THE GAME

The University of Utah Football team is set to host the Iowa State Cyclones on Saturday, Nov. 23 at 5:30 p.m. MT on FOX. Saturday's game will be Utah's final game in Rice-Eccles Stadium this season and will be the Utes' Senior Night with fans encouraged to arrive early.

HOME SWEET HOME

Utah is 120-40 (.750) in Rice-Eccles Stadium (1998-present) and is 92-29 in RES during the Kyle Whittingham era.

- Utah has five undefeated home seasons under Whittingham (2022, 6-0; 2021, 6-0; 2019, 7-0; 2009, 6-0; 2008, 6-0) with the Utes winning 33 of their last 38 home games, which included a streak of 18 in a row from Dec. 5, 2020 – Oct. 14, 2023.
- It was the second-longest streak in the Whittingham era with the longest streak taking place Sept. 15, 2007 – Oct. 23, 2010 (21 games).
- Utah has sold out Rice-Eccles Stadium in 88 consecutive games, dating back to the 2010 season opener.

THE NUMBERS

- Head Coach Kyle Whittingham is set to coach in his 378th overall game at Utah and his 252nd as head coach on Saturday.
- The game on Saturday will be the sixth game in the all-time series against the Cyclones and the first since 2010 (Utah 68, Iowa State 27).
- Utah will honor 24 student-athletes for Senior Night on Saturday.
- Utah's game against Iowa State on Saturday will be the Utes' third-straight game against an AP Top 25 opponent and the fourth overall this season.

UTAH FOOTBALL: NEED TO KNOWS

- With two regular season games remaining, Utah's defense is leading the Big 12 in third down (24.1%) and first down (151) defense, along with ranking second in red zone defense (78.3%) and total defense (3172 yards per game).
- The Utes are also leading the Big 12 in time of possession, holding the ball for an average of 33:22, which also ranks sixth in the FBS.
- Utah is only allowing 125.7 rushing yards and 191.5 passing yards per game, which ranks in the top-five in the league in both.
- Senior running back Micah Bernard has 880 total rushing yards this season, needing 120 to become Utah's 21st all-time 1,000-yard rusher.
- Utah currently has eight players that have started all 10 games this season (Lander Barton, LB; Micah Bernard, RB; Spencer Fano, RT; Jaren Kump, C; Caleb Lomu, LT; Dorian Singer, WR; Tanoa Togiai, LG; Zemaiah Vaughn, CB).

Kyle Whittingham, who is the second-longest tenured head coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS and the longest-tenured in the Big 12, is in his 20th season at the helm and 31st overall season at Utah in 2024 as the Utes' all-time wins leader. In his first season in the Big 12 Conference, Whittingham ranks second among active Big 12 head coaches in all-time victories (166), also ranking sixth among all active FBS head coaches and fourth among head coaches at the same school.

- Including 11 seasons as a Ute assistant coach, he has contributed to more victories (251) than any coach in program history.
- He has coached in 377 games at Utah, including in 251 as the head coach.
- His 166 career wins passed Ike Armstrong (141-55-15 in 211 games from 1925-49) for the all-time wins number.
- Utah has finished with a winning record in 17 of his previous 19 years as head coach, including in 10 straight.
- The Utes have seven, 10-win seasons under Whittingham (2008, 2009, 2010, 2015, 2019, 2021, 2022).
- Legendary for his postseason success, his 11 bowl wins (11-6) ranks fourth among active coaches with his record including a 2-2 mark in New Year's Six bowls.
- He has wins over Pittsburgh in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl (co-head coach) and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.

Whether in the Pac-12 or the Mountain West, Whittingham's success in conference play has been unmatched as the Utes have gone 101-66 in conference games under Whittingham (.621). Utah won back-to-back Pac-12 titles in 2021 and 2022, also winning at least a share of the Pac-12 South four times (2015 – shared, 2018, 2019, 2021). The Utes also won the Mountain West in 2008 after going 8-0 in league play.

- He is a two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year (2019, 2021) and was Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2008.
- He has won three National Coach of the Year awards. He was the AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award winner in 2008, and the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Year in 2019.
- In 2019 he also won AFCA Regional Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award.
- In 2021, Whittingham was a finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year award.

Individually, Whittingham has had 34 players make All-America teams during his time as head coach, including 17 that have made major All-America first-teams (those determining NCAA's consensus team) with 10 earning consensus or unanimous honors.

- Utah has had a consensus or unanimous All-American in six of the last eight years, including in three straight.
- Utah's consensus and unanimous All-Americans under Whittingham include Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008), Tom Hackett (2014, 2015), Mitch Wishnowsky (2016), Matt Gay (2017), Bradlee Anae (2019), Devin Lloyd (2021), Clark Phillips III (Unanimous, 2022), Jonah Elliss (2023).

THE UTAH MAN	
Head coach Kyle Whittingham is in his 20th year at the helm as the longest-tenured coach in the Big 12 and the second-longest tenured coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS. He is 166-85 overall at Utah, becoming the all-time wins leader at Utah in 2021. He passed Ike Armstrong (141-55-15 in 211 games) with Utah's historic win over No. 3 Oregon on Nov. 20, 2021 in Rice-Eccles Stadium. He has coached in 377 games at Utah (11 seasons as an assistant) and 251 as the head coach.	
• He has contributed to more victories than any coach in program history (251), including his 11 seasons as an assistant coach (1994-2004). • His 166 career wins as the head coach of the Utes is sixth among all active FBS head coaches and fourth among head coaches at the same school. He is also second among active Big 12 head coaches in all-time victories. • Whittingham has coached the Utes to three conference titles (2008, MWC; 2021, Pac-12; 2022, Pac-12). The Utes also won at least a share of the Pac-12 South four times (2015 - shared, 2018, 2019, 2021). • He has won three National Coach of the Year recognitions: AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award winner in 2008, and the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Year in 2019. • Whittingham has been named conference coach of the year three times in his career (2008, MWC; 2019, Pac-12; 2021, Pac-12). • He has had 34 players make All-America teams, including 17 that have made major All-America teams (those determining NCAA's consensus team) with 10 earning consensus or unanimous.

