## THE LEAD

No. 13 Iowa State returns to the Collegiate Duals for the third-consecutive season Saturday in Nashville, Tennessee. The Cyclones, fresh off a win over NDSU in their Big 12 dual opener, will face stiff competition at the event against Lock Haven (2 p.m.), No. 25 North Carolina (4 p.m.) and No. 5 Ohio State (6 p.m.).

## KEY STORYLINES

- Iowa State is fresh off a 27-12 victory over North Dakota State in its Big 12 dual opener last Sunday. The win brought the Cyclones to a 2-2 record in dual action this season.
- The Cyclones will wrestle at the Collegiate Duals for the third season in a row. ISU is 5-1 at the current format of the duals losing only to No. 1 Penn State in 2022-23. Iowa State won its pool last season, defeating Pittsburgh, Little Rock and Cornell.
- The injury bug has plagued the Cyclones early in the season. Iowa State lost starters Casey Swiderski (141) and Connor Euton (165) to season-ending knee injuries. Anthony Echemendia (149) is expected to be out until late January due to a high ankle sprain while heavyweight Yonger Bastida has wrestled in only one dual this season as he recovers from a lingering knee injury.
- Nearly half of Iowa State's matches won this season (excluding open tournaments) have resulted in bonus points for the Cyclones (24-of-49, 48%).

## FROM THE NOTEBOOK

### PROGRAM ON THE RISE

Head coach Kevin Dresser, in his eighth season at the helm, has brought Iowa State wrestling back into the national conversation.

- Iowa State finished in fourth place at the NCAA Championships with 68.5 team points, it's best finish and point total since 2010. ISU placed four wrestlers on the podium, its most since 2009.
- Dresser inherited a program that scored one point and finished tied for 57th at the 2017 NCAA Championships. Since then, Iowa State has finished T-45th, 16th, T-13th, 17th, 11th and 4th at the NCAA Championships.
- Iowa State had no conference champions in 2017 and failed to have a wrestler reach All-American status. Since then, Dresser has produced 10 Big 12 Champs, 13 NCAA All-Americans, two National Champions and has led ISU to its first Big 12 team title since 2009.

### IOWA STATE GETS ITS NCAA TROPHY

It took until August, but Iowa State finally received its fourth-place NCAA trophy. Better late than never, but why did it take so long?

- Traditionally, the NCAA has always awarded the top four teams at the NCAA Championships a trophy, but following

the 2023 season, the NCAA elected to do away with the fourth-place trophy, citing financial reasons.

- In July, the NCAA Competition Oversight Committee voted to reverse course and to reinstate the fourth-place trophy going forward, as well as retroactively award the Cyclones their trophy for 2024.
- It officially marked Iowa State's 45th trophy finish in program history (eight national titles, 16 runner-up finishes, 13 third-place finishes, eight fourth-place finishes).

### BIG 12 CHAMPS

The 2023-24 season saw Iowa State win its first Big 12 title since 2009. The Cyclones crowned two champions and finished with 152.5 team points, the fourth-most in a tournament in league history and the most ever by an ISU team in the Big 12 era.

- With one less placewinner than Oklahoma State, the Cyclones still managed to outpace the Cowboys thanks to 28 bonus points compared to 13 from OSU.
- Iowa State is looking to win back-to-back Big 12 titles for the first time since the Cyclones won three-straight championships from 2007-09.

## FROM THE NOTEBOOK

### BIG 12 DUAL SUCCESS

Iowa State is 42-12 in Big 12 duals under head coach Kevin Dresser. Dresser and the Cyclones have been even better in recent seasons.

### CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- There are 10 teams on Iowa State's dual schedule that had a top-25 finish at the 2024 NCAA Championships, four of which placed inside the top 10.
- Overall, 11 of ISU's 17 dual opponents are ranked in the top 25, including three of the top five.

