college to college. "When they arrive at ISU we want it to be a positive experience," Graziano says.

The Student-Athlete Support Center serves as a liaison for the student-athlete to all services available to the student population as a whole, including but not limited to career counseling, the counseling and testing office, the academic skills center, the registrar, financial aid, the placement office, postgraduate scholarships, and any other student services.

The office also provides tutoring, helps the student-athlete stay on track for graduation and NCAA eligibility, provides advising on general education courses until a major course of study is selected, and helps with career choices with the idea in mind that a college education can be more meaningful when a career is decided on. The office also makes presentations on drug and alcohol awareness available to the student-athletes.

"Even though our graduation rates are good, we are constantly striving to improve them," Graziano says. "The creation of the Student-Athlete Support Center is a positive step in that improvement."

The refurbished Student-Athlete Support Center was dedicated in 2003 and is located on the south side of Holt Arena. As part of the refurbishment, student computers and additional space for academic counseling were added, bringing added benefits to the students.

The department continues to grow, as in 2008, an expanded study center in Turner Hall was opened. The new center was funded with a \$40,000 grant obtained by Matt Steuart from the NCAA. The new study area features over a dozen computer stations, a quiet room, and has available tutoring for the student-athletes.



### Idaho State Sports and Orthopaedic Center

Idaho State's athletic facilities had already boasted of the first domed stadium capable of housing both football and basketball ever constructed on a college campus, as well as America's fastest indoor board track. With the June 1994 opening of the Sports & Orthopaedic Center at ISU, they include the premier weight training facility in the Big Sky Conference.

The 25,000-foot Center includes a 6,800-foot state-of-the-art weight training area that is reserved strictly for Idaho State's student-athletes. The area has weight lifting stations, stationary bicycles, and aerobics equipment, as well as an on-site strength and conditioning coach.

The Center also houses the offices of Drs. Tony Joseph, M.R. Mickelson, ISU's team physician, Steve Coker, Kenneth E. Newhouse, the offices of The Pocatello Physical Therapy Clinic with physical therapists Ric Benedetti and Dan DesFosses, and an alumni, recruitment and educational center with meeting and classrooms. It was built at a cost of \$2.5 million.

The Center is a joint venture of ISU and the Portneuf Medical Center and was 14 months in construction.

It is a major milestone for ISU in fulfilling its mission as the state's lead institution for health care education. It serves as an educational and training facility for health sciences students, faculty, area health care providers, and the community.

The Center is beneficial for ISU's student-athletes in numerous ways, aside from the enormous benefit of the area's premier weight training facility being next door to Holt Arena. First and foremost, student-athletes have immediate access to physicians and therapists as well as the equipment used in treatment and rehabilitation.

The Center was built at no cost to the public. The privately-financed structure will be leased to PMC and after the two 20-year land leases have expired, ownership is transferred back to Idaho State University.

Tom Brock is entering his seventh season with Idaho State University.

Tom is heading into his third year as the lead Football Athletic Trainer, but he also serves in assisting with the Men's and Women's Indoor Track and Field teams. Tom previously has spent three years as the lead Athletic Trainer with the Idaho State men's basketball program.

Brock has served under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Trainer Phil Luckey, assisting with the Football and Men's Basketball team's and being the Lead Athletic Trainer for the Outdoor Men's and Women's Track and Field Team's.

During his first two years at ISU Tom spent his first two years at Idaho State as a Graduate Assistant, where he served as the Athletic Trainer for a pair of Big Sky Conference soccer titles.

Brock works with the other ISU's staff of Athletic Trainers and Team physicians, from Idaho Orthopaedic Center, in providing injury prevention and care for the ISU athlete's to help them return to the competition quickly and safely. Tom also serves in assisting in providing First-Aid/CPR instruction for the athletic department.

Originally from Rahway, New Jersey Tom received an Associates degree from Rick's College, the transferred to Boise State University where he received a B.S. degree in Kinesiology in 2002, while serving as an Athletic Training student working with various athletic team's. While attending BSU Tom completed a summer Athletic Training Internship with the New Orleans Saints in 2001.

Tom completed his Masters Degree at Idaho State University in Athletic Administration in 2004. Tom is also an Eagle Scout.

## Strength and Conditioning

Mark Campbell has been a strength and conditioning coach for 23 years.

He has 10 national certifications and has trained athletes of all ages and all sports. Coach Campbell played line backer under coach Kyle Whittingham and was the defensive player of the year at Idaho State his senior year and tried out for the NFL and CFL. He started his career teaching, coaching and training in Hawaii at Punahou High School. While working at Punahou, Campbell started his first of two personal training companies. In addition, many of his high school clients have earned college scholarships. Campbell moved back to Pocatello in 1997 where he has coached at several schools in southeast Idaho. He joined Idaho State University in 2005. He became the Head Strength and Conditioning Coach in 2007. His certifications are: CSCS, ACSM, ACE, AFAA, YMCA (5), and battling ropes certified.



The beginning of 2010 marked a new era in Idaho State's ability to train and compete when Jared Allen donated \$200,000 to renovate the ISU weight room. The newly remodeled center was named in honor of Allen and has been dubbed The Jared Allen Strength and Conditioning Center at the Idaho Orthopaedic and Sports Center.

Allen's contribution includes the replacement of all of the current strength and conditioning equipment, all-new rubber flooring, and a new paint job as well. Allen, who had his jersey retired along with earning Hall of Fame and Ring of Honor status in November of 2009, will have his retired jersey framed and hung in the Allen Center.

While Allen has contributed in the past, most notably with the purchase of ISU's new football uniforms and the ISU football locker room renovation, this gives back not just to football, but to all programs at ISU. Idaho State has 15 varsity sports that compete in the Big Sky Conference or the Pacific Coast Softball Conference.

The donation is the second-largest ever received by ISU athletics, behind only the donation of land valued at over \$1 million in Driggs, Idaho by Sylvia Papenberg and her late husband Don which will go toward Miller Ranch Stadium (softball) and Papenfield Field, ISU's outdoor practice field. The contribution does top the \$150,000 donation for ISU's new video board by the Idaho Potato Commission. The renovation of the "Jared Allen Strength & Conditioning Center" will begin in mid December, and it will be in full working order for the student-athlete's spring semester of competition. The project is set to be completed on Sunday, January 10, 2010.

"The weight room at Idaho Orthopaedic has always been

a good facility for our athletes to train. When I was in Pocatello last spring I started talking to Donna Hays about a project for the athletic department," said Allen, who had his number retired on November 7, the day he was inducted into the ISU Sports Hall of Fame and the Ring of Honor. "I thought it would be awesome to update the weight room. I spend a lot of time working out and know how important it is for our athletes to have the best equipment available. Donna and I have been working out all of the details for the upgrade and I'm excited that we can announce that the plans are finalized and we are moving forward."

Mark Campbell, ISU's strength and conditioning coach, feels that having not only a revamped weight room will be a source of pride for ISU's athletes, but having some of the newest and best equipment will benefit everyone as well.

"Because of the great generosity that Jared Allen has shown, we will be able to take our strength and conditioning program to another level. The quality and variety of the equipment we will be getting will allow all the athletes of all sports to benefit and improve their athletic performance," said Campbell.


As a player at Idaho State, Allen was twice named All-America, including consensus first team honors in 2003, a year in which he broke the Idaho State single season and career sack records, leading the nation in sacks, tackles for loss, and forced fumbles. All was honored at the end of his senior season by being named the 2003 winner of the Buck Buchanan Award from the Sports Network as the I-AA Defensive Player of the Year. He has since gone on to star in the National Football League, first with the Kansas City Chiefs, and for the last two years with the Minnesota Vikings.



# Holt Arena History



## Holt Arena History

Idaho State has long been a national leader in innovative athletic facilities. In 1967, then-athletic director Milton 'Dubby' Holt first hit on the idea of playing both football and basketball in a domed structure on the ISU campus. The doors opened in September, 1970, with a 64-34 win over UNLV.

Only one domed facility predates Holt Arena: the Houston Astrodome. But ever since ISU demonstrated that a dome could be constructed at a reasonable price, which was \$2.8 million at the time, domes have proliferated around the country.

Holt Arena is presently one of the few totally-contained indoor stadiums anywhere. It consists of a 12,000-seat football field and an 8,000-seat basketball arena with a wooden floor from the Horner Flooring Company. In August of 2011, Holt Arena received an upgrade in field turf as Hellas Construction installed new turf that is used by the Dallas Cowboys.

Holt Arena has hosted many memorable events. Those coming to mind immediately include three NCAA Sub-Regional Basketball Tournaments, two of which ISU participated in, three NCAA Division I-AA playoff games involving Idaho State and two I-AA National Championship Games for which Pocatello bid to host and won, and numerous district and conference indoor track championships.

