BY THE NUMBERS

2.36 • The Hoosiers hold an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.36, the third-best mark in the country. IU has recorded 104 assists (on 149 made field goals) compared to 44 turnovers. As a team, Indiana dished out at least 20 assists in the first three games of the season, the longest stretch since the 2012-13 season.

43 • Redshirt senior forward Tucker DeVries has hit 20-plus points in 43 career games, including two with the Cream & Crimson.

50 • The 2025-26 season marks the 50th anniversary of the 1976 championship team, the last undefeated national champion in NCAA Division I men's basketball.

53 • Indiana defeated Lindenwood by a score of 73-53 on Thursday, Nov. 20, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The point total allowed was the fewest by a Hoosier defense since beating Maryland (65-53) on Dec. 1, 2023. The Lions shot 25.4% (17-of-67) from the floor and 16.7% (3-of-18) from behind the 3-point line.

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TEAM NOTABLES

OPENING TIP

• Indiana University continues its 126th season of competition in men's basketball with a non-conference clash against Kansas State at 8 p.m. ET on Tuesday, Nov. 25, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The fourth of a five-game homestand will be aired on FS1 with Conor Onion and Steve Smith on the call.

• Kansas State (5-1) is led by fourth-year head coach Jerome Tang. The Wildcats are led by preseason All-American P.J. Hagerty. The junior guard has averaged 28.0 points per game on 56.0% (56-of-100) shooting from the floor and 40.9% (9-of-22) from the 3-point line.

• Junior guard Abdi Bashir Jr. (14.3 points, 24 made 3-pointers), senior guard Nate Johnson (13.7 points, 6.2 rebounds), sophomore guard David Castollos (11.8 points), and senior forward Khamari McGriff (11.7 points, 82.9% field goals) all post double-figure scoring averages.

• Kansas State has posted 92.8 points per game and have reached at least 84 points in all six contests. The Wildcats have hit 43.3% (68-of-157) from behind the 3-point line as a team.

SERIES HISTORY

• Indiana and Kansas State, an old-school rivalry that once met yearly from 1951-70, have squared off 31 times on the floor. IU has earned 19 victories in the series and won nine-straight against KSU.

• The Hoosiers hold a record of 11-4 in games played against the Wildcats in Bloomington.

• The sides last met in the first round of the 1998 Maui Invitational with the Hoosiers claiming a 71-70 result. **A.J. Guyton** led the Hoosiers with 25 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the 3-point line, three rebounds, three assists, and two steals.

LAST TIME OUT

• Indiana (5-0) ran its win streak to five games with a victory over Lindenwood by a score of 73-53 on Thursday, Nov. 20, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The Hoosier defense held the Lions to 17-of-67 (25.4%) shooting from the floor and 3-of-18 (16.7%) from behind the 3-point line. The 53 points allowed were the fewest by an IU team since toppling Maryland (65-53) on Dec. 1, 2023.

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** torched the nets for a game-high 25 points. He made 7-of-15 shots from the floor, 5-of-10 from behind the arc, and 6-of-6 attempts from the charity stripe.

• Senior forward **Sam Alexis** provided a bench spark with eight points, a game-best 10 rebounds, and a season-high four blocked shots. Freshman forward **Trent Sisley** tallied eight points and six rebounds off the IU bench.

TUCKER DEVRIES HONORED BY BIG TEN CONFERENCE

• Indiana redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** was named Co-Big Ten Player of the Week, the conference announced on Nov. 10.

• In a pair of Hoosier victories to open the season, DeVries averaged 22.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists, and 1.0 steal per game. He shot 57.1% (16-of-28) from the floor and 58.8% (10-of-17) from the 3-point line.

• The two-time Missouri Valley Player of the Year began his Cream 'n Crimson career with an 18-point, 11-rebound double-double in a 98-51 win over Alabama A&M. His encore performance included a game-high 27 points (24 in the first half) to pair with six rebounds in a 100-77 win over Marquette at the United Center in Chicago to earn Most Outstanding Player of the Waterkeeper Alliance Invitational honors.

