Gene Chizik



Gene Chizik was the man. From the moment Iowa State athletics director Jamie Pollard began a search for a new head football coach in 2006, Chizik was at the top of Pollard's list of potential candidates. He wasn't alone. Everyone wanted Gene Chizik. It was no surprise, then, that improvement of the Cyclone football program in its first year under Chizik was immediate. Chizik's first ISU team beat rival Iowa and made steady progress throughout the season. Iowa State closed out the 2007 home season with wins over Kansas State and bowl-bound Colorado, affirming the major advances the Cyclones made on both sides of the ball. Iowa State fans embraced Chizik. Cyclone backers bought a school-record 36,000 season tickets in 2007 and posted the school's best home game attendance average (49,462) since 1982. A school-record 56,795 fans packed Jack Trice Stadium for last season's game against Northern Iowa.

Chizik's first win, a 15-13 victory over intrastate rival Iowa, made him the first Iowa State coach since 1907 to beat the Hawkeyes in his initial season. The back-to-back wins over Kansas State and Colorado were the first

consecutive Big 12 victories for the Iowa State program since 2005. The statistics tell the story. Iowa State ranked 102nd nationally in total defense in 2006. Under Chizik that ranking improved to 65th in the country last season. The improvement of the Cyclones against the rush was even more pronounced. A defense that had ranked 11th in the Big 12 Conference and 102nd nationally against the rush in 2006 improved under Chizik's oversight to 44th in NCAA Division I and sixth in the Big 12 in 2007.

There was an offensive surge. Bret Meyer and Todd Blythe finished their careers as the Cyclones' all-time leaders in passing and receiving, respectively. The Iowa State running game was back, despite a totally new offensive line. Two different ISU tailbacks, Alexander Robinson and J.J. Bass, had a pair of 100-yard rushing games, the first time that occurred in the Cyclone backfield since 2002. Running back Jason Scales was also a major contributor, rushing for 100-plus yards against Nebraska. When Robinson rushed for 127 yards and Blythe had 124 yards receiving against Colorado, it marked the first time Iowa State had a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver in a single game since 2005. Chizik's ISU squad rallied from a 21-0 halftime deficit to beat CU, equaling the biggest comeback in school history.

Chizik knows about building programs. The Iowa State head coach has been to the mountaintop. He had been assistant head coach and defensive coordinator on Texas' 2005 national championship team; before that, three years as defensive coordinator at Auburn, where in the midst of 30 wins in three seasons he earned the Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. He has been defensive coordinator on conference title teams in three different BCS conferences. Chizik's track record of preparing players for college football and beyond is unassailable. Amazingly, the ISU head coach tutored three straight winners of the Jim Thorpe Award. The honor is given annually to the nation's top collegiate defensive back. At Auburn, Chizik coached cornerback Carlos Rogers, who won the award in 2004 and now plays for the NFL's Washington Redskins. At Texas, Chizik coached the 2005 Thorpe honoree, Michael Huff, who is now a strong safety for the Oakland Raiders. Aaron Ross received recognition as the 2006 Thorpe Award winner and is now a corner for the New York Giants.

It was Pollard's challenge to bring Chizik to Ames. At the Iowa State athletics director's disposal was his demonstrated commitment to excellence. Pollard's plan for "The Next Big Step" in athletics at ISU affirmed that commitment. That vision sold Chizik, who wasn't shy about his decision.

Iowa State's commitment to Chizik and "The Next Big Step" are tangible. Phase I of the project is a \$19.5 million effort that includes the construction of new suites, a remodeled donor club section and a necessary widening of the Jack Trice Stadium's concourse that will debut in time for the 2008 season. These moves underscore the rising wave of enthusiasm for Chizik's vision for the future of Iowa State football.

Chizik, as a defensive coordinator, learned from the best head coaches in the nation's top collegiate programs while making tremendous contributions toward the enhancement of their national head coaching reputations.

