SETTING THE SCENE

- Following its 73-35 victory over Indiana State, the Indiana football team welcomes Navy to Memorial Stadium on Saturday for the first time since 1986. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. EDT and BTN will broadcast the game.
- IU and Navy will meet for the fourth time overall, the second straight season and the third time in Bloomington.
- The Hoosiers won the previous two home meetings in 1985 (38-35) and 1986 (52-29), while the Midshipmen earned a 31-30 victory in Annapolis on Oct. 20, 2012.
- Navy is the only service academy IU has ever faced.

THE COACHES

- Kevin Wilson is in his third season as head coach at Indiana. Wilson spent the 2002-10 seasons at Oklahoma, where he served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10.
- Ken Niumatalolo is 40-26 (.606) in his sixth season as head coach at Navy. Niumatalolo's 40 wins are the most in school history by a head coach in his first five years.

NEWS & NOTES

- Indiana's 73 points against Indiana State are the second-most in school history, behind only a 76-0 victory over Franklin College in 1901.
- The Hoosiers posted 319 yards passing and 313 yards rushing, marking the first time in program history the team has gained 300-plus yards through the air and on the ground in the same game.
- IU's 632 yards of total offense are the third-most in program history.
- Indiana's 10 touchdowns are the most on record, with statistics available since 1949.
- The Hoosiers 45 points in the first half are the most on record.
- IU averaged 61 seconds on its nine TD drives through the first three quarters.
- The game produced Memorial Stadium records for points scored by a team (73), combined points scored (108), total yards (632) and touchdowns (10).
- Indiana's defense picked off one pass, recovered one fumble, recorded four sacks and seven tackles for loss, and forced the Sycamores into 10 three-and-outs.
- Shane Wynn had three touches that all resulted in touchdowns. Wynn is the first Hoosier to catch a pair of TDs and return a punt for six points since Rob Turner in 1990 against Missouri.
- Wynn is the first IU player to record at least one kick return, punt return and receiving TD in his career.
- **Tevin Coleman** posted a career-best 169 rushing yards on 14 carries (12.1 average) with two touchdowns. His 169 yards were the most for a running back in a season opener since Alex Smith in 1996 (174 vs. Toledo).

Indiana head coach Kevin Wilson will hold his weekly press conference every Monday during the regular season at 11 a.m. ET in the Henke Hall of Champions.

The Indiana locker room is closed at all times. A media relations staffer will collect all player requests in the press box midway through the fourth quarter. Requested players will be available in the weight room of the North End Zone complex immediately following head coach **Kevin Wilson's** post-game press conference.

Wilson will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone facility following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.

Working credentials for the 2013 Indiana football season must be requested via the web. To request credentials visit IUHoosiers.com and click on the media services link under "Athletics." A link to apply for football credentials will be at the top of the page.

Credentials will be mailed to the address provided. To guarantee that your credential is mailed to you, your request should be made 10 days prior to the game. All requests made during the week of the game will be held at media will call, which is located at ticket booth No. 3 located on the West side of Memorial Stadium and opens four hours prior to kickoff.

EXPERIENCED YOUTH

Indiana returns 52 letterwinners and 384 career starts, which is tied for the sixth-most nationally.

- · Despite that total, IU only has 10 seniors, which is the fourth fewest number in the county.
- · The Hoosiers played eight true freshmen in their season-opening victory, including TE Danny Friend and RB Laray Smith on offense, and DT Darius Latham, DE David Kenney, LBs T.J. Simmons, Clyde Newton and Marcus Oliver, and S Antonio Allen on defense, and 13 redshirt freshmen.
- Indiana played 16 true freshmen in 2011, tied for the third-most in the country.
- Additionally, 16 redshirt freshmen saw action. The 32 total freshmen were the highest total in the nation.
- IU played 11 true freshmen and five redshirt freshmen in 2012.
- In 2012, 24 of the 35 starters were underclassmen - 13 on offense and 11 on defense - including 21 sophomores, one redshirt freshman and two true freshmen.

INSIDE THE OFFENSE

Offensively, the Hoosiers returned 10 starters from 2012, 24 letterwinners and 193 career starts, which ranked as the fifth-highest total nationally. This week's depth chart features four seniors, 10 juniors, eight sophomores and four freshmen, including one true freshman.

QUICK STRIKES

The Hoosiers offense lit up the scoreboard and did so quickly in 2012 and picked up right where they left off in the season opener:

- IU averaged 61 seconds on its first nine touchdown drives and 75 seconds on its 11 scoring drives.
- Indiana had five TD drives under 60 seconds (:51) :51, :07, :57, :43), and two more under 90 seconds (:61, :67). All seven drives took four plays or fewer.
- The Hoosiers ran one play every 23.1 seconds.
- In 2012, IU had 12 TD drives under 60 seconds, 23 TD drives under 90 seconds, 11 of which covered at least 70 yards in six-or-fewer plays. Indiana also had 17 TD drives of five plays or fewer.
- The Hoosiers ran one play every 20.3 seconds.
- Thirty-seven of Indiana's final 44 scoring drives (29 TDs) and 44 overall (34 TDs) took three minutes or less.

