THE LEAD

No. 8 Iowa State hosts its in-state rival, No. 4 Iowa, Sunday afternoon in a highly anticipated Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series clash. The top-10 matchup will be televised on ESPN, making it the first college wrestling dual on the flagship network in the company's 44-year history.

KEY STORYLINES

- Iowa State trounced No. 18 Wisconsin, 42-0, its last time out. ISU dominated the dual from start to finish with three wrestlers - Kysen Terukina, Casey Swiderski and David Carr - defeating top-15 foes. ISU won the takedown battle, 27-2.
- The Cyclones have won 12 consecutive duals inside Hilton Coliseum dating back to 2021. ISU is 31-7 over the last six seasons on its home mat.
- Iowa State has pushed the pace this season on its feet. The Cyclones own a 117-8 takedown advantage over their opponents through three duals.
- Last year, Iowa State and Iowa split the Cy-Hawk dual with five match wins apiece. Bonus points were the difference as Iowa prevailed, 18-15.
- No. 2 David Carr will see his second top-five opponent in the span of a week. Toeing the line across from him this time is North Dakota State transfer and 2023 All-American No. 5 Michael Caliendo.
- Carr is fresh off his first real test of the season after he gutted out a 2-0 decision against Wisconsin's No. 4 Dean Hamiti last weekend.
- Kysen Terukina was named Big 12 Wrestler of the Week after his 14-3 major decision against Wisconsin's No. 5 Eric Barnett. Terukina is 4-2 against top-10 foes and 3-1 against top-5 opponents in the last three years.
- Clarion transfer and 2023 All-American Will Feldkamp made his ISU debut last weekend. His match didn't make it out of the first period as he picked up a fall in 1:39. Feldkamp was third in NCAA Division I last season with 14 pins.
- Casey Swiderski made his season debut in the ISU lineup last weekend as well. He secured his fifth-career top-15 win with a 9-4 decision over No. 14 Joseph Zargo.
- Cody Chittum has impressed in his two appearances in the lineup, securing a major decision on both occasions. Chittum spent his grey shirt year training in Iowa City.
- Anthony Echেমendia dropped a weight to 141 pounds against Wisconsin. He was sharp on his feet, securing seven takedowns in a 21-6 tech fall. The Cuban leads ISU with 20 takedowns in three matches.

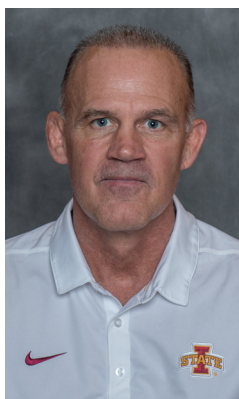

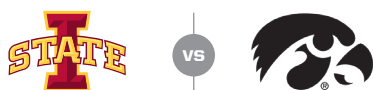

Iowa State has won 12 consecutive duals inside Hilton Coliseum dating back to 2021. The Cyclones are 31-7 on their home mat over the last six seasons.

Sunday's Cy-Hawk clash will be televised on ESPN, making it the first college wrestling dual on the flagship network in the company's 44-year history.

IOWA CONNECTIONS

Three members of Iowa State's coaching staff - Kevin Dresser, Brent Metcalf and Derek St. John - wrestled at the University of Iowa.

Dresser was a two-time Big Ten champ, two-time All-American and a 1986 NCAA champion.

Metcalf, who was inducted into the Iowa Hall of Fame this fall, was a three-time All-American, two-time NCAA champ and a 2008 Hodge Trophy winner.

St. John was a four-time All-American and 2013 NCAA Champion for the Hawkeyes.

BONUS POINTS

The Cyclone grapplers are pushing the pace and taking advantage of the NCAA's new three-point takedown. ISU owns a 117-8 takedown advantage over its dual opponents this season, resulting in 25 bonus-point wins (5 WBF, 13 TF, 7 MD) in 30 matches.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Freshman or redshirt freshman have accounted for 12 of ISU's 29 match wins in dual action this season.

Four projected starters for ISU against Iowa are sophomores or younger.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

ISU's dual slate includes matchups against four of the top seven, and three of the top five, teams at last season's NCAA Championships. In total, there are eight top-25 teams on ISU's 2023-24 schedule.

BASTIDA BULKING

Yonger Bastida made the jump from 197 pounds to heavyweight this season. In preparation for the jump, he put on 43 pounds during the offseason while lowering his body fat percentage. Bastida still looks quick on his feet, and is second on the team with 19 takedowns.

Bastida went 18-9 and qualified for his second NCAA Championships in 2022-23. He went 2-2 in the tournament as the No. 13 seed and scored 1.5 team points.