NEW CONFERENCE, NEW CHALLENGE

Utah Football began a new era in 2024, joining the Big 12 Conference. The Utes have also been a part of the Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-1937), the Big Seven (1938-1947), the Skyline (1948-1961), the Western Athletic Conference (1962-1998), the Mountain West (1999-2010) and the Pac-12 (2011-2023).

- Utah is 446-266-19 all-time in conference games (.625), including its first win in the Big 12 against Oklahoma State (Sept. 21, 2024, W, 22-19).
- Utah is 32-16 in conference games since 2019.
- The Utes bring 28 conference championships with them to the Big 12.

THE MOMENT OF LOUDNESS

In 2021, the Utah Football program started a tradition to honor the legacy of Aaron Lowe and Ty Jordan with The Moment of Loudness, which takes place during the third quarter break of each home game. It is a tradition that has now turned into a way of life for the Utah family. To live the way that they did - to smile, to be infectiously optimistic, and to be 22-percent better every day.



CONTROL THE BALL, CONTROL THE GAME

It has been no secret that part of Utah's success on both sides of the ball in recent history has been winning the time of possession battle with 2024 being no different.

- Through 10 games this season, Utah is holding the ball for an average of 33:22, which ranks first in the Big 12 and sixth in the FBS.
- The Utes have won the time of possession battle in eight of the 10 games this season.
- In the second and fourth quarters in 2024, Utah is holding the time of possession at 9:21 and 9:35 respectively.
- Utah has controlled the ball for 10+ minutes in 11 quarters this season.
- Against Oklahoma State, Utah had a season-high 42:26 TOP with the Cowboys only holding the ball for 17:31.
- Utah has won the time of possession battle in eight games this season, going over the 35:00 mark in three (42:26 at Oklahoma State, 37:18 at Utah State, 35:38 at Colorado).
- Since 2019, Utah has finished the season leading its conference in time of possession.

OFFENSIVE DRIVES

Through 10 games in 2024, Utah has scored 25 offensive touchdowns with the scoring drives ranging from 0-9 yards to 90-99.

- Out of Utah's 25 offensive touchdowns, 15 have come on drives of 60 yards or longer, including nine in the 70-79 range.
- The Utes have five touchdown drives this season that were just one-play drives, which ties for the lead among all Power Four schools.

- Against Southern Utah, Utah's offense notched touchdowns on its first five drives, the first time they've accomplished that feat since they scored TDs on their first six possessions on Sept. 20, 1997 against UTEP.

BALANCING ACT

One of Utah's mainstays on offense is having a balanced attack, and through 10 games, the Utes have recorded 1,385 yards on the ground and 2,153 through the air.

- In back-to-back games, Utah had 450+ yards of total offense

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- and 200+ yards rushing (460/221 at Utah State, 456/249 at Oklahoma State).
- Against both Utah State and Oklahoma State, Utah had over 200 yards passing and 200 yards rushing (239/221 at Utah State, 207/249 at Oklahoma State). It was the first time that the Utes have had 200+ passing yards and 200+ rushing yards in back-to-back games since 2022.
- Utah has had 200+ passing yards and 200+ rushing yards in the same game 18 times since 2019.

SPREAD THE LOVE

- Through 10 games this season, Utah's quarterbacks have connected with 18 different players (4 RB, 8 WR, 6 TE) on 173 passes, recording 2,153 yards through the air.
- Utah has six players from three different positions that have 100+ receiving yards this season.

- Utah's tight ends have combined to rack up 51 receptions for 703 yards and 11 touchdowns.
- Utah's running backs have accumulated 303 receiving yards on 35 catches with Stanley's career-high 150 receiving yards against Southern Utah being the second-most by a Ute this year.
- The Utes have seven players from three different positions (WR, TE, RB) that have scored a receiving touchdown along with an offensive lineman that caught a receiving two-point conversion (Spencer Fano at Colorado).
- The Utes have either had a 100-yard rusher or a 100-yard receiver in seven of the 10 games this season.

THE QUARTERBACKS

- Despite the plague of injuries that has struck the Utah quarterback room in 2024, the Utes continue to fight and produce talent at the position. Starting the year, the Utes had a five-star (Sam Huard, season-ending injury in practice), two four-stars (Isaac Wilson, Cameron Rising - season-ending injury against Arizona State), a three-star (Brandon Rose, season-ending injury against BYU) and a standout JUCO transfer (Luke Bottari).
- True freshman Isaac Wilson was named the No. 2 QB on the depth chart toward the end of fall camp, officially being named the starter prior to Utah's game against TCU.

- He has started in six games, playing in eight and is 2-4 overall as the starter. He became the first true freshman QB in Utah history to earn a win against a ranked opponent on the road (No. 14 Oklahoma State).
- Wilson, a four-star recruit out of Corner Canyon HS, spent the spring with the Utes after earning Mr. Football by the Deseret News in 2023.
- Senior Luke Bottari, who came in late in the 2023 season when the Utes were plagued with injuries, finished the year 1-0 as the starter after going 6-of-10 passing for 61 yards and two rushing touchdowns for the win against Colorado.
- Bottari has seen action in one game this season, playing in the final series against Colorado, going 1-for-1 for five yards and a first down.
- Bottari played three seasons at College of San Mateo (2019-21), becoming the career passing touchdown record holder (46), throwing for 4,673 passing yards.
- Sophomore Brandon Rose, out of Temecula, Calif., is in his third season with the program, seeing action in three games, starting against BYU where he suffered a season-ending injury.
- Walk-on quarterback Dallen Engemann has spent the fall on Utah's scout team after playing for Santa Ana College from 2022-23. In his two seasons with the Dons, he went 293-of-514 passing for 3,715 yards and 41 touchdowns
- Rose, a three-star recruit out of Murrieta Valley HS, earned his first-career start against BYU, throwing for a career-high 112 yards (2 TD), also rushing for a career-best 55 yards.
- Rising started in three games (Southern Utah, Baylor, Arizona State) before suffering a season-ending injury against Arizona State. He has 20 wins as the starter, ranking fifth all-time.
- Sam Huard came out of Kennedy Catholic HS as the No. 1 pro-style QB in the country and a five-star recruit, playing in five games at Washington from 2021-22 and in nine games at Cal Poly (2023). The Bellevue, Wash., native was 184-of-303 passing last season at Cal Poly for 2,247 yards (18 TD). He unfortunately suffered a season-ending injury while playing on the scout team in 2024 at Utah.