RETURNING YARDS

Indiana fielded the youngest team in the country in 2012. Here is what returned:

- 1,595 of 1,570 rushing yards (101.6%)
- 5,329 of 5,304 total yards (100.5)
- all of IU's 21 rushing TDs (100.0)
- all of IU's 331 completions, 3,734 passing yards and 24 passing TDs (100.0)
- 394 of 399 rushing attempts (98.8)
- 960 of 973 kick return yards (98.7)
- 363 of 369 points (98.4)
- 6,285 of 6,473 all-purpose yards (97.1)
- 23 of 24 receiving TDs (95.8)
- 3,549 of 3,734 receiving yards (95.1)
- 308 of 331 receptions (93.1)

LET'S TALK OFFENSE

In his first season as offensive coordinator in 2012, Seth Littrell brought an aerial assault to Bloomington.

• The Hoosiers led the Big Ten in passing offense (311.2), which ranked 17th nationally. They finished second in total offense (442.0) and fourth in scoring offense (30.8) in conference play.

- Indiana set program records for passing yardage (3,734), total offense (5,304), completions (331), attempts (540) and total plays (939).
- IU improved by 9.4 points (15th most improved in FBS) and 111.8 passing yards per game (3rd) and threw 14 more TD passes (T-9th) vs. 2011.
- The Hoosiers made significant strides in several categories from 2011 (2012 listed first):
- Points: 30.8 21.4
- Passing Yards: 311.2 199.4
- Total Yards: 442.0 360.4
- Completion %: 61.3 55.8
- Plays: 78.3 72.5
- Indiana had 24 passing touchdowns, which tied for second in the Big Ten, after throwing just 10 in all of 2011, and it had 46 total touchdowns after recording just 31 in 2011.
- IU had 31 70-plus yard scoring drives in 2012 after totaling just 18 in 2011.
- Despite trailing its opponents in time of possession (26:31-33:29), the Hoosier led their opponents in plays per game (78.3-75.8) and was nearly even in first downs per game (22.8-24.0).

COUNTING ON COLEMAN

As a true freshman in 2012. Tevin Coleman provided the Hoosiers a strong 1-2 running back punch alongside Stephen Houston. The coaching staff is expecting more in 2013, and Coleman delivered in the season opener against Indiana State.

- Coleman set career-bests with 14 carries (tied), 169 yards, two touchdowns, a 12.1 average and 212 allpurpose yards (43 kick return).
- He carded a 34-vard TD in the first, a 20-vard TD in the third and added a career-long 58-yarder in the third.
- · Coleman's 169 yards were the most for an IU running back in a season opener since Alex Smith in 1996 (174 vs. Toledo).
- In 2012, Coleman rushed for 225 yards on 51 rushes (4.4 average) with one score and finished third on the team with 840 all-purpose yards and 70.0 per game.
- He led the team with 566 yards on 24 kick returns with a 96-yard touchdown. His 23.6 average ranked third in the Big Ten.
- · At Northwestern, Coleman returned three kicks for 138 yards (46.0) with the 96-yard TD. He joined teammate **Shane Wynn** (2011) as the only two IU true freshmen to deliver a kick return touchdown.
- Coleman played at Oak Forest (III.) High School, where he was named the Pepsi-Cola/Southtown Star, the South Suburban Conference and the Daily Southtown Player of the Year in 2011.

GONE WITH THE WYNN

With his 58-yard punt return touchdown in the season opener against Indiana State, junior Shane Wynn became the first player in school history and the sixth active FBS player with punt return (one), kick return (one) and receiving (eight) TDs in his career.

- Wynn scored all three times he touched the ball, as he added 43- and 3-vard touchdown receptions.
- In 2012, Wynn finished with a team-high 68 receptions, which ranks fourth on Indiana's singleseason list, for 660 yards (second on the team) and six touchdowns (tied for first on the team).
- He added 180 yards on eight kick returns and was second on the team with 863 all-purpose yards. Wynn's 1,195 kick return yards are seventh on IU's career list.
- The Cleveland native finished second in the Big Ten in receptions per game (5.7), tied for fourth in receiving TDs and eighth in yards per game (55.0).

- · Wynn led the team in catches seven times and in vardage five times and hauled in eight 20-yard receptions, including three over 50 (76-TD, 71-TD, 52).
- · He recorded his first career 100-yard game and reached 70 yards six times. Wynn caught 12 passes twice, which shared the Big Ten mark for the most in a single game in 2012 and is tied for fifth on Indiana's single-game list.
- The 5-7, 170-pounder set career-highs with 12 grabs for 108 yards at Penn State. He also added 12 receptions for 70 yards and a score vs. Michigan State.
- His 1,015 kick return yards in 2011 were an Indiana true freshman record, second on the single-season list (one yard short of first), fifth on the Big Ten's singleseason list, ninth on the school's career list and the sixth-most nationally (second among true freshmen).
- · Wynn set an IU true freshman single-season allpurpose vardage mark and became just the third true freshman to lead the Hoosiers in all-purpose yards.

BOLSER-ING THE OFFENSE

For the third straight season, fifth-year senior tight end Ted Bolser is on the John Mackey Award Watch List. Bolser, who stepped up as one of the team's leaders last season, is a fixture in offensive coordinator Seth Littrell's offense.

