SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana (5-2, 2-2 B1G East) closes out its two-game road stretch at Nebraska (4-3, 2-2 B1G West) on Saturday, Oct. 26. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. EDT at Memorial Stadium (85,458; FieldTurf) on BTN.
- IU heads to Lincoln for the first time since NU joined the Big Ten and the first time since 1977.
- Saturday marks the second meeting between the two programs since the Cornhuskers joined the league.
- Nebraska earned a 27-22 victory in Bloomington on Oct. 15, 2016.
- Indiana leads the all-time series, 9-8-3, with a 7-5-2 advantage in Lincoln.

- Tom Allen was named Indiana's head coach on Dec. 1, 2016, and made his debut at the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl against Utah. The New Castle, Ind., native joined IU as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016. In Allen's two seasons as head coach, 21 Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors and 15 have been drafted or invited to NFL camps. (full bio on page 18)
- Former Cornhusker Scott Frost is 8-11 in his second year as Nebraska head coach. Frost guided Central Florida to a 19-7 record from 2016-17, including a perfect 13-0 mark in his final season.

- Indiana is off to its best seven-game start since opening with a 5-2 mark in 2007.
- IU has won back-to-back B1G games for the first time since 2017 (at Illinois Nov. 11 and Rutgers Nov. 18).
- The Hoosiers reached 30 points for the sixth time in seven games, 500 yards (520) for the third time and 300 passing yards (334) for the third time at Maryland last weekend.
- Stevie Scott III went over 100 yards for the second-straight game and the eighth-time in his career, which shares 11th in program history. Scott finished with 108 yards on 18 carries (6.0 average).
- He reached the end zone twice and has 12 rushing touchdowns over his last 12 games.
- After posting 118 yards (39.3 per game) on 37 carries (3.2) over the first three weeks, Scott has 435 yards (108.8 per game) on 69 carries (6.3) the last four weeks.
- Safety Juwan Burgess (fumble at 3:42) and cornerback Reese Taylor (interception at 1:00) helped seal the 34-28 victory with a pair of takeaways in the final 3:42.
- Indiana is T-2nd in the B1G in defensive TDs (2, T-7th nationally), 3rd in opponent 3rd-down conversions (29.8, 10th), 4th in pass defense (168.7, T-9th), 6th in scoring defense (20.9, 32nd), pass defense efficiency (117.0, 31st) and opponent 1st downs (17.1, T-21st), T-6h in sacks (2.57, T-37th) and 7th in total defense (297.0, 18th).
- IU is 1st in the B1G in sacks allowed (1.29, T-20th), 2nd in total offense (449.9, 31st) and pass offense (307.3, 16th), T-2nd in 1st downs (24.3, T-19th), 3rd in time of possession (33:41, 10th) and completion percentage (70.1, 11th), T-3rd in pass TDs (17, T-20th), 4th in 3rd-down conversions (47.3, 18th), 5th in pass efficiency (155.2, 25th) and 6th in scoring offense (33.4, T-40th).
- The Hoosiers are one of four teams with a pair of whitewashings in 2019 Wisconsin (4), Florida (2) and Georgia (2).
 Indiana owns four shutouts since the start of the 2017 season, which shares second nationally with Alabama and Georgia,
 - Fifth-year senior **Logan Justus** is one of just six kickers in the nation perfect (9 FGs. 27 PATs) on the year.

Allen will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone facility following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.


TERRY TALLEN INDIANA FOOTBALL COMPLEX OPENS

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex officially opened on Aug. 13, 2019. Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics on April 20, 2018. This \$2 million commitment helped provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area will be permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex fills 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex includes the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches' locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, the Hoosiers first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International's Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana's Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company's Chairman and CEO. Tallen Capital Partners, LLC is a privately held, vertically integrated retail and mixed-use real estate investment and development organization with offices in San Diego and San Francisco. Prior to founding Tallen Capital Partners and becoming an entrepreneur, Terry enjoyed a corporate career as a senior executive with some of our country's largest public as well as private companies. He is considered one of the leading shopping center investors and developers in the Western U.S.





TEAM

• With their 38-3 win over Connecticut, Indiana has won 17 of their last 18 regular season non-conference games, including nine straight, and 12 of their last 13 at Memorial Stadium.

IU's nine-consecutive victories mark the program's longest winning streak since 1909-15 (16 straight).

• Former kicker Chris Gartner (1970-72) and linebacker **Donnie Thomas** (posthumously, 1973-75) were officially inducted into the Indiana Athletics Hall of Fame on Sept. 20.

A native of Gothenburg, Sweden, Gartner earned first-team All-America and first-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 1972. Thomas was named firstteam All-Big Ten and third-team All-America in 1975.

· After three years as defensive coordinator, Indiana head coach Tom Allen handed over the reins to Kane **Wommack** (bio on page 9), who at 32 is the youngest Power 5 defensive coordinator. Wommack coached the Hoosiers linebackers in 2018.

Mike DeBord retired after two seasons as offensive coordinator and Allen brought in Kalen DeBoer (bio on page 5), who served in the same capacity at Fresno State University in 2017 and 2018.

- Tom Allen's son, Thomas, is an IU redshirt sophomore linebacker. Tom is one of five FBS head coaches to coach his son:
- *Dana and Logan Holgorsen (Houston)
- *Phillip and Cannon Montgomery (Tulsa)
- *Dabo, Will and Drew Swinney (Clemson)
- *Bobby and Derek Wilder (Old Dominion)
- The Hoosiers welcomed the top-rated signing class in program history in February, which bested last season's record-setting class. Nineteen of this year's 22 signed in the early period in December.

The 2019 class features five four-star prospects: running back Sampson James (ESPN, Rivals, 247), defensive back Tiawan Mullen (Rivals), defensive lineman Beau Robbins (ESPN, Rivals, 247), defensive back **Josh Sanguinetti** (ESPN) and linebacker Cameron Williams (Rivals, 247).

Quarterback Jack Tuttle, a Utah transfer and mid-year enrollee who is eligible in 2019, was a 2018 four-star prospect (Rivals, 247). Long snapper Sean **Wracher** is a five-star prospect (KohlsKicking.com).

YOUTHFUL EXPERIENCE

Offensive lineman Matthew Bedford, James, offensive lineman Mike Katic, defensive back Larry Tracy III and Tuttle enrolled in the spring semester and practiced.

Thirty-eight true freshmen (12 in 2019, 16 in 2018, 10 in 2017) have played in **Tom Allen's** tenure.

• Former IU QB Antwaan Randle EI (1998-2001) is on the 2019 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame for the eighth-consecutive year.

He earned All-Big Ten distinction in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1998. The Big Ten MVP and first-team All-American in 2001, Randle El was also sixth in Heisman Trophy balloting after he finished 13th in 2000.

The Riverdale, III., native was the first player in NCAA history to score 40 touchdowns (45) and throw for 40 TDs (42), the first to record over 2,500 total yards in four seasons, and the first to both pass for over 6,000 yards and rush for over 3,000 yards.