At one point, the new Iowa State head coach had a personal 29-game win streak in two-plus years as defensive coordinator at Auburn and Texas. The national championship won by Texas in 2005 was the school's first since 1970. When Auburn won the 2004 SEC Championship game, it was the Tigers' first league crown since 1989. Additionally, Chizik helped Middle Tennessee State win the Ohio Valley Conference title (1990). The Blue Raiders won 20 games in Chizik's two seasons. Chizik was on the Clemson coaching staff when the Tigers captured the 1988 ACC championship.

Chizik's defense loomed large in Texas' 2005 national championship season under head coach Mack Brown. The Longhorns ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense, 10th in total defense and fourth in pass efficiency defense. UT allowed opponents to reach 300 yards of total offense only five times in 2005 and held the remaining eight opponents to less than 267 yards. Ten UT defenders were all-Big 12 Conference selections, including four who made the first team. In 2006, Chizik's Texas defenders were second nationally against the rush (58.8 ypg.) after 12 games, including limiting No. 1 Ohio State to just 79 yards on the ground. His aggressive schemes resulted in 100 tackles for loss, 96 quarterback hurries and 30 takeaways during the 2006 regular season.

Chizik's coaching path has harbored a long list of All-America achievers. At Texas, Huff, defensive tackle Rodrique Wright and linebacker Aaron Harris earned All-America honors. Huff and Wright were consensus All-Americans. At Auburn, Rogers was an All-American along with safety Junior Rosegreen.

At Auburn, Chizik's defenses were unforgiving and set a standard for the rest of the country. In 2004, the Tigers gave up a national low 11.3 points per game en route to an undefeated season. Overall, the Tigers gave up an average of just 277.62 yards of total offense per contest, ranking fifth nationally for the second straight season. Rosegreen figured nationally with six interceptions, including four against No. 10 Tennessee in Knoxville. Rogers was the nation's top pass defender despite the fact that teams did not throw to his side of the field often. Most incredibly, Chizik's Tiger defenders did not allow a rushing touchdown until the eighth game of the season. Overall, opponents managed just four rushing touchdowns against Auburn all season.

Chizik was also defensive coordinator for four seasons (1998-2001) at Central Florida. He improved a unit that ranked 81st nationally in total defense before his arrival to one that rated 16th in 2001.

Chizik also coached at Stephen F. Austin University, tutoring linebackers (1992-94) and the secondary (1995-97). He was SFA's defensive coordinator in 1996 and 1997. Former Tampa Bay Buccaneer Jeremiah Trotter was his star with the Lumberjacks. During Chizik's tenure at Stephen F. Austin, the Lumberjacks made the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs twice, including a semifinal berth in 1995.

He started coaching as a defensive coordinator (1986-88) in his home state at Seminole High School in St. Petersburg, Fla. Chizik stepped into college coaching at Clemson University (1988-89) as a graduate assistant for a pair of 10-win teams and then worked at Middle Tennessee State (1990-91) as a full-time assistant. The Blue Raiders made the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in both of his seasons and were conference champions in 1990.

Chizik earned his B.A. degree in education from Florida (1985) and his M.A. in guidance and counseling from Clemson (1991). Chizik, a native of Clearwater, Fla., and his wife (Jonna) have identical twin daughters (Landry Grace and Kennedy Danielle) and one son (Cally).

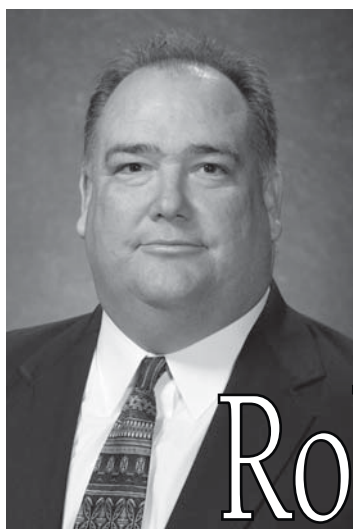

A former head coach with more than 20 years of collegiate experience, Iowa State offensive coordinator and offensive line coach Robert McFarland has a long list of achievements and former players who competed in the National Football League. He made a big difference in his first Iowa State season. McFarland successfully rebuilt the Cyclone offensive line from scratch in 2007. Iowa State's offense was much improved, despite its youth in the trenches. Bret Meyer and Todd Blythe finished their careers as ISU's career leaders in passing and receiving, respectively. Running backs Alexander Robinson and J.J. Bass each had two 100-yard rushing games. Jason Scales also posted a 100-yard rushing game against Nebraska. Most impressively, Iowa State cut its sacks allowed from 38 in 2006 to 17 in 2007, despite having only one returning starter on the offensive line.

