SCOUTING REPORT: INDIANA HOOSIERS

- The Hoosiers spent two weeks in the D1Baseball Top 25.
 They were ranked as high as #20, but fell out in the Week 4 rankings.
- Indiana is 3-4 at home this season.
- Indiana is 2-3 against ranked opponents this season. Their two wins came against #18 Coastal Carolina and #25 Dallas Bantist
- Devin Taylor is fifth in the Big Ten with a .386 batting average.
- Carter Mathison is tied for second in the conference with five home runs.
- Brock Tibbitts is riding a six-game hitting streak and has 12 hits in his past six contests.
- Sophomores Devin Taylor (27) and Tyler Cerny (26) are both top-five in the conference in hits.

GAME RECAP VS. UT MARTIN (MAR. 13)

Belmont defeated UT Martin 3-2.

- Cade Granzow moves to 1-1 on the season. He recorded career highs in innings pitched (6) and strikeouts (6). It was Granzow's most efficient outing of the season, as he allowed a season-low two earned runs on four hits.
- Sam Slaughter hit a game-high 2-for-3, with a pair of RBIs.
 This was Slaughter's third multi-RBI game in the last four
 games. He's recorded an RBI in five of his last six games.
- Jack Rando recorded an RBI on a sacrifice fly.
- Bill Dudy notched his second save of the season. The graduate transfer went 1.2 hitless innings with one strikeout.
- Jordan Zuger tosses 1.1 scoreless innings.
- Michael Lareau and Max Blessinger recorded stolen bases.

SEREIES RECAP VS. UAB (MAR 8-10)

Belmont went 2-1 in their series against UAB.

- Belmont's 23 runs against UAB is the most by the Bruins in a three-game series.
- Sam Slaughter and Jack Rando are the two hottest bats in the Bruins' lineup. Both players recorded five hits in the series against UAB. Slaughter holds a 10-game on-base streak, which is the second longest of the season for a Bruin. Slaughter leads the team with a .333 batting average. Rando finished the series with a team-best five RBIs. His three RBIs in Saturday's game is a new season high. He ranks behind Slaughter with a .313 batting average.
- Brodey Heaton is five hits away from moving into the top 10 in program history for career hits. Heaton currently sits at 220 career hits.
- Brodey Heaton's two home runs in Friday's game against UAB is the second time this season a Bruin has hit multiple home runs in a game (Landon Godsey 2/16 vs. Eastern Michigan). His team-leading five home runs rank sixth in the MVC.
- Belmont batted around in the first inning of their 9-3 win in game two. Sam Slaughter recorded two hits in the inning.

ACE IN PRYOR

Will Pryor was tabbed the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Pitcher of the Week for March 5th. Pryor had himself a day last Friday against Little Rock. The sophomore tossed a career-high seven innings and set a new personal best with 11 strikeouts. Pryor had five strikeouts through the first three innings. He worked out of a bases-loaded jam in the third inning, which was the only time Little Rock left runners stranded on base. His pitch sequencing led to three consecutive 1-2-3 innings from the fourth through sixth innings, and he finished with four on the day. It was Pryor's most effective outing of the season, as he threw only 84 pitches.

FOLLOW BRODEY

Brodey Heaton continues to lead the Bruins in multiple hitting categories: hits (17), doubles (3), home runs (5), RBIs (11), and total bases (35). Heaton is third on the team in batting average (.283). He held a team-high 11-game hit streak from February 17 to March 3.

HOT BATS

Sam Slaughter: Slaughter has been on a tear for the last two weeks. He's currently on a six-game hit streak, with multi-hit performances in the last three games. The outfielder has eight RBIs during the stretch, and has increased his season batting average to a team-high .349.

Jack Rando lost a five-game hit streak against UT Martin on Wednesday. After his pinch-hit RBI-double on March 3 against Little Rock, Rando has started in the last five games. He's had three multi-hit games, with a season-high three RBIs on March 9 vs. UAB.