• DeVries is the first Hoosier to be named Big Ten Player of the Week since **Trayce Jackson-Davis** on March 6, 2023.

THAT'S AN OFFENSIVE STAT

• The Hoosiers scored 90-plus points in three-straight contests to open the season for the first time since 2007-08.

• IU has averaged 88.2 points per contest and shot 50.0% (48th) from the floor, 39.4% (30th) from the 3-point line, 77.1% (46th) from the free throw line, and an effective field goal percentage of 62.2%. Indiana is one of 14 teams to slash .500/.375/.750 shooting splits this season.

• Indiana has dished out 20-or-more assists in three of five games to open the season. The Hoosiers average 20.8 helpers per night and have assisted on 69.8% of its made field goals, the eighth-best rate in the country.

• The Hoosiers boast an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.36, the third-best mark in the country. IU has recorded 104 assists (on 149 made field goals) compared to 44 turnovers. Six IU players have an assist-to-turnover ratio better than 2-to-1 this season.

• Indiana knocked down at least nine 3-point field goals in four of five games of the season. for The Hoosiers buried 14 triples in consecutive games against Marquette (Nov. 9) and Milwaukee (Nov. 12), the first time an IU team converted at least 14 3-point field goals in consecutive games since November of 2005.

• Five Hoosiers average double-figure scoring numbers, led by redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries**. He has averaged 19.2 points per night on 46.5% (20-of-43) shooting from the 3-point line. He has made at least three 3-pointers in four contests.

A NEW PRINCE OF BLOOMINGTON

• Four-star combo guard **Prince-Alexander Moody** signed his letter of intent to continue his basketball career at Indiana University under head men's basketball coach Darian DeVries.

• A three-year letterwinner for head coach Jay Gavin at Bishop McNamara. Moody has compiled 1,075 career points, 119 made 3-pointers through 85 career games in high school

• He was named a 2025 Peach Jam Standout player, one of the 2025 EYBL Best Performers, and averaged 14.3 points, 3.1 rebounds, and 1.8 assists per game for Team Takeover during the EBYL season.

• **DeVries on Moody:** Prince is the ultimate team guy and competitor. He has a great feel for the game and will fit in perfectly with what we do at both ends of the floor.

VAUGHN OF A KIND

• Four-star wing **Vaughn Karvala** signed his letter of intent to continue his basketball career at Indiana University under head men's basketball coach Darian DeVries.

• A three-year letterwinner for head coach Chris Siebert at Oregon High School in Wisconsin before transferring to Bella Vista Prep, a preseason top 10 team, prior to his senior season.

• He averaged 26.5 points, 9.5 rebounds, 3.8 assists, and 1.6 steals per game as a junior and shot 53.5% from the floor and 41.9% from the 3-point line.

DeVries on Karvala: Vaughn has very good size, skill, and athleticism that makes him a highlight reel waiting to happen in the open floor. When you combine that with his ability to shoot the ball, he has a very bright future here.

PORTAL COMBAT

• The Hoosiers underwent a complete overhaul of the roster during the offseason with 10 transfer additions. The class ranked third in the Big Ten Conference and 10th nationally according to 247Sports.

• The class is headlined by top-125 national portal acquisitions in redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** (West Virginia), fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** (Sam Houston), senior forward **Reed Bailey** (Davidson), junior guard **Nick Dorn** (Elon), sixth-year senior guard **Tayton Conerway** (Troy), and junior guard **Jasai Miles** (North Florida).

• The 10-man portal class made 554 starts in NCAA Division I basketball prior to joining the Hoosiers. IU is the only program to bring in at least 10 transfers with 30-plus collegiate starts.

• Four players enter the season having made at least 80 career 3-pointers while shooting better than 35.0% from behind the arc. Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** has drilled 276 triples at a 36.7% clip, while fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** has buried 202 collegiate 3s at a 40.0% rate. Junior forward **Nick Dorn** is a 35.6% career shooter with 134 makes, and redshirt senior guard **Conor Enright** has canned 88 3-pointers at 37.1%.