- Has played in eight games this season, starting six.
- Is 2-4 as a starter at Utah.
- Among freshmen quarterbacks in Power football, Wilson ranks seventh in passing yards (1,436) and touchdown passes (10).
- He became the fifth-known true freshman in program history to start a game for the Utes, and first since Travis Wilson started the final seven games of the 2012 season.
- Of those five true freshmen, Wilson is the first true freshman QB at Utah to have three passing scores in his first start (at Utah State).
- Wilson became Utah's first true freshman starting quarterback in recorded program history to beat an AP-ranked team with Utah's 22-19 victory over No. 14 Oklahoma State. Previously, true freshmen to start for Utah were 0-3 against AP-ranked teams.
- He is the second true freshman starter in Utah history to pass for 200-plus yards in his first two starts (Jordan Wynn in 2009).
- In 2024, he has four games for 200+ passing yards and two with multiple passing touchdowns.
- Wilson has converted on 16 third downs and six fourth downs this season.
- Wilson has also accounted for 25 of Utah's 47 explosive plays (plays for 20-or-more yards) this season (24 pass, 1 rush).
- Six of his 10 passing touchdowns have been for 20 yards-or-longer.
- Four-star recruit out of Corner Canyon HS, ranking as the No. 3 recruit in the state of Utah and the No. 21 quarterback nationally on 247Sports.
- Named Mr. Football by the Deseret News in 2023.
- Two-time first-team All-State selection.
- Led Corner Canyon to a state title in 2023 with the Chargers going 13-1.
- Broke the Utah state record for total offense in a season in 2023 (5,901).
- Brother, Zach, played quarterback at BYU and is currently playing for the Denver Broncos.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

JIM'S GIANTS

Entering the 2024 season as one of the most experienced position groups on the field for the Utes, assistant head coach Jim Harding is leading the offensive line - or the O-BLOCK - for his 11th season with the program.

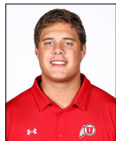
- Harding has coached eight first-team all-conference selections to date and has had six offensive linemen selected in the NFL Draft, including four in 2016.
- He coached Utah legend Garret Bolles, Utah's second-highest drafted offensive lineman in school history, who went in the first round of the 2017 NFL Draft to Denver (20th overall).
- Harding's linemen have blocked for a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last 10 seasons.
- In three of the last four seasons, Utah's offensive line has ranked in the top-25 nationally in sacks allowed, including ranking No. 4 in the FBS and No. 1 in the Pac-12 in 2021, only allowing 0.93 per game.
- Prior to Utah, Harding spent five seasons at Wyoming as the offensive line coach (co-coach his first four seasons) from 2009-13. He was promoted to co-offensive coordinator his final season in Laramie when the 2013 Cowboys finished 22nd in the country in total offense, averaging 472.8 yards per game.
- Harding played football at Toledo from 1997-2000 as an offensive tackle, setting the school record with 46 consecutive starts. He was a first-team All-Mid-American Conference selection.

THE O-BLOCK

Utah's 2024 offensive line has combined for 304 games played through 10 games this season, ranking 14th in Power Four football and third in the Big 12. The group has six players that have started at least two games in the past, which includes 110 total starts between them.

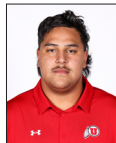
- Junior Jaren Kump (C in 2024) is in his fifth year with the program, starting at every position on the offensive line (45 career games, 27 total starts: 15 at C, 7 at RT, 3 at LT, 1 at RG, 1 at LG), one of just two players in the FBS that have accomplished the feat.
- Sophomore Spencer Fano (RT in 2024) is back with the Utes this fall, coming off a standout true freshman season in 2023 where he was one of just two true freshmen in the FBS to start at left tackle in the season opener. He has now played in 23 career games, starting 22 (12 at LT, 9 at RT), earning freshman All-America in 2023 and PFF Midseason All-America in 2024.
- On the left side of the ball, junior Tanoa Togiai (LG in 2024) and Caleb Lomu (LT in 2024) will hold things down. Togiai joined the program in 2020 and has played in 33 career games with 12 starts with Lomu starting all 10 games at left tackle this season to earn The Athletic Midseason Freshman All-America.
- Senior Falcon Kaumatule, who has played in 47 career games on special teams and the offensive line, has started two of the last three games (Houston, BYU) at right guard. Sophomore Solatoa Moea'i started at right guard against Colorado after having played as a reserve on the offensive line and on special teams in all 10 games this season.
- Junior Michael Mokofisi (RG in 2024) has played in 38 career games with 34 starts (33 at RG, 1 at LG). He started the first eight games of 2024 at right guard, but suffered a season-ending injury against TCU.

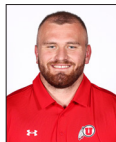

RUNS IN THE FAMILY

In his ninth season as Utah's tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator, Freddie Whittingham is set to keep the tradition of NFL-caliber tight ends coming through Salt Lake City. Freddie, the younger brother of head coach Kyle Whittingham, has been a part of the program for 12 years, serving as the director of player personnel from 2012-15.