McFarland coached Stephen F. Austin to a tie for second place in the Southland Conference in 2006. In his two years as the Lumberjacks' head coach, McFarland coached two All-Americans and 26 all-Southland Conference players.

McFarland's offenses at Central Florida, where he was offensive coordinator, featured one of the nation's top passing attacks. His Golden Knight offense ranked 12th nationally in 2000, ninth in 2001 and sixth in 2002. His quarterback, Ryan Schneider, threw for 3,770 yards and 31 touchdowns in 2002. Those efforts broke the school records set previously by NFL quarterback Daunte Culpepper.

It was a balanced attack. Under McFarland, Central Florida's offense featured two 1,000-yard receivers and a 1,000-yard rusher in the same season. Six of his players went to the NFL, including tight end Michael Gaines of the Detroit Lions. McFarland also coached at Clemson and Notre Dame. He coached teams in the Citrus Bowl, Gator Bowl and Orange Bowl.

Wayne Bolt has coached conference championship teams and nine bowl squads in a career of 30 years at UAB, Troy, Clemson, Auburn and Iowa State. It was no surprise then that ISU head coach Gene Chizik made an immediate call to Bolt after assuming leadership of the Cyclone football program. That phone call paid immediate dividends last season.

Under Bolt, Iowa State's defense against run improved from 11th in the Big 12 and 89th nationally in 2006 to sixth in the Big 12 and 44th nationally last season. Opponents average yards per rush declined from 4.6 to 3.9. Overall, an Iowa State defense that ranked 11th in the Big 12 and 102nd nationally in 2006 improved to seventh in the Big 12 and 65th nationally in 2007. The defense was led by one of Bolt's pupils, all-Big 12 linebacker Alvin Bowen. Bowen is now a member of the Buffalo Bills of the NFL.

Bolt has coached more than 20 collegians that went on to the NFL. At Troy as defensive coordinator, Bolt coached New York Giant defensive end Osi Umenyiora and Dallas Cowboy outside linebacker DeMarcus Ware. Troy ranked fourth under Bolt in total defense for the 2002 season.

Bolt was defensive coordinator on UAB's 2004 Hawaii Bowl team. During his 67-game tenure in the same position at Troy, his defenses dominated in conference play, ranking first or second in scoring defense, rushing defense and total defense.

Bolt was an All-American offensive lineman at East Carolina, where he played under the legendary Pat Dye. He then coached on Dye's staff at Wyoming and at Auburn, where the Tigers played in the Sugar and Cotton Bowls among four bowl appearances and won a SEC title. Under head coach Danny Ford at Clemson, Bolt was a part of teams that won three Atlantic Coast Conference titles and played in four bowl games.

Jay Boulware's tailbacks hit the ground running in his first season as running backs coach, reviving the Iowa State rushing attack. In Boulware's first ISU season, newcomer tailbacks Alexander Robinson and J.J. Bass both posted a pair of 100-yard games. The performances marked the first time two different Cyclone running backs topped the century barrier twice in a single season since 2002. Jason Scales also had a 100-yard rushing game in 2007.

Boulware coached at Texas, Northern Illinois, Arizona, Stanford and Utah before coming to Iowa State. His Ute special teams were Mountain West Conference leaders. The Utah kickoff return unit paced the MWC in 2006. Utah earned a bid to the Emerald Bowl in 2005, beating Georgia Tech 38-10. Boulware helped coach the Utah team that received a bid to the 2006 Armed Forces Bowl, in which it beat Tulsa 25-13.

It all started for Boulware at Texas, where he lettered twice on the offensive line. First as a student coach and then as a graduate assistant, he was with the Longhorns as they participated in three bowl games.

