SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana (3-2, 0-2 B1G East) welcomes Rutgers (1-4, 0-3 B1G East) for the school's Bicentennial Homecoming on Saturday, Oct. 12. Kickoff is set for noon EDT at Memorial Stadium (52,656; FieldTurf) on BTN.
- IU owns a 44-56-6 record on Homecoming.
- The Hoosiers will host the Scarlet Knights for the second time (2015) on Homecoming.
- Saturday marks the sixth meeting between the two programs and the third in Bloomington.
- Indiana has won the last three games in the series: on Nov. 5, 2016 (33-27, A), on Nov. 18, 2017 (41-0, H) and on Sept. 29 2018 (24-17, A).
- IU is 3-2 overall against RU and 1-1 at Memorial Stadium.
- The Hoosiers will wear special uniforms to commemorate the university's bicentennial.

- Tom Allen was named Indiana's head coach on Dec. 1, 2016, and made his debut at the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl against Utah. The New Castle, Ind., native joined IU as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016. In Allen's two seasons as head coach, 21 Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors and 15 have been drafted or invited to NFL camps. (full bio on page 18)
- Nunzio Campanile was elevated to interim head coach on Sept. 29, 2019. Campanile, who is in his second year at Rutgers, serves as offensive coordinator. He has also coached running backs (2018) and tight ends (2019).

- Michael Penix Jr. earned his second Big Ten Freshman of the Week honor after he went 33-of-42 (78.6 percent) for 286 yards with a career-best three passing TDs and one rushing score at No. 25 Michigan State.
- The Tampa native completed a school-record 20-straight passes, the second-longest streak in conference history behind Chuck Long's 22-consecutive completions in 1984.
- . Whop Philyor reached double-digits in receptions for a program-record third time with 14 (T-1st nationally in 2019), which shares third on Indiana's single-game list.
- The Tampa Plant graduate topped 100 yards for the third time in his career with 142 yards (6th-most in the B1G in 2019) and hauled in a career-best two scores.
- Philyor's 6.2 grabs per game rank fourth in the league (T-23rd nationally), and his 74.2 yards sit fifth.
- IU is third in the Big Ten in passing offense (304.0, 21st nationally) and third-down conversions (48.5, 14th), and fourth in time of possession (32:47, 20th) and first downs (23.4, T-35th).
- True freshman cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** broke up a team season-high four passes against the Spartans and shares sixth in the conference with 1.0 passes defended per game.



TERRY TALLEN INDIANA FOOTBALL COMPLEX OPENS

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex officially opened on Aug. 13, 2019. Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics on April 20, 2018. This \$2 million commitment helped provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area will be permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex fills 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex includes the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches' locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, the Hoosiers first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International's Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana's Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company's Chairman and CEO. Tallen Capital Partners, LLC is a privately held, vertically integrated retail and mixed-use real estate investment and development organization with offices in San Diego and San Francisco. Prior to founding Tallen Capital Partners and becoming an entrepreneur, Terry enjoyed a corporate career as a senior executive with some of our country's largest public as well as private companies. He is considered one of the leading shopping center investors and developers in the Western U.S.





TEAM

• With their 38-3 win over Connecticut, Indiana has won 17 of their last 18 regular season non-conference games, including nine straight, and 12 of their last 13 at Memorial Stadium.

IU's nine-consecutive victories mark the program's longest winning streak since 1909-15 (16 straight).

• Former kicker Chris Gartner (1970-72) and linebacker **Donnie Thomas** (posthumously, 1973-75) were officially inducted into the Indiana Athletics Hall of Fame on Sept. 20.

A native of Gothenburg, Sweden, Gartner earned first-team All-America and first-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 1972. Thomas was named firstteam All-Big Ten and third-team All-America in 1975.

· After three years as defensive coordinator, Indiana head coach Tom Allen handed over the reins to Kane **Wommack** (bio on page 9), who at 32 is the youngest Power 5 defensive coordinator. Wommack coached the Hoosiers linebackers in 2018.

Mike DeBord retired after two seasons as offensive coordinator and Allen brought in Kalen DeBoer (bio on page 5), who served in the same capacity at Fresno State University in 2017 and 2018.

- Tom Allen's son, Thomas, is an IU redshirt sophomore linebacker. Tom is one of five FBS head coaches to coach his son:
- *Dana and Logan Holgorsen (Houston)
- *Phillip and Cannon Montgomery (Tulsa)
- *Dabo, Will and Drew Swinney (Clemson)
- *Bobby and Derek Wilder (Old Dominion)
- The Hoosiers welcomed the top-rated signing class in program history in February, which bested last season's record-setting class. Nineteen of this year's 22 signed in the early period in December.

The 2019 class features five four-star prospects: running back Sampson James (ESPN, Rivals, 247), defensive back Tiawan Mullen (Rivals), defensive lineman Beau Robbins (ESPN, Rivals, 247), defensive back **Josh Sanguinetti** (ESPN) and linebacker Cameron Williams (Rivals, 247).

Quarterback Jack Tuttle, a Utah transfer and mid-year enrollee who is eligible in 2019, was a 2018 four-star prospect (Rivals, 247). Long snapper Sean **Wracher** is a five-star prospect (KohlsKicking.com).

YOUTHFUL EXPERIENCE

Offensive lineman Matthew Bedford, defensive lineman Juan Harris. James. offensive lineman Mike Katic, defensive back Larry Tracy III and Tuttle enrolled in the spring semester and practiced.

