LAST TIME OUT • UTC took a break from the Preseason WNIT to host Butler and came away with a 60-49 win against the Bulldogs. Moses Johnson dropped in a team-high 12 points and matched her career-best for rebounds with nine in the contest to lead the Mocs. Aryanna and Keiana Gilbert each recorded 11 points for Chattanooga while Keiana grabbed six boards. She and Johnson combined for eight of the Mocs' 12 offensive snares. The game started slow with both teams combining to miss the first 10 shots. Butler would score first and get out to a 4-0 lead with 6:26 to go in the opening frame. Aryanna Gilbert took a pass from Alicia Payne for the Mocs first score and Chattanooga put together a short 8-2 run to take its first lead of the game. Butler bounced back with the next four points to lead 10-8 at the first break. The Mocs tied it up 10-10 to start the second half, sparking a 19-2 run that put UTC out front 27-12 for its largest lead of the half with 2:14 to play in the period. The Mocs had a balanced attack in the frame, getting scoring from six different players. Johnson and Payne each dropped in five points and Johnson grabbed five rebounds. Chattanooga led 27-19 at the half and stretched it out to 32-19 to start the second half. The Bulldogs responded with five points to make it 32-24 at the 6:59 mark of the period. UTC struck back with the next eight points for its largest lead of the game, 40-24, at the 4:04 of the third. It would be all Butler from there. Tori Schickel and Taylor Buford combined for the Bulldog's final 10 points of the frame to cut the lead to 40-34 at the end of three. In the fourth, Butler cut it to a 44-41 game on an old-fashioned 3-point play from Blaire Langlois who nailed her free throw at the 7:32 mark of the frame. The Mocs responded with a layup from Johnson and a trio of free throws to make it 49-41 at the 4:01 mark. Butler went 2-of-4 from the free throw line to cut the lead to six, but junior Chelsey Shumpert drained a 3-pointer, and the Mocs lead grew to nine, 52-43, with 3:04 on the clock. Butler responded with a 3-pointer from Langlois to get within six points again, but that's as close as it would be the remainder of the game. Keiana Gilbert had four of the Mocs next six points to put the lead into double-digits for the first time in the quarter and after one free throw from the Bulldogs, Chattanooga got three more points for the final score. Chattanooga shot 46.9 percent for the day making 23-of-49 from the field and hitting three 3-pointers. The Mocs outscored Butler 38-28 in the paint and got 19 points off 18 Bulldog miscues. The teams matched each other on the boards with 31 and UTC scored 13 points off 12 offensive rebounds. Johnson had 12 of the Mocs 19 bench points with no turnovers. She was 5-of-6 from the field and had one from beyond the arc. Ansley Chilton added five points off the bench, spelling junior Jasmine Joyner who got into foul trouble early.

Keiana Gilbert tabbed CSM SoCon Player of the Week • Sophomore Keiana Gilbert was selected the College Sports Madness Southern Conference Player of the Week for her performance on the court. She dropped in 19 points in UTC's season opener against McNeese State and had six rebounds.

New Rules Highlight Start of Women's Season • This season will see new rules for women's basketball. The most obvious will be the move from two 20-minute halves to four 10-minute quarters. Another will be advancing the ball in the final minute of play. Once a basket or rebound is made, a team may call timeout before advancing the ball and take possession at the 28-foot mark. A more extensive explanation can be found on page six of this notes package.

Joyner Records Double-Double • Junior Jasmine Joyner recorded her seventh career double-double with 15 points and 13 points in the season opener. She added six blocked shots and topped the 500-point mark for her career.

Mocs Picked to Win Fourth Straight Crown • The Southern Conference coaches and media picked UTC to the league title. The Mocs, winners of three straight, have won the regular season 19 times since 1984.

Joyner Named Preseason Favorite • Junior Jasmine Joyner was selected the preseason favorite for Southern Conference Player of the Year by the league coaches. Joyner was named to the SoCon all-conference team last season and named the tournament Most Outstanding Player.

