THE LEAD

No. 6 Iowa State, fresh off a Big 12 title and an NCAA team trophy, enters its eighth season under two-time Big 12 Coach of the Year Kevin Dresser. The Cyclones open their 2024-25 campaign at home against No. 20 Stanford Friday at 7 p.m. on ESPN+.

KEY STORYLINES

- This marks just the second all-time meeting between Iowa State and Stanford and the first since 2005.
- ISU finished in fourth place at the 2024 NCAA Championships with 68.5 team points, it's best finish and point total since 2010. It was the 45th NCAA team trophy finish in program history.
- ISU returns seven of nine wrestlers, and 42.5 of 68.5 points, from its NCAA Championship lineup.
- Four current Cyclones have earned All-America status at some point in their career - Evan Frost, Anthony Echemendia, Casey Swiderski and Yonger Bastida.
- Iowa State won its first Big 12 title, and its 18th conference championship in program history, in 2024 behind individual title performances from Echemendia and Bastida. With one less placewinner than Oklahoma State, the Cyclones still managed to outpace the Cowboys thanks to 28 bonus points compared to 13 from OSU.
- Bonus points were the common theme for Iowa State's success last season. Nearly 45 percent of dual/tournament matches wrestled by Cyclones in 2023-24 resulted in a bonus-point win (125-of-285).
- Iowa State added nine freshmen and four transfers to its roster during the offseason, giving it the No. 11 recruiting class nationally by FloWrestling.
- Eight of the 11 Cyclones in Friday's projected lineup are sophomores or younger, including three true freshmen. Additionally, six of the 11 are new to the roster this season.

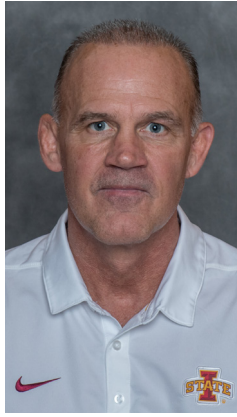

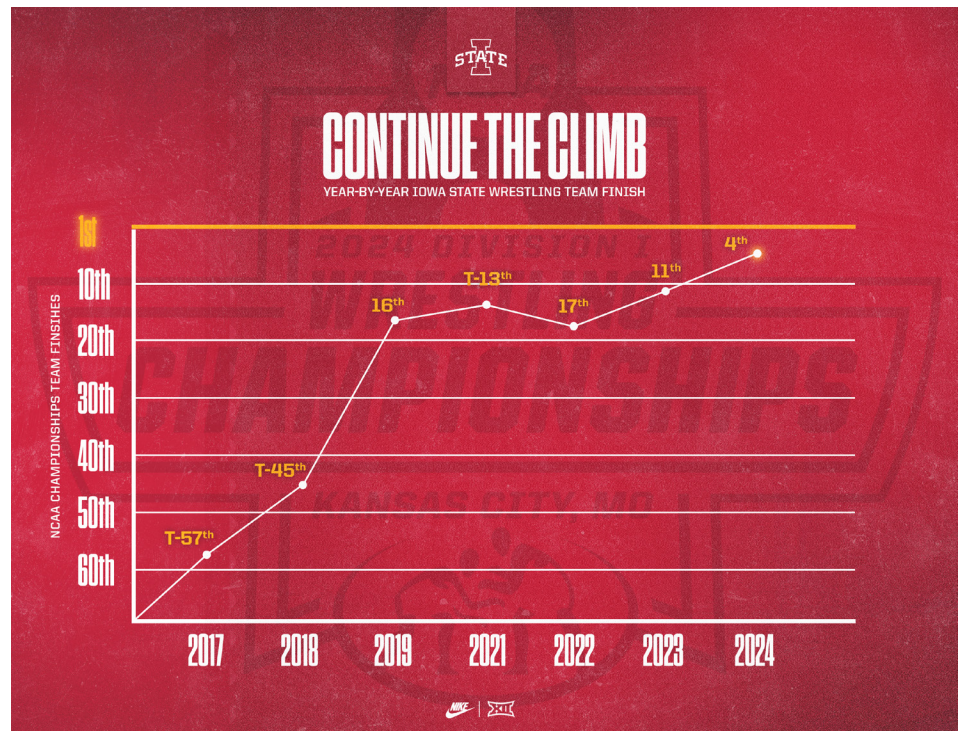

PROGRAM BUILDER

Kevin Dresser's efforts have seen Iowa State climb on the national stage, highlighted most recently by a 2024 Big 12 title and fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships, ISU's best since 2010.