Thirty-six true freshmen (10 in 2019, 16 in 2018, 10 in 2017) have played in **Tom Allen's** tenure.

• Former IU QB Antwaan Randle EI (1998-2001) is on the 2019 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame for the eighth-consecutive year.

He earned All-Big Ten distinction in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1998. The Big Ten MVP and first-team All-American in 2001, Randle El was also sixth in Heisman Trophy balloting after he finished 13th in 2000.

The Riverdale, III., native was the first player in NCAA history to score 40 touchdowns (45) and throw for 40 TDs (42), the first to record over 2,500 total yards in four seasons, and the first to both pass for over 6,000 yards and rush for over 3,000 yards.

- Eleven Hoosiers are currently on NFL rosters: RB Tevin Coleman (49ers), LB Chris Covington (Cowboys), OL Dan Feeney (Chargers), RB Jordan Howard (Eagles), OL Brandon Knight (Cowboys), WR Cody Latimer (Giants), OL Wes Martin (Redskins), OL Rodger Saffold (Titans), OL Jason Spriggs (Packers), OB Nate Sudfeld (Eagles) and TE Ian Thomas (Panthers).
- Indiana is wearing a patch of the CFB150 logo to celebrate the 150th birthday of college football.

The Hoosiers are also wearing an Indiana University Bicentennial decal on their helmets for IU's 200th anniversary. Jan. 20, 2020, is the official anniversary.

• Redshirt junior kickoff specialist Nathanael **Snyder** was awarded a scholarship at Lucas Oil Stadium on Aug. 22. Former Colts punter Pat McAfee surprised Snyder with the news on the stadium's videoboard at the end of practice.

Redshirt junior running back Connor Thomas, redshirt sophomore running back Ahrod Lloyd and redshirt sophomore defensive back Samuel Slusher were awarded scholarships at the end of fall camp.

- A program-record 29 Indiana football studentathletes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2018. Forty-seven Hoosiers have collected the accolades in Tom Allen's first two seasons.
- Head coach Tom Allen's radio show. Inside IU Football with Tom Allen, will be held Wednesday evenings at 7:05 p.m. EDT on the IU Radio Network. **Don Fischer**, who is in his 47th season as The Voice of the Hoosiers (T-2nd-longest active FBS radio p-b-p), hosts the show live from the Bloomington Holiday Inn.

OFFENSE

- Kalen DeBoer leads IU's offense following Mike DeBord's (2017-18) retirement. DeBoer also serves as associate head coach and quarterbacks coach.
- · Indiana is third in the Big Ten in passing offense (304.0, 21st nationally) and third-down conversions (48.5, 14th), fourth in time of possession (32:47, 20th) and first downs (23.4, T-35th), fifth in passing efficiency (154.9, 30th), passing touchdowns (12, T-26th) and sacks allowed (1.60), and sixth in scoring offense (33.0).
- The Hoosiers have scored 31-or-more points four times, matching 2018's season total, and passed for 300-plus yards twice, one behind last year's total.
- IU threw for 286 yards, totaled 356 yards and scored 31 points at No. 25 Michigan State, all seasonhighs against the Spartans defense.
- MSU entered the game allowing 176.0 passing yards, 228.2 total yards and 11.0 points.
- Indiana's 52 points against Eastern Illinois were the most since a 52-17 win vs. Georgia Southern on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Its 555 total yards were the most since Nov. 5, 2016, at Rutgers (567), and its 441 passing yards were its most since Sept. 24, 2016, vs. Wake Forest (496).
- · Fourteen players have caught a pass, 12 have recorded a rush and 10 have reached the end zone.
- DeBoer has made use of his tight ends and running backs in the receiving game.
- The tight ends have combined for 24 receptions for 272 yards and three touchdowns, while the backs have caught 23 for 193 yards with one TD.
- · A three-time national champion head coach at the University of Sioux Falls (2006, 2008-09) and veteran play-caller of 19 years. DeBoer comes to Bloomington

- after stints as assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Fresno State University (2017-18), and offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Eastern Michigan University
- Before his arrival, Fresno State ranked 120th nationally in total offense only to jump to 47th over his two seasons, while Eastern Michigan moved from 111th to 35th.
- The Bulldogs went 22-6 in his 28 games as coordinator after a 4-20 mark the previous two campaigns, and the Eagles made the program's second bowl game and posted their first winning record (2016) since 1995.
- FSU became the second team in FBS history to record a double-digit win year (10-4 in 2017) on the heels of a double-digit loss season (1-11 in 2016). The nine-win turnaround was the largest in the country, a feat matched by EMU in 2016 (+6).
- IU returned nine starters and 23 letterwinners from an offense that ranked second in the Big Ten and shared 24th nationally in first downs per game (23.5).
- Indiana finished third in the conference (36th nationally) in passing offense (257.8) and tied for sixth in passing touchdowns (20).
- Sophomore running back Stevie Scott III is on the Maxwell Award and Doak Walker Award Watch Lists, senior left tackle Coy Cronk is on the Outland Trophy Watch List and fifth-year senior center **Hunter Littlejohn** is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List.
- Left tackle Wes Martin was selected in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Washington Redskins and right tackle Brandon Knight signed a free-agent deal with the Dallas Cowbovs.