Three Named to SoCon Preseason Team • Senior Alicia Payne and juniors Jasmine Joyner and Chelsey Shumpert were named to the SoCon preseason all-conference team by the league coaches.

Mocs Ranked 25th in AP Preseason Poll • The Mocs earned their first-ever AP Top 25 preseason ranking this year. Chattanooga climbed as high as 17th last season. After receiving votes for six weeks, the remained in the poll for the final seven weeks.

UTC Second in Mid-Major Top 25 • College Insider ranks the Mocs at second in its preseason Mid-Major Top 25 poll. The Mocs ended last season at second and return five starters. Chattanooga received three first place votes for 720 points behind Florida Gulf Coast who received 22 first place votes for 735 points.

ESPNW Ranks Mocs in Preseason Top 10 • ESPNW reporters and contributer ranked the Mocs fourth in its preseason Mid-Major Top 10. UTC is behind Florida Gulf Coast, George Washington and Princeton.

Foster Gets Another First • Last season Chattanooga head coach Jim Foster became the first coach in NCAA history to have four different teams ranked in the AP Top 25. The previous season he was the first to guide four different teams to the NCAA Tournament. This season he becomes the first coach in NCAA history to have four different teams ranked in the AP Top 25 Preseason Poll. The Mocs are ranked 25th.

Mocs Make Fourth Appearance in Preseason WNIT • The Mocs opened the season with its fourth appearance in the preseason tournament. Chattanooga defeated McNeese State 68-53 to open the season and will take on Indiana in the second round. UTC hosted UAB in the opening game in 2011 coming away with a 65-59 win. UTC went 2-1 in 2011 with wins over UAB and Indiana State and a loss to Baylor. Chattanooga fell 74-53 to the Sycamores in 2005 on Indiana State's home court and dropped a 69-52 decision at Louisiana Tech in 2000.

Four Mocs Opponents Ranked Among the Best • With UConn headlining both preseason polls, the Mocs will face some stiff competition this season. The Huskies are ranked first in both the AP Top 25 and the USA Today Coaches Top 25. UTC will take on UConn for the first time in school history on Nov. 30 at home. Before that, the Mocs will face off against Tennessee in Knoxville. The Lady Vols are ranked fourth in both polls. Chattanooga will travel to South Florida in mid-December to face the Bulls who are 20th in the AP Poll and 19th in the Coaches Poll. Also in the polls is Stanford. Chattanooga will travel west to take on the Cardinal on December 28. Stanford is ranked 16th by the AP and 14th by the coaches.

Southern Conference Win Streak • The Mocs have lost just one game in three years against the Southern Conference. After falling to Elon on the road in overtime in January 2013, the Mocs have won a school and Southern Conference record 48 consecutive regular season league games.

Hot Beyond the Arc ● The Mocs have made at least one 3-pointer in 500 consecutive games dating back to December 1999 - that's a 15-year span.

Hot at Home • Chattanooga opened the season with a win over McNeese State to extend its home-court win streak to 13 games and the Mocs have won 53 of its last 54 games in the Roundhouse. Those wins include Villanova (2014), No. 4 Tennessee (2014), No. 7 Stanford (2014), Alabama (2013), Auburn (2013), No. 20 Tennessee (2012).

Foster Fastest to 50 wins ● Through 57 games, Jim Foster earned his 50th win at the UTC helm. He reached the 50-win mark at UTC faster than any other in school history.

UTC Record Against the Top 10 • Chattanooga is 2-1 against the Top 10. The Mocs defeated then-ranked No. 4 Tennessee 67-63 at the McKenzie Arena and then followed that up with a 54-46 win over then-No. 7 Stanford at the Roundhouse three weeks later last year. UTC fell 88-53 to then-ranked No. 3 Notre Dame in South Bend.

