SETTING THE SCENE

Opening the 52nd season at Memorial Stadium, the Indiana football team (0-1, 0-0 Big Ten) welcomes Virginia (1-0, 0-0 ACC) on Saturday, Sept. 10. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. EDT and the BTN will broadcast the game. The Hoosiers dropped their season opener to Ball State, 27-20, at Lucas Oil Stadium, while the Cavaliers defeated William & Mary, 40-3, in their home opener.

THE VIRGINIA SERIES

Indiana and Virginia are meeting for the second time overall and the first time in Bloomington. The Cavaliers won the lone contest, 47-7, in Charlottesville on Oct. 10, 2009.

THE COACHES

Kevin Wilson will roam the Memorial Stadium sidelines for the first time on Saturday night. Wilson spent the 2002-10 seasons at Oklahoma, where he served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10. OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.

Mike London is in his second season as Virginia head coach. The Cavaliers posted a 4-8 record in 2010. London led Richmond to a 24-5 mark (2008-09) and claimed the 2008 Football Championship Series national title.

NEWS & NOTES

- The Hoosiers are 35-16 in Memorial Stadium openers with nine straight victories and wins in 26 of their last 29 home starters.
- **Edward Wright-Baker** threw for 272 yards with one touchdown in the opener against Ball State. His 272 yards are the most for a first-time starter since Blake Powers (276) vs. Central Michigan on Sept. 2, 2005.
- Linebacker **Jeff Thomas** (11), safety **Chris Adkins** (11) and defensive tackle **Adam Replogle** (10) reached double figures in tackles vs. Ball State.
- Indiana played 10 true freshmen against Ball State, its highest total since 2003 (11).
- The Hoosiers are 5-11 all-time against the ACC.
- IU is 20-7 (.741) in regular-season non-conference games since the start of the 2004 season.
- Hoosiers redshirt freshman tight end **Paul Phillips** will see a familiar face across the sideline. His brother, Colter, is the Cavaliers starting tight end.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Indiana head coach **Kevin Wilson** will hold his weekly press conference every Tuesday during the regular season at 11:30 a.m. ET in the Henke Hall of Champions beginning on Tuesday, Aug. 30. Live streaming of the press conference will be made available on IUHoosiers.com.

Selected players and coordinators will be available following Coach Wilson. Lunch will be provided at 11:30 a.m. Players and coaches made available at Tuesday's press conference will not be available following practice.

PRACTICE SCHEDULE

Practices are closed to the media. Coaches and players will be available in the Team Room in the North End Zone complex for post-practice interviews. Media members are asked to meet in the Team Room at least 10 minutes before practice is complete.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS

All player and coaching staff interview requests should be directed to Jeff Keag. Requests for post-practice interviews should be made at least 24 hours in advance. Personal phone numbers will not be made available to media. Players have been instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted without prior approval from the media relations staff.

POST-GAME INTERVIEW POLICY

The Indiana locker room is closed at all times. A media relations staffer will collect all player requests in the press box midway through the fourth quarter. Requested players will be available in the weight room of the North End Zone complex immediately following head coach **Kevin Wilson's** post-game press conference.

Wilson will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone facility following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.

Working credentials for the 2011 Indiana football season must be requested via the web. Please do not send faxes, letters or e-mails. To request credentials visit IUHoosiers.com and click on the media services link under "Inside Athletics." A link to apply for football credentials will be at the top of the page.

Credentials will be mailed to the address provided. To guarantee that your credential is mailed to you, your request should be made 10 days prior to the game. All requests made during the week of the game will be held at will call, which is located at ticket booth No. 3 located on the West side of Memorial Stadium and opens three hours prior to kickoff.

THE WRIGHT-BAKER STUFF

Edward Wright-Baker earned his first career start in the season opener against Ball State. The sophomore southpaw entered 2011 with just five completions, 12 attempts and 80 yards in five games.

