SETTING THE SCENE

• Coming off its bye week, the Indiana football team (2-1) travels to Evanston for the first time since 2009 to face Northwestern (4-0) on Saturday, Sept. 29. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m. CDT/noon EDT and BTN will broadcast the game from Ryan Field (47,130; Natural Grass).

THE COACHES

- Kevin Wilson is in his second season as head coach at Indiana. Wilson spent the 2002-10 seasons at Oklahoma, where he served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10. OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.
- Pat Fitzgerald is in his seventh season as head coach at Northwestern and owns a 44-36 (.550) record. Fitzgerald starred at linebacker for the Wildcats (1993-96) and has guided NU to four straight bowl games.

NEWS & NOTES

- Indiana sophomore QB Cameron Coffman made his first career start against Ball State and went 24-of-35 (68.6 percent) for 251 yards and two touchdowns in three quarters of action.
- True freshman QB Nate Sudfeld earned co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his performance against Ball State. Entering the game in the fourth quarter, he finished 13-of-20 for 172 yards with two TDs.
- Sudfeld is just the third true freshman QB to play at IU (Steve Bradley 1977, Tre Roberson 2011).
- The Hoosiers lead the Big Ten in passing offense (326.0-13th nationally) and are second in total offense (538.3). IU is also one of just 11 teams nationally perfect in red zone scoring, going 12-for-12 with 10 touchdowns.
- For just the sixth time in school history, Indiana went over 500 yards in back-to-back games. The Hoosiers collected 558 yards against Ball State and 606 yards at UMass.
- IU head coach Kevin Wilson was Northwestern's offensive coordinator from 1999-2001.
- Wilson worked with Pat Fitzgerald in 2001, as Fitzgerald coached NU's secondary.
- Assistant offensive coordinator Kevin Johns served two stints with the Wildcats (1999-2001, 2004-10).
- Northwestern wide receivers coach Dennis Springer spent the 2008-10 seasons on IU's coaching staff.
- NU leads the all-time series, 45-34-1, including a 26-16-1 edge in Evanston.
- Seven of the last eight games between the two teams have been decided by seven points or less. Those seven contests were decided by a combined 26 points with two extending into overtime.

PRACTICE SCHEDULE

Personal phone numbers will not be made available to media. Players have been instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted without prior approval from the media relations staff.

POST-GAME INTERVIEW POLICY

The Indiana locker room is closed at all times. A media relations staffer will collect all player requests in the press box midway through the fourth quarter. Requested players will be available in the weight room of the North End Zone complex immediately following head coach **Kevin Wilson's** post-game press conference.

Wilson will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone facility following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.

Working credentials for the 2012 Indiana football season must be requested via the web. To request credentials visit IUHoosiers.com and click on the media services link under "Inside Athletics." A link to apply for football credentials will be at the top of the page.

Credentials will be mailed to the address provided. To guarantee that your credential is mailed to you, your request should be made 10 days prior to the game. All requests made during the week of the game will be held at media will call, which is located at ticket booth No. 3 located on the West side of Memorial Stadium and opens three hours prior to kickoff.

NORTHWESTERN TIES

Indiana head coach Kevin Wilson coached at Northwestern from 1999-2001. He was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator in 2001 after serving as offensive coordinator in 1999 and 2000. He also worked with the guarterbacks.

- Wilson's 2000 offense averaged 42.1 points per game in Big Ten play, which is the fourth-best output in conference history, and boosted the Wildcats to a share of the Big Ten championship.
- Wilson worked with Northwestern head coach Pat Fitzgerald in 2001. Fitzgerald coached the secondary.
- IU wide receivers and quarterbacks coach Kevin Johns spent the 2004-10 campaigns at NU. Additionally, he was an offensive graduate assistant under Wilson from 1999-2001.
- Northwestern's wide receivers coach Dennis Springer was on Indiana's coaching staff from 2008-10.

ILLINOIS CONNECTION

Fourteen Hoosiers hail from the state of Illinois. Nate Boudreau (Neugua Valley H.S.), Nick Campos (Wheaton-Warrenville South) **Dimitrius Carr-Watson** (Mount Carmel), Quai Chandler (Lake Forest), Tevin Coleman (Oak Forest), Peyton Eckert (Prospect), Mitch Ewald (Waubonsie Valley), Dan Feeney (Carl Sandburg), Nick Mangieri (Dunlap), Will Matte South), Jake Michalek (Wheaton-Warrenville (Brother Rice), Ryan Parker (Carl Sandburg), Matt Perez (Maine South) and Austin Schlosser (Neugua Valley) all arrived from the Land of Lincoln.

YOUNGEST TEAM IN THE COUNTRY

Kevin Wilson has made it no secret that he is not afraid to play true freshmen, and he has certainly lived up to his word. Indiana played 16 in 2011, tied for the third most in the country.

- Additionally, 16 redshirt freshmen saw action. The 32 total freshmen were the highest total in the nation. • IU has played nine true freshmen this season: RB
- Tevin Coleman, TE Anthony Corsaro, RG Dan Feeney, S Dawson Fletcher, WR Ricky Jones, DE Nick Mangieri, LT Jason Spriggs, QB Nate Sudfeld and DT Alex Todd.
- OL Ralston Evans, DT Adarius Rayner and DE Zack Shaw are the three redshirt freshmen who have received playing time in 2012.
- Twenty of the 27 starters this season have been underclassmen - 11 on offense and nine on defense - including 17 sophomores, one redshirt freshman (Shaw) and two true freshmen (Spriggs and Feeney).
- · Indiana only has eight seniors on its 2012 roster, tied for the fewest in the country. Of the eight, only DTs Larry Black, Jr., Adam Replogle and Nicholas Sliger, C Will Matte and TE Charles Love III came to Bloomington on scholarship.
- Of the 105 players invited to 2012 camp, 76 were underclassmen (72.4 percent), 39 were freshmen (37.1) and 32 were true freshmen (30.5).