DUBY IS DEALING

Bill Duby: picked up two saves this week against UAB and UT Martin. Duby sealed the 9-6 win over the Blazers on March 8, with a strikeout. He earned the save against the Skyhawks in 1.2 innings of work with a strikeout. In his last four outings, Duby has thrown 6 hitless innings. The only time that Duby allowed earned runs was March 1, against Little Rock. He leads the team with a 1.80 ERA.

FEBRUARY NOTES

- Brodey Heaton carries a team-high eight-game hit streak into March. Heaton is tied for second on the team with two home runs
- Sophomore Jake Timbes has been exceptional on the mound in two starts for the Bruins. Timbes is tied for the third-lowest ERA in the Missouri Valley Conference. In his start against #21 South Carolina, Timbes went five innings, allowed one run, and earned his second win of the season, as Belmont upset the Gamecocks, 11-2.
- Will Pryor is tied for sixth in the MVC with 11 strikeouts. He fanned six batters on Opening Day against Eastern Michigan.
- Max Jones leads the team in batting average (.355), hits (55), tied for a team-high in RBIs (8) and doubles (2).
- Freshman Pete Daniel is one of four Bruins to start in all nine games in February. Daniel is batting .250 on the season, with eight hits, a home run, and has served as the leadoff batter for the last seven games.
- Freshman Hank Liss has already established himself as Belmont's closer. Liss owns a 2.35 ERA through 7.2 innings of work. He picked up the save on Opening Day against Eastern Michigan, as he went three innings, allowed one run, and struck out two batters. Liss recently picked up his first

career win against Tennessee Tech. He's struck out four hitters in his last two outings against #21 South Carolina (Feb. 24) and Tennessee Tech (Feb. 27).

Landon Godsey has started behind the dish for the Bruins eight times. His
.333 batting average is the second-best on the team. He leads the team
with three home runs, which is tied for third in the MVC.

VS. BIG TEN OPPONENTS

- Belmont is 11-3 against Big Ten opponents since their inaugural NCAA season in 1998.
- The last time the Bruins faced a Big Ten opponent was Purdue in 2022. The Bruins swept the Boilermakers in Lafayette during a three-game series (April 22-24).

TOP 25 OPPONENTS

Belmont plays four teams in the Top 25 rankings by D1baseball.com: #21 South Carolina (Feb. 23-25), #9 Vanderbilt (Mar. 19), #16 Alabama (Mar. 26), and #8 Tennessee (May 14). Indiana (Mar. 15-17) dropped our, after being ranked as high as #20 in the D1Baseball.com Week 2 ranking. The Bruins are 1-2 this season against ranked opponents, after going 0-5 last season.

ARMY OF ARMS

Even with the departure of ace Andy Bean, the Bruins' pitching staff is setup for success in the 2024 season. Assistant head coach / pitching coach A.J. Gaura and the Bruins return 85% of their innings and strikeouts from last season. Belmont saw five different pitchers make five or more starts last season: Dominic Baratta (13), Joe Ruzicka (13), Jordan Zuger (11), Jalen Borders (5), and Will Pryor (4). The depth is similar in the bullpen, as Belmont returns key contributors Jett Thielke, Simon Tesh, and Jordan Zuger.

VETERAN LINEUP

Belmont returns all of their starting lineup and 92% of their at-bats from last year featuring seven seniors , led by first baseman Brodey Heaton. His power potential backed by 44 RBIs and 10 home runs last season makes him Belmont's big-swing threat in the lineup. Belmont's most productive bat last season was in the hands of Mason Landers. The senior from Shelbyville, Tennessee led the team with a .277 batting average, 12 home runs, and 118 total bases.

WELCOME THE TRANSFERS

The Bruins welcome four transfers to the 2024 roster. Michael Lareau joins the Bruins after two seasons at Wabash Valley Community College. In 2023, he posted a .338 batting average, recorded 35 RBIs, and totaled 51 runs. Lareau helped the Warriors to a 57-13 record and were runners-up in the NJCAA Division I World Series under a first-year head coach. Graduate student Blake Ciuffetelli reunites with former high school teammate Brodey Heaton, after spending four seasons at Southern Indiana. Last year, Ciuffetelli made 24 appearances and seven starts in the Screaming Eagles' inaugural Division I season. He set a new career-high with 48 strikeouts. Landon Godsey joins the Bruins after two years at Volunteer State Community College, in Gallatin, Tennessee. Godsey had a spectacular 2023 campaign at the plate hitting .368 in 55 games, including 68 hits, eight home runs, and 23 extra-base hits. The junior catcher/outfielder from Indianapolis busted on the scene with 31 hits in his first 22 games last season. Bill Duby is a graduate transfer from Western Kentucky, who joins the Bruins following a year away from baseball. Before his one season for the Hilltoppers in 2022, Duby pitched at Diablo Valley Community College for three seasons.