### RETURNING PRODUCTION

- Iowa State is adjusting to life without two-time national champ and five-time All-American David Carr in the lineup, but the 2024-25 Cyclone lineup still returned a plethora of talent.
- ISU returned seven wrestlers, including three All-Americans, from its Big 12 and NCAA Championships lineup last season.
  - Overall, Iowa State returned 76 percent of its dual meet victories from last season's roster and 42.5 of its 68.5 points from the 2024 NCAA Championships.
  - Four current Cyclones have earned All-America status at some point in their career - Evan Frost, Anthony Echemendia, Casey Swiderski and Yonger Bastida.

### NEXT MAN UP

The injury bug has plagued the Cyclones early in the season. Iowa State lost starters Casey Swiderski (141) and Connor Euton (165) to season-ending knee injuries.

Anthony Echemendia (149) is expected to miss until late January due to a high ankle sprain while heavyweight Yonger Bastida has wrestled in only one dual this season as he heals from a lingering knee injury.

Additionally, 125-pounder Kysen Terukina has yet to make his season debut due to nagging neck soreness, according to Coach Dresser.

### NEW FACES

Iowa State added nine freshmen and four transfers to its roster during the offseason, giving it the No. 11 recruiting class nationally by FloWrestling.

- The Cyclones signed four top-100 prep recruits in the class - No. 13 Sawyer Bartelt, No. 54 Adrian Meza, No. 63 Daniel Herrera (Flo) and No. 90 Kane Naaktgeboren (MatScouts).
- Transfers Christian Carroll (197, Oklahoma State), Evan Bockman (184, Utah Valley), Aiden Riggins (174, Iowa) and CJ Carter (285, Iowa Western CC) were brought in to add depth and competition to the top half of the lineup.
- Riggins, Bockman and Carroll have all been regular starters for the Cyclones this season.

### GOING FOR BONUS

Kevin Dresser preaches a high-paced, entertaining style of wrestling and encourages his athletes to give fans their money's worth.

- Last season, nearly half of ISU's wins in duals came with bonus points. The Cyclones tallied 72 bonus-point wins (15 WBF, 29 TF, 28 MD) in 150 dual matches in 2023-24.
- In total, nearly 45 percent of ISU's matches (dual & tournament) last season resulted in a bonus-point win (125-of-285).
- Bonus points were the reason for ISU's tournament success a season ago. Iowa State won 53 matches with bonus points spread across the Cliff Keen Invitational (23), Big 12 Championship (19) and NCAA Championships (11).
- This season, nearly half of Cyclone wrestlers' wins have come with bonus points (24-of-49).

**FEELIN' FROSTY**

Twin brothers Evan and Jacob Frost are both projected to wrestle at the Collegiate Duals this weekend at 133 and 141 pounds, respectively.

Evan and Jacob both appeared in duals last season against Cleveland State and Davidson, making them the first set of brothers to appear in ISU's dual lineup since Michael and Gabe Moreno in 2015.

Evan and Jacob wrestled their high school senior seasons at Dowling Catholic in Des Moines, Iowa, but called Metairie, Louisiana home growing up. The pair moved from Louisiana to Iowa for a better and more high-profile wrestling experience. They each won three state titles in Louisiana and Evan added a fourth in Iowa while Jacob grabbed a runner-up finish as a senior.

**EVAN FROST**

Evan Frost logged his second-consecutive runner-up finish at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational his last time out. Frost is 4-2 on the season with two top-20 victories.

- As only a redshirt freshman, Evan was as consistent as they come at 133 pounds last season. He placed sixth at the NCAA Championships to become Iowa State's first All-American at the weight since Earl Hall placed seventh in 2016.
- Six of his seven matches at the national tournament were decided by a takedown or less, including a tiebreaker loss to top-seeded Daton Fix in the quarterfinals and a win in sudden victory over No. 4 Dylan Shawver.
- A Big 12 runner-up, Frost posted a 22-7 record and tallied 12 bonus-point victories (5 TF, 7 MD) last season.