- Eleven Hoosiers are currently on NFL rosters: RB Tevin Coleman (49ers), LB Chris Covington (Cowboys), OL Dan Feeney (Chargers), RB Jordan Howard (Eagles), OL Brandon Knight (Cowboys), WR Cody Latimer (Giants), OL Wes Martin (Redskins), OL Rodger Saffold (Titans), OL Jason Spriggs (Packers), OB Nate Sudfeld (Eagles) and TE Ian Thomas (Panthers).
- Indiana is wearing a patch of the CFB150 logo to celebrate the 150th birthday of college football.

The Hoosiers are also wearing an Indiana University Bicentennial decal on their helmets for IU's 200th anniversary. Jan. 20, 2020, is the official anniversary.

• Redshirt junior kickoff specialist Nathanael **Snyder** was awarded a scholarship at Lucas Oil Stadium on Aug. 22. Former Colts punter Pat McAfee surprised Snyder with the news on the stadium's videoboard at the end of practice.

Redshirt junior running back Connor Thomas, redshirt sophomore running back Ahrod Lloyd and redshirt sophomore defensive back Samuel Slusher were awarded scholarships at the end of fall camp.

- A program-record 29 Indiana football studentathletes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2018. Forty-seven Hoosiers have collected the accolades in Tom Allen's first two seasons.
- Head coach Tom Allen's radio show. Inside IU Football with Tom Allen, will be held Wednesday evenings at 7:05 p.m. EDT on the IU Radio Network. **Don Fischer**, who is in his 47th season as The Voice of the Hoosiers (T-2nd-longest active FBS radio p-b-p), hosts the show live from the Bloomington Holiday Inn.

OFFENSE

- Kalen DeBoer leads IU's offense following Mike DeBord's (2017-18) retirement. DeBoer also serves as associate head coach and quarterbacks coach.
- Indiana is first in the Big Ten in sacks allowed (1.29, T-20th), second in total offense (449.9, 31st) and passing offense (307.3, 16th), shares second in first downs (24.3, T-19th), third in time of possession (33:41, 10th) and completion percentage (70.1, 11th), tied for third in passing touchdowns (17, T-20th), fourth in third-down conversions (47.3, 18th), fifth in passing efficiency (155.2, 25th) and sixth in scoring offense (33.4, T-40th).
- The Hoosiers have scored 31-or-more points six times, surpassing 2018's season total (4), eclipsed 500 yards three times (once in 2018) and passed for 300-plus yards three times, matching last year's total.
- · For the second time in as many weeks, IU scored 30-plus points (34) and went over 500 yards (520) with 334 through the air and 186 on the ground at Maryland last weekend.
- Indiana rushed for a season-high 260 yards and totaled a season-best 557 yards in the Rutgers win, the team's highest totals against a conference foe since it collected 267 vs. Rutgers (2017) and 567 at Rutgers (2016).
- The Hoosiers threw for 286 yards, totaled 356 yards and scored 31 points at No. 25 Michigan State, all season-highs at the time against the MSU defense, which entered the game allowing 176.0 passing yards, 228.2 total yards and 11.0 points.
- IU's 52 points against Eastern Illinois were the most since a 52-17 win vs. Georgia Southern on Sept. 23, 2017.

- It totaled 555 yards and passed for 441, its most since Sept. 24, 2016, vs. Wake Forest (496).
- Sixteen players have caught a pass, 12 have recorded a rush and 11 have reached the end zone.
- DeBoer has made use of his tight ends and running backs in the receiving game.
- The tight ends have combined for 32 receptions for 383 yards and four touchdowns, while the backs have caught 32 for 254 yards with one TD.
- A three-time national champion head coach at the University of Sioux Falls (2006, 2008-09) and veteran play-caller of 19 years, DeBoer comes to Bloomington after stints as assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Fresno State University (2017-18), and offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Eastern Michigan University (2014-16).
- Before his arrival, Fresno State ranked 120th nationally in total offense only to jump to 47th over his two seasons, while Eastern Michigan moved from 111th to 35th.
- The Bulldogs went 22-6 in his 28 games as coordinator after a 4-20 mark the previous two campaigns, and the Eagles made the program's second bowl game and posted their first winning record (2016) since 1995.
- FSU became the second team in FBS history to record a double-digit win year (10-4 in 2017) on the heels of a double-digit loss season (1-11 in 2016). The nine-win turnaround was the largest in the country, a feat matched by EMU in 2016 (+6).

TIGHT END

- Redshirt sophomore Peyton Hendershot is enjoying a breakout season.
- Entering 2019 with 15 receptions for 163 yards and two touchdowns in 11 games, Hendershot owns 27 catches (2nd on the team) for 351 yards (2nd) and four TDs (T-1st) in seven starts this year.
- His 3.9 receptions and 50.1 yards per game rank second among all Big Ten tight ends, while his four scores share first (T-6th overall in the Big Ten).
- · Among tight ends nationally, he shares sixth in touchdowns, shares 10th in catches, and he is 12th in receiving yardage.
- The North Salem, Ind., native nearly became the first Hoosier tight end since 1985 (Dave Lilja) and the fifth overall to reach the century mark at Maryland.
- · Hendershot posted career-highs with 95 yards and six receptions, both game-highs, in the win.
- He has now set or matched career-highs in catches or yardage five times, has led the team in receptions on four occasions, has led the team in yardage twice and has reached the end zone in four of the last six ballgames.
- · Against No. 6 Ohio State, he collected 70 yards, including a career-long 49-yard TD, on four grabs.
- The 6-4, 255-pounder made five catches for 52 yards with a score in the Eastern Illinois win a week after he caught four for 69 yards and a two-point conversion in the season-opening Ball State victory.
- Former Hoosier tight end lan Thomas (2016-17) was selected with the first pick of the fourth round in the 2018 NFL Draft by Carolina.

- He made 36 receptions for 333 yards and two scores in his rookie campaign.
- Nick Sheridan is in his first season coaching the Indiana tight ends.
- A guarterback at the University of Michigan (2006-09), Sheridan appeared in 12 games and made four starts. His father, Bill, is the defensive coordinator/ linebackers coach at Boston College