FRESH FACES

The Bruins add four freshmen to the roster for the 2024 season. Belmont adds a pair of position players, Ty Allen and Pete Daniel, and pitchers, Zach Hernandez and Hank Liss. Allen was a four-year varsity starter at Independence High School in Franklin, Tennessee. The two-time All-District and All-Midstate honoree recorded a .350 batting average, nine home runs, 24 doubles, and 76 RBIs in his last two years of high school ball. He was selected by the Tennessee Baseball Coaches Association to represent Team Tennessee. Independence High School won both the district and regional championships twice during Allen's time, along with a state tournament appearance. Nashville native Pete Daniel was a two-time D-IIAA All-Region selection and multi-sport athlete

at Ensworth High School (played varsity basketball). Right-handed pitcher Zach Hernandez, hailing from Fayetteville, Tennessee, attended Lincoln County High School. Hernandez earned All-District honors and helped Lincoln County secure a district championship. Hank Liss is the only freshman joining the Bruins from outside Tennessee. A native of Evanston, Illinois, Liss racked up an impressive resume at Evanston Township High School. He earned an IHSA All-State selection, tossed three no-hitters, and helped the Wildkits win three conference and regional championships. Liss played travel ball for Top Tier North and led the pitching staff with the lowest ERA.

HOME GROWN

Fifteen Bruins hail from Tennessee: Zach Hernandez (Fayetteville), Simon Tesh (Knoxville), Sam Kirkpatrick (Franklin), Ty Allen (Franklin), Sam Slaughter (Symrna), Blake Barton (Franklin), Ethan Harden (Greenbrier), Jordan Zuger (Hendersonville), Will Pryor (Whitwell), Mason Landers (Shelbyville), Jake Timbes (Kingsport), Pete Daniel (Nashville), Jack Rando (Brentwood), and Cade Granzow (Franklin).

THE LEGEND OF JARVIS

Head coach Dave Jarvis enters his 27th season at the helm of the Belmont Baseball program. Jarvis is one of 16 active Division I coaches to record more than 700 career wins at their current university. He became the winningest coach in program history back in 2021 thanks to a pair of doubleheader wins on April 17 against Murray State. He passed Belmont legend Dave Whitten (1969-1997) for the all-time wins total in program history with 737 wins. With an 11-1 win over Middle Tennessee on Feb. 23, 2022 Dave Jarvis recorded his 1,000th career win (324 at Three Rivers College, 676 at Belmont). With an 8-2 win over Evansville on April 26, 2022, Jarvis notched his 700th win at Belmont, one of only 16 active coaches with 700+ Division I wins at their current school.

BRUIN ON THE WORLD STAGE

Former Belmont catcher Jamie Ritchie (2012-2014) was selected

to Great Britain's national team roster for the 2023 World Baseball Classic, becoming the first Bruin to participate in the event. Ritchie has played for eight seasons in the minor leagues after being drafted in the 13th round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Houston Astros. This past offseason, Ritchie signed a minor league deal with the Toronto Blue Jays.

BELMONT'S MLB CHAMPION

Former Belmont Baseball All-American Matt Beaty ('15) became the first Bruin alum to win a World Series title when he was a member of the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2020. The Dresden, Tenn. native is the second Belmont alum to win a World Championship in professional sports, with former Belmont Basketball player Ian Clark winning an NBA Championship in 2017 as a member of the Golden State Warriors. Beaty became the first Belmont player to play in a Major League Baseball game since Dwight Bernard in 1978, making his Major League debut on April 30, 2019. Beaty played for the San Diego Padres in 2022 and signed with the Kansas City Royals on January 10, 2023.