In 2001, Holt Arena hosted the Big Sky Conference Women's Basketball Tournament as well as the Golden Spike Invitational Track Meet, which was broadcast on ESPN.

The arena is also the site of numerous concerts by entertainers as diverse as Garth Brooks and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir, numerous state high school championships, and the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo.

In 2009, courtesy of the Idaho Potato Commission, a new 16x12 foot video board debuted, further increasing the fan experience at Holt Arena.

# 1981 National Champions



The 1981 Bengal squad went 12-1 on the way to the NCAA I-AA National Championship

In the fall of 1981, the Idaho State University football team shocked the nation, as the Bengals capped an improbable season with a I-AA national championship.

The season was all the more remarkable because in 1979 the Bengals went 0-11, and the championship came just 14 months after ending the longest losing streak in I-AA history at 19 games.


After an opening win over Eastern Washington, the Bengals took out defending national champion Boise State in Boise 21-10. They followed that with home wins over a strong Nevada team and Northern Arizona, and a road win at Portland State.

ISU lost at Montana 24-21, but they would not falter again. They knocked off Idaho on the road 24-14, and then scored impressive home wins over Montana State 21-3, and Utah State, 50-24, setting up a winner-take-all showdown with Weber State for the Big Sky title and a berth in the NCAA playoffs. The

game went to three overtimes, with ISU surviving a missed 32-yard field goal in the second overtime by WSU's Roger Ruzek that would have won the game. In the third overtime, Case deBruijn nailed a 33-yard field goal for a 33-30 win.

Idaho State then waltzed to the championship game after home wins against Rhode Island 51-0, and South Carolina State 41-12.

In the Pioneer Bowl, as the I-AA game was called, ISU went up against perennial power Eastern Kentucky, but the Bengals would not be denied, winning the title with a 34-23 victory.

# Caccia Field



On Saturday afternoon, October 6, 2007 on Homecoming against Northern Colorado, Idaho State University dedicated the Holt Arena playing surface to ISU's all-time winningest coach, Italo J. "Babe" Caccia. The field is now known as Caccia Field.

The ceremony took place on the field prior to the nationally televised game with the Bears, a long standing former Rocky Mountain Conference rival that Caccia's squads went 9-1 against over his coaching tenure. Flanked by

his wife and family, Caccia, who celebrated his 90th birthday during the week of the festivities, was called by ISU President Dr. Arthur C. Vailas "an institution, and a true Bengal".

Caccia, who was the Athletic Director for ISU's 1981 National Championship season and worked hand in hand with his best friend and Dome namesake Milton "Dubby" Holt, had the Holt Arena crowd in stitches at the ceremony, commenting that, "had I known all this would have happened, I'd be happy to turn 90 again next year!"



The Caccia Field logo was unveiled on the Holt Arena turf just prior to the start of the 2007 Homecoming game against Northern Colorado, a game ISU would win 26-14 on national television.



Babe coached the Bengals from 1952 through the 1965 season, compiling an all-time mark of 79-38-2. Babe's teams won Rocky Mountain Conference championships in 1952, 1953, 1955, 1957, and 1959, and he also won the first ever Big Sky Conference title in 1963. Caccia's legendary teams include a pair of undefeated squads in 1952 (8-0, 5-0 RMC) and in 1957 (9-0, 6-0 RMC). The 1957 team outscored their opponents 280-85, with only one game decided by 13 points or less.

Caccia's teams also went 11-3 on Homecoming, and fittingly, Idaho State scored a decisive 26-14 victory to commemorate the occasion and the christening of Caccia Field.





# Mike Kramer

## Idaho State Head Coach

### Idaho, 1977

### First Season

One of the most successful coaches in Big Sky football history is now an Idaho State Bengal. Mike Kramer was hired to be the Bengal's 25th head coach in program history on Nov. 22, 2010. Kramer has previously been the head coach at fellow Big Sky Conference schools, Eastern Washington and Montana State.

He is one of only five coaches in Big Sky history to be named Big Sky Coach of the Year three times: twice while at Montana State and once at Eastern Washington. He has 77 career wins, 53 of which came in league play which ranks

fourth all-time in conference history. He is the only coach to win Big Sky Coach of the Year honors at two different schools. His 53 Big Sky wins ranks third for most in the Big Sky record books. He needs only one victory to tie Don Read (Montana) and move into second place.

Kramer spent the last year as the assistant to the director of football operations at Washington State. Prior to Washington State Kramer was hired as the head coach at Montana State in 2000 where he coached at until May of 2007. During his time in Bozeman he amassed 40 wins and led the Bobcats to three Big Sky Conference championships. From 2002-07 MSU went 35-26, including an eight-win campaign in 2006 which at the time was the schools highest-total since 1984.

Kramer orchestrated five-straight winning seasons in Bozeman; the longest for the program in more than 40 years. Montana State's 2006 season featured the first postseason win and postseason home games since 1984 and a No. 10 final national ranking. The 2006 team lost in the quarterfinals to eventual national champion Appalachian State.

Kramer's defensive staff and then, with the addition of Don Bailey as offensive coordinator, rewrote most of the Bobcat record books during his seven year run. Records broken and surpassed included: most total offense, passing, rushing, and receiving records for single game, season, and career in almost every category. His 2001-03 teams lead the Big Sky Conference in total defense under the direction of current Boise State defensive coordinator Pete Kwiatkowski.

A key feature of Kramer's success was ending a 17-game losing streak to arch-rival Montana. In fact, the Bobcats under Kramer were able to beat the perennial Big Sky


Champion Grizzlies 3-of-4 contests 2002-05. Attendance at Bobcat games doubled and tripled to the current levels enjoyed by the Bobcat faithful.

Notable among the many of Kramer's outstanding Bobcat performers was quarterback Travis Lulay currently with the British Columbia Lions, running back Ryan Johnson who was named to the Elite Eight as a NCAA scholar athlete in 2003, cornerback Joey Thomas currently with the Oakland Raiders and center Jeff Bolton who was named the Rimington Award Winner (I-AA) after the 2005 season.

He also served as head coach at Eastern Washington, where he compiled a record of 37-32 from 1994-99, including the school's first outright conference title in 1997. That year he guided his team to the semi-finals of the FCS playoffs, the last Big Sky team other than Montana to make the semi-finals. His Eastern team lost to eventual national champion Youngstown State coached by Jim Tressel. From 1995 through 1999 the Eagles produced a 1,000 yard rusher every season.

The Colton, Wash., native began his coaching career at his prep alma mater as a student teacher and assistant coach in 1976, helping the team to an undefeated season and the state B-11 Championship. The next year, Kramer became teacher and assistant football coach at Helena High under eventual University of Montana Head Coach Mick Dennehy. In 1980, upon his mentor's departure to join the MSU staff, he was elevated to the head coaching position. During his highly successful tenure - he led the Bengals to their first winning season since 1958 - was capped with a stint as the winning head coach in the East-West Shrine Game in 1982.

After serving as Helena's head coach from 1980-82, Kramer joined the Bobcat staff in 1983 as a defensive line coach and a year later was part of the 1984 Big Sky Conference and NCAA I-AA national championship squad as the inside linebackers coach for head coach Dave Arnold. In 1985, Kramer assumed defensive coordinator duties and moved to coaching the secondary. Following the 1986 season, Kramer returned to the high school ranks as a teacher and head football coach at Tacoma Stadium High School and remained there for two seasons. In 1989, Dick Zornes hired Kramer as Eastern Washington's defensive line coach. In 1991, Kramer moved to the offensive side of the ball where he coached for three seasons helping the Eagles to a share of the Big Sky conference title in 1992.



As the head coach of the Eagles Kramer's teams rewrote most of the total offense, rushing, passing and receiving records at EWU. Those records were eclipsed by former Kramer assistant coach and eventual head coach Paul Wulff's teams 2000-07. Current national champion Eastern Washington's success followed on the heels of such Kramer luminaries as quarterback Harry Leons, running backs Rex Prescott and Michael McKenzie, offensive tackle Trent Pollard, and wide receiver Jeff Ogden. Kramer recruited to Eastern Washington eventual NFL defensive lineman Dario Romero and wide receiver Lamont Brighful.

A 1977 graduate of Idaho, Kramer started 36 of his 44 games on the offensive and defensive lines, including nine games at defensive end as a freshman in 1972. The next year he started seven games at center, and in 1974 and 1975 started at guard for current ISU tight ends coach Matt Troxel's grandfather Ed Troxel.

Kramer's education credentials include a bachelor of science degree from the University of Idaho, a master's degree in physical education from Eastern Washington and graduate studies in educational administration at Washington State University. He is an avid mountaineer with conquests of most of the tallest peaks in the Pacific Northwest including several different routes on Mt Rainier.

Mike's wife of 37 years Sandi is a health care administrator with degrees in nursing from Carroll College and Montana State University. They have two daughters: Courtney is Bozeman city historic preservationist with degrees from Montana State University and the University of Kentucky while Gretchen is a senior at Washington State University.

