QUICK HITTERS

• Indiana is set to take on the Big Ten-leading Wisconsin Badgers on Jan. 19 at the Kohl Center in Madison. The game marks the middle of a three-game stand against top-15 ranked opponents and the first of back-to-back conference road games. (More on Pg. 4)

• Senior guard **Trey Galloway** has posted 42 total assists (6.0 per game) over his last seven contests dating back to the end of non-conference play. He has posted a 3.5 assist-to-turnover ratio during the month-long stretch and has more steals (14) than turnovers (12).

• Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** is averaging 11.7 points and 3.4 rebounds per game during league play this season. He is shooting 28-of-61 (45.9%) from the field and 12-of-26 (46.2%) from the 3-point line and has scored at least 11 points in five of the seven BIG games.

• Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** averages 7.5 defensive rebounds per game, the highest figure among Big Ten players. He is third in the conference overall at 9.4 boards per game.

COACH BOB KNIGHT PASSES AWAY AT 83

Bob Knight, one of the most successful and influential figures in the history college basketball, passed away on Nov. 1, 2023 surrounded by family and friends. He was 83 years old.

Knight's coaching accomplishments are legendary. He went 902-371 during a 42-year head coaching career that included stops at Army (1966-71), Indiana (1972-2000), and Texas Tech (2002-08). Those 902 wins ranked No. 1 all-time when he retired in 2008, and currently ranks sixth. He was a four-time National Coach of the Year, a five-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, and was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame (1991), the College Basketball Hall of Fame (2006), and the IU Athletics Hall of Fame (2009).

While he enjoyed tremendous success at each of his three head coaching stops, he became a larger-than-life figure in the sport thanks to his accomplishments in Bloomington. Hired by IU at the age of 30 in 1971, he led the program to three NCAA titles (1976, 1981, 1987), five Final Fours (1973, 1976, 1981, 1987, 1992), and 11 Big Ten Regular Season Championships (1973-76, 1980-81, 1983, 1987, 1989, 1991, 1993) in his 29 years as head coach. Knight's 1976 team, which went 32-0 on its way to the NCAA title, remains the most recent to go undefeated on its way to an NCAA title. His 1975 and 1976 teams, meanwhile, each went undefeated (18-0) in Big Ten play, and no Big Ten team has gone undefeated in a single season in league play since. Indiana's 37 consecutive Big Ten wins during that period also established a new conference standard that has never been seriously threatened.

Knight's dominance at IU stretched through all three decades that he coached in Bloomington. The 1970s included four Big Ten titles, two Final Fours, and one of the greatest teams in college basketball history with the undefeated 1976 national champions. As great as the 1970s were, the 1980s were even better. College basketball's most successful team during the decade, Knight's teams captured two NCAA titles and five Big Ten championships. In the 1990s, the Hoosiers won two more league crowns, advanced to another Final Four, earned 10 NCAA tourney bids, and four straight Sweet 16 trips. The 1990s also featured one of Knight's greatest teams to not win an NCAA title, as the 1993 team went 17-1 in the Big Ten, was the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, and featured four players that would eventually be first-round NBA Draft picks.

In addition to his accomplishments representing Indiana University, Knight also enjoyed similar success on the international level. He assembled and coached arguably the greatest amateur men's basketball team in history, as he led the 1984 U.S. Olympic team to a gold medal in Los Angeles, and guided the U.S. team to the 1979 Pan American Games gold as well.

While his teams excelled on the court, Knight's student-athletes also embodied what it meant to be a student-athlete. During his IU coaching career, 98 percent of his four-year players earned their degrees.

Besides being one of the sport's most successful coaches, Knight was also one of the most innovative. He revolutionized and popularized the 'motion offense,' an offensive style originally credited to one of Knight's mentors, Henry Iba. Unlike traditional 'set' offensive plays, the motion offense relied on player movement, proper spacing, passing, cutting, and screening to create scoring opportunities. It's a style of play that became synonymous with Knight and his IU teams, and it remains very much a staple of many of the game's most successful coaches to this day. Defensively, Knight was equally committed to a single style, as he had a deeply-rooted belief in the merits of the man-to-man defense.