His players have earned national honors and gone onto the NFL. At Northern Illinois, he recruited future All-American and current Atlanta running back Michael "the Burner" Turner. During Boulware's tenure at NIU, the Huskie offense ranked 12th nationally in rushing as two-time all-MAC offensive lineman Ryan Diem moved on to the NFL, where he plays for the Indianapolis Colts. Arizona recruited Boulware to the Wildcat program where he coached tailback Mike Bell, an all-Pac 10 performer who now plays for the Denver Broncos.

Scott Fountain's efforts as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator at Iowa State have been rewarded. Fountain coached Iowa State tight end Ben Barkema, who ended his career with 52 receptions for 566 yards and four TDs last season. Derrick Catlett developed rapidly as Barkema's heir apparent, making 21 catches for 112 yards and two touchdowns as a sophomore. Iowa State's first two recruiting classes have established a foundation for the future.

In a career spanning nearly two decades, Fountain has coached successfully at nearly every level of football. After significant success in the Alabama high school ranks, Fountain began his collegiate coaching career under Bobby Bowden at Florida State. The Seminoles made postseason appearances in the Sugar Bowl (1995, 1997), the Orange Bowl (1996) and won three ACC titles.

Fountain went on to Central Florida in 1997, where he hooked up with ISU head coach Gene Chizik and offensive coordinator Robert McFarland. With Fountain as offensive tackles and tight ends coach on the Knight's staff, UCF's offense ranked among the nation's top 30 in six of his seven years. Among Fountain's pupils was tight end Mike Gaines, a seventh-round draft pick of the Carolina Panthers. Fountain also coordinated nationally-ranked recruiting efforts.

Fountain moved to Middle Tennessee State for two seasons, where he coached a trio of all-conference linemen. Fountain coached the offensive linemen at Georgia Southern in 2006. His line allowed a national-low six sacks in 2006. The Eagles ranked 22nd nationally in rushing, averaging 184 yards per game led by all-conference lineman Lance Wayne.

Fountain earned his bachelor's degree at Samford in 1988 and his master's degree from Florida State in 1998.

Fountain was a four-year letterman on the offensive line at Samford, where he started every game of his college career under head coach Terry Bowden.

Jeff Koonz coached the Iowa State secondary in 2007, and his young defensive backfield responded well to his leadership. Free safety James Smith was an all-Big 12 selection in his second season at Iowa State and is back this fall as the team's top returning tackler (79). He also broke up three passes and forced two fumbles. Iowa State nearly doubled its interceptions from the previous season. Cornerback Chris Singleton starts his senior year with six career interceptions. Koonz played a role in the football education of cornerback Allen Bell, who finished his first season in NCAA Division I with 54 tackles and an interception.

At Auburn and Texas with Iowa State head coach Gene Chizik, Jeff Koonz shared Chizik's 29-game personal win streak over two seasons at those two schools. Koonz joined Chizik on the ISU coaching staff after first filling the coaching void left at Texas when Chizik departed the Longhorn football program to be Iowa State's head coach. Koonz worked under Chizik as a defensive graduate assistant at Texas during the 2005 and 2006 seasons. He worked in the same role with the Cyclone head coach at Auburn in 2004.

During Koonz's stay at Texas, the Longhorns won the national collegiate football championship over USC in the 2006 Rose Bowl. Texas was 13-0 that season en route to the Big 12 championship. While at Auburn, he worked on staffs that led the Tigers to the 2002 Capital One Bowl championship, a 2003 Music City Bowl victory, the 2004 SEC championship and a win in the 2004 Nokia Sugar Bowl.

The numbers speak for themselves. Texas ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense, 10th in total defense and fourth in pass efficiency in 2005. In 2004, Auburn gave up a national low 11.3 points per game. The Tigers gave up an average of 277.62 yards of total offense per contest, ranking fifth nationally.