SINGING STARS

Not only has Belmont alumni made its name in the professional baseball ranks, but they have shined as stars off the field. Florida Georgia Line's Brian Kelley pitched for the Bruins from 2008-09, compiling 109 strikeouts. Judah Akers, the lead singer of Judah & The Lion, earned All-Atlantic Sun honors and was named the 2012 Atlantic Sun Tournament MVP to help Belmont to its second straight NCAA Tournament. Judah & The Lion performed on February 23 for Belmont's Homecoming.

FROM HERE TO ANYWHERE

Several of Belmont Baseball's alumni have gone onto success in coaching. Vanderbilt Football's head coach Clark Lea was a member of the Bruins in 2002, hitting .400 in his lone season. Packy Elkins now serves as the run production coach for the St. Louis Cardinals, where he played at Belmont from 2007-10 and hit .327 in his senior season. Grace Christian Academy's Brad Myers was inducted into the Tennessee Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January 2022. He played for Belmont from 1989-92.

GAME RECAP VS. KENNESAW STATE (MAR. 6)

Kennesaw State defeated Belmont 15-2 in seven innings.

- Sam Slaughter went 1-for-3, with a solo home run in the fourth inning. This was Slaughter's second home run of the season, and he has hit a long ball in Belmont's last two games. He scored both of Belmont's runs in the game.
- Jack Rando went 2-for-3 and drove in Belmont's first run of the game in the second inning. He has at least one RBI in three of his last five games.
- Caleb Guisewite retired all three batters faced in the seventh inning.

SERIES RECAP VS. LITTLE ROCK (MAR. 1-3)

- The Bruins went 1-2 against Little Rock in their weekend series. Both losses on Friday and Saturday went to extra innings. Saturday's 5-3 loss in 14 innings is tied for the second-longest game in Division I this season.

- Belmont's Will Pryor and Joe Ruzicka had stellar stars for the Bruins this weekend. Pryor went a career-high seven shutout innings, with a career-high 11 strikeouts. Joe Ruzicka picked his second win of the season Sunday. Ruzicka went a career-high eight innings, allowed two runs on two hits, and recorded five punchouts. 





Entering his 27th season at the helm of Belmont's baseball program and 42nd year of coaching overall, head coach Dave Jarvis has cultivated a rich program that's seen success both on the field and in the classroom. Jarvis has led the Bruins since their inception as a NCAA Division I institution in 1998, leading Belmont to four conference championships and its two NCAA Tournament berths in 2011 and 2012.

As a coach, Jarvis has culminated an overall record of 1,061-830-2 in 35 years as a head coach and helped produce nine seasons in which the Bruins garnered 30 or more wins. The team constructed a program-best 39 wins during both the 2012 and 2022 seasons.

Not only has Jarvis lifted Belmont Baseball to new heights, but he is also in elite company in NCAA Division I baseball. Jarvis is one of just 16 active head coaches to record 700 or more Division I wins at their current school.

Jarvis has developed 29 players from Belmont who have gone on to play professional baseball, including current San Diego Padres infielder/outfielder Matt Beaty and 2022 MLB Draft pick Guy Lipscomb, who was selected No. 151 overall

by the Cleveland Guardians to become the highest draft selection in program history. In addition to his on-field success, Jarvis has helped his players excel in the classroom. Following the 2021-22 academic year, a league-high 30 Belmont baseball players were named to the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll.

During the 2022 season, Belmont secured their first OVC Regular Season championship by finishing conference play with an 18-6 mark, tying the program record for both regular season wins (37) and total wins (39). The Bruins swept the conference's major awards, with Jarvis earning OVC Coach of the Year, Guy Lipscomb earning OVC Player of the Year, and Andy Bean taking home OVC Pitcher of the Year. On April 22-24, the Bruins swept Purdue on the road, the program's first-ever road sweep of a Power Five opponent.

The Bruins boasted one of the top defenses in the country in 2022, finishing 4th in NCAA Division I in fielding percentage (.983) with first baseman Brodey Heaton being named one of three finalists for the 2022 Rawlings Gold Glove Award, given annually to the top defender at each position. Guy Lipscomb turned in one of the best individual season in program history, setting program records for batting average (.406) and stolen bases (42) on the way to Third-Team All-American status and towards becoming the first player in NCAA Division I since 2011 to hit over .400 and steal at least 40 bags.