- · Bolser picked up right here he left off in 2012 against Indiana State, where he posted a career-high-tying six catches for 78 yards and two touchdowns.
- The Cincinnati native scored twice for the second time in his career. He has 11 TDs overall, extending his IU tight end record, and he has found the end zone first to open two seasons (2010, 2013).
- Bolser became the third tight end in school history and the 36th player overall to reach 1,000 career receiving yards, joining Bob Stephenson (1,252 from 1978-81) and Dave Lilja (1,045 from 1984-86).
- · He now has 1,095 yards (31st all-time), the record 11 touchdowns and 88 receptions, which is second to Stephenson (115).
- Bolser finished fourth on the team with 41 receptions and 445 yards, both career-highs, and three TDs (tied for fourth) in 2012. He picked up first downs or scores on 27 of his 41 grabs (65.9 percent).
- The Indian Hill H.S. graduate sat second in the Big Ten and 15th nationally among tight ends in catches and third in the Big Ten in yardage.
- Bolser's receptions and vardage rank third on IU's tight end single-season list.
- He matched a career-high with six receptions against lowa and set a career mark with 82 yards.
- In 2010, Bolser broke out as a redshirt freshman, where he caught 27 passes for 407 yards with five touchdowns and an average of 15.1 yards per reception.
- · He set an Indiana tight end record, ranked first nationally among freshman tight ends and tied for seventh nationally among all tight ends in scores.
- · Bolser posted Hoosier freshman tight end records in catches and yards, and he finished with the sixth-most yards all-time in a single season among IU tight ends.
- · He was named to Rivals.com and Football Writers Association of America Freshman All-America teams.
- The 6-6, 252-pounder collected the most yards for an Indiana tight end since 1991 (Rod Coleman) and the most receptions since 1992 (Ross Hales).

MR. ROBERSON'S NEIGHBORHOOD

Tre Roberson's 2012 season came to an end after he sustained a broken leg, for which he received a medical redshirt, in the second quarter against Massachusetts in week two.

- In just over a quarter of work, Roberson rushed for 114 yards on five rushes, with 50- and 39-yard touchdown runs. He added 88 passing yards, including a 5-yard scoring strike.
- Roberson set career-highs with 280 yards, 26 completions, 36 attempts, a 72.2 completion percentage and 299 total yards in the opener vs. Indiana State.
- He connected with **Shane Wynn** on a 71-yard score and also added a 1-yard TD run.
- Roberson received the starting nod in the 2013 season opener and led the Hoosiers on a pair of first quarter scoring drives.
- The Indianapolis native went 3-of-6 for 71 yards with 43- and 12-yard touchdown passes. He also added 19 rushing yards on five rushes.
- · Roberson became the first true freshman quarterback in IU history to start in 2011.
- He started the final five games and was 81-of-142 (57.0 percent) with 937 yards, three touchdowns and six interceptions to go along with 426 rushing yards on 109 carries (3.9) with two scores in nine games.
- In his first start against lowa, Roberson celebrated his 19th birthday by becoming the third Hoosier to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.
- His 426 rushing yards were second on Indiana and third among true freshman quarterbacks nationally.
- At Lawrence Central High School, Roberson earned Indiana's 2010 Mr. Football Award.
- · His grandfather, Larry Highbaugh, played defensive back and ran track at IU from 1968-71
- Highbaugh played briefly with the Dallas Cowboys, spent 13 years in the Canadian Football League and was inducted into the CFL Hall of Fame in 2004.

SUDFELD COOL UNDER PRESSURE

Nate Sudfeld became just the third true freshman quarterback to play at Indiana last season. He threw for 632 yards, completed 51-of-82 (62.2 percent) and tossed seven touchdowns with just one interception in seven games.

- In the 2013 opener, Sudfeld received the most extensive action under center and went 12-of-17 with career-highs in yards (219) and TDs (four).
- Sudfeld, who threw 44-, 27-, 9- and 3-yard scores, became the first Hoosier with four since Ben Chappell's four against Arkansas State on Oct. 16, 2010.
- · Against Ball State in 2012, Sudfeld earned co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his performance in just his second game.
- Entering the game in the fourth quarter, he finished 13-of-20 for a career-high 172 yards to go along with two touchdowns, including a career-long 70-yarder.
- In his most extensive action, Sudfeld entered the IIlinois game for the final drive of the first quarter. He led four scoring drives (three TDs) and finished 10-of-15 for 107 yards with two scores en route to a Hoosier win.
- The two-time IU offensive player of the week passed for 157 yards and a 35-yard score at Northwestern
- The 14th-rated quarterback nationally by ESPN. com set school single-season records in passing yards (2,332), passing TDs (29) and passing yards per game (233.2) at Modesto (Calif.) Christian High School.
- Sudfeld's brothers, Zach and Matthew, are twins and no strangers to football. Zach is a tight end for the New England Patriots and starred at Nevada (2007-12). Matthew was a wide receiver at Brown (2007-11).
- Nate took a mission trip to Uganda as a 14-year old.

- The junior finished third on Indiana's single-season lists in completion percentage, fourth in passing yards, completions and attempts, sixth in passing TDs and seventh in total offense.
- · He ranked second in the Big Ten in yards per game, completions and attempts, third in yards, tied for third in passing scores and fourth in total offense.
- Coffman collected three 300-yard games (454, 348) and 315), recorded five multi-touchdown games (three twice), posted three games with 30-plus completions and four-games with 45-plus attempts.
- . The Peculiar, Mo., native completed 30 passes over 20 yards (four TDs - 79, 76, 30 and 21 yards), 13 passes over 30, six over 45 and three over 75.
- · At Penn State, Coffman threw for season-highs of 454 yards, 33 completions and 59 attempts to go along with two scores, including a 79-yarder.
- · His yardage and attempts were both Big Ten season-highs and rank second on IU's single-game lists while his completions share fourth.
- Coffman went 31-of-53 for 348 yards with one passing and one rushing TD the following weekend at Purdue. His attempts were sixth and completions tied for eighth on Indiana's single-game lists.
- He threw for 2,244 yards with 21 touchdowns and six interceptions and completed 61.4 percent of his passes as Arizona Western Community College won a schoolrecord 11 games and advanced to the NJCAA national championship game in 2011.
- · Football is in the genes as his father, Paul, was a standout tight end at Kansas State as well as the NFL - Green Bay (1978-85) and Kansas City (1986-87).
- Paul was a teammate of IU safety Mark Murphy's father, Mark, with the Packers.
- · His brother, Chase, played tight end at the University of Missouri (2005-08), with the Cincinnati Bengals (2009-10) and is currently with the Atlanta Falcons.
- · Cameron's brother, Carson, played quarterback at Kansas State University (2007-10).