- Nick Westbrook (123, 1948, 15), Donavan Hale (81, 1159, 11), Whop Philyor (99, 1129, 7) and Ty Fryfogle (55, 641, 4) account for 358 receptions, 4,877 yards and 37 touchdowns.
- Philyor tops the team with 43 catches and 559 yards, and he is third with three TDs (tied). His 6.1 grabs per game rank second in the Big Ten (T-18th nationally), and his 79.9 yards sit sixth (28th).
- · According to Pro Football Focus College, his 343 yards after contact tops the Big Ten (10th nationally).
- The Tampa Plant grad became the first Hoosier to record double-digit reception games in back-to-back games with 10 in the Rutgers win.
- Philyor hauled in 14 (1st in the B1G, T-2nd nationally in 2019) at No. 25 Michigan State and has a program record four games in double figures.
- He is one of 11 receivers nationally and two in the conference to reach double figures twice in 2019.
- Philyor topped 100 yards for the third and fourth times in his career with 142 (7th-most in the B1G in 2019) against the Spartans, with a career-best two touchdowns, and a career-high 182 (4th-most) against the Scarlet Knights.
- His 24 catches set an Indiana two-week record and his 324 yards rank second.
- The 5-11, 178-pounder also brought in 10-plus completions vs. MSU in 2018 (13 for 148) and at Maryland in 2017 (13 for 127). His 14 receptions share third and the 13 share fifth on IU's single-game charts.
- Philyor also has rushed five times for 43 yards and returned 12 punts for 56 yards to give him 94.0 allpurpose yards per game, seventh in the B1G
- As a true freshman in 2017, his catches (33) and TDs (3) rank first, and yardage (335) is third on Indiana's true freshman single-season lists.
- Philyor made 23 grabs for 235 yards and one score in just five starts due to injury one year ago.
- His parents began calling him Whop because of his love for Burger King's Whoppers.
- A two-time Biletnikoff Watch Lister, Westbrook became the 19th Hoosier to reach 100 catches and 1,500 yards.
- He has 21 grabs for 294 yards (14.0 average) with four TDs (T-1st on the team) in 2019, including one in three of the last four weeks and a team-long 75-yarder.
- Whop **Philyor**

- The fifth-year senior out of Lake Mary, Fla., owns a team-leading six 100-vard games, including a 103yard effort (3 receptions) in the season-opening Ball State win, and two multi-touchdown games.
- Westbrook's 15 career scores share seventh on the program's career list.
- He sustained a season-ending ACL injury on the opening kickoff of 2017, and bounced back to lead the team with 590 yards, 49.2 yards per game and 14.0 yards per grab in 2018.
- The 6-3, 219-pounder also produced the Big Ten's top deep passer rating (123.1), according to Pro Football Focus, and has hauled in three passes of at least 75 yards in his career (75-twice, 79).
- A 2016 honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick, he caught 54 passes for an 18.4 average and six scores.
- The three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection came up five yards shy of becoming the seventh Hoosier to reach the 1,000-yard mark. His 995 yards are seventh in school history.
- Fellow fifth-year senior Hale reached the century mark for the first time in his career in the Eastern Illinois win and became the 45th Hoosier to surpass 1,000 yards against No. 6 Ohio State.
- · Hale also threw a 49-yard touchdown vs. OSU and owns 18 receptions for 315 yards (2nd on the team) with three TDs and a team-best 17.5 average per catch on the year.
- He made five catches for 110 yards with a 43-yard score, his third-career 40-plus yarder, vs. EIU.
- · Against the Spartans, Hale delivered seven grabs for 99 yards and one touchdown.
- The Largo, Fla., native earned honorable-mention All-Big Ten with 42 catches (3rd on the team) for 508 yards (2nd) and six TDs (1st), which shared 11th in the conference, one season ago.
- A junior out of Lucedale, Miss., Fryfogle carded a season-high 63 yards on four receptions at Maryland last weekend.
- He is third on the team with 25 catches for 247 yards with one touchdown.
- He led the Hoosiers with six catches (41 yards) vs. Ball State and five in the Connecticut win (47 yards).
- Fryfogle posted 29 grabs for 381 yards, including a career-high 71 against lowa, and three scores in 2018.

QUARTERBACK

- Redshirt freshmen Michael Penix Jr. earned the starting job after winning the competition in fall camp over redshirt junior Peyton Ramsey and redshirt freshman Jack Tuttle.
- The Tampa native has claimed Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors twice (Ball State, Michigan State) in his five starts (missed 2 games due to injury).
- Penix is 100-of-145 (69.0 percent) for 1,232 yards with 10 touchdowns and four interceptions, good for a 157.58 pass-efficiency rating.
- He has rushed for 115 yards on 17 attempts (6.8 average) with one TD.
- The southpaw is averaging 246.4 passing yards and 269.4 total yards per game.
- Penix became the first Indiana freshman to start the opening game at quarterback since Antwaan Randle El in 1998.
- And like Randle El, Penix delivered a performance to remember. He joined Randle El as the only freshman to surpass 300 passing yards in his first start and is one of just four freshmen to ever reach the benchmark (Kellen Lewis, Bob Hoernschemeyer).
- · Penix finished with 326 yards on 24-of-40 with a 75-yard score, IU's longest since Sept. 24, 2016. Penix added 67 yards on the ground for 393 total yards.
- · His total yardage and passing yardage trail only Randle El for the most in a freshman debut. Randle El posted 467 total yards and 385 passing yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 1998.
- In his first-career road start at No. 25 Michigan State, he went 33-of-42 (78.6 percent) for 286 yards with a career-best three passing touchdowns, which he matched in the Rutgers win (282 yards), and one rushing TD.
- The 6-3, 202-pounder completed a school-record 20-straight passes, the second-longest streak in Big Ten history behind Chuck Long's 22-straight in 1984.
- His 33 completions were a career-high and share seventh on the program's single-game list.

- Penix, the fifth Hoosiers true freshman guarterback to play, went 21-of-34 for 219 yards and one score with 45 yards on seven carries in three games in 2018.
- He suffered an ACL injury against No. 18 Penn State in game eight.
- A team captain at Tampa Bay Technical High School. Penix threw for 61 touchdowns and just six INTs with 16 rushing TDs in his two years as a starter (24 games).
- He also played center field, jumped 22 feet in the long jump and ran a 22.8 in the 200-meter dash.
- Ramsey has started two and appeared in five games in 2019, including the win at Maryland last weekend, where entered a 14-14 tie in the second quarter and guided the Hoosiers to a 34-28 victory.
- He completed 20-of-27 passes (74.1) for 193 yards and a 26-yard touchdown, and he added 46 yards on the ground on eight carries.
- Ramsey saw his first action in the Eastern Illinois win, setting the program's single-game completion percentage mark on 13-of-14 (92.9) for 226 yards with TDs of 64 and 43 yards.
- He own's the first, third and fourth spots on the program's single-game percentage list.
- In the win over UConn, Ramsey went 23-of-27 (85.2) for 247 yards and three scores, his fourth-career game with three passing touchdowns.
- He is Indiana's all-time completion percentage leader (66.9), shares fifth in 300-yard games (3) and passing TDs (35), is sixth in completions (508) and attempts (759), is eighth in total offense (5,629) and ninth in passing yardage (4,970).
- In 26 career games (18 starts), he owns 11 multitouchdown passing games, and six games with at least one passing and rushing score.
- The 6-2, 216-pound righty played for his father, Doug, at Cincinnati Elder High School.
- A two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, Peyton is named after Peyton Manning, his older brother Montana "Tanner" is named after Joe Montana and his younger brother Drew is named after Drew Bledsoe.