• Indiana joins Baylor, Memphis, Miami (Fla.), UCF, West Virginia, and Xavier as the only high-major programs to return zero points from the 2024-25 roster.

THE VOICE OF INDIANA ATHLETICS

Veteran voice of the Hoosiers Don Fischer enters his 53rd season as the play-by-play voice of Indiana Men's Basketball. During that time, he's called more than 2,200 games and four NCAA Men's Basketball Championship games. He's been honored as the National Sports Media Association's Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 32 times, and was awarded the prestigious National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's Chris Schenkel Award. He was also awarded with the Indiana University Bicentennial Award in 2019 in recognition for his enormous contributions to Indiana University and IU Athletics. He was inducted into the IU Athletic Hall of Fame in the fall of 2022.

DARIAN DEVRIES DEEP DIVE

- Indiana head men's basketball coach **Darian DeVries** was announced as the 31st head coach in program history on March 18, 2025.
- Prior to Indiana, DeVries spent one season in Morgantown as the head coach of West Virginia. He inherited a roster that returned only two players and 2.8 percent of its scoring from a 2023-24 roster that finished 9-23. The Mountaineers more than doubled its previous season's win total, going 19-13 overall and 10-10 in the Big 12. WVU earned a series of signature victories this season, including three wins over top-10 teams (No. 2 Iowa State, No. 3 Gonzaga, and No. 7 Kansas).
- His first head coaching stint began in 2018-19 at Drake, a program that had been to one NCAA Tournament in the previous 47 years, had five 20-win seasons in its 112-year history, and was a combined 40-87 (31.5%) in the six years prior to his arrival. His Drake teams won at least 20 games each year, including 25 or more in each of his final four seasons. During those final four seasons at Drake the Bulldogs were one of only three Division I programs (Gonzaga and Houston) to win at least 25 games each season. His teams won MVC postseason tournament championships in his final two seasons, led the league in scoring offense twice, and he finished his Drake career with a 150-55 record.
- DeVries began his coaching career at Creighton, where he spent 20 years (17 as an assistant coach) as a member of the Bluejays' staff under Dana Altman and Greg McDermott. The program went a combined 460-211 during his 20 seasons and earned 19 postseason berths, including 12 NCAA trips.

TEAM NOTABLES

DEVRIES ANNOUNCES ASSISTANTS, SUPPORT STAFF

- In his debut season, Indiana head men's basketball coach **Darian DeVries** announced four assistant coaches and eight members of his support staff.
- Assistant coach **Kenny Johnson** returned to IU after one season at Georgetown. KJ's first stint with the Hoosiers came from 2012-14 and featured an outright Big Ten Championship. He coached numerous NBA players including NBA All-Stars **Victor Oladipo** and Donovan Mitchell.
- Assistant coach **Rod Clark** spent the last four seasons at Tennessee. The Vols, appeared in every AP Top 25 poll, earned wins over 30 AP top 25 programs, and claimed two SEC Championships during his Knoxville tenure.
- Assistant coach **Drew Adams**, a Bloomington South alum, returned to his hometown after two seasons at Cincinnati. During his time with the Bearcats, the program won 41 games and made a pair of postseason tournaments.
- Assistant coach **Nick Norton** moved to Bloomington after one season at West Virginia. He played a big role in the development of Javon Small, the fourth WVU player in program history to be named to the All-Big 12 First Team.
- Special Assistant to the Head Coach **Mike Barga** joined the Hoosiers after 10 highly successful seasons at Bradley. He also overlapped with DeVries at Creighton as a graduate manager from 2001-04.
- Head Strength and Conditioning Coach **Ryan Horn** worked with DeVries in a similar capacity at both Drake (2023-24) and West Virginia (2024-25).
- Athletic Trainer **Andrew Vereen** spent the last three years with Drake and was part of three-straight Missouri Valley Conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Director of Player Personnel **Justin Bailey** spent the last four seasons at Sam Houston. He helped mentor the breakout 2024-25 season from current Hoosier **Lamar Wilkerson**.
- Director of Operations **Garrett Sturtz**, Video and Player Development Analyst **Jalen Cannady**, Graduate Manager **Jackson Creel**, and Graduate Manager **ShanQuan Hemphill** round out the support staff.