Lipscomb and Bean earned First-Team All-Conference honors while Heaton, Jalen Borders, and Kyle Brennan picked up Second-Team All-Conference recognition in 2022

Jarvis recorded his 1,000th career win on February 23, 2022 with an 11-1 victory over Middle Tennessee. On April 26, 2022, Jarvis picked up his 700th win at Belmont with an 8-2 victory at Evansville.

Jarvis developed 28 players from Belmont who have gone on to play professional baseball, including current Los Angeles Dodgers infielder/outfielder Matt Beaty. In addition to his on-field success, Jarvis has helped his players excel in the classroom. Following the 2019-20 academic year, 21 Belmont baseball players were named to the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll.

The 2020 Belmont Bruins finished the season receiving votes in the final two weeks of the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Top 30 poll, posting the 17th-highest win-loss percentage in NCAA Baseball with an .824 mark. The Bruins were also 18th in the country in total home runs with 20.

In 2011, Belmont beat Oklahoma State and Troy in the Baton Rouge Regional, marking the first time in program history that the Bruins won an NCAA tournament game in any sport. Concluding the landmark season, Jarvis was named the TBCA College Coach of the Year. The previous year carved another program-best when Belmont started the season with a perfect 10-0 start.

Belmont toppled its first ranked opponent in 2001 when Jarvis' squad beat then-No. 13 ranked Georgia, who would be an eventual College World Series participant. Since then the Bruins have beaten multiple ranked opponents.

Jarvis fine-tuned his coaching ability with a nine-year stint as head coach at Three Rivers Community College in Poplar Bluff, Mo. from 1985-93. With Jarvis at the helm, the Raiders were consistently ranked in the National Junior College Athletic Association top 20 poll, highlighted by a No. 4 ranking in 1992.

Jarvis broke into NCAA Division I baseball as an assistant with Murray State in the fall of 1993. At Murray State, he was primarily responsible for the instruction of hitters and catchers as well as teaching base running skills. Jarvis also used his extensive junior college network to create a recruiting pipeline for the Racers.

He finished his playing career at Arkansas State as the starting catcher and team captain. The Missouri native earned a bachelor's degree in education and later received his master's in education, both at Arkansas State.

A dedicated family man, Jarvis has three sons, Jordan, Logan, and Jackson. The family resides in Franklin, Tenn.

COACHING STAFF



A.J. Gaura • Associate Head Coach / Pitching Coach

A.J. Gaura enters his first year as Belmont's assistant head coach, and third season as the Belmont pitching coach, after being introduced to the Bruins' staff on Jan. 3, 2022.

Gaura's first season in the dugout for the Bruins resulted in Belmont owning the best pitching staff in the Ohio Valley Conference, leading the league in ERA (4.59) with the runner-up nearly a full run behind (5.52). Belmont was also first in the conference in opponent batting average (.253), first in wins (39), first in saves (18), second in home runs allowed (60), and third in walks allowed (217).

With Gaura's guidance, the Bruins owned one of the best weekend rotations in the country, with OVC Pitcher of the Year Andy Bean and Second-Team All-Conference selection Jalen Borders bookending two-time OVC Preseason Pitcher of the Year Joshua South. Bean, Borders, and South were all in the top-10 in the Ohio Valley Conference in ERA, in the top-5 in opponent batting average, in the top-7 in innings pitched, and in the top-10 in strikeouts.

Under Gaura's tutelage, Bean earned Belmont's first-ever OVC Pitcher of the Year honor after going 9-1 with a 4.64 ERA and 75 strikeouts in 2022, to help lead the Bruins to their first OVC Regular Season Championship, winning the league with an 18-6 conference mark while tying the program-record for wins (39).

In the bullpen, reliever Kyle Brennan enjoyed a record-breaking year as the Bruin closer, finishing 4th in the country in saves (14) while breaking the program's all-time career record for saves (31). Gaura's efforts with reliever Dusty Baird resulted in the right-hander developing finishing the season on a scorching stretch that saw him allow just one run over his final 13 innings, before signing a professional contract with the Rocky Mountain Vibes of the Pioneer League.

