THE LEAD

No. 13 Iowa State returns to dual action inside Hilton Coliseum for the first time since mid-November when the Cyclones welcome two of their oldest conference foes, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State, Friday and Sunday. ISU has won 12-consecutive home Big 12 duals (last loss: Oklahoma State, 2021).

KEY STORYLINES

- The Cyclones are winners of three straight and six of their last seven duals.
- Oklahoma and Oklahoma State are two of ISU's oldest rivals, having met the Sooners 101 times on the mat, more than any other opponent in program history. Oklahoma State is third on that list, having squared off 88 times against ISU.
- Injuries continue to plague the Cyclones this season. Head coach Kevin Dresser announced Tuesday that heavyweight Yonger Bastida will miss the remainder of the season due to a lingering knee injury and will pursue a medical redshirt. ISU already lost starters Casey Swiderski (141) and Connor Euton (165) to season ending injuries in the first semester.

All-American Anthony Echemendia has been out with a high-ankle sprain since early December. Kysen Terukina (125) is expected to miss 2-4 weeks due to a knee sprain suffered at the Cyclone Open while Cody Chittum (157) is day-to-day with an elbow injury.

- Paniro Johnson, who owns dual victories at 149, 157 and 165 pounds this season, carries a team-best nine-match winning streak into the weekend. Johnson is 6-0 since taking over the 149-pound spot.
- Kevin Dresser preaches a high-paced, entertaining style of wrestling and encourages his athletes to give fans their money's worth. This season, nearly half of Cyclone wrestlers' wins have come with bonus points (43-of-85, 50.6%).

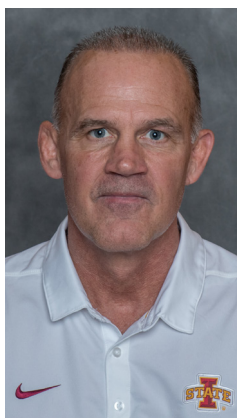

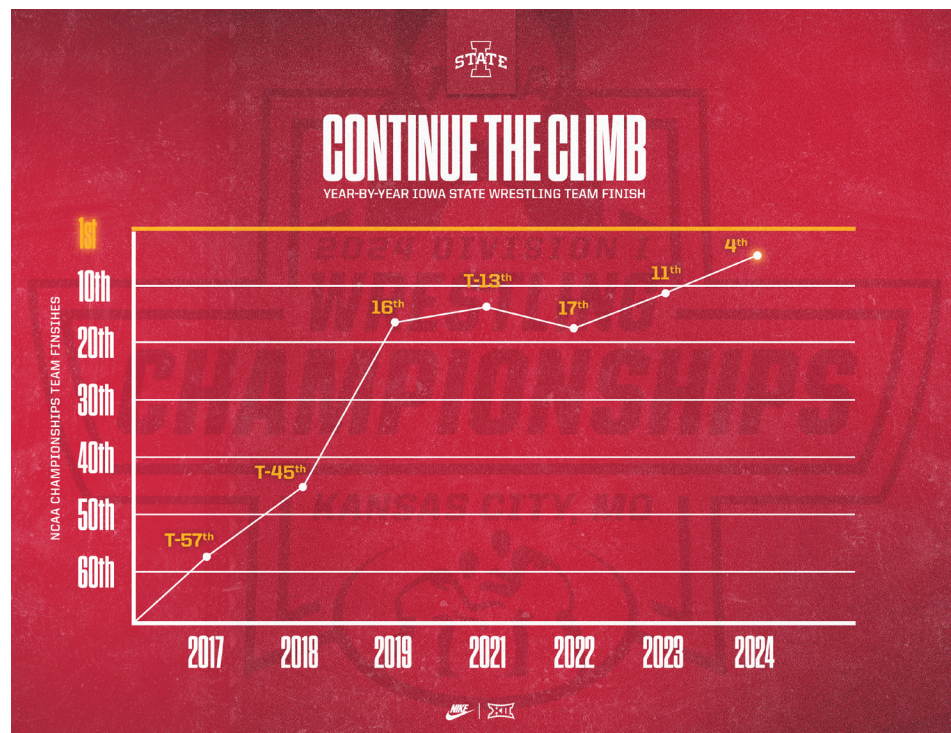

Kevin Dresser's efforts have seen Iowa State climb on the national stage, highlighted most recently by a 2024 Big 12 title and fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships, ISU's best since 2010.