# Don Bailey

Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator/QB  
Portland State, '91  
First Season

Don Bailey enters his first year as the associate head coach and offensive coordinator at Idaho State. Bailey has proven to be one of the most innovative offensive coaches in the country as players at every school he has coached at have set school and conference records.

Before coming to Idaho State Bailey was the passing game coordinator, quarterbacks and wide receiver coach at South Dakota State. He coached Ryan Berry, a first-team Missouri Valley Conference member who led the league in passing with 3,106 yards and 30 touchdowns. Berry set single season South Dakota State records for most

completions, yards and attempts. By the end of the 2008 season, the SDSU offense had set nine offensive records.

In 2008 Bailey also coached Jaron Harris who earned first-team all-conference honors, leading the Jacks with 70 catches for 966 yards and 11 touchdowns. Glen Fox earned second-team all-conference honors with 66 catches for 792 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Prior to coaching at South Dakota State, Bailey coached the wide receivers from July 2007 to March 2008 at Weber State. He was responsible for tutoring Bryant Eteuati, a first-team all-conference honoree as wide receiver and kick returner and led the nation in all-purpose yards with 207.6 a contest,

Bailey was the offensive coordinator, quarterback and wide receivers coach under Kramer at Montana State where he helped guide the Bobcats to conference championships in 2002, 2003 and 2005. He coached Travis Lulay, a four-year starter at quarterback who ranks second-all-time in the Big Sky for total offense with 12,205 yards. He is the Bobcats all-time leading passer with 10,746 yards and 58 touchdowns. Lulay also rushed for 1,459 yards in his career with 23 touchdowns. He is a three-time all-conference selection. The former MSU quarterback ranked second in the nation in total offense in 2004 and ninth in 2005. He also had four receivers earn all-conference honors.

During Bailey's time at Montana State his offensive teams' broke a total of 109 offensive records, individual and team since 2001. On the receiving side, Bailey coached Junior Adams, Aaron Hill, Scott Turnquist and Rick Gatewood to all-conference selections. Adams ranks sixth all-time for receptions at Montana State while Turnquist ranks third all-time for yardage. Gatewood ranks fifth all-time at MSU in receptions and yards.

Bailey also spent time at Cal Poly as the offensive coordinator, quarterbacks and receivers coach where he coached Seth Burford, who was drafted in the sixth round by the San Diego Chargers. In 2000, Burford was sixth in the nation in passing efficiency, and set the single-season total offense record. Receiver Kassim Osgood garnered first-team All-American honors in 2000 as he set the single-season receptions and yardage record.

The Bengal offensive coordinator coached at Shepherd College and Cheyney University. Bailey coached on Pokey's Allen's staff at Portland State from 1991-93 and at Boise State from 1993-96. In 1994, Bailey was a part of the Bronco team that was on the national championship. Wide receiver Ryan Ikebe became the all-time leader in receiving yards and second all-time in receptions at 169.

While coaching at Portland State, Bailey was a part of a team that went to the playoffs each year.

Bailey graduated from Portland State in 1991 with a degree in Speech Communications.





# Derrick Roche

## Offensive Line

Washington State, '03

First Season

Derrick Roche enters his first year as the offensive line coach at Idaho State. Roche comes to Idaho State after spending the last three seasons at Millersville University coaching the offensive line.

Prior to Millersville, Roche was a graduate assistant coach at UTEP from August 2005-July 2008. During his time in El Paso he served as the special teams' program coordinator and the offensive line graduate assistant. He was responsible for special teams scouting report, defensive scout

team, film break down and assisting in coaching the offensive line.

Roche has also spent time assisting the Washington State football camps and he was a volunteer assistant coach at Kentridge High School in 2004.

Roche played at Washington State from 1998-2003 where he was on the team that played in the Rose Bowl in 2003 and the Sun Bowl in 2001. # Matt Troxel

**Tight Ends**  
Montana, '09  
First Season

Matt Troxel enters his first season as the tight ends coach at Idaho State University. He comes to Idaho State after serving as the graduate assistant coach at the University of Idaho since 2009.

During his time at Idaho he worked with the wide receivers in 2009 and the offensive line in 2010. He was in charge of coordinating the scout team defense, breaking all opponents' film and putting together the offensive scouting report. Troxel was a part of the 8-5 Idaho team that won the 2009

Humanitarian Bowl. The 2009 team finished ninth in total offense nationally.

Prior to coming to Idaho, Troxel was a student-assistant at Montana in 2008 where he assisted the wide receivers and coordinated the scout team defense.

Troxel played collegiate football at Montana from 2004-07 where his team was the 2004 1-AA National Runner-Up, and 2004 Big Sky Champion. Montana won the Big Sky championship all four years he played at Montana. In 2006, the Grizzlies advanced to the 2006 FCS semi-finals.

# Rudy Griffin

Inside Linebackers

Alabama, '06

First Season

Rudy Griffin enters his first year as the inside linebackers coach at Idaho State University. Griffin comes to Idaho State after spending a year as a graduate assistant coach at Washington State where he worked with the offensive line.

Last year at WSU, Griffin was in charge of editing game film, overseeing the recruiting budget, teaching individual skills and coordinating official recruiting visits.

Prior to working as a graduate assistant coach at Washington State, Griffin served as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Demopolis High School in Alabama from 2008-10. While at Demopolis he was responsible for calling plays and making personnel choices. Griffin's defense improved each year as they allowed only 14 points a game.

In 2008, Griffin saw three defenders sign to play Division I football and in 2009 his team won the 5A state championship, allowing only 17 points a game. That year the defense had 21 interceptions, 32.5 sacks and did not allow a 100-yard rusher in eight games. Two Demopolis' defenders signed to play Division I football in 2009.

Smaha spent the previous football season coaching the tight ends at Western Oregon where he assisted the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach in run game planning. Smaha coordinated walk-on players and

tracked player participation.

Anthony Tucker enters his first year as wide receivers coach at Idaho State. Tucker comes to Pocatello after spending last year working with the football program at Colorado as the offensive technical assistant.

Prior to Colorado, he served as the passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach at Lakewood High School in Lakewood, Calif., from 2006-09. In 2008-09, he also coached the wide receivers in the Best of the West Quarterback and Wide Receiver Skills Camp in Lakewood.

He spent four years in the NFL, originally signing as a free agent with the New York Giants in 1999 and earning a spot on the Giants' practice squad in 2000. He was allocated to NFL Europe from the Giants in 2001 and played for the Amsterdam Admirals. He signed with the St. Louis Rams in 2002 and then suffered a career-ending leg injury.

# 2011 Season Preview



This past off season has been a time of change for the Idaho State football program. The change started with Mike Kramer, the fourth winningest coach in Big Sky Conference history with 77 wins, being named the head football coach in November of 2010. Then this past summer new turf was installed in Holt Arena to add to the excitement of the upcoming 2011 season. Now the 2011 Bengals are ready to take that enthusiasm and begin the season.

"We are excited to begin with a new football team that has distinct physical attributes and a facility that allows us to be outside of the range of normal," Kramer said. "We want to be cutting edge as a team on and off the field. For us that began academically with a level of excellence. We proved that this past spring semester."

## Offense

"On offense we really want to press the envelope in

terms of yards gained, touchdowns scored, attempted and the pace of our attack," Kramer said. "Our offense should be able to pick up the pace with what we established as a staff in the last decade at Montana State. We want to not only equal but exceed the efforts we had under a couple of great quarterbacks there and we expect to do it immediately."

## Quarterback

The Bengalshave three quarterbacks on the roster in junior college transfers Kevin Yost and Justin Arias and freshman Brad Kragthorpe. All three student-athletes bring qualities the ISU coach loves and he is looking forward to the start of camp to see who emerges as the starter.

The one player that joined the team in January was Yost and he participated in spring ball and the coaches came away pleased with how he picked up the system. On his two junior college quarterbacks Kramer said, "Both have a great understanding of the sport and they both have quick releases. The only difference is Yost is a junior and Arias is a sophomore."

Kragthorpe comes to the Bengal football team with an excellent football heritage as his grandfather Dave was the head coach of ISU when the team won the National Championship in 1981 and his dad Steve was the head coach at Louisville and Tulsa and is currently the offensive coordinator at LSU.

"He is a little more slight in terms of height but he is as well schooled as any freshman quarterback is in the United States being that his dad is the former head coach at Tulsa at Louisville and is currently the offensive coordinator at LSU," Kramer said.

Overall the Bengal coaches like what all three quarterbacks bring to the table.

"All three guys are cerebral," Kramer said. "All three guys have quick releases. All three guys have good vision and all three guys are academically what we want. It is a great mix."