RUNNING BACK

- A member of the 2019 Maxwell Award and Doak Award Watch Lists. Stevie Scott III has reached the century mark each of the last two weeks.
- His eight 100-yard games are tied for the 11thmost in program history.
- · Scott rushed for 164 yards, the second-highest total of his career, on just 12 carries (13.7 average) with a career-long rush of 57 yards in the Rutgers win.
- He followed that up with 108 yards on 18 attempts (6.0) with a pair of touchdowns, his fourth-career multi-TD game.
- The sophomore owns 553 yards (4th in the Big Ten) on 106 rushes (4th) with six scores (T-8th, T-37th nationally) and a 5.2 average. Scott is fifth in the conference with a 79.0 average per game.
- After posting 118 yards (39.3 per game) on 37 carries (3.2) over the first three weeks, he has 435 vards (108.8) on 69 (6.3) the last four weeks.
- He has reached the end zone in nine of the last 12 games with 12 touchdowns in those contests.
- Scott also set career-highs with five receptions for 36 yards last weekend and he shares second among all Big Ten backs with 18 catches for 146 yards (3rd). He caught 16 balls for 86 yards all of last year.
- His 99.9 all-purpose yards per game pace the Hoosiers and rank 10th in the league.
- · He turned in the top true freshman running back campaign in program history in 2018.
- · Scott set Indiana true freshman records with 1,137 yards (losing just 18 yards), 228 attempts, 10 touchdowns and six 100-yard games.
- He averaged 94.8 yards and 101.9 all-purpose yards per game, 5.0 yards per carry, and added 16 receptions for 86 yards with one TD.
- The 6-2, 231-pounder became the 13th Hoosier (19th time) to reach 1,000 yards and his 1,137 yards rank 14th.
- · Amongst true freshmen running backs nationally, Scott finished second in rushing yardage, 100-yard games and rushes, and third in rushing scores.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native finished fourth in the Big Ten in attempts per game (19.0, 23rd nationally), tied for fourth in rushing touchdowns, fifth in rushing yardage (33rd) and rushing yardage per game (27th), eighth in all-purpose yardage (1,223), tied for eighth in total TDs (11) and 10th in all-purpose yardage per game (101.9).

- A two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, Scott finished with 204 yards, three shy of Anthony Thompson's Hoosiers true freshman record (1988), on 31 carries (6.6 average) with his first-career score, a 40-yarder, in a 20-16 victory over Virginia.
- IU's Offensive Newcomer of the Year was a 2016 all-state and All-Central New York selection as a back and linebacker before he was limited to three games due to injury in 2017 at Christian Brothers Academy.
- Ronnie Walker Jr. rushed 32 times for 141 yards (4.4) with two scores behind Scott as a true freshman.
- Walker caught a ball in the flat and raced 64 yards to paydirt for his first-career receiving touchdown against Eastern Illinois this year.
- He has 15 carries for 52 yards and seven receptions for 88 yards overall.
- The Hopewell, Va., native twice claimed all-state and all-region honors at Hopewell High School.
- True freshman **Sampson James** participated in 2019 spring practice after a distinguished career at Avon (Ind.) High School.
- The two-time all-stater was a consensus four-star prospect by ESPN, Rivals and 247Sports.
- James, who has 85 yards and two scores in 2019, both second on the team, closed out his Avon career with 3,451 yards on 573 attempts (6.0 average) with 38 rushing touchdowns and 41 total TDs.
- A 2018 Broyles Award nominee, Mike Hart is in his third season as Indiana's running backs coach and his second as assistant head coach.
- The University of Michigan's all-time rushing leader, Hart spent three years with the Indianapolis Colts before entering the coaching ranks in 2011.
- In his eight years as a coach (Syracuse, 2016; Western Michigan, 2014-15; Eastern Michigan, 2011-13), Hart has tutored four 1,000-yard rushers, two Mid-American Conference (MAC) Freshman of the Year and the 2014 MAC Offensive Player of the Year, Jarvion Franklin.
- Each of the Hoosiers last four featured running backs have reached the NFL - Devine Redding (Kansas City), Jordan Howard (Philadelphia), Tevin Coleman (Atlanta) and Stephen Houston (New England, Pittsburgh and Baltimore).

THE START CHART

- Indiana returned 157 career starts from 12 players on offense and 131 career starts from 11 players on defense for a total of 288 career starts from 23 players.
- The offensive line is the team's most experienced unit with 113 career starts among seven players.
- On defense, the secondary is the most experienced unit with 111 career starts among 10 different players.
- Across both lines, IU owns 168 career starts among 13 players.

- Senior captain and left tackle Coy Cronk suffered a season-ending lower leg injury against Connecticut.
- Cronk has started all 40 games in which he has appeared at left tackle since his arrival in 2016, when he was a 247Sports True Freshman All-American.
- The Lafayette, Ind., native is a member of the 2019 Outland Trophy and Senior Bowl Watch Lists.
- A pair of fifth-year seniors join Cronk on the Senior Bowl Watch List - right guard Simon Stepaniak (27 starts) and center Hunter Littlejohn (22 starts).
- Stepaniak has made 19-consecutive starts, while Littlejohn started the first six before missing the Maryland game due to injury last weekend.
- A team captain, Stepaniak (6-4, 321) ranked 43rd on Bruce Feldman's 2019 Freaks list.
- He benches 515 pounds, his hang clean max is 410 pounds, and he has 41 reps on the 225-pound bench.
- Littlejohn (6-3, 315) is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List, awarded to the nation's top center.
- · A three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, he graduated with a healthcare management and policy degree in May 2019.
- Junior left guard Harry Crider (21 career games) and redshirt sophomore right tackle **Caleb Jones** (18) have started all seven games this year, with Crider making his first-career start at center last weekend.

- Crider (6-4, 311) attended Columbus East High School in Columbus, Ind., while Jones (6-8, 358) was an all-state standout in 2015 and 2016 at Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis.
- True freshman Matthew Bedford has filled in for Cronk the last three games.
- Bedford (6-6, 307) participated in spring practice after he chose the Hoosiers over Mississippi State and South Carolina.
- Indiana leads the Big Ten lead (T-20th nationally) allowing just 1.29 sacks per game (9 total).
- **Darren Hiller** is in his third season overseeing the offensive line. A 25-year coaching veteran, Hiller has coached 20 players who have moved on to the NFL, including former Hoosiers Wes Martin (guard) and Brandon Knight (tackle).
- Martin, a fourth-round selection in the 2019 NFL Draft by Washington, joined 2016 and 2017 day two selections tackle Jason Spriggs (Green Bay) and guard Dan Feeney (Los Angeles Chargers).
- Spriggs was taken with pick No. 48 (round 2) and Feeney was selected with pick No. 71 (round 3)
- Knight signed a 2019 free-agent deal with Dallas.
- The quartet, along with Rodger Saffold, a 10year veteran tackle who signed with Tennessee this offseason, gives Indiana five former O-line standouts currently on NFL rosters.