- Wright-Baker completed 20-of-32 for 272 yards with a 65-yard score and zero interceptions vs. BSU.
- His 272 yards marked the highest total for an IU quarterback in his first start since Blake Powers threw for 276 yards at Central Michigan on Sept. 2, 2005.
- The Jeffersonville, Ind., native hit eight different receivers and connected with **Damarlo Belcher** for his career-long, 65-yard TD.
- It was the Hoosiers first 60-yard touchdown reception since the first of Wright-Baker's career, a 62-yarder to **Duwyce Wilson** at Wisconsin last year.

BELCHER ON THE BRINK

Damarlo Belcher is the Big Ten's active leader in receptions and yardage. He is on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List and the Big Ten Players to Watch List.

- With his four catches for 101 yards against Ball State, Belcher became the sixth Hoosier to reach 2,000 career receiving yards.
- Belcher is third on Indiana's career list with 168 catches and sixth with 2,040 yards. He is chasing fellow Fort Wayne, Ind., native James Hardy's marks of 191 and 2,740.
- He now owns three 100-yard games and has reached the 10-reception mark three times.
- Belcher pulled in a 65-yard score vs. the Cardinals, which matched his career long.
- His 168 career receptions are 12th among active FBS receivers and his 2,040 yards are 17th.
- He led the Hoosiers with 78 receptions and 832 yards in 2010. The 78 catches rank second on the school's single-season list and the 832 yards are ninth.
- Belcher paced the Big Ten in receptions (tied for 22nd nationally) and topped the league (17th nationally) in catches per game (6.50). He also ranked fourth in the conference with 69.3 receiving yards per game and added four touchdowns.

BACKFIELD BRUISERS

Matt Perez and **Stephen Houston** made their Hoosier debuts in the backfield against Ball State. Perez (230 pounds) and Houston (228 pounds) combined for 84 yards on 21 carries with a score in the game.

- Perez rushed for 41 yards on 12 attempts and scored IU's first touchdown of the season. Additionally, he made two grabs for 18 yards.
- The redshirt freshman suffered a season-ending ACL injury during week two practice in 2010. He was named the *Chicago Sun-Times*, *Chicago Tribune* and *ESPNChicago.com* 2009 Player of the Year at Maine South High School in Park Ridge, Ill.
- Perez is the only player on the Hoosiers roster who can squat 700 pounds.
- Houston led Indiana with 43 yards on nine carries (4.8 average) against the Cardinals. He also caught one pass for six yards.
- The sophomore transferred from Independence (Kan.) CC, where he rushed for 1,082 yards and five touchdowns on 165 carries at Independence in 2010.

EARNING HIS SPOT

Fifth-year **Dre Muhammad** earned a scholarship prior to the 2011 season. After redshirting the 2007 season at Purdue, Muhammad walked on at IU in 2008

and played in eight games in his three seasons before earning his first career start against Ball State.

- Muhammad made the most of his opportunity, not only making his first career reception, but leading the team with six catches.
- He added 68 yards, with a long of 24, rushed once for seven yards and returned one punt.

FROSH IN THE GAME

Kevin Wilson made it no secret that he was not afraid to play true freshmen, and he certainly lived up to his word. Ten true freshmen saw action against Ball State, the most for an IU squad since 11 took the field during the 2003 campaign. Indiana only played eight true freshmen from 2007-10.

Wide receivers **Jay McCants**, **Cody Latimer** and **Shane Wynn**, safeties **Mark Murphy** and **Forisse Hardin**, running back **D'Angelo Roberts**, cornerbacks **Michael Hunter**, **Kenny Mullen** and **Nick Stoner**, and long snapper **Matt Dooley** made their debuts.

The Hoosiers also started three redshirt freshmen and played six overall vs. BSU. Running back **Matt Perez**, defensive end **Ryan Phillis** and strong-side linebacker **Chase Hoobler** each earned their first career starts, while offensive lineman **Cody Evers**, linebacker **Jake Michalek** and fullback **Matt Zakrzewski** saw action.

