- Kaley Rammelsberg totaled 23 blocks across three matches including an IU best nine against Lindenwood.
- Mady Saris had 36 kills and hit over .300 collectively in the three victories.
- Camryn Haworth had a double-double (32 assists and 10 digs) in the win over Austin Peay.

- Annabelle Standish is the go-to option offensively and leads the way with 133 kills on a .231 clip this year.
- Nyah Molina runs the offense and has dished out 248 assists this campaign.
- Sophia Groom is young but a force in the middle with 31 blocks on the year.

MIAMI

- A tournament team a year ago, Miami is 5-2 this year and has defeated Big Ten foe Maryland on the opening weekend.
- Savannah Vach leads the way with 266 assists and 10.64 per set and is one of the most veteran setters in the nation.
- Janice Leao has 20 total blocks while Naylani Feliciano has dug 68 balls at 3.40 per set this year.

- The Dolphins have five players with 50+ kills on the season but are led by Anna Erickson with 86.
- This marks the first-ever meeting between the two programs.
- Setter Rebecca Rocassin has dished out 299 assists on the season.

- Jade Sadeiko and Mackenzie Morgan have been impacts as transfers and have 96 and 76 kills respectively.



PRESEASON PRIMER

The Indiana volleyball program officially kicked off its 2023 season with report day to Bloomington on August 7th (Monday) and the first day of practice on August 8th (Tuesday).

Coming off its best finish in the Big Ten (8th) since the conference expanded to 14 teams, IU returns 12 players from a year ago including six of seven starting rotational players and a number of key reserves.

Morgan Geddes and Camryn Haworth were named to the 20-woman USA Collegiate National Team in April following a strong performance at the Open Tryout in Colorado Springs.

The nation's best athletes were selected and trained with USA volleyball in Anaheim this summer over a five-day period. Geddes enjoyed a breakout season in 2022 despite dealing with lingering injuries that held her out multiple games in the non-conference. Haworth took the keys to the offense as the team's setter last season.

The pair of Hoosiers will have a valuable role for IU during the 2023 season, joining middle blockers Kaley Rammelsberg and Savannah Kjolhede and outside hitters Candela Alonso-Corcelles and Mady Saris as returning starters.

MADY TRAINS IN CANADA

The duo went through full practices, drills and matches as the Canadian National Team begins the process of identifying the next generation of talent. Saris was named among the initial 35-person senior team roster for the Volleyball Nations League but elected not to participate as to continue training in Bloomington.

BIG TEN MEDIA DAYS

The Indiana trio of setter *Camryn Haworth*, outside hitter/defensive specialist *Grae Gosnell* and head coach *Steve Aird* attended the 2nd Annual Big Ten Volleyball Media Days in Chicago.

As part of the conference's continued commitment to growing the game of volleyball, the two-day event featured media interviews, tv sit-downs, social media engagement, photoshoots and a dinner for all coaches and athletes at the Big Ten Network studios.

SCHEDULE/TV NOTES

IU's full 33-match schedule was announced in accordance with the Big Ten schedule release in June.

The Hoosiers' campaign will feature 13 home matches including an opening weekend tournament against New Hampshire, Southern Indiana and Radford.

IU will play Purdue, Michigan, Rutgers, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin and Maryland twice with solo home matches against Minnesota, Nebraska and lowa and solo road games at Penn State, Northwestern and Michigan State.

The non-conference slate includes matches against 2022 NCAA Tournament teams Washington and Miami (Fla.) as well as traditional powers Long Beach State and UCLA.

IU will play on the Big Ten Network four times this season with matches against Illinois (Sept. 20), Nebraska (Sept. 30), Purdue (Oct. 11) and Illinois (Oct. 25) featured on the network's national television channel.

STAFF CHANGES

In accordance with a new NCAA byline put into effect on July 1, 2023, women's volleyball programs are now allowed three paid assistants, eliminating the previously designated volunteer role.

Head coach Steve Aird named his 2023 coaching staff shortly after including the addition of Kevin Hodge as an assistant coach.

Additional changes saw Brett Agne promoted to the third paid assistant role, Rachel Morris elevated to associated head coach and Hallie Enderle named director of operations.



An exciting chapter began for Indiana University Athletics, as IU unveiled a new, state-of-the-art, 3,000-seat facility - Wilkinson Hall.

Wilkinson Hall is a multi-use training and performance center that is the new home venue for the Indiana Volleyball and Wrestling programs.

Consistent with the university's master plan, the facility brings these two programs' home competitions back onto the IU Athletics campus from their former University Gymnasium home at the intersection of 10th Street and the 45/46 bypass.

