## KICKING OFF

**KEY STORYLINES:** A derby will decide which team from The Hoosier State will advance to the 2023 NCAA Men's College Cup. Indiana and No. 2 national seed Notre Dame met at Alumni Stadium to begin their seasons, and Saturday one must end its season there as well.

Both teams are in excellent form. The Hoosiers have won eight straight and 12 of their last 13 matches. Notre Dame has not allowed a goal in its two NCAA Tournament matches.

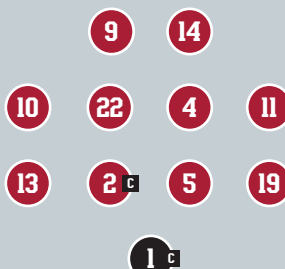
The Fighting Irish are IU's third straight nationally-seeded, ACC opponent in this year's tournament. The Hoosiers took care of No. 10 seed and Atlantic Division Champion Wake Forest in the second round 3-2. Last weekend, they shut out No. 7 seed and Coastal Division runner-up Virginia 1-0. Notre Dame won the Coastal Division, collecting 20 points from a 6-0-2 conference record.

## A WIN WOULD:

- Advance Indiana to its 23rd NCAA Tournament Semifinal and fifth NCAA College Cup in seven years...
- Give IU its ninth consecutive victory and 13th win in 14 matches...
- Come as Indiana's third-straight victory over a nationally-seeded ACC opponent...
- Mark the first time that IU reached the College Cup as an unseeded team since 2003 (Since seeding 16 teams began in 2003)...
- Give IU's seniors their third College Cup appearance.