## Wide Receiver

The Bengal quarterbacks are going to have plenty of options to throw the ball too. Returning from last year's team is Rodrick Rumble, Luke Austin, Daniel McSurdy and Kelvin Krosch. Joining the squad this year are transfers Cameron Richmond, Derek Graves and Anthony Boyles.

Rumble had an impressive spring and Kramer said Austin and McSurdy "showed they can play effectively within our offense."

On the newcomers, Kramer said they will allow the offense to compete and be "mature, fast-paced and accomplished very early. We have excellent depth and versatility at our receiving corp."

## Tight End

One player who could be ready for a breakout season is junior Josh Hill. Hill, a two-year starter, emerged in the spring as a primary target for the Bengal quarterbacks and he will be counted on to catch a variety of passes this fall.

"A major factor of our receiving corp. is the development of Josh Hill at tight end, who I consider to be one of the top tight end prospects in the United States," Kramer said. "He has been a two year starter for us. He just hasn't had the ball thrown his way enough. The volume of his catches in the spring exceeded the volume of his catches last season. He showed he is not only capable of that type of volume but he is also talented enough to do something with the ball when he makes a catch. He is not a typical led footed tight end that can knock you off the ball. He is a slithery, fast vertical tight end that will have an impact on most imposing teams' defenses."

Backing up Hill at tight end is senior Andrew Zamora and Derek Despot.

## Running Back

The returning Bengal who garnered the most coverage and accolades in 2010 was Tavoy Moore. Moore was named to various All-American teams and turned out to be the team's top offensive threat with the ball, playing receiver and running back. This year he will be only a running back.

"We will allow him to be a full-time running back and showcase his talents as much as we can in the open field from the tailback position," Kramer said. "He won't be a hybrid and won't play wide receiver unless we shift our tailback position to a wide receiver spot. We might consider him already our featured player on offense."

Also expected to see time on the field is Jahmel Rover, who had a great spring and showed he is healthy after missing most of the 2010 season due to injury.

"During the course of our workouts he continued to show just how explosive our running back position is going to be given the fact that we are so spread out in our passing game," Kramer said.

Jarrod Daniels could also see time on the field but the Bengal coaching staff is going to be cautious on how and when they use him.

"He has tremendous straight ahead speed," Kramer said. "Given the fact that he is only a sophomore to be with a redshirt we will be careful about playing him early in the year unless he is a starter."

## Offensive Line

The offensive line will be anchored by Jon Van Vliet at center, Mark Clampitt at left guard, Brad Shedd at left tackle, Elijah Ruhl at right guard and Braeden Clayson at right tackle.

Van Vliet emerged as the starting center during spring practice and Kramer loves having Clayson and Shedd

at the tackle positions.

"Our two tackle positions are manned as well as I could have expected with Braeden Clayson and Brad Shedd," the Bengal coach said. "Shedd is one of the most outstanding tackles in the Big Sky Conference at 6-7, 300 while Clayson is a savvy guy that can play tackle and guard."

Nick Beckman, Erik Jacobson, who are coming off injuries will see time on the line as well.

## Defense

Kramer wants his defense to have the trait of variability and adaptability. In practice the defense will give the quarterbacks a feel for what they will really face in the games. The defense will align in a 3-4 set but have the ability to morph into a 4-3.

## Defensive Line

The defensive line will be anchored by senior Jordan Monga at nose tackle. The Bengal senior earned honorable mention all conference honors and his leadership qualities on and off the field have been vital for the team.

"He might be slight but he has already proven that he is a resolute, no quit never give up type of player which is perfect for us at the nose tackle," Kramer said. "We want him to be able to move latterly and to be able to pursue at the extreme. One of the natures of his personality he is already one of the best leaders on this team."

Monga will be backed by David Forrester and Austin Schnizler.

James Bergren is slated to start at left tackle. On the right side at tackle Jake Rouser is slated to start with freshman Washington State transfer Austin Graves as the backup.

"Jake Rouser went through spring as a starter," Kramer said. "We will rotate him with Austin Graves a freshman

transfer from Washington State who got better with every repetition during the spring."

### Linebackers

The most experience on defense comes at the inside linebacker position with seniors A.J. Storms and Basim Hudeen. Both players were the top two tacklers on the team last year and earned all-conference honors. Storms also garnered All-American honors as he led the nation in tackles in 2010 at 13.3 a game.

"They are excellent performers who were one and two in tackles on the team," Kramer said. "They are humble about their ability. Our inside line backing corp. is well manned and will be a position of strength on this team."

Backing up Hudeen is Jack Francis while Storms will be backed up by Jake Pele.

"Pele is our most improved player on defense," Kramer said.

The starting outside linebacker positions will be manned by Ryan Coleman and JT Albers with Ethan Monroe set to backup Coleman and Trevor Spence backing up Albers.

"Ryan Coleman fits the profile of what we want there," Kramer said. "He has become a valuable member of this team right away. JT Albers is a senior that has labored in obscurity at Idaho State in a variety of positions for whatever reasons. During the spring he showed he is a natural pass rusher and a physical player at the point of attack. He is savvy enough to drop into space on the short side. He is an important member of our defense. Depth behind those guys is unproven."

### Secondary

This is the position on the team that Kramer calls relatively unproven. Kelvin Miller and Cameron Gupton are slated to start at the corner positions with Tanner Davis and Greg Melendez going into fall camp as the starters at strong and free safety.

"They have not gone through the season as a starter at their positions," Kramer said. "That is probably the most vulnerable area of our team. I think we are capable. With Gupton and Miller at corner we have physical capability and with Davis and Melendez at safety we have size, strength and toughness but can we play at the level we need to play at to be successful remains to be seen."

Also expected to see time in the secondary is Donovan Henley and Antonio Evans.

"Their arrival will be key but after that the depth gets exceedingly slim," Kramer said. "We have to be careful in our secondary that we don't wear out, tire out and flame out."

### Special Teams

With Tavoy Moore returning kickoff and punts last year, the special teams unit turned out to be one of

the most explosive units on the Bengal football team. Moore returned two punts and two kickoffs back for touchdowns and garnered several All-American honors following the year.

David Harrington will handle the punting duties with Brendon Garcia taking care of all the place kicking responsibilities. Clint Brock will once again be the team's long snapper.

"We are very accomplished in the kicking game," Kramer said. "We will have two styles in our punting game which is to static punt, pro style, and roll punt."

# The Big Sky Conference



The Big Sky Conference enters its 49th year of athletic competition in 2011-12. The Big Sky is an NCAA Division I member in all sports, with member institutions classified in the Football Championship Subdivision (formally I-AA). The Big Sky returned to a nine-team format in 2006 with the addition of the University of Northern Colorado after spending five years as an eight-member league.

The current lineup includes Eastern Washington, Idaho State, Montana, Montana State\*, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Weber State. The league has become one of the strongest Division I conferences in the West and is a national leader in I-AA football. The Big Sky Conference was established in 1963 by six charter members – Idaho, Idaho State, Gonzaga, Montana, Montana State\* and Weber State. Those six schools formed the foundation of the Big Sky before the league expanded in 1970 by adding Boise State and Northern Arizona. Gonzaga left the Sky in 1979 and was replaced by Nevada, which gave the league eight members. The conference grew to nine schools in 1987 with the addition of Eastern Washington. The 1990s saw change in the makeup of the league, beginning in 1992 when Nevada departed and put the Big Sky back at eight teams. In 1996 Boise State and Idaho left and at the same time the conference added Portland State, Sacramento State and Cal State Northridge. The Big Sky maintained nine teams for five years before Cal State Northridge departed in the spring of 2001. With the addition of Northern Colorado, the Big Sky spreads across seven states

spanning from the Pacific Ocean to the Rocky Mountain Front. The Big Sky is represented along the entire west coast with schools in Washington, Oregon and California. League schools also range up and down the Rocky Mountains with institutions in Montana, Idaho, Utah, Arizona and now Colorado.



Of the eight western-most states in the contiguous United States only one, Nevada, is not represented in the Big Sky. On Feb 25, 1963, the name Big Sky was adopted by the six presidents of the charter members as the name of the new conference. The name Big Sky originated in a novel written by the late A.B. (Bud) Guthrie of Great Falls, Mont., in 1947 entitled "The Big Sky." Jack Hollowell, a former Montana advertising director, promoted the Big Sky theme for the Treasure State, and Harry Missildine of the Spokane Spokesman-Review called for the newly formed league to be named the Big Sky Conference in his column dated Feb. 20, 1963.

The Big Sky sponsors championships in 14 sports, including men's and women's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field, basketball and tennis. In addition, there are also championships in football, and women's volleyball, golf and soccer.

The 2007-08 season will mark the 20th year that the Big Sky Conference will sponsor championships in women's sports. The former Mountain West Conference existed from 1982-88, sponsoring championships for women's sports at the same institutions the Big Sky had men's programs. The Big Sky merged with the Mountain West in 1988, forming one league for both men and women.