Dresser inherited a program that scored one point and finished tied for 57th at the 2017 NCAA Championships. Since then, Iowa State has finished T-45th, 16th, T-13th, 17th, 11th and 4th at the national tournament.

FROM THE NOTEBOOK

PROGRAM ON THE RISE

Head coach Kevin Dresser, in his eighth season at the helm, has brought Iowa State wrestling back into the national conversation.

- Iowa State finished in fourth place at the NCAA Championships with 68.5 team points, its best finish and point total since 2010. ISU placed four wrestlers on the podium, its most since 2009.
- Dresser inherited a program that scored one point and finished tied for 57th at the 2017 NCAA Championships. Since then, Iowa State has finished T-45th, 16th, T-13th, 17th, 11th and 4th at the NCAA Championships.
- Iowa State had no conference champions in 2017 and failed to have a wrestler reach All-American status. Since then, Dresser has produced 10 Big 12 Champs, 13 NCAA All-Americans, two National Champions and has led ISU to its first Big 12 team title since 2009.

IOWA STATE GETS ITS NCAA TROPHY

It took until August, but Iowa State finally received its fourth-place NCAA trophy. Better late than never, but why did it take so long?

- Traditionally, the NCAA has always awarded the top four teams at the NCAA Championships a trophy, but following the 2023 season, the NCAA elected to do away with the fourth-place trophy, citing financial reasons.
- In July, the NCAA Competition Oversight Committee voted to reverse course and to reinstate the fourth-place trophy going forward, as well as retroactively award the Cyclones their trophy for 2024.

- It officially marked Iowa State's 45th trophy finish in program history (eight national titles, 16 runner-up finishes, 13 third-place finishes, eight fourth-place finishes).

BIG 12 CHAMPS

The 2023-24 season saw Iowa State win its first Big 12 title since 2009. The Cyclones crowned two champions and finished with 152.5 team points, the fourth-most in a tournament in league history and the most ever by an ISU team in the Big 12 era.

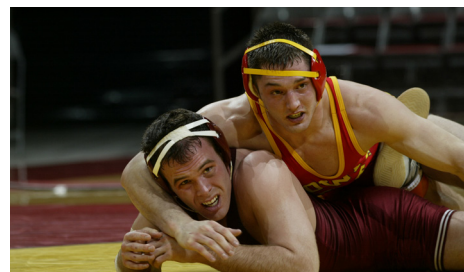
- With one less placewinner than Oklahoma State, the Cyclones still managed to outpace the Cowboys thanks to 28 bonus points compared to 13 from OSU.
- Iowa State will embark upon the 2024-25 season with the goal of winning back-to-back Big 12 titles for the first time since the Cyclones won three-straight championships from 2007-09.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- There are 10 teams on Iowa State's dual schedule that had a top-25 finish at the 2024 NCAA Championships, four of which placed inside the top 10.
- Five of Iowa State's home dual opponents are ranked in the preseason poll: No. 21 Stanford (Nov. 8), No. 22 Oklahoma (Jan. 24), No. 3 Oklahoma State (Jan. 26), No. 18 Arizona State (Feb. 7) and No. 25 Pittsburgh (Feb. 9).
- Overall, 12 of ISU's 17 dual opponents are ranked in the top 25, including three of the top five.

SERIES NOTES

- Iowa State and Stanford face off for just the second time in the programs' history.
- The Cyclones and Cardinal first met Jan. 21, 2005 when Iowa State defeated Stanford, 23-18, inside Hilton Coliseum.
- Stanford led the No. 3 Cyclones, 18-16, after eight bouts, but ISU got a major decision from two-time All-American Kurt Backes (pictured below) at 197 pounds and a decision from heavyweight Scott Coleman to close out the dual.





RETURNING PRODUCTION

Iowa State must adjust to life without two-time national champ and five-time All-American David Carr in the lineup, but the 2024-25 Cyclone roster has the potential to be better than last year.

- ISU returns seven wrestlers, including three All-Americans, from its Big 12 and NCAA Championships lineup last season.
- Overall, Iowa State returns 76 percent of its dual meet victories from last season's roster and 42.5 of its 68.5 points from the 2024 NCAA Championships.
- Four current Cyclones have earned All-America status at some point in their career - Evan Frost, Anthony Echemendia, Casey Swiderski and Yonger Bastida.