At Auburn, Koonz worked with Thorpe Award winner Carlos Rogers. He was a defensive graduate assistant at Texas from January 2005 until November 2006. Koonz assisted in the coaching of Longhorn linebackers and special teams. He oversaw the offensive scout team under Chizik's direction at Auburn, where Koonz also assisted coaching the secondary and all areas of special teams. Koonz earned a bachelor's degree from Auburn in 2004 and a master's degree from Texas in 2006.

The most obvious improvement in the Iowa State football program last season was in the defensive line, which under Mike Pelton boasted two Cyclones who earned all-Big 12 honors and another who tied for second in the league in sacks. Iowa State's defense against the rush improved from 11th in the Big 12 and 89th nationally in 2006 to sixth in the Big 12 and 44th nationally last season under Pelton. Nose guard Ahtyba Rubin's season earned him spots in the East-West Shrine Game and the Senior Bowl. Academic All-American defensive tackle Bryce Braaksma earned all-Big 12 recognition. Defensive end Kurtis Taylor averaged eight tackles a game and led the Cyclones with 6.5 sacks.

Pelton came to Iowa State after serving as co-defensive coordinator at Troy. The former Auburn All-American defensive lineman had previously gone on to the NFL as a player and then to collegiate coaching. As Troy co-defensive coordinator, he coached current NFL linebacker Demarcus Ware of the Dallas Cowboys and defensive end Osi Umenyiora of the New York Giants.

Pelton was at Troy for six years and the Trojan defense was consistently among the nation's leaders in several categories. In 2004, Troy ranked eighth nationally in rushing defense and 16th overall. In 2002, the Trojans ranked fourth nationally, allowing just 276.83 total yards per game. At Troy, Pelton worked under current Iowa State defensive coordinator Wayne Bolt.

Prior to going to Troy, Pelton coached the defensive line at Valdosta State in 2000. The Blazers posted a 10-2 record and made the NCAA Division II playoffs. As a player at Auburn, Pelton was a part of Tiger teams that won a school-record 20 consecutive games during his final two seasons, including an 11-0 record in 1993.

Pelton was drafted by the Kansas City Chiefs in the fifth round of the 1995 NFL Draft. The 1995 Auburn graduate moved to the Indianapolis Colts a year later.

Tony Petersen's quarterbacks keep putting up big numbers. Under Petersen, Iowa State quarterback Bret Meyer finished his career last season with school-record totals for passing (9,499) and total offense (10,422). Petersen, who coached in nine bowl games at Minnesota and Marshall, has tutored a long list of record-setting quarterbacks. A former Marshall quarterback, he coached New York Jets signal-caller Chad Pennington there, and his quarterbacks at Minnesota set a slew of school records.

As co-offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach and then passing game coordinator at Minnesota, Petersen engineered an offense that stood alone nationally over eight seasons, rushing and passing for more than 2,000 yards each year.

Petersen's aerial game exploded in 2006 as the Gophers recorded 2,874 yards through the air, the second-highest total in school history. Under Petersen, Minnesota quarterback Bryan Cupito became the school's all-time leading passer with 7,183 yards. The Gophers had a 2,000-yard passer for the fifth-straight season in 2006, another school record. Quarterback Asad Abdul-Khaliq (2000-03) rewrote the Minnesota record book during his four seasons.

During Petersen's eight-year tenure at Marshall, the Thundering Herd made eight straight postseason appearances. Pennington was a finalist for the 1998 Davey O'Brien Award. Before Pennington, Petersen coached quarterback Todd Donnan to all-conference honors. As a quarterback at Marshall, Petersen was the conference player of the year in 1987.

Raney played a role in the football education of cornerback Allen Bell, who finished his first season in NCAA Division I with 54 tackles and an interception.

Formerly the cornerbacks coach at Alabama-Birmingham and a successful defensive coordinator in the Kansas junior college ranks, Raney is starting his second season working for Iowa State head coach Gene Chizik. A former quarterback at Indiana and Missouri State, Jay Rodgers coaches Iowa State receivers under offensive coordinator Robert McFarland. McFarland was previously head coach at Stephen F. Austin, and Rodgers was the Lumberjacks' quarterbacks coach. Rodgers coached a pair of record-setting signal-callers at SFA.