Dresser inherited a program that scored one point and finished tied for 57th at the 2017 NCAA Championships. Since then, Iowa State has finished T-45th, 16th, T-13th, 17th, 11th and 4th at the national tournament.

FROM THE NOTEBOOK

CYCLONES ON ESPN

For the second season in a row, Iowa State will have a dual broadcast live on the main ESPN network when the Cyclones take on No. 3 Oklahoma State Sunday. Last year's Cy-Hawk dual in Ames was the first collegiate wrestling dual to ever air on the main ESPN network. Sunday's dual will be the second.

PROGRAM ON THE RISE

Head coach Kevin Dresser, in his eighth season at the helm, has brought Iowa State wrestling back into the national conversation.

- Iowa State finished in fourth place at the NCAA Championships with 68.5 team points, it's best finish and point total since 2010. ISU placed four wrestlers on the podium, its most since 2009.
- Dresser inherited a program that scored one point and finished tied for 57th at the 2017 NCAA Championships. Since then, Iowa State has finished T-45th, 16th, T-13th, 17th, 11th and 4th at the NCAA Championships.
- Iowa State had no conference champions in 2017 and failed to have a wrestler reach All-American status. Since then, Dresser has produced 10 Big 12 Champs, 13 NCAA All-Americans, two National Champions and has led ISU to its first Big 12 team title since 2009.

IOWA STATE GETS ITS NCAA TROPHY

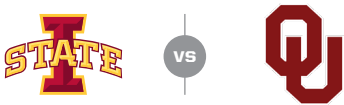
It took until August, but Iowa State finally received its fourth-place NCAA trophy. Better late than never, but why did it take so long?

- Traditionally, the NCAA has always awarded the top four teams at the NCAA Championships a trophy, but following the 2023 season, the NCAA elected to do away with the fourth-place trophy, citing financial reasons.
- In July, the NCAA Competition Oversight Committee voted to reverse course and to reinstate the fourth-place trophy going forward, as well as retroactively award the Cyclones their trophy for 2024.
- It officially marked Iowa State's 45th trophy finish in program history (eight national titles, 16 runner-up finishes, 13 third-place finishes, eight fourth-place finishes).

BIG 12 CHAMPS

The 2023-24 season saw Iowa State win its first Big 12 title since 2009. The Cyclones crowned two champions and finished with 152.5 team points, the fourth-most in a tournament in league history and the most ever by an ISU team in the Big 12 era.

- With one less placewinner than Oklahoma State, the Cyclones still managed to outpace the Cowboys thanks to 28 bonus points compared to 13 from OSU.

BIG 12 DUAL SUCCESS

Iowa State is 43-12 in Big 12 duals under head coach Kevin Dresser. Dresser and the Cyclones have been even better in recent seasons.

HOME SWEET HILTON

- Iowa State is 19-3 on its home mat since the 2021-22 season.
- The Cyclones have won 12 consecutive home Big 12 duals since the 2020-21 season. Their last loss to a conference foe inside Hilton Coliseum was on 1/30/21 to No. 5 Oklahoma State (ISU 15, OSU 16).

NEXT MAN UP

- The injury bug continues to bite the Cyclones. ISU's three duals over its last road trip was the first time this season that it used the same lineup in back-to-back duals. Of the 41 wrestlers on the roster, 24 have been in the lineup this season.
- Iowa State has lost three starters to season-ending knee injuries: Casey Swiderski (141), Connor Euton (165) and Yonger Bastida (285).
 - Kysen Terukina (125) made his way back into the lineup just before Christmas after missing the early portion of the season due to a neck injury but is back on the sideline for 2-4 weeks following a knee sprain at the Cyclone Open (Jan. 19).
 - Anthony Echemendia has missed extended time due to a high ankle sprain suffered at the Cliff Keen Invitational (Dec. 6-7). Echemendia is nearing his return and was listed as an option in Dresser's probable lineup this week.
 - Cody Chittum (157) is considered day-to-day with an elbow injury suffered during his finals match at the Cyclone Open.

