#1ST & 10

- Iowa has won six straight games over Iowa State inside Jack Trice Stadium. The Hawkeyes are 22-8 all-time in Ames. The road team has won the last five games in the series, dating back to 2019 (no game in 2020 due to COVID).
- Eleven of the last 13 meetings in the series have been decided by 10 points or less, including the last seven contests dating back to 2017. Five of the last seven games have been one score contests.
- Saturday's game date of Sept. 6 is the earliest meeting on the calendar in the all-time series.
- The Hawkeyes have 43 native Iowans on the 2025 roster; Iowa State has 44.
- Iowa is 29-10 in its last 39 rivalry trophy games.
- First-year Iowa starting QB Mark Gronowski won his 50th career game in the Hawkeyes' season-opening win over UAlbany. Cullen Finnerty of Grand Valley State (Division II) is the national leader with 51 career victories.
- Iowa's rushing attack churned out 310 yards in the season-opening victory over UAlbany – the most yards in an opener since 2002 (376 vs. Akron). It is the second time in the last six games Iowa has had 300+ rushing yards.
- During OC Tim Lester's tenure, Iowa has rushed for 200+ yards in eight games.
- The Hawkeyes have won 97 games during the College Football Playoff era -- the 11th-most nationally during that span and fifth-most in the Big Ten.
- Iowa's offense ranked 72nd in the nation in scoring (27.7) in 2024 under first-year OC Tim Lester -- a 57-spot improvement from 2023.
- Iowa's defense allowed 17.8 points per game in 2024. The unit has allowed fewer than 20 points per game in nine consecutive seasons -- the longest streak nationally by six seasons. Iowa finished 11th in FBS in scoring defense and 20th in total defense (318.4).
- The Hawkeyes are 33-1 when scoring 21+ points since 2020. Since the start of the 2015 season, Iowa is 79-5 when leading by eight points at any point in a game.



Graduate Jaden Harrell had four tackles in his first career start in the win over UAlbany on Aug. 30. Harrell is one of 43 native Iowans on the roster heading into the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup in Ames.

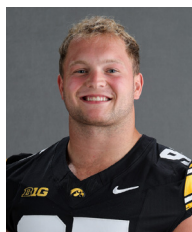

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game will mark the 72nd meeting in the series where Iowa holds a 47-24 advantage. The series began in 1894 -- a 16-8 Cyclone victory.

- The Hawkeyes have won the last six meetings in Jack Trice Stadium and are 22-8 all-time in games played in Ames. Iowa won 27-17 in 2021 when the Cyclones were ranked No. 9 nationally and 20-13 in the most recent meeting in 2023.

- Iowa has won seven of the last nine meetings overall, but Iowa State has won two of the last three contests -- both in Iowa City.

- Eleven of the last 13 meetings have been decided by 10 points or less, including the last seven contests dating back to 2017. Five of the last seven games have been one score contests.

- Head coach Kirk Ferentz is 14-11 all-time against Iowa State, including winning 11 of the last 16 meetings, dating back to the 2008 season.

- The teams did not meet between 1935-1976, or 2020. The teams played 43 straight seasons from 1977-2019 before the Big Ten announced in 2020 that it would not play nonconference games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Iowa held a 29-14 advantage in the series from 1977-2019.

WOODY & KIRK

Kirk Ferentz is in his 27th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football and he won his 200th career game as a member of the Big Ten Conference on Oct. 12, 2024, against Washington. Ferentz is currently tied with Ohio State's Woody Hayes with 205 wins for the most victories in Big Ten Conference history.

- Ferentz has 128 Big Ten wins, which rank third all-time, trailing Hayes (153) and Michigan's Bo Schembechler (143).

- Ferentz won his 200th career game at Iowa State in 2023. He is the 27th coach at an FBS institution to reach the 200-career win milestone and the 99th coach across all divisions. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry finished his career with 236 victories.

- Ferentz has 10 career bowl game victories, which tie Joe Paterno for the most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference.