ALL HANDS ON DECK

Indiana returns one of the deepest group of passcatchers in the country. In fact, five players have the opportunity to reach 100 receptions and 1,000 yards in 2013. Only 18 Hoosiers have ever obtained both milestones in their careers.

- The eldest statesman is fifth-year senior wideout **Duwyce Wilson**. He owns 73 catches for 946 yards.
- Senior Kofi Hughes (88 and 1,286), and juniors Shane Wynn (89 and 903) and Cody Latimer (65 and 990) round out the receiver quartet.
- Latimer (4.2, 67.1), Shane Wynn (5.7, 55.0) and Hughes (3.9, 58.1) each ranked in the Big Ten's top 10 in receptions and yardage per game in 2012. The Hoosiers were the only Big Ten team with a trio in the top 10 in either category.
- Fifth-year senior tight end Ted Bolser joins the wide receivers with 88 receptions and 1,095 yards.

CODE BREAKER

En route to second team All-Big Ten honors in 2012, **Cody Latimer** led the team with 805 yards, 67.1 yards per game and a 15.8 average per reception. He also shared the top spot with six touchdowns and finished second with 51 catches, all career-highs.

· The junior, who is on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List, closed out last season second in the Big Ten in yards per game, tied for fourth in receiving TDs and seventh in receptions per game (4.2).

- Latimer recorded two 100-yard games and reached 60 yards eight times. He broke out with 113 yards to go along with a career-high tying seven catches and a career-high three touchdowns en route to his first co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor against lowa in week nine.
- The three scores tied for the second-most in school history (10 times), trailing only James Hardy's four (Michigan State on Oct. 28, 2006).
- Latimer collected his first career 100-yard game against Ball State. He pulled in four balls for 115 yards with two scores, his first career two-touchdown game, including a career-long 70-yarder.
- The Dayton, Ohio, native is in his fifth season in organized football. Latimer only played two years of high school football, where he was a defensive back and wide receiver at Jefferson Township.
- · Latimer also starred on the basketball team, as evidenced during his throwdown at the team's Dunk Contest back in April, which was featured on ESPN's SportsNation.

KOFI BREAK

Kofi Hughes became the 35th Hoosier to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards and after posting 69 yards, with a 27-yard touchdown, in the season opener against Indiana State, is 21st all-time with 1,286 yards. He needs 12 receptions to become the 19th Hoosier to reach the 100 and 1,000 barriers.

- Hughes finished third on the team with 43 catches. 639 yards and 58.1 yards per game, all career-bests, a season ago. He was second with a 14.9 average per catch to go along with three touchdowns.
- The Indianapolis native ended the year sixth in the Big Ten in yards per game and 10th with 3.9 receptions per game.
- Hughes posted two 100-yard games (three in career) and reached 70 yards five times, led IU in receptions three times and made seven 35-plus yard grabs.
- He netted 110 yards at Northwestern and against lowa. Hughes led the team with his 110 yards on five catches, including a 35-yard touchdown and 39- and 28-varders, vs. the Wildcats.
- Hughes added six receptions and also reeled in a career-long 77-yard grab against the Hawkeyes.
- He delivered a career day at Ohio State in 2011. Hughes recorded career-highs with eight receptions. 147 receiving yards and 156 all-purpose yards.
- At Cathedral High School, Hughes played quarterback and was named the 2009 Gatorade Indiana Football Player of the Year.
- Hughes threw for 1,584 yards with 19 scores and rushed for 1,552 with 22 TDs as a senior.

IT STARTS UP FRONT

When **Kevin Wilson** first arrived in 2011, only one offensive linemen weighed over 300 pounds. Now seven weigh in at the 300-pound mark.

- The quartet of left tackle Jason Spriggs (13), left quard Bernard Taylor (17), center Collin Rahrig (15) and right tackle **Peyton Eckert** (18) own 63 combined career starts.
- Dan Feeney was on track to start at right guard before he suffered a season-ending foot injury during preseason camp. Feeney, started 12 games as a true freshman a season ago.
- Sophomore David Kaminski started for Feeney and sophomore Ralston Evans started for Eckert, who missed the season opener with an injury.
- The line picked up where it left of in 2012, not allowing a sack in 30 pass attempts.

