#### THE OPENING TIP

Indiana will take on No. 25 Chattanooga in the second round of the Preseason WNIT on Tuesday, Nov. 17 in Assembly Hall at 7 p.m. ET. The game will be streamed live on IUHoosiers.com and can be heard on WHCC 105.1 FM with Greg Murray on the call.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- With Indiana's 88-56 victory over Tennessee State in the season opener, it marked the third-straight year that IU has won the first game of the season, including head coach Teri Moren improving to 2-0 in season openers at Indiana.
- The Hoosiers are participating in the Preseason WNIT for the third time in program history (1998, 2008).
- In the win over TSU, Indiana collected 14 steals in the game as a team, marking the fourth time in the Teri Moren era that IU has had 14 or more steals in a game.
- The Indiana defense also held the Lady Tigers to just 28.6 percent shooting last Friday.
- The Hoosiers dished for 22 assists in the opener as a team. Indiana had 22 or more assists in seven games a year ago.
- IU outscored Tennessee State 50-8 in points in the paint and 30-14 in points off turnovers while forcing the Lady Tigers into 22 turnovers in game one.
- Sophomore Tyra Buss led Indiana with 21 points, a career-high tying eight assists and six steals vs. Tennessee State. Buss has now collected six or more steals in a game three times in her career.
- In her Indiana debut last Friday, junior Tyshee Towner tallied 18 points with six rebounds, two steals and two assists. She went 6-of-10 from the field and 2-of-2 from beyond the arc.
- Sophomore Amanda Cahill finished with 17 points against Tennessee State, shooting 7-of-9 from the field. She added eight rebounds, a career-high tying four assists and a pair of steals.
- Junior Alexis Gassion was the fourth IU player to score in double figures vs. TSU as she had 12 points, eight rebounds, a career-high tying four blocks and four assists.
- Senior Lyndsay Leikem set a career mark with three steals in the season-opening win, she also added nine points and eight rebounds.
- Teri Moren begins her second season at the helm of the Indiana program, having just completed her first full offseason in Bloomington after being hired in August of 2014. Prior to IU, Moren spent four years at Indiana State University as head coach where she led the Sycamores to a Missouri Valley Conference championship in 2013-14.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

Four Hoosiers scored in double figures as Indiana downed Tennessee State in the season opener and first round Preseason WNIT matchup, 88-56. Tyra Buss led Indiana with 21 points, Tyshee Towner added 18 in her IU debut as Amanda Cahill had 17 points and Alexis Gassion added 12. The Hoosiers built a 50-14 halftime lead and never looked back. IU dished for 22 assists in the win and grabbed 14 steals in the game, paced by Buss who had six steals.

#### **CHATTANOOGA AT A GLANCE**

No. 25 Chattanooga arrives in Bloomington after a pair of wins to begin the year over McNeese State and Butler at home. Coming into the year, Jim Foster's Mocs went 58-8 over the last two seasons, winning 29 contests each year. Keiana Gilbert has averaged 15.0 points per game in her first two games of 2015-16 to lead UTC so far this season. Chelsey Shumpert is an outside threat for the Mocs as she leads the team in 3-point makes and attempts, averaging 10.0 points per game. Jasmine Joyner will look to disrupt Indiana as she has 11 blocks already on the young season.

#### **INDIANA IN PRESEASON WNIT FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2008**

The Hoosiers open the 2015-16 season as part of the 16-team Preseason WNIT Field. This year marks the third time that IU has participated in the Preseason WNIT (2008, 1998).

Every team in the field is guaranteed three games in the tournament. Participating schools will host all games in campus facilities, including the semifinals and championship. The event began with round one on Nov. 13, followed by round two on Nov. 15-17. The semifinals will take place on Nov. 19 followed by the championship game on Nov. 22. All consolation rounds (teams that lose in first two rounds) will be on either Nov. 20-21.

The Preseason WNIT began in its modern form in 1994. Since its inception, over 200 teams representing all 32 conferences have competed in the tournament. It is organized and produced by Triple Crown Sports, a national sports event company based in Fort Collins, Colo. For more information on the WNIT visit: www.womensnit.com

#### **BEWARE OF STEALERS**

With 14 steals as a team in the win over TSU to begin the year, it marked the fourth time in the Teri Moren era that the Hoosiers have had 14 or more steals in a game as IU did it three times a year ago. Prior to last year, the last time an IU team had three or more games of 14-plus steals came in 2010-11.

#### **GET ON THE BUSS**

Indiana's returning leader in scoring, steals and assists started where she left off last year. In the season opener vs. Tennessee State, sophomore Tyra Buss led Indiana in scoring with 21 points, in assists with a career-high tying eight and in steals with six. It marked the third time in her career that she has had six or more steals in game.