In addition, Wilkinson Hall will provide the entire Indiana University Athletic Department and its programs with a new top-flight facility for year-round training, and will serve as a venue to host department and university events.

Wilkinson Hall is named after IU alumnus Jay Wilkinson and his family, who have an incredible history of support for IU Athletics and its student-athletes.

Indiana Volleyball played its first official matches in Wilkinson Hall during the 2019 campaign and has played there every year since.

In 2019, the opening year of Wilkinson Hall, the Hoosiers were 15th in the NCAA in attendance, the highest the team has ever been in program history.

The 2023 season will be the fifth season for Indiana volleyball and the first with no COVID-19 restrictions since the 2019 season.

IU set a Wilkinson Hall record of 2,512 in a match against No. 9 Purdue on Oct. 14, 2022.

An average of 1,366 fans came to watch IU matches in Wilkinson Hall in 2023.

Indiana head coach **Steve Aird** recently completed his fifth season at the helm in 2022.

A two-time NCAA champion as an assistant coach at Penn State, Aird is an elite recruiter and has brought new energy into the Indiana volleyball program.

He helped land the program's first two Under Armour All-Americans in Emily Fitzner (2019) and Ramsey Gary (2022) and has proven to be an outstanding developer of talent at the collegiate level.

During the 2022 campaign, Aird helped lead the Hoosiers to a 16-16 record including a 9-11 finish in the Big Ten. The Hoosiers won nine conference matches for the first time since 2010 and finished eighth in the Big Ten, the highest team's finish since the conference expanded to 14 teams.

IU beat No. 5 Ohio State and No. 25 Michigan on the road, marking the first season in program history with multiple road victories over ranked teams. The win over the Buckeyes was the first over a top-five team on the road in program history and the second-highest ranked win in the team's history.

An average of 1,366 fans came to watch IU matches in Wilkinson Hall in 2022 and IU beat four conference teams on the road for the first time since 2009.

Under his guidance, setter Camryn Haworth earned First Team All-Big Ten Honors, the first Hoosier to do so since 2010. She was also named AVCA Northeast All-Region Honorable Mention and earned the title of AVCA National Player of the Week on Nov. 22.

Haworth and libero Paula Cerame both earned Big Ten Weekly Honors on Nov. 21 following a weekend that saw IU beat Northwestern and No. 5 Ohio State. During that weekend, Haworth also recorded the program's first triple-double since 2001.

Cerame broke the program's single season record for digs in a Big Ten season with 353. She also became the third athlete to score 500+ digs in a single season. The Hoosiers started five athletes with freshman or sophomore eligibility in the 2022 campaign and return six starters and 12 athletes from this year's roster.

During the 2021 campaign, the Hoosiers returned to a complete schedule following the shortened COVID-19 season of 2020-2021. Over the course of the 2021 calendar year, the Hoosiers played in 52 total matches. Aird helped guide IU to a season sweep of Rutgers in 2021.

The campaign also featured Breana Edwards breaking the 1,000-kill mark for her IU career and moving into 12th (1,267) on IU's all-time career list. The 2021 team featured impact performances from freshmen Camryn Haworth and Mady Saris as well as transfers Paula Cerame and Kaley Rammelsberg.

The 2020-2021 season featured a freshmen class, which ranked No. 15 in the country, the highest ranked class in program history. It included the Hoosiers second highest ranked individual recruit in program history in No. 32 Tommi Stockham and two Under Armour All-Americans. Indiana's roster in 2020-2021 featured nine total freshmen as the Hoosiers battled to a 5-15 record against the nation's best volleyball conference.

In the 2019 season, Aird guided the Hoosiers to an 11-2 start in non-conference action, including a win over No. 15 Kentucky in Lexington. The win over UK was the Hoosiers first win against Kentucky since 1996 and first ranked non-conference win since 1998.

Aird continued to build momentum for the Hoosiers as the program set an average attendance record of 1,809 fans per match, which ranked in the top-15 among all NCAA DI programs.

The 2019 campaign saw Aird help transition the Hoosiers into the \$17-million-dollar, state-of-the-art Wilkinson Hall which houses the volleyball and wrestling teams.

His first season in Bloomington saw Aird led the Hoosiers to an overall record of 16-15 and 7-13 mark in Big Ten play. The Hoosiers swept Ohio State for the first time since 2008 and picked up a win over No. 14 Michigan.

Under Aird, junior middle blocker Deyshia Lofton earned All-Big Ten Second Team honors and sophomore libero Bayli Lebo set an Indiana record for single season digs with 525. The Hoosiers saw record crowds turnout for their matches and set a new average season attendance record for University Gym.