- Indiana allowed just 17 sacks and led the Big Ten with one per every 31.8 pass attempts last season.
- The Hoosiers did not allow a sack in five games and surrendered just one sack twice.
- Feeney did not surrender a sack in 935 snaps and finished second on the team with 54 knockdowns.
- He received FoxSportsNext.com/Scout.com Freshman All-America first team recognition and carded a spot on ESPN.com's Big Ten All-Freshman team.
- Spriggs became the first Indiana true freshman to start at left tackle since current St. Louis Rams tackle Rodger Saffold in 2006.
- · He led the team with 80 knockdowns and surrendered just two sacks in 961 snaps.
- The Elkhart, Ind., native was a CollegeFootball-News.com Freshman All-American honorable mention selection and earned spots on the ESPN.com and BTN. com Big Ten All-Freshman team.
- Both guys earned honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition and set an IU true freshman record for an offensive lineman with their 12 starts.
- Rahrig, a junior and Indiana's most versatile lineman, made five starts at right guard and three at center in 2011 and last year he started six times at left guard.
- He was named Indiana's Outstanding Walk-On Player of the Year in 2011 and earned a scholarship prior to the 2012 season.
- · Eckert and Taylor earned their first career starts as true freshmen in week three in 2011.
- Taylor started the first six games of 2012 at left quard before sustaining a season-ending injury
- · He earned a spot on the Yahoo Sports, BTN.com and ESPN.com Big Ten All-Freshman teams in 2011.
- Eckert started all 12 games at right tackle in 2012 and made six starts at right tackle in 2011.

TD MACHINE

Stephen Houston ranks sixth on Indiana's career list with 20 rushing touchdowns and seventh with 24 total scores.

- · He scored at least one TD in the first eight games of 2012, and nine straight overall, which tied for the second-longest streak in school history with wide receiver James Hardy (2006-07), behind running back Anthony Thompson's 12 (1988-89).
- Houston closed out 2012 with 12 rushing touchdowns and 16 total TDs. He finished third in the Big Ten in scoring (non-kickers). His total touchdowns were tied for fourth, points were fifth and rushing TDs were tied for eighth on IU's single-season lists.
- He accounted for 16 of the Hoosiers 46 touchdowns (34.8 percent) in 2012.
- The fifth-year senior's 20 career rushing scores are the most for an Indiana running back since Levron Williams total of 31 (1998-2001).
- · Houston became the first Hoosiers running back with at least eight rushing TDs in back-to-back seasons since Williams (10 in 2000 and 17 in 2001).
- · He netted three rushing touchdowns for the first time in his career in the 2012 season finale at Purdue.
- Houston also scored three times at Illinois and against Ohio State, both times with two rushing and one receiving score.

NO PROBLEM WITH HOUSTON

With 749 rushing yards in 2012 and 802 in 2011, Stephen Houston became the first Indiana back with at least 700 rushing yards in consecutive years since BenJarvus Green-Ellis (938 in 2003 and 794 in 2004).

 Houston led IU with 62.4 yards per game, 161 carries, 12 touchdowns and a 4.7 average in 2012.

- Additionally, he caught 37 passes for 381 yards with four scores and led the way with 1,130 all-purpose yards, 94.2 per game, and 16 total TDs.
- Houston rushed for 100 yards twice to push his career total to five, reached 90 yards four times and 80 yards five times. He collected 90 receiving yards twice and had three 40-plus yard runs (59-TD, 51-TD and 45) and two 30-plus vard catches (79-TD and 31).
- The Little Rock, Ark., native closed the season with career-highs in all-purpose yards (253), rushing yards (158), rushing scores (three), carries (28), catches (12) and receiving yards (95) at Purdue.
- His 12 grabs shared the Big Ten mark for the most in a single game in 2012, tied for fifth on Indiana's singlegame list and ranks as the second-most for a Hoosier running back (Jason Spear - 16, 1997).
- In 2011, Houston rushed for 802 yards on 151 attempts with eight touchdowns, 5.3 yards per carry and 66.8 yards per game.
- His 802 yards were the most for a Hoosier since 2003 (Green-Ellis - 938).
- Houston joined the Hoosiers in July of 2011 from Independence (Kan.) CC.

INSIDE THE DEFENSE

Defensively, the Hoosiers returned eight starters, 25 letterwinners and 147 career starts. This week's depth chart features three seniors, 11 juniors, six sophomores and six freshmen, including five true freshmen.

INGE & PATTON JOIN STAFF

William Inge and James Patton joined the Hoosiers coaching staff in the offseason. Inge serves as co-defensive coordinator and coaches the linebackers. Patton is Indiana's recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and assistant defensive line coach.

- Inge was the Buffalo Bills assistant defensive line coach in 2012 after two seasons as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at the University of Buffalo.
- He has 12 years of experience, including stints as the linebackers coach at the University of Cincinnati (2008-09) and San Diego State University (2006-07).
- Patton has 14 years of experience in the Midwest. spending seven as a player and coach at Miami (Ohio) University and seven as an assistant coach at Northwestern University. He coached the offensive line at the University of Oklahoma from 2006-12.
- He has coached in 10 bowl games and on six conference championship teams. Patton spent six years with IU head coach Kevin Wilson at Miami (1990-94, 98), three at Northwestern (1999-2001) and five at Oklahoma (2006-10).

YES, HE-BAN!

Defensive back **Greg Heban** started his IU career as a pitcher for head coach Tracy Smith's baseball team. After dominating the 2009 intramural flag football season, Smith urged Heban to give football, one of three sports he played at Delta High School in Muncie, Ind., along with basketball and baseball, another shot.

Heban arrived at preseason camp in 2010, made the team, worked his way up the depth chart and eventually started four of the team's final five games at cornerback and played in all 12 contests.

- Head coach Kevin Wilson awarded the now fifthyear senior defensive back a scholarship prior to the 2011 season and he has not disappointed since.
- Heban leads all Hoosier defenders with 196 tackles, 134 solos, 12 tackles for loss, six interceptions 19 pass breakups and two fumble recoveries in his career.