Doug Fullerton, the fifth commissioner of the Big Sky Conference, will enter his 12th year at the helm. Fullerton took over the Big Sky on July 1, 1995, replacing longtime commissioner Ron Stephenson. Stephenson served the league for 14 years. Steve Belko was the commissioner from 1977-81 while John Roning held the post from 1971-77. The first league commissioner was Jack Friel, who served from 1963-71.

# Game 1: Idaho State 32 Montana Western 3

## Attendance: 4,797; Stadium: Holt Arena



**POCATELLO, Idaho (Sept. 4, 2010)** - Redshirt freshman quarterback Kyle Morris passed for 189 yards and three touchdowns while transfer running backs Corey White and Jahmel Rover teamed up for 234 rushing yards as Idaho State won its 2010 season opener 32-3 over Montana Western at home in Holt Arena Saturday evening.

The victory marked the first time ISU held an opponent without a touchdown since the last time the Bengals played the Bulldogs, a 37-0 win in 2005 at home. Montana Western gained only 141 yards, minus-three on 21 rushes. ISU rushed for 269 yards and passed for 189 for a total of 458 yards in 34:45 of possession.

Morris, from Ukiah, Calif., completed 17-of-26 passes, one interception, for 189 yards. He opened the game's scoring by hitting sophomore wide receiver Rodrick Rumble with a short toss that Rumble converted into a 49-yard touchdown. It was the game's first play from scrimmage and followed a 44-yard kickoff return by transfer all-purpose back Tavoy Moore.

Moore totaled 203 yards of all purpose running, 32 on three rushes, 40 on three pass receptions, 78 on two kickoff returns, and 53 on two punt returns. Several times, he was tripped up by the last defender. A 41-yard field goal by Mackenzie Crossley with 4:22 left in the first quarter closed the margin to 7-3, but was the visitors' only mark on the scoreboard for the contest.

ISU scored a safety early in the second quarter when, following a 47-yard punt by David Harrington that pinned the Bulldogs deep, a bad Montana Western punt snap went out of the end zone.

The Bengals closed first-half scoring when a 34-yard punt return by Moore provided good field position and three plays later White gained 45 of his 126 yards en route to the end zone.

ISU scored on its first two second-half possessions when Morris capped a 67-yard drive with a five-yard TD toss to sophomore tight end Josh Hill, then freshman kicker Brendan Garcia toed a 50-yard field goal.

ISU had a team defensive effort. No one had more than transfer cornerback Kenny Viser's seven stops, but junior defensive tackle Jordan Monga's six tackles included three for loss, senior defensive tackle Chris O'Donnell had a sack, and cornerback Kelvin Miller recorded a pick.

# Game 2: Utah State 38 Idaho State 17

**LOGAN, Utah (Sept. 11, 2010)** -- Quarterback Diondre Borel keyed a balanced attack as Utah State defeated Idaho State 38-17 in Logan. But Bengal quarterback Russel Hill saw his first action of the season and led ISU to two late touchdowns.

Borel completed 21 of 26 passes for 25 yards and one touchdown, and rushed for 28 yards and one touchdown as the Aggies unveiled a no-huddle offense that tired out an ISU defense that was unable to substitute.

But the game's most important factor from ISU's standpoint was the return of Hill, who sat out the season opener and first half of this contest with a knee injury. He entered the game with 3:23 left in the third quarter and sparked an ISU team that trailed 31-3 at the time by directing two fourth-quarter touchdown drives.

Hill completed 13 of 22 passes for 162 yards and one touchdown. After safety Chis Holmesly intercepted a pass, Hill threw a five-yard scoring toss to receiver Isaiah Burel with 2:57 left in the game. And after linebacker Phillip Arias recovered an Aggie fumble on the 33, Hill hit Burel with a 32-yarder to set up runningback Corey White's one-yard TD burst with 1:30 left.

Utah State outgained ISU 542 yards to 285, rushing for 275 yards and passing for 267. Linebacker A.J. Storms led ISU's valiant defensive effort with 20 tackles. Holmesly had 12 stops plus the interception.

ISU, starting fast, opened the scoring on Brendon Garcia's 36-yard field goal. Tavoy Moore's 43-yard kickoff return, a 12-yard pass to Moore from quarterback Kyle Morris and a personal foul penalty put Garcia in position. A stout effort by ISU's defensive front controlled the Aggies' running game early, so USU head coach Gary Andersen, a former ISU assistant in the mid-'90s, opted to go with a Wildcat attack. Runningback Kerwynn Williams took a direct snap and got the Aggies on the scoreboard with a 27-yard run with 0:36 left in the first quarter.

Borel's three-yard run stretched Utah State's lead to 14-3 with 8:29 left in the half. The Aggies got the ball when ISU receiver Isaiah Burel bobbled a Morris pass and USU's Rajric Coleman stole the ball on the 50 in a play ruled an interception. A 23-yard Pete Caldwell field goal with 0:05 left in the half made it 17-3 Aggies at the intermission.

# Game 3: Northern Colorado 35 Idaho State 21

## Nottingham Field; Attendance 5,497



**GREELEY, Colo. (Sept. 17, 2010)** - A four-touchdown performance by Northern Colorado's slippery quarterback Dylan Orms overcame an ISU-record all-purpose running effort by Tavoy Moore as the Bears prevailed 35-21.

Orms, a 6-1, 195-pound junior, completed 18 of 24 passes for 188 yards and two scores and had touchdown runs of four and one yards.

That offset Moore's 318-yard all-purpose running effort that included a 91 yard return of the opening kickoff to give ISU a 7-0 lead and an 81-yard punt return with 9:34 left in the game to get ISU back in the game 28-21. He returned three kickoffs for 128 yards, two punts for 109 yards, caught five passes for 57 yards and rushed twice for 24 yards.

The previous school record was 310 all-purpose yards by Alfredo Anderson at Montana State in 1994. ISU's last kickoff return for a touchdown was a 100-yarder by J.D. Ponciano in 2007 vs. Montana.

The story of the game for ISU was missed opportunities. In one sequence near the end of the first half, Moore had yet another scoring punt return called back by off-setting penalties, the re-kick of only six yards went out-of-bounds on the Bears 13 , then Brendan Garcia missed a 25-yard field goal wide right with 0:47 left.

Deep in UNC territory late in the third quarter , running back Corey White ripped off a nifty 11-yard gain but fumbled on the UNC 15. On the ensuing possession, Orms marched the Bears 72 yards, climaxed by his 26-yard TD pass to wide receive Jace Davis.

On ISU's next possession, quarterback Russel Hill, who relieved starter Kyle Morris on the last series of the first half, hit wide receiver Rodrick Rumble wide open with a 30-yarder that the latter bobbled then dropped with no one between him and the goal line.

The final score is misleading. Ahead 28-21, Bear punter Cameron Kaman buried a 57-yard punt out of bounds on the ISU 1 with 2:33 left. ISU had to try for the first down on fourth and eight, the Bears held and two plays later punched in their final score from the one.

Defensive end Sean Rutten led a defensive effort that limited the Bears to 322 yards. Rutten recorded four quarterback sacks, his first sacks of the year, among his 11 tackles. He neared the school one-game record of 5.5 sacks by Josh Hays set in a 1994 game vs. Boise State.

Linebackers Basim Hudeen and A.J. Storms had a game-high 14 stops each. Defensive linemen Jake Rouser and Justin Vae'ena each had a sack and safety Dustin Tew intercepted a pass.

# Game 4: Northern Arizona 32 Idaho State 7

## Holta Arena ; Attendance 6,626



**POCATELLO, Idaho (Sept. 24, 2010)**—The Idaho State football team played in front of its largest crowd since October of 2008 as 6,626 fans came to support the Bengals on Homecoming Day. The 1963 Big Sky championship team was also honored at halftime on a day where ISU lost 32-7 at Holt Arena to Northern Arizona. The previous largest crowd came in October of 2008 when 6,636 fans watched the Bengals against NAU.

The Bengal defense held the NAU rushing attack to only 3.9 yards a carry as Northern Arizona carried the ball 41 times for 160 yards. Northern Arizona had 369 yards of total offense while ISU had 151 yards.

Chris Holmesly led the Bengals with 13 tackles while A.J. Storms had 11. Corey White led the Idaho State rushing attack with 43 yards on 10 carries while Josh Hill caught four passes for 48 yards.

Idaho State's touchdown came with 2:41 left in the game when Rodrick Rumble caught a 21-yard pass from Russel Hill.

The touchdown came after Holmesly forced a fumble that was recovered by Chad O'Donnell.

Northern Arizona led 15-0 at halftime, scored 14 points in the third quarter and added a field goal before the Bengals scored their touchdown.