2024 RECRUITING CLASS

Iowa State added nine freshmen and four transfers to its roster during the offseason, giving it the No. 11 recruiting class nationally by FloWrestling.

- The Cyclones signed four top-100 prep recruits in the class - No. 13 Sawyer Bartelt, No. 54 Adrian Meza, No. 63 Daniel Herrera (Flo) and No. 90 Kane Naaktgeboren (MatScouts).
- Transfers Christian Carroll (197, Oklahoma State), Evan Bockman (184, Utah Valley), Aiden Riggins (174, Iowa) and CJ Carter (285, Iowa Western CC) were brought in to add depth and competition to the top half of the lineup.
- Riggins, Bockman and Carroll are all in ISU's projected lineup against Stanford.

GOING FOR BONUS

Kevin Dresser preaches a high-paced, entertaining style of wrestling which allowed the Cyclones to take advantage of the NCAA's new three-point takedown rule last season.

- Last season, nearly half of ISU's wins in duals came with bonus points. The Cyclones tallied 72 bonus-point wins (15 WBF, 29 TF, 28 MD) in 150 dual matches in 2023-24.
- In total, nearly 45 percent of ISU's matches (dual & tournament) last season resulted in a bonus-point win (125-of-285).
- Bonus points were the reason for ISU's tournament success a season ago. Iowa State won 53 matches with bonus points spread across the Cliff Keen Invitational (23), Big 12 Championship (19) and NCAA Championships (11).

CUBANS COMING AT YA

Iowa State has three native Cubans on its roster - Anthony Echemendia, Yonger Bastida and Osmany Diversent.

- Echemendia and Bastida both won Big 12 titles for the Cyclones last season and enter their final seasons of eligibility. Diversent, a freshman, is new to the roster in 2024-25.
- Childhood friends, Bastida hails from Trinidad, Cuba while Echemendia is from Cabaiguan, Cuba - a mere 36 miles away from each other.
- From ages 9-18 the pair trained together at EIDE Lino Salabarría Pupo - a sports teaching facility for the training and development of high-performance athletes in Sancti Spiritus, Cuba, located between their hometowns and 1620 miles away from Ames, Iowa.
- Bastida and Echemendia were two of four international wrestlers in the 2024 Division I NCAA Wrestling Championships field.



FEELIN' FROSTY

As only a redshirt freshman, Evan Frost was as consistent as they come at 133 pounds. He placed sixth at the NCAA Championships to become Iowa State's first All-American at the weight since Earl Hall placed seventh in 2016.

- Six of his seven matches at the national tournament were decided by a takedown or less, including a tiebreaker loss to top-seeded Daton Fix in the quarterfinals and a win in sudden victory over No. 4 Dylan Shawver.
- A Big 12 runner-up, Frost posted a 22-7 record and tallied 12 bonus-point victories (5 TF, 7 MD) last season.

A COUNTRY BOY CAN SURVIVE

A year removed of falling in the blood round, Casey Swiderski placed seventh at the 2024 NCAA Championships (149 pounds) in his sophomore season.

It was another difficult year battling injury, but the Michigan native toughed it out and advanced to the national quarterfinals before gutting out a win in the blood round over Ohio State's No. 14 Dylan D'Emilio in tiebreakers.

- Swiderski lost only three matches after returning from an injury which caused him to miss most of December and January, two of which occurred at the national tournament.
- Swiderski finished the 2023-24 season with a 24-5 record and 13 bonus point wins (7 TF, 6 MD). Four of his five losses came against top-five opponents.
- He has 11 top-15 wins in his career, including seven in 2023-24.

Program-Building Commitment

- Swiderski was the first commitment for Iowa State in its second-ranked 2022 recruiting class and was tabbed by MatScouts as the No. 3 prospect nationally.
- He has four Michigan state titles to his name, all at different weight classes (103, 135, 145, 152), and posted a 166-3 high school record, including a 45-0 mark as a senior.
- Swiderski is one of four Michigan prep wrestlers all-time to win four-time team and individual state titles. Also among the group is Iowa State assistant coach Brent Metcalf (2002-05).

BASTIDA LOOKING TO BOUNCE BACK

Heavyweight Yonger Bastida looks to bounce back in 2024-25 after a disappointing end to a dominant 2023-24 season.