OFFENSIVE STRIKES

Indiana's offense is off to a fast start, literally. Under new offensive coordinator Seth Littrell, the Hoosiers have six touchdown drives covering at least 70 yards in less than 1:30 and in six-or-fewer plays. IU also has a one-play, 50-yard touchdown run that took 10 seconds.

 Indiana is running one play every 21.4 seconds. The Hoosiers have also shown significant strides in

several categories from 2011 (2012 listed first):

- Total Yards: 538.3 360.4
- Passing Yards: 326.0 199.4
- Rushing Yards: 212.3 161.0
- Plays: 87.7 72.5
- Time of Possession: 31:13 28:06
- IU has seven passing touchdowns this season after throwing just 10 in all of 2011.

CAMIAM

After leading Arizona Western Community College to the National Junior College Athletic Association national championship game, Cameron Coffman enrolled in spring classes and participated in practice.

- That extra practice has paid off as the sophomore quarterback assumed starting duties following Tre Roberson's season-ending injury in week two.
- In his first start against Ball State, Coffman went 24of-35 (68.6 percent) for 251 yards and two touchdowns in three quarters of action.
- He completed 16-of-22 (72.7) for 159 yards and one TD in relief of Roberson in his collegiate debut at UMass.
- On the season, Coffman is 40-of-57 (70.2) for 410 yards, three scores and no interceptions. He has led the Hoosiers on seven scoring drives (six touchdowns) in nearly seven full quarters of action.
- Coffman threw for 2,244 yards with 21 touchdowns and six interceptions and completed 61.4 percent of his passes at Arizona Western in 2011.
- He also rushed for two scores and caught one TD as Arizona Western won a school-record 11 games.
- Coffman attended Raymore-Peculiar Senior High School in Peculiar, Mo., where he compiled 3,300 yards passing, 25 touchdowns and 14 interceptions as a senior and rushed for 680 yards and eight scores.
- Football is in the genes as his father, Paul, was a standout tight end at Kansas State University as well as the Green Bay Packers (1978-85) and the Kansas City Chiefs (1986-87).
- Paul was a teammate of IU safety Mark Murphy's father, Mark, with the Packers.
- Cameron's brother, Chase, played tight end at the University of Missouri (2005-08) and the Cincinnati Bengals (2009-10). He is currently a member of the Atlanta Falcons practice squad.
- · His brother, Carson, played quarterback at Kansas State University (2007-10).

SUDFELD COOL UNDER PRESSURE

Nate Sudfeld became just the third true freshman quarterback to play at Indiana at UMass and the following week he earned co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his performance against Ball State.

- Entering the game in the fourth guarter for the injured Cameron Coffman, Sudfeld finished 13-of-20 for 172 yards to go along with two touchdowns.
- Trailing 38-25 with 4:07 remaining, he connected with Cody Latimer from 70 yards out and later put the Hoosiers ahead 39-38 when he found **Shane Wynn** for a 2-yard score with 49 seconds left.
- Sudfeld guided IU on a six-play, 77-yard drive in just 53 seconds on that final drive. He went 4-of-6 for 36 yards and distributed the ball to four different receivers.
- Last year, Sudfeld was slinging it to the tune of 2,332 yards with 31 touchdowns (two rushing) and six interceptions at Modesto (Calif.) Christian High School.
- The 14th-rated quarterback nationally by ESPN.com set school single-season records in passing yards, passing TDs and passing yards per game (233.2).

THE NORTHWESTERN GAME - 4

- · Sudfeld's twin brothers, Matthew and Zach, also played college football. Matthew was a wide receiver at Brown University (2007-11) and Zach was a tight end at the University of Nevada (2007-11)
- Nate took a mission trip to Uganda as a 14-year old.

MR. ROBERSON'S NEIGHBORHOOD

Tre Roberson's season came to an end after he sustained a broken leg in the second quarter against Massachusetts in week two.

- In just over a guarter of work. Roberson rushed for 114 yards on five rushes, with 50- and 39-yard touchdown runs. He added 88 passing yards, including a 5-yard scoring strike.
- Roberson set career highs with 280 yards, 26 completions, 36 attempts, a 72.2 completion percentage and 299 total yards in the opener vs. Indiana State.
- He connected with **Shane Wynn** on a 71-yard touchdown strike, a career long, and also added a 1-yard TD run.
- Roberson became the first true freshman quarterback in IU history to start when he took the field at lowa in week eight last season.
- In 2011, Roberson was 81-of-142 (57.0) with 937 yards, three touchdowns and six interceptions to go along with 426 rushing yards on 109 carries (3.9) with two scores in nine games.
- In his first start last year, Roberson celebrated his 19th birthday by becoming the third Hoosier to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.
- His 426 rushing yards were second on Indiana and third among true freshman quarterbacks nationally.
- At Lawrence Central High School in Indianapolis, Roberson earned Indiana's 2010 Mr. Football Award.
- · His grandfather, Larry Highbaugh, played defensive back and ran track at IU from 1968-71.
- Highbaugh played briefly with the Dallas Cowboys, spent 13 years in the Canadian Football League and was inducted into the CFL Hall of Fame in 2004.

CODE BREAKER

After battling through an injury last season, which eventually forced him to miss the final three games, sophomore wide receiver Cody Latimer has a clean bill of health in 2012.