2013 INDIANA FOOTBALL

THE NAVY GAME - 7

- The Muncie, Ind., native started all 12 games at cornerback in 2011 and led IU with two interceptions, shared the top spot with six pass breakups and was third with 62 tackles.
- · Heban moved inside as a nickel back for the first five games of 2012, where he started three times, before making his first career start at safety against Ohio State in week six and starting there every game since.
- He led the team with 91 tackles, 68 solo, three interceptions and eight pass breakups (tied) and added one sack, seven tackles for loss (24 yards) and one fumble recovery.
- Heban finished 12th in the Big Ten with 7.6 tackles per game, tops among defensive backs, tied for fifth in interceptions and tied for 11th in passes defended.
- · He recorded three double-digit tackle games, reached eight stops six times, led the team in tackles six times, received honorable mention All-Big Ten, was named Indiana's Teammate of the Year and received Academic All-Big Ten for the third straight year.
- In the team's win at Illinois, Heban matched his career-high, which he set the previous week at Navy, with 13 tackles. He added seven solo stops, one half-TFL and recovered a fumble setting up the game-winning TD. Heban also made a career-best nine solos with one tackle for loss against the Midshipmen.
- Heban graduated in May of 2013 with a bachelor's degree in exercise science. He is working on a second degree in nutrition science.
- A three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree, he was a member of the Capital One Academic All-District V team and received the IU Football Academic Excellence Award in 2011.
- Despite being just 6-foot-1, he can dunk a basketball from standing flat-footed and can throw 90 mph, as he pitched 1 1/3 innings for the 2010 IU baseball team.

HANGING WITH MR. COOPER

Looking to strengthen the team's linebacking unit, the Hoosiers coaching staff uncovered its 2012 starting middle linebacker from Coffeyville (Kan.) Community College in **David Cooper**.

- · Cooper redshirted the 2010 season at Coffeyville before a big 2011 campaign, which saw him collect 102 tackles, two sacks, 13 tackles for loss, three fumble recoveries, one interception and one forced fumble.
- The 6-1, 225-pounder enrolled at Indiana in the 2012 spring, where he immediately found himself starting in the middle during spring drills.
- Cooper started all 12 games and finished second on the team with 86 tackles, 50 solo, with three sacks (26 yards), nine tackles for loss (36 yards), one forced fumble and three pass breakups.
- · He tied for 15th in the Big Ten with 7.2 stops per game, his nine TFLs ranked third on the team and he made eight-or-more tackles in seven games.
- Cooper set career-highs with 10 tackles and three stops for loss at Illinois and added his first career sack.
- Against Wisconsin, Cooper reached 10 tackles once again to go along with one sack and one pass breakup.
- Showing his versatility, Cooper started on the strong side against Indiana State in the 2013 opener, and he responded with eight tackles and a half-TFL.
- A native of Lilburn, Ga., Cooper attended Brookwood High School before heading to Coffeyville.

ON THE MARK

Safety Mark Murphy is second on the Hoosiers with 151 tackles and 95 solo stops in his career. He finished fourth on the team with 70 tackles, third with 49 solos and started 11 of the team's 12 games in 2012.

- Murphy earned his first selection to the Capital One Academic All-District V team and recorded a gamehigh and a career-high-tying 13 tackles and a careerhigh nine solo stops against Wisconsin.
- It marked his fifth career double-digit tackle game and his second of 2012.
- The Akron, Ohio, native played in all 12 games in 2011 and started three times at weak-side linebacker and the final six at safety.
- Murphy earned a spot on the Yahoo Sports, BTN. com and ESPN.com Big Ten All-Freshman teams in 2011. He led all Big Ten true freshmen with 76 tackles, the most for a Hoosier true freshman since 2003.
- He finished second on the team with 76 tackles and led the way with 44 solos to go along with one tackle for loss, one interception and four pass breakups.
- Murphy intercepted his first pass and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown at North Texas, becoming the first true freshman since Tracy Porter (2004) to do so.
- Murphy's father, Mark, played safety for the Green Bay Packers from 1980-91 and was enshrined into the Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame in 1998.
- Paul was a teammate of IU quarterback Cameron Coffman's father, Paul, with the Packers.

JUST FOR KICKS

Mitch Ewald has put together an assault on Indiana's kicking records. The fifth-year senior is the school's all-time career field goal percentage leader. He is 45-of-56 (80.4 percent) in his career, with two of the misses blocked, and 115-of-116 on extra points.

- Ewald, who is on the Lou Groza Award Watch List for the third straight year, is eighth among active kickers and second among active Big Ten kickers in field goal percentage.

- In his career, he is 8-of-12 from 45-or-more vards. including a pair of 46-yarders in 2012.
- For the third straight season, Ewald recovered his own onside kick at Penn State. He converted a leaguehigh three onside kicks in four attempts and is 5-of-7 in his career
- On IU's single-season charts. Ewald is tied for third (16, 2010) and tied for ninth (13, 2011) in field goals, eighth (33, 2010) in extra points and ninth in total points (81, 2010).
- In 24 career Big Ten games, Ewald has hit 29-of-35. (82.9) field goals.