BEAUTY AND THE BEAST

- Iowa State will host a Beauty and the Beast event, featuring Cyclone wrestling and gymnastics side-by-side in Hilton Coliseum, for the ninth time in school history.
- It is ISU's first Beauty and the Beast since the 2022-23 season when ISU wrestling defeated Illinois, 21-13.

GOING FOR BONUS

- Kevin Dresser preaches a high-paced, entertaining style of wrestling and encourages his athletes to give fans their money's worth.
- Nearly half of Cyclone wrestlers' wins this season have come with bonus points (43-of-85, 50.6%).
 - Last season, nearly half of ISU's wins in duals came with bonus points. The Cyclones tallied 72 bonus-point wins (15 WBF, 29 TF, 28 MD) in 150 dual matches in 2023-24.

JOHNSON FINDING HIS GROOVE

- Paniro Johnson who owns dual victories at 149, 157 and 165 pounds this season, carries a team-best nine-match winning streak into the weekend. Johnson is 6-0 since taking over the 149-pound spot.
- Johnson is 15-3 and is 5-1 against ranked opponents.
 - Johnson is entering his toughest stretch of the season. His next four dual opponents are all ranked in the top 21 in InterMat's latest rankings.
 - 2023 Big 12 Champion at 149 pounds.
 - Johnson earned the No. 5 seed at the 2023 NCAA Championships but was eliminated from the tournament after scoring just one team point. He finished the year with an 18-6 record.

JOHNSON MAKES U23 WORLD TEAM

- Paniro Johnson qualified for the U23 World Championships in Tirana, Albania but unfortunately had to miss the event due to an injury suffered during training.
- Johnson won the 70 KG U23 national title in June to make the USA Wrestling World Team.

FEELIN' FROSTY

- Twin brothers Evan (133) and Jacob (141) Frost have appeared in the ISU lineup at the same time six times in their career, including four times this season.
- They are the first set of brothers to appear in ISU's dual lineup since Michael and Gabe Moreno in 2015.
 - Evan and Jacob wrestled their high school senior seasons at Dowling Catholic in Des Moines, Iowa, but called Metairie, Louisiana home growing up. The pair moved from Louisiana to Iowa for a better and more high-profile wrestling experience. They each won three state titles in Louisiana and Evan added a fourth in Iowa while Jacob grabbed a runner-up finish as a senior.

EVAN FROST

Evan Frost is 10-2 on the season with three top-20 victories. Frost has a 2:1 takedown ratio and six bonus-point wins (2 MD, 3 TF, 1 WBF).

- As only a redshirt freshman, Evan was as consistent as they come at 133 pounds last season. He placed sixth at the NCAA Championships to become Iowa State's first All-American at the weight since Earl Hall placed seventh in 2016.
- Six of his seven matches at the national tournament were decided by a takedown or less, including a tiebreaker loss to top-seeded Daton Fix in the quarterfinals.
- A Big 12 runner-up, Frost posted a 22-7 record and tallied 12 bonus-point victories (5 TF, 7 MD) last season.

JACOB FROST

Jacob is 20-4 on the season with 12 bonus-point victories (2 WBF, 7 TF, 3 MD). He has a seven-match winning streak with three of those victories coming with bonus points.

- Jacob has five wins over ranked foes this season.
- In early December, Jacob placed fifth in a loaded 141-pound bracket at the Cliff Keen Invitational.

CUBAN CONNECTIONS

Iowa State has three native Cubans on its roster - Anthony Echemendia, Yonger Bastida and Osmany Diversent.