- Through three games, Latimer has surpassed his 2011 totals with a team-best 223 yards, 13 receptions (second) and two touchdowns (second).
- The Dayton, Ohio, native paces the Hoosiers with 15.9 yards per reception and an average of 74.3 yards per game, which ranks third in the Big Ten.
- He also shares ninth in the league with 4.67 catches
- Following back-to-back five-reception games to open the season, Latimer broke through with his first career 100-yard game against Ball State.
- · He pulled in four balls for 115 yards with two scores, his first career two-TD game, including a career-long
- · Latimer played in eight games with two starts last season. He finished the year with 12 catches for 141 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

GONE WITH THE WYNN

Shane Wynn produced one of the top seasons by a true freshman in school history in 2011. Wynn, who posted a 4.37 40-yard dash in the offseason, led the Hoosiers with 1,249 all-purpose yards, including 1,015 via kick return, 197 receiving and 37 rushing.

- In the 2012 season opener, Wynn recorded the top receiving game of his career with career highs of six receptions and 95 yards.
- · Wynn accounted for the Hoosiers first score of the year and his first career receiving touchdown when he brought home a 71-yard **Tre Roberson** pass.
- The TD marked IU's first 70-yard score since 2008.
- He added a 5-yard score at Massachusetts and a 2-yard touchdown vs. Ball State to push his teamleading total to three.
- Wynn also paces the team with 15 receptions, 5.0 per game (shares sixth in the Big Ten), and he is second with 145 yards.
- His 1,015 kick return yards in 2011 were an Indiana true freshman record, second on the single-season list (one yard short of first), fifth on the Big Ten's singleseason list, ninth on the school's career list and the sixth-most nationally (second among true freshmen).
- Wynn set an IU true freshman single-season allpurpose yardage mark and became just the third true freshman to lead the Hoosiers in all-purpose yards.
- The Cleveland native recorded eight games over the century mark in all-purpose yardage, including two 150-plus games and surpassed 100 kick return yards five times. Wynn averaged 104.1 all-purpose yards per game (eighth) and 123.4 in Big Ten games only (fifth).
- Wynn returned the opening kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown against Illinois. He became the first true freshman in IU history to collect a kickoff return TD and earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.
- The return was the fourth-longest in school history (three 100-yarders), the second-longest in the Big Ten and the 14th-longest nationally in 2011.
- Wynn finished the game with 148 kick return yards, an IU true freshman record and tied for the seventhbest single-game total in school history.

IT STARTS UP FRONT

Indiana has started four underclassmen along with a fifth-year senior across the offensive line in all three games this season.

- Fifth-year senior center Will Matte anchors the line. He started his first 32 career games at center before suffering an injury last season.
- Prior to the injury, he was the only offensive lineman to start every game from 2009-11. He has started 36 times in his career.
- Sophomores Bernard Taylor (left guard) and Peyton Eckert (right tackle) earned their first career starts as true freshmen in week three last year.
- Taylor started the rest of the season (10 overall) and earned a spot on the Yahoo Sports, BTN.com and ESPN.com Big Ten All-Freshman teams.
- He moved from the defensive line to offensive line during 2011 preseason camp and allowed only three sacks in 295 passing attempts.
- Eckert finished the year with six starts and appeared in eight games.
- Jason Spriggs became the first Indiana true freshman to start at left tackle since current St. Louis Rams left tackle Rodger Saffold in 2006.
- Dan Feeney joined his fellow true freshman, getting the nod at right guard.

NO PROBLEM WITH HOUSTON

Stephen Houston joined the Hoosiers in July of 2011 from Independence (Kan.) CC. The 228-pound running back appeared in each of the first four games before earning his first start in the Big Ten opener

against Penn State, and he remained in the starting lineup the rest of the way.

- In his eight starts, Houston recorded 711 rushing yards on 129 carries with seven scores, a 5.5 average and 88.9 yards per game.
- · After a slow start this season, Houston got back on track with his fourth career 100-yard game against Ball State. He gained 102 yards on just 12 carries (8.5 average) with a 13-yard touchdown and a long of 45.
- Following the BSU performance, Houston took over the team lead with 164 yards and three TDs. He is averaging 5.3 yards per carry (31 attempts).
- His 711 yards in 2011 were the most for a Hoosier in Big Ten action since 2003 (BenJarvus Green-Ellis - 784) and his seven touchdowns were the most since 2001 (Levron Williams - 16).
- Overall, Houston rushed for 802 yards on 151 attempts with eight touchdowns, 5.3 yards per carry and 66.8 yards per game in all 12 contests.
- His 802 yards were the most for a Hoosier since 2003 (Green-Ellis - 938) and his eight touchdowns were the most for a running back since 2002 (Yamar Washington - nine).
- He added 17 receptions for 164 yards and two kickoff returns for 13 yards to finish second on the team with 979 all-purpose vards (81.6 per game).
- Houston surpassed the century mark three times (at No. 4 Wisconsin - 135, Northwestern - 151 and Purdue - 129) and scored from 67 yards against the Badgers and from 52 vs. the Boilermakers.
- He has fumbled just once in his 182 career carries (207 touches) and has not fumbled in his last 144 attempts (161 touches).

GROUND GAINS

With three weeks in the books, the Indiana rushing attack has continued to build off its 2011 finish.

- . In its victory over UMass, the Hoosiers rushed for 331 yards, the second time the team has surpassed 300 yards in **Kevin Wilson's** tenure. IU collected 319 against Northwestern on Oct. 29, 2011.
- The 331 yards were the most for an Indiana team since a 338-yard effort vs. Akron on Sept. 15, 2007.
- IU has rushed for 637 yards, a 212.3 average per game, with seven touchdowns and a 4.8 average. The Hoosiers 212.3 average ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 31st nationally.
- Junior Stephen Houston leads a group featuring three backs each over 135 yards on the year. Houston owns 164 yards with a team-best three touchdowns and a 5.3 average.
- True freshman **Tevin Coleman** sits behind Houston with (146, 5.6) followed by sophomore D'Angelo Roberts (138, 3.8), Sophomore Isaiah Roundtree has 62 yards, one score and a 5.6 average.
- Dating back to last season, Indiana's running backs have lost just one fumble in 377 attempts.
- In their last nine games dating back to the 2011 season. IU has totaled 1.856 rushing vards, an average of 206.2 per game, with 18 touchdowns and a 4.7 average per carry (393 attempts).
- In 2011, the Hoosiers rushed for 1,374 yards in league play, the program's highest total since 2001, and posted 1,932 overall, the program's highest total since 2008.
- Indiana collected three straight 200-plus yard rushing games - at No. 4 Wisconsin (223), at Iowa (217) and against Northwestern - for the first time in league action since 2001.