TIGHT END

- Redshirt sophomore **Peyton Hendershot** is enjoying a breakout season.
- Entering 2019 with 15 receptions for 163 yards and two touchdowns in 11 games, Hendershot owns 20 catches (2nd on team) for 242 yards (3rd) and three TDs (T-1st) through five games this year.
- His 4.0 receptions (T-10th overall) and his 48.4 yards per game lead all Big Ten tight ends, while his three scores share first (T-9th).
- · Among tight ends nationally, he shares 10th in touchdowns, shares 11th in catches, and he is 15th in receiving yardage.
- The North Salem, Ind., native set or matched career-highs in receptions or yardage in each of the first four weeks and has led the team in catches on three occasions.
- Against No. 6 Ohio State, he collected a new high with 70 yards, including a career-long 49-yard TD, on
- The 6-4, 255-pounder posted a career-high with five receptions for 52 yards with a score in the Eastern Illinois win a week after he caught four balls for 69 vards and a two-point conversion in the 2019 seasonopening victory vs. Ball State.
- Former Hoosier tight end lan Thomas (2016-17) was selected with the first pick of the fourth round in the 2018 NFL Draft by Carolina.
- He made 36 receptions for 333 yards and two scores in his rookie campaign.
- Nick Sheridan is in his first season coaching the Indiana tight ends.

- He was named one of the nation's top 30 coaches under 30 years of age by 247 Sports in 2017.
- A quarterback at the University of Michigan (2006-09), Sheridan appeared in 12 games and made four starts. His father, Bill, is the defensive coordinator/ linebackers coach at Boston College.

WIDE RECEIVER

- Nick Westbrook (112, 1823, 13), Donavan Hale (79, 1127, 10), Whop Philyor (87, 941, 7) and Ty Fryfogle (48, 555, 3) account for 326 receptions, 4,446 yards and 33 touchdowns.
- Philyor tops the Hoosiers with 31 catches, 371 yards and three TDs (tied). His 6.2 grabs per game rank fourth in the Big Ten (T-23rd nationally), his 74.2 yards sit fifth and his three scores share ninth.
- The Tampa Plant graduate reached double-digits in receptions for a program-record third time with 14 (T-1st nationally in 2019) at No. 25 Michigan State.
- Philyor topped 100 yards for the third time in his career with 142 (6th-most in the Big Ten in 2019) and caught a career-best two touchdowns.
- He also hauled in 10-plus completions vs. MSU in 2018 (13 for 148) and at Maryland in 2017 (13 for 127).
- The 14 catches share third and the 13 share fifth on Indiana's single-game charts.
- A 5-11, 178-pounder, Philyor is a three-time IU offensive player of the week this season.
- As a true freshman in 2017, his receptions (33) and TDs (3) rank first, and yardage (335) is third on the Hoosiers true freshman single-season lists.
- Philyor made 23 grabs for 235 yards and one score in just five starts due to injury one year ago.
- His parents began calling him Whop because of his love for Burger King's Whoppers.
- A two-time Biletnikoff Watch Lister, Westbrook became the 19th Hoosier to reach 100 catches and 1,500 yards. He has 10 for 169 (16.9 average) with two TDs in 2019, including a Big Ten-long 75-yarder.
- The fifth-year senior out of Lake Mary, Fla., owns a team-leading six 100-yard games, including a 103yard effort (3 receptions) in the season-opening Ball State win, and two multi-touchdown games.

- He sustained a season-ending ACL injury on the opening kickoff of 2017, and bounced back to lead the team with 590 yards, 49.2 yards per game and 14.0 yards per grab in 2018.
- The 6-3, 219-pounder also produced the Big Ten's top deep passer rating (123.1), according to Pro Football Focus, and has hauled in three passes of at least 75 yards in his career (75-twice, 79).
- A 2016 honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick, he caught 54 passes for an 18.4 average and six scores.
- The three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection came up five yards shy of becoming the seventh Hoosier to reach the 1,000-yard mark. His 995 yards are seventh in school history.
- Fellow fifth-year senior Hale reached the century mark for the first time in his career in the Eastern Illinois win and became the 45th Hoosier to surpass 1,000 yards against No. 6 Ohio State.
- Hale also threw a 49-yard touchdown vs. OSU and owns 16 receptions for 283 yards (2nd on the team) with two TDs (T-3rd) and a team-best 17.7 average per catch on the year.
- He made five catches for 110 yards with a 43-yard score, his third-career 40-plus yarder, vs. EIU.
- · Against the Spartans, Hale delivered seven grabs for 99 yards and one touchdown.
- The Largo, Fla., native earned honorable-mention All-Big Ten with 42 catches (3rd on the team) for 508 yards (2nd) and six scores (1st), which shared 11th in the conference, one season ago.
- · A junior out of Lucedale, Miss., Fryfogle is third on the team with 18 receptions for 161 yards.
- He led the Hoosiers with six catches (41 yards) vs. Ball State and five in the Connecticut win (47 yards).
- Fryfogle posted 29 grabs for 381 yards, including a career-high 71 against lowa, and three scores in 2018.

