WEEKEND SNAPSHOT

After a strong 2-1 start to their Big Ten schedule, including two wins against top-20 teams, the Hoosiers seek a return to their winning ways this coming weekend. They'll look to do it against one of the toughest two-game weekend slates in field hockey. On Friday, October 9, Indiana returns to the road to take on the Michigan State Spartans, their second consecutive weekend in the Great Lake State. Following that, the Hoosiers return home for a test against the undefeated, top-ranked Syracuse Orange. Both games will be available for streaming via BTN2Go.com.

HOOSIER NOTABLES

RETURN TO THE ROAD

Indiana heads into another weekend against formidable competition, both inside and outside of the Big Ten. They'll open the weekend on Friday with an away game against Michigan State, seeking their third Big Ten win for the first time since 2009. After that, they head home to face the unbeaten Orange of Syracuse University. The Hoosiers will take the field looking for their first win in school history over a No. 1 team.

A NEW SEASON, A NEW ERA

Indiana Field Hockey welcomes two new coaches to the Hoosier family. Head coach **Amanda Janney** enters her first season as the head coach of the Hoosiers. She is joined by first-year assistant coach **Ayla Halus**. The Hoosiers return 13 letterwinners from their 2014 campaign, including 2015 Preseason All-Big Ten selections **Kate Barber**, **Karen Lorite**, and **Nicole Volgraf**.

OVERTIME THRILLER VS KENT STATE

The Hoosiers revisited their non-conference schedule last weekend in a home game against Kent State. Indiana held a 3-1 lead early in the second half with a goal by Rachel Stauffer and two from **Maddie Latino**, but the Golden Flashes rallied to draw it up. The two teams were tied 3-3 at the end of regulation, but an overtime goal by **Taylor Pearson** gave the Hoosiers their sixth win.

LAST SUNDAY AT MICHIGAN

On Sunday, the Hoosiers played evenly with the Wolverines, but a penalty stroke late in the first half gave Michigan a narrow halftime lead. Indiana was able to tie the contest early in the second half with a goal from **Kate Barber**, but fell after a late score by Michigan, 2-1.

OVERTIME AT EAST LANSING

Most recently, the Hoosiers traveled to East Lansing to take on the Michigan State Spartans. The Hoosiers came back from a one-goal deficit in the second half to force overtime, but the Spartans answered with the game-winning goal in sudden-death overtime. Indiana sophomore **Maddie Latino** continued her scoring ways with two goals. Freshman **Claire Woods** served an excellent assist on Latino's second goal.

FACING TOP-RANKED SYRACUSE

The Hoosiers close their weekend with one of their toughest opponents yet, the No. 1 undefeated Syracuse Orange. The Orange are off to an unbeaten start with wins over seven teams ranked in the top 20. This is the first meeting between Indiana and Syracuse, and the Hoosiers' second meeting against the No. 1 team in the nation (last: No. 1 Wake Forest, 2003).

OF NOTE...

- The Hoosiers currently rank #25 in the FieldHockeyCorner.com ACR polls, and currently sit at #29 in the NCAA RPI rankings.
- **Kate Barber**, **Karen Lorite** and **Nicole Volgraf** were named to the 2015 Big Ten Players to Watch List.
- Sophomore **Maddie Latino** leads all Hoosiers in scoring this season. The attacking midfielder has eight goals and five assists to her name through the eleven games, accounting for over 25% of Indiana's total points.
- **Kate Barber** and **Karen Lorite** are having solid seasons on the attack as well. The two have combined for nine goals and eight assists, accounting for over a third of the Hoosiers' offensive output.
- The Hoosiers rank second in the conference in assists per game in Big Ten play (2.33)

HEAD COACH AMANDA JANNEY

FIRST YEAR AT INDIANA



Indiana University Vice President and Director of Athletics Fred Glass announced the hiring of Temple University Head Coach Amanda Janney as the new head coach of the Indiana field hockey program on Monday, Feb. 9, 2015. Janney's experience includes a pattern of great success as both a player at Wake Forest and on the U.S. Indoor National Team, and as a head and assistant coach.

Joining the Hoosiers after 10 years as the head coach at Temple, Janney has compiled a 114-94 record with 10 straight postseason appearances. Last season, Janney led the Owls to a No. 11 NCAA RPI ranking and a finish of No. 14 in the NFHCA Coaches Poll.

At Temple, Janney took over a team that had not turned in a winning record since 1992 and transformed it into a consistently successful program. In those 10 seasons, Janney coached five Atlantic 10 Players of the Year, 23 All-Conference selections, three All-Americans, three Temple Student-Athletes of the Year and 16 Regional All-Americans.

"We are thrilled to have Amanda Janney as the new leader of Indiana field hockey," Glass said. "On the field, in the classroom, and in the community, Amanda's track record as the head coach at Temple is extraordinary. Known as an elite recruiter and talent developer, we believe we have hired one of the great field hockey coaches in the country."

Janney was selected as head coach after a comprehensive national search led by

Glass who worked in consultation with the Search Advisory Committee, consisting of key administrators, support staff, along with redshirt junior forward Nicole Volgraf and sophomore defender Malia Fujisawa, who served as the student-athlete representatives to the committee. Glass and the committee reviewed dozens of potential candidates, performed extensive research and reference checks on a handful or so, and had four candidates, including Amanda, on campus to interview with Glass and the committee. After a thorough review, Glass made the decision to hire Janney as head coach.

Janney is excited about opportunity to coach at Indiana and in one of the nation's elite conferences.

"I want to thank Fred Glass and the administration for this amazing opportunity," said Janney. "I am already so impressed with the team leaders, the IU field hockey alumni, and the Spirit of Indiana. I am ready to lead IU field hockey and compete in the Big Ten, one of the best conferences in the country."

Janney played collegiately at Wake Forest University, scoring 21 goals and tallying 17 assists as a center forward while graduating Cum Laude in Sociology. As a member of the USA Indoor National Team, she earned a gold medal at the Women's National Indoor Championship in 2010. "Growing up in Philadelphia, I loved watching Coach Janney's Temple

teams play," said student-athlete Search Advisory Committee representative Nicole Volgraf. "On her interview, she lit up the room with her passion and unbelievable drive. She is just the coach that IU field hockey needs to go to the next level."

Prior to joining the Owls, Janney spent two years as the First Assistant Coach at the University of Pennsylvania, leading the team to a 23-12 overall record and a 2004 Ivy League Championship. She also spent the 2002 season as the Second Assistant Coach at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Va. Additionally, Janney currently serves as the head coach of USFHA Pennsylvania High Performance in Philadelphia, leading the team to a USFHA Women's National Championship in June 2014.