IN HIS BACKYARD

- D'Angelo Roberts produced a record-setting career at Bloomington North High School. The hometown product played in 11 games as a true freshman in 2011.
- He received the second start of his career in the 2012 season opener vs. Indiana State and led the team with 67 yards and 22 carries (career high).
- Through the first three games, Roberts is third on the team with 138 yards and first with 36 attempts.
- Roberts rushed for 263 yards with four scores and a 4.4 average in 2011.
- He earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors and added his name to the Hoosier record book following the South Carolina State game.
- Roberts became the eighth IU true freshman and the first since BenJarvus Green-Ellis (vs. Purdue on Nov. 22, 2003) to go over 100 yards with 102.
- Most impressive is the fact that Roberts gained all 102 of his rushing yards in the second half alone.
- Roberts received 19 carries (5.4 average) and added a 7-yard score, the first of his career, with a long rush of 33 yards. He also made two catches for 12 yards.
- He rushed for 6,002 yards, the most in Monroe County history, and 75 TDs at Bloomington North.

BOLSER-ING THE OFFENSE

For the second straight season, junior tight end **Ted Bolser** is on the John Mackey Award Watch List. Bolser, who stepped up as one of the team's leaders this offseason, figures to be a fixture in new offensive coordinator Seth Littrell's offense.

- He is fourth on the team with nine catches and third with 107 yards, picking up first downs on seven of his grabs this season.
- Bolser broke out as a redshirt freshman in 2010, where he caught 27 passes for 407 yards with five touchdowns and an average of 15.1 yards per reception.
- He caught 14 passes for 165 yards with one touchdown and appeared in all 12 games last year.
- In 2010, Bolser set an IU tight end record, ranked first nationally among freshman tight ends and tied for seventh nationally among all tight ends in scores.
- Bolser posted Hoosier freshman tight end records in catches and yards, and he finished with the sixth-most yards all-time in a single season among IU tight ends.
- He was named to Rivals.com and Football Writers Association of America Freshman All-America teams.
- The Cincinnati native collected the most vards for an Indiana tight end since 1991 (Rod Coleman) and the most receptions since 1992 (Ross Hales).

JUST FOR KICKS

Mitch Ewald has put together an assault on Indiana's kicking records. The junior is IU's all-time career field goal percentage leader. He is 32-of-40 (80.0 percent) in his career and a perfect 76-of-76 on extra points.

- His percentage is tied for 12th among active kickers.
- Ewald's 32 field goals are seventh on IU's career list and his 76 extra points are sixth.
- The Naperville, III., native opened the scoring against Ball State with a 46-yarder, improving to 6-of-9 (66.7 percent) from 45-plus yards in his career.
- He also handles kickoff duties and has posted nine touchbacks, which ranks third in the Big Ten, on 19 kickoffs with a 63.4 average.
- Ewald is tied for third and eighth on the school's single-season field goals list and seventh on the school's single-season extra points list.

- In 16 career Big Ten games, Ewald is 20-of-23 (87.0) | from field goal range and 35-of-35 on extra points.
- For the second straight season he has earned a spot on the Lou Groza Award Watch List after going 13-of-16 (one blocked) from field goal range (81.2 percent) and 30-of-30 on extra points last season.
- As a redshirt freshman in 2010, the Naperville, III., product hit 16-of-19 field goals (84.2 percent) and all 33 extra points.
- His 16 field goals tied an Indiana freshman record.
- Ewald forced overtime with a 26-varder and hit the game-winner from 31 yards in the team's Old Oaken Bucket victory at Purdue.

DON'T SLEEP ON STONER

Nick Stoner showcased his speed and why he is always in the conversation as one of the fastest Hoosiers during the 2012 track season.

- Stoner was a member of Indiana's indoor (Big Ten champions) and outdoor track and field teams.
- As a carry on the 4x400m relay, he helped clinch IU's first Big Ten title in indoor track and field since 1992.
- He earned All-America honors as a member of the 4x400m relay, taking eighth at the NCAA Championships.
- During the outdoor season. Stoner collected All-Big Ten honors, finishing second in the 4x100m relay and third in the 4x400m relay at the Big Ten Championships.
- He qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 4x100m and 4x400m relays, advancing to the semifinals in the 4x400m.
- Stoner has six catches for 42 yards this season, and he has returned three punts for 39 yards.
- As a true freshman, Stoner started 2011 at cornerback before moving to wide receiver in week 11.
- The Greenwood, Ind., native played in all 12 games and made six tackles, returned six kicks for 120 yards and had one punt return for 10 yards.

PROTECT THE QB & THE BALL

In its first three games, Indiana has allowed one sack per 26.2 pass attempts and committed just one turnover (interception), which is tied for the fewest in the country.

- · Last season, the Hoosiers allowed 31 sacks (one every 12.2 attempts), threw 11 interceptions and lost seven fumbles
- In the season opener against Indiana State, IU did not allow a sack. Indiana surrendered at least one sack in each of its 12 games in 2011.
- The Hoosiers did not commit a turnover against ISU and once again in week three against Ball State, something they did twice all of last year.
- IU won the turnover battle against the Sycamores. something they did just four times last year.