QUARTERBACK

- Redshirt freshmen Michael Penix Jr. earned the starting job after winning the competition in fall camp over redshirt junior Peyton Ramsey and redshirt freshman Jack Tuttle.
- The Tampa native has claimed Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors twice (Ball State, Michigan State) in his three starts (missed 2 games due to injury).
- Penix is 71-of-102 (69.6 percent) for 809 yards with six touchdowns and two interceptions, good for a 151.72 pass-efficiency rating.
- He has rushed for 75 yards on 11 attempts (6.8 average) with one TD.
- The southpaw is averaging 269.7 passing yards and 294.7 total yards per game.
- Penix became the first Indiana freshman to start the opening game at quarterback since Antwaan Randle El in 1998.
- And like Randle El, Penix delivered a performance to remember. He joined Randle El as the only freshman to surpass 300 passing yards in his first start and is one of just four freshmen to ever reach the benchmark (Kellen Lewis, Bob Hoernschemeyer).
- Penix finished with 326 yards on 24-of-40 with a 75-yard score, IU's longest since Sept. 24, 2016. Penix added 67 yards on the ground for 393 total yards.
- · His total yardage and passing yardage trail only Randle El for the most in a freshman debut. Randle El posted 467 total yards and 385 passing yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 1998.
- In his first-career road start at No. 25 Michigan State, he went 33-of-42 (78.6 percent) for 286 yards with a career-best three passing touchdowns and one rushing TD.
- The 6-3, 202-pounder completed a school-record 20-straight passes, the second-longest streak in Big Ten history behind Chuck Long's 22-straight in 1984.
- His 33 completions were a career-high and share seventh on the program's single-game list.
- Penix, the fifth Hoosiers true freshman quarterback to play, went 21-of-34 for 219 yards and one score with 45 yards on seven carries in three games in 2018.
- He suffered an ACL injury against No. 18 Penn State in game eight.

- A team captain at Tampa Bay Technical High School, Penix threw for 61 touchdowns and just six INTs with 16 rushing TDs in his two years as a starter (24 games).
- He also played center field, jumped 22 feet in the long jump and ran a 22.8 in the 200-meter dash.
- Ramsey has started two games in 2019. He saw his first action in the Eastern Illinois win, where he set the program's single-game completion percentage mark on 13-of-14 (92.9) for 226 yards with TDs of 64
- In the win over UConn, he completed 23-of-27 for 247 yards and three touchdowns, his fourth-career game with three passing scores.
- His completion percentage of 85.2 is third on the program's single-game list. Ramsey now owns the first, third and fourth spots.
- He is Indiana's all-time completion percentage leader (66.7), shares fifth in 300-yard games (3), is sixth in completions (461), shares sixth in passing scores (34), is eighth in total offense (5,364) and attempts (726), and ninth in passing yardage (4,762).
- In 24 career games (18 starts), he owns 11 multitouchdown passing games, and six games with at least one passing and rushing score.
- The 6-2, 216-pound righty played for his father, Doug, at Cincinnati Elder High School.
- A two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, Peyton is named after Peyton Manning, his older brother Montana "Tanner" is named after Joe Montana and his younger brother Drew is named after Drew
- Tuttle, who made his debut against EIU, transferred from the University of Utah on Dec. 17, 2018, practiced with the Hoosiers and was ruled eligible for the 2019 campaign in the spring. He did not see action at Utah.
- A graduate of Mission Hills High School in San Marcos, Calif., Tuttle was a Rivals and 247Sports fourstar prospect.
- The 6-4, 210-pound right-hander was ranked the No. 4 pro-style guarterback nationally by Rivals, the No. 5 pro-style quarterback nationally by 247Sports and the No. 13 player in California by 247Sports.
- Tuttle's father, Jay, was a walk-on kicker at IU from 1986-88

RUNNING BACK

- A member of the 2019 Maxwell Award and Doak Award Watch Lists, Stevie Scott III posted seasonhighs with 21 carries for 97 yards with one touchdown against Connecticut.
- The sophomore owns 294 yards on 76 attempts with four scores (7th in B1G).
- Scott shares third among all Big Ten backs with 12 receptions for 102 yards. He caught 16 balls for 86 yards all of last year.
- He turned in the top true freshman running back campaign in program history in 2018.
- · Scott set Indiana true freshman records with 1,137 yards (losing just 18 yards), 228 attempts, 10 touchdowns and six 100-yard games.
- He averaged 94.8 yards and 101.9 all-purpose yards per game, 5.0 yards per carry, and added 16 receptions for 86 yards with one TD.
- The 6-2, 231-pounder became the 13th Hoosier (19th time) to reach 1,000 yards and his 1,137 yards rank 14th.
- Amongst true freshmen running backs nationally, Scott finished second in rushing yardage, 100-yard games and rushes, and third in rushing scores.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native finished fourth in the Big Ten in attempts per game (19.0, 23rd nationally), tied for fourth in rushing touchdowns, fifth in rushing yardage (33rd) and rushing yardage per game (27th), eighth in all-purpose yardage (1,223), tied for eighth in total TDs (11) and 10th in all-purpose yardage per game (101.9).
- · A two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, Scott finished with 204 yards, three shy of Anthony Thompson's Hoosiers true freshman record (1988), on 31 carries (6.6 average) with his first-career score, a 40-yarder, in a 20-16 victory over Virginia.