Last year, Buss averaged 11.7 points, 2.1 steals and 3.2 assists per game to go along with 3.6 rebounds per contest in 2014-15. Her 65 steals last year were the most by an IU player since 2010-11, tied for the ninth most in a single season in program history and was the second most by a freshman ever at IU. Her steals total led all Big Ten freshmen and ranked sixth nationally among freshmen.

Buss scored in double figures in 22 games a year ago and had three or more steals in 11 contests. She was twice named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

#### **CLIMBING TO THE CA-HILL TOP**

Sophomore Amanda Cahill caught fire against Tennessee State, going 7-of-9 from the field and 2-of-3 from long distance on her way to 17 points. She also added a team-high tying eight rebounds, a career-high tying four assists and a pair of steals. Last year, Cahill was the only freshman in the Big Ten last year to average at least 10.8 points and 7.7 rebounds per game while hitting 77.5 percent from the free throw line. She finished the year ranked second among freshmen and 12th overall in rebounding in the conference.

Cahill started in all 31 games in 2014-15 and connected on 50.2 percent (11th in B1G) of her field goal attempts to go along with 1.3 steals and 1.0 blocks per game. She had six double-doubles on the year, the most by an Indiana player since 2008-09. The Clyde, Ohio, native scored in double figures in 18 contests and grabbed 10 or more rebounds in 10 games.

#### THIS IS HER TOWN-ER

Tyshee Towner came to play in her Indiana debut last Friday as the junior tallied 18 points on 6-of-10 shooting with six rebounds, two steals and two assists. She also nailed both of her 3-point field goal attempts as she started in her first game in an IU uniform.

#### HIT THE GASSION PEDAL

In her 2015-16 debut, junior Alexis Gassion scored in double figures for the 24th time in her career as she had 12 points to go along with eight boards, a career-high tying four blocks and four assists. Last season, Gassion played in all 31 games, starting in the final 16. She averaged 8.0 points per game and was second on the team with 6.1 rebounds per contest. Gassion tallied 10 or more points 10 times and double-digit rebounds four times with a pair of double-doubles. The Fairborn, Ohio, native shot 44.9 percent from the field, 77.0 percent from the free throw line and 34.8 percent from 3-point range.

#### **LEIKEM TO GRADUATE IN 2016**

Lyndsay leikem got her final season in Bloomington started in style as she just missed a double-double with nine points and eight rebounds against Tennessee State to go along with a career-high three steals. The senior shot 4-of-7 from the field and added a pair of assists.

Leikem is entering her third year with Indiana women's basketball, but will graduate from IU in May 2016 with degrees in criminal justice and psychology. She plans to move to the Washington, D.C. area after graduating to pursue a career with the FBI.

Leikem appeared in 29 contests in 2014-15 as a sophomore. She connected on 83.3 percent of her free throw attempts and averaged 2.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game. As a freshman, Leikem averaged 4.7 points and 2.8 rebounds per game while shooting 44.0 percent from the field and 91.7 percent from the free throw line.

#### TERI MOREN BEGINS SECOND SEASON AT INDIANA

Indiana head coach Teri Moren begins her second year at the helm of the Hoosier program after completing her first full offseason in Bloomington prior to the 2015-16 season. Moren, a native of nearby Seymour, Ind., enters her 13th year as a head coach at the collegiate level including stops at Indiana State and the University of Indianapolis. Moren's complete bio can be found later in this notes packet.

#### **HOOSIERS BOLSTER SCHEDULE FOR 2015-16**

Head coach Teri Moren made it a priority to bolster the 2015-16 non-conference schedule, and Indiana did just that. IU will participate in three non-league tournaments, including the Preseason WNIT, and host a Big Ten/ACC Challenge matchup in Assembly Hall. The non-Big Ten slate features five opponents who played in the postseason a year ago (Tennessee State, Ohio, Georgia Tech, Miami, West Virginia) with an opportunity to play against additional 2015 postseason teams as part of the Preseason WNIT field. IU will also participate in the Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament on Nov. 27-28 in Nashville, Tenn. and the Florida Sunshine Classic near Orlando, Fla. on Dec. 20-21.

Indiana's 18-game Big Ten schedule will get started at Wisconsin Dec. 31. IU will host nine conference foes in Assembly Hall beginning with Michigan on Jan. 3. The Big Ten saw eight teams earn postseason berths last season, including seven into the NCAA Tournament.