JUST FOR KICKS

One of the top kickers in the nation coming out of Waubonsie Valley High School in Naperville, Ill., **Mitch Ewald** has proved why this was the case after he redshirted the 2009 campaign.

- Ewald hit both of his attempts in the season opener against Ball State, including his second career 49-yarder (career high), to improve to 18-of-21 (86.7 percent) in his career.
- He is 10th on Indiana's career field goal list.
- In addition to his 86.7 field goal percentage, he is a perfect 35-of-35 in the extra point department.
- Ewald's 16 field goals tied for the most for a freshman and tied for the third most on IU's single-season list in 2010.
- His 1.33 field goals per game ranked third among freshmen nationally, fourth in the Big Ten and 25th among all kickers nationally.
- Ewald forced overtime with a 26-yarder and hit the game-winner from 31 yards in the Old Oaken Bucket victory at Purdue.

THE WILSON FILE

Kevin Wilson has led some of the most productive offenses in the history of college football. Wilson has served as an offensive coordinator at Miami (Ohio), Northwestern and Oklahoma. He is coaching the tight ends and fullbacks this season, and he has coached the offensive line, quarterbacks, tight ends and fullbacks in his career.

- In Wilson nine years at Oklahoma, twenty-two offensive players were drafted into the NFL, including seven first-round selections, with three going among the first 10 picks and two in the top five.
- Wilson served as position coach for three All-Americans, an Outland Trophy winner (Jammal Brown), a Mackey Award finalist (Jermaine Gresham) and a two-time Rimington Trophy finalist (Vince Carter).
- As position coach, he tutored three first-round draft picks, a second-round pick, a fifth-round pick, a sixth-round pick and six free agents.

- His 2008 offense shattered NCAA records by scoring 60 or more points in five straight games and 716 total points for the entire season to average more than 51 points per contest.
- OU played in the 2008 BCS National Championship Game behind Heisman Trophy winner Sam Bradford, the No. 1 overall pick in the 2010 NFL Draft.
- Adrian Peterson rushed for 1,925 yards in 2004, the highest total for a freshman in NCAA history. He was the seventh pick in the 2007 NFL Draft.
- Wilson's 2000 Northwestern offense averaged 42.1 points per game in Big Ten play, which is the third-best output in conference history, and boosted the Wildcats to a share of the Big Ten championship.

PLAY HARD, PLAY SMART, PLAY PHYSICAL

When walking into the Hoosiers practice facilities, you will find the following in bold lettering - PLAY HARD... PLAY SMART... PLAY PHYSICAL. **Kevin Wilson** has stressed these three things to his team, noting this is what championship teams do, and that it does not take talent to play hard and physical.

Wilson's 2010 offense played smart football. Despite taking a national high 1,211 snaps - approximately 20 percent more than the next closest team - the Sooners committed just 18 turnovers. OU finished with a plus-14 advantage in turnover margin. As a team, Oklahoma averaged only 5.14 penalties and 42.49 penalty yards per contest.

It should come as no surprise then that Oklahoma went 12-2, captured the Big 12 championship and closed out the year with a 48-20 victory over UConn in the Fiesta Bowl.

WIN TODAY

Kevin Wilson did not mince his words in his first meeting with his team. He is not building for the future; he expects to win now. In order to win this season, Wilson has preached to his team to WIN TODAY. Whether it is in the weight room, on the field or in the classroom, Wilson wants his players to win.

And the players have bought in. This summer, most of the team stayed in Bloomington for summer workouts and summer school. The incoming freshmen also arrived earlier than previous years, taking courses and working out during the second summer session.

IT STARTS UPFRONT

Despite the departure of starting right tackle James Brewer, who was drafted in fourth round of the 2011 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, the Hoosiers boast plenty of experience along the offensive line. Four of the five projected starters for Saturday are in at least their fourth year with the program.