- IU's Offensive Newcomer of the Year was a 2016 all-state and All-Central New York selection as a back and linebacker before he was limited to three games due to injury in 2017 at Christian Brothers Academy.
- Ronnie Walker Jr. rushed 32 times for 141 yards (4.4) with two scores behind Scott as a true freshman.
- Walker caught a ball in the flat and raced 64 yards to paydirt for his first-career receiving touchdown against Eastern Illinois this year.
- The Hopewell, Va., native twice claimed all-state and all-region honors at Hopewell High School.
- True freshman **Sampson James** participated in 2019 spring practice after a distinguished career at Avon (Ind.) High School.
- The two-time all-stater was a consensus four-star prospect by ESPN, Rivals and 247Sports.
- James, who has 56 yards and a score in 2019, closed out his Avon career with 3,451 yards on 573 attempts (6.0 average) with 38 rushing touchdowns and 41 total TDs.
- A 2018 Broyles Award nominee, Mike Hart is in his third season as Indiana's running backs coach and his second as assistant head coach.
- The University of Michigan's all-time rushing leader, Hart spent three years with the Indianapolis Colts before entering the coaching ranks in 2011.
- In his eight years as a coach (Syracuse, 2016; Western Michigan, 2014-15; Eastern Michigan, 2011-13), Hart has tutored four 1,000-yard rushers, two Mid-American Conference (MAC) Freshman of the Year and the 2014 MAC Offensive Player of the Year, Jarvion Franklin.
- Each of the Hoosiers last four featured running backs have reached the NFL - Devine Redding (Kansas City), Jordan Howard (Philadelphia), Tevin Coleman (Atlanta) and Stephen Houston (New England, Pittsburgh and Baltimore).

THE START CHART

- Indiana returned 157 career starts from 12 players on offense and 131 career starts from 11 players on defense for a total of 288 career starts from 23 players.
- The offensive line is the team's most experienced unit with 103 career starts among seven players.
- On defense, the secondary is the most experienced unit with 117 career starts among eight different players.
- Across both lines, IU owns 151 career starts among 14 players.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Senior captain and left tackle Coy Cronk suffered a season-ending lower leg injury against Connecticut.
- · Cronk has started all 40 games in which he has appeared at left tackle since his arrival in 2016, when he earned 247Sports True Freshman All-America honors.
- The Lafavette, Ind., native is a member of the 2019 Outland Trophy and Senior Bowl Watch Lists.
- · A pair of seniors join Cronk on the Senior Bowl Watch List - right guard Simon Stepaniak (25 starts) and center Hunter Littlejohn (21 starts).
- The fifth-year seniors have started all five games in 2019, and Stepaniak has made 17-consecutive starts.
- A team captain, Stepaniak (6-4, 321) ranked 43rd on Bruce Feldman's 2019 Freaks list.
- Stepaniak benches 515 pounds, his hang clean max is 410 pounds, and he has done 41 reps on the 225-pound bench.
- Littlejohn (6-3, 315) is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List, awarded to the nation's top center.
- · A three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, he graduated with a healthcare management and policy degree in May 2019.
- Junior left guard Harry Crider (19 career games) and redshirt sophomore right tackle **Caleb Jones** (16) have also started all five games this year.

- Crider (6-4, 311) attended Columbus East High School in Columbus, Ind., while Jones (6-8, 358) was an all-state standout in 2015 and 2016 at Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis.
- True freshman Matthew Bedford filled in for Cronk at No. 25 Michigan State.
- Bedford (6-6, 307) participated in spring practice after he chose the Hoosiers over Mississippi State and South Carolina.
- Darren Hiller is in his third season overseeing the offensive line. A 25-year coaching veteran, Hiller has coached 20 players who have moved on to the NFL, including former Hoosiers Wes Martin (guard) and Brandon Knight (tackle).
- Martin, a fourth-round selection in the 2019 NFL Draft by Washington, joined 2016 and 2017 day two selections tackle Jason Spriggs (Green Bay) and guard Dan Feeney (Los Angeles Chargers).
- Spriggs was taken with pick No. 48 (round 2) and Feeney was selected with pick No. 71 (round 3).
- Knight signed a 2019 free-agent deal with Dallas.
- The quartet, along with Rodger Saffold, a 10year veteran tackle who signed with Tennessee this offseason, gives Indiana five former O-line standouts currently on NFL rosters.

DEFENSE

- After three years running the Indiana defense, **Tom** Allen turned over the reins to Kane Wommack, who served as linebackers coach in 2018.
- · Wommack's charges recorded the IU's first shutout since 2017 in a 52-0 whitewashing of Eastern Illinois.
- The shutout was the Hoosiers first in a home opener since beating Toledo, 27-0, on Sept. 4, 1993.
- Indiana allowed 116 total yards the fewest dating back to 1966; 64 passing yards - the fewest since 58 vs. Michigan on Oct. 14, 2017; and 52 rushing yards the fewest since 33 at Illinois on Nov. 11, 2017.
- In the win over Connecticut, IU held Connecticut to three points (fewest against an FBS opponent since Rutgers - 0 on Nov. 18, 2017), 145 total yards (Michigan State - 138 on Oct. 5, 1991), 94 passing vards (Michigan - 54 on Oct. 14, 2017) and 51 rushing yards (Illinois - 33 on Nov. 11, 2017).
- The Hoosiers have at least one takeaway in 21 of their last 23 games and an interception in 12 of their last 15 contests.
- Wommack worked with Allen as an Ole Miss graduate assistant in 2012-13, when Allen was linebackers coach under defensive coordinator Dave Wommack, Kane's father.
- · At 32 years of age, Wommack is the youngest Power 5 defensive coordinator.
- He served as the University of South Alabama's defensive coordinator, the youngest in the FBS, and linebackers coach in 2016-17, after two seasons (2014-15) as defensive coordinator at Eastern Illinois
- Wommack engineered one of the top turnarounds in the country in 2016. The unit was the fifth-most improved nationally in scoring defense (-10.3), one spot behind the Hoosiers, and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in passing defense.