- Iowa is one of seven programs nationally to have posted 11 straight winning seasons (Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Georgia, Iowa, Memphis, Ohio State).
- Iowa has had a consensus All-American in each of the past six seasons -- the only school nationally to accomplish the feat. The program has 12 consensus All-Americans over the past 11 seasons.
- From 2015-16 to the 2024-25 season, Iowa has the seventh-best winning percentage (.677) in the NCAA for combined wins in football and men's and women's basketball.
- Since 2020, Iowa is 15-7 in road games and the Hawkeyes have posted a winning road record dating back to the start of the 2018 season (21-11 record).
- Iowa's defense has allowed fewer than 400 yards in 39 of the last 42 games and 14 or fewer points in 26 of their last 41 games. The Hawkeyes have held 11 teams without a touchdown since the start of the 2022 season.

Iowa has played 133 games in the Ferentz era in games decided by one score or less. The Hawkeyes are 66-67 (.496) in such contests. Over the past two seasons, Iowa has won six of 10 games decided by eight points or fewer.

- 2023 Walter Camp Award recipient, which is the FCS Heisman... Walter Camp Award finalist in 2024.
- Led South Dakota State to two FCS National Championships in 2022 and 2023.
- Passed for 10,309 yards and 93 touchdowns and rushed for 1,767 yards and 37 touchdowns at South Dakota State.

A NEW QB ROOM

The only returnee in the room is junior Jackson Stratton, who started two games a season ago.

OFFENSIVE GROWTH

Iowa's offense averaged 15.4 points during the 2023 season and that mark went up to 27.7 points in 2024 under first-year offensive coordinator Tim Lester. The Hawkeyes went from 132nd in the nation in scoring offense to No. 72.

X'S SPECTACULAR DEBUT

- Redshirt freshman Xavier Williams had a debut to remember in his first game as a Hawkeye, recording his first career 100-yard game, finishing with 122 yards on 11 attempts with one touchdown in the season-opening win over UAlbany. He had 94 yards on six attempts in the first half.
- Williams is the first Iowa freshman to record a 100-yard game in his debut since Shonn Greene against Ball State in 2005. The 122 yards are the most by a Hawkeye freshman since at least 1970 in their debut.
- The Indiana native had two explosive runs (27, 43 yards) and he scored his first touchdown from 3-yards out.
- It is the second straight season Iowa has had a freshman record a 100-yard game (Kamari Moulton at Maryland).

GROUND & POUND

- The Hawkeyes churned out 310 yards on 53 rushing attempts as a team in the season-opening victory over UAlbany on Aug. 30. Along with Xavier Williams' 122 yards, sophomore Terrell Washington, Jr., had 69 yards on 15 attempts and senior Jaziun Patterson had 47 yards on seven carries.
- It is the second time in the team's last six games that Iowa has surpassed 300 rushing yards (329 vs. Wisconsin).
- The 310 yards are the eighth-most in a game under head coach Kirk Ferentz. The 53 rushing attempts are tied for the 10th most.

ANOTHER DIMENSION

Graduate Mark Gronowski rushed for 39 yards on 11 carries and scored a touchdown in the season-opening victory over UAlbany on Aug. 30. It was his 38th career rushing touchdown.

- Gronowski has had both a passing and rushing touchdown in 27 games in his collegiate career.
- Iowa's backup quarterback Hank Brown also found the end zone, scoring from 1-yard out in the fourth quarter. It was his first career rushing touchdown.

AN ABUNDANCE OF WR WEAPONS

Iowa's wide receiving corps has an abundance of weapons entering the 2025 season as the Hawkeyes have a deep group that goes eight deep.

Jacob Gill - Northwestern transfer... made 35 catches for 411 yards in 2024... great blocking wide receiver.

Reece Vander Zee - Big "X" receiver... missed second half of freshman season with stress fracture... had 14 catches for 176 yards in 2024... day-to-day with foot injury.

Seth Anderson - Speedster... battled injury first two seasons... has 16 catches for 256 yards in two seasons after transferring from Charleston Southern.

Dayton Howard - Big frame at 6-4, 204... had a 33-yard TD catch against Washington in 2024.

Kaden Wetjen - Made a name for himself as a return specialist... looking to make gains in receiving game.

Sam Phillips - Tennessee Chattanooga transfer... speedster who led Southern Conference in receptions (50) for 823 yards... missed majority of spring with injury.

ADDY & ORT

The Hawkeyes return two of their top three tight end weapons in 2025 in senior Addison Ostrenga and junior Zach Ortwerth. The duo combined to make 26 catches for 247 yards and one touchdown a season ago. Ortwerth is on the Mackey Award Watch List.