Before Indiana, Aird served as the head coach at Maryland from 2014-2017. His time at Maryland saw him inherit a program that not only went 13-19 and finished 13th in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2013, but was also preparing the join arguably the nation's best volleyball conference - the Big Ten.

After winning just 10 matches overall and three in the Big Ten in his debut season, Aird quickly turned the Terrapins' fortunes around. His 18 wins in 2017 represented the program's most since 2010, while the seven conference victories were the most since joining the Big Ten.

Notable wins that fall came against eventual Elite Eight participant USC as well as NCAA qualifier Purdue.

"I am humbled and honored to accept the Head Coaching position at Indiana University. I believe Indiana Volleyball has a rightful place among the nation's elite and we will work tirelessly to make that a reality," Aird said. "I cannot thank Fred Glass and his staff enough for this opportunity and for their commitment to building an excellent program the right way. Brandy and I could not be more excited to be a part of the IU family and the Bloomington community."

Among Aird's greatest attributes is his ability to recruit. In 2016, Aird welcomed the nation's 16th ranked recruiting class to College Park, Md., and he followed that up with the program's first-ever top-10 class in 2017. That infusion of talent not only helped elevate Maryland in the Big Ten standings, but also created a level of excitement that had been lacking. Six of the program's top-10 attendance marks came during Aird's four-year stint.

Before taking over at Maryland, Aird enjoyed highly-successful assistant coaching stints at Penn State (2007, 2012-13), Cincinnati (2005-07) and Auburn (2002-05). At Penn State, he helped the Nittany Lions to NCAA titles in both 2007 and 2013 along with a Final Four berth in 2012.

In addition to his success in the coaching ranks, Aird also served as the President and CMO of Complete Athlete Inc., from 2007-12, where he helped train and develop youth volleyball players. Many of his players went on to play at the D-I level, including programs such as Penn State, Stanford, Washington, Florida and Tennessee.

A native of London, Ontario, Canada, Aird was a four-year member of Penn State's men's volleyball program from 1997-01. He was a two-year captain and helped the Nittany Lions to three appearances in the Final Four.

Aird, who earned his bachelor's degree in Letters, Arts and Sciences from Penn State in 2001, is married to the former Brandy Wilson. The couple has two sons, Caelan and Padraic, and a daughter, Mackenzie.

Morris worked directly with sophomore setter Camryn Haworth to help orchestrate an offense that saw four athletes record 200-plus digs on the season. Haworth was named First Team All-Big Ten and AVCA Northeast All-Region Honorable Mention for her contributions and also earned the nod as AVCA National Player of the Week and Big Ten Setter of the Week after a weekend that saw her score a triple-double and lead the Hoosiers to wins over No. 5 Ohio State and Northwestern.

Morris was named to the AVCA 30 Under Thirty list and was awarded with the AVCA Innovational award. She was also named AVCA Regional High School Coach of the Year.

ASSISTANT COACH KEVIN HODGE



Kevin Hodge was named an assistant caoch for Indiana volleyball on July 6, 2023.

Hodge joins the IU program after working as the Director of Girls Indoor Recruiting at WAVE, California's premier club volleyball program, since 2015. He took on a variety of roles for the club, most notably being named 2019 National 17's Club Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Penn State, Hodge played four seasons Nittany Lion Men's Volleyball team from 1998-2002 where he was a teammate of Aird's. Hodge helped lead Penn State to four consecutive Final Four appearances and was named to the EIVA All-Tournament team in 2001.

Following his playing career, Hodge served three years as a volunteer assistant coach under legendary Penn State women's volleyball head coach Russ Rose. The Nittany Lions won three-straight Big Ten titles (2003-05) in those three seasons.

He would serve one year as an assistant coach in 2006 at the University of Cincinnati, overlapping with Aird once again in the Queen City. Hodge began his club coaching journey in 2007 with Team Z out of Cincinnati before moving out to Southern California.

Brett Agne enters his third season with Indiana volleyball in 2023. He was promoted to Assistant Coach/Technical Coordinator on July 1, 2023 in accordance with new NCAA bylines allowing a third paid assistant for women's volleyball.

Before the 2022 campaign, Agne was elevated to the team's Director of Operations where he maintained his current on-court and off-the-court duties while continuing to play an integral role in the program's success.

In the fall 2021 season, he served as the program's Technical Coordinator. His main responsibilities included production of both staff and team scouting reports, facilitating individual and team film sessions, and the assembly of all individual and conference statistics. He also aided in multiple operational duties within the program. Agne Joined the staff in the summer of 2021.