DEFENSE

- After three years running the defense, **Tom Allen** turned over the reins to Kane Wommack, who served as linebackers coach in 2018.
- Indiana is tied for second in the Big Ten in defensive touchdowns (2, T-7th nationally), third in opponent third-down conversions (29.8, 10th), fourth in passing defense (168.7, T-9th), sixth in scoring defense (20.9, 32nd), pass defense efficiency (117.0, 31st) and opponent first downs (17.1, T-21st), tied for sixth in sacks (2.57, T-37th), seventh in total defense (297.0, 18th), eighth in tackles for loss (7.3, T-35th) and ninth in rushing defense (128.3, 39th).
- IU posted its second shutout of 2019 against Rutgers. The Hoosiers are one of four teams (Wisconsin-4, Florida-2, Georgia-2) with two.
- Indiana held RU to 5-of-13 passing for one yard, the lowest output for an FBS team this season and the lowest IU has yielded against a Big Ten foe since holding Minnesota to 0 on Oct. 19, 1985.
- The Hoosiers kept the Scarlet Knights to 75 total yards, the fewest allowed dating back to 1966.
- Rutgers did not convert on 11 third-down attempts, the first time on record that Indiana did not allow a third-down conversion.
- IU racked up 14 tackles for loss, its most since Nov. 12, 2016, against Penn State (16), and six sacks, its most since Nov. 11, 2017, at Illinois (8).
- Reakwon Jones returned a fumble 17 yards for a score, the defense's second of the year.
- The Hoosiers have recorded at least one takeaway in 23 of the last 25 games, including a fumble recovery with 3:42 remaining and an interception with 1:00 left to preserve the win at Maryland last weekend.
- Wommack's charges recorded their first shutout in a 52-0 whitewashing of Eastern Illinois.
- It was Indiana's first blanking since 2017 (Rutgers - Nov. 18, 2017) and its first in a home opener since beating Toledo, 27-0, on Sept. 4, 1993.

- IU allowed 116 total yards, 64 passing yards and 52 rushing yards.
- In the win over Connecticut, the Hoosiers limited the Huskies to three points, 145 total yards, 94 passing yards and 51 rushing yards - the fewest since 33 at Illinois on Nov. 11, 2017.
- Wommack worked with Allen as an Ole Miss graduate assistant in 2012-13, when Allen was linebackers coach under defensive coordinator Dave Wommack, Kane's father.
- At 32 years of age, Wommack is the youngest Power 5 defensive coordinator.
- He served as the University of South Alabama's defensive coordinator, the youngest in the FBS, and linebackers coach in 2016-17, after two seasons (2014-15) as defensive coordinator at Eastern Illinois
- Wommack engineered one of the top turnarounds in the country in 2016. The unit was the fifth-most improved nationally in scoring defense (-10.3), one spot behind the Hoosiers, and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in passing defense.
- Indiana finished 2018 with 26 takeaways (T-11th nationally; T-2nd in the Big Ten), 13 fumble recoveries (T-5th; 2nd) and 13 interceptions (T-33rd; T-6th).
- During the 2016-17 campaigns, IU was the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third-down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ypg).
- Wommack stresses the importance of takeaways and his magic number per game is three.
- The defense reached that number four times in 2016, twice in 2017 and five times in 2018.
- Since the start of 2016 (44 games), the Hoosiers have four games with four takeaways, 11 with at least three takeaways and 18 with multiple takeaways.

- Fifth-year senior **Reakwon Jones** brings the most experience to the linebackers room. He has appeared in 38 games with 17-straight starts at the stinger position (weak-side LB).
- In the Rutgers win, Jones scooped up a fumble, the second of his career, and returned it 17 yards for his first-career touchdown. He added his second-career sack in the contest.
- Jones paces the team with 32 tackles and 21 solos to go along with 1.5 TFLs, the sack and fumble recovery, and one quarterback hurry.
- He has led the team in stops four times, including in the season-opening win over Ball State.
- The 6-2, 233-pounder posted a game- and careerhigh 11 tackles, his first double-digit contest, en route to IU defensive player of the week honors.
- Jones made 36 stops, 24 solo, 4.5 for loss, one sack, one fumble recovery, two pass breakups and one QBH with a pair of 2018 team defensive POW accolades in 10 starts.
- A Lynn Haven, Fla., native, Jones saw his family's home destroyed by Hurricane Michael on Oct. 10, 2018. Through a GoFundMe page, Hoosier Nation helped raise \$16,705 and the family is now living in an apartment in Panama City, Fla.
- Sophomore **Cam Jones** has shifted over from the husky position to stinger in 2019 and shares fourth on the team with 22 tackles, 17 solos and two sacks (T-3rd) in addition to three for loss, one pick-6, two pass PBUs and two QB hurries in six games.
- · Jones set a career-high with two sacks, the first two of his career, and six solos, while he matched his career-best of six total stops against RU.
- In the win over UConn, Jones picked off his secondcareer pass and returned it 44 yards for six points, and he opened the campaign with six tackles against BSU.
- Jones was recognized as the team's 2018 defensive newcomer of the year after he shared the team lead with two forced fumbles (T-1st among Big Ten true freshmen, T-2nd among freshmen nationally, T-7th in the Big Ten overall) in 11 games.

- The Memphis, Tenn., native totaled 20 stops, 15 solo, with one fumble recovery, one interception, one pass breakup and one QBH.
- · Jones finished second on the team with four takeaways.
- In the middle, sophomore Micah McFadden has played in all seven games, (6 starts) and tops the team with six tackles for loss.
- He is second with 28 stops and shares third with 18 solos to go along with a half-sack, two quarterback hurries and one breakup.
- McFadden has led the team in tackles three times. including last weekend at Maryland (5 solos), and made a career-high six in the season opener.
- He set a career-high with a pair of TFLs at No. 25 Michigan State and added 1.5 against the Scarlet Knights. He owns 4.5 stops for loss over the last four games and has registered one in five.
- . McFadden posted 20 tackles, 14 solo, with one for loss, one forced fumble and two QBHs in 12 games as a true freshman last campaign.
- The Tampa Plant grad tallied a program-record 211 stops, 124 solo, 39 for loss, seven sacks, two picks and two fumble recoveries as a senior.

- Marcelino Ball is the team leader in career tackles (177) and solos (127). He shares the top spot with three interceptions, is second in stops for loss with 14 and is third with 12 pass breakups.
- The 20-year old, redshirt junior also owns 3.5 sacks, with his first of 2019 at Maryland last weekend, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in 35 career games (32 starts).
- He opened 2019 with a career-high 10 stops (5th time) in the win over Ball State and has 23 overall (3rd on the team), 14 solo, with one sack, 1.5 TFLs, one PBU and three quarterback hurries.
- Ball came in No. 9 on Bruce Feldman's 2019 Freaks list. He owns a 365-pound power clean, a 405-pound bench press max, has topped out at 22.74 miles per hour and recorded a 4.41 electronically timed 40.
- After he suffered a season-ending injury, which resulted in a medical redshirt, in the third game of 2017, he returned in a big way last year.