The successes of both styles were enormous throughout his IU tenure, as his Hoosier teams were traditionally one of the Big Ten's most efficient offensively and one of the most difficult to score against defensively. As a result, Indiana won 73.5 percent of its games during Knight's tenure, the best among all Big Ten programs during that period. IU also earned 24 invitations to the NCAA Tournament during his 29 years, going 42-21 (.667) in those games. Overall, 28 of Knight's 29 IU teams earned postseason invitations.

While Knight's system and his unwavering belief in those coaching philosophies were a big part of his success at IU, an even more important component of his success was the abundance of exceptional student-athletes that he attracted to and developed in Bloomington.

In all, Knight coached nine Big Ten MVPs and 27 All-Americans at IU. His first Big Ten MVP was Steve Downing, who earned the honor in 1973 after leading Knight's second Hoosier team to the program's first Big Ten title in six years and its first Final Four trip in 20 seasons. The next to win the award was Scott May, the Big Ten's MVP in both 1975 and 1976 who also became Knight's first National Player of the Year in 1976. Calbert Cheaney became Knight's second National Player of the Year in 1993 after guiding IU to a Big Ten title, an Elite Eight berth, and becoming the Big Ten's all-time leading scorer with 2,613 points, a mark that stands to this day.

The list of Knight's legendary IU players doesn't end there. Far from it. Quinn Buckner was a two-time All-American, a three-time Big Ten champion, an Olympic gold medalist, and a future NBA champion whom Knight often referenced as the greatest leader in program history. Isiah Thomas was a 1981 All-American who guided IU to the NCAA title that same season before going on to a Hall of Fame and championship professional career with the NBA's Detroit Pistons. Steve Alford was a Big Ten MVP and two-time All-American who led the 1987 team to an NCAA title. And current IU coach Mike Woodson was a two-time All-American and 1980 Big Ten MVP who was Knight's first IU player to score 2,000 career points.

Knight was born on Oct. 25, 1940, in Orrville, Ohio. A multi-sport standout at Orrville H.S., Knight played basketball at Ohio State for Hall of Fame Coach Fred Taylor from 1958-62. A key reserve on those Buckeye teams, Knight played alongside future Hall of Famers John Havlicek and Jerry Lucas and helped OSU to the 1960 NCAA title and NCAA runner-up finishes in both 1961 and 1962.

After graduating from Ohio State in 1962, Knight spent one year coaching high school basketball at Cuyahoga Falls (Ohio) H.S. before enlisting in the Army in 1963. While in the Army, Knight accepted an assistant coaching position with the men's basketball team, and two years later was promoted to head coach at the age of 24. He went 102-50 in six years with the program and earned four NIT invitations before IU Athletic Director Bill Orwig announced his hiring as IU's new head coach on March 27, 1971.

The world of basketball lost a great one today. There won't be another one like him."

"I will always cherish the time we spent together after I played for him. His fierce loyalty to his former players never wavered. I am grateful that he was able to come to our practices after I came back. His presence meant so much to me, our staff, and our players."



NOTABLES

OPENING TIP

• Indiana University continues its 124th season of competition in men's basketball with a two-game road trip beginning on Friday, Jan. 19 at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis. Tip is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. CT against the No. 11/8 Wisconsin Badgers on FSI.

• The Big Ten-leading Badgers (13-4, 5-1) are led by 15.3 points and 3.2 rebounds per game from sophomore guard AJ Storr. The St. John's transfer is also second on the team with 20 made 3-pointers.

• Junior forward Steven Crowl (12.0 points, 7.8 rebounds) and fifth-year senior forward Tyler Wahl (11.7, 5.8) provide the bulk of the Wisconsin production from the frontcourt.

• Junior guard Max Klesmit (9.0 points), freshman guard John Blackwell (8.9), and junior guard Chucky Hepburn (8.0) provide 54 made 3-pointers between the trio.