- Out of the 15,064 receiving yards produced since 2019, Utah's tight ends have accounted for 31-percent as well as 59 total touchdowns in that time span.
- A tight end has led the Utes in receiving yards in three of the last five years.
- Whittingham has been integral in the development of All-Americans, all-conference selections and NFL draftees during his time at Utah, including first-round pick Dalton Kincaid.
- Between 2018-2023, Whittingham coached the trio of Brant Kuithe, Kincaid and Cole Fotheringham with Kincaid and Fotheringham playing in the NFL and Kuithe becoming a three-time all-conference selection.
- In 2022, Whittingham's tight ends accounted for 18 of Utah's 31 receiving scores with Kincaid, Kuithe and Thomas Yassmin combining for 1,397 yards and 17 touchdowns.
- Prior to becoming a coach, Whittingham worked in higher education, spending 20 years with McGraw-Hill companies and Simon & Schuster as a sales and marketing executive in the higher education publishing industry.
- He was a three-year starter at running back at BYU from 1987-89, leading the Cougars in rushing yards all three years.

TIGHT END U

What has quickly become one of the most successful position groups on the field, Utah's 2024 tight ends will look to continue the tradition into this fall. For the Utes, a tight end has now caught at least one pass in 93 of the last 94 games, which included a streak of 77 straight.

- Through 10 games in 2024, Utah's tight ends have caught 51 passes, coming down with 11 of Utah's 19 receiving scores (58%).
- In week one against Southern Utah, Tight End U combined for four of Utah's six receiving touchdowns with the TE room also catching two of Utah's four offensive TDs against Utah State.
- At least one tight end has caught a touchdown in seven of the 10 games this season.

- The Utes have a trio of transfer juniors in the tight end room in

Dallen Bentley, Carsen Ryan and Landen King that continue to bring success to the storied position group.

- Bentley and King are in their second year with the Utes after transferring from Snow College and Auburn, respectively. Bentley has played in 17 games for the Utes with seven starts this season while King has played in 23 games with five starts (4 in 2023, 1 in 2024).
- Ryan is in his first season with the Utes after playing in 17 games at UCLA from 2022-23, earning eight starts during his time there. He has played in all 10 games at Utah in 2024, scoring his first touchdown as a Ute against Utah State.
- A common theme in the tight end room this fall is newcomers finding a new niche with both Miki Suguturaga and Caleb Lohner finding their home at tight end.
- Suguturaga had 25 starts on Utah's defensive line before making the switch to tight end in 2023. He has played in 23 games at tight end with nine starts since 2023.
- Lohner, who had not competitively played the sport of football prior to fall camp, joined the Utes after playing three seasons of Division I basketball at BYU (2020-22) and Baylor (2022-23). He has scored four touchdowns in 2024 on exactly four catches.
- Kuithe returned to the field in 2024 after 706 days of not playing the sport he loves due to injury. He led all active FBS tight ends in career receiving yards (2,364), receptions (179) and touchdowns (21) before suffering a season-ending injury against BYU this season.
- Kuithe had caught a pass in 41 straight games that he had appeared in, which ranked first among tight ends and made him just one of five players in the FBS that had 40-or-more straight games with a catch.

- In his first season at Utah in 2022, he saw the Utes rank No. 11 in the FBS in rushing offense (217.6) with Utah's 3,047 total rushing yards ranking as the second-most in school history.
- Ganthier spent the 2021 season with the Jacksonville Jaguars as the offensive quality control coach after coaching the Weber State running backs from 2013-20.
- At Weber State, Ganthier saw the Wildcats go 45-20 in his final five seasons with three-straight Big Sky titles.
- He spent seven years playing in the NFL after being picked by Tennessee in the seventh round of the 2006 NFL Draft, playing in 36 career games with Washington, Seattle, Buffalo and Tennessee.
- Ganthier earned two All-MWC selections during his time at Utah, rushing for 1,120 yards and seven touchdowns as a senior. He was also a part of the 2004 Fiesta Bowl team.

RUN TOGETHER, WIN TOGETHER

Utah's running back room will look to continue a storied tradition of having 1,000-yard rushers, returning not only depth, but versatility to the field this fall. Since 2021, Utah has eclipsed the 200-yard rushing mark in 21 games played with 101 rushing touchdowns.

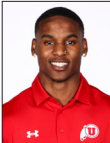

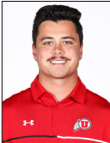

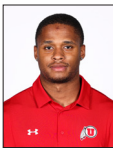
- In his first season with the Utes, Whitted coached a young group of WRs with three different receivers scoring at least two touchdowns.
- He coached 2024 NFL Draft pick Devaughn Vele to a standout senior season with Vele wrapping up his career with 1,689 yards and nine touchdowns.
- In 2024, Whitted has been integral in the development of Dorian Singer, who has 681 receiving yards on 49 receptions (1 TD) through 10 games.
- During his time at Wisconsin, Whitted developed Chimere Dike to finish in the top-10 in the Big Ten in total receiving yards (689) in 2022, also coaching Kendric Pryor and Danny Davis to combine for 1,166 yards and six touchdowns in 2021.
- Before Wisconsin, Whitted coached with the Green Bay Packers in 2019, helping to develop Pro Bowl pick Devante Adams.
- He also spent seven seasons at Colorado State, mentoring All-Americans and Biletnikoff Award finalists Rashard Higgins and Michael Gallup.
- A graduate of North Carolina State, Whitted starred as a return specialist for the Wolfpack, racking up 1,929 kickoff return yards. He was a two-sport athlete, becoming a two-time All-American and five-time ACC champ in the 100, 200 and 400-meter dashes.
- Whitted finished sixth in the 200 meters at the 1996 U.S. Olympic Trials, competing in the final with U.S. greats Carl Lewis and Michael Johnson, who set the world record in the race.

RAC BOYZ

Utah's wide receivers bring versatility, speed and size to the field this fall, not only in the route-running sphere - but in the blocking game as well. Known as the RAC Boyz (Run After Catch), the WR room is set to have a big, and successful season.