- · One of the most innovative and prolific offensive minds in the country, Kevin Wilson was named Indiana University's 28th head football coach on Dec. 7, 2010.
- It is clear Wilson has the Hoosiers tracking on the right path. He and his staff assembled the highest-rated recruiting class in program history after showing considerable progress on the field in 2012.
- · Despite fielding the youngest team in the country, the Hoosiers quadrupled their win total from 2011 and lost contests by one, two, three and four points. IU won back-toback Big Ten games for the first time since 2007.
- Indiana boasted nine All-Big Ten honorees, the most for the program since 2001. The Hoosiers six honorees on offense and three honorees along the offensive line were the program's most since 2001.
- Offensive linemen Jason Spriggs and Dan Feeney earned freshman All-America honors. Running back Tevin Coleman, defensive end Zack Shaw and guarterback Nate Sudfeld joined the duo as All-Big Ten freshman selections, pushing Índiana's two-year total to eight.
- Defensive tackle Adam Replogle became the eighth Hoosier to collect Academic All-America honors and the first since 2007.
- Twenty-two Hoosiers received Academic All-Big Ten accolades. Coupled with 2011's school-record 24 honorees, the program set a two-year mark with 46 award winners under Wilson.
- Indiana played 32 freshmen in 2011, the highest total in the country, and played 16 more in 2012. Twenty-seven of the 48 were true freshmen in the two years.
- The Hoosiers only suited up eight seniors in 2012, tied for the fewest in the country, and twenty-four of the 35 starters were underclassmen.
- Spent the 2002-10 seasons at the University of Oklahoma. He served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10.
- Led some of the most productive offenses in the history of college football, coached in 10 consecutive bowl games and made seven BCS bowl appearances, including three national championship games (2003, '04, '08).
- OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.
- Over Wilson's time at Oklahoma, 26 offensive players were drafted into the NFL, including seven first-round selections, with three going among the first 10 picks and two in the top
- · Served as position coach for three All-Americans, an Outland Trophy winner (Jammal Brown), a Mackey Award finalist (Jermaine Gresham) and a two-time Rimington Trophy finalist (Vince Carter).
- · As position coach, Wilson tutored three first-round draft picks (Jermaine Gresham, TE - 2010, Davin Joseph, OL - 2006 and Jammal Brown, OL - 2005), a second-round pick (Chris Chester, OL - 2005), a fifth-round pick (Brody Eldridge, TE -2010), two sixth-round picks (James Hanna, TE - 2012; Wes Sims, OL - 2004) and six free agents at Oklahoma.
- Twice a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award awarded to the nation's top assistant coach, Wilson won the award in

- During the 2010 campaign, running back DeMarco Murray set the school record for career touchdowns and also broke the OU mark for career all-purpose yards.
- Guided wide receiver Ryan Broyles to eight Sooner receiving records, including career marks for receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns. Broyles led the nation with 131 receptions in 2010.
- His 2008 offense shattered NCAA records by scoring 60-ormore points in five straight games and 716 total points for the entire season to average more than 51 points per contest.
- The 2008 team played in the BCS National Championship Game behind Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Sam Bradford. Bradford passed for 4,720 yards and 50 TDs, Chris Brown and DeMarco Murray both rushed for over 1,000 yards, Juaquin Iglesias caught 74 balls for 1,150 yards and Jermaine Gresham added 66 catches for 950 yards.
- Bradford ranked No. 1 nationally in passing efficiency as a freshman in 2007 and again in 2008, as he threw for more scores (86) in two seasons than anyone in NCAA history.
- In the 2010 NFL Draft, Bradford was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the St. Louis Rams. He captured the 2010 Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honor.
- Wilson was also instrumental in the development of Adrian Peterson. Peterson rushed for 1,925 yards in his freshman campaign (2004), which set an OU single-season record and marked the highest total for a freshman in NCAA history.
- Peterson went on to place second in the Heisman voting, which at the time was the highest finish ever by a freshman. He was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings as the seventh pick in the 2007 NFL Draft, where he was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year. Peterson won the 2012 NFL Most Valuable Player Award after he rushed for 2,097 yards, just nine shy of the NFL's single-season mark.
- Prior to his stint in Norman, Wilson was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Northwestern University in 2001 after serving as offensive coordinator in 1999 and 2000. He worked with the quarterbacks during his time in Evanston.
- Followed Randy Walker to Northwestern from Miami University after spending nine years in Oxford, coaching alongside former Indiana head coach Terry Hoeppner.
- Served as offensive line coach for his first two years at Miami and was promoted to offensive coordinator for the next seven, spending 1992-1997 in charge of the offensive line and the 1998 season with the quarterbacks.
- Wilson was the head coach and athletic director at Foard High School in North Carolina during the 1989 campaign and the offensive coordinator at North Carolina A&T in 1988.
- Spent a year as the offensive line coach at Winston Salem State in 1987. Wilson began his career in coaching as a student and graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina.
- A walk-on offensive lineman at North Carolina, Wilson earned a scholarship while playing in four bowl games - the 1980 Bluebonnet, the 1981 Gator, the 1982 Sun and the 1983 Peach Bowls.
- Earned his bachelor's degree in education (1984) and his master's degree in physical education (1987). Wilson was a three-sport star at Maiden High School in Maiden, N.C.
- Kevin and his wife, Angela, have five children, including three daughters, Elaina (17), Makenzie (15) and Marlee (12), and two sons, Trey (13) and Toby (10).

It provides exclusive sports programming to more than 900 radio stations throughout the country. Learfield's strategic affiliation with Team Services, LLC, also affords its partners a distinct advantage in the areas of venue consulting, naming rights and market research.



DON FISCHER

This marks the 41st year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. The past 26 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the Indiana University Radio

Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 19 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts.

During his 40 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 27 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 23 times, including the last four seasons, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast more than 1,600 Indiana University games - a total that includes seven bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, III., Fischer has been in the radio business for 46 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, III.; Springfield, III.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and 10 grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoined the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator in 2010. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, reunited with the Voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-game and halftime

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory. After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony

Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named an administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a school-record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 31st year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his

45th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, III. From 1973-89, Joe worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on Indiana's WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook.