- · The trio welcomes back sophomore Reese Taylor, who started 2018 at corner as a true freshman before moving to the offense in week two, and true freshman Tiawan Mullen out of Coconut Creek High School in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.
- · Taylor recorded the first interception of his career with 1:00 left to seal IU's 34-28 win at Maryland.
- Mullen, who has started the last two games and played in all seven, leads IU with five pass breakups. highlighted by a team season-high four at No. 25 Michigan State.
- · A Rivals four-star prospect, Mullen played in the 2019 All-American Bowl after he picked off 14 career passes and returned three for scores.
- His brother, Trayvon, played cornerback at Clemson University (2016-18) and is a member of the Oakland Raiders, and his cousin, Lamar Jackson, played at Louisville (2015-17) and is currently the Baltimore Ravens starting quarterback.
- · Brown, who graduated with a human resources management degree in May 2019, and is currently enrolled in the public affairs master of public administration program, started all 12 games in 2018.
- He registered 29 tackles, 24 solo, with two for loss and a team-high six pass breakups.
- The Decatur, Ga., native owns 108 career stops, 83 solo, six for loss, with 13 PBUs, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and one touchdown.
- · Layne, a Deland, Fla., product leads the corners with 19 tackles and 18 solos with one for loss and two breakups in seven games (6 starts) this season.

- Fitzgerald has 16 stops, 15 solo, one for loss, with three pass breakups and one quarterback hurry in seven games (5 starts) this season.
- Senior Khalil Bryant shared the team-lead with a career-high five tackles (5th time) at Maryland.
- He recovered his first-career fumble vs. No. 6 Ohio State and has 20 stops.

- Johnson, IU's 2018 Outstanding Lineman, has 67 stops, 6.5 sacks, 11 for loss, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in his career.
- He ended 2018 with 1.5 sacks against Purdue, matched that total in the season-opening win vs. Ball State while he equaled his career-best five tackles.
- Johnson added a half-sack against Connecticut and has two overall to go along with 17 stops.
- A year ago, the Bassfield, Miss., native headed the team with 3.5 sacks and was third with 5.5 for loss.
- Johnson also topped the line with 32 tackles and 21 solos to go along with the forced fumble, the fumble recovery and one QBH.

- Elliott fronts the D-line in stops with 22 (T-4th on the team), solos with 19 (2nd), sacks with three

- (T-1st), TFLs with five (2nd), and forced fumbles with one (T-2nd) in six starts (7 games).
- He posted a career-high three tackles for loss with one sack and the forced fumble, which was recovered for a score, in the Rutgers win.
- Elliott tallied five stops at No. 25 Michigan State and added a pair of four-tackle and one-sack games against No. 6 Ohio State and UConn.
- The sophomore has paced Indiana in stops on three occasions, tied for the team-high.
- · Elliott played in 10 games and made 19 tackles, 4.5 for loss, with one sack at Garden City Community College (Kan.) in 2018.
- Sophomore **James Head Jr.** has started all seven games at end in 2019, and he has three TFLs (T-5th on the team) to go along with 1.5 sacks, 11 tackles and a team-high four QBHs.
- He twice has secured four stops in the Eastern Illinois win (1.5 sacks) and against MSU.
- The Miami native made 17 tackles in 11 games last year after a sterling career at Southridge High School.
- Head finished his career with 250 stops, 47 for loss and 45 sacks.
- Junior end Michael Ziemba is third on the team with four TFLs and has tallied 20 tackles, second on the line, with a career-high five against Rutgers.
- The Sanford, Fla., native has played in 20 games and has made his first starts over the last four.
- Ziemba, who has a tackle for loss in four games this campaign, posted four stops, 1.5 for loss and two hurries against the Buckeyes.

SPECIALISTS

- One of 20 semifinalists for the 2018 Lou Groza Award, fifth-year senior Logan Justus is one of just six kickers perfect in 2019.
- Indiana's all-time field goal percentage leader has not missed a field goal in nine attempts or an extra point in 27 tries.
- Justus, who has hit his last nine attempts (T-6th in program history) and 17 of his last 18, is third in the Big Ten in field goals made (T-38th nationally) and shares sixth in scoring among all players (7.7).
- The left-footer is one of 30 members on this year's Groza Award Watch List and sits 24-of-27 in his career (88.9 percent) and 59-of-60 on PATs (98.3), good for 131 career points.
- His 24 field goals share ninth on the program's alltime list, while his 59 extra points are 10th.
- Justus opened his second season as the Hoosiers kicker with perhaps his career-best performance, as he matched a program record with a career-high four field goals, in four attempts.
- Three times he bested his career-long with 48-, 49- and 50-yarders en route to his second-career Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honor and his second-career Lou Groza Award Star of the Week recognition.
- Justus became the 11th Hoosier (22nd time) to record a 50-yarder, and he collected his second game with at least three field goals.
- He added his seventh-career multi-FG contest with a pair at Maryland last weekend.
- The McCordsville, Ind., native finished the 2018 campaign 15-of-18 on field goals (83.3) and 32-of-33 on PATs. His 15 makes share eighth in school history.
- A second-team All-Big Ten honoree, Justus ranked second in the conference in percentage (T-19th nationally) and was named IU's Most Outstanding Specialist of the Year.
- Justus hit the game-winner from 42 yards out with 2:32 remaining to lift IU to a 34-32 win over Maryland.

- He finished the game a perfect 6-of-6 (2 FGs, 4 PATs) en route to Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and Lou Groza Star of the Week accolades.
- Upon the conclusion of the 2018 campaign, the former walk-on was placed on scholarship.
- Three-time Ray Guy Award Watch Lister (2017-19) Haydon Whitehead only punted three times in the 2019 opener, but he made the most of them.
- The fifth-year senior averaged 51.7 yards, including a 63-yarder, and had two downed inside the 10-yard line en route to being named one of the Ray Guy Award's Rav's 8.
- Whitehead is averaging a career-high 43.0 yards (6th in the Big Ten) on 28 punts with 11 inside the 20 (8 inside the 10) and six 50-plus yarders, including a career-long 65-yarder.
- The fifth-year senior holds a 40.9 career average with 15 50-yarders in addition to 61 punts inside the 20-yard line, 29 inside the 10 and 11 inside the 5.
- The Melbourne, Australia, native kicked in his first American football game ever in the 2017 season opener, and he went on to earn honorable-mention All-Big Ten (coaches and media).
- · Whitehead, who punts left-footed but is able to kick right-footed if necessary, enrolled in 2017 spring classes and participated in practice.
- The 24-year old played Australian Rules Football for 15 years. He made his first trip to the United States when he took his official visit to IU in December 2016.
- · Whitehead trained under Nathan Chapman and John Smith at Prokick Australia in Melbourne.
- Prokick has produced five of the past six Ray Guy winners (2013-17), including all three finalists in 2016 and two of the three in 2017 and 2018.
- With the graduation of former long snapper **Dan** Godsil (2015-18), the Hoosiers have turned to true freshman long snapper Sean Wracher.
- The Akron, Ohio, native was a Kohl'sKicking.com five-star prospect and ranked the No. 1 long snapper nationally by Kornblue Kicking.