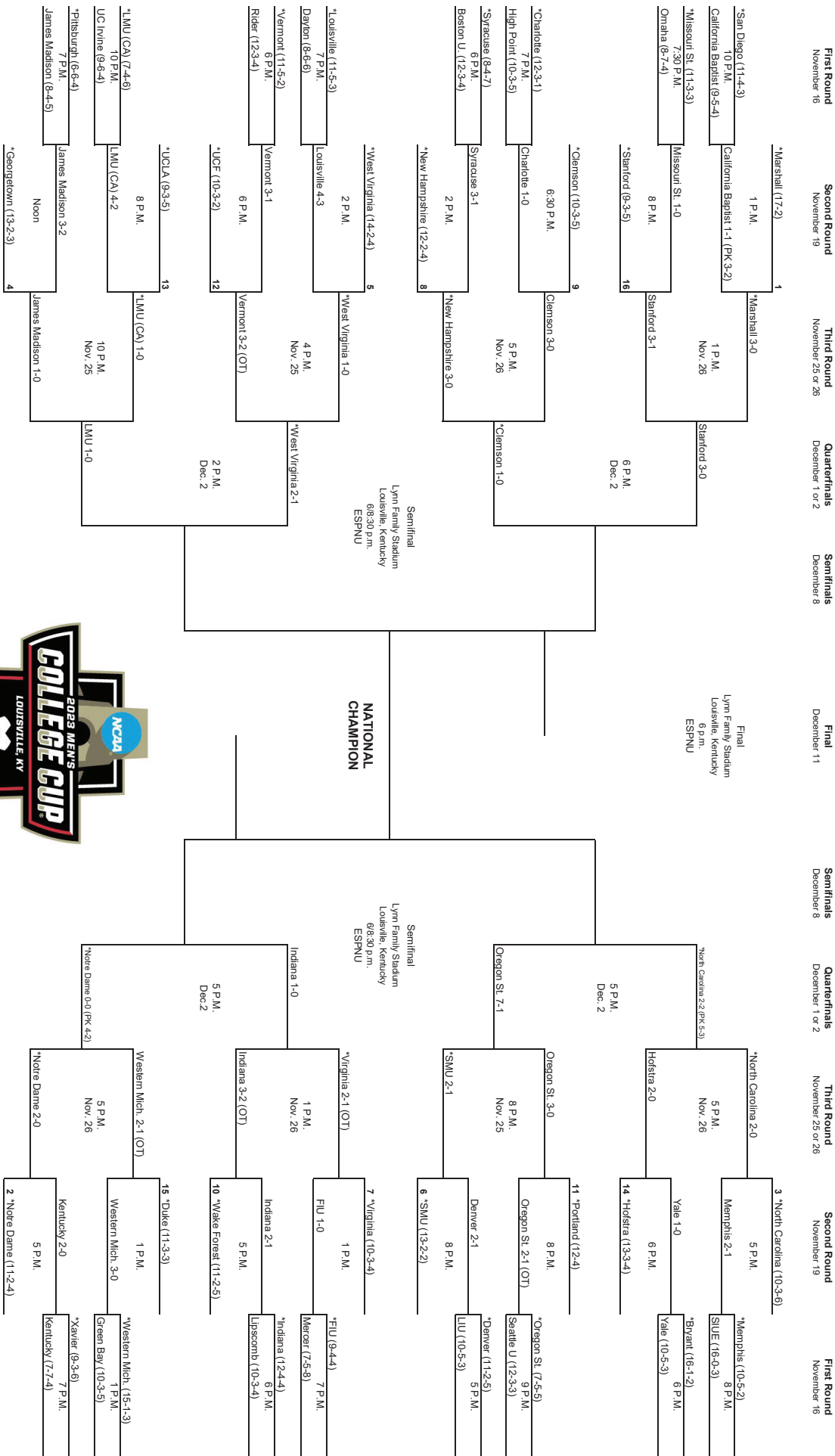

## PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

The MAC Hermann Trophy is annually presented to the nation's top collegiate soccer player. Indiana men's soccer has a rich tradition of producing the most excellent players in the country, with seven players winning the trophy a combined eight times.

Indiana also boasts three Soccer America Player of the Year winners: Paul DiBernardo (1984), Aleksey Korol (1999) and Grant Lillard (2017).

**NOTE:** The MAC Player of the Year Award and the Hermann Trophy merged in 2002, allowing for multiple winners between 1986-2002. The Soccer America award was discontinued following the 2019 season.

**50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION:** In May, Indiana men's soccer celebrated its Tradition of Excellence with a 50th anniversary celebration on the campus of Indiana University. 2023 marked 50 years since the IU Board of Trustees voted to grant men's soccer its varsity status, and, since then, the program has set the standard for NCAA men's soccer.

That weekend, May 19-21, the program welcomed over 325 guests - national champions, hall-of-famers, and those who love the program. Festivities included a golf outing, reception, kickaround, celebration dinner and tours of the athletic facilities.

**FAMILY MATTERS:** So many families have made Bloomington their second home while joining the greater Indiana men's soccer family, creating a special environment in and around the program.

The Yeagley family has set this pattern - **Jerry Yeagley** lobbied for men's soccer to become a varsity sport at IU in 1973 and, as head coach, went on to win six national championships. His family's involvement in the program now spans three generations, as **Todd Yeagley**, an IU player under his father from 1991-94, has led the team since 2010 and coached his two sons, Ben and Grant, the latter of which is a current player.

Five members of the current squad are part of family legacies within the program.

**Luka Bezerra:** Brother, Victor, was an All-America forward from 2019-2021 before signing an MLS Homegrown Contract with Chicago Fire.

**Joey Maher:** Brother, Jack Maher, was an All-America defender from 2018-19 and now plays for MLS club Nashville SC.

**Grant Yeagley:** Brother, Ben, player from 2019-2022 and teammate for two seasons; Father, Todd, is current head coach and played from 1991-94; Grandfather, Jerry, was head coach from 1973-2003.

Assistant Coach **Tanner Thompson:** Brother, Tommy, was teammate in 2013 and now plays for MLS club San Jose Earthquakes; Father, Gregg, played between 1978-82 and scored winning goal in Indiana's first national championship.

**#PROIU:** Combining Major League Soccer Draft picks (48), MLS Supplemental Draft picks (4) and MLS Homegrown selections (8), the Indiana men's soccer program has seen 60 Hoosiers selected into the top flight of American soccer. Additionally, 19 Hoosiers have earned United States Men's National Team caps.

**CONFERENCE DOMINANCE:** With 33 total conference trophies, Indiana has set the standard for Big Ten men's soccer. Owning a 144-35-30 (.763) record in league play all-time, IU is one of two program's owning at least 100 Big Ten wins, followed only by Penn State's 109.

Indiana has totaled 120 All-Big Ten first team selections all-time, 55 more than the next-best program (Penn State, 65).

Additionally, Jerry Yeagley and Todd Yeagley are the winningest coaches in Big Ten history, by percentage.

**THREADED WITH HISTORY:** The Hoosiers debuted new uniforms for their 50th season that express the program's Tradition of Excellence. In July 2022, the program released its cream and crimson jerseys ahead of its 50th season, a fresh take on some of the old styles of the team's storied past. The team will wear the uniforms again during its 2023 season.

Indiana's crimson kit features stripes, a popular choice across IU athletics and in the program's 2010s designs. The stripes are alternating shades of crimson with the eight-star logo sitting on the left chest like a crest, the player number centered on the torso and an adidas logo aligned high on the right.