GAME-BY-GAME NOTABLES

INDIANA 73, LINDENWOOD 53 (GAME 5)

- Indiana ran its win streak to five games with a victory over Lindenwood by a score of 73-53 on Thursday, Nov. 20, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The Hoosier defense held the Lions to 17-of-67 (25.4%) shooting from the floor and 3-of-18 (16.7%) from behind the 3-point line. The 53 points allowed were the fewest by an IU team since toppling Maryland (65-53) on Dec. 1, 2023.
- Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** torched the nets for a game-high 25 points. He made 7-of-15 shots from the floor, 5-of-10 from behind the arc, and 6-of-6 attempts from the charity stripe.
- INDIANA 69, INCARNATE WORD 61 (GAME 4)

 - Indiana defeated Incarnate Word by a score of 69-61 despite the program's first off shooting night of the season on Sunday, Nov. 16, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. The Hoosiers converted 5-of-24 (20.8%) shots from behind the 3-point line.
 - The IU bench, led by 16 points and eight rebounds from senior forward **Sam Alexis** outscored the UIW reserves by a tally of 26-10. Freshman forward **Trent Sisley** chipped in 10 points and a season-best eight boards in 20 minutes off the bench.
 - Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** registered 14 points, five rebounds, and three assists.
- INDIANA 101, MILWAUKEE 70 (GAME 3)

 - Indiana earned its third-straight victory to open the season with a 101-70 result over Milwaukee on Wednesday, Nov. 12, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.
 - Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** led the IU attack with a game-best 24 points, two assists, and two steals. He made 5-of-6 shots from the 3-point line.
 - Sixth-year senior guard **Tayton Conerway** posted a season-high 21 points on 8-of-11 shooting from the floor, six assists, and two steals.
 - IU canned 14-of-28 (50.0%) from the 3-point line and outscored MKE by 27 points from behind the arc.
- INDIANA 100, MARQUETTE 77 (GAME 2)

 - Indiana put on an offensive show at the United Center in Chicago with a 100-77 victory over the Marquette Golden Eagles on Sunday, Nov. 9.
 - Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** posted a game-best 27 points (24 in the first half) on 6-of-9 shooting from the 3-point line. Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** added 24 points (15 in the second half) on 6-of-10 shooting from deep. He added a career-high eight assists.
 - The Indiana bench, led by 15 points from freshman forward **Trent Sisley** and 13 points from senior forward **Sam Alexis**, out-paced the Marquette bench by a score of 34-29.
- INDIANA 98, ALABAMA A&M 51 (GAME 1)

 - Indiana opened the season with a resounding result, 98-51, the largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2018. The 47-point margin of victory also marked the largest in a first win of an IU coach's tenure in program history.
 - Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries** collected 18 points, 11 rebounds, four assists, and four made 3-pointers. Senior forward **Reed Bailey** led the IU offense with 21 points (7-of-7 from the free throw line) to pair with five rebounds and two assists. Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson** added 19 points and three steals.
 - Senior forward **Sam Alexis** provided 17 points, eight rebounds, and two blocks off the bench, while sixth-year senior guard **Tayton Conerway** added 14 points and a team-best five assists.



PRESEASON PLAYER NOTABLES

0 | JASAI MILES

• Junior guard **Jasai Miles**, a transfer from North Florida, earned ASUN All-Conference third-team honors in 2024-25. He averaged 15.4 points, 6.8 rebounds, and 1.9 assists in 31.6 minutes per game during his sophomore campaign. He reached double figures in the scoring column in 29-of-32 games, topped 20 points on six occasions, and posted five double-doubles.

• Miles was one of two players (RJ Felton, ECU) to score at least 450 points, grab 200 rebounds, and make 75 3-pointers during the 2024-25 season.

1 | REED BAILEY

• Senior forward **Reed Bailey**, a transfer from Davidson, became the eighth player in program history to be named an Atlantic 10 All-Conference performer. He averaged 12.4 points, 4.9 rebounds, and 2.0 assists in 97 career games, all starts. Bailey shot 46.2% (412-of-892) from the floor and 76.9% (339-of-441) from the free throw line.