SERIES HISTORY

• For the 188th time in program history, Indiana will take on the Wisconsin Badgers. The Hoosiers hold a 97-80 advantage in the series that dates back to Jan. 19, 1910, in a game in which IU emerged with a 13-11 victory in Madison.

• Three Hoosiers scored in double figures to lead Indiana to a 63-45 victory on Jan. 14, 2023, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall in the lone matchup between the two schools a season ago.

• All-American forward **Trayce Jackson-Davis** scored a game-high 18 points, including a series of thunderous dunks, to go with 12 rebounds and five blocked shots. **Jalen Hood-Schifano** tallied 16 points, five rebounds, and four assists, while **Jordan Geronimo** added a 12-point, 11-rebound double-double.

• The Hoosiers will attempt to secure the program's first victory in the Kohl Center since a 69-59 result on Jan. 25, 1998, the second men's game ever played in the arena. Indiana has not beaten a ranked Wisconsin team on the road in 12 tries.

LAST TIME OUT

• Indiana fell to archrival Purdue by a score of 87-66 on Jan. 16 in front of a 'White Out' crowd at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The No. 2/2 Boilers were led by 33 points and 14 rebounds from the reigning National Player of the Year Zach Edey.

• Senior guard **Trey Galloway** paced the Hoosier offense with 17 points and five assists. Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** dealt with early foul trouble but scored 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting from the floor.

• The IU bench, led by seven points, three rebounds, and three assists from sophomore guard **CJ Gunn**, outscored the PU reserves 16-10.

SOPHOMORE JUMP FOR RENEAU

• Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** has posted double digits in the scoring column in 16 games this season, including 10 efforts of at least 15 points. He notched a career-high 34 points against Kennesaw State (Dec. 29).

• Over the final two non-conference games, Reneau averaged 29.5 points, 9.0 rebounds, and 3.0 assists on 23-of-33 (69.7%) shooting from the floor, 5-of-7 (71.4%) from the 3-point line, and 8-of-12 (66.7%) from the charity stripe.

• Reneau is averaging a team-best 15.8 points per game to go along with 6.0 rebounds, 3.1 assists, and 0.8 blocks in 29 minutes per game. He is shooting 57.3% (114-of-199) from the floor, 40.0% (12-of-30) from the 3-point line, and 62.5% (45-of-72) from the free throw line.

BIG MAN TRANSFORMATION

• Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware**, a transfer from Oregon, has upped his scoring (from 6.6 points to 14.2), rebounds (4.1 to 9.4), assists (0.5 to 1.8), and field goal percentage (45.7% to 54.8%) in his second season. He leads the Hoosiers in rebounds and blocks in 31 minutes per game.

• Ware has scored at least 10 points in 14 games this year after producing just eight such games as a rookie. The 7-footer has ripped down at least 10 boards seven times this season, including a career-high 17 at Rutgers (Jan. 9). Since the turn of the new year, Ware is averaging 10.7 rebounds per game in conference play.

• Ware tallied a career-high 28 points on 12-of-13 shooting from the floor in an 89-76 win over Harvard (Nov. 26) in Indianapolis. The 92.3% shooting split marked the highest by a Hoosier with at least 10 made field goals this century.

PAINT PRODUCTION

• Indiana averages 37.7 points per game in the paint and shoots 52.9% (388-of-734) from inside the arc. The Hoosiers hold opponents to 27.8 points per night in the key.

• IU gets to the charity stripe 23.0 times per game, the 38th most among all Division I programs and the third-highest figure in the Big Ten.

• Indiana scored a season-best 56 points in the paint against Wright State (Nov. 16). The Hoosiers also tallied 50 paint points against Harvard (Nov. 26) and 52 against Kennesaw State (Dec. 29).

SONS OF COACHES

• Senior guard **Trey Galloway** scored a career-high 28 points against No. 2/2 Kansas (Dec. 16). He converted 12-of-17 shots. Galloway has scored at least 15 points in six career games. IU holds a record of 4-2 in those contests.