- Senior Dorian Singer has been the leader in the wide receiver room this season, recording a team-best 49 catches for 681 yards (1 TD). Both his receptions and yard totals are the most by a Utah wide receiver since 2022 (Devaughn Vele, 55 catches, 695 yards).
- Senior Munir McClain has also been integral to the Utes after missing the first part of the season with an injury. He has played in 26 career games with eight starts at Utah after transferring from USC in 2021.
- The Utes have also seen growth from its younger wide receivers in freshmen Daidren Zipperer and Zacharyus Williams. The duo has played in nine and eight games, respectively, combining for five catches and 72 yards.
- Senior Money Parks played in 47 career games at Utah, recording 24 starts. He had caught at least one pass in 32 straight games, breaking the 1,000 career receiving yards mark against TCU (1,013 total through 47 games) before suffering a season-ending injury at Houston.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

A UTAH MAN IS HE

Defensive coordinator Morgan Scalley, a Salt Lake City native and former All-American safety at the U, is in his 17th season on the Utah coaching staff and ninth as defensive coordinator.

- Athletics Director Mark Harlan announced on July 1, 2024 that Scalley has formally been designated as Utah's head coach in waiting.
- In addition to his coordinator duties, Scalley has coached the safeties since he first joined the staff in 2008. He was also the team's recruiting coordinator from 2009-15 and special teams coordinator in '15 as well.
- Scalley has coached 13 All-Americans (four consensus or unanimous), 19 first team All-Conference selections and five freshmen All-Americans. He has also seen 29 of his proteges reach the NFL, including Devin Lloyd—the highest-drafted linebacker in school history (Round 1, 27th overall in 2022).
- As a player, Scalley came to the Utes out of nearby Highland High School—less than four miles from Rice-Eccles Stadium—where Scalley won "Mr. Football" as the state's high school version of the Heisman Trophy. He arrived on campus in 2001 and captained the squad as a senior in 2004, earning All-America and Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year on the BCS Buster team that won that Fiesta Bowl.
- He has been part of four games known today as part of the "New Year's Six": he had three tackles in Utah's Fiesta Bowl win over Pittsburgh (2004), the Sugar Bowl win over Alabama (2008) capped his first season as safeties coach, and he was on the sidelines for both of the Utes' Rose Bowl appearances.
- Both of Scalley's parents are alumni of the U, including his father, Ford "Bud" Scalley, who lettered as a halfback from 1960-62. His father's marquee moment, perhaps, came in November 1960 when he scored a late touchdown—the only one of the game—to beat a nationally-ranked and previously-undefeated Utah State team, 6-0. It came just a week after Bud Scalley was placed on a full scholarship.

R.S.N.B. - RELENTLESS, SMART, NASTY, BALLHAWKS

The long-standing culture of the Utah defense carries forward into the Big 12, with R.S.N.B. continuing as the identity of the group: relentless, smart, nasty, ballhawks. With conference play on the home stretch, a slew of veterans have played key roles while newcomers to the defense have stepped up when called upon—all bringing the physicality that Utah has become renowned for.

- In Scalley's eight-plus seasons as DC, the Utes have averaged 327.6 total yards allowed per game; it leads the Big 12 and ranks ninth among Power Conference programs during that time. His defense has held 28 opponents under 250 total yards of offense and 17 opponents under 200 yards.
- The Utes return home with the Big 12's third-best scoring defense at 20.3 points allowed per game; it ranks in the top-20 for Power Football. In conference play only, Utah is allowing 24.2 points per game which is fourth in the Big 12. Prior to the Colorado game (49), no Utah opponent this season had scored more than 27 points on the Utes.
- Dating back to last season, the Utes have held 10 of their last 12 opponents to 23 points or less, with a shutout included in that span. Utah has finished each season since 2017 with a top-three scoring defense in its conference.
- This season, Utah is allowing 317.2 total yards per game, the second-best in the Big 12 and 16th in the Power Conferences. In eight of the last nine games, Utah has held its opponent under its average total offense entering the game. Six of Utah's last nine opponents have been held under their average rushing total as well.
- The Utes also bring a top-four league ranking in tackles for loss at 6.1 TFL per game—including a season-high nine against BYU. The defensive line in particular has accounted for at least 3.0 TFL in five games this season.

GUARDING AGAINST THE GROUND GAME

Yardage against Utah does not come easy via the run game—where R.S.N.B. football is arguably best on display. Rushing defense has long been a point of pride for Utah under Morgan Scalley; in his eight prior seasons as coordinator, Utah led the Pac-12 five times (2016, '18, '19, '20 and '21). It includes ranking third in the nation in 2019 when Scalley was a Broyles Award finalist.

- Since Scalley took on coordinator duties in 2016, the Utes have averaged 109.6 rushing yards allowed per game and allowed 108 rushing touchdowns. The rushing defense in that time trails only Georgia (104.6) for the Power Conference lead.
- The Utes have also had three different quarters this season in which the team allowed single-digit rushing yards—most recently the second quarter vs. BYU (3).

- The 2024 Utes have allowed the second-fewest rushing touchdowns (9) in the Big 12. It ties Utah for 12th among the Power Conference teams.
- In Utah's 110 games since 2016, the Utes have 53 performances allowing 100 yards or less on the ground and are 43-10 in those games. A consistent layer among a physical defensive brand, Utah held at least six opponents under 100 rushing yards in five different seasons from 2018-23. It includes both of the program's Pac-12 Championship victories against Oregon (74 yards in 2021) and USC (56 in 2022).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

NO FLY ZONE

Scalley's defense has also a history of havoc for opposing pass games; the Utes sit top-five in the Big 12 for both pass efficiency defense (3rd, 114.59) and passing yards allowed (5th, 191.5). Utah's passing yards allowed ranks 16th in Power Football, while the team's pass efficiency defense is 15th in the Power Conferences.

- Only TCU (Oct. 19) and Colorado (Nov. 16) passed for more than 250 yards against Utah in the last 12 games, dating back to 2023. The Utes have also kept Houston (61 yards) and Southern Utah (71 yards) under 100 passing yards through the air this season.
- It comes after Utah finished five of its final seven Pac-12 seasons in the top third of the conference in both areas. Utah led the league in pass efficiency defense both in 2019 (112.89) and 2020 (120.64), as well as passing yards allowed in 2019 (187.7).
- Fourteen different Utes have at least one PBU this season, led by nickel back Smith Snowden (7), cornerback Cameron Calhoun (6) and defensive end Van Fillinger (5). The team had nine pass breakups altogether vs. BYU, the most for Utah in a game since 2021.
- A well-balanced defense has seen nine different players contribute at least 1.0 sack. Fillinger (6.0) leads the team and reset his single-season career-high after an assisted sack vs. BYU. Fillinger has started nine games this season (8 at DE, 1 at DT) after missing parts of '22 and '23 due to injury.