# Game 6: Montana 47 Idaho State 28

## Washington-Grizzly Stadium ; Attendance 25,568



**MISSOULA, Mont. (Oct. 9, 2010)** - Tavoy Moore broke his own school record for all-purpose yards in a game as he had 323 on Saturday afternoon at No. 12 Montana. He became only the third player in Idaho State history to return a kickoff for 100-yards and he also returned punt 84-yards for a touchdown later in the fourth quarter. Moore's play wasn't enough as Idaho State lost 47-28 at No. 12 Montana in front of a crowd of 25,568 at Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

Moore now has three kickoff returns for a touchdown, tying a Big Sky record with Bashir Livingstson of Eastern Washington in 1998.

Moore previously set the school record for all-purpose yards with 318 at Northern Colorado earlier in the year.

Russel Hill passed for 142 yards in three quarters of play and Kelvin Krosch caught five passes for 59 yards and one touchdown while Phil Pleasant rushed nine times for 37 yards. For the second time this season A.J. Storms had 20 tackles, tying his career high.

The Bengal defense forced three Montana turnovers, led by Jarrid Nash recording his first-career interception and recovering a fumble.

Jake Hutton put the Bengals on the scoreboard with his first career touchdown with 2:38 left in the first half on one-yard run. The ISU drive took 10 plays on 80 yards and lasted 5:25. Idaho State then cut the Montana lead to 30-14 with 4:46 left in the third quarter when Hill connected with Krosch on an eight-yard reception.

Moore's first touchdown was the 100-yard kickoff return with 10:24 to play in the game. He then had his 84-yard punt return with 1:42 left in the contest.

# Game 7: Weber State 16 Idaho State 13

## Holt Arena ; Attendance 5,083



**POCATELLO, Idaho (Oct. 16, 2010)**- The Idaho State defense forced five Weber State turnovers and Dustin Tew tied a school record for longest interception at 100 yards but the Bengals last chance 55-yard field goal to send the contest into overtime fell short as Weber State defeated ISU 16-13 on Saturday at Holt Arena.

Idaho State (1-6, 0-5) picked off Weber State (3-3, 2-2) quarterback Cameron Higgins four times. Basim Hudeen, Chris Holmesly, Cameron Gupton and Tew all had the interceptions while Sean Rutten recovered a fumble.

The Idaho State offense had 255 total yards led by Russel Hill's 195 yards passing. Tavoy Moore had 57 yards receiving, 66 yards rushing for 172 all-purpose yards.

After a scoreless first quarter, Tew put the Bengals on the board when he picked off Higgins at the goal line and returned it 100-yards for a touchdown with 11:54 remaining in the second quarter. The last 100-yard interception return for a touchdown was D.J. Clark on Nov. 3, 2007, also against Weber State.

Weber State then tied the game at seven with a touchdown at the 8:35 mark of the second quarter and then took a 10-7 lead at halftime after Shaun McClain kicked a 20-yard field goal with two seconds left in the half.

ISU scored the next six points in the third quarter after Brendon Garcia connected on 22 and 45-yard field goals, giving ISU a 13-10 lead with 5:09 left in the third.



# Game 8: Montana State 23 Idaho State 20 (OT)

## Holt Arena ; Attendance 5,740



**POCATELLO, Idaho (Oct. 30, 2010)** - In a game where Kristen Chatterley, Lemaefe Galeai, Christina Shoemaker and Don Neves were honored for being inducted into the ISU Sports Hall of Fame, the Bengal football team took No. 13 Montana State to overtime before falling 23-20 on Saturday afternoon at Holt Arena.

With the score tied at 17, Montana State kicker Jason Cunningham missed a 41-yard field goal as time expired to send the game into overtime. In the extra stanza, Idaho State's Brendon Garcia kicked a 27-yard field goal to give the Bengals a 20-17 lead. Montana State then got the ball and quarterback Denarius McGhee scored on the first play from scrimmage breaking several tackles for a 25-yard touchdown run and victory.

The Bengal defense held a Montana State offense that was averaging 39 points a game to only 23 points and forced four turnovers. The ISU defense has forced nine turnovers in the last two games. Basim Hudeen, Leki Fuapau, Justin Vae'ena and Jacob Hutton all recovered fumbles. Hudeen and Chris Holmesly had a career-high in tackles as Hudeen has 15 with one tackle for loss, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Holmesly had 14 tackles with one forced fumble.

The ISU offense had 189 yards of total offense. Russel Hill was 13-for-23 with two touchdowns and 175 yards passing. Kelvin Krosch caught four passes for 46 yards and one touchdown while Tavoy Moore caught four passes for 34 yards. Rodrick Rumble had three passes for 22 yards while Hutton and Josh Hill each caught a pass. Hill's reception was a 34-yard touchdown catch.

ISU jumped out to a 7-0 lead in the first quarter when Hill connected with Krosch in the end zone for a 19-yard reception. The drive was an 83-yard drive on nine plays, the offense's longest scoring drive of the season. The score was set up after MSU running back Orenzo Davis fumbled on the ISU 21-yard line.

Montana State came back to tie the game at seven on the ensuing possession. Idaho State went into halftime leading 10-7 after Garcia connected on a 27-yard field goal with 3:24 left in the half.

Phil Pleasant had five carries for 29 yards and Tavoy Moore scored Idaho State's touchdown on a 25-yard reception from Kyle Morris with 8:51 left in the game.

"We played our tails off to the very end," Zamberlin said. "I was proud of how we represented the program and University. This is a pretty good storied program so I am proud of my guys."

The ISU defense held Georgia to no touchdowns in the first quarter and only trailed 6-0 after the first quarter. But after two Idaho State interceptions Georgia was able to score 35 second quarter points to lead 41-0 at the break.

# Game 10: Sacramento State 45 Idaho State 17

**POCATELLO, Idaho (Nov. 13, 2010)** - The Idaho State football team dropped its final home game of the season to Sacramento State, 45-17 on Saturday afternoon at Holt Arena on Senior Day. The Bengals dropped to 1-9 and 0-7 in Big Sky play while Sacramento State improved to 6-4 and finished Big Sky play with a 5-3 mark.

Idaho State had 243 yards of total to Sacramento State's 451. Russel Hill threw for 224 yards and two touchdowns while Rodrick Rumble caught six passes for 93 yards and Kelvin Krosch caught five passes for 63 yards.

"I thought Kelvin and Rodrick competed and made some plays," Idaho State coach John Zamberlin said. A.J. Storms, the nation's leading tackler, had 13 tackles.

Idaho State fell behind early, 21-3 in the first quarter and trailed 28-3 at halftime. Sacramento State then scored 17 third quarter points to lead 45-3 after three quarters.

"In the first half we lost our poise and composure but I thought we got it back in the second half," Zamberlin said. "We talked about it at halftime and said focus on one play at a time and stay together. They got their composure back and I am proud of that."

The Bengals scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter, the first came with 14:13 left in the game when Hill hit tight end Josh Hill for a five-yard pass in the end zone. Then with 5:06 to play, Hill connected with Tavoy Moore on a 39-yard touchdown reception.

The Bengals close out the season next Saturday at Eastern Washington.



**Cheney, Wash (Nov. 20, 2010)**- The Idaho State football team dropped its final game of the 2010 season at No. 3 Eastern Washington, 34-7 on a cold Saturday afternoon in front of 5,781 fans at Roos Field. The Bengals finished the season 1-10 while Eastern Washington improved to 9-2 and 7-1 in Big Sky play. Eastern Washington and Montana State are co-Big Sky champions.

AJ Storms led ISU with 18 tackles. It was his third straight double figure tackle game and his eighth of the season. Chris Holmesly had 13 tackles for ISU. Jordan Monga had two sacks and Jarrid Nash had one.

Idaho State had 243 yards of total offense. Russel Hill passed for 186 yards and one touchdown while Tavoy Moore had 64 yards rushing on 15 carries. Moore finished with 170 yards of all-purpose yards. Kelvin Krosch had a season-high 75 yards on five receptions and one touchdown.

ISU pulled out the tricks early as they opened the game by recovering an onside kick. The Bengals were unable to convert on the play. ISU trailed 7-0 after the first quarter. Then with 14:25 left in the second quarter Idaho State tied the game at 7-7 when Hill connected with Krosch on a 22-yard reception in the end zone. Krosch had to go up and grab the ball with two defenders on him. The scoring drive was a six play, 60-yard drive that took 1:57.

Idaho State trailed 28-7 at halftime and the Bengal defense held Eastern Washington to two second half field goals.

## DR. ARTHUR C. VAILAS, ISU PRESIDENT

Arthur C. Vailas became the 12th president of Idaho State University on July 1, 2006. He has placed ISU on a trajectory to become a major research institution that provides the highest quality education to its students. Under his direction, ISU engages in teaching, research and service designed to respond to local, national and global societal needs, especially in the fields of energy, health care and the environment.