• He has dished out 42 total assists in his last seven outings against North Alabama (Dec. 21), Kennesaw State (Dec. 29), at Nebraska (Jan. 3), Ohio State (Jan. 6), at Rutgers (Jan. 9), and Minnesota (Jan. 12), and No. 2/2 Purdue (Jan. 16) to go against just 12 turnovers.

• Galloway, who won the 2018 Indiana 3A state title for Culver Academies coached by his father, Mark, turned in his best collegiate season in 2022-23 with career highs in games played (32), games started (25), minutes per game (27.6), points per game (6.7), rebounds per game (3.0), assists per game (2.1), and 3-point field goal percentage (46.2).

• Freshman guard **Gabe Cupps**, the 2022 Mr. Basketball in the state of Ohio led Centerville, coached by his father Brook, to the 2021 state title.

• Cupps started nine games for the Hoosiers with averages of 3.3 points, 2.8 rebounds, and 1.3 assists per game in a starting role. IU holds a record of 6-3 with Cupps manning the point guard position with the first unit.

MACK ATTACK

• Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** has made a team-high 24 3-pointers this season, including 16 over his past seven games. During the seven-game stretch he is shooting 16-of-33 (48.5%) from behind the arc and averaging 12.0 points, 3.4 rebounds, and 2.0 assists per game.

• Mgbako scored a career-best 19 points on 6-of-12 shooting from the floor against Minnesota (Jan. 12) to go along with four rebounds and two assists.

• The consensus top-10 recruit is averaging 11.7 points and 3.4 rebounds per game in Big Ten play. He has reached double figures in the scoring column in 11 of the last 13 games.

EMPIRE STATE OF MIND

• Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau**, a member of the 2023 Saatva Empire Classic All-Tournament Team, showed out in the World's Most Famous Arena. He averaged 15.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.0 steal, and 1.5 blocks in a pair of games against No. 5/4 UConn and Louisville.

• Sophomore forward **Kaleb Banks** had a breakout game against border rival Louisville (Nov. 20) in the Empire Classic. He posted career highs in rebounds (8), assists (3), steals (3), blocks (3), and minutes (25) to go along with four points.

INDIANA FALLS TO NO. 2/2 PURDUE

• Despite dealing with early foul trouble, freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** scored 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting from the floor in an 87-66 loss to No. 2/2 Purdue on Jan. 16 at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

• Senior guard **Trey Galloway** notched a team-high 17 points to go along with five assists. Sophomore guard **CJ Gunn** led the bench unit with seven points, three rebounds, and three assists.

MGBAKO LEADS IU OVER MINNESOTA

• Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** scored a game-high 19 points on 6-of-12 shooting from the floor in a 74-62 win over Minnesota on Jan. 12. He added four rebounds and two assists.

• Sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** charted his seventh double-double of the season with 17 points and 14 rebounds. The Oregon transfer also swatted two shots. Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** finished with 16 points, six rebounds, and three assists.

INDIANA FALTERS AGAINST RUTGERS ON THE ROAD

• The Indiana starting frontcourt of freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako**, sophomore forward **Malik Reneau**, and sophomore center **Kel'el Ware** combined to score 39 points on 15-of-31 shooting from the floor. The trio added 28 rebounds, nine assists, and three blocks in a 66-57 loss at Rutgers on Jan. 9.

• IU held Rutgers to 21-of-65 (32.3%) shooting from the floor and 5-of-22 (22.7%) from the 3-point line while forcing 15 turnovers.

HOOSIERS BEAT BUCKEYES IN BLOOMINGTON

• Indiana dominated the painted area (40-24) in a 71-65 win over Ohio State on Jan. 6. Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** led the way for the Hoosiers with 23 points and seven rebounds.

• Sixth-year senior guard **Xavier Johnson** posted 18 points, three rebounds, and three assists, while sophomore guard **CJ Gunn** added 10 points and a steal off the bench.