- IU finished 2018 with 26 takeaways (T-11th nationally; T-2nd in the Big Ten), 13 fumble recoveries (T-5th; 2nd) and 13 interceptions (T-33rd; T-6th).
- During the 2016-17 campaigns, Indiana was the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third-down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ypg).
- The Hoosiers finished ninth nationally in third-down defense (29.9 percent - best program mark since 1992; 3rd in the Big Ten), 17th in passing defense (179.7 ypg – best program mark since 1995; 4th in the Big Ten) and 26th in total defense (340.1 ypg - best program mark since 1995) in 2017.
- In 2016, IU held its opponents to 380.1 total yards, down 129.4 yards from 2015, the largest improvement in the country; limited its foes to 94.1 fewer passing yards, also first nationally; 10.4 fewer points, which ranked fourth nationally; and gave up 25 fewer touchdowns than in 2015.
- Wommack stresses the importance of takeaways and his magic number per game is three.
- The defense reached that number four times in 2016, twice in 2017 and five times in 2018.
- Since the start of 2016 (42 games), Indiana has four games with four takeaways (3 in 2018), 11 with at least three takeaways (5 in 2018) and 17 with multiple takeaways (6).
- IU returned nine starters and 26 letterwinners on defense, including 19 underclassmen (10 true freshmen, 5 redshirt freshmen and 4 sophomores) who saw action in 2018.

- Fifth-year senior **Reakwon Jones** brings the most experience to the linebackers room. He has appeared in 36 games with 15-straight starts at the stinger position (weak-side LB).
- Jones paces the team with 29 tackles and 18 solos to go along with a half-TFL and one quarterback hurry.
- He has led the team in stops four times, including in the season-opening win over Ball State.
- The 6-2, 233-pounder posted a game- and careerhigh 11 tackles, his first double-digit contest en route to IU defensive player of the week honors.
- Jones made 36 stops, 24 solo, 4.5 for loss, one sack, one fumble recovery, two pass breakups and one QBH with a pair of 2018 team defensive POW accolades in 10 starts.
- A Lynn Haven, Fla., native, Jones saw his family's home destroyed by Hurricane Michael on Oct. 10, 2018. Through a GoFundMe page, Hoosier Nation helped raise \$16,705 and the family is now living in an apartment in Panama City, Fla.
- Sophomore **Cam Jones** has shifted over from the husky position to stinger in 2019 and owns 14 tackles, nine solo, one for loss, one pick-6, two pass breakups and one QB hurry in four games.
- In the win over UConn, Jones picked off his secondcareer pass and returned it 44 yards. He added four stops, the TFL and the PBU.

- A 2018 two-time defensive scout team player of the week and one-time special teams scout team player of the week, the Tampa native (Armwood H.S.) chose the Hoosiers over Florida State.
- Thomas Allen has 10 tackles after he collected 28 stops, 20 solo, with one sack, three for loss, one INT (30 yards) and two hurries in 12 games one year ago.
- An Academic All-Big Ten selection, the redshirt sophomore is the son of head coach Tom Allen.
- Allen was a teammate of McFadden at Plant.


- Marcelino Ball is the team leader in career tackles (170) and solos (123). He shares the top spot with three interceptions, is second in stops for loss with 12.5 and is third with 11 pass breakups.
- The 20-year old, redshirt junior also owns 2.5 sacks, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in 33 career games (30 starts).
- He opened 2019 with a career-high 10 stops (5th time) the in win over Ball State and is fourth on the team with 16 overall, 10 solo.

- The quartet welcomes back sophomore Reese **Taylor**, who started 2018 at corner as a true freshman before moving to the offense in week two, and true freshman Tiawan Mullen out of Coconut Creek High School in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.
- Brown, who graduated with a human resources management degree in May 2019, and is currently enrolled in the public affairs master of public administration program, started all 12 games in 2018.
- He registered 29 tackles, 24 solo, with two for loss and a team-high six pass breakups.
- The Decatur, Ga., native owns 104 career stops, 80 solo, five for loss, with 13 PBUs, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and one touchdown.
- · Layne, a Deland, Fla., product leads the corners with 14 tackles and 13 solos in five starts this season.

- Riggins has 71 career stops, 59 solo, two for loss, one sack, a team-high 17 PBUs, one interception and one forced fumble.

- Indiana's all-time field goal percentage leader has not missed a field goal in seven attempts or an extra point in 18 tries.
- Justus, who has hit 15 of his last 16 attempts, is third in the Big Ten (T-31st nationally) in field goals made and seventh in scoring among all players (7.8).
- The left-footer is one of 30 members on this year's Groza Award Watch List and sits 22-of-25 in his career (88.0 percent) and 50-of-51 on PATs (98.0), good for 116 career points.
- His 22 field goals share 10th on the program's alltime list.
- · Justus opened his second season as the Hoosiers kicker with perhaps his career-best performance, as he matched a program record with a career-high four field goals, in four attempts.
- Three times he bested his career-long with 48-, 49- and 50-yarders en route to his second-career Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honor and his second-career Lou Groza Award Star of the Week recognition.
- Justus became the 11th Hoosier (22nd time) to record a 50-yarder, and he collected his second game with at least three field goals and his sixth-career multi-FG contest.
- The McCordsville, Ind., native finished the 2018 campaign 15-of-18 on field goals (83.3) and 32-of-33 on PATs. His 15 makes share eighth in school history.
- · A second-team All-Big Ten honoree, Justus ranked second in the conference in percentage (T-19th nationally) and was named IU's Most Outstanding Specialist of the Year.
- Justus hit the game-winner from 42 yards out with 2:32 remaining to lift IU to a 34-32 win over Maryland.