#### **HOW TO WATCH THE HOOSIERS IN 2015-16**

Nearly every Indiana home and Big Ten game in 2015-16 will be either televised or streamed live on Big Ten Network platforms. The Hoosiers will play on national television a guaranteed four times this season on BTN beginning with the home conference opener against Michigan on Jan. 3 at 12:30 p.m. ET in Assembly Hall. Other IU BTN-televised games include at Northwestern on Jan. 24 at 5 p.m., against lowa on Feb. 4 at 7 p.m. and the regular season finale against Penn State on Feb. 27 at 4 p.m.

The remaining 14 Big Ten contests will all be available on BTN Plus, a subscription service that can be accessed on the BTN2Go app or website. Indiana's game at lowa on Feb. 21 is a wildcard weekend game and could receive television designation.

IU's non-conference home matchups against Georgia Tech, Samford and Yale will all also be available on BTN Plus.

#### 2014-15 SEASON NOTABLES

- In 2014-15, Indiana achieved the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96, the best team free throw percentage (74.3 percent) since 2003-04 and the most steals (284) since 2010-11.
- IU nailed 236 3-point field goals, the second best total in school history, and also cracked the top five in program history in free throw percentage (4th), points scored (5th, 2,229), points per game (5th) and 3-point field goal percentage (5th, 33.1 percent).
- Indiana held opponents to less than 30 percent shooting from 3-point range (.292), good for third in the Big Ten last season.
- The Hoosiers tied the regular season record for most 3-pointers made in a single year with 223 makes through the first 29 games last year. The previous mark was set in 2013-14.
- Last year's Indiana team was the first ever in program history to achieve back-to-back games of at least 18 steals as IU tallied that total against Gardner-Webb and Valparaiso in consecutive contests.
- Off the court, the 2014-15 Hoosiers achieved a team grade point average of 3.23.

#### **HOOSIER NOTABLES**

#### **WALTER IS GOING ON**

Second-year guard Jess Walter led all Big Ten freshmen and was fourth overall in the conference in 3-point field goal percentage at 41.7 percent in 2014-15. She appeared in all 31 games last year with four starts, averaging 7.4 points per game and shot 73.8 percent from the free throw line. Walter scored in double figures in 10 games and connected on three or more 3-pointers in six contests, hitting five two times.

#### JENN FROM THE BLOCK

Junior Jenn Anderson ranked fourth in the Big Ten in field goal percentage in 2014-15, shooting 56.0 percent. Her field goal percentage was the highest percentage by an IU player for a single year since 1997-98. She appeared in 30 games and made 28 starts last year while averaging 7.9 points and 3.5 rebounds per game. Anderson also nailed 72.1 percent of her free throw attempts.

From her freshman to sophomore year, Anderson saw major improvement in scoring (+4.5 ppg), field goal percentage (+10.2 percent), free throw percentage (+25 percent) as well as rebounds, steals and blocks.

#### **START THE KAR-LEE**

Sophomore Karlee McBride appeared in all 31 games last season and averaged 8.4 points per game to lead reserve scorers for the Hoosiers. Between her freshman and sophomore years, McBride improved her scoring by 4.1 points per game and increased her totals in rebounds, assists and steals. She scored in double figures in 13 games while shooting 33.3 percent from 3-point range and 41.4 percent from the field, improving her field goal percentage by 10 percent from the year prior.

#### THE NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

#### Kym Royster • 6-2 • Forward •Newark, Ohio/Newark

A freshman from Newark, Ohio, Kym Royster played four years at Newark High School. She led Newark to conference, regional and district championships in 2014-15 with a 27-2 overall record. Royster averaged a near double-double with 20.4 points and 9.8 rebounds per game as a senior and was named district and advocate Player of the Year while earning First Team All-Ohio and first team All-Conference honors. As a junior, Royster tallied 20.0 points and 9.6 rebounds per contest while shooting 61 percent from the field.

#### Tia Elbert • 5-7 • Guard • Oakdale, Minn./Tartan/Marquette

Sophomore transfer Tia Elbert will sit out the 2015-16 season due to NCAA transfer rules. As a freshman at Marquette last season, Elbert appeared in all 31 games, making 23 starts to average 8.6 points, 3.0 assists and 1.0 steals per game. She earned a spot on the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team as she scored in double figures in 12 contests. In high school, Elbert tallied 3,501 career points during her four years, which was the seventh-highest point total ever in Minnesota girls basketball history. She averaged 36.4 points per game as a senior in 2013-14.

#### Tyshee Towner • 5-9 • Guard • Aurora, III./East Aurora/Wabash Valley College

Tyshee Towner joins the Hoosiers after two seasons at Wabash Valley College in Mt. Carmel, III. Towner was a First Team All-America selection by the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) in 2014-15. She averaged 17.1 points, 5.7 rebounds and 3.2 steals per game as a sophomore while shooting 46.4 percent from the field and 79.9 percent from the free throw line. Towner was named Great Rivers Conference and Region 24 Player of the Year. The Aurora, III., native led WVC to a 28-7 record, including a victory in the 2015 NJCAA Tournament.