• The Hoosier defense held Ohio State to 7-of-27 (25.9%) shooting from the 3-point line. The Buckeyes entered the game making 8.5 3-pointers per game at a 38.0% clip.

• IU shot 36-of-59 (61.0%) from the floor, the highest single-game percentage since shooting 61.8% (34-of-55) at Illinois on Jan. 19, 2023.

LONG BALL LOOMS LARGE IN WIN OVER LIONS

• Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** scored 25 points to go along with seven rebounds and two assists in Indiana’s 83-66 victory over North Alabama on Dec. 21. Reneau canned all four of his 3-point attempts.

• As a team, IU knocked down a season-high 12 3-pointers on 24 attempts. Reneau (4), freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** (2), and senior guard **Trey Galloway** (2) all hit multiple 3-point attempts.

LATE PUSH LEADS INDIANA OVER MOREHEAD STATE

• Indiana erased a 15-point deficit in just under nine minutes on the strength of a 20-4 run to close the game to secure a 69-68 win over Morehead State on Dec. 19. Fifth-year senior **Anthony Walker** charted 18 points and nine rebounds off the bench.

• Sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** blocked Morehead State’s game-winning shot attempt at time expired.

INDIANA TAKES KANSAS DOWN TO THE WIRE

• The Hoosiers led the second-ranked Kansas Jayhawks for the first 35 minutes of the game before falling by a score of 75-71 on Dec. 16 in front of a striped-out crowd at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

• Senior guard **Trey Galloway** posted a career night with 28 points on 12-of-17 shooting from the floor. Sophomore center **Kel’el Ware** tallied an 11-point, 15-rebound double-double.

• Freshman forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** added 14 points and five rebounds, while sophomore forward **Malik Reneau** scored 13 points. The quartet scored 93.0% (66-of-71) of the IU points.

HOOSIERS FALL IN HOLIDAY HOOPSGIVING EVENT

• The game marked the first time Indiana’s defense had surrendered 100-plus points in regulation since falling to No. 3 North Carolina by a score of 101-86 in the Sweet Sixteen of the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

• Sophomore guard **CJ Gunn** produced a season-best eight points on 2-of-3 shooting from behind the arc to go along with a career-high-tying three steals in a 78-75 win over Michigan on Dec. 5.

IU MOURNS THE LOSS GEORGE MCGINNIS

The Indiana men's basketball program is saddened by the loss of Indiana University Athletics Hall of Famer **George McGinnis** (1950-2023). He was 73 years old.

"I loved George McGinnis," Indiana men's basketball head coach **Mike Woodson** said. "He meant so much not only to IU and the state of Indiana, but to the entire basketball world."

"I looked up to George growing up in Indianapolis. He meant so much to me as a player and more importantly as a man. George was a Hall of Famer on and off the court, and I am going to miss him so much. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the McGinnis family, his friends, and his teammates. Rest easy Big Mac."

In his one year of varsity basketball at Indiana, McGinnis led the Big Ten in both scoring (29.9 points per game) and rebounds (14.7) to become the first sophomore in league history to lead the Big Ten in both categories. He was named to the Associated Press All-America Third Team and added to the All-Big Ten First Team before bypassing his final two seasons of eligibility as a hardship case. He was inducted to the IU Athletics Hall of Fame on Sept. 22, 2023.

MGBAKO NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Freshman forward Mackenzie Mgbako was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Jan. 2.

The Gladstone, N.J., native averaged 13.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, and 2.3 assists on 6-of-16 (37.5%) shooting from the 3-point line in a trio of non-conference games against Morehead State (Dec. 19), North Alabama (Dec. 21), and Kennesaw State (Dec. 29).

He was the first Hoosier to earn a Big Ten weekly honor this season and first IU freshman to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week since Jalen Hood-Schifino on Feb. 27. JHS claimed the award four times last season before being drafted No. 17 overall by the Los Angeles Lakers.