- Echemendia and Bastida both won Big 12 titles for the Cyclones last season. Diversent, a freshman, is new to the roster in 2024-25.
- Childhood friends, Bastida hails from Trinidad, Cuba while Echemendia is from Cabaiguan, Cuba - a mere 36 miles away from each other.
- From ages 9-18 the pair trained together at EIDE Lino Salabarria Pupo - a sports teaching facility for the training and development of high-performance athletes in Sancti Spiritus, Cuba, located between their hometowns and 1620 miles away from Ames, Iowa.
- Bastida and Echemendia were two of four international wrestlers in the 2024 Division I NCAA Wrestling Championships field.

ANTHONY ECHEMENDIA

Anthony Echemendia has his sights set on another podium finish in 2024-25. Echemendia has is 6-3 on the season.

- Coach Dresser announced on Dec. 10 that Echemendia will miss 4-6 weeks due to a high ankle sprain suffered at the CKLV. He is nearing a return, however, and is listed as an option in this week's probable lineup.
- Echemendia is 10-9 against top-15 opponents as a Cyclone.
- Echemendia placed fifth at the NCAA Championships as the No. 5 seed last season. He became the first Cyclone 141-pounder to receive All-America honors at the NCAA Championships since 2009 (Nate Gallick).
- Echemendia also won a Big 12 title, becoming the fifth Cyclone to win a conference title at 141 pounds and the first since Ian Parker did so in 2020.
- The Cuban finished the 2023-24 season with a 24-6 record and won 18 of his last 21 matches. He registered 17 bonus-point victories (1 WBF, 9 TF, 7 MD) and tallied 96 takedowns while allowing only 12.

CALI STYLE

MJ Gaitan, who brings big-move and bonus-point potential to the lineup, moved from 165 to 174 pounds after the new year.

- The California native is 9-5 with four pins and has six bonus-point victories so far in 2024-25 (4 WBF, 1 TF, 1 MD). He has dropped three-straight matches, however.
- Gaitan was as dynamic as they come in 2023-24 with 10 pins on the season, the most on the team and tied for the 17th-most nationally.
- After losing his first match at the 2024 NCAA Championships, Gaitan put together a remarkable run through the back side of the bracket with three consecutive wins. He fell just a win shy of All-America honors after falling to No. 3 Edmond Ruth, 8-6, in the blood round.
- Gaitan posted a 22-9 season record and found another gear late in the year, winning 16 of his final 20 matches, including 10-straight victories to close the regular season.
- He had 15 bonus-point wins (10 WBF, 1 TF, 4 TF) in 2023-24.

**BOCKMAN FINDS HIS FIT**

Evan Bockman is in his seventh season of collegiate wrestling in 2024-25. Bockman wrestled at 197 pounds for the last three seasons, but dropped to 184 for the 2024-25 season.

- Bockman appears more comfortable and more effective at his new weight and is 10-3 on the season with five ranked wins.
- A three-time NCAA Qualifier, Bockman began his career at California Baptist (2018-21) before spending three seasons at Utah Valley (2021-24).

RIGGINS IN CARDINAL & GOLD

Aiden Riggins transferred to Iowa State after spending two seasons at Iowa. He moved from 174 to 165 pounds after the new year and is 8-11 on the season.

- Wrestling above his natural weight, Riggins went 1-13 last season and represented Iowa at 184 pounds at the 2024 Big Ten Championships (DNP).
- An Iowa prep standout at Waverly-Shell rock, Riggins was the No. 25 recruit nationally on MatScouts' 2022 Big Board. He was a two-time state champion, three-time finalist and four-time placewinner (170-4 prep record).

PNUT

Daniel Herrera goes by the nickname "peanut" but make no mistake, there is nothing small about the heavyweight.

- Herrera has made the most of his opportunity with Yonger Bastida out of the lineup. He is 19-6 on the season with 13 bonus-point victories (7 WBF, 5 TF, 1 MD).
- Leads the team in takedowns (29 for, 6 against).
- Prepped at Palm Desert High School in California before finishing his high school career at Ames High School. No. 35 overall recruit nationally by MatScouts.
- Three-time state champion (two in California, one in Iowa) ... never lost a high school match (87-0).