- Fifth-year senior left tackle **Andrew McDonald** has started 12 games and played in 25 in his career.
- Redshirt junior left guard **Marc Damisch** has eight career starts. He has played in 21 overall games and has appeared at both guard positions and right tackle.
- Redshirt junior **Will Matte** has started all 25 career games at center. He is the only offensive lineman to start every game in 2009, 2010 and 2011.
- Senior right guard **Justin Pagán** is the Hoosiers most experienced lineman. He has appeared in 31 career games, started 27 of the team's last 30 games and played every position on the line except center.

SECOND LEVEL SENIORS

Co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach **Mike Ekeler** is looking to a pair of seniors for leadership this season. **Jeff Thomas** is the Hoosiers starter in the middle and **Leon Beckum** is the starter on the weak side.

- Thomas joined the Hoosiers from Foothill (Calif.) CC and has made 10 starts, including the season opener against Ball State.
- He recorded his third career game with double-digit tackles vs. BSU, sharing game-high honors with 11. Thomas also has five games with at least eight stops.
- Thomas finished second on the team with 82 tackles, 45 solo stops, 7.5 tackles for loss and two interceptions in 2010.
- The homegrown Beckum played his high school ball at Bloomington North, joined the Hoosiers as a walk-on in 2007 and earned a scholarship in 2009.
- He has played all three linebacker spots in his career and was an 11-game starter in 2010.
- Beckum made 69 tackles, 41 solo, with three sacks and nine tackles for loss. He led the team in TFLs, finished second in sacks and tied for third in tackles.

YES, HE-BAN!

Greg Heban started his IU career as a pitcher for head coach Tracy Smith's baseball team. After dominating the 2009 intramural flag football season, Smith urged Heban to give football, one of three sports he played at Delta High School in Muncie, Ind., along with basketball and baseball, another shot.

Heban arrived at preseason camp in 2010, made the team, worked his way up the depth chart and eventually started four of the team's final five games at cornerback and played in all 12 contests.

- Head coach **Kevin Wilson** awarded Heban a scholarship prior to the season.
- The sophomore cornerback started the Ball State game and made a career-high nine tackles with one pass breakup.
- He shared the team lead with five passes broken up and made 40 tackles, 25 solo, 3.5 tackles for loss and one interception in 2010.
- Despite being just 6-foot-1, he can dunk a basketball from standing flat-footed and can throw 90 mph, as he pitched 1 1/3 innings for the 2010 IU baseball team.

INTERIOR THREAT

One of the Hoosiers deepest units is defensive tackle. The coaching staff believes it has four starters in juniors **Adam Replogle**, **Larry Black, Jr.**, **Mick Mentzer** and **Nicholas Sliger**.

- Replogle, Black and Mentzer have played in each of the team's 25 games over the last three seasons, while Sliger missed one of those games with an injury.
- Replogle is the only one to start as a true freshman and has started the last 24 games. After recording a career-high 10 tackles in the season opener, he also leads the group with 74 tackles, 40 solo, and six sacks to go along with 8.5 tackles for loss in his career.
- Black has made 17 starts and earned a spot on the *Sporting News* freshman All-America and All-Big Ten teams in 2009. He has 49 tackles, 2.5 sacks and 10 TFLs in his career.

**SAFETIES FIRST**

Despite playing in 33 combined games entering 2011, fifth-year senior safeties Jarrell Drane and Chris Adkins started together for the first time in their careers in the season opener against Ball State. Drane received the starting nod at strong safety with Adkins next to him at free safety.

- In his second career start, Drane recorded a career-high eight tackles.
- He received his first start at No. 6 Wisconsin last season.
- Adkins matched linebacker Jeff Thomas for game-high honors and set a new career high with 11 stops.
- He started 12 games as a redshirt freshman in 2008 and struggled with injuries which limited him to just one start in both 2009 and 2010.