MIKE WOODSON

Third Year at Indiana • Third Year as College Head Coach

Record at Indiana: 56-32 Overall, Third Year

Indiana University Vice President and Director of Athletics Scott Dolsen named former Hoosier All-American and Indianapolis native Mike Woodson as the 30th head coach in the men's basketball program's history on March 28, 2021.

Under his tutelage, the Hoosiers have posted a 44-26 mark and seen the program make back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since 2015 and 2016. IU also advanced to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals for the second straight year.

In 2022-23, the Hoosiers finished the season ranked in the top 25 in both major polls. IU was 23-12 overall and finished tied for second in the Big Ten with a 12-8 mark. The year included a road win at Xavier and season sweeps over Purdue, Michigan and Illinois, a group of teams that prior to Woodson's arrival had a combined 20-0 record recently against the Hoosiers. Under Woodson, IU is 9-3 against those three teams with victories included in West Lafayette, Ann Arbor, and Champaign.

The Cream and Crimson led the Big Ten in field goal percentage (48.7%) and finished second in the conference in field goal percentage defense in both the league's overall and conference games only ledgers. The Hoosiers also tied for the most wins in the Big Ten against Top 25 programs (5) and had the best winning percentage versus ranked foes (62.5%) in the conference.

He saw senior forward Trayce Jackson-Davis earn consensus first-team All-American honors, a first for a Hoosier player in 10 years, and win the Karl Malone Award given annually to the best power forward in college basketball. The Greenwood native finished his career at IU ranked third in career scoring and double-doubles, while finishing as the school's all-time leader in rebounds and blocked shots. He was a unanimous first team All-Big Ten selection and the league leader in blocked shots also was a member of the league's All-Defensive team.

In addition, freshman Jalen Hood-Schifino was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year, was named second and third team All-Big Ten and earned All-Freshman accolades.

In his first year, Woodson guided the team to a nine-win improvement, an NCAA Tournament win, built the top-rated defense in the Big Ten according to KenPom (22nd, nationally). IU also led the Big Ten in field goal percentage defense at 39.6% and finished second in blocked shots at 4.83 a game. In Big Ten games, the Hoosiers also led the league in field goal percentage defense at 41.3%.

He led the Hoosiers to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals for the first time since 2003 and helped three players earn All-Big Ten status including Trayce Jackson-Davis, Race Thompson, and Xavier Johnson. His team also ended nine-game losing streaks to Purdue and Michigan and his staff landed the 10th-best recruiting class in the country according to 247Sports.

Woodson returned to the Bloomington campus in the spring of 2021 with a vast experiences and knowledge after playing in the NBA for 11 seasons beginning in 1980 and serving as a coach in the league beginning in 1996 for seven NBA franchises, including nine years combined as a head coach with the Atlanta Hawks and New York Knicks. He was currently serving as an assistant coach with the Knicks.

Woodson was the 1980 Big Ten Player of the Year and NABC All-American as a senior in leading the Hoosiers to a conference title and a berth in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen. Despite undergoing back surgery in December and missing seven weeks, he was honored as the Chicago Tribune's Silver Basketball Award Winner following the season.

As head coach of the Knicks, Woodson guided his 2012-13 Atlantic Division Champions to their first appearance in the Eastern Conference semifinals since 2000 and finished his tenure as New York's coach with a record of 109-79 (.680). As an NBA head coach with Atlanta (2004-2010) and New York (2011-2014), Woodson saw his teams compile two 50-plus win seasons including a personal high of 54 victories during the 2012-13 season with the Knicks. Woodson joined the Knicks staff following six seasons as head coach of the Hawks, where he guided the Hawks to the NBA Playoffs in each of his last three seasons (including 2007-08, ending Atlanta's eight-year Playoff drought), and into the Eastern Conference Semifinals in his last two seasons. In the Playoffs, he piloted the Hawks to back-to-back Game 7 wins in the first round over Miami in 2009 and Milwaukee in 2010.