• One of two players listed at 6'10 or taller (Johni Broome, Auburn) to record at least 600 points, 200 rebounds, and 100 assists during the 2024-25 season. Bailey scored double figures in 56 career games, reached 20-plus points 21 times, and compiled seven career double-doubles.

2 | JASON DRAKE

• Junior guard **Jason Drake**, a transfer from Drexel, averaged 11.1 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 3.1 assists in 26.2 minutes per game with the Dragons. In 49 career games with Cleveland State (16 games in 2022-23) and Drexel (33 games in 2024-25) he shot 41.5% (140-of-337) from the floor, 38.7% (46-of-119) from the 3-point line, and 85.5% (65-of-76) from the free throw line.

• 'Deuce' scored double figures in 18 career games, reached 20-plus points in four games, and compiled seven games with 5-plus assists.

3 | LAMAR WILKERSON

• Fifth-year senior guard **Lamar Wilkerson**, a transfer from Sam Houston, earned two All-Conference USA first team selections. He averaged 13.9 points, 3.6 rebounds, and 1.3 assists in 95 career games with the Bearkats and shot 44.8% (467-of-1,042) from the floor, 40.0% (202-of-505) from the 3-point line, and 82.6% (185-of-224) from the free throw line.

• During the 2024-25 season, Wilkerson was one of three players in Division I men's basketball to make at least 100 3-pointers and shoot over 44.0% from behind the arc. He is one of seven players to average at least 13.0 points per game, make at least 200 3-pointers, and shoot at least 40.0% from behind the arc over the last three seasons.

4 | SAM ALEXIS

• Senior forward **Sam Alexis**, a National-Championship winning transfer from Florida, earned All-Southern Conference plaudits during his two-years with Chattanooga (2022-24). He has averaged 7.1 points, 5.7 rebounds, and 1.2 blocks in 89 career games and shot 52.5% (258-of-491) from the floor. The 6'9 big man has compiled 12 career double-doubles and posted 26 multi-block games.

• During his sophomore season (2023-24), Alexis was named to the league's All-Defensive Team and was one of five Division I men's basketball players to average at least 10.0 points, 9.0 rebounds, and 2.0 blocks per game.

5 | CONOR ENRIGHT

• Fifth-year senior guard **Conor Enright**, a transfer from DePaul via Drake, won two Missouri Valley Conference Tournament championships with current Indiana head coach Darian DeVries at Drake. Enright holds a record of 65-26 (71.4% winning percentage) in games in which he played.

• The Mundelein, Ill., native averaged 6.0 points, 2.8 rebounds, and 3.3 assists per game in 91 career games. He has compiled 26 career games with five assists and 10 games with at least eight assists, including a career-high 11 dimes against No. 7 Marquette on Jan. 14, 2025.

6 | TAYTON CONERWAY

• Sixth-year senior guard **Tayton Conerway**, a transfer from Troy, is the reigning Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. He was one of six players to log at least 1,000 minutes and average at least 14.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists, and 2.0 steals per outing in 2024-25

• In two seasons playing for Scott Cross and the Trojans, he scored double figures in 49 career games, reached 20-plus points eight times, and added 48 multi-steals games. He broke the Troy record with 98 steals during the 2024-25 season. Conerway helped guide the Trojans to 43 victories over the last two seasons and advanced to the 2025 NCAA Tournament.

7 | NICK DORN

• Junior guard **Nick Dorn**, a transfer from Elon, was one of six NCAA Division I men's basketball players to average at least 15.0 points per game, make 70 3-pointers, and make 90 free throws while playing less than 1,000 minutes during the 2024-25 season.

• Dorn, the son of seven-year NFL veteran Torin Dorn, averaged 12.0 points and 3.4 rebounds in 55 career games with the Phoenix. He shot 35.6% (134-of-376) from the 3-point line, and 79.0% (124-of-157) from the free throw line. Dorn was named a CAA All-Rookie performer following the 2023-24 season.