THIRD DOWN'S THE CHARM

When Utah joined the Big 12 Conference, the Utes brought with them a reputation as one of the toughest teams nationally to convert against on third down. Ten games in, the defense has lived up to the billing with an FBS-best 24.1% conversion rate for opponents. It comes after Utah finished atop the Pac-12 in both 2022 and 2023.

- Opponents have gained 151 first downs against Utah through the first 10 games, the fewest gained against a Big 12 team and third-fewest in Power Football. Utah has given up 15 or fewer first downs in six games.
- Dating back to last season, the Utes have won the time of possession battle in 11 of the last 13 games and 15 of the last 18. Partly a byproduct of having a stingy third-down defense, Utah is atop the Big 12 this season in TOP (33:22 per game) and led the nation in the 2023 season (34:04 per game).
- In the Week 11 rivalry game, Utah allowed a third-down conversion on BYU's second attempt but never again, bringing BYU to a 1-for-12 conversion tally for the game. Four different Utes had at least 2.0 third-down stops in the game. Of BYU's 11 failed conversion attempts, eight resulted in no gain or negative yardage.
- At Oklahoma State in Week 4, the Utes' third-down defense held OSU to a 4-of-15 clip; as a result Utah held the ball for 42:26 of game time. It was the most for the team against an FBS opponent since 2016.
- In Week 2 vs. Baylor, the Utah defense stopped the Bears on their first eight third-down conversion

attempts. Throughout the game, five different Utes had at least 1.0 third-down stop.

- In 2023, Utah's 29.5% opponent third-down conversion rate ranked seventh among Power Conference teams. It correlated with Utah's 199 first downs allowed ranking as fewest in the Pac-12 and third-fewest in the Power Conferences.
- Utah's 199 first downs allowed during 2023 was the fewest for the defense for a full season (excluding 2020) in the program's Power Conference era.
- The Utes had a top-three (or better) third-down defense in the Pac-12 each year from 2018-23 and led the league four times in that span.

PICK-SIX CITY

The Utah defense is looking to extend a nation-leading streak of 20 consecutive seasons with an interception returned for a touchdown. It dates back to 2004, when current defensive coordinator Morgan Scalley was a senior and played safety on the Utes' Fiesta Bowl-winning team.

- This run of annual pick-sixes is the longest active streak in FBS football, and is tied with Arizona State (20 seasons from 2000-19) for the longest streak since 1996. There are no known, longer streaks; however, pick-six statistics are limited prior to 1996.
- During the 20-season span since 2004, Utah has totaled 45 interception return touchdowns, tying Alabama for the most in FBS in that span. Most recently, Lander Barton and Karene Reid each had a pick-six during the 2023 season.
- Jonathan Fanene and Steve Fifita scored Utah's pick-sixes in 2004 to begin the streak.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

LEADING THE GUYS UP FRONT

Imparting the culture of the Utah defense in the trenches are a pair of program alumni in defensive tackles coach Luther Elliss and defensive ends coach Lewis Powell. Elliss is in his third season with the program and played for the Utes from 1991-94, while Powell enters year 10 on the coaching staff after donning the Utah uniform from 2001-03.

- Powell has coached six first team All-Pac-12 players and two consensus All-Americans. He has sent nine Utes to the NFL, including six draft picks—most recently Jonah Elliss in 2024. Three more of his alumni of the defensive ends room signed with NFL teams as undrafted free agents.
- Luther Elliss' defensive tackles have picked up three All-Conference nods in his two previous seasons, as well as a pair of Freshman All-America awards. He returned to his alma mater after five seasons on the Idaho staff.
- Anchored by the defensive line, the Utes led the Pac-12 in TFL in their final three seasons, and led the league in sacks twice during that time. Utah's TFL totals during the 2021 season (98) and 2022 (90) rank among the top-nine in program history for a single season.
- In 2023, the Utah defensive line accounted for 77% of the team's sacks and 56% of the Utes' TFL total. It helped the team rank top-four in the Pac-12 both in sacks per game (2.77) and TFL per game (5.8), with the sack average also placing 16th in FBS.
- Luther Elliss, the 1994 WAC Defensive Player of the Year, was a consensus All-American defensive end in his final season. He was selected 20th overall in the 1995 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 10-year playing career.
- Powell was the 2003 Liberty Bowl Defensive Player of the Game in a 17-0 Utah victory over Southern Miss, capping off a 10-2 season for the Utes.

SACK LAKE CITY

The Utes entered the 2024 season having to replace the physicality and edge speed of fourth round NFL draft pick Jonah Elliss—but a veteran group of defensive line returners have picked up where Elliss left off as a Lombardi Award finalist. Van Fillinger (36 GS), Connor O'Toole (14 GS) and Logan Fano (11 GS) are leading the charge at defensive end, while Junior Tafuna and Keanu Tanuvasa bring a combined 62 starts to the defensive tackle spots.

- Fillinger, who was named to the preseason Lombardi Award Watch List, was a four-star recruit out of Corner Canyon HS and has earned 36 starts out of his 47 career games played. The Draper, Utah, native enters Week 13 ranked third in the Big 12 with 6.0 sacks—a testament to his resilience and determination after battling injuries throughout 2022 and '23. He also leads the Utah defensive line with five pass breakups.
- With 19.5 sacks in his career, Fillinger needs just 0.5 more to break into the top-10 list in program history.
- The sophomore Fano has stepped up this season, starting the last eight games after returning

from a season-ending injury just five games into 2023. He has set a pair of career-highs during Big 12 Conference play, leading the defensive line with seven tackles at Arizona State and posting 1.5 TFL against BYU, the most on the line. The brother of offensive lineman Spencer Fano, Logan started three games as a freshman last year, making 14 tackles (4.0 TFL, 3.5 sacks).