Before joining the Hawks, Woodson served for one season (2003-04) as an assistant coach with the Detroit Pistons, where he earned an NBA Championship ring as one of the chief architects behind Detroit's suffocating defense that helped lift the Pistons to the 2004 NBA title. Prior to his six years at the helm of the Hawks, Woodson logged eight seasons as an assistant coach with Milwaukee (1996-97 through 1998-99), Cleveland (1999-2000 through 2000-01), Philadelphia (2001-02 through 2002-03) and Detroit (2003-04).

Among the All-Stars he's mentored are Ray Allen (Milwaukee Bucks), Kenny Anderson (Atlanta Hawks), Carmelo Anthony (New York Knicks), Chauncey Billups (Detroit Pistons), Sam Cassell (Milwaukee Bucks), Derrick Coleman (Philadelphia 76ers), Baron Davis (New York Knicks), Blake Griffin (Los Angeles Clippers), Richard Hamilton (Detroit Pistons), Al Horford (Atlanta Hawks), Allen Iverson (Philadelphia 76ers), Joe Johnson (Atlanta Hawks), DeAndre Jordan (Los Angeles Clippers), Shawn Kemp (Cleveland Cavaliers), Jason Kidd (New York Knicks), Kenyon Martin (New York Knicks), Dikembe Mutombo (Philadelphia 76ers), Chris Paul (Los Angeles Clippers), Paul Pierce (Los Angeles Clippers), Julius Randle (New York Knicks), Glenn Robinson (Milwaukee Bucks), Derrick Rose (New York Knicks), Amar'e Stoudemire (New York Knicks), Antoine Walker (Atlanta Hawks), Ben Wallace (Detroit Pistons) and Rasheed Wallace (Detroit Pistons, New York Knicks).


As an assistant, he has worked for greats such as Chris Ford (Bucks), George Karl (Bucks), Larry Brown (76ers and Pistons), Mike D'Antoni (Knicks), Doc Rivers (Clippers), and Tom Thibodeau (Knicks).

The Knicks selected Woodson with the 12th pick of the 1980 NBA Draft and he enjoyed an 11-year NBA playing career, averaging 14.0 points over 786 games for the Knicks (1980-81), New Jersey (1981-82), Kansas City/Sacramento (1981-82 through 1985-86), the LA Clippers (1986-87 through 1987-88), Houston (1988-89 through 1990-91) and Cleveland (1990-91). He scored a career-high 18.2 ppg with Kansas City in 1982-83. He also averaged 12.2 points in 13 career Playoff games over five post-seasons. Woodson's NBA playing career began in 1980-81, when he averaged 4.7 points over 11.7 minutes in 81 contests with the Knicks.

He had the honor of playing for some of the most decorated coaches in league history including Red Holzman (Knicks) Larry Brown (Nets) Cotton Fitzsimmons (Kings); Gene Shue (Clippers), Don Chaney (Clippers and Rockets).

Woodson played 104 games for the Hoosiers after graduating in 1976 from Broad Ripple High School and is the fifth all-time leading scorer with 2,061 points and his 19.8 points per game average is tied (Calbert Cheaney) for the second highest by a Hoosier who played four seasons in college. He averaged 21.0 points during his junior season and helped lead Indiana to an NIT Championship. Woodson captained the USA's Pan American Games team to a gold medal during the summer prior to his senior year and was all set to have a perfect season with the Hoosiers who were ranked No. 1 in the preseason of the 1979-80 campaign. After five games, Woodson suffered a herniated disc in his back and had to undergo surgery. Upon losing Woodson, the Hoosiers went 7-5 in the Big Ten until he returned to spark Indiana back into action. IU finished the conference season with six straight victories and won the Big Ten title. Woodson was the MVP after playing in only six league games that season.

The 65-year-old was born on March 24, 1958 in Indianapolis. At Broad Ripple High School in Indianapolis, he averaged 28.6 points as a senior, scored 1,154 points in his career, and earned All-State honors while being a member of the Indiana All-Stars. He was inducted into the IU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1992 and the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010. Mike and his wife, Terri, have two daughters, Alexis and Mariah, who were volleyball players at Georgia Tech. Alexis also played one season at IU.