- Bastida was the lone Cyclone to enter the NCAA Championships with an undefeated record, but fell short of the podium following a last-second quarterfinal defeat to Michigan's Lucas Davison and subsequent blood round defeat later on Friday evening - his only two losses of the year.
- Bastida's season was still noteworthy, however. He had 102 takedowns to his name and only allowed six, three of which occurred at the national tournament.
- Bastida finished with a 26-2 record which included 18 bonus point victories (3 WBF, 9 TF, 6 MD).

ANTHONY ECHEMENDIA

Anthony Echemendia has his sights set on another podium finish this season.

- Echemendia placed fifth at the NCAA Championships as the No. 5 seed. He became the first Cyclone 141-pounder to receive All-America honors at the NCAA Championships since 2009 (Nate Gallick).
- Echemendia also won a Big 12 title, becoming the fifth Cyclone to win a conference title at 141 pounds and the first since Ian Parker did so in 2020.
- The Cuban finished the year with a 24-6 record and won 18 of his last 21 matches. He registered 17 bonus-point victories (1 WBF, 9 TF, 7 MD) and tallied 96 takedowns while allowing only 12.
- Echemendia is 8-6 against top-15 opponents as a Cyclone.

CALI STYLE

MJ Gaitan brings big-move and bonus-point potential to the lineup.

- Gaitan was as dynamic as they come in 2023-24 with 10 pins on the season, the most on the team and tied for the 17th-most nationally.
- After losing his first match at the 2024 NCAA Championships, Gaitan put together a remarkable run through the back side of the bracket with three consecutive wins. He fell just a win shy of All-America honors after falling to No. 3 Edmond Ruth, 8-6, in the blood round.
- Gaitan posted a 22-9 season record and found another gear late in the year, winning 16 of his final 20 matches, including 10-straight victories to close the regular season.
- He had 15 bonus-point wins (10 WBF, 1 TF, 4 TF).

CONNOR EUTON

Connor Euton is projected to make his Hilton Coliseum debut on Friday against Stanford.

- Euton appeared in one dual last season, earning a 10-7 victory over NCAA Qualifier Joey Bianchi (Little Rock). He posted a 20-4 record and claimed titles at the Grand View and Doane open tournaments.
- Before redshirting the 2022-23 season, Euton was a two-time Ohio state champ with a 134-12 career mark.

CODY CHITTUM

- Cody Chittum registered a 16-7 record in his true freshman season, including 10 bonus-point victories (5 TF, 5 MD).
- After a Big 12 runner-up finish, Chittum went 1-2 at the NCAA Championships and scored 2.0 team points.
- Chittum's highest-ranked win of the season was a 9-5 decision over Arizona State's No. 4 Jacori Teemer in early January.

Chittum is a Cyclone

- Chittum was FloWrestling's No. 1 pound-for-pound recruit in the class of 2022 but took a grey shirt year training in Iowa City.
- During his grey shirt year, Chittum medaled three times at senior level freestyle events in 2023 - silver at the Bill Farrell and bronze medals at the Henri Deglane and Egypt Ranking Series.

TRACKING TERUKINA

- Kysen Terukina qualified for the NCAA Championships for the third time in his career in 2023-24. He picked up his first win at the tournament over Army's No. 25 Ethan Berginc, 4-2.
- Terukina posted a 14-10 record and had five wins come with bonus points (1 WBF, 2 TF, 2 MD).
- His best win of the season was a 14-3 major decision over Wisconsin's No. 6 Eric Barnett in November. Terukina also defeated No. 7 Stevo Poulin (UNCO), 3-2, at the Big 12 Championship.

FROST SELECTED FOR ALL-STAR CLASSIC

Evan Frost was selected to compete at the 2024 National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) All-Star Classic on Nov. 16.

- Frost is matched up against Little Rock's No. 2 Nasir Bailey, who placed fourth at the NCAA Championships in March. It's a rematch from last season as Bailey was responsible for one of Frost's three regular season losses, a 15-0 tech fall in 1:57.
- The Frost-Bailey matchup pits two of the NCAA's brightest young talents at 133 pounds against each other. Both Frost and Bailey enter the 2024-25 season ranked in the top five by FloWrestling and both were All-Americans at the 2024 NCAA Championships.

CARROLL JOINS THE FRAY

Christian Carroll joined the Cyclones after redshirting the 2023-24 season at Oklahoma State.