- The duo of Tanuvasa and Tafuna self-coined the nicknames "Dom" and "Nate," respectively—a play on the word "Dominate." It embodies the energy and physicality that both have brought to the defensive line for the last three seasons.
- Tafuna, a Preseason All-Big 12 pick and included on a plethora of watch lists, is one of three defensive linemen on the team totaling at least 25 tackles. A three-time All-Conference pick, Tafuna has started 43 games dating back to his freshman season. He is tied for the defensive line lead with 5.5 third-down stops this season.
- A native of nearby Taylorsville, Utah, Tafuna was thrust into a starting role early in 2021 and went on to win Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year. His career-highs in TFL (5.5) and sacks (4.5) both came in 2021.
- A Freshman All-American in 2022, Tanuvasa went from playing as a reserve in four games that season, to starting 19 of Utah's 23 games in 2023 and 24. His expanded role saw Tanuvasa rank second on the defensive line last year with 6.0 TFL, quadrupling his total from 2022. He went on to earn CFN All-America in 2023. Among the most productive third-down players on the team, Tanuvasa has 5.0 third-down stops on the year—tying him for third on the defensive line.
- Also coming on the scene of late has been true freshman Dallas Vakalahi. Just months after returning from serving a church mission, Vakalahi has played in seven games with three starts. Three of his five tackles at Houston were third-down stops—the most TDS by a Ute in a game this season.
- The group of Fillinger, O'Toole, Tafuna and Tanuvasa have each made gains in size since their arrival on campus. Tafuna sits at 305 pounds after beginning his career at 255 pounds in 2020, while O'Toole—a converted wide receiver—weighs in at 252 pounds, up nearly 40 from his true freshman season.
- Four defensive linemen were among Utah's 11 selections to the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Watch List. It includes Fano (DE), Simote Pepa (DT), Tafuna (DT) and Tanuvasa (DT).

LINEBACKERS AND LASSOS

Linebackers coach Colton Swan guides his group into a new era as Swan continues his sixth season in Salt Lake City. During Utah's time in the Pac-12, Swan's players were some of the most productive in the league earning seven First Team All-Conference selections and sending four Utah linebackers to the NFL.

- He helped Devin Lloyd become a finalist for the Butkus Award both in 2020 and '21, with Lloyd ultimately being selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the 27th pick in the 2022 NFL Draft. A consensus All-American at Utah, Lloyd is now in his third NFL season in 2024. Mohamoud Diabate (Cleveland) and Nephi Sewell (New Orleans) signed free agent contracts after working with Swan, while Francis Bernard spent two seasons in the NFL.
- A man of many talents, Swan initially attended Weber State on a rodeo scholarship before walking on to the football team and transforming into an All-Big Sky linebacker. Nevertheless, Swan maintains a passion for the sport of rodeo to this day and occasionally competes during the football offseason.

HOME IS WHERE THE UTES STAY

Local and returning talent dots the Utah linebacker room, with a pair of preseason Butkus Award Watch List members serving as the leaders of the pack. Senior and former walk-on Karene Reid (41 GP, 37 GS) along with junior Lander Barton (31 GP, 20 GS) are in their third year together at the position, with Reid returning from injury vs. TCU after a four-game absence. The pair have combined for 12.0 third-down stops in 2024.

- Both Barton (Cottonwood Heights) and Reid (American Fork) grew up within a 40-minute drive of Rice-Eccles Stadium.
- Barton is averaging 8.2 tackles over the last five games and leads the team with 64 total stops. He has produced six or more tackles in six games this season—including a career-long run of four straight games with seven-plus stops. It was highlighted by a 12-tackle night (11 solo) in the matchup with Houston. He has defended three passes in the last two games, including an

interception of Shedeur Sanders on the first play of the game at Colorado.

- As a freshman in 2022, Barton's 46 tackles, eight TFL and 4.5 sacks all led rookies on the team—putting him in place to win Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year and Freshman All-America honors. Barton started all seven games in 2023 before sustaining a season-ending injury. He and Reid combined for 101 tackles in 2023, with Barton (34) leading the linebacker room at the time of his injury.
- Reid has put on two eight-tackle performances (vs. TCU and BYU) after missing the previous four games due to injury. His night vs. TCU (with 0.5 TFL) came after Reid entered the game with eight total tackles in his two games played. The preseason watch list selection for Polynesian College Football Player of the Year has notched 1.0 sack in back-to-back games and at least an assisted TFL in all four games since returning from injury.
- His rivalry night vs. BYU tied career-bests for TFL (2.0) and sacks (1.0), while Reid also broke up a pass and led the team with eight tackles and 2.5 third-down stops.
- Reid, a two-time All-Pac-12 pick, had three different nine-tackle games during the 2023 season, averaging 6.8 tackles per game in conference play. His four PBU last season led the linebacker room and ranked third on the team.
- Safety-to-linebacker convert Johnathan Hall came up with a career-high seven tackles (2.0 TFL) in the game at Colorado. He had a pair of five-tackle performances at Arizona State and Utah State with a TFL in each. Hall's first career interception came in the Houston game, while playing less than an hour from his hometown of Katy, Texas.
- A third Utah native, Sione Fotu of West Jordan, has played in eight games (3 GS) this season with his seven tackles vs. Baylor tying a career-high. After playing in all five games during the COVID-altered 2020 season, Fotu departed on a church mission, returning in 2023 to play in 11 games last year. He contributed 18 tackles in '23.

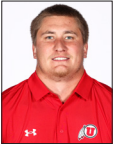

MOVIN' ON UP

Four Utah safeties have moved onto the NFL in the last five seasons after Cole Bishop and Sione Vaki were both selected in the 2024 NFL Draft. New faces are settling in as the featured safeties for the Utes in 2024, with returner Tao Johnson and Stanford transfer Alaka'i Gilman at the top of the list.