On the back, like many modern IU shirts, an "INDIANA" nameplate floats above the player number. Gracing a cream collar, "Never Daunted" lies in reference to the school fight song, "Indiana, Our Indiana."

The cream kit is a distinct reference to the styles of the 1970s and early '80s, the first decade of varsity soccer at IU. One decoration graces a white front; the left chest has the Indiana script mark on top of the player number. Indiana's first national championship teams in 1982 and 1983 wore kits with similar designs.

Indiana's eight-star mark is prominent atop the back of the cream jersey. "Tradition of Excellence" graces the hem of the shirt, a reminder of the program's proud history and drive to continue it for many years to come.

## EIGHT STARS

**1982:** After being denied in the NCAA College Cup final three times (1976, 1978 and 1980), the Hoosiers won the program's first NCAA National Championship via a 2-1, eight-overtime marathon victory over Duke.

**1999:** IU won the treble for a second straight season, capping the century with its fifth national title. After surviving a four-overtime victory over UCLA the day before, Indiana bested Santa Clara, 1-0, in the title match.

**1983:** Following an overtime loss in the season opener the Hoosiers went undefeated the rest of the way (21-1-4 overall) including a 1-0, overtime win in the national championship match. IU won back-to-back titles for the first time in program history.

**2003:** Jerry Yeagley retired following the 2003 season after once again leading IU to a championship treble. On a snowy day in Columbus, Ohio, the Hoosiers scored two-first-half goals to bury St. John's, 2-1, in the championship match.

**1988:** Ken Snow tallied 22 goals and seven assists to lead IU back to the mountaintop in 1988. In a matches played at IU's home, Bill Armstrong Stadium, the Hoosiers won 1-0 decisions versus Portland and Howard to win their third title.

**2004:** Indiana won back-to-back NCAA Championships for the third time in program history as former Hoosier All-American Mike Freitag led IU in his first season as head coach. After a 1-1 full-time result, the Hoosiers beat UC-Santa Barbara, 3-2, on penalties.

**1998:** Indiana captured its first of three championship trebles in program history, winning the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles in the same year. IU outscored its two NCAA College Cup opponents 7-1 to win its first title in a decade.

**2012:** It took Todd Yeagley just three seasons to continue the family legacy and win his first national title as head coach. The No. 16 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, IU beat four national seeds and allowed just one goal in its title run.

**SERIES NOTES:** Indiana's first-ever varsity match was a 5-1 victory in South Bend. The Hoosiers then won 11 straight matchups to kick off a series that has been renewed 47 times.

More recently, the two teams have met in 22 of the last 23 seasons, only missing the unique 2020-21 campaign due to IU's conference-only schedule. In that span, the programs have met 25 times.

The Hoosiers hold a dominant 33-10-4 record in the series and are undefeated in the last seven matches (5-0-2), each decided by one goal or a draw. IU and Notre Dame met in the 2023 season opener and played to a 1-1 draw. The Hoosiers recovered from a 1-0 deficit thanks to **Collins Oduro's** first-career goal.

Indiana and Notre Dame have met three times in the NCAA Tournament with the Hoosiers holding a 3-1 advantage in those matches. Notably, IU earned a comeback, 2-1 win over the No. 1-seed Fighting Irish in the third round of the 2012 tournament on its way to its eighth national title. In 2018, IU beat Notre Dame in the quarterfinal round to advance to the NCAA College Cup.

## TEAM NOTES

**IN FORM:** Who have been IU's main contributors in recent matches?

**Maouloune Gomballe:** Five goals and three assists in last eight matches.

**Collins Oduro:** Two goals in three NCAA Tournament matches.

**THE HOOSIERS ARE HOT:** Indiana has won 12 of its last 13 matches, improving from 3-3-4 after a tie at Kentucky on Oct. 3 to 15-4-4 and winning the Big Ten Double as the regular season co-champion and tournament champion.

In that span, nine different Hoosiers have combined for 27 goals, and eight have scored multiple goals. **Samuel Sarver** and **Maouloune Gomballe** have combined for 10 goals during the run. Sarver and **Hugo Bacharach** each have four assists.

**INDIANA DERBIES:** Indiana's success on the national stage is a macrocosm of its success in The Hoosier State - IU is 110-14-8 (.864) all-time against opponents from its home state.

IU has not lost to a team from the state of Indiana since 2019 - a 2-1 loss to Butler. Since then, the Hoosiers are 10-0-2 in these derbies, outscoring opponents 28-5. Since 2017, Indiana is 17-1-4 against such opponents, outscoring them 51-8.