Bastida has earned All-America honors once in his career, thanks to a fifth-place finish at 197 pounds in 2022.

CUBAN CONNECTION

Childhood friends Yonger Bastida and Anthony Echemendia both hail from Cuba. Bastida called Trinidad, Cuba home while Echemendia is from Cabaiguán, Cuba - a mere 36 miles away from each other.

From ages 9-18 the pair trained together at EIDE Lino Salabarría Pupo - a sports teaching facility for the training and development of high-performance athletes in Sancti Spiritus, Cuba, located between their hometowns and 1620 miles away from Ames, Iowa.



FROM THE NOTEBOOK

TRACKING TERUKINA

Kysen Terkina was named Big 12 Wrestler of the Week after his 14-3 major decision against Wisconsin's No. 5 Eric Barnett.

The Hawaii native is 3-0 to start the 2023-24 season. Along with his major decision against Barnett, he has two tech falls this year after not having any entering the season.

Terukina is 4-2 against top-10 foes and 3-1 against top-5 opponents in the last three years.

Terukina is back in the lineup this season after he suffered a season-ending shoulder injury at the NWCA All-Star Classic last November.

CARR CHALLENGED EARLY

No. 2 David Carr will see his second top-five opponent in the span of a week. Toeing the line across from him this time is North Dakota State transfer and 2023 All-American No. 5 Michael Caliendo.

Carr is fresh off his first real test of the season after he gutted out a 2-0 decision against Wisconsin's No. 4 Dean Hamiti last weekend. Hamiti's length proved to be a challenge as Carr was unable to score a takedown in the match. The Cyclone relied on a strong two-minute ride in the third period to secure the win.

NEW ARRIVALS

Coach Dresser and the coaching staff made some key additions during the offseason who are making an immediate impact. Freshman Cody Chittum joined the program after spending a grey shirt year training in Iowa City while senior Will Feldkamp (Clarion) joined via the transfer portal.

CHITTUM ARRIVES

Cody Chittum has impressed in his two appearances in the lineup, securing a major decision on both occasions.

He was FloWrestling's No. 1 pound-for-pound recruit in the class of 2022 but took a grey shirt year training in Iowa City.

Chittum medaled three times at senior level freestyle events in 2023 - silver at the Bill Farrell and bronze medals at the Henri Deglane and Egypt Ranking Series.

FELDKAMP GOES BIG

Clarion transfer and 2023 All-American Will Feldkamp made his ISU debut last weekend after a few bumps and bruises in the preseason. His match didn't make it out of the first period as he picked up a fall in 1:39.

He brings big-move potential to the lineup after he was third in NCAA Division I last season with 14 pins.

Feldkamp compiled a 29-6 record with 18 bonus-point wins in 2022-23.

A COUNTRY BOY CAN SURVIVE

Casey Swiderski made his season debut in the ISU lineup last weekend as well. He secured his fifth-career top-15 win with a 9-4 decision over No. 14 Joseph Zargo.

Swiderski went 14-12 in his freshman season and advanced to the blood round before falling one win shy of All-America honors.

Swiderski got off to a hot start last season with two top-20 wins on the first weekend, but battled injury for much of December and struggled upon his return to the lineup. After losing six of his final seven regular season matches, he failed to earn an NCAA allocation. Swiderski got hot at the right time and successfully stole a bid to the NCAA Championships with a fourth-place finish at the Big 12 Championship.

Swiderski was the first commitment for Iowa State in its second-ranked 2022 recruiting class and was tabbed by MatScouts as the No. 3 prospect nationally.

He has four Michigan state titles to his name, all at different weight classes (103, 135, 145, 152), and posted a 166-3 high school record, including a 45-0 mark as a senior.

Swiderski is one of four Michigan prep wrestlers all-time to win four-time team and individual state titles. Also among the group is Iowa State assistant coach Brent Metcalf (2002-05).

DAD STRENGTH

Julien Broderson and his fiancée, Macie, welcomed a baby girl, Olive, during the offseason.



The birth of their daughter has also seemingly given Julien "dad strength" of sorts. He is moving up two weight classes from 174 to 197 pounds this season.

Over the offseason, Broderson packed on 51 pounds to his frame while maintaining the same body composition.

Broderson is 2-0 to start the 2023-24 season. In his season debut against Davidson, Broderson used a head lock to earn a fall in 45 seconds.

FROM THE NOTEBOOK

ECEMENDIA DROPS

After wrestling ISU's first two duals of the season at 149 pounds, Anthony Echemendia made his debut at 141 against Wisconsin on Sunday. He secured in seven takedowns in 4:15 for a 21-6 tech fall.