- Tom Allen was named Indiana University's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016. He made his head coaching debut in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.
- The New Castle, Ind., native joined the IU staff as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016, and continued to oversee the defense in 2017 and 2018.
- In his two seasons as head coach, 21 Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors. A school-record 13 collected 2017 all-conference accolades, including six defenders, which matched 2016's program mark.
- Fifteen Indiana players have been drafted or invited to NFL camps over the past two seasons, including a school-record 11 in 2018. Eight worked out at the 2018 and 2019 NFL Combines, highlighted by a program-record five in 2018.
- Right guard Wes Martin (4th round, Washington, 2019), tight end lan Thomas (4th round, Carolina, 2018) and linebacker Chris Covington (6th round, Dallas, 2018) were selected in the NFL Draft.
- Wide receiver Simmie Cobbs Jr. (Saints), kicker Griffin Oakes and linebacker Tegray Scales (Steelers) garnered 2017 first-team all-league honors. Oakes was named the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year.
- A school-record 29 Hoosiers secured 2018 Academic All-Big Ten recognition to push Allen's two-year mark to 47.
- Achieved unparalleled recruiting success. IU's 2019 signing class is the highest rated in program history, besting the previous top-ranked class of 2018, and includes a record five four-star prospects.
- Defenses have reached heights not seen in a generation in Bloomington. Allen's charges finished 2018 with 26 takeaways (T-11th nationally; T-2nd in the Big Ten), 13 fumble recoveries (T-5th; 2nd) and 13 interceptions (T-33rd; T-6th)
- During the 2016-17 campaigns, the Hoosiers were the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third-down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ypg).
- Indiana finished ninth nationally in third-down defense (29.9 percent best program mark since 1992; 3rd in the Big Ten), 17th in passing defense (179.7 ypg best program mark since 1995; 4th in the Big Ten) and 26th in total defense (340.1 ypg best program mark since 1995) in 2017.
- IU ranked in the top six in the Big Ten in both total offense (6th) and total defense (6th) for the first time since 1991.
- Engineered one of the top defensive turnarounds in the country in 2016. The Hoosiers improved in every major statistical category against a schedule featuring four Top-10 opponents, a program first.
- Indiana held its opponents to 380.1 total yards, down 129.4 yards from 2015, the largest improvement in the country; limited its foes to 94.1 fewer passing yards, also first nationally; 10.4 fewer points, which ranked fourth nationally; and gave up 25 fewer touchdowns than in 2015.

- A nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award, Allen led the program's first All-American at linebacker since 1987, Scales (Sl.com second-teamer).
- Allen has strong ties to the Hoosier state as he served as head coach at Ben Davis High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion High School (1997), and earned his master's degree from IU (2002).
- Over the past 24-plus seasons, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 237-85 (.736).
- A 27-year coaching veteran, Allen was the defensive coordinator at the University of South Florida in 2015.
- South Florida posted an 8-5 record and earned a trip to the Miami Beach Bowl. Allen mentored three all-conference selections and the American Athletic Conference's top scoring defense (19.6 ppg in league play).
- In his lone season in Tampa, USF tied for 13th nationally in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), tied for 14th in interceptions (17), tied for 24th in takeaways (25), tied for 26th in sacks (2.62 per game), 31st in rushing defense (141.4 ypg), 34th in passing efficiency defense (118.76) and 35th in scoring defense (22.9 ppg).
- Spent the 2012-14 campaigns as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at Ole Miss, where he coached All-SEC linebackers Serderius Bryant and Denzel Nkemdiche.
- The Rebels closed out 2014 with a 9-3 record and ranked No. 9 after they met No. 6 TCU in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Ole Miss spent nine weeks in the Associated Press Top 10 with a high-water mark of No. 3.
- Additionally, the Rebels led the nation in scoring defense (13.8 ppg) and allowed a national-low 18 touchdowns.
- Ole Miss topped the SEC in five categories and ranked in the Top 20 nationally in 11, including 10th in red zone defense, 11th in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), 12th in takeaways (28), 13th in total defense (321.2 ypg) and 13th in defensive touchdowns scored (4).
- Worked with defensive coordinator Dave Wommack to help guide a huge improvement in the Rebels defense, which ranked last in the SEC in total defense before their arrival in 2011. Under their stewardship, Ole Miss consistently ranked among the top teams in the SEC and nationally in tackles for loss and sacks.
- Nkemdiche earned Freshman All-America honors and second-team All-SEC after he led the Rebels in tackles (82), TFLs (13.0), forced fumbles (4) and interceptions (3) in 2012.

DON FISCHER

This marks the 47th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-byplay "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. He shares the second-longest football radio tenure in the nation. The past 33 years, Fischer has worked as an

independent contractor and is currently serving the Indiana University Radio Network owned by Learfield IMG College out of Plano, Texas.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which included handling for 23 years the pre-season television play-by-play for the NFL's Indianapolis Colts (1995-2017).

During his 46 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 30 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 26 times, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

He received the inaugural Woody Durham College Voice Award from the National Sports Media Association, the University of North Carolina and Learfield Sports in June of 2018.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast over 1,900 Indiana University games - a total that includes 10 bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, III., Fischer has been in the radio business for 53 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, III.; Springfield, III.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and 12 grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr is entering his 15th season as the color commentator and analyst for Indiana University football.

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95)

as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory.

After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a thenschool record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.

They have four grandchildren: Addy, Hayden, Taylor and Mack.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 36th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in

Bloomington, is in his 50th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, III. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Smith handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Smith has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, currently resides in Brownsburg, Ind., with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden, Kaleb and Logan. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, currently reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan and two daughters, Emerson and Carolina.

TEAM

- Today's game kicked off the 135th season of Indiana Football.
- Indiana has won 14 of its last 16 season openers.
- Head coach **Tom Allen** is 2-1 in openers, with the lone loss coming in 2017 to No. 2 Ohio State.
- IU has won 15 of its last 16 non-conference games, including seven straight.
- Indiana leads the all-time series with the Cardinals, 7-3, and has won three-consecutive contests.
- IU is now 40-9-1 (.810) all-time against Mid-American Conference opponents.
- The Hoosiers won the coin toss and elected to defer.
- True freshmen D.K. Bonhomme, David Ellis, Sampson James, Tiawan Mullen and Sean Wracher made their Indiana debuts.
- Senior left tackle **Coy Cronk**, fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones**, fifth-year senior right guard **Simon Stepaniak** and fifth-year senior wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** served as game captains.