**TODD'S 200<sup>TH</sup>:** Indiana men's soccer head coach **Todd Yeagley** earned his 200th head coaching victory with the 1-0 win at Virginia in the NCAA Tournament.

**15** seasons as a head coach and **14** seasons as head coach of IU men's soccer. He averages **13.3** wins per season.

**363** combined wins as a player (72, 1991-94), assistant coach (91, 2003-08) and head coach (200, 2009-Present).

**193** wins since 2010 - his first season as head coach of IU - the most of any men's soccer coach over that span.

Yeagley is the second-winningest head coach in Big Ten history, by percentage (.693 mark) and trails only his father, Jerry Yeagley (.821).

**TOURNAMENT TIME:** Indiana men's soccer has a storied history in the NCAA Tournament as the winningest program in the competition's history by both total wins (104) and percentage (.730). With its 2022 NCAA Quarterfinal win at UNC-Greensboro, IU became the first program to reach 100 NCAA Tournament victories.

Indiana's eight national championships are the most since it became a varsity program in 1973.

**THE TOURNEY SO FAR:** Indiana has reached the NCAA Tournament Round of 16. Here's how the Hoosiers arrived here:

**First Round:** IU opened the tournament in the first round for the first time in a decade, seeing its nine-year national seed streak snapped as, for the first time since the NCAA began seeding 16 teams in 2003, the Big Ten did not receive a seed.

Unphased, the Hoosiers hosted Lipscomb. Indiana took it to the ASUN Champions as **Collins Oduro** opened the scoring with a shot from distance in the 32nd minute. **Maouloune Gomballe** doubled IU's lead in the 74th, and the Hoosiers held the Bisons' high-powered offense scoreless over 83 minutes before Tyrese Spicer's magnificent solo effort put Lipscomb on the board, his 14th goal of the season.

**Second Round:** Three days later, IU visited No. 10 national seed Wake Forest in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The Hoosiers had to come back from down 1-0 and 2-1, and they did just that to force overtime.

**Hugo Bacharach** scored IU's first and the third, winning goal, both coming from set pieces. His 94th-minute winner in overtime was a stunner, as he finished **Patrick McDonald**'s free kick with a back-heel flick. McDonald assisted both of Bacharach's goals. **Karsen Henderlong** scored the second match-tying goal in the 73rd minute, cleaning up a rebound from a shot on goal.

**Third Round:** Another national seed. Another ACC opponent. Another road match. Another Indiana win. IU traveled to No. 7 seed Virginia, the first meeting between the blue bloods since 2000.

After absorbing pressure in the early going, Indiana opened the scoring via **Collins Oduro**, scoring in the 11th minute via a **Maouloune Gomballe** cross. The Hoosiers would hold strong defensively - thanks in part to a pair of goal-line saves from defender **Jansen Miller** - to earn their ninth clean sheet and the 1-0 result.

The victory marked **Todd Yeagley**'s 200th head coaching win, made especially sweet by his personal history - Yeagley's final match as an IU player in 1994 came against Virginia in the national final, a 1-0 loss.





## TEAM NOTES (cont.)

**STREAKING:** Indiana owns several notable active streaks:

- IU owns an active eight-match winning streak, the longest active streak in the country.
- The Hoosiers have reached the NCAA Tournament in 37 consecutive seasons (NCAA record).
- IUMS boasts the nation's longest active streak of NCAA Tournament Third Round appearances, making it nine straight with a second round victory over No. 10 national seed Wake Forest.
- Indiana set a Big Ten record for consecutive appearances in the conference final, making its seventh straight appearance. It's the nation's longest active streak, tied with Georgetown.

**BIG TEN DOUBLE:** With a 4-1 win over Rutgers Oct. 29, Indiana clinched a share of the Big Ten Championship, its 18th regular season title.

IU shared the championship with Penn State (both 4-2-2) but received the No. 1 seed and home-field advantage throughout the Big Ten Tournament from its head-to-head win over the Nittany Lions in October.

IU won a share of the title despite taking just two points from its first three conference matches (0-1-2). That win over Penn State kickstarted a 4-1-0 league run in October that vaulted the Hoosiers up the standings.

The Hoosiers made the most of their home-field advantage in the tournament, welcoming a total of 8,969 fans over the three matches. IU beat No. 8-seeded Wisconsin 2-1 and No. 5-seeded Michigan 4-3 to advance to the final. With 4,045 packing Bill Armstrong Stadium for the championship match, the Hoosiers proved they were the Big Ten's best with a 1-0 shutout of regular season co-champ and No. 2-seeded Penn State.