3 BACK ON O-LINE

Iowa returns three starters from an offensive line that was among the best in the nation a season ago. The Hawkeyes return center Logan Jones, guard Beau Stephens and tackle Gennings Dunker in 2025. All three earned All-Big Ten recognition a season ago.

- Jones (38 starts), Dunker (25 starts) and Stephens (21 starts) have combined to start 84 games in their collegiate careers.

RUSH STRONG

The Hawkeyes rushed for 200+ yards in eight games in 2024 -- believed to be the most in a single season in program history.

- Iowa averaged 197.2 yards on 38.5 attempts per game -- the highest average for the program since 2002. The rushing attack finished second in the Big Ten and 24th nationally.
- Iowa averaged 185.4 yards in Big Ten games to lead the league in rushing. It is the fourth time in program history that Iowa has led the league in rushing.
- The Hawkeyes had 26 rushes of 20+ yards in 2024 after having 12 runs of 20+ yards a season ago.
- Iowa rushed for 329 yards -- the most for the program since 2019 -- and the most against a Big Ten opponent since 2016 (365, Purdue). The Hawkeyes had four players finish with 50+ rushing yards in the game -- a first under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- The team's 329 yards were the most against the Badgers since 1990 and it was the second straight season Iowa surpassed 200 yards against Wisconsin -- a first since 1989 and 1990.

AN OLD DEFENSE

Iowa's defense lost some key pieces from the 2024 unit, but the Hawkeyes return their top three team leaders in sacks (Ethan Hurkett), tackles for loss (Hurkett) and forced fumbles (Hurkett, Aaron Graves) in 2025.

SCORING DEFENSE

Since the start of the 2000 season, Iowa's defense is second nationally in safeties. The Hawkeyes have 19 safeties during the span, one behind Oklahoma for the national lead.

"NEW" LINEBACKERS

The Hawkeyes will turn to a trio of graduates -- Jaden Harrell, Karson Sharar and Jaxon Rexroth -- at the linebacker position to fill the void left by the loss of All-American Jay Higgins, Nick Jackson and Kyler Fisher.

- Harrell (27 games/nine tackles), Sharar (35 games/21 tackles) and Rexroth (37 games/11 tackles) have combined to make 41 tackles in 99 combined games, but none of the three have started a collegiate game.

HURK & GRAVES = DL ANCHORS

Iowa returns a pair of starters on the defensive line in graduates Ethan Hurkett and Aaron Graves to go along with key reserve in DL Max Llewellyn.

- Hurkett led the team's defensive linemen with 56 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks, Graves had 33 tackles, eight TFL and six sacks, while Llewellyn had 22 tackles, eight TFL and 5.5 sacks.
- The position group added two defensive tackles in the portal in Jonah Pace (Central Michigan) and Bryce Hawthorne (South Dakota State). Pace played in 37 career games for the Chippewas, where he had 55 career tackles, 12 TFL and five sacks, while Hawthorne had 5.5 TFL as a freshman for the Jackrabbits.

IN THE SECONDARY

Iowa returns three starters in the secondary in defensive backs T.J. Hall and Deshaun Lee and safety Xavier Nwankpa. Hall and Lee both recorded an interception a season ago.

- Nwankpa is transitioning from strong safety to free safety following the graduation of Quinn Schulte.
- Iowa added transfer Shahid Barros from South Dakota, where he started 24 career games with three interceptions.

TURNOVER KINGS

Iowa's defense forced at least one turnover in 12 of its 13 games during the 2024 season, finishing with 24 turnovers in total.

- The team had 16 interceptions -- the most since 2021 and the 14th-most in the nation. The Ballhawks had two interceptions in four of the last six games.
- Iowa forced three turnovers in three games (Illinois State, Northwestern, at UCLA) and it had two or more turnovers in nine contests.
- Iowa's 24 takeaways were second in the Big Ten and 17th nationally and the turnover margin was eighth (0.92).