DEFENSIVE STOPS

The Hoosiers held one opponent under 20 points last season. In its first two wins in 2012, IU surrendered 17 points to Indiana State and six points to UMass.

Indiana last held an opponent in single digits back in 2008, a 45-3 victory over Murray State (Sept. 6). The Hoosiers also held the Minutemen to 78 yards on the ground, the first time they held an opponent under the century mark since Nov. 27, 2010 (at Purdue, 58).

INTERIOR THREAT

Defensive tackles Adam Replogle, Larry Black, Jr., and Nicholas Sliger make up Indiana's most experienced group. They represent three of the team's eight seniors and have played together in 37 of Indiana's 39 games since the start of the 2009 season.

- Replogle and Black have started alongside each other 31 times, including the last 15 games.
- The duo has played in each of IU's 39 games since the start of 2009, with Replogle starting the last 38 at tackle or end and Black starting 31 times.
- In the 2012 opener, they combined for three sacks with Black collecting his first career multi-sack game. Black added two TFLs at UMass to push his teamleading total to four, which shares fifth in the Big Ten.
- Replogle is second on the team with 18 tackles and has 1.5 sacks. He has recorded at least five tackles in each of the first three games (six, five and seven).
- · Sliger has only missed two games, including the 2012 season opener, and appeared in 37 since the beginning of 2009.
- Replogle leads all Hoosier defenders with 131 tackles and 11.5 sacks in his career. He only trails Black with 17 tackles for loss.
- The Centerville, Ohio, native was elected a team captain, earned All-District V honors (second straight year), was a finalist for the ARA Sportsmanship Award and collected Academic All-Big Ten honors (second straight year) in 2011.
- Replogle led the team with four sacks, finished second with seven TFLs and led all linemen with 49 stops.
- Black owns six sacks and 100 tackles to go along with his team-high 19.5 career tackles for loss.
- The Cincinnati product collected 5.5 TFLs, 47 stops and 1.5 sacks one year ago.
- Sliger set career highs with 25 tackles and added 1.5 tackles for loss and his first career forced fumble last season. The Cicero, Ind., native has 45 career stops and four TFLs.

YES, HE-BAN!

Defensive back Greg Heban started his IU career as a pitcher for head coach Tracy Smith's baseball team. After dominating the 2009 intramural flag football season, Smith urged Heban to give football, one of three sports he played at Delta High School in Muncie, Ind., along with basketball and baseball, another shot.

Heban arrived at preseason camp in 2010, made the team, worked his way up the depth chart and eventually started four of the team's final five games at cornerback and played in all 12 contests.

- Head coach Kevin Wilson awarded the now junior defensive back a scholarship prior to the 2011 season.
- Heban started all 12 games at cornerback in 2011 and led the team with two interceptions. He shared the top spot with six pass breakups and finished third with 62 tackles.
- This season, Heban has moved inside as a nickel back, where he has started the last two games and shares the team lead with four pass breakups, is tied for fourth with 14 tackles and owns 1.5 tackles for loss.
- He was named the team's defensive player of the week against Ball State after he posted eight tackles, one TFL and two PBUs.

2012 INDIANA FOOTBALL

THE NORTHWESTERN GAME - 7

- . In 2011, he was named IU's Special Ops Player of the Year and was awarded the team's Academic Excellence Award following the 2011 campaign.
- · The Muncie, Ind., native also earned Academic All-District V honors and Academic All-Big Ten recognition (second straight year) last year.
- · Despite being just 6-foot-1, he can dunk a basketball from standing flat-footed and can throw 90 mph, as he pitched 1 1/3 innings for the 2010 IU baseball team.

HANGING WITH MR. COOPER

Looking to strengthen the team's linebacking unit, the Hoosiers coaching staff uncovered its starting linebacker from Coffeyville (Kan.) Community College in **David Cooper**.

- Cooper redshirted the 2010 season at Coffeyville before a big 2011 campaign, which saw him collect 102 tackles, two sacks, 13 tackles for loss, three fumble recoveries, one interception and one forced fumble.
- The 6-1, 225-pounder enrolled at Indiana in the spring, where he immediately found himself starting in the middle during spring drills.
- · Cooper has started at linebacker the first three games this season and he leads the team with 20 tackles to go along with two tackles for loss.
- He made seven tackles with one TFL in his Hoosier debut against Indiana State and followed that effort up with an eight-tackle performance at UMass.
- · A native of Lilburn, Ga., Cooper attended Brookwood High School before heading to Coffeyville.

ON THE MARK

Safety Mark Murphy earned a spot on the Yahoo Sports, BTN.com and ESPN.com Big Ten All-Freshman teams last season. Murphy led all Big Ten true freshmen with 76 tackles, the most for a Hoosier true freshman since 2003 (Will Meyers - 83).

- He picked up right where he left off, sharing second on the team with seven tackles, six solo, in the 2012 opener and is tied for fourth on the team with 14 stops.
- · The Akron, Ohio, native started the 2011 season working with the safeties, joined the linebackers before game three and returned to safety prior to game seven, where he remained the rest of the season.
- Murphy played in all 12 games, started three times at weak-side linebacker and the final six at safety.
- · He finished second on the team with 76 tackles and led the way with 44 solos to go along with one tackle for loss, one interception and four pass breakups.
- In Big Ten play, Murphy paced the Hoosiers by 13 tackles with 62 stops, including a team-best 35 solos.
- · He collected double-digit tackles three times, including a career-high 13 stops against Purdue, and recorded at least eight tackles on five occasions.
- Murphy intercepted his first pass and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown at North Texas, becoming the first true freshman since Tracy Porter (2004) to do so.
- Murphy's father, Mark, played safety for the Green Bay Packers from 1980-91 and was enshrined into the Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame in 1998.