A native of Suamico, Wisconsin, Gaura came to Belmont after three seasons as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Evansville.

In 2021, the Aces finished with a 28-27 overall record competing in the Missouri Valley Conference, their first winning season since 2014. That season, Gaura helped sophomore pitcher Shane Gray to one of the best pitching performances from an Ace in recent memory, coaching Gray to a spot on the All-MVC Second Team after he finished with a 2.84 ERA, the third best mark in the Missouri Valley Conference. Under Gaura, the Aces finished with a 4.82 team ERA in his first season in 2019, down from a 6.04 ERA mark the previous year.

Prior to arriving in Evansville, Gaura spent three seasons at national power Mississippi State, where he worked as a graduate assistant video coordinator in 2016 before being promoted to the Bulldogs' director of player development in 2017. In that role, Gaura was responsible for the organization of all on-campus recruiting, the scholarship and recruiting database, and video needs for both player development and advanced scouting.

Gaura's assistance in recruiting the 2018 and 2019 classes to Mississippi State resulted in both being ranked No. 4 in the nation by Perfect Game.

Prior to the 2018 season, Gaura became the Bulldogs' volunteer assistant and camp coordinator while also taking on the duties of catchers' coach and assistant pitching coach, helping Mississippi State take two out of three games from Vanderbilt in the Super Regional before winning two games at the College World Series in Omaha

Gaura graduated from Austin Peay in 2015 with a degree in business administration, helping the Governors to the OVC Championship in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. Prior to arriving in Clarksville, Gaura pitched for Iowa Western Community College, where he was a part of the 2012 NJCAA Division I national championship team.

Upon his graduation in 2015, Gaura remained with the Austin Peay program in 2016 as a volunteer assistant/camp coordinator while earning his master's of science in management.

Gaura lives in Nashville with his wife. Rachel.

Belmont University baseball head coach Dave Jarvis announced Aug. 22, 2023, the hire of Jason Stein to the position of assistant coach and recruiting coordinator.

Stein most recently as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Middle Tennessee. He returns to Belmont having served on Jarvis' staff from 2001-08.

"We are excited to welcome Jason back to the Belmont coaching staff," Jarvis said. "He brings outstanding experience from several quality programs and conferences. He's seen the college game from every angle. Jason's teaching ability, energy and dedication to players will benefit our program."

Stein brings a wealth of experience and industry knowledge to the Bruin diamond, having spent over two decades in the college game.

In all, Stein has recruited and coached 45 Major League Baseball draft picks – including 12 former Bruins, most notably sixth-round selection Blake Owen.

Stein previously served as an assistant coach at Duke from 2015 to 2022, holding responsibilities such as hitting coach, third base coach, coaching infielders, coordinating the team's community service efforts, and managing the program's on-campus facilities.

In 2021, Stein helped the Blue Devils capture the program's first ACC Baseball Tournament Championship title in program history and their first conference title since 1961. While on the Blue Devil staff, Stein was a part of four NCAA Regional appearances and back-to-back NCAA Super Regional appearances in 2018 and 2019.

Before Duke, Stein was the head coach at Eastern Kentucky from 2008 to 2015. Stein earned Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2012 after leading EKU to a share of the OVC regular season title.

Under Stein's direction, the Colonels regularly ranked in the top 10 nationally in home runs per game, ranking first in the nation in home runs per game with 1.22 per contest in 2012. EKU's 66 home runs tied for second-most in the nation. EKU belted 59 home runs and posted a .450 team slugging percentage in 2015.

During his first stint with the Bruins, Stein coached 24 All-Atlantic Sun Conference selections, including Carlo Testa who earned First Team honors as a starting pitcher and outfielder.

Stein earned two degrees at EKU. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in ornamental horticulture in 1997 and received his master's degree in sports administration in 1998. Stein posted a .334 career batting average; his .378 average in 1993 led the Ohio Valley Conference.

Stein and his wife Terri have five children (Ryker, Riley, Jaxton, Jacey and Kacen).