- Carroll wrestled at the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials at 97 kg where he defeated four-time NCAA All-American Tony Cassioppi in the opening round.
- In addition to Cassioppi, he also notched Freestyle wins over NCAA All-Americans Jacob Warner and Trey Munoz during the year.
- Carroll won the Last Chance Olympic Team Trials Qualifier and placed third at 92 kg at 2024 U23 Nationals.
- As a prep, he was the No. 2 pound-for-pound wrestler in the class of 2023 by MatScouts.

BOCKMAN MOVES DOWN

Evan Bockman enters his seventh season of collegiate wrestling in 2024-25. Bockman wrestled at 197 pounds a year ago, but has dropped to 184 for the upcoming season.

- A three-time NCAA Qualifier, Bockman began his career at California Baptist (2018-21) before spending three seasons at Utah Valley (2021-24).
- He owns a 58-33 career record, including a 19-9 mark a season ago at Utah Valley.

RIGGINS IN CARDINAL & GOLD

Aiden Riggins transferred to Iowa State after spending two seasons at Iowa.

- Wrestling above his natural weight, he represented Iowa at 184 pounds at the Big Ten Championships (DNP).
- Riggins posted a 12-13 record in 2023-24 and redshirted the 2022-23 season.
- An Iowa prep standout at Waverly-Shell rock, Riggins was the No. 25 recruit nationally on MatScouts' 2022 Big Board. He was a two-time state champion, three-time finalist and four-time placewinner (170-4 prep record).

ADRIAN MEZA

Adrian Meza, a Valiant College Prep [Ariz.] product, was a key peice of Iowa State's 2024 recruiting class.

- He was rated as the No. 54 recruit nationally by FloWrestling and No. 68 by MatScouts.
- Meza was a 2023 Junior Freestyle All-American and placed sixth at 2023 Super 32.

HOME SWEET HILTON

- Iowa State is 18-2 on its home mat since the 2021-22 season.
- The Cyclones have won 12 consecutive home Big 12 duals since the 2020-21 season. Their last loss to a conference foe inside Hilton Coliseum was on 1/30/21 to No. 5 Oklahoma State (ISU 15, OSU 16).

BIG 12 DUAL SUCCESS

Iowas State is 41-12 in Big 12 duals under head coach Kevin Dresser. Dresser and the Cyclones have been even better in recent seasons.

True freshman Kane Naaktgeboren is projected to make his Cyclone debut Friday against Stanford.

- He is the younger brother of ISU 174-pounder Tate Naaktgeboren.
- A Linn-Mar High School product, Kane Naaktgeboren was the No. 90 overall recruit nationally by MatScouts.
- Naaktgeboren capped his outstanding prep career with a state title and perfect 37-0 record. He was named the 2024 Bob Steenlage Iowa High School Wrestler of the Year, Cedar Rapids Gazette Wrestler of the Year and Dave Schultz High School Excellence Award recipient and was a 2024 Dan Gable Wrestler of the Year finalist.
- Naaktgeboren was a four-time Iowa high school state medalist with a 128-10 career record, including a school-record 108 falls.



FROM THE NOTEBOOK

JOHNSON MAKES U23 WORLD TEAM

Paniro Johnson qualified for the U23 World Championships in Tirana, Albania but unfortunately had to miss the event due to an injury suffered during training.

- Johnson won the 70 KG U23 national title in June to make the USA Wrestling World Team.

BROTHERLY LOVE

Iowa State boasts three set of brothers on its 2024-25 roster.

Evan (133) and Jacob (141) both appeared in duals last season against Cleveland State and Davidson, making them the first set of brothers to appear in ISU's dual lineup since Michael and Gabe Moreno in 2015.

Evan and Jacob wrestled their high school senior seasons at Dowling Catholic in Des Moines, Iowa, but called Metairie, Louisiana home growing up. The pair moved from Louisiana to Iowa for a better and more high-profile wrestling experience. They each won three state titles in Louisiana and Evan added a fourth in Iowa while Jacob grabbed a runner-up finish as a senior.

2025 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Speaking of brotherly love, the 2025 NCAA Wrestling Championships will be held March 20-22 in Philadelphia, Pa.

CARLUCCI'S BATTLE

In mid-April of 2023, Strep A bacteria - typically found in the throat - settled in Cole Carlucci's knee bursa. He underwent five surgeries in 10 days to clean out the infection and try to preserve as much quad tissue as possible.

Remarkably, Carlucci was back in the weight room by July of that year and was able to begin wrestling activity along with the team at the start of the school year.