MULLEN MUSCLES WAY INTO LINEUP

The defensive coaching staff recognized cornerback Kenny Mullen as one of the most improved members of the defense in the offseason.

- Mullen gained 14 pounds of muscle and earned a starting spot after serving as a nickel back in 2011.
- The Fort Wayne, Ind., native has started all three games this season and is third on the team with 15

tackles, 14 solo (first), to go along with two tackles for loss (tied for second) and two pass breakups.

- He boasted a team-leading eight stops, seven solo, with his two TFLs and one PBU in IU's win at UMass.
- Mullen appeared in all 12 games and started twice last season. He finished the season with 18 tackles, 13 solo, two sacks and one pass breakup.
- · At Bishop Luers High School, Mullen was a part of the 2007, 2009 and 2010 state champions.
- The four-year football and basketball letterwinner was also a member of the 2008 and 2009 state champion basketball teams.

CUT TO THE CHASE

As a redshirt freshman in 2011, linebacker Chase **Hoobler** earned accolades from Yahoo Sports and BTN.com's Big Ten All-Freshman Teams last season.

- Hoobler finished the year with 48 tackles, 23 solo, two sacks, five tackles for loss and one forced fumble.
- He started eight games, including six times in the Big Ten, and played in all 12 contests.
- The Orrville, Ohio, native started the 2012 season opener at weak-side linebacker and shared second on the team with seven tackles. He also carded his third career sack.
- Hoobler came on strong at the end of the 2011 campaign. In Big Ten play, he made 36 of his tackles, both of his sacks, four of his TFLs and recovered his fumble.

JUNIOR COLLEGE ADDITIONS

The Hoosiers added eight junior college transfers this season, including quarterback Cameron Coffman (Arizona Western C.C.), defensive end Justin Rayside (Riverside [Calif.] C.C.), linebackers Jacarri Alexander (lowa Central C.C.) and David Cooper (Coffeyville [Kan.] C.C.) and defensive backs Tim Bennett (Ellsworth [lowa] C.C.), Antonio Marshall (Georgia Military College), Ryan Thompson (Itawamba [Miss.] C.C.) and Tregg Waters (Glendale [Ariz.] C.C.).

Coffman, Alexander, Cooper, Rayside, Thompson and Waters enrolled in the spring, while Bennett and Marshall joined the team at the start of camp.

NEW TURF, NEW PRACTICE SCHEDULE

Continuing to enhance the football program's facilities, a brand new FieldTurf Revolution surface replaced the East grass field at the football practice facility prior to preseason camp.

Indiana took advantage of the surface and also implemented a new practice schedule. The team now practices in the morning and is off the field at 11 a.m. every day.

Head coach **Kevin Wilson** explained the schedule change: "We were practicing too late, then study hall/ academics was starting too late. We're hoping going in the morning will get the academics going in the afternoon and get more of a normal biological clock. Physically, when practice is over, we're done. The players might get back over later and watch a little tape, but they're done physically. Their football day is over and now they're students."

INSIDE IU FOOTBALL WITH KEVIN WILSON

- One of the most innovative and prolific offensive minds in the country, Kevin Wilson was named Indiana University's 28th head football coach on Dec. 7, 2010.
- Spent the 2002-10 seasons at the University of Oklahoma. He served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10.
- Led some of the most productive offenses in the history of college football, coached in 10 consecutive bowl games and made seven BCS bowl appearances, including three national championship games (2003, '04, '08).
- OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.

- · As position coach, Wilson tutored three first-round draft picks (Jermaine Gresham, TE - 2010, Davin Joseph, OL - 2006 and Jammal Brown, OL - 2005), a second-round pick (Chris Chester, OL - 2005), a fifth-round pick (Brody Eldridge, TE - 2010), a sixth-round pick (Wes Sims, OL - 2004) and six free agents at Oklahoma.
- Indiana played 32 freshmen last season, the highest total in the country. Linebacker Chase Hoobler, safety Mark Murphy and offensive lineman Bernard Taylor each collected freshman postseason honors.
- · Murphy and Taylor secured spots on the Yahoo Sports, BTN.com and ESPN.com Big Ten All-Freshman teams, while Hoobler earned accolades from Yahoo Sports and BTN.com.
- The Hoosiers excelled in the classroom as well. A school record 24 football student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, 37 posted 3.0 grade point averages in the fall and 36 currently hold cumulative 3.0 GPAs.
- In 2010, the Sooners earned a 48-20 victory over Connecticut in the Fiesta Bowl and also claimed the seventh Big 12 championship in school history.
- During the 2010 campaign, running back DeMarco Murray set the school record for career touchdowns and also broke the OU mark for career all-purpose yards.
- Guided wide receiver Ryan Broyles to eight Sooner receiving records, including career marks for receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns. Broyles led the nation with 131 receptions in 2010.
- His 2008 offense shattered NCAA records by scoring 60 or more points in five straight games and 716 total points for the entire season to average more than 51 points per contest.
- The 2008 team played in the BCS National Championship Game behind Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Sam Bradford.
- In 2008, Bradford passed for 4,720 yards and 50 touchdowns, Chris Brown and DeMarco Murray both rushed

for over 1,000 yards, Juaquin Iglesias recorded 1,150 yards (74 catches) and Jermaine Gresham added 950 yards (66).