BOLSER-ING THE OFFENSE

The last time Indiana received the production out of the tight end position that **Ted Bolser** provided last year came back in the early 1990s. Bolser, who is on the 2011 John Mackey Award Watch List, caught 27 passes for 407 yards with five touchdowns and an average of 15.1 yards per reception.

- Bolser set an IU tight end record, ranked first nationally among freshman tight ends and tied for seventh nationally among all tight ends in scores.
- He posted Hoosier freshman tight end records in catches and yards, and he finished with the sixth-most yards all-time in a single season among IU tight ends.
- Bolser was named to *Rivals.com* and Football Writers Association of America Freshman All-America teams.
- The Cincinnati native collected the most yards for an IU tight end since 1991 (Rod Coleman) and the most receptions since 1992 (Ross Hales).
- He finished second all-time among all Indiana freshman pass-catchers in TDs, sixth in yardage and tied for seventh in catches.

THE GOOD HANDS MAN

Duwycy Wilson turned in one of the top seasons for a freshman wide receiver in IU history last year. He caught 32 balls for 488 yards with three scores and paced the team with 15.2 yards per receptions.

- Wilson led all Big Ten freshmen with his 32 catches and 488 yards.
- He tied for second all-time among Indiana freshman wide receivers in receptions, third in yardage and tied for third in TDs.
- Wilson was selected to the *ESPN.com* and *Rivals.com* All-Freshman teams.
- The Columbus, Ind., native also returned eight kick-offs for 180 yards.

HERO COMES HOME

Kevin Bush played in all 12 games last season at defensive end and on special teams. He recorded 11 tackles with two quarterback hurries and a half-tackle for loss. The junior also blocked a punt in his collegiate debut, which led to a touchdown, in the Hoosiers season-opening win vs. Towson.

Bush always dreamed of being an Indiana Hoosier. He never dreamed the route he would take to Bloomington. The 25-year-old began his career at the University of Toledo in 2004 before returning to his hometown of Fort Wayne after one month. He found a factory job, decided it wasn't for him, and went on

to join the United States Armed Forces. Bush spent the next 3 1/2 years in the Army, including a 14-month stint in Iraq and one year in Korea.

Upon his return, he blazed through walk-on tryouts to earn a spot on the 2009 team, eventually earning co-defensive scout team player of the year honors.

A 425-seat club section is located directly in front of the Henke Hall of Champions. - One of the most innovative and prolific offensive minds in the country, Kevin Wilson was named Indiana University's 28th head football coach on Dec. 7, 2010.

- Spent the 2002-10 seasons at the University of Oklahoma. He served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10.

- Led some of the most productive offenses in college football history and coached in 10 consecutive bowl games, seven of which were BCS bowl appearances, including three national championship games (2003, 2004, 2008 seasons).

- OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.

- In Wilson's nine years at Oklahoma, 22 offensive players were drafted into the NFL, including seven first-round selections, with three going among the first 10 picks and two in the top five.

- Served as position coach for three All-Americans, an Outland Trophy winner (Jammal Brown), a Mackey Award finalist (Jermaine Gresham) and a two-time Rimington Trophy finalist (Vince Carter).

- Twice a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award - awarded to the nation's top assistant coach - won the award in 2008.

- As position coach, tutored three first-round draft picks (Jermaine Gresham, TE, 2010, Davin Joseph, OL, 2006 and Jammal Brown, OL, 2005), a second-round pick (Chris Chester, OL, 2005), a fifth-round pick (Brody Eldridge, TE, 2010), a sixth-round pick (Wes Sims, OL, 2004) and six free agents at Oklahoma.

- In 2010, the Sooners earned a 48-20 victory over Connecticut in the Fiesta Bowl and also claimed the seventh Big 12 championship in school history.

- During the 2010 campaign, running back DeMarco Murray set the school record for career touchdowns and also set an OU mark for career all-purpose yards.

- Guided wide receiver Ryan Broyles to eight Sooner receiving records, including career marks for receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns. Broyles led the nation with 131 receptions in 2010.