CODY CHITTUM

Cody Chittum is 12-2 on the season and has won nine of his last 10 matches. His best win of the season is a 10-8 victory over Ohio State's No. 7 Paddy Gallagher at the Collegiate Duals.

- Chittum has two wins over top-10 opponents in his career.
- Last season, Chittum registered a 16-7 record as a true freshman, including 10 bonus-point victories (5 TF, 5 MD).
- After a Big 12 runner-up finish, Chittum went 1-2 at the NCAA Championships and scored 2.0 team points.

Chittum is a Cyclone

- Chittum was FloWrestling's No. 1 pound-for-pound recruit in the class of 2022 but took a grey shirt year training in Iowa City.
- During his grey shirt year, Chittum medaled three times at senior level freestyle events in 2023 - silver at the Bill Farrell and bronze medals at the Henri Deglane and Egypt Ranking Series.

TRACKING TERUKINA

- After missing the early portion of the season due to a neck injury, 125-pounder Kysen Terukina is back on the sideline for 2-4 weeks due to a knee sprain suffered at the Cyclone Open (Jan. 19).
- He was off to an 11-1 start to his season with his lone loss coming at the buzzer to West Virginia's Jett Strickenberger.
- The Hawaiian qualified for the NCAA Championships for the third time in his career in 2023-24. He picked up his first win at the tournament over Army's No. 25 Ethan Berginc, 4-2.
- Terukina posted a 14-10 record last season and had five wins come with bonus points (1 WBF, 2 TF, 2 MD).

ADRIAN MEZA

Adrian Meza, a Valiant College Prep (Ariz.) product, was a key piece of Iowa State's 2024 recruiting class. Meza went 11-2 in the first semester while filling in for Terukina but is expected to redshirt the 2024-25 season.

- Meza reached the Round of 12 at the Cliff Keen Invitational and won a Grand View Open title in tournament action.
- In dual action, Meza went 3-0 and earned the first ranked victory of his career by defeating No. 27 Kale Petersen, 5-1, in the Cy-Hawk dual.

- He was rated as the No. 54 recruit nationally by FloWrestling and No. 68 by MatScouts.
- Meza was a 2023 Junior Freestyle All-American and placed sixth at 2023 Super 32.

ETHAN PERRYMAN

Ethan Perryman, another Temecula, California native along with Gaitan, is expected to fill in for the injured Terukina this time around. Perryman has wrestled in nine duals in his career. He is 17-7 on the season and 43-18 in his career.

KANE NAAKTGEBOREN

True freshman Kane Naaktgeboren has seen action in two duals this season.

- Younger brother of ISU 174-pounder Tate Naaktgeboren.
- Linn-Mar High School product and the No. 90 overall recruit nationally by MatScouts.
- Capped his outstanding prep career with a state title and perfect 37-0 record. He was named the 2024 Bob Steenlage Iowa High School Wrestler of the Year, Cedar Rapids Gazette Wrestler of the Year and Dave Schultz High School Excellence Award recipient and was a 2024 Dan Gable Wrestler of the Year finalist.
- Naaktgeboren was a four-time Iowa high school state medalist with a 128-10 career record, including a school-record 108 falls.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- There are 10 teams on Iowa State's dual schedule that had a top-25 finish at the 2024 NCAA Championships, four of which placed inside the top 10.
- Overall, 10 of ISU's 17 dual opponents are ranked in the top 25, including three of the top five.

RETURNING PRODUCTION

Iowa State is adjusting to life without two-time national champ and five-time All-American David Carr in the lineup, but the 2024-25 Cyclone lineup still returned a plethora of talent.

- ISU returned seven wrestlers, including three All-Americans, from its Big 12 and NCAA Championships lineup last season.
- Overall, Iowa State returned 76 percent of its dual meet victories from last season's roster and 42.5 of its 68.5 points from the 2024 NCAA Championships.
- Four current Cyclones have earned All-America status at some point in their career - Evan Frost, Anthony Echemendia, Casey Swiderski and Yonger Bastida.