- He finished the game a perfect 6-of-6 (2 FGs, 4 PATs) en route to Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and Lou Groza Star of the Week accolades.
- Upon the conclusion of the 2018 campaign, the former walk-on was placed on scholarship.
- Three-time Ray Guy Award Watch Lister (2017-19) Haydon Whitehead only punted three times in the 2019 opener, but he made the most of them.
- The fifth-year senior averaged 51.7 yards, including a 63-yarder, and had two downed inside the 10-yard line en route to being named one of the Ray Guy Award's Rav's 8.
- Whitehead is averaging a career-high 43.9 yards (6th in the Big Ten) on 19 punts with five inside the 20 (all inside the 10) and five 50-plus yarders, including a career-long 65-yarder.
- The fifth-year senior holds a 40.9 career average with 14 50-yarders in addition to 55 punts inside the 20-yard line, 26 inside the 10 and 10 inside the 5.
- The Melbourne, Australia, native kicked in his first American football game ever in the 2017 season opener, and he went on to earn honorable-mention All-Big Ten (coaches and media).
- · Whitehead, who punts left-footed but is able to kick right-footed if necessary, enrolled in 2017 spring classes and participated in practice.
- The 24-year old played Australian Rules Football for 15 years. He made his first trip to the United States when he took his official visit to IU in December 2016.
- Whitehead trained under Nathan Chapman and John Smith at Prokick Australia in Melbourne.
- Prokick has produced five of the past six Ray Guy winners (2013-17), including all three finalists in 2016 and two of the three in 2017 and 2018.
- With the graduation of former long snapper **Dan** Godsil (2015-18), the Hoosiers have turned to true freshman long snapper Sean Wracher.
- The Akron, Ohio, native was a Kohl'sKicking.com five-star prospect and ranked the No. 1 long snapper nationally by Kornblue Kicking.

BOWL EXPERIENCE

- Tom Allen was named Indiana University's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016. He made his head coaching debut in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.
- The New Castle, Ind., native joined the IU staff as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016, and continued to oversee the defense in 2017 and 2018.
- In his two seasons as head coach, 21 Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors. A school-record 13 collected 2017 all-conference accolades, including six defenders, which matched 2016's program mark.
- Fifteen Indiana players have been drafted or invited to NFL camps over the past two seasons, including a school-record 11 in 2018. Eight worked out at the 2018 and 2019 NFL Combines, highlighted by a program-record five in 2018.
- Right guard Wes Martin (4th round, Washington, 2019), tight end lan Thomas (4th round, Carolina, 2018) and linebacker Chris Covington (6th round, Dallas, 2018) were selected in the NFL Draft.
- Wide receiver Simmie Cobbs Jr. (Saints), kicker Griffin Oakes and linebacker Tegray Scales (Steelers) garnered 2017 first-team all-league honors. Oakes was named the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year.
- A school-record 29 Hoosiers secured 2018 Academic All-Big Ten recognition to push Allen's two-year mark to 47.
- Achieved unparalleled recruiting success. IU's 2019 signing class is the highest rated in program history, besting the previous top-ranked class of 2018, and includes a record five four-star prospects.
- Defenses have reached heights not seen in a generation in Bloomington. Allen's charges finished 2018 with 26 takeaways (T-11th nationally; T-2nd in the Big Ten), 13 fumble recoveries (T-5th; 2nd) and 13 interceptions (T-33rd; T-6th)
- During the 2016-17 campaigns, the Hoosiers were the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third-down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ypg).
- Indiana finished ninth nationally in third-down defense (29.9 percent best program mark since 1992; 3rd in the Big Ten), 17th in passing defense (179.7 ypg best program mark since 1995; 4th in the Big Ten) and 26th in total defense (340.1 ypg best program mark since 1995) in 2017.
- IU ranked in the top six in the Big Ten in both total offense (6th) and total defense (6th) for the first time since 1991.
- Engineered one of the top defensive turnarounds in the country in 2016. The Hoosiers improved in every major statistical category against a schedule featuring four Top-10 opponents, a program first.
- Indiana held its opponents to 380.1 total yards, down 129.4 yards from 2015, the largest improvement in the country; limited its foes to 94.1 fewer passing yards, also first nationally; 10.4 fewer points, which ranked fourth nationally; and gave up 25 fewer touchdowns than in 2015.