Under Rodgers, Iowa State's Todd Blythe finished his career as the Cyclones' all-time leader in receptions (176), receiving yards (3,096) and TD catches (31). R.J. Sumrall became a prime target last season with his 54 receptions, ranking eighth in Iowa State single-season history.

Rodgers guided Stephen F. Austin quarterback Danny Southall to status as the Southland Conference's top-rated quarterback in 2005 and the leader in total offense in 2006, averaging 208.64 yards per game. Southall's predecessor, Zeke Dixon, became one of the top producing quarterbacks in SFA history. The 'Jacks led the SLC in pass offense in 2005 as Dixon threw for 2,407 yards and 20 touchdowns.

Rodgers was quarterbacks coach at Missouri State in 2004. In 2003, he coached receivers, quarterbacks and was passing game coordinator at Dodge City (Kan.) Community College. Dodge City ranked first in the conference in passing offense and third in passing efficiency.

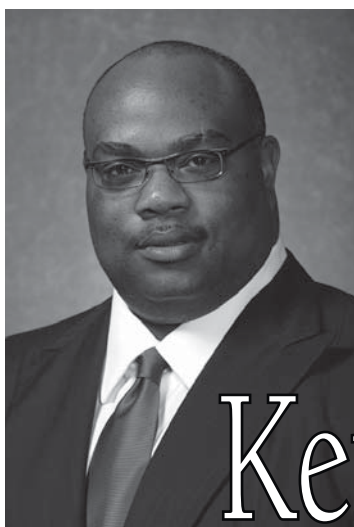

Ken Sheppard, an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Texas for nine seasons, was named head strength and conditioning coach for Gene Chizik's football program in January 2007. His impact was immediate as Iowa State's football players were bigger, faster and stronger last season. The list of current NFL players who have grown faster, stronger and more explosive under Sheppard's guidance is a long one. Among his pupils as collegians were Tennessee Titans quarterback Vince Young, Chicago Bears defensive back Nathan Vasher, Tennessee Titan tight end Alge Crumpler and Detroit Lions wide receiver Roy Williams.

While at Texas, he supervised Longhorn daily strength facility activities and implemented training programs for individual student-athletes. He also supervised nutrition plans for Texas athletes. With the Longhorn football program, Sheppard directed the Mack Brown/Jeff Madden Texas Speed and Explosive Power Camp, one of the largest camps of its kind in the United States. The 1985 graduate of North Carolina Central (criminal justice) was the camp's primary administrator and developed curriculum for beginning strength coaches.

Sheppard also served as an assistant strength and conditioning coach at North Carolina for five seasons. At UNC, he designed and implemented strength and conditioning plans in an athletics program that boasted 29 sports. 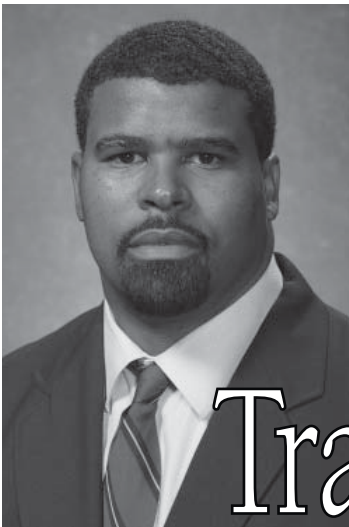

Link and his wife, Jill, reside in Ankeny.



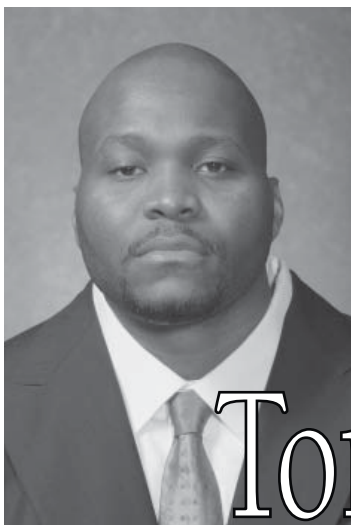