SoCon Tournament • The Southern Conference Tournament will be held in Asheville, N.C., March 5-8. All rounds will be played in the U.S. Cellular Center this year.

42 Seasons • UTC begins its 42nd season of play as a varsity sport and has had just five coaches in it's history. The Mocs are 794-416 over that time, averaging just over 22 wins per season.

Home Openers • When opening the season at home, the Mocs are 14-4 and have won each of the last five with a win over McNeese State at home this year. In all openers the Mocs are 32-10.

Doubleheaders on the Slate • The Chattanooga men's and women's teams will take part in six doubleheaders. The first will be on the road at Furman on January 9. The next five will be at home with one more in January and the last four in February.

Road Tournament • The women will travel to Wilmington, N.C., to participate in the UNCW Christmas Classic. UTC will face East Carolina the first day and follow with a matchup against the host UNC Wilmington.

Foster in it for the Long Haul • Jim Foster begins his season season at the helm of the Mocs and is in his 38th season of coaching. Foster began his career at St. Joe's, moved on to Vanderbilt and had his latest stint at Ohio State. He starts the season as the 11th winningest coach in NCAA history (all levels) with 841 victories. He is just the 11th coach in NCAA history to reach 800 wins. He is also the ONLY coach to advance four different teams to the NCAA Tournament and have four different teams ranked in the AP Poll and Preseason Poll.

ON THE ROSTER

- Gilbert Returns to Lineup Redshirt sophomore Aryanna Gilbert suffered a season-ending knee injury last season after the Mocs' eighth game. After a long rehab and preseason workouts, she is back in the lineup and ready to play. She was able to redshirt last season and will have three years remaining.
- Queen Alford to Make Chattanooga Debut After sitting on the sidelines for an entire season, redshirt junior Queen Alford will make her UTC debut this season. Alford was the Atlantic Sun Freshman of the Year in 2013 and a two-time all-conference performer for the Dolphins. She led Jacksonville in scoring both seasons and was second in rebounding as well. In her freshman year, she had a team-best .450 3-point field goal percentage making 27-of-60.
- Ashlyn Wert in the Lineup After taking a redshirt her freshman year, Ashlyn Wert is ready to step onto the court for her first collegiate game. At just over 6-foot-5, she is Chattanooga tallest player and will back up the center position.
- Two Freshmen in the Lineup The Mocs added freshmen Nakeia Burks of Huntsville High School and Molly Melton of the Webb School of Knoxville.

2015 RULES CHANGES

Southern Conference Coaches Preseason Poll

The Chattanooga Mocs have been picked to win their fourth straight Southern Conference women's basketball title, according to a vote by the league's head coaches. UTC junior forward Jasmine Joyner was tabbed Preseason Player of the Year. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams or student-athletes as part of the balloting.

Foul shots: Teams will now reach the bonus on the fifth foul of each quarter and shoot two shots. Fouls are cleared from the board at the start of each quarter but the bonus will carry over from the fourth quarter to any overtime period.

Advancing the ball: Teams may advance the ball to the frontcourt by calling a timeout immediately after a made basket or defensive rebound. The ball may not be advanced prior to the timeout. The ball will be inbounded at the 28-foot mark on the side of the court with the scorer's table.

10-Second Backcourt exception: A team will not receive a new 10-second backcourt count when a throw-in results from the following:

- The ball is deflected out of bounds by the defense
- There is a held ball and the possession arrow favors the offensive team
- A technical foul is called on the offensive team while the ball is in its backcourt.

Post Defense: Defenders are allowed to place a forearm or open hand with a bend in the elbow on an offensive post player with the ball whose back is to the basket.

Timeouts: There will be one media timeout per quarter at the first deadball at or below the five-minute mark and at the end of the first and third quarters. However, if a team calls timeout before the five-minute mark, that would be treated as the media timeout. Additionally, the first called team timeout in the second half would be treated as a full media timeout, but will not take the place of the media timeout for that quarter.