10 | JOSH HARRIS

• Sophomore forward **Josh Harris**, a transfer from North Florida, was named to the All-ASUN Freshman Team after he averaged 13.4 points and 7.1 rebounds in 22.5 minutes per game in his debut season.

• He was the only freshman in Division I men's basketball to record at least 400 points and 200 rebounds on 55.0% or better shooting from the floor in 2024-25.

11 | TRENT SISLEY

• Freshman forward **Trent Sisley**, a consensus 4-star and top-100 nationally-ranked recruit, holds the Heritage Hills High School career scoring (1,715 points) and rebounding (751 boards) records despite only playing three seasons for the Patriots before transferring to Monteverde Academy.

• He earned Associated Press All-State Second Team honors as a junior after he averaged 24.2 points, 11.4 rebounds, 4.3 assists, 2.2 blocked shots, and 1.8 steals per game.

12 | TUCKER DEVRIES

• Redshirt senior forward **Tucker DeVries**, a transfer from West Virginia via Drake, is a two-time Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year. During his career he has averaged 17.7 points, 5.6 rebounds, 2.5 assists, and 1.5 steals per game in 112 career games. The Waukee, Iowa, native shot 43.5% (666-of-1,530) from the floor, 36.7% (276-of-752) from the 3-point line, and 81.3% (378-of-465) from the free throw line.

• DeVries has started 104-straight games over the last four seasons playing for his father **Darian DeVries** at both Drake (2021-24) and West Virginia (2024-25). He has reached double figures in 101 career games, scored 20-plus points in 41 games, and posted six 30-point games.

• In his 112 games, his teams have produced a record of held 84-28 (75.0% winning percentage). DeVries scored at least 500 points and made at least 75 3-point field goals in each of his three healthy seasons at Drake.

13 | ALEKSA RISTIC

• Freshman guard **Aleksa Ristic** joined the Hoosiers after a successful three-year run with KK Dynamic in the Serbia KSL, the top league in Serbia. He averaged 13.6 points, 3.2 rebounds, 4.2 assists, and 1.2 steals in 19 games during his final season with the team.

• He averaged 11.3 points, 6.3 assists, and posted a 2.59 assist-to-turnover ratio at the 2025 FIBA U20 EuroBasket Championships for the fourth-place Serbian National Team.

15 | ANDREJ ACIMOVIC

• Freshman center **Andrej Acimovic**, a Bosnian big man, was added to the IU rotation after he averaged 17.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in the U19 ABA League, the top league in the Balkans region.

• During competition in the second Bosnian division, a senior level league, he posted 17.3 points, 7.7 rebounds, 1.2 assists, and 1.1 blocks per game. He shot 65.3% from the floor and 39.0% from the 3-point line.

Darian DeVries was named Indiana Men’s Basketball’s 31st head coach on March 19, 2025. The Aplington, Iowa, native arrived in Bloomington with nearly 25 years of Division I coaching experience, including seven years as a head coach of Drake (2018-24) and West Virginia (2024-25). He advanced to the NCAA Tournament three of his final four seasons with Drake.

In his lone season at West Virginia the Mountaineers improved its previous season’s win total by 10 games to an overall record of 19-13 and a 10-10 mark in Big XII games. WVU earned six Quad 1 victories, 13 wins over NET Top 100 programs, and four triumphs over ranked opponents.

West Virginia played the final 24 games of the season without two-time Larry Bird Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year, Tucker DeVries, who was lost for the season with an injury. The Mountaineers held a record of 6-2 with wins over No. 3 Gonzaga and No. 24 Arizona in the Battle 4 Atlantis at the time of the injury. WVU climbed as high as No. 21 in the Associated Press Top 25 (Week 10).

Under his guidance, senior guard Javon Small became the fourth Mountaineer in program history to be named to the All-Big 12 First Team. The Fort Wayne, Ind., native tied for the league lead with 18.5 points per game, was third in free throw percentage (88.1%), third in assists per game (5.6), fourth in 3-point percentage (35.3%), fourth in 3-point field goals per game (2.5), ninth in assist-to-turnover ratio (+2.1), and 12th in steals per game (1.6).