**JACOB FROST**

Jacob is 12-3 on the season and placed fifth in a loaded 141-pound bracket at the Cliff Keen Invitational.

- Jacob owns a 28-7 career record, including a 3-1 mark in dual action.
- Jacob has seven bonus-point wins this season (1 WBF, 5 TF, 1 MD).

**CUBAN CONNECTIONS**

Iowa State has three native Cubans on its roster - Anthony Echemendia, Yonger Bastida and Osmany Diversent.

- Echemendia and Bastida both won Big 12 titles for the Cyclones last season and enter their final seasons of eligibility.

Diversent, a freshman, is new to the roster in 2024-25.

- Childhood friends, Bastida hails from Trinidad, Cuba while Echemendia is from Cabaiguan, Cuba - a mere 36 miles away from each other.
- From ages 9-18 the pair trained together at EIDE Lino Salabarria Pupo - a sports teaching facility for the training and development of high-performance athletes in Sancti Spiritus, Cuba, located between their hometowns and 1620 miles away from Ames, Iowa.
- Bastida and Echemendia were two of four international wrestlers in the 2024 Division I NCAA Wrestling Championships field.

**ANTHONY ECHEMENDIA**

Anthony Echemendia has his sights set on another podium finish in 2024-25. This season, Echemendia made the move from 141 to 149 pounds and is 6-3 on the season.

- Coach Dresser announced on Dec. 10 that Echemendia will miss 4-6 weeks due to a high ankle sprain suffered at the CKLV.
- Echemendia is 10-9 against top-15 opponents as a Cyclone.
- Echemendia placed fifth at the NCAA Championships as the No. 5 seed last season. He became the first Cyclone 141-pounder to receive All-America honors at the NCAA Championships since 2009 (Nate Gallick).
- Echemendia also won a Big 12 title, becoming the fifth Cyclone to win a conference title at 141 pounds and the first since Ian Parker did so in 2020.
- The Cuban finished the 2023-24 season with a 24-6 record and won 18 of his last 21 matches. He registered 17 bonus-point victories (1 WBF, 9 TF, 7 MD) and tallied 96 takedowns while allowing only 12.

**CALI STYLE**

MJ Gaitan, who brings big-move and bonus-point potential to the lineup, is 8-2 with four pins this season. He has six bonus-point victories so far in 2024-25 (4 WBF, 1 TF, 1 MD).

- Gaitan did not place at the CKLV last week after medically forfeiting from the tournament following his quarterfinal match and did not wrestle in the dual against North Dakota State.
- Gaitan was as dynamic as they come in 2023-24 with 10 pins on the season, the most on the team and tied for the 17th-most nationally.
- After losing his first match at the 2024 NCAA Championships, Gaitan put together a remarkable run through the back side of the bracket with three consecutive wins. He fell just a win shy of All-America honors after falling to No. 3 Edmond Ruth, 8-6, in the blood round.
- Gaitan posted a 22-9 season record and found another gear late in the year, winning 16 of his final 20 matches, including 10-straight victories to close the regular season.
- He had 15 bonus-point wins (10 WBF, 1 TF, 4 TF) in 2023-24.

**CARROLL JOINS THE FRAY**

Christian Carroll joined the Cyclones after redshirting the 2023-24 season at Oklahoma State.

- Carroll is 5-5 this season with two top-20 wins to his name. The freshman had a great start to the season but has hit a rough patch, dropping four of his last five.
- Carroll impressed in his collegiate debut, upsetting No. 13 Nick Stemmet, 11-7. Carroll was named the Week 2 Big 12 Wrestler of the Week after the win.
- Carroll wrestled at the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials at 97 kg where he defeated former Hawkeye and four-time NCAA All-American Tony Cassioppi in the opening round.
- In addition to Cassioppi, he also notched Freestyle wins over NCAA All-Americans Jacob Warner (Iowa) and Trey Munoz (ORST) during the year.
- As a prep, he was the No. 2 pound-for-pound wrestler in the class of 2023 by MatScouts.