- A do-it-all kind of player, Johnson has spent time at wide receiver (2022), nickel back (2023) and now safety in his three seasons at the U. He leads the secondary with 57 tackles (2.0 TFL), helped by two marquee games this season. Johnson made a career-best nine stops plus an interception vs. Arizona, along with three other seven-tackle games: Baylor (2.0 TFL), Arizona State and TCU.
- Johnson has also been a key special teams contributor. He blocked a field goal attempt against TCU, while also scooping up a blocked field goal vs. Baylor and running it back for a 77-yard touchdown. The former No. 2-ranked prospect in Idaho is the only FBS player since 2012 to accomplish both of those in the same season. He earned spots on both the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List and Good Works Team Watch List.
- Gilman made the move to Salt Lake City after playing in 32 games (13 GS) with the Cardinal from 2020-23. He ranks in the top-six on the team lead with 5.0 third-down stops, all in the last seven games. In the game against Arizona, he made a career-best 2.0 TFL among eight total tackles.
- Gilman started all nine of his games played in '23 with Stanford, recording 50 tackles, three pass breakups and an interception.
- Evans has earned three starts, including Week 7 at Arizona State. That was a breakout night for the junior out of Blinn College, who turned in nine tackles plus a pass breakup for his most tackles as a Ute.

THE COMMON THREAD

Cornerbacks coach Sharrieff Shah is synonymous with the Utah defense, first playing safety with the Utes from 1990-93 and now in his 13th season coaching the cornerbacks. Shah also is in his sixth year as special teams coordinator, previously serving as co-coordinator from 2016-18.

- Named by ESPN in 2014 as one of "10 coaches who adapt and thrive," Shah has developed five cornerback converts into NFL players. Eleven of his players have been named All-Conference, highlighted by unanimous All-America choice and Jim Thorpe Award finalist Clark Phillips III in 2022.
- Shah was a captain while playing for former longtime head coach Ron McBride, going in the books as a three-year starter. Shah was an All-WAC honorable mention pick in 1991 and '92 and starred in indoor track.
- Before entering the coaching world, Shah took a unique path serving as a practicing attorney, certified agent through the NFLPA and as the Utes' sideline reporter on radio and television during the team's WAC and Mountain West eras.

COVERED FROM CORNER TO CORNER

Beaumont, Texas native and 2023 All-Pac-12 selection Zemaiah Vaughn brings experience in the cornerback room with 34 starts as a Ute and 54 career games played with Utah—the most on the defense. Sophomore Elijah Davis and freshman Cameron Calhoun have emerged opposite Vaughn, with a talented group of freshmen and sophomores behind them and ready when their numbers are called.

- Vaughn, a former walk-on turned starter, came into the Big 12 with Preseason All-Conference honors after starting all 13 games last season. He has 3.0 third-down stops this season and defended 23 passes (2 INT, 21 PBU) in his career. Vaughn's 21 career PBU tie him for 10th-most in program history.
- Vaughn doubled his previous career-high with a 3.0 TFL performance against BYU; it was the first 3.0 TFL performance by a Utah player in the secondary since Sept. 2023.
- A converted high school quarterback, Vaughn has started 29 consecutive games at corner. Last season, his 53 total stops led the cornerbacks room and was third among returners to the team this year. In addition, Vaughn's 5.0 TFL were the most at his position a year ago.
- Both Davis and Calhoun—the latter a Michigan transfer—have combined for nine starts. Davis went off for a career-best six tackles in the TCU game, also totaling two interceptions this season. Calhoun announced his arrival with a three-tackle game at Utah State as well as an interception (34 yards) in that win over the Aggies.
- With Tao Johnson's transition to safety, sophomore Smith Snowden is making strides at nickel back after playing in 11 games as a true freshman. Snowden leads the team both with seven pass breakups this season and 8.0 third-down stops.
- Snowden's first career interception came in the Utah State win, where he led the secondary with a career-high six tackles (1.0 TFL) and a pass breakup. He followed that performance with a two-tackle, three-PBU outing at Oklahoma State.
- Snowden grew up in nearby Lehi, Utah, and was a four-star recruit after being named Utah's "Mr. Football" in 2022. He has logged three-plus tackles in four games this season. A three-time All-State and All-Region selection in high school, he was a four-star recruit and finished his high school career with 26 interceptions.

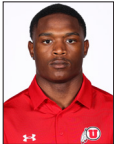

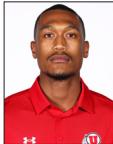

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

The Utes and Special Teams Coordinator Sharrieff Shah saw the return of each of the program's top specialists in seniors JT Greep and Cole Becker at the snapper and kicker spots, respectively, and junior punter Jack Bouwmeester. Trey Coleman has helped shoulder Utah's kickoff duties.

- After joining the team in time for the start of the 2023 campaign, Becker had an immediate impact, piling up 73 points, the most by a Utah kicker since Jadon Redding had 86 in 2019.
- Becker converted on 83.3 percent of his field goal tries during his first year as a Ute, the highest rate by any Utah kicker with at least 10 attempts since Matt Gay in 2018.
- The 51-yard field goal Becker knocked through in Utah's 2023 opener vs. Florida was also the longest by a Ute in five years, as Gay hit from 55 in 2018.
- Becker's 15 made field goals so far in 2024 put him in a tie for fourth in the Big 12 and in the top 25 in the nation.
- Bouwmeester improved statistically across the board during his sophomore year, adding more than six yards to his average and logging 19 boots of 50 yards or better, the highest total by a Utah punter since Mitch Wishnowsky totaled 20 in 2018.
- Bouwmeester's 2,154 punt yards are the most in the Big 12 and his 18 punts dropped inside the 20 are the league's highest total.
- Bouwmeester also ranks third in the league with 11 punts of 50 yards or better and a 44.6 average, which also ranks 21st nationally.
- Greep didn't miss a single game for the Utes in 2022 or 2023 and has spent 2024 by adding to his ledger of nearly 400 total snaps for the Utes.
- Coleman has stepped into the role of kickoff specialist and accounted for 10 touchbacks on 28 kickoffs.

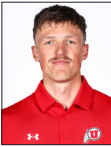