DeVries posted a record of 150-55 (73.2 winning percentage) at Drake. His final four seasons with the Bulldogs saw the program secure 108 wins (27 wins per season) to pair with three NCAA Tournament trips. He won 70.5% (79-33) of his Missouri Valley Conference games and claimed three MVC titles. He led Drake to six of the program’s 11 20-wins in program history before leaving for West Virginia.

He inherited a program that had been to one NCAA Tournament in the previous 47 years, had five 20-win seasons in its 112-year history, and was a combined 40-87 (31.5%) in the six years prior to his arrival. He immediately turned the Missouri Valley Conference program’s fortunes around, going 24-10 overall in year one and tying for the Missouri Valley Conference regular season championship. He won 20-plus games in all six seasons in Des Moines, including 25-plus victories in each of his final four seasons with the Bulldogs.

In 2023-24, DeVries led Drake to a 28-7 record, capping the season with a MVC Tournament title and the Bulldogs’ third NCAA Tournament appearance in the last four years. Drake’s 28 victories were its most since recording 28 in 2008.

DeVries, a two-time MVC Coach of the Year (2019 and 2021), was a finalist for the 2023-24 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, given annually to the top mid-major head coach in college basketball.

He led the Bulldogs back to the NCAA Tournament in 2022-23 and finished with a 27-8 record. Drake captured the 2023 MVC Tournament title for the first time under DeVries.

In his third year, DeVries led Drake to an 18-0 start and an AP Top 25 appearance. Despite losing two of his top players to injury, he led Drake to its first NCAA Tournament bid in 13 years, and its first NCAA Tournament win in 50 years over Wichita State. He was named MVC Coach of the Year for the second time in three years. Drake finished the season with a 26-5 record.

DeVries made history in his second season at Drake, becoming the first coach to lead an eight seed to a win over the top seed in the MVC Tournament, downing Northern Iowa, 77-56. The 2020 postseason was canceled after the UNI victory due to COVID-19. His Bulldogs won 20 games, marking the first time since 1971 the program had won 20-or-more games in consecutive seasons.

In his first season as head coach at Drake, DeVries led the Bulldogs to a 24-10 record after inheriting a team with the second-fewest returning letterwinners in the nation. He led the Bulldogs to their first regular season MVC title since 2008 and the program’s 12th all-time postseason appearance, despite losing a potential MVC Player of the Year candidate to a season-ending knee injury in the first game of conference play. In his first season as a head coach, he was named MVC Coach of the Year and received the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award.

Prior to Drake, DeVries was an assistant coach at Creighton for 17 years under Greg McDermott and Dana Altman. He joined Creighton as a graduate manager and spent 20 years at Creighton. During his time there, he was part of 19 postseason appearances and 12 NCAA Tournament bids. Creighton was 460-211 overall and 231-129 in conference games during DeVries’ tenure at Creighton.

DeVries is a 1998 graduate of Northern Iowa, where he played for coach Eldon Miller and ranks 31st all-time in career scoring with 1,084 points. He was a two-time MVC Scholar-Athlete Team selection and two-time team captain. DeVries led the Panthers in 3-point shooting for three seasons and converted on 44 percent of his attempts as a senior with 3.1 assists per game.

A native of Aplington, Iowa, DeVries attended Aplington-Parkersburg High and was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association (IHSAA) Hall of Fame in 2015.

He is the oldest of five siblings. His brother, Jared, was an All-American on the Iowa football team and played for the Detroit Lions for 12 seasons. Another brother, Dusty, also played football at Iowa, while his youngest brother, Jay, played football at Wartburg College. His sister, Jodi, was an All-MVC Second-Team selection in volleyball at Northern Iowa.

DeVries and his wife, Ashley, have a son, Tucker, and a daughter, Tatum. Tucker recently became the ninth-ever player and first since Doug McDermott to win the Larry Bird MVC Player of the Year trophy in back-to-back seasons while playing at Drake. He was also named an Associated Press All-America Honorable Mention selection in 2023-24.