- His 2008 offense shattered NCAA records by scoring 60 or more points in five straight games and 716 total points for the entire season to average more than 51 points per contest.

- The 2008 team played in the BCS National Championship Game behind Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Sam Bradford.

- In 2008, Bradford passed for 4,720 yards and 50 touchdowns, Chris Brown and DeMarco Murray both rushed for over 1,000 yards, Jaquín Iglesias caught 74 balls for 1,150 yards and Jermaine Gresham added 66 for 950.

- Bradford ranked No. 1 nationally in passing efficiency as a freshman in 2007 and again in 2008, as he threw for more touchdowns (86) in two seasons than anyone in NCAA history.

- In the 2010 NFL Draft, Bradford went on to become the No. 1 overall pick by the St. Louis Rams. He was named the 2010 Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

- Three of Wilson's tight ends, Jermaine Gresham, Brody Eldridge and Joe Jon Finley, earned All-Big 12 honors following the 2007 season.

- Wilson was also instrumental in the development of Adrian Peterson. Peterson rushed for 1,925 yards in his freshman campaign in 2004, which set an OU single-season record and the highest total for a freshman in NCAA history.

- Peterson went on to place second in the Heisman voting, the highest finish ever by a freshman. He was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings as the seventh pick in the 2007 NFL Draft, where he was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year.

- Prior to his stint in Norman, Wilson was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Northwestern University in 2001 after serving as offensive coordinator in 1999 and 2000. He worked with the quarterbacks during his time in Evanston.

- Helped NU to the 2000 Alamo Bowl and quarterback Zac Kustok, a Unitas Award finalist, led the Big Ten in total offense. Running back Damian Anderson earned All-America honors and became the sixth-best rusher in Big Ten history.

- Followed Randy Walker to Northwestern from Miami after spending nine years in Oxford, coaching alongside former Indiana head coach Terry Hoepfner.

- Served as offensive line coach for his first two years at Miami and was promoted to offensive coordinator for the next seven, spending 1992-1997 in charge of the offensive line and the 1998 season with the quarterbacks.

- His offenses produced outstanding running backs, including Travis Prentice and Indiana running backs coach Deland McCullough.

- Prentice became the NCAA all-time leading scorer and the fifth-most prolific rusher in NCAA history, breaking McCullough's school records in the process.

- Wilson was the head coach and athletic director at Foard High School in North Carolina in 1989 and the offensive coordinator at North Carolina A&T in 1988.

- Spent a year as offensive line coach at Winston Salem State in 1987. Wilson began his career in coaching as a student and graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina.

- A walk-on offensive lineman at North Carolina, he earned a scholarship while playing in four bowl games, including the 1980 Bluebonnet, the 1981 Gator, the 1982 Sun and the 1983 Peach Bowls.

- Earned his bachelor's degree in education (1984) and his master's degree in physical education (1987).

- Wilson was a three-sport star in high school at Maiden High in Maiden, N.C.

- Kevin and his wife, Angela, have five children, including three daughters, Elaina (15), Makenzie (13) and Marlee (10) and two sons, Trey (11) and Toby (8).

DON FISCHER

This marks the 39th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. The past 24 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the Indiana University Radio

Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both football and basketball and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 17 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts.

During his 38 years of work with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 25 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 21 times, including 2009 and 2010, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard

M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. He also has been named an Honorary "I" Man.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play by-play broadcaster for IU.

Fischer has broadcast more than 1,500 Indiana University games - a total that includes eight bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games. From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 43 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and eight grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoined the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator for the 2010 season. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, reunited with the radio voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-

game and halftime). Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory.

After his stint as running backs coach, where he mentored All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001. As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing at-

tacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions.

In 1988, the Indiana offense rushed for a school-record 2,963 yards. During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 29th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 42nd year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Joe worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook.

In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University in June 2004.