**BOCKMAN MOVES DOWN**

Evan Bockman is in his seventh season of collegiate wrestling in 2024-25. Bockman wrestled at 197 pounds for the last three seasons, but dropped to 184 for the 2024-25 season.

- Bockman appears comfortable at his new weight and is off to a 5-3 start to the season with two ranked wins.
- A three-time NCAA Qualifier, Bockman began his career at California Baptist (2018-21) before spending three seasons at Utah Valley (2021-24).
- He owns a 59-33 career record, including a 19-9 mark a season ago at Utah Valley.

**RIGGINS IN CARDINAL & GOLD**

Aiden Riggins transferred to Iowa State after spending two seasons at Iowa.

- Riggins is 6-5 on the season and earned his first dual victory of the year Sunday against NDSU, winning by major decision.
- Wrestling above his natural weight, Riggins represented Iowa at 184 pounds at the 2024 Big Ten Championships (DNP).
- Riggins posted a 12-13 record in 2023-24 and redshirted the 2022-23 season for the Hawkeyes.
- An Iowa prep standout at Waverly-Shell rock, Riggins was the No. 25 recruit nationally on MatScouts' 2022 Big Board. He was a two-time state champion, three-time finalist and four-time placewinner (170-4 prep record).

**TRACKING TERUKINA**

- Kysen Terukina has yet to make his season debut due to neck soreness.
- The Hawaiian qualified for the NCAA Championships for the third time in his career in 2023-24. He picked up his first win at the tournament over Army's No. 25 Ethan Berginc, 4-2.
- Terukina posted a 14-10 record and had five wins come with bonus points (1 WBF, 2 TF, 2 MD).
- His best win of the season was a 14-3 major decision over Wisconsin's No. 6 Eric Barnett in November. Terukina also defeated No. 7 Stevo Poulin (UNCO), 3-2, at the Big 12 Championship.

**ADRIAN MEZA**

Adrian Meza, a Valiant College Prep [Ariz.] product, was a key piece of Iowa State's 2024 recruiting class. Meza went 11-2 in the

first semester while filling in for Terukina but is expected to redshirt the 2024-25 season.

- Meza reached the Round of 12 at the Cliff Keen Invitational and won a Grand View Open title in tournament action.
- In dual action, Meza went 3-0 and earned the first ranked victory of his career by defeating No. 27 Kale Petersen, 5-1, in the Cy-Hawk dual.
- He was rated as the No. 54 recruit nationally by FloWrestling and No. 68 by MatScouts.
- Meza was a 2023 Junior Freestyle All-American and placed sixth at 2023 Super 32.

**JOHNSON RETURNS**

After missing the 2023-24 season, Paniro Johnson is back in the lineup at 157 pounds for the Cyclones.

- Johnson is 7-3 so far this season and is 4-1 against ranked opponents.
- He placed seventh at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational. Three of his five matches in the tournament were decided either in sudden victory or tiebreakers.
- Johnson was the 2023 Big 12 Champion at 149 pounds.
- Johnson earned the No. 5 seed at the NCAA Championships but was eliminated from the tournament after scoring just one team point. He finished the year with an 18-6 record.

**JOHNSON MAKES U23 WORLD TEAM**

Paniro Johnson qualified for the U23 World Championships in Tirana, Albania but unfortunately had to miss the event due to an injury suffered during training.

- Johnson won the 70 KG U23 national title in June to make the USA Wrestling World Team.

**HOME SWEET HILTON**

- Iowa State is 19-3 on its home mat since the 2021-22 season.
- The Cyclones have won 12 consecutive home Big 12 duals since the 2020-21 season. Their last loss to a conference foe inside Hilton Coliseum was on 1/30/21 to No. 5 Oklahoma State (ISU 15, OSU 16).