- Bradford ranked No. 1 nationally in passing efficiency as a freshman and sophomore, as he threw for more touchdowns (86) in two seasons than anyone in NCAA history.
- In the 2010 NFL Draft, Bradford was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the St. Louis Rams. He captured the 2010 Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honor.
- Three of Wilson's tight ends, Jermaine Gresham, Brody Eldridge and Joe Jon Finley, earned All-Big 12 honors (2007).
- Wilson was also instrumental in the development of Adrian Peterson. Peterson rushed for 1,925 yards in his freshman campaign (2004), which set an OU single-season record and marked the highest total for a freshman in NCAA history.
- Peterson went on to place second in the Heisman voting, the highest finish ever by a freshman. He was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings as the seventh pick in the 2007 NFL Draft, where he was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year.
- Prior to his stint in Norman, Wilson was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Northwestern University in 2001 after serving as offensive coordinator in 1999 and 2000. He worked with the quarterbacks during his time in Evanston.
- Helped NU to the 2000 Alamo Bowl and quarterback Zac Kustok, a Unitas Award finalist, led the Big Ten in total offense.
- Running back Damian Anderson earned All-America honors and became the sixth-best rusher in Big Ten history.
- · Followed Randy Walker to Northwestern from Miami University after spending nine years in Oxford, coaching alongside former Indiana head coach Terry Hoeppner.
- · Served as offensive line coach for his first two years at Miami and was promoted to offensive coordinator for the next seven, spending 1992-1997 in charge of the offensive line and the 1998 season with the quarterbacks.
- His offenses produced outstanding running backs, including Travis Prentice and Indiana running backs coach Deland McCullough.
- Prentice became the NCAA all-time leading scorer and the fifth-most prolific rusher in NCAA history, breaking McCullough's school records in the process.
- Wilson was the head coach and athletic director at Foard High School in North Carolina during the 1989 campaign and the offensive coordinator at North Carolina A&T in 1988.
- Spent a year as the offensive line coach at Winston Salem State in 1987. Wilson began his career in coaching as a student and graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina.
- A walk-on offensive lineman at North Carolina, Wilson earned a scholarship while playing in four bowl games - the 1980 Bluebonnet, the 1981 Gator, the 1982 Sun and the 1983 Peach Bowls.
- Earned his bachelor's degree in education (1984) and his master's degree in physical education (1987).

DON FISCHER

This marks the 40th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-byplay "voice" of Indiana University football men's basketball games. 25 The past years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the

Indiana University Radio Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 18 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts.

During his 39 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 26 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 22 times, including the last three seasons, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by IU with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast more than 1,600 Indiana University games - a total that includes eight bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, III., Fischer has been in the radio business for 44 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, III.; Springfield, III.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and nine grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoined the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator in 2010. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, reunited with the Voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-game and halftime).

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory.

After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From

1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a school-record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 30th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his

POST-GAME NOTES

- Indiana's first points of the season came courtesy of sophomore wide receiver **Shane** Wynn when he pulled in a 71-yard touchdown reception from sophomore quarterback Tre Roberson. It marked Wynn's first career TD reception and Roberson's career-long scoring strike. It was also the longest snare of Wynn's career.
- · Wynn finished the game with career highs of six receptions and 95 yards. He added four rushing yards for a total of 99 all-purpose yards.
- The last time IU scored on a 70-yard reception came back on Oct. 4, 2008. Quarterback Ben Chappell connected with Marcus Thigpen from 77 yards out.
- · Roberson finished with a career-high 280 yards passing with one touchdown. He connected on 26-of-36 (72.2 percent), including completions to 10 different receivers. Roberson added 19 yards rushing for a career-high total of 299 yards total offense.
- The Indianapolis native extended the IU lead to 24-10 with a 1-yard rushing score in the third quarter. He now has three career rushing scores. Roberson has thrown for and rushed for at least one score in the same game twice in his career (Oct. 29, 2011 - Northwestern).
- The Hoosiers ran for 171 yards in the game on 47 carries. Indiana has averaged more than 161 yards rushing per game in the Kevin Wilson era.
- Sophomore D'Angelo Roberts finished with a team-high 67 yards on a career-high 22 carries. True freshman Tevin Coleman had 48 yards on seven carries, junior Stephen **Houston** had 34 yards on 10 carries and Roberson added 19 yards on seven carries.
- Houston made the most out of his first carry of the season, breaking free for a 15-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. The junior has crossed the goal line nine times in
- Sophomore safety **Drew Hardin** paced IU with eight tackles, making three solo stops. He also teamed with junior linebacker Griffen Dahlstrom to create Indiana's first turnover of the season. Dahlstrom forced his first career fumble, which was recovered by Hardin (also the first of his career).
- Dahlstrom also came up with his first career sack with 2:58 left to play, Indiana's fifth of the game.
- Sophomore linebacker Chase Hoobler recorded Indiana's first sack of the season (10 vards) and the third of his career. He finished with seven tackles, five solo.
- Fifth-year defensive tackle Larry Black, Jr., notched his first career multi-sack game. He recorded one in the first and fourth quarters to push his career total to six.
- Adam Replogle picked up Indiana's third sack of the game. The senior defensive tackle leads all Hoosier defenders with 11 career sacks. Replogle finished with six tackles, four
- The Hoosiers had five sacks and seven tackles for loss in the game. The team totaled five-or-more sacks only once in 2011, with six against Ohio State on November 5, 2011. IU had seven-or-more tackles for loss three times in 2011 (7 vs. Penn State on Oct. 1, 9 vs. Ohio State and 7 vs. Purdue on Nov. 26).
- In his first career start, sophomore cornerback **Brian Williams** came up huge. Williams stepped in front of a Mike Perish pass and snared his first career interception to stop an Indiana State drive at the Hoosiers 31-yard line with 9:27 left.