Since arriving, President Vailas has increased substantially the university's financial reserves, while at the same time purchasing and implementing a universitywide, comprehensive information system. In 2010, he led a collaborative effort to reorganize the university to enhance student program offerings and increase administrative efficiency. External research funding increased 27 percent in 2010. In January 2011, the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching announced that ISU's classification had been elevated to "Research University-High" status, placing ISU in a field enjoyed by less than 5 percent of all higher academic institutions.

Under his leadership, enrollment has increased substantially. From 2006 to 2009, enrollment increased more than 10 percent, with residence halls nearly full. The Early College program, which allows high school students to take university courses at reduced cost, has expanded. To attract and assist returning military personnel seeking educations, the university operates the Veterans' Sanctuary and was recognized as a military-friendly school for 2011 by G.I. Jobs magazine. Idaho State University has more graduate full-time equivalent students than any other university in Idaho. In 2011, the athletics department received full NCAA certification.

President Arthur Vailas

Fundraising successes and partnerships have resulted in the construction of new facilities for teaching and research. The 200,000 square-foot ISU Meridian Health Science Center, which opened in 2009, houses all of ISU's Treasure Valley health professions programs and represents a partnership with the Meridian School System and the City of Meridian. Its L.S. Skaggs pharmacy facility is the result of a \$6 million gift from the ALSAM Foundation. A recent gift from Delta Dental supports the ISU dental residency clinic in Meridian.

In Pocatello, the Energy Systems and Technology Education Center is a partnership with the Idaho National Laboratory and Partners for Prosperity and enjoys equipment made possible by Qwest.

In Idaho Falls, a new 55,000 square-foot building for the Center for Advanced Energy Studies was formed through

partnerships with the other Idaho universities, the U.S. Department of Energy and private entities. There, researchers are working on the latest in energy technology.

Athletics has benefitted from a gift to name the Papenberg Softball Field, and has received gifts from Idaho Central Credit Union and Idaho State University Credit Union for a new basketball court and football field. An endowment for the performing arts has been established to attract and support visiting artists and artists-in-residence.

Prior to joining ISU, President Vailas was vice president for research and intellectual property management for the University of Houston, and vice chancellor for research for the University of Houston System, where he also was an advisor to the Texas governor on energy, helped establish the Research Partnership to Secure Energy for America, and developed a formal affiliation between UH and the Texas Medical Center. He served on the NASA national advisory council and was on the executive board of the Southeastern Universities Research Association. Earlier, he held faculty and leadership positions at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and University of California-Los Angeles.



An accomplished biomedical researcher, President Vailas is the author of numerous peer-reviewed scientific publications, national grants and honors and has held leadership positions on national boards and scientific committees. He earned his Ph.D. at the University of Iowa, where he also completed a three-year NIH postdoctoral fellowship in biochemistry and a research fellowship in the Department of Orthopedic Surgery of the University of Iowa College of Medicine.

## JEFF TINGEY, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Jeff Tingey enters his fifth full year leading the Idaho State University athletic department, and his third as the Director of Athletics after spending a year as the interim director. Already, in a short amount of time he has already shown a keen knack for marketing and fundraising, and he has overseen several job openings at Idaho State,

including spearheading the largest corporate gift in ISU athletics history, from the Idaho Potato Commission for a new video board in Holt Arena. He became the Interim Athletic Director after spending his first year as the Assistant Athletic Director for Marketing and Corporate Sales.

As the Director of Athletics, Tingey will oversee all aspects of Idaho State's 15-sport athletic program, with specific tasks of raising Idaho State's profile both in the Big Sky Conference, the West, and within and throughout Southeast Idaho.

Already in his short tenure, Tingey has overseen the final aspects of a budget recovery plan that saw Idaho State recover from a near \$800,000 deficit to hit the black heading into the 2008-09 season. He has also increased ISU's marketing presence in the community, bringing in nearly \$600,000 in corporate dollars to the athletic department, and expanding ISU's influence in the region.

He also has improved athletic department

communication with the implementation of a "Coaches Cabinet", and he has championed President Vailas' mantra of transparency as well.

Along with the video board, other capital improvements early in his tenure include a refurbishment of the ISU football locker room, getting rid of the old metal lockers for new oak lockers donated as part of the Bengal Locker Room Project.

As the Assistant Athletic Director for Marketing and Corporate Sales, Tingey oversaw all Bengal Sport Properties and ISU's corporate partner program while providing leadership and oversight for marketing and promotions.

In 2006-07, Tingey had spent year at Brigham Young, where he handled the marketing profile for football, coordinating game-day presentation, scripts, and pre and post-game activities for the football team. Jeff also oversaw the marketing profiles for men's volleyball, women's soccer, women's basketball, softball, golf, cross country, and track and field. Tingey also coordinated many athletic department special events and trade accounts.

Jeff graduated from Weber State University, where he ran track for two years, from 2000-2002. While there, he worked as an intern in the Weber State marketing department, and was then hired as the Assistant Marketing Director after graduating,

staying there for four years. While with the Wildcats, he was responsible for the marketing and promotions for women's soccer, volleyball, and basketball, and he also handled a variety of special events for the Wildcats, including the football tailgate party and Big Sky Conference Tournaments.

Tingey is a Pocatello native, having lettered in track and football at Highland High School. He then went to Ricks College where he played football and ran track before serving a two-year LDS Mission to Fresno, California. He and his wife Amber have a three-year old son, Ammon and twins Burklee and Kellan

## NANCY GRAZIANO

### Associate Athletic Director for Student Support Services + Senior Woman Administrator

Nancy Graziano enters her 26th year with the Idaho State University athletic department. After six years as an assistant women's basketball coach, Graziano assumed the duties of Director of Student Support, and has served as ISU's NCAA Compliance Coordinator. As the Associate Athletic Director for Student Support Services, she oversees academics, compliance, the training room, the weight room, and the equipment room. Graziano has served for the past 17 years as Idaho State's Senior Women Administrator.

Nancy has taught an introductory orientation class for all incoming freshman and transfer student-athletes. Nancy is the liaison between the student-athletes and academic resources at ISU. She advises and assists the student-athletes in achieving their academic goals. Nancy works with the Faculty Athletic Representative to monitor the Student Athlete's progress toward graduation and their Big Sky Conference/NCAA academic eligibility. She also works with all coaches, keeping them informed of their student-athlete's academic progress, and she handles all questions regarding

compliance and NCAA regulations. Nancy regularly holds rules education seminars for the athletic staff on compliance and rules education issues, and she keeps the athletic department updated on new issues and bylaws.

She came to Idaho State in 1985 as an assistant women's basketball coach after a highly successful prep coaching career. Graziano compiled a 284-43 basketball record in 15 years at Alemany High School in Mission Hills, California. Her Alemany softball teams were also 214-28 in 12 years, a total which included 12 league championships. A three-sport coach, Graziano's volleyball teams were 165-75. Graziano was Girls' Athletic Director at Alemany (1977-83), Director of Athletics (1983-85), and chaired the Department of Physical Education from 1975-85. Nancy completed her undergraduate work at Cal State Northridge, and earned her Master's degree in Athletic Administration from Idaho State University in 1990. In 2006 she was honored as the Grand Marshall of the ISU Homecoming Parade.



## JIM KRAMER

### Assistant Athletic Director for Financial Services

Jim Kramer enters his seventh year with Idaho State University as the university's first Assistant Athletic Director for Financial Services, coming to Pocatello from Indiana University-Purdue University-Indianapolis, where he served as the fiscal manager for the IUPUI Sport Complex.

With Idaho State, Kramer oversees the athletic budget, and he assists all members of the athletic department with university purchasing policy and procedures. He coordinates all budgetary matters, including team and individual travel, equipment, and much of ISU's scholarship allocation procedures. Jim was instrumental in ISU turning an \$800,000 deficit into the black, and he has instituted several new procedures to help streamline ISU's fiscal procedures.

At IUPUI, Kramer was responsible for a \$2.3 million operating budget, and managed their accounts

payables and receivables and department payroll. Kramer also handled several facility issues including event ticket sales, overseeing the pro shop and management of the business office staff.

Kramer also served for 10 years with the Indianapolis Star/News, contributing to area coverage of various high school, college, and professional events in the greater Indianapolis area.

Jim earned his B.B.A. in finance and marketing from The Ohio State University in 1986, and his master's in business administration from the University of Akron in 1993. He and his wife Mary have three children Maura, Joseph, and Thomas.



## JAY MCMILLIN

### Assistant Athletic Director for Development and Major Gifts

Jay McMillin enters his 14th year with Idaho State University, and his third as Assistant Athletic Director for Development & Major Gifts after spending two years as the Executive Director of the Bengal Foundation.

As the Director of Major Gifts, McMillin will work with the ISU Development Office to identify and procure major gift contributions to the athletic department. Jay will concentrate much of his time towards raising funds for Bengal Village. Along with working with athletics, Yizar is also the Associate Director of the Student Success Center where he has the charge of improving retention university wide.