#### Danielle Williams • 6-4 • Center • Fort Worth, Texas/North Crowley

A freshman from Fort Worth, Texas, Danielle Williams played four years at North Crowley High School. She was a second team all-district player as a senior averaging 10 points, 8 rebounds and 6 blocks per game last season. As a junior, Williams earned first team all-district honors while leading her team in scoring (10 ppg), rebounding (7 rpg) and blocks (5 bpg).

### TERI MOREN

#### **HEAD COACH**

#### SECOND YEAR AT INDIANA • 13TH YEAR OVERALL AS COLLEGE HEAD COACH

- Indiana University Vice President and Director of Athletics Fred Glass announced the hiring of Seymour, Ind., native Teri Moren as head coach of the IU women's basketball program on August 9, 2014.
- During her first year in Bloomington in 2014-15, Moren led the Hoosiers to the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96, the best team free throw percentage (74.3 percent) since 2003-04 and the most steals (284) since 2010-11. IU nailed 236 3-point field goals, the second best total in school history, and also cracked the top five in program history in free throw percentage (4th), points scored (5th, 2,229), points per game (5th) and 3-point field goal percentage (5th, 33.1 percent).
- The 2014-15 Hoosiers became the first team ever in program history to achieve back-to-back games of 18 steals as IU tallied that total against Gardner-Webb and Valparaiso in consecutive games to begin the year.
- Indiana also set single game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in the season opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. IU also tied the school mark for field goals made in that game (46).
- Off the court, Moren's team achieved a team grade point average of 3.23 in 2014-15.
- Before arriving in Bloomington, Moren spent four seasons as head coach at Indiana State University where she led the Sycamores to their first 20-win season in eight years in 2013-14 before taking the job at Indiana.
- In her four years at Indiana State, Moren guided the Sycamores from a middle of the pack Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) team in her first year to a conference championship program in 2013-14, including a postseason tournament appearance in the WNIT. Twice in her four years, Moren led the Sycamores to a WNIT berth while six players earned All-MVC honors.
- ISU finished with a 20-12 record in 2013-14, the program's first 20-win season in eight years and just the fifth 20-win campaign in school history. With a 14-4 record in conference games, Moren's Sycamores won a share of the regular season MVC title and earned the No. 1 overall seed in the MVC Tournament. Moren led Indiana State to six-straight victories and seven wins in eight games to end the regular season last year to secure a share of the MVC crown. It was only the third time in program history that ISU won a regular season conference championship and the first since 2006.

- In 2012-13, Moren's Sycamores finished with an 18-13 record, the program's most wins in six years at the time. ISU went 10-8 in conference play, its most MVC victories in four seasons, to finish fourth in the MVC standings.
- The Sycamores would go on to play in the WNIT for the first time since 2006. Moren's 2012-13 team set a program record for fewest points allowed per game (55.5 ppg) while holding 10 opponents to less than 50 points.
- In her second year at ISU in 2011-12, Moren led the Sycamores to a fifth place finish in the MVC.
- During her first year at the helm in 2010-11, Moren won the most games by a first year coach in ISU history as the Sycamores played into the semifinals of the 2011 MVC Tournament.
- Prior to ISU, Moren was associate head coach at Georgia Tech. In each of her three years there, the Yellow Jackets made an NCAA Tournament appearance and won 22 or more games each season.
- Moren began her head coaching career at the University of Indianapolis. She spent seven seasons at Ulndy beginning in 2000-01.
- The 2003 WBCA Region 4 Coach of the Year in NCAA Division II, her teams went to three consecutive NCAA Division II Tournaments and earned Great Lakes Valley Conference regular season and tournament titles in 2003. That squad finished with a 29-3 record overall and an 18-2 mark in conference play.
- Moren began her coaching career in 1992-93 at Butler as an assistant coach for six years, leading the Bulldogs to three 20-win seasons. Moren then spent two years as an assistant at Northwestern.
- A 1992 graduate of Purdue University, Moren earned her bachelor's degree in therapeutic recreation. She was a four-year basketball letterwinner and two-year starter for the Boilermakers under Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Coach Lin Dunn. She was part of three NCAA Tournament teams and Purdue's first Big Ten championship.
- Moren graduated from Seymour High School in 1987 and was named an Indiana All Star that year. She led the Owls to four sectional titles, two regional championships, a semi-state win and a 1987 state finals appearance. She was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame on April 26, 2014.