BALL HAWKS

- Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 17 seasons and 22 of the last 23. It is the second longest active streak in the nation.
- The program's current streak began with an Amari Spivey pick 6 in 2008.
- There have been 55 pick 6s in program history with 41 coming under Kirk Ferentz and only three came prior to Hayden Fry. Thirty-eight have come inside Kinnick Stadium and four in bowl games.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

KADEN “THE JET” WETJEN

Graduate Kaden Wetjen was named the recipient of The 2024 Jet Award, which honors the most outstanding return specialist in college football. He was the first Hawkeye to receive the distinction.

- The Williamsburg, Iowa, native led the country by a wide margin, finishing with 1,055 combined kick return yards. He ranked first in the FBS in kickoff return yards (727) and second in punt return yards (328). Wetjen had two return for scores in 2024 -- a 100-yard kickoff return against No. 19 Missouri in the Music City Bowl and an 85-yard punt return in the win over Northwestern.
- He was the only player in the nation to have both a kickoff and punt return for a touchdown.
- During the regular season, Wetjen returned a punt 85 yards for a score against Northwestern, the seventh-longest in school history. He had 100+ kickoff return yards in three straight games (Washington, Michigan State, Northwestern) -- a first by a Hawkeye since at least 1978.

STEVENS APPROACHES RECORD

Senior Drew Stevens moved into third place in program history in career field goals with his two makes in the season-opening win over UAlbany. The South Carolina native has made 56 field goals in his career.

- Stevens connected from 28 and a career-long 55 yards in the victory over the Great Danes. The 55-yarder is tied for the fourth longest kick in school history and it was Stevens' ninth career make from 50+ -- extending his school record.
- Stevens enjoyed a breakout 2024 season, making 20-of-23 field goals, which were a career high and the sixth-most in program history. He was 5-for-5 from 40-49 yards and had four makes from 50+.
- He tied Kyle Schlicher's program record that was set in 2004, making five field goals in the road win at Maryland on Nov. 23. The five makes also tied the SECU Stadium, which led to him being named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Two of Stevens' makes came from 54 and 50 yards, making him the first Hawkeye since Tim Douglas (at Illinois, 1998) to make multiple 50+ yard field goals in the same game.
- Stevens has four career games where he has made at least four field goals and he has three career game-winning field goals (21-yarder with 28 seconds left in road win at Minnesota in 2022, a 53-yarder in road win over Northwestern at Wrigley Field in 2023 and a 53-yarder as time expired in a win over Nebraska in 2024.).
- For his career, Stevens has made 56-of-69 field goal attempts (81.2 percent) and is 87-of-88 on PATs. He is 9-of-13 from 50-59 yards in his Hawkeye career.

STEVENS ASCENDS IN CAREER SCORING

Senior Drew Stevens opened the season with a nine-point outing in Iowa's season-opening victory over UAlbany on Aug. 30 inside Kinnick Stadium. He now has 255 career points, moving him into sixth place on the all-time list.

DAKIN READY FOR YEAR 2

Freshman Rhys Dakin had a pair of punts in Iowa's season-opening victory over UAlbany, averaging 50 yards on the two attempts. His second punt traveled 53 yards.

- For his career, 17 of Dakin's punts have traveled 50+ yards.
- Dakin averaged 44.1 yards on 64 punts in 2024, which ranked fourth in the Big Ten and 24th nationally. The Australian, who hails from the same hometown of Melbourne as former Hawkeye Tory Taylor, earned FWAAs Freshman All-America honors for his efforts.
- Thirty-three of Dakin's punts in 2024 were fair caught, 29 were downed inside the 20 and 16 traveled 50+ yards. Only five of his punts were touchbacks.

RIES MAKES HIS MARK

Redshirt freshman Preston Ries got his hand on a punt in the fourth quarter of Iowa's season-opening win over UAlbany. The Monticello, Iowa, native is the first Hawkeye since Yahya Black in 2023 to block a punt.

TEAM NOTES

HERE COMES THE BRIDE

Three Hawkeyes -- Aaron Graves (Aubrey Hahn), Logan Jones (Amber Aesoph), Ethan Hurkett (Megan Callahan) -- were married on three consecutive weekends in late June and early July this summer.

- Graves and Hahn announced in early August that they are expecting a baby boy.