In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal in June 2004. The honor goes to a non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

POST-GAME NOTES

- Indiana's 73 points scored are the second most in school history behind only the 76-0 victory over Franklin in 1901.
- The Hoosiers 632 yards of total offense are the third most in school history.
- \bullet IU had 313 yards rushing and 319 yards passing, marking the first time in school history the team has gained 300-plus yards through the air and on the ground.
- Indiana's 10 touchdowns in the game are the most on record, with statistics available since 1949.
- IU's 45 points in the first half are the most on record in school history (score by quarter is unavailable prior to 1949).
- The game produced Memorial Stadium records for points scored by a team (Indiana's 73), combined points scored (108), total yards (Indiana's 632) and touchdowns (Indiana's 10).
- Fifth-year senior **Ted Bolser** had a career-high-tying six catches for 78 yards with two touchdowns. He caught a 12-yard score from sophomore quarterback **Tre Roberson** to open the game and a 9-yard TD from sophomore quarterback **Nate Sudfeld** in the second quarter.
- Bolser has scored the Hoosiers first points of a season twice in his career. He also caught a 12-yard TD against Towson in the 2010 opener.
- The Cincinnati native scored two touchdowns for the second times in his career. He has 11 overall, extending his IU tight end record.
- Sophomore **Tevin Coleman** posted a career-best 169 rushing yards on 14 carries with two touchdowns, averaging 12.1 yards per carry. He added a career-long 58-yarder in the third quarter, which set up a 3-yard score for Wynn.
- Coleman added a 34-yard touchdown in the first quarter and a 20-yard score in the third. He has three career rushing TDs.
- Indiana scored nine touchdowns in the first three quarters of the game, averaging 1:01 per touchdown drive over that stretch. The Hoosiers scored more than three points for every minute of offensive possession in the first three quarters.
- Nine of Indiana's touchdowns came on four-or-fewer plays of offense, including one punt return
- Junior **Shane Wynn** had three non-fair catch touches that all resulted in touchdowns. He has eight career receiving touchdowns.
- In the first quarter, Wynn caught a 43-yard touchdown from Roberson, his third career 40-plus yard TD reception. He added a 3-yard touchdown grab from Sudfeld in the third quarter.
- Wynn added his first career punt return TD, a 58-yarder, in the second quarter. It is the Hoosiers' first punt return score since Tracy Porter's 86-yarder on Sept. 2, 2006.
- Wynn is the first Hoosier to catch a pair of touchdowns and return a punt for a touchdown since Rob Turner caught two TD's and returned a punt for the score vs. Missouri on Sept. 22, 1990.
- The Cleveland native now has a receiving, kick return and punt return for a score in his career.
- Senior **Kofi Hughes** scored on a 27-yard pass from Sudfeld. Hughes caught passes on all three plays of the drive, gaining all 69 yards.
- · Sudfeld finished 12-of-17 for 219 yards with four touchdowns and one interception.
- Sudfeld's four touchdown passes make him the first Hoosier with four since Ben Chappell threw four against Arkansas State on Oct. 16, 2010.
- Roberson started the game and finished 3-for-6 with 71 yards and a career-high two touchdowns. He added 19 yards on five carries.
- Junior linebacker Forisse Hardin forced a first quarter fumble that true freshman safety Antonio Allen recovered, career firsts for both
- Sophomore cornerback Michael Hunter collected his first career interception in the first quarter, returning it for 28 yards and setting up a three-play touchdown drive.
- Junior wide receiver Nick Stoner added his first career TD, a 44-yarder from Sudfeld, at the 11:00 mark in the second quarter
- Fifth-year senior kicker **Mitch Ewald** scored 13 points in the game, making 10-of-10 extra points and his only field goal attempt, a 26-yard kick in the second quarter.
- Ewald had six touchbacks on 12 kickoffs, and Indiana State had an average starting position of the 22.5-yard line on Ewald kickoffs.
- Indiana sacked ISU quarterbacks four times in the game. Sophomore defensive end **Nick Mangieri** added 1.5 sacks, sophomore defensive tackle **Adarius Rayne**r had one, and true freshman defensive tackle **Darius Latham**, junior linebacker **David Cooper** and junior defensive end **John Laihinen** each
- True freshman linebacker T.J. Simmons added a team-high nine tackles, including half-tackle for loss. Cooper had eight stops.
- Junior cornerback **Tim Bennett** broke up three passes, and Indiana got hands on five in the contest with junior Steven Funderburk and junior cornerback Kenny Mullen each registering one.
- Eight true freshmen played for the Hoosiers, as safety **Antonio Allen**, tight end **Danny Friend**, defensive end **David Kenney**, defensive tackle **Darius Latham**, linebackers **Clyde Newton**, **Marcus Oliver** and **T.J. Simmons**, and running back **Laray Smith** saw the field in the contest.
- Fifth-year senior safety **Greg Heban**, fifth-year senior wide receiver **Duwyce Wilson**, senior wide receiver **Kofi Hughes** and fifth-year senior linebacker **Griffen Dahlstrom** served as game captains.
- Sophomore defensive end **Nick Mangieri**, sophomore defensive tackle **Adarius Rayner**, redshirt freshman defensive tackle **Ralphael Green** and true freshman middle linebacker **T.J. Simmons** received their first career starts on defense.
- Sophomore right guard David Kaminski and sophomore right tackle Ralston Evans earned their first career starts on offense.
- Indiana won the coin toss and elected to defer