Joe has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, who currently resides in Indianapolis with his wife, Kristen, is a 2002 graduate with a bachelor's degree in sport communications. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric Graebe, currently reside in Kill Devil Hills, N.C. She earned her bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2005, and her master's in sports management at the University of Tennessee in 2006.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Sophomore quarterback **Edward Wright-Baker** went 20-of-32 for 272 yards with one touchdown and no interceptions in his first career start. Wright-Baker spread it around to eight different receivers.

- Senior wide receiver **Damarlo Belcher** finished with a team-high 101 yards receiving on four receptions. He also had one touchdown. It was his third 100-yard receiving game of his career.

- Belcher now has 168 career receptions and is three shy of moving into the second spot on the IU career list.

- Wright-Baker connected with Belcher for a 65-yard score in the second quarter. It was a career long for Wright-Baker and matched a career-best for Belcher. The last time the Hoosiers connected on a 60-yard score was a Wright-Baker 62-yarder to **Duwyce Wilson** at Wisconsin on Nov. 13, 2010.

- Fifth-year senior wide receiver **Dre Muhammad** recorded his first career catch tonight. He led the team in receptions with six, finishing with 68 yards, including a long of 24.

- Three Hoosiers recorded double-digit tackles, led by senior safety **Chris Adkins** and senior linebacker **Jeff Thomas** with 11 apiece. Junior defensive tackle **Adam Replogle** chipped in 10.

- Adkins set a new career high with his 11 stops, while Thomas recorded his third career double-digit game. Replogle also bested his previous career mark of seven. Sophomore cornerback **Greg Heban**, senior safety **Jarrell Drane** and senior defensive end **Fred Jones** all tallied career bests in tackles as well, totaling 9, 8 and 7, respectively.

- Muhammad, Wright-Baker, running back **Matt Perez**, defensive ends **Ryan Phillis** and **Fred Jones**, linebacker **Chase Hoobler** and cornerback **Lawrence Barnett** made their first career starts for the Hoosiers.

- The Hoosiers played nine true freshmen tonight. Wide receivers **Jay McCants**, **Cody Latimer** and **Shane Wynn**, safeties **Mark Murphy** and **Forisse Hardin**, running back **D'Angelo Roberts**, cornerbacks **Michael Hunter** and **Nick Stoner**, and long snapper **Matt Dooley** each made their IU debuts. It is the most true freshmen to play for the Hoosiers since 2003, when Indiana played 11 true freshmen. IU only played eight true freshmen the previous four seasons combined.

- Perez scored Indiana's first touchdown of the season with his 9-yard run. It is the second straight year a freshman recorded the Hoosiers' first score. Tight end **Ted Bolser** caught a 12-yard pass to open 2010 against Towson.

- Indiana drove 76 yards in 15 plays and scored on its first drive of the season. The Hoosiers last scored on its season-opening drive in 2007 against Indiana State (seven plays, 73 yards).

- With his second career 49-yard field goal, also matching his career high, **Mitch Ewald** moved into sole possession of 10th place on the Hoosiers career list. He added a 27-yarder in the fourth quarter and now has 18 career field goals.

- Junior punter **Adam Pines** set a new personal best with a 56-yard punt in the second quarter.

- The Hoosiers finished the night with 375 yards of total offense. It is the eighth straight game Indiana has tallied 300 or more yards of total offense.

- Indiana did not turn the ball over tonight. In 2010, the Hoosiers only had two turnover-free games and not since game three against Akron on Sept. 25.

- Tonight's loss snapped a seven-game win streak for Indiana in season openers. The Hoosiers have won eight of their last 10 openers.

- IU is 20-7 in regular-season non-conference games since 2004.

- The Hoosiers are now 35-7-1 against teams from the Mid-American Conference.

- Linebackers **Jeff Thomas** and **Leon Beckum** joined wide receiver **Damarlo Belcher** and center **Will Matte** as game captains.

- Indiana won the coin toss and elected to receive.