Indiana has won 34 Big Ten titles (regular season + tournament) in 33 seasons of Big Ten men's soccer, winning at least one league title in 22 of those seasons. IU won at least one conference championship in each of the first 14 seasons of league competition.

**DECISION DAY DRAMA:** It all came together for Indiana on the final day of the regular season as the Hoosiers had perhaps their best performance of the year to-date in a 4-1 rout of Rutgers to capture a share of the Big Ten regular season title and the No. 1 seed in the Big Ten Tournament.

Coming into that Sunday, Indiana could have finished anywhere from No. 1 in the conference to No. 6 because of how tight the race was at the top of the table. In one scenario, four teams could have shared the regular season title.

To earn at least a share of the title, Indiana (11 points coming in) needed Penn State and Northwestern (13 points) each to drop points (lose or draw). Penn State tied, giving them a share of the title, and Northwestern fell to Michigan 3-0, dropping them into fourth on tiebreakers.

**BIG TEN'S BEST:** Five Hoosiers ranked among the Big Ten's Top 10 in offensive categories during conference play.

**THE SAM SARVER SHOW:** A first-team All-Big Ten selection and Indiana's leading goalscorer, forward **Samuel Sarver** currently sits second in the Big Ten in goals (8), tied-for-third in assists (6) and second in points (22). All three marks are career-highs.

The junior has tallied 52 points in his career from 19 goals and 14 assists. He is the 50th Hoosier to reach 50 points in a career and the first junior to eclipse the milestone since Nikita Kotlov in 2012.

Sarver was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 10 after he scored a brace in IU's 2-1 win at No. 19 Penn State. He's also scored game-winning goals against Seton Hall, Butler, Maryland and Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament final.

Sarver is known for his quickness with or without the ball. He can beat defenders down the wing with a quick burst of acceleration or use his pace to leave a defender in the dust during transition.

Last season, Sarver scored four goals, all against ranked opponents, and added four assists. In 2021, Sarver led all conference freshmen with seven goals which ranked No. 2 on the team. He also had four assists.

IU head men's soccer coach **Todd Yeagley** is carrying on the Tradition of Excellence and winning culture of IUMS into his 14th season as leader of the program.

Since taking over the IU job in 2010, Yeagley is the winningest coach in NCAA Division-I men's soccer and the only one to guide his program to five College Cups in that span.

**TEN AGAIN:** With its win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Tournament, Indiana clinched its 49th double-digit win season in program history. The Hoosiers have failed to reach 10 wins twice in the program's 51-year history (1986, 2013).

**MAOULOUNE MAKES CENTURY MARK:** Fifth-year senior **Maouloune Goumballe** made his 100th career appearance on Oct. 27, starting the win over Trine. He scored the game's first goal, blasting a shot past the keeper at the near post.

Goumballe is the NCAA's active career leader in games played at 107. Washington's Christian Soto has the next most at 95.

**HERE'S HUGO:** Senior **Hugo Bacharach**, a transfer from Fairleigh Dickinson, racked up a laundry list of preseason awards (see pg. 7 sidebar).

Bacharach was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 31 after contributing to two goals in the 4-1 win over Rutgers that clinched a share of the Big Ten regular season title. The senior scored IU's first goal and assisted the fourth off the foot of **Samuel Sarver**.

Since being shifted from center-back to defensive midfielder during IU's 2-1 win at Penn State, Bacharach has recorded four goals and four assists. He scored a game-tying goal and the winner, both from set pieces, in IU's NCAA Tournament Second Round victory at No. 10 national seed Wake Forest.

The Spanish defender was a first-team All-Northeast Conference performer at FDU and the conference's defensive player of the year last season as a junior.

This summer, Bacharach played in USL League Two for the Flint City Bucks, leading the to seven clean sheets. For his contributions, Bacharach was named the USL League Two Defender of the Year.

**MAHER OF THE FINAL THIRD:** A first-team All-Big Ten honoree and one of Indiana's two captains, senior **Joey Maher**'s career is defined by dependable defense. The Caseyville, Illinois, native has started all but four matches since his 2020-21 freshman season and has been part of two NCAA College Cup runs.

In 84 career appearances (82 starts), he has helped IU keep 40 clean sheets. In 23 matches this season, he has led the Hoosiers to nine shutouts.

Maher earned his first-career Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honor on Oct. 17 after the Hoosiers allowed one shot on goal between consecutive wins over Evansville and Ohio State.

**BARGER IN THE BACK:** Among a mostly veteran back-line, freshman **Alex Barger** has made himself a fixture, starting 22 of IU's 23 matches, missing only the game against D-III Trine.