OFFENSE

- Redshirt freshman **Michael Penix Jr.** became the first IU freshman quarterback to start a season opener since Antwaan Randle El in 1998.
- Penix joined Randle El as the only freshman to surpass 300 passing yards in his first start and is one of just four freshmen to reach the benchmark (Kellen Lewis, Bob Hoernschemeyer). The Tampa native finished with 326 yards on 24-of-40 with one touchdown. Penix added 67 yards on the ground for 393 total yards.
- His total yards and passing yards trail only Randle El for the most in a debut. Randle El posted 467 total yards and 385 passing yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 1998.
- The Hoosiers reached the end zone for the first time in 2019 when Penix connected with fifthyear senior **Nick Westbrook** from 75 yards out in the first quarter. It marked Indiana's longest passing touchdown since Westbrook hauled in a 75-yarder from Richard Lagow vs. Wake Forest on Sept. 24, 2016.
- Westbrook now owns three 70-plus yard TDs (79, 75, 75), two of which have come against Ball State (79, Ball State in 2016), while the 75-yarder was a career-best for Penix.
- The Lake Mary, Fla., native went over 100 yards for the sixth time in his career with 103 on three receptions.
- Stevie Scott III reached the end zone twice, his third-career multi-score rushing game. The sophomore rushed for 48 yards, matched a career-best with three catches and set a career-high with 28 receiving yards.
- Redshirt sophomore tight end **Peyton Hendershot** set new career-highs with 69 yards and four receptions. Hendershot also hauled in a two-point conversion in the fourth quarter.
- Junior **Ty Fryfogle** set a new career-high with six receptions and finished with 41 yards.
- Junior Whop Philyor caught six balls for 66 yards and added a 22-yard rush.
- Penix, junior left guard Harry Crider and redshirt sophomore right tackle Caleb Jones made their first career starts.

DEFENSE

- Fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jone**s led the Hoosiers in tackles with a career-high 11, his first double-digit game.
- Redshirt junior husky Marcelino Ball matched his career-best for the fifth time with 10 stops.
- Sophomore safety **Devon Matthews** posted a career-high with nine tackles and six solos.
- Sophomore linebackers **Micah McFadden** (1 TFL) and Cam Jones (1 PBU, 1 QBH) also netted career-bests with six stops.
- Sophomore husky **Jamar Johnson** secured the team's first sack of the season and the first of his career in the third quarter.
- Redshirt junior defensive lineman Jerome Johnson and redshirt freshman linebacker James
 Miller combined for a sack in the fourth quarter, and Johnson accounted for the team's final sack later in the stanza.
- Johnson tied his career-high with 1.5 sacks and five tackles. He now owns six career sacks, while Miller entered the sack column for the first time.
- Sophomore **Jaylin Williams** pulled in his second career interception in the fourth quarter, returning the pick 29 yards.
- With the INT, the Hoosiers have at least one takeaway in their last 19 games, the longest streak in the country, and at least one pick in 11 straight contests.
- Fifth-year senior cornerback **Andre Brown Jr.** posted four stops to push his career total to 101.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive end Alfred Bryant, redshirt sophomore defensive tackle Juan Harris, sophomore defensive end James Head Jr., sophomore safety Devon Matthews and sophomore linebacker Micah McFadden made their first career starts.

- Fifth-year senior **Logan Justus** put the Hoosiers first points of 2019 on the board with a thencareer-long 48-yard field goal in the opening quarter. He then went on to best that twice, including a 49-yarder in the second quarter and a 50-yarder in the fourth quarter. Justus also added a 30-yard field goal to finish the game with a career-high four, tying the single-game Indiana record.
- The McCordsville, Ind., native collected his second game with at least three field goals, and is now 19-of-22 in his career (86.3 percent). Justus recorded his sixth-career multi-FG game and his fourth in five games, and he has hit 12 of his last 13 attempts.
- Justus is the 11th Hoosier (22nd time) to record a 50-yarder.
- Freshman David Ellis returned four kicks for 104 yards. In addition, he completed a two-point
 conversation on a pass to Peyton Hendershot in the fourth quarter.
- Fifth-year senior **Haydon Whitehead** averaged 51.7 yards on three punts. Whitehead recorded a career-best 63-yard effort in the fourth quarter and had two punts downed inside the 10-yard line.

TEAM

- Indiana Football opened its 60th season at Memorial Stadium.
- The 52-point margin of victory was the most in Memorial Stadium history, eclipsing the 51-point win the Hoosiers had over Missouri (58-7) on Sept. 22, 1990. It was also IU's largest margin of victory since a 54-0 blanking of Nebraska in Bloomington on Oct. 14, 1944.
- Indiana is 42-18 in Memorial Stadium openers with wins in 16 of its last 18 and 33 of its last 38.
- The Hoosiers improved to 2-0 for the second-straight season, the second time under head coach Tom Allen and the fourth time in the past five campaigns.
 - Today marked the first meeting between the two programs.

OFFENSE

- Junior wide receiver Whop Philyor became the 46th player in Indiana football history to amass 1,000 career receiving yards. Philyor has 97 catches for 1,123 yards
- · Philyor compiled 10 receptions for a career-high 182 yards overall. The 100-yard game marked the fourth of his career and second in as many games.
- He is the first Indiana pass catcher since Ricky Jones to post back-to-back 100-yard receiving games.
 In 2016, Jones had 208 yards against Wake Forest on Sept. 24, and 124 yards against Michigan State on Oct. 1. Philyor's two-game stretch of 24 catches is the most over a two-game stretch in school history and his 324 yards are the second-most.
- The game marked the fourth time Philyor has hauled in at least 10 receptions in a single game, which extended his program record. He made 14 grabs last time out at Michigan State and is the first Hoosier to record back-to-back 10-plus catch games.
- Indiana compiled a season-high 557 yards of total yards of offense. The game marks the second time

- Indiana held Rutgers to 5-for-13 passing for one yard. The passing total is the lowest output for a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team this season and the lowest figure IU has yielded against a Big Ten Conference opponent since holding Minnesota to 0 yards on Oct. 19, 1985.
- The Hoosiers have blanked Rutgers in each of RU's last two trips to Memorial Stadium after defeating the Scarlet Knights, 41-0, on Nov. 18, 2017. The last time Indiana shut out a Big Ten opponent in back-toback home games was in 1991 and 1993 against Michigan State.
- The shutout is the fourth for IU since the start of the 2017 season.
- The Hoosiers held Rutgers to 75 total yards, the fewest allowed dating back to 1966.
- With the first-quarter fumble recovery, Indiana has recorded at least one takeaway in 22 of the last 24 games played.

- Sophomore husky **Jamar Johnson** set a career-high with two tackles for loss and matched a career-best with one sack. The sack marked the second of his career. He finished the game with three tackles (2 solo).
- Redshirt junior husky **Marcelino Ball** recorded his first sack of the season in the third quarter. He has 3.5 sacks in his career. Ball also tallied five total tackles, tied for the team lead, with four solo stops.
- Senior safety Khalil Bryant was the third Hoosier with five stops, which matched a career-best.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Indiana's career field goal percentage leader Logan Justus continued his perfect season with a 21-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 34-yarder in the fourth quarter. He is a perfect 9-for-9 on field goal attempts and 27-for-27 on extra points this year.
- Justus is now 24-of-27 on field goals (88.9 percent) and 59-of-60 on PATs (98.3 percent). His 24 career field goals are tied for ninth in program history and his 59 PATs are 10th on the program's career list.
- The McCordsville, Ind., native has converted nine-straight field goals, a career-best streak, and a mark that ranks tied for the sixth-longest streak in IU history.