POST-GAME NOTES

- Indiana totaled 606 yards of offense, marking the first time IU had surpassed 600 offensive yards since Oct. 6, 2001, at Wisconsin (631 yards).
- As a team, Indiana rushed for 331 yards on the ground, which marked the first time IU had 300 rushing yards since Oct. 29, 2011, against Northwestern (319 yards).
- Indiana opened up a 21-6 lead after one quarter. The Hoosiers last scored 21 points in a quarter vs. South Carolina State on Sept. 17, 2011 (21 points).
- Indiana had eight players rush the ball during the game.
- The Hoosiers had 11 players catch passes on the day.
- Quarterback **Tre Roberson** scored his fourth career touchdown when he ran 50 yards for his first score of the game to put the Hoosiers up 7-0. That run was the longest TD run for a Hoosier quarterback since Kellen Lewis scored from 75 yards out vs. Western Kentucky on Aug. 30, 2008.
- Roberson later scored on a 39-yard TD run at the 10:24 mark of the first quarter for his second rushing score of the day. The two rushing touchdowns are a new career singlegame mark for Roberson.
- Roberson finished the game with 114 rushing yards, his highest total on the ground since running for 121 yards against Northwestern on Oct. 29, 2011. He also went 7-for-14 through the air for 88 yards and a touchdown pass.
- True freshman running back **Tevin Coleman** set career marks rushing for 86 yards on 14 carries, averaging 6.1 yards per attempt.
- Running back **Isaiah Roundtree** saw his first action as a Hoosier, running for 62 yards on 10 carries, which averaged to 6.2 yards per run. The sophomore also added his first career touchdown in the third quarter.
- With Indiana holding a 38-6 lead at halftime, it marked the highest point total in a half for the Hoosiers since Sept. 2, 2010 (38 vs. Towson, first half).
- In his first two drives playing quarterback for Indiana, Cameron Coffman went 8-for-11 for 92 yards as both ended in touchdowns.
- Mitch Ewald kicked his 72nd career PAT on IU's final touchdown drive. That total puts Ewald alone in sixth place all-time in school history in the extra points department.
- Sophomore cornerback **Kenny Mullen** and sophomore linebacker **David Cooper** both set career highs in tackles as both defenders finished the game with eight tackles.
- Sophomore Cody Latimer led the Hoosiers in receiving with a career-high 68 yards on five catches
- Coffman connected with Charles Love III for a 12-yard score early in the fourth quarter, marking the first career TD pass for Coffman and first career TD catch for Love III.
- Coffman paced the Hoosiers passing attack, completing 16-of-22 for 159 yards and a touchdown. He finished with a completion percentage of 72.7.
- Sophomore defensive back **Tim Bennett** recorded his first career sack for an 11-yard loss midway through the fourth quarter.
- Sophomore defensive end Ryan Phillis tallied the first sack of his career for a six-yard loss during the third quarter.
- Indiana's 45 points are the most scored in a single game for the Hoosiers since scoring 51 against Towson on Sept. 2, 2010.
- · UMass won the coin toss and elected to defer.
- Sophomore wide receiver **Nick Stoner** and true freshman running back Tevin Coleman made their first career starts.

POST-GAME NOTES

- Indiana gained 558 yards of total offense in the game (423 passing, 135 rushing), marking the second straight game the Hoosiers have gone over 500 yards (606 vs. Massachusetts).
- It is the first time Indiana has had back-to-back games with 500-or-more total yards since the 2006 Purdue game (505) and the opener in 2007 against Indiana State (516) and just the sixth time in school history.
- Sophomore Cameron Coffman made the first start of his career. He finished with 251 yards on 24-of-35 passing with two touchdowns.
- Stephen Houston scored the Hoosiers first TD of the night and his third of the season from 13 yards out. He now has 11 touchdowns in his career.
- The junior capped a five-play, 75-yard scoring drive that took just 1:27. Houston finished with 102 yards on 12 rushes, marking his fourth career 100-yard game.
- Junior wide receiver Kofi Hughes caught Coffman's first TD, a 9-yard reception at the 13:30 mark in the second quarter. It was his first scoring grab this season and the fourth
- Sophomore Cody Latimer hauled in his first touchdown of the season from three yards out right before halftime. The drive covered 78 yards in 15 plays and 4:30.
- True freshman Nate Sudfeld connected with Latimer for a 70-yard score with 4:07 to play, making it a six-point game. The touchdown was the first of Sudfeld's career. It is the second 70-yard pass play of the season for Indiana, as **Tre Roberson** connected with **Shane Wynn** for 71 yards against Indiana State.
- Latimer finished with 115 yards receiving and his first two-touchdown game. It marked the first 100-yard performance by an Indiana receiver since Kofi Hughes had 147 against
- Sudfeld led IU on a six-play, 77-yard drive over 53 seconds, capped by a 2-yard touchdown pass to Shane Wynn, putting Indiana up 39-38 with 49 seconds to play. The drive was the second of the game and fifth of the season to cover 75 yards in less than 1:30 and all five drives have been of six or fewer plays.
- · Wynn's touchdown is his third of the season and of his career.
- The Hoosiers took a 25-24 lead into the locker room when Houston converted the two-point attempt following Latimer's score. It was IU's first two-point conversion since Roberson connected with Wynn in last season's Old Oaken Bucket game (Nov. 26).
- Indiana's all-time career field goal percentage leader Mitch Ewald boosted his total. He opened the Hoosiers scoring with a 46-yarder in the first guarter. The junior is now 32-of-40 (80.0 percent) in his career and 6-of-9 (66.7) from 45-plus yards. Ewald also made all four of his extra point attempts in the game, moving his career total to a perfect 76-for-76.
- Junior defensive back Greg Heban led the Hoosiers with eight tackles, seven solo, and one went for a loss. He added two pass breakups as well.
- Sophomore cornerback Brian Williams had career highs with seven tackles, all solos, and three pass breakups.
- Senor defensive tackle **Adam Replogle** added a season-high seven tackles, three solo. Sophomore linebacker David Cooper and junior linebacker Griffen Dahlstrom combined for a tackle for loss.
- Fifth-year senior center Will Matte and Adam Replogle served as Indiana's game captains for the third time in as many games this season.
- Ball State won the coin toss and deferred to the second half. Indiana is 1-1 when receiving the ball first this season.