- A nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award, Allen led the program's first All-American at linebacker since 1987, Scales (Sl.com second-teamer).
- Allen has strong ties to the Hoosier state as he served as head coach at Ben Davis High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion High School (1997), and earned his master's degree from IU (2002).
- Over the past 24-plus seasons, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 235-85 (.734).
- A 27-year coaching veteran, Allen was the defensive coordinator at the University of South Florida in 2015.
- South Florida posted an 8-5 record and earned a trip to the Miami Beach Bowl. Allen mentored three all-conference selections and the American Athletic Conference's top scoring defense (19.6 ppg in league play).
- In his lone season in Tampa, USF tied for 13th nationally in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), tied for 14th in interceptions (17), tied for 24th in takeaways (25), tied for 26th in sacks (2.62 per game), 31st in rushing defense (141.4 ypg), 34th in passing efficiency defense (118.76) and 35th in scoring defense (22.9 ppg).
- Spent the 2012-14 campaigns as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at Ole Miss, where he coached All-SEC linebackers Serderius Bryant and Denzel Nkemdiche.
- The Rebels closed out 2014 with a 9-3 record and ranked No. 9 after they met No. 6 TCU in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Ole Miss spent nine weeks in the Associated Press Top 10 with a high-water mark of No. 3.
- Additionally, the Rebels led the nation in scoring defense (13.8 ppg) and allowed a national-low 18 touchdowns.
- Ole Miss topped the SEC in five categories and ranked in the Top 20 nationally in 11, including 10th in red zone defense, 11th in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), 12th in takeaways (28), 13th in total defense (321.2 ypg) and 13th in defensive touchdowns scored (4).
- Worked with defensive coordinator Dave Wommack to help guide a huge improvement in the Rebels defense, which ranked last in the SEC in total defense before their arrival in 2011. Under their stewardship, Ole Miss consistently ranked among the top teams in the SEC and nationally in tackles for loss and sacks.
- Nkemdiche earned Freshman All-America honors and second-team All-SEC after he led the Rebels in tackles (82), TFLs (13.0), forced fumbles (4) and interceptions (3) in 2012.
- As assistant head coach at Arkansas State University (2011), the Red Wolves led the Sun Belt and ranked in the Top 25 nationally in total (331.46 ypg) and scoring defense (20.77 ppg). ASU also finished eighth nationally in tackles for loss (7.62 per game) and 15th in sacks (2.69 per game).
- Allen earned his bachelor's degree from Maranatha Baptist University (Wis.) in 1992. Tom and his wife, Tracy, have three children, Hannah (22), Thomas (20) and Brittney (18). Thomas is a redshirt sophomore linebacker with the Hoosiers.

Indiana University's football program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield IMG College holds the exclusive rights as IU's official radio outlet.



DON FISCHER

This marks the 47th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-byplay "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. He shares the second-longest football radio tenure in the nation. The past 33 years, Fischer has worked as an

independent contractor and is currently serving the Indiana University Radio Network owned by Learfield IMG College out of Plano, Texas.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which included handling for 23 years the pre-season television play-by-play for the NFL's Indianapolis Colts (1995-2017).

During his 46 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 30 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 26 times, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

He received the inaugural Woody Durham College Voice Award from the National Sports Media Association, the University of North Carolina and Learfield Sports in June of 2018.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast over 1,900 Indiana University games - a total that includes 10 bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, III., Fischer has been in the radio business for 53 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, III.; Springfield, III.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and 12 grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr is entering his 15th season as the color commentator and analyst for Indiana University football.

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95)

as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory.

After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a thenschool record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.

They have four grandchildren: Addy, Hayden, Taylor and Mack.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 36th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in

Bloomington, is in his 50th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, III. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Smith handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Smith has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, currently resides in Brownsburg, Ind., with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden, Kaleb and Logan. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, currently reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan and two daughters, Emerson and Carolina.

POST-GAME NOTES

TEAM

- Today's game kicked off the 135th season of Indiana Football.
- Indiana has won 14 of its last 16 season openers.
- Head coach **Tom Allen** is 2-1 in openers, with the lone loss coming in 2017 to No. 2 Ohio State.
- IU has won 15 of its last 16 non-conference games, including seven straight.
- Indiana leads the all-time series with the Cardinals, 7-3, and has won three-consecutive contests.
- IU is now 40-9-1 (.810) all-time against Mid-American Conference opponents.
- The Hoosiers won the coin toss and elected to defer.
- True freshmen D.K. Bonhomme, David Ellis, Sampson James, Tiawan Mullen and Sean Wracher made their Indiana debuts.
- Senior left tackle Coy Cronk, fifth-year senior linebacker Reakwon Jones, fifth-year senior right guard Simon Stepaniak and fifth-year wide receiver Nick Westbrook served as game captains.

DEFENSE

- Redshirt freshman **Michael Penix Jr.** became the first IU freshman quarterback to start a season opener since Antwaan Randle El in 1998.
- Penix joined Randle El as the only freshman to surpass 300 passing yards in his first start and is one of just four freshmen to reach the benchmark (Kellen Lewis, Bob Hoernschemeyer). The Tampa native finished with 326 yards on 24-of-40 with one touchdown. Penix added 67 yards on the ground for 393 total yards.
- His total yards and passing yards trail only Randle El for the most in a debut. Randle El posted 467 total yards and 385 passing yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 1998.
- The Hoosiers reached the end zone for the first time in 2019 when Penix connected with fifthyear senior Nick Westbrook from 75 yards out in the first quarter. It marked Indiana's longest passing touchdown since Westbrook hauled in a 75-yarder from Richard Lagow vs. Wake Forest on Sept. 24, 2016.
- Westbrook now owns three 70-plus yard TDs (79, 75, 75), two of which have come against Ball State (79, Ball State in 2016), while the 75-yarder was a career-best for Penix.
- The Lake Mary, Fla., native went over 100 yards for the sixth time in his career with 103 on three receptions.

- The Cincinnati native moved into a tie for 6th on the school's career passing TDs list (34), and into eighth in total offense (5,464) and attempts (726).