HAWKEYE FREAKS

Three Hawkeyes -- offensive linemen Logan Jones and Kade Pieper and linebacker Preston Ries -- are ranked in Bruce Feldman's Freaks List for the 2025 season. Jones comes in at No. 7 after holding position records with a 36.6-inch vertical, 1.53 10-yard split and 4.09 shuttle. He also has a 470-pound hang clean. Pieper is 22nd as he boasts the program's fastest short shuttle for guards at 4.13 seconds, while also having a 37.4 vertical jump and a 1.52 10-yard dash -- both records. Ries is No. 50 after recording the program linebacker record with a 630-pound squat and 41.4 vertical jump and 1.45 second 10-yard split.

HAY BALE CHAMP X 2

Sophomore Kade Pieper defended his title as the Solon Beef Days Hay Bale Toss champion on July 18. He won his first crown, clearing 12 feet in 2024 and improved on his mark with a toss of 13 feet in 2025. Pieper joins fellow offensive lineman Gennings Dunker as a back-to-back champion. He won the event in 2022 and 2023.

The 2025 Player Council includes graduates Jacob Gill, Aaron Graves, Mark Gronowski, Jaden Harrell, Ethan Hurkett, Logan Jones, Hayden Large, Jeremiah Pittman and Jaxon Rexroth, senior Gennings Dunker and Addison Ostrenga, juniors Koen Entringer and Jayden Montgomery and sophomores Zach Lutmer and Kamari Moulton.

- The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

- Iowa has four players on its 2025 roster whose fathers played for the Hawkeyes: LB lose Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), LB Jayden Montgomery (Jerry, 1998-01), TE Mason Woods (LeVar, 1998-00) and WR Apollo Payne (O.J., 2002-03).
- Epenesa's brothers, A.J. and Eric, played at Iowa from 2017-19 and 2021-24, respectively. DE Drew Campbell is the younger brother of Hawkeye All-American LB Jack Campbell.
- WR Alex Eichmann's grandfather, Richard "Dick" Gibbs, played at Iowa from 1965-66.
- Five Hawkeyes had relatives that played for the Hawkeyes -- DL Max Llewellyn's brother, Luke, played baseball at Iowa, DB Jaylen Watson's uncle is former Hawkeye RB Fred Russell, OL Lucas Allgeyer's uncle, Ken, played offensive line at Iowa and cousin, Nick, was an All-Big Ten pitcher for the Hawkeyes, DB' Kael Kolarik's grandfather, Albert, played baseball at Iowa, LB Jayden Montgomery's mother, Natalie, played volleyball at Iowa and OL George Nahas' father, Jim, played baseball at Iowa.
- LB Nolan DeLong's sister, Isabelle, is a member of the Iowa rowing team.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,321 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 702-581-39 (.547). That includes a 437-229-16 (.652) record in home games, a 266-351-23 (.434) record in games away from Iowa City, a 366-394-25 (.482) mark in Big Ten games and a 321-194-15 (.619) record in Kinnick Stadium.

TROPHY COLLECTION

- Saturday's game is Iowa's first trophy game of the 2025 season. The Hawkeyes went 3-2 in trophy games in 2024, falling 20-19 to Iowa State in an Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup inside Kinnick Stadium, winning 31-14 at Minnesota to reclaim the Floyd of Rosedale, thumping Wisconsin, 42-10, to win the Heartland Trophy for a third straight season and downing Nebraska on a game-winning field goal as time expired to keep the Heroes Trophy. Iowa lost to Missouri, 27-24, in the Music City Bowl.
- Iowa is 33-14 in its last 47 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships). The Hawkeyes are 29-10 in their last 39 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl-eligible 23 times in the last 24 seasons, including 2024. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 10-10 bowl record.
- Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Mike Gundy (12), Dabo Swinney (12) and Kyle Whittingham (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (16), Wisconsin (12), USC (12), Oregon (11), Penn State (11) and Minnesota (11) have more bowl wins (including FBS Playoffs, BCS championship game and CFP), than Iowa. Iowa is 18-18-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

- Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only seven Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons. They include: Duffy Daugherty (Michigan State; 1965, 1966), Ferentz (Iowa; 2002, 2015), Jim Harbaugh (Michigan; 2022, 2023), Woody Hayes (Ohio State; 1954, 1957, 1968, 1970, 1975); Urban Meyer (Ohio State; 2012, 2013); Bo Schembechler (Michigan; 1971, 1980, 1989); Jim Tressel (Ohio State; 2002, 2006).