COACHING STAFF



Will Craig • Assistant Coach

Will Craig enters his first season as an assistant coach at Belmont University.

The highly decorated former first-round draft pick by the Pittsburgh Pirates will be a valuable asset in player development, and hitting instruction

A native of Johnson City, Tennessee, Craig attended Science Hill High School. He was drafted in the 37th round of the 2013 MLB Draft by the Kansas City Royals but chose to attend Wake Forest University in the fall.

From 2014-2016, Craig became one of the most decorated Deacons in program history. Over his collegiate career, Craig posted an average of .347 with 42 doubles, 37 homers, 160 RBIs and 108 walks through three seasons. He also excelled on the mound, holding a 6-4 career record. As a junior in 2016, Craig tallied a .379 average, 16 home runs and 66 RBIs and went 2-0 with a team-high nine saves and a 3.54 ERA, earning him unanimous All-American and D1Baseball's National Player of the Year honors as well as being named a Dick Howser Trophy Finalist and a Golden Spikes Award Semifinalist. During his sophomore season, Craig was named the 2015 ACC Player of the Year, the sixth Deacon to earn Player of the Year honors, and became just the fourth Demon Deacon to be named an All-American by five different outlets.

Craig made his debut for the Pirates on August 27, 2020, in against the St. Louis Cardinals. He appeared in two games for Pittsburgh during the shortened 2020 season. In 2021, Craig played in 18 games for the Pirates, with a .217 batting average, 13 hits, a home run, and three RBIs.

Craig was selected by the Pittsburg Pirates with the 22nd overall pick in the 2016 MLB Draft. He began his professional career with the West Virginia Bears of the New York-Penn League (Class A Short). He made his debut on June 17 against Mahoning Valley and went 1-for-4 with two strikeouts. He finished the season with a .280 batting average, 61 hits, two home runs, 23 RBIs, and a .774 on-base plus slugging. He hit his first professional home run on July 17 vs. Williamsport, and started 46 games at third base.

In 2017, he entered the season as Pittsburgh's ninth-best prospect, according to Baseball America. He spent the season with the Bradenton Marauder (Single-A) where he led all Florida State League first basemen in total chances (940), putouts (855), and assists (78). He was named to the Florida State League's mid-season All-Star team. A durable player, Craig ranked third among all Pirates farmhands in games played.

Craig's 2018 campaign with the Altoona Curve (Double-A) propelled his professional career to new heights. He was voted the team's MVP, and was named both a mid- and post-season All-Star for the Eastern League. He led the league in RBIs (102), which ranked fifth in all of minor league baseball. He became the second player in Altoona's history to reach triple digits in RBIS, and the first Pirates minor league to reach 100 RBIs and highest total since 2007. In addition to being ranked the 16th-best-prospect by MLB.com, Craig was named the "Best Defensive First Baseman" in the Eastern League by Baseball America. He later was named All-Arizona Fall League.

Craig joined the Indianapolis Indians (Triple-A) in 2019. He won his first Rawlings Minor League Gold Glove at first base after posting a .999 fielding percentage in 886 total chances (recorded 828 putouts and 57 assists) while making only one error in 111 games at first base. Craig's power showed with a career-high 23 home runs, and a team-high 78 RBIs; the highest single-season total for an Indians player since Brandon Moss in 2010. His home run total also ranked third-best among all Pirates minor leaguers. With 27 home runs before the All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field in Cleveland.

After his time with the Pirates, Craig finished his playing career overseas in Korea with the Kiwoom Heroes. He made his KBO debut on August 13, 2021, against the Doosan Giants. In 61 games, Craig posted a .248 batting average, 12 doubles, 6 home runs, and 30 RBIs.

He returned to the United States in 2022 to finish his degree at Wake Forest and was an assistant coach for a team that made it to the College World Series. The Deacons went 54-12 and 22-7 in ACC play. After the conference tournament, Wake Forest won the Winston-Salem Regional, swept Alabama in the Winston-Salem Super Regional, and made it to the College World Series Finals before losing to LSU.

Craig lives with his wife. Morgan, and their dog. Clio