Barger, a Napierville, Illinois, native, was a two-year All-America selection during his prep career and, in 2021, was named the Illinois Gatorade Player of the Year.

The freshman earned his first-career point assisting **Samuel Sarver**'s game-winning goal against Seton Hall, firing an incisive pass to **Maouloune Goumballe**, who held up play while Sarver ran into space. In October, he scored the opening goal in a crucial 2-1 win at Maryland, heading home from a throw-in.

**BRETT THE VET:** Fifth-year senior defender **Brett Bebej**, IU's 2022 Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree, has been nicknamed the "Swiss Army Knife" for his ability and willingness to play many positions, seeing minutes at center back, outside back, center mid and on the wings in his career.

Bebej scored three goals last season and recorded a goal contribution in two of IU's four NCAA Tournament matches - he scored a match-winning header against Marshall and had the assist to **Maouloune Goumballe**'s go-ahead score at UNC Greensboro.

**ODURO INTRO:** Freshman **Collins Odoro** was named a Big Ten Player to Watch as well as a Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Freshman Best XI selection. In October, he was ranked the 13th-best freshman in Top Drawer's midseason Top 100 list and earned a spot in the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.

In his collegiate debut, a start at Notre Dame in IU's season opener, Odoro scored a game-tying goal after a nice bit of combination play with Samuel Sarver. Odoro darted through Notre Dame's defense and won his one-on-one with the keeper to pull Indiana even.

Odoro then brought his tally to two goals in his first two games with the breakthrough score in the 2-0 win over DePaul. His 67th-minute free header at the back post gave Indiana a 1-0 lead on the way to victory. He had six shots, three on frame in the match.

He earned his first-career assist for his contribution to the winning goal versus Butler. He turned a Bulldog defender inside-out before finding **Samuel Sarver** crashing the box.

The freshman has scored two goals in three NCAA Tournament matches, recording the opening goals against Lipscomb and at Virginia.

Odoro scored 39 goals in his 2022 senior season at The Phelps School and was named the Pennsylvania Gatorade Player of the Year.

### THE REAL MADRID OF COLLEGE SOCCER?:

Senior **Hugo Bacharach** — a native of Benicàssim, Spain — when asked about his reasons for coming to play at Indiana, compared the program to the most successful club in the world by saying IU men's soccer is "the Real Madrid of (men's) college soccer."

**RETURNERS:** Of IU's 29 players that saw minutes in 2022, 17 returned for the 2022 season.

Statistically, Indiana returns 62 percent of its goals scored (27 of 44) and 64 percent of its assists (28 of 44) from last campaign, which saw IU make a run to the national title match.

Defenders **Joey Maher** and **Brett Bebej**, who each appeared in 24 of IU's 25 matches and helped the team keep nine clean sheets, return to anchor the back-line.

In midfield, **Patrick McDonald** and **Jack Wagoner** started together in 11 of IU's final 12 matches - the lone exception being its matchup with Division-III Trine.

**Tommy Mihalic** and **Samuel Sarver** earned two of IU's top point tallies, collecting 16 and 12, respectively. Mihalic's seven goals were second on the team, and both showed dynamism with four assists apiece.

**2023 SIGNING CLASS:** Indiana welcomes in the nation's No. 12-ranked signing class according to Top Drawer Soccer, featuring one transfer and 10 freshmen.

**Hugo Bacharach:** Transfer from Fairleigh Dickinson ... 2022 Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Year ... 2022 USL League Two Defender of the Year.

**MLS AWARDS:** Three former Indiana men's soccer student-athletes were named finalists (top three) for Major League Soccer's end-of-year awards.

Roman Celentano (FC Cincinnati) was named a nominee for the Allstate Goalkeeper of the Year award and Save of the Year, Aidan Morris (Columbus Crew) for the Young Player of the Year and Pat Noonan (FC Cincinnati) for the Coach of the Year.

Celentano won the MLS Save of the Year award for a last-minute denial in FCC's May 20 win over the Columbus Crew.

Noonan was named the MLS Coach of the Year for leading Cincinnati to the MLS Supporters' Shield. The club earned the most points in the league from its regular season results and received the Eastern Conference's No. 1 seed in the MLS Cup Playoffs.

**SURGING MLS ALL-STAR:** 21-year old Aidan Morris is having a breakthrough professional season after bursts of success in Major League Soccer and an All-America and Big Ten Freshman of the Year campaign for IU in 2019.