For a second straight year, the "Iowa Wave" is USA Today's Readers' Choice Award Best College Sports Tradition. Head coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week, except Oct. 1, during the regular season. HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ



Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 27th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015, 2021 and 2023.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015
- Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.

- Ferentz is tied with Ohio State's Woody Hays for first all-time with 205 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 128 Big Ten wins, which are the third-most all-time, trailing only Woody Hayes (153) and Bo Schembechler (143).
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Twelve different players have won 14 national awards during Ferentz's tenure.
- Iowa has posted an 196-101 (.660) overall mark and a 125-74 (.628) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top half of the conference 18 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015, 2021 and 2023.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 205-124 (.623) and a 128-88 (.593) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 205 wins. In 26+ seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 217-145 (.599), giving him the most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05, James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013 and Steve was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.
- James Ferentz, retired following an eight-year NFL career in 2024. He is currently an assistant offensive line coach for the New York Giants. Steve Ferentz is in his third season on the coaching staff at the University of South Dakota (outside linebackers coach), while Brian Ferentz is in his first season as the tight ends coach at Fresno State.

• Since Parker took over as Iowa's defensive coordinator, Iowa is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in points (18.93), first in the Big Ten and fourth nationally in total defense (321.61), first in the Big Ten and third nationally in yards per play (4.77) and the unit is second in the nation in interceptions (194) and fourth in interceptions returned for touchdowns (28).

• Iowa's defense allowed 400 yards or less in 39 of the last 42 games.

• The Hawkeyes led the nation in fewest yards per play allowed on defense in consecutive seasons -- 3.99 in 2022 and 4.08 in 2023.

• Iowa's defense has allowed fewer than 20 points per game in nine consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak in the nation. The next closest streak is three by Alabama, Michigan, Oregon and Penn State.

• Iowa is 18-4 under Parker all-time when returning an interception for a touchdown.

• The Hawkeyes have top-six scoring defenses nationally in four of the past six years. The scoring defense has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in each of the last 10 years.

• Iowa's 3.986 yards per play during the 2022 season were the lowest by any team at the FBS level since Florida State's 3.853 in 2012.

• Iowa's 270.8 yards per game surrendered in 2022 was the fewest by an Iowa defense since 1981.

• Iowa has 244 interceptions since the start of the 2009 season -- the third-most nationally in that span. The "Ball-Hawks" had a school record 25 interceptions in 2021.

• A principle of Parker's defense is to limit explosive plays, forcing the offense to sustain a drive. Iowa surrendered just 15 explosive plays out of 883 defensive snaps over 13 games during the 2022 season.

• Iowa has had six players win the Big Ten Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year since 2012: Micah Hyde, 2012; Desmond King, 2015; Josh Jackson, 2017; Amani Hooker, 2018; Riley Moss, 2021, Cooper DeJean, 2023).

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 23 of the last 24 seasons. Iowa is 10-10 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (14) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-18-1 in 37 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (205-124) replaced Fry and has completed 26 seasons. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and 2023 to earn a spot in the Big Ten Championship Game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP Poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 356 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 15 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award), Tory Taylor (Ray Guy) and Kaden Wetjen (Jett Award).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa is the only school in the nation with a consensus All-American in the last six seasons.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 224 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (94 draft picks/135 free agents).
- Iowa has produced 34 first-team NFL All-Pro's -- 16th-most among collegiate programs.
- Iowa had five players named to CBS Sports Top 100 list of the NFL's top stars for the 2025 season -- the most in the Big Ten and the fourth most in the nation. (Tristan Wirfs, 20; George Kittle, 25; Tyler Linderbaum, 53; Cooper DeJean, 85; Sam LaPorta, 86).
- Former Iowa consensus All-American Cooper DeJean helped the Philadelphia Eagles win Super Bowl LIX. DeJean intercepted Chiefs quarterback Patrick Mahomes and returned the theft 38 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. It was DeJean's first interception in the NFL. DeJean became the youngest player in NFL history to score a defensive touchdown on his birthday (regular or postseason).
- Tampa Bay OL Tristan Wirfs made NFL history, becoming the first player to earn first-team All-Pro honors as a right tackle and left tackle. He was joined on the NFL Pro Bowl roster by George Kittle and Tyler Linderbaum.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (47 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 13 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