Echemendia leads ISU with 20 takedowns and three tech falls this season.

CALIFORNIA LOVE

MJ Gaitan is never out of a match because of his ability to go upper-body for big-time points. The Temecula, California native has two falls in his first three matches this season.

FEELIN' FROSTY

Identical twins Evan and Jacob Frost both started against Cleveland State and Davidson, making them the first set of brothers to appear in ISU's dual lineup since Michael and Gabe Moreno in 2015.

Evan and Jacob wrestled their high school senior seasons at Dowling Catholic in Des Moines, Iowa, but called Metairie, Louisiana home growing up. The pair moved from Louisiana to Iowa for a better and more high-profile wrestling experience. They each won three state titles in Louisiana and Evan added a fourth in Iowa while Jacob grabbed a runner-up finish as a senior.

In 2022-23, both brothers took advantage of the NCAA's new redshirt rule which allows freshmen to wrestle on up to five countable dates and maintain their redshirt status. Evan posted a 15-5 record with eight bonus-point wins. Jacob went 11-2, including 1-0 in dual action, and also had eight bonus-point victories.

RETURNING PRODUCTION

Iowa State returns 69 percent of its dual meet victories from last season's roster and 30 of its 47 points from the 2023 NCAA Championships.

Notable departures from last season's squad include two-time All-American Marcus Coleman (5th - 15.0 pts.) and heavyweight Sam Schuyler (R12 - 2.0 pts.).

DRESSER'S DEVELOPMENT

Kevin Dresser inherited a program that finished tied for 57th at the 2017 NCAA Championships. Since then, Iowa State has finished T-45th, 16th, T-13th, 17th and 11th at the NCAA Championships.

Heading into the 2019-20 season, Coach Dresser's roster included one returning All-American and one returning Big 12 Champ. Over the past three seasons, Iowa State has produced six Big 12 Champs, 13 All-Americans and one National Champion.

Iowa State finished the 2022-23 season 11th at the NCAA Championships, the Cyclones' best finish since 2013. ISU scored its highest point total in the tournament since 2010, 47.0 points.

THE DRESSER BUMP

A rematch between Iowa State and Cornell is set for Dec. 18 at the Collegiate Duals in Nashville, Tenn. Last season, the dual gave us one of the season's most memorable moments - The Dresser Bump.

After an injury to heavyweight Sam Schuyler in a previous dual and no backup available on the road, Coach Dresser was forced to get creative with his lineup if Iowa State had any hope of beating No. 12 Cornell.

Trailing 13-9 with three matches remaining, Joel Devine, Marcus Coleman and Yonger Bastida all wrestled up a weight class at 184, 197 and 285 pounds, respectively. They rattled off three consecutive victories to win the dual for the Cyclones, 18-13.

In the heavyweight match to decide the dual, Bastida gave up nearly 60 pounds to his opponent, No. 15 Lewis Fernandes, but still came out on top, 4-2.

NAAK'S BIG SUMMER

Freshman Tate Naaktgeboren had an impressive summer before arriving on campus, winning Freestyle and Greco-Roman national titles in Fargo, N.D.

Including both styles, Naaktgeboren went 14-0 and outscored his opponents 139-16 on the week. Twelve of his 14 wins came via tech fall or fall.

CARLUCCI'S BATTLE

In mid-April, Strep A bacteria - typically found in the throat - settled in Cole Carlucci's knee bursa. He underwent five surgeries in 10 days to clean out the infection and try to preserve as much quad tissue as possible.

Remarkably, Carlucci was back in the weight room by July and was able to begin wrestling activity along with the team at the start of the school year.

RETURNING HOME

Iowa State opened the 2023-24 season against Cleveland State in Massillon, Ohio inside Carr's high school gymnasium at Perry High School. He used a 'Dresser Dump' to earn a fall in 1:47.

Carr was a four-time Ohio state champion at Perry High School, wrestling for his father, Nate Carr. David posted a 188-6 high school record and was FloWrestling's No. 2 pound-for-pound recruit in his class. David also won a Kentucky high school state title as an eighth grader with a 47-1 record.

CARR MOVES TO 165 POUNDS

Last Season, Carr moved up a weight class from 157 to 165 pounds. He fell one win short of his second national title, losing in the championship match to Keegan O'Toole.

The 165-pound bracket at the NCAA Championships was loaded with three past NCAA champions, another returning NCAA finalist and five more returning All-Americans. Just to reach the finals he had to beat Shane Griffith, a 2021 national champion, and Quincy Monday, a 2022 national finalist.