Morris signed a Homegrown contract with Columbus Crew SC following that season and immediately helped his club win the MLS Cup, becoming the youngest player to start in the league final at 19. After missing the 2021 MLS season, he made his way back into the rotation and became a fixture in the Crew's starting XI in 2022.

2023 has been a culmination for the rising star. In January, Morris received his first call-up to the United States Men's National Team before earning his first cap against Serbia that same month. Since, he's earned three more roster calls, including a spot on the USMNT's Gold Cup roster, and has made four appearances for the national team. In October, Morris was called to the United States Olympic training camp as the national team builds up to the 2024 Games.

In MLS play, Morris is establishing himself as one of the top midfielders in the league while ranking among the leaders in tackles won, passing accuracy and interceptions. In June, he was named an MLS All-Star and played against Premier League side Arsenal alongside the best talent in MLS. In October, he was named the league's third-best under-22 player in its annual 22-Under-22 rankings.

**TOP FLIGHT TROPHIES:** As the Major League Soccer regular season reaches its conclusion at the end of October, three Hoosiers have helped their clubs win trophies.

Defender Griffin Dorsey scored the first goal in Houston Dynamo's 2-1 win over Inter Miami in the U.S. Open Cup final.

FC Cincinnati head coach Pat Noonan and goalkeeper Roman Celentano celebrated the club clinching the MLS Supporters' Shield - awarded to the club with the most points at season's end. FCC clinched with three matches remaining.

MLS clubs have one more trophy to play for. Six Hoosiers have helped their clubs qualify for the MLS Cup Playoffs: Noonan and Celentano, Dorsey, Justin Rennicks (New England Revolution), Aidan Morris (Columbus Crew), and Jack Maher (Nashville SC).

**AMAZING ALEKSEY:** In August, the Indiana Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced six new members to its Athletics Hall of Fame. One of the six was Aleksey Korol, a two-time NCAA Champion as an Indiana men's soccer student-athlete.

Korol was a dominant offensive force during arguably the greatest four-year stretch in IU Men's Soccer history (1996-99).

Indiana went 82-9-3 during Korol's four years with the program, a run that included Big Ten titles each year, Final Four berths in his final three seasons, and NCAA championships in his final two.

As a senior he was named Soccer America's National Player of the Year and Big Ten Player of the Year after becoming one of only seven IU players to score 20 goals in a single season. Korol was at his best when it mattered most, as his 12 career goals and five assists in 17 NCAA Tournament contests made him the all-time leading scorer in NCAA Tournament history.

He ranks fourth in IU history in scoring with 149 points on 57 goals and 35 assists. He was also named to Soccer America's Team of the Decade for the 1990s, one of five IU soccer players to earn a spot on an All-Decade team. Korol is the eighth men's soccer player to enter the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

**SUMMER AT THE SOCCER TOURNAMENT:** In June, Hoosier Army, a team made up of Indiana men's soccer alumni, participated in The Soccer Tournament (TST), a seven-versus-seven competition in Cary, North Carolina, for a \$1 million dollar prize.

Hoosier Army was the first college soccer alumni team to enter the TST field, and its roster featured players from the last 18 years of IU men's soccer. Kevin Noschang was the most senior Hoosier on the squad, representing the 2005-08 squads. He played alongside Ryan Wittenbrink, who was part of Indiana's run to the NCAA College Cup last season. Five players featured on the roster played in the 2012 NCAA National Championship squad.

Current IU men's soccer associate head coach **Kevin Robson** served as the team's head coach.

The Indiana alumni played in and won the tournament's inaugural match against a team representing German Bundesliga giant Borussia Dortmund. Despite winning its first two of three group play matches, Hoosier Army was ousted on goal differential.

**800:** During the 2022 season, Indiana men's soccer earned its 800th win. Coming within 50 seasons, it is the quickest ascent to 800 wins in NCAA Division-I men's soccer history - 10 years better than the next-fastest program.

With an 822-198-116 record all-time, Indiana is the winningest program in NCAA DI men's soccer history by percentage (.775).

**BOUNCING BACK:** Indiana has played 165 consecutive matches without back-to-back regular season losses. The streak spans 3,676 days (10 years, 1 month, 1 day) in total dating back to November 1, 2013.

**OUR INDIANA HOME:** The passionate IU fans and lively Hoosier Army student section create a unique atmosphere at Bill Armstrong Stadium that is rarely rivaled. The Hoosiers hold a 365-71-55 (.799) record all-time at "The Bill."

Since 2016, Indiana owns a 77-7-13 record on its home ground, posting 60 shutouts in those 97 matches. IU was 9-3-1 at home last season, earning seven shutouts in those matches. IU welcomed 26,735 fans to Bill Armstrong Stadium last year, which ranked No. 2 nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten in attendance.