- Iowa had two first round picks in the 2023 NFL Draft -- LB Lukas Van Ness (Packers) and LB Jack Campbell (Lions). It is the fourth time in program history Iowa has had two players selected in the first round.
- C Tyler Linderbaum and TE Sam LaPorta were named to the 2023 Pro Bowl. LaPorta was also a second-team All-Pro selection. TE George Kittle was first-team All-Pro in 2023.
- OT Tristan Wirfs and TEs George Kittle and T.J. Hockenson were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2022. Wirfs and Kittle were Second Team NFL All-Pro selections.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 25 years, 216-of-261 (83 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Iowa has had 10 first round picks in the last 15 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022; LB Lukas Van Ness, 2023, LB Jack Campbell, 2023.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2025 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (19) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 22 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (14 drafted/8 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

IOWA NOTES

- The victory is No. 205 for head coach Kirk Ferentz, moving him into a tie with Ohio State's Woody Hayes for the most wins in Big Ten Conference history.
- Iowa has won its last five and 11 of its last 12 season openers dating back to the 2014 season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Xavier Williams notched his first career 100-yard game, finishing with 122 yards on 11 carries and one touchdown. He had 94 yards on six attempts in the first half.
- Williams is the first Iowa freshman to record a 100-yard game in his debut since Shonn Greene against Ball State in 2005 (116 yards, 18 att., 1 TD). The 122 yards are the most by a Hawkeye freshman since at least 1970 in their debut.
- He scored on a 3-yard touchdown run in the second quarter for his first career touchdown.
- Williams rushed for 14, 27 and 3 yards on his first three career rushing attempts on the nine-play, 68-yard scoring drive. He had a career-long 43-yard run on the following possession.
- It is the second straight season Iowa has had a freshman record a 100-yard game (Kamari Moulton at Maryland).
- QB Mark Gronowski completed 8-of-15 attempts for 44 yards with one touchdown – a 2-yarder to Kaden Wetjen.
- It was Gronowski's 94th career passing touchdown.
- He also had a 1-yard touchdown run in the third quarter – his first score as a Hawkeye and 38th career rushing TD.
- For the game, Gronowski rushed 11 times for 39 yards with one touchdown.
- It was also Gronowski's 50th career win as a starter.
- QB Hank Brown had a 1-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter – his first career rushing touchdown.
- WR Kaden Wetjen caught a 2-yard touchdown reception on fourth-and-goal in the second quarter. It was Wetjen's first career receiving touchdown and third career score.
- PK Drew Stevens connected on a 28-yard field goal in the first quarter and a career-long 55-yarder in the fourth. The make moved him into sole possession of third place on Iowa's all-time field goals list with 56.
- The 55-yarder is tied for the fourth-longest in program history and is the longest by a Hawkeye since 2015 (Marshall Koehn vs. Pittsburgh, 57 yards).
- Stevens is now 9-of-13 for his career from 50+ yards.
- Stevens' nine points gives him 255 for his career, moving him into sixth place all-time in the record books.
- LB Preston Ries had a blocked punt in the fourth quarter – Iowa's first blocked punt since 2023 (Yahya Black vs. Northwestern).

MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa rushed for 310 yards in the game – the most in a season-opener since 2002 (376 vs. Akron).
- It is the second time in the last six contests the Hawkeyes have surpassed 300 rushing yards (329 vs. Wisconsin).
- It is the eighth time under OC Tim Lester that Iowa has had 200+ rushing yards.
- The Hawkeyes scored the final 31 points in the game after trailing 7-3.
- Iowa's defense limited UAlbany to 177 yards of total offense – the fewest in a season opener since 2022 (120 yards).
- The Hawkeyes limited two teams under 200 yards of total offense in 2024.
- Iowa held UAlbany to 33 total yards of offense in the second half.
- The Hawkeyes had nine first-time Hawkeye starters in the lineup against UAlbany – four on offense (QB Mark Gronowski, WR Sam Phillips, OL Trevor Lauck, OL Kade Pieper) and five on defense (DB Zach Lutmer, LB Karson Sharar, LB Jaden Harrell, DL Bryce Hawthorne and DL Max Llewellyn). Seven of the nine (all but Gronowski and Phillips) were making their first collegiate starts.