Prior to assuming this position in 2010, he was the Associate Dean of Students from 2008-10 where he was second in command in the Division of Student Affairs. In this position he provided leadership to Student Affairs units in building and maintaining collaborative relations among university divisions. Yizar was the Interim Associate Dean of Students from 2006-08.

From 2000-06, Yizar served as the Assistant Dean of Students where he coordinated leadership

services between Student Affairs, Academic Affairs, student organizations and community agencies. Prior to that position, he served at the TRIO Director from 1994-2006, the Assistant TRIO Director from 1990-94 and a counselor and learning specialist from 1984-90.

During this time Yizar has been involved in many projects campus-wide. He served as a steering committee member for athletics NCAA Athletic Department certification process. He also coordinated the annual new freshman parent orientation program and was the acting director for University Housing in 2007. Other recent projects include being the Coordinator of New Student Orientation Program, Director of Diversity Resource Center, chair of the Multicultural Committee and chaired the Student Employee of the Year Committee.

Yizar graduated from Idaho State with a Bachelor of Arts in secondary education in 1982. He received his master's in counseling degree in 1990 with an emphasis in student personnel in higher education and then earned a management development program certificate from Harvard in 1998. In December of 2010 he will complete his Doctorate of Education degree with an emphasis in higher education administration from Idaho State.

Steve Schaack enters his second year as the Assistant Athletic Director for Media Relations at Idaho State. In his first season with the Bengals he worked with football and men's basketball. This season he will be covering football, men's basketball, softball and golf.

Prior to Idaho State Schaack spent three years in the athletic communications department at Fresno State. He was promoted to associate athletic communications director in July 2010 before moving on to the position at Idaho State.





# Bengal Champions

The Idaho State athletic department has a storied past sprinkled with Olympians, pro athletes, NCAA and Big Sky champions as well as All-Americans.

## On the National Stage

In the 100-plus year history of ISU athletics, the teams have totaled 29 NCAA post-season appearances and one AIAW showing. Probably the most visible of those appearances culminated in the Bengals winning the NCAA Division I football championship in 1981.

Bengal athletes have also earned 18 NCAA individual championships, including 16 in boxing, a sport which was discontinued by the NCAA in 1961.

One hundred Bengals have garnered national recognition in the form of All-America honors, since records were kept. Forty-seven footballers along with 51 individuals from the track and cross country programs have received the prestigious athletic award. One Bengal, Jared Allen, has also garnered ISU's only National Player of the Year Award, as he was named the 2003 Buck Buchanan Award winner.

## In the Conference

Idaho State has been successful on the conference level, tallying 71 Big Sky post-season appearances including 38 championship titles. The Bengal track/cross country

program has nabbed 21 Big Sky team titles dating back to the 1963-64 season - the most of any ISU program.

Before joining the Big Sky Conference, ISU also boasted 29 more postseason conference appearances, 12 in men's basketball, nine in track and five in football as a member of the Rocky Mountain Conference as well as three in volleyball as a part of the Mountain West Athletic Conference. Of those 29 appearances, the Bengals took home 26 titles, nine each in men's basketball and track, five in football and two in volleyball.

Individual Bengal athletes have also found success on the Big Sky level, snagging 298 conference titles overall. ISU tracksters have garnered 276 of those titles, while men's and women's tennis athletes have contributed 20 to the total and men's and women's golf have one each to its credit.

## On Top of the World

Idaho State's reach has not ended with the college ranks as several ISU athletes have gone on to the professional and elite ranks in their respective sports.

NBA teams have picked up 15 Idaho State hoopsters since 1963, while 39 Bengals have played, or are currently playing in the NFL.

The Arena Football League has claimed several Bengals on its rosters while over 20 former ISU players

have suited up in the Canadian Football League. Idaho State players have also been well represented in the Indoor Pro Football League, the National Indoor Football League, the Arena Football League, and one Bengal even strapped on an XFL helmet. Over 10 Bengals have also played in AF2.

But ISU's cream of the crop athletes have made it to the highest level of competition in the world; the Olympic Games. Eleven Bengals beginning in the 1952 Games have

represented ISU and their respective countries at the Olympics.

Four boxers, five track athletes and two coaches have competed for four different countries at eight different Olympic Games, highlighted by Stacy Dragila winning gold in the inaugural women's pole vault in Sydney, Australia.

# Idaho State Ring of Honor

In January of 1999, the Idaho State athletic department instituted the ISU Ring of Honor. Encircling the top of Holt Arena, the Ring of Honor is for the truly outstanding men and women in Idaho State University history.

On January 30, 1999, the first 16 individuals were enshrined in the Ring of Honor, along with Idaho State's three national championship teams.

In 2009, Idaho State inducted the 17 individual into the Ring of Honor as Jared Allen earned the nod and had his jersey retired.

In order to earn induction into the Ring of Honor, a candidate must meet one of the following criteria:

- 1) Have his or her number retired
- 2) Have competed in the Olympic Games
- 3) Have brought fame and national attention to Idaho State University

For teams to be inducted, they must win a national championship.

# The ISU Sports Hall of Fame

All-time greats and Bengal legends are inducted every year into the ISU Athletic Hall of Fame.

The ISU Sports Hall of Fame was established in the 1960s by former athletic director John Vesser and other members of the athletic department staff. After moving from Reed Gym to Holt Arena, the Hall of Fame became inactive until 1977, when Bob Hilliard became president of the Alumni Board of Directors.

Chaired by Hall of Famer Glenn Alford, the Hall has enshrined 162 athletes since 1977.

In 1994, the Hall of Fame found a new home in the Sports Medicine & Orthopaedic Center, where photographs of each member hang.

The following guidelines have been established for admittance into the ISU Sports Hall of Fame:

- 1) A candidate must have attended the Academy of Idaho, Idaho Technical Institute, University of Idaho Southern Branch, Idaho State College, or Idaho State University for at least one year.
- 2) A candidate must have excelled in one of the intercollegiate sports programs.
- 3) A candidate must have been out of school for at least ten years.

In addition, only members of the Sports Hall of Fame Selection Committee are eligible to vote for induction, and consideration is given to nominees for recognition received, as well as contributions to the university, after leaving the institution.

# Media Information

## PRESS FACILITIES

The press box is located on the South Side of Holt Arena. The three tiered press box houses all facets of print, radio, and television media members, as well as the official stat crew and game operations personnel.

Credentials are required in order to guarantee a seat, and must be requested by the end of business on Wednesday the week of a game. Credential requests can be mailed to:

## RADIO & TELEVISION

ISU will provide space and credentials for up to three radio members upon request. Each visiting radio station has two phone lines for their use. Television broadcast facilities are available with prior arrangement through Jeff Tingey, Athletic Director, and the Athletic Director of the opposing team.

## PARKING

Parking passes are available from the Sports Information Office, and they will be sent to the visiting SID the week of the game. The passes will allow you to park on the South Side of Holt, closest to the media working areas.

## NON-WORKING PRESS SEATING

Area and space in the press box is severely limited, so only credentialed media are allowed in the press area. Members of the media who have guests accompanying them to Holt Arena need to contact Steve Schaack to make arrangements.

## SERVICES

Idaho State athletic media relations provides each credentialed media member with pre-game statistics for each team, notes for each team, media information, game programs, flip cards, and Big Sky Conference information.

The press box also contains an in-house public address system, which is used to broadcast scores to the media as well as interesting notes and facts throughout the game for the media's use.

ISU uses Stat Crew's Automated Scorebook for Football, and provides the media with detailed play-by-play, and final offensive and defensive stats.

The post-game press room is located in the sports information office, located in the southwest corner of Holt Arena.

ISU's locker room and training room is off limits to the media.

After games, the head coaches and one or two players from each team will address the media. Other players will be available for one-on-one interviews after the post-game formal interview sessions. The press room in the sports information office will be used for post-game filing. There are several telephone jacks and a fax machine that are available. Those print media wishing for a specific phone in the press box must call 208-282-4541 and order one prior to the game.

## RELEASES & STATISTICS

Idaho State's statistics are updated right after games and posted on the internet at [www.isubengals.com](http://www.isubengals.com). The weekly release is also emailed to all media members on ISU's email lists for football. The conference release as well as the opponents' weekly release is also sent out via ISU's email list.

## PHOTOGRAPHY/SIDELINE CONTROL

All photographers must work outside the 25-yard lines as dictated by NCAA rules. Photographers and media members are not allowed to linger in the team areas. Stewards are available on the field to help media members across the team areas to the other side of the field.

## INTERVIEW POLICY

Once fall practice begins, the following interview policy will be in effect.

\*Interviews with players will only be done on the weekly Tuesday press conference which begin a 11:30.

\*Coach Kramer is available through Thursday on game weeks to talk.

\*Calling student-athletes or coaches at home is strictly prohibited.