In 14 home matches this season, Indiana is 11-1-2 and has earned eight clean sheets, conceding eight goals.

After a standout playing career for the Hoosiers, Todd Yeagley was named Indiana head men's soccer coach on December 18, 2009. Since then, no NCAA Division-I men's soccer head coach has more wins (178) or College Cup appearances (5) than Yeagley coming into the 2023 season.

In 2023, Yeagley begins his 14th season at the helm of the Hoosier program. Yeagley is a four-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, has led the region staff of the year three times and in 2012 was named Soccer America Coach of the Year.

Indiana has earned a national seed and NCAA Tournament first-round bye in an NCAA record nine seasons and in all but one season of the Todd Yeagley era. The program's recent excellence has been in part due to Yeagley's emphasis on defense – in each of the last seven seasons, IU has ranked top-eleven nationally in clean sheets, totaling 87 shutouts in that span.

##### 2012 NCAA National Championship

• In just his third season as head coach, Yeagley led Indiana to the 2012 NCAA title, the eighth championship in IU men's soccer history. The Hoosiers became the first No. 16 seed to win the championship, compiling victories over Xavier, at No. 1 Notre Dame, at No. 9 North Carolina, versus No. 12 Creighton and against No. 3 Georgetown during their tournament run.

• Yeagley was named 2012 Soccer America Coach of the Year as he and his father, Jerry, became the first father-son duo to have won Division I men's soccer championships.

##### 2022 Season

The Hoosiers returned to the NCAA College Cup in 2022, where they finished as the national runner-up after a thrilling championship match that ended in a penalty shootout. Indiana earned the No. 13 national seed and then marched to the national final via four

consecutive clean sheets in the NCAA Tournament as well as the program's NCAA-record 100th tournament victory in the College Cup semifinal against Pittsburgh. Yeagley and the Hoosiers also achieved the program's 800th victory during the regular season, making Indiana the fastest NCAA Division I men's program to reach that mark (50 seasons). Playing one of the toughest schedules in the nation, IU finished 14-4-7 and 8-3-2 against ranked opponents. For the second year in a row, Daniel Munie was named an All-American and the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year. Three Hoosiers were selected in the 2023 MLS SuperDraft, with Munie going No. 10 overall to the San Jose Earthquakes and forwards Herbert Endeley (No. 24) and Ryan Wittenbrink (No. 53) hearing their names called by FC Dallas.

##### Playing Career

• As a player, Yeagley was a four-time All-American at Indiana (1991-94) and in 1994 was named the Missouri Athletic Club National Player of the Year. During his stint as a student-athlete in Bloomington, Yeagley was a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. He led the Hoosiers to three Big Ten titles (1991, 1992, 1994) and a 79-9-5 overall record.

• He remains third on IU's career assists list with 40 and shares the Big Ten single-season assists record with the 14 he recorded in 1993.

• After his playing days at Indiana, Yeagley also enjoyed a successful seven-year professional career in Major League Soccer with the Columbus Crew. Columbus advanced to the MLS Playoffs in five of Yeagley's seven seasons with the team and won the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup in 2002 – the first trophy in club history.

##### Honors

• Since returning to his alma mater, Yeagley has coached 17 Major League Soccer Draft picks, seven MLS Homegrown signees, 32 first team All-Big Ten honorees, 12 Big Ten Player of the Year selections and six Big Ten Freshman of the Year picks.

• In 2015, Jack Griffith was given the prestigious Jack D. Tichenor Award, which is given annually to IU's top male and female student-athletes that hold the highest individual cumulative GPA among the entire Department of Athletics. Griffith is the fourth men's soccer student-athlete to earn the Tichenor Award, joining Barry T. Margolin (1987), Christopher Munroe (2005) and three-time winner Tyler McCarroll (2010-12).

• In 2016, Femi Hollinger-Janzen was presented the Spirit of Indiana Director's Award, given by Vice President and Director of Athletics Fred Glass to two student-athletes that best represent The Spirit of Indiana: 24 Sports, 1 Team.

##### Personal

• Yeagley is a member of the Indiana Soccer Hall of Fame and in 2013 was inducted into the Monroe County Hall of Fame and the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

• Yeagley earned a Bachelor of Science degree in sociology from Indiana in 2002. He and his wife, Suzy, have three children: Ben, Grant and Jay.

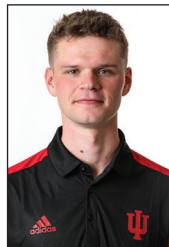