Carr finished the 2022-23 season with a 27-1 record, including 12 wins over wrestlers ranked in the top-15 of FloWrestling's final poll. Fourteen of Carr's 27 wins came with bonus points.

2021 NATIONAL TITLE

Carr put together an undefeated 2021 season to win the 157-pound national title. As the No. 3 seed, he navigated to the finals with two major decisions, a quarterfinal win in SV-1 and a decision in the semis.

Carr defeated Rider's Jesse Dellavecchia in the finals, 4-0, with 2:04 of riding time thanks to a trademark third-period rideout.

CARR WRESTLES BACK FOR THIRD

Carr entered the 2022 national tournament as an undefeated Big 12 champion but suffered a shocking loss in the second round to Oregon State's Hunter Willits in tiebreakers.

Despite his disappointment, Carr went on a winning streak after that match, beating All-Americans Wyatt Sheets, Kaleb Young, Jared Franek and Will Lewan, in addition to receiving a medical forfeit from Austin O'Connor, to finish third.

It's a run that won respect from the wrestling community at large and showed Carr's leadership and character on the biggest stage in college wrestling.

CYCLONE LEGACY

David Carr's father, Nate, wrestled at Iowa State from 1980-83 and won three NCAA titles for the Cyclones with a 122-17 career record. Nate and David are one of six father-son duos to win Division I NCAA titles and one of two pairs to both accomplish it at the same school.

Nate and David are also one of three ISU father-son duos to both earn All-American honors.

Nate is a coach at the Cyclone Regional Training Center and is the color analyst on ISU wrestling radio broadcasts.

David's brother, Nate Carr Jr., wrestled at Iowa State from 2009-11 and their uncles, Solomon and Michael Carr, were Cyclone wrestlers in the 1980s.

WRESTLING FAMILY

The Carr family is well-known in wrestling circles. Nate grew up one of 16 kids and all nine boys wrestled - five became Division I All-Americans. Two wrestled in the Olympics: Nate won bronze in 1988, and Jimmy made the 1972 team at 17 years old, the youngest ever.

CARR VS. O'TOOLE

BIGGEST RIVALRY IN COLLEGE WRESTLING

David Carr vs. Missouri's Keegan O'Toole captured the attention of the college wrestling world last season. The pair wrestled each other three times in the final 32 days of the 2023 season.

Carr defeated O'Toole in the ISU vs. Mizzou dual and Big 12 Championship match before O'Toole flipped the script in the national finals.

Part I - 2.15.2023 // Columbia, Mo.

In what many dubbed as the "Match of the Year" between No. 1 Keegan O'Toole and No. 2 David Carr, Carr emerged victorious, 7-2. Carr, known for his crisp technique, showed flashes of his scrambling ability as he got two takedowns in the win over the defending 165-pound national champion. Carr also showed his prowess on top, riding O'Toole for the entire third period to secure the riding time point.

Part II - 3.5.2023 // Tulsa, Okla.

In a highly anticipated rematch from a month prior, Carr pinned defending Big 12 and National Champion Keegan O'Toole in sudden victory (7:38).

It was the tightest of the three matches and, after a scoreless first period, saw O'Toole enter the final period with a 1-0 advantage thanks to an escape in the second.

In the third period, Carr escaped in four seconds to tie the match, then took down O'Toole with a minute remaining to take a 3-1 lead. Two stall calls on Carr in the final 36 seconds, and an O'Toole escape with 32 seconds remaining, left the score at 3-3 as the clock hit zeros.

Carr got in on a leg in SV-1 and managed to lock up a cradle with roughly 30 seconds remaining for the fall.

Part III - 3.18.2023 // Tulsa, Okla.

O'Toole changed the narrative when it mattered most, with an 8-2 victory over Carr in the national finals - Carr's only loss of the season which snapped a 33-match win streak.

The Missouri Tiger captured his second national title and found a way to finish his attacks. Carr never found his offense in the match, rather, it was O'Toole who secured takedowns in the first and third periods. O'Toole also had an escape and two near fall points, as well as a riding time point, in the final period.

RIVALRY CONTINUED

Both Carr and O'Toole plan to run it back at 165 pounds in 2023-24, meaning college wrestling fans could see this matchup up to three more times.

FloWrestling has O'Toole ranked No. 2 and Carr ranked No. 3 in its preseason pound-for-pound rankings and as the top two wrestlers at 165 pounds.

The first potential matchup between the two wrestlers this season would be Feb. 25 in what could be Carr's final match inside Hilton Coliseum - a building which Carr has never lost in.
